Our new facility offers a capacity of 5,300 with room to expand beyond 8,000, improved amenities, and opportunities for a better in-game experience for fans, alumni, former letter winners, student-athletes, media and employees.

Sun Devil Athletics has honored the baseball program's storied tradition through a variety of ways, including increased signage and branding as well a Legacy Walk that features permanent plaques for our four former head coaches, Packard Stadium and the foundation of the program. With an increased use of historical photos and video, and added emphasis on our strong ties with Major League Baseball, USA Baseball and the College World Series, Phoenix Muni is a living testament to the excellence of Sun Devil Baseball.

Capital improvements included the installation of a state-of-the art video board a redesigned clubhouse complete with a player's lounge, academic center, weight room and training room, and premium seating options.

Tracy Smith was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

"His accomplishments and accolades on the field speak for themselves, and his career has been defined by class, dignity and integrity," Anderson said. "He will be a great fit within the ASU family, our baseball community and our current student-athletes, and we can't wait for the new era of Sun Devil Baseball to begin under Tracy's guidance."

Smith comes to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and has more than 600 career victories.

He tallied more than 40 wins in each of the past two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 40 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 18 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 54 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 22 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 24 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past six seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in facility upgrades at both IU and Miami (Ohio) and was instrumental in the approval and design of both Miami's Stanley G. McKie Field at Joseph P. Hayden Jr. Park and Indiana's Bart Kaufman Field.

Smith's Academic Progress Rate as a head coach increased each season until it reached a perfect 1000 in two-year stretch between 2008-10.

IU saw eight players on 12 occasions be named All-Americans under Smith, including four in 2014, which was the highest total in program history and the second straight season that IU produced three or more All-Americans.

Smith mentored two Big Ten Players of the Year, three Big Ten Pitchers of the Year and a pair of Big Ten Freshman of the Year in nine seasons at IU, and at least one Hoosier earned Freshman All-America honors in six of the past seven seasons in Bloomington.

He has landed three players on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and mentored numerous players at all positions, including outfielder Alex Dickerson, who was named Big Ten Player of the Year and won the Big Ten Triple Crown in 2010, right-handed pitcher Aaron Slegers, who was named 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, and catcher Kyle Schwarber, who was named an All-American by five major college baseball groups in 2014.

In nine years at the helm of the RedHawks baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.





He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization. He also participated in 1992 Major League Scouting Bureau's Professional Scout School as a representative of the Cubs.

Born Feb. 14, 1966, Smith graduated with a bachelor's degree in Education from Miami (Ohio) in 1989 and completed a master's degree in Sport Organization from Miami (Ohio) in 1992.

A native of Kentland, Ind., Smith and his wife, Jaime, have three sons, Casey, Ty and Jack. Casey was a redshirt senior on the Hoosier baseball team while Ty is a sophomore receiver for the IU football team. Jack is a three-sport athlete at Bloomington High School North.

Ben Greenspan enters his first season at Arizona State University as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. Greenspan works primarily with the team's offense and catchers.

Greenspan spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, including the past year as recruiting coordinator, and worked extensively with the team's catchers and hitters. The Hoosiers' offense ranked in the top 25 in the nation in batting average, slugging percentage, total hits and extra-base hits in 2014.

"In addition to being a top-notch person, Ben is a talented re<mark>cruiter and a k</mark>nowledgeable coach," coach Smith said. "He played for me and coached with me over the past eight years, so he knows exactly the type of players that excel in our system. I love the enthusiasm he brings to his job every day and he has a real passion for mentoring catchers and working with the team's offense. In fact, he was so enthusiastic about the chance to join the staff at ASU that I was barely able to get the offer out of my mouth before he was already packed and ready to hit the recruiting trail. It would be an understatement to say that Ben is excited to move to Tempe with his wife, Janine, and join the ASU family."

Greenspan mentored some of the most prolific hitters in IU program history, including two-time All-American catcher Kyle Schwarber, current White Sox catcher Josh Phegley, and 2010 Big Ten Player of the Year Alex Dickerson. He also played a large role in developing talent at IU as 11 of his position players were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including five in the top five rounds.


Schwarber, who was selected with the fourth overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft, was a 2013 First Team All-American and was named the best catcher in the country by Perfect Game and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. Dickerson won the 2010 Big Ten Triple Crown after he batted .419 with 24 homeruns and 75 RBI. Greenspan's additional hitting protégés include 2012 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Sam Travis, two-time All-American Dustin DeMuth and Major League Baseball draft picks Micah Johnson, Michael Earley, Ethan Wilson, Jake Dunnings and Evan Crawford.

Greenspan played for two seasons under coach Smith at IU, and was a Hoosier team captain and Academic All-Big Ten performer in 2007. He spent two years at the University of Connecticut as a catcher and first baseman before joining the IU program. He earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Marketing and Management and a master's degree in Sport Administration from Indiana University.

Greenspan is from West Point, N.Y., and his father, Rick, played baseball at the University of Maryland and served as Director of Athletics for Illinois State, Army, Indiana and Rice.

Brandon Higelin enters his first season at Arizona State University as the team's pitching coach.

Higelin joined IU at the start of the 2013-14 academic year and promptly molded the pitching staff into one of the most consistent in the nation. The Hoosiers put together a 2.33 team ERA in 2014, seventh lowest in the nation and the lowest in IU program history since 1968, and had a 2.43 strikeout-to-walk ratio and a conference-best seven shutouts.

"Higgy' grew up and played collegiate baseball in California, so he probably knows far better than the rest of us on staff the influence and meaning ASU Baseball holds west of the Mississippi," coach Smith said. "Through his time as a pitching instructor, he has worked with several pitchers that have gone on to pitch and have success in the Pac-12 Conference. I know there are some who may look at his resume and point out the fact that he doesn't have years of coaching experience at the college level, but I will tell you 'Higgy' has put in his 10,000 hours (and then some) working with and developing some of the top high school, collegiate and professional arms in Southern California. I have no doubts that our student-athletes are going to not only learn from him, but love playing for him as well."

Two of Higelin's pitchers were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft, including Joey DeNato, who put together the best season of his record-setting career at IU in 2014. He went 13-1 with a 1.82 ERA and led the team with 81 strikeouts, and set single season school records in innings pitched (109.1) and wins. He became just the third pitcher in school history to earn All-America honors and ended his time in Bloomington, Ind., as the school's all-time career leader in wins (37), strikeouts (297) and innings pitched (369.1).

Prior to his time at IU, Higelin served as Field Manager of the Battle Creek Bombers in the Northwoods League from 2012-13 and was the pitching coach during the Bombers league championship season in 2011. He also has extensive experience as a private pitching instructor with Division-I collegiate and minor league players in California.

He played collegiately at Cal State-Los Angeles and was a 28th round draft pick of the San Diego Padres in 2005. He played four seasons of professional ball, including a Midwest League All-Star campaign in 2006.

Higelin is from Glendale, Calif., and earned a Psychology degree from Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio.

This marks Nori's fourth stint working with Coach Smith after he served as the volunteer assistant for Indiana University in 2014 and 2007, and for Miami University in 2005.

"I appreciate the opportunity that Tracy is giving me, and I'm excited to be working with him again as he begins the next chapter of his coaching career at Arizona State," Nori said. "I have enjoyed following and coaching with Tracy for the past 20 years as he builds championship teams that understand how to compete and how to win, and most importantly, how to do it the right way. His teams have always played with a lot of discipline and a hate-to-lose mentality. I just hope to play a part in continuing the rich tradition of the one of the top baseball programs in the country."

Nori has three conference tournament championships, three NCAA Regional berths and two regular season conference crowns in four seasons as a Div. I assistant coach.

He was a member of the 2014 IU team that won the Big Ten Conference championship and tournament championship, and became the first program in Big Ten history to earn a national seed. The RedHawks finished first in the Mid-American Conference, won the MAC Tournament championship and were an NCAA Regional participant in 2005. Nori was also a member of the 2009 Xavier Baseball staff, where he helped the Musketeers win the Atlantic 10 Tournament title and advance to an NCAA Regional.

Smith coached both of Nori's sons to conference championships and postseason berths at IU and Miami University, respectively. Smith mentored Nori's oldest son, Micah, from 1994-97 as the pitching coach at IU and helped lead the Hoosiers to the 1996 Big Ten Tournament crown and an appearance in the Wichita State Regional. He was the head coach for his youngest son, Brady, at Miami from 1998-2001 and led the RedHawks to a MAC Tournament Championship and a spot in the Tempe Regional in 2000.

Nori has a long history of excellence in Ohio high school baseball and owns more than 20 years of head coaching experience that includes a Class A State Championship.

Nori went on to play professional baseball for three seasons after his playing days at IU ended and he hit .284 with five home runs and 55 RBI as a member of the New York Mets organization. He was a student-athlete at IU from 1961-65, and earned his IU degree in 1965 and a master's degree from Xavier in 1969.


Nori and his wife, Sani, have four children and five grandchildren. Their sons, Micah and Brady, both played college baseball. Micah played for Indiana (1994-97) while Brady competed at Miami University (1998-2001). Micah is currently an assistant coach for the NBA's Sacramento Kings. 

Abe Ruiz enters his second season as a graduate assistant for the Sun Devils, including his first on head coach Tracy Smith's staff at Arizona State.

Ruiz, who served as a graduate assistant for the Sun Devils under Tim Esmay in 2014, was a three-year letterman at ASU from 2009, 11-12. He earned All-America and All-Pac-12 honors in 2012 after he tied for the Pac-12 lead in home runs with 13, finished second in the conference in slugging percentage at .595 and fourth in RBI with 53.

He was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 16th round (501st overall) of the 2012 Major League Baseball Draft and was also taken in the 47th round (1,401st pick overall) by the San Francisco Giants in the 2008 MLB draft.

In 2012 he led the team in home runs, slugging percentage, RBI and doubles, and appeared in all 56 games for the Sun Devils, hitting .305 with a team-high 53 RBI on 61 hits, including a team-best 19 doubles. He was named Pac-12 Player of the Week for Feb. 22 after he drove in six runs vs. Western Michigan on Feb 17.

He is a 2008 graduate of Pacific Grove (Calif.) High School and was a 2008 Louisville Slugger All-American and Rawlings All-American selection. He was a four-time first-team all-league selection and holds school career records for RBI (137) and doubles (34).

Robbins previously worked with Coach Smith at Indiana University from 2009-14, and oversaw the strength and conditioning program for baseball, swimming, diving, and water polo.

While at IU, Robbins gained esteem for cultivating world-class athletes as he coached two individual national champions, five Olympians, 18 players of the year, 29 conference champions, 108 all-conference honorees and 161 All-Americans.

Robbins' unique and baseball-specific training program helped the IU baseball team reach unprecedented heights, including two Big Ten Conference Championships and a College World Series berth. His student-athletes accounted for 10 All-America selections and 15 Major League Baseball Draft picks, including Kyle Schwarber, an undrafted high schooler who was the fourth overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft, and Sam Travis, who became a second-round pick after being a 40th-round pick out of high school.



The Sun Devils were hungry entering the 1965 season after making their first College World Series appearance the previous year. Though they made an early exit with two losses in three games in 1964, their journey to Omaha, Nebraska, had given them a taste of the good life.

There was no stopping Coach Bobby Winkles' team in '65. They stormed through the regular season with a 47-7 record, won the Western Athletic Conference title at 9-3 and swept two games from Colorado State in the District 7 playoffs in Phoenix to earn another trip to Omaha sporting a No.-1 national ranking

from Collegiate Baseball.



Slugging center fielder Rick Monday was the backbone of that team. He batted .359 with a school-record 11 home runs and became the first of 13 Sun Devils to be named National Player of the Year. He was the first player chosen (by the Kansas City Athletics) in Major League Baseball's initial amateur draft. John Pavlik (12-0), Jim Merrick (13-2) and Ron Lea (11-3) headed the pitching staff.



ASU VS. LAFAYETTE—JUNE 7

ASU entered the tourney ranked first in the final national poll prior to the CWS, and lived up to the billing. The Devils blasted three Lafayette pitchers for a 14-1 win. Top Sun Devil sluggers included starting pitcher John Pavlik (2-for-3, 1 RBI), Sal Bando (3-for-5 with a double, a homer and 3 RBI), Jim Armstrong (3-for-4, 2 RBI) and 3 runs scored) and Glenn Smith, with a 3-for-4 performance. Pavlik limited Lafayette to just three singles in getting the win, and was helped by Alan Schmelz in the ninth. Pavlik had a no-hitter for six innings before a run scored on three singles in the seventh.

The championship victory was ASU's 54th win in the 62-game season, a national record at that time.

The 1967 Sun Devils did not have an easy path to Omaha, where they captured their second national championship in three years. The Devils lost four of their first five Western Athletic Conference games before rallying to capture the Southern Division title and earn a spot against Brigham Young University in the WAC playoffs.

In a game still considered by many the greatest in school history, the 11th-ranked Sun Devils beat 9th-ranked Arizona, 3-2, in a one-game Southern Division playoff in front of 8,314 fans at Phoenix Municipal

Stadium. Sun Devil pitcher Gary Gentry, who had shut out the Wildcats, 3-0, in the final regular-season game, pitched all 15 innings of the four-hour, 17-minute marathon. Working on just two days' rest, Gentry scattered nine hits, walked five and struck out 18. He threw 208 pitches.

After disposing of BYU in the WAC championship series, the Sun Devils won two of three from Air Force in the District 7 playoffs in Phoenix to earn a spot in Omaha, where they won five of six games to claim National Title No. 2.

Outfielder Paul Ray Powell led the Sun Devils in batting (.366), home runs (11) and RBI (73) and was named College Player of the Year by The Sporting News. Powell was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Twins in the 1969 June amateur draft, the seventh

player drafted overall. Powell also played safety on the football team and led the nation in kick

Left-hander Larry Gura was the pitching star of the 1969 Sun Devils. He put together a season that still ranks as one of the best in college history. Gura set a NCAA record for pitching victories with a 19-2 record and established a school record with a sparkling 1.01 ERA. He struck out 196 batters in 169 innings. He made four pitching appearances — two as a starter and two in relief — as the Sun Devils shook off a first-round loss to Texas to win their third national title in Omaha.

The 1977 Sun Devils were a determined bunch after compiling a 65-10 overall record and 17-1 WAC mark in 1976 but falling short in their quest for the school's fourth national title. Their 1977 record (57-12, 15-3) wasn't quite as impressive and they were down a bit in most statistical categories, but this time they got it right at Omaha.

Coach Jim Brock's Devils hit their stride in mid April, rolling up 19 consecutive victories in a streak that continued into the post season. They swept BYU in the WAC playoffs and stormed through a NCAA Regional

tournament in Tempe with one victory over Cal State Fullerton and two over Washington State, taking a No. 1 national ranking into the College World Series.

Though they lacked the dominant pitching of some earlier ASU clubs, the Devils bludgeoned opponents with an attack that featured the likes of Bob Horner, Hubie Brooks, Chris Bando, Dave Hudgens and Jamie Allen. Horner won virtually every major college baseball award after leading the nation in hits (102), home runs (22), RBI (87) and total bases (191)

Sun Devil bats blistered Clemson early, and ASU then hung on for a 10-7 win. The Devils knocked undefeated Clemson hurler Ron Musselman out of the game early with one run in the first and a three-run third inning. In the fifth, Jamie Allen led off with a homer and Steve Michael doubled in a run to give ASU a 6-0 lead, but ASU starter Jerry Vasquez faltered and allowed the Tigers five runs in the bottom of the inning. About the only blip was a three-game sweep at the hands of Stanford in a late-season road series, but the Devils rebounded to sweep rival Arizona in the final regular-season series to take some momentum into the post season. They beat Gonzaga once and Cal State Fullerton twice to sweep the NCAA West Regional in Tempe and earn a trip to Omaha.



A devastating offense led by Mike Sodders (.424, 22 HR, 100 RBI), Kevin Romine (.410, 81 R, 27 SB) and Stan Holmes (.366, 14 HR, 82 RBI) set school records for team batting average (.356), home runs (110) and runs (694). Other big contributors were Donnie Hill (.378, 81 R, 22 SB), Ricky Nelson (.345, 18 HR, 68 RBI) and Alvin Davis (.396, 72 R). The bullpen was the strength of the pitching staff. Kendall Carter led the nation in victories with a 19-1 record, mostly in relief. Kevin Dukes, who beat Oklahoma State in the national title game, was 8-2 with 12 saves.

The Sun Devils' explosive offense scored early and often as ASU defeated Texas, 11-2, on the first day of competition. Left fielder Stan Holmes went a perfect 5-for-5 with six RBI and three runs scored as Arizona State scored in six of the nine innings played. A-State starter Kendall Carter pitched five and two-thirds innings of five-hit ball, allowing only two unearned runs in the fifth to pick up the win. 



COLLEGE BASEBALL HALL OF FAME



In July of 2006, Sun Devil legends Bobby Winkles and Bob Horner were part of the first-ever 10 member induction class in the new College Baseball Hall of Fame in Lubbock, Texas.


The Sun Devils' eight Hall of Famers are the second most in college baseball, behind only Texas with nine. ASU leads all Pac-12 schools, ahead of Arizona and USC with three, Washington State with two and UCLA with one.

Players are eligible for the College Baseball Hall of Fame ballot five years after the student-athlete's final collegiate season, not to include


any active player or coach on a professional baseball team roster. Former players must have made an All-American team or an All-League team during at least one year at a four-year institution.

Coaches are eligible after ending their collegiate career, not to include an active coach on a professional team. They must have achieved 300 career wins, or have won at least 65% of their games.













ASU HALL OF FAME



stablished in 1975 to honor the school's most distinguished student-athletes in all sports, the Arizona State University Sports Hall of Fame honors over 200 former Sun Devil student-athletes. The Hall of Distinction, recognizing contributions from coaches and administrators, was inaugurated in 1982 and features over 20 honorees. Plaques describing the athletic achievements of each inductee are displayed on the concourse level of Wells Fargo Arena, while memorabilia and other historical artifacts are on display in the Bill and Judy Schaefer Sports Hall of Fame in the Carson-Student Athlete Center at Sun Devil Stadium.

48 Sun Devil baseball players, some of whom played multiple sports at ASU, have been inducted into the Arizona State Sports Hall of Fame. Bobby Winkles and Jim Brock are both in the Hall of Distinction.

O / ODDIBE MCDOWELL 1983-1984

The first Sun Devil baseball player to have his number retired, McDowell hit a combined .380 with 30 home runs and 31 doubles in his two years in Tempe. His 1984 season, in which he hit .405 with 23 home runs and 117 hits, remains one of the best offensive performances in school history and earned him a spot on the US Olympic team as well as the Golden Spikes Award. Oddibe had his number 0 retired, but legend has it that the digit on his back was actually the letter "O", making him the only player to have a letter retired. McDowell played seven seasons in the Major Leagues after being a First Round pick of the Texas Rangers in 1984.



1 / BOBBY WINKLES 1959-1971

The first varsity baseball coach at ASU, Winkles had his number retired February 25, 1972. Winkles guided the Sun Devils to a 524-173-1 mark from 1959 to '71, including four College World Series appearances. He captured three national championships and was inducted into both the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame and the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He went on to manage in the Major Leagues, leading both the California Angels and the Oakland Athletics. Winkles was honored for his numerous coaching milestones at ASU when the field at Packard Stadium was dedicated as Bobby Winkles Field in 2001.



5 / BOB HORNER 1976-1978

On February 11, 1996, Bob Horner saw his number retired by Arizona State. The first Golden Spikes Award winner in 1978, Horner hit 56 home runs over his three seasons in Tempe. He was the MOP of the 1977 College World Series and the 1978 National Player of the Year. He hit .412 during his senior season and led the Devils to Omaha all three years he played for ASU. Horner was the first pick of the 1978 MLB Draft, going to the Atlanta Braves. He spent 10 years in the Majors, winning the 1978 National League Rookie of the Year Award and playing in the 1982 All-Star Game. He was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



6 / SAL BANDO 1964-1965

February 23, 1996 saw Sal Bando's number retired by the Sun Devils. The MOP of the 1965 College World Series, Bando helped lead Arizona State to Omaha in both of his seasons in Tempe. Bando hit .319 over his Sun Devil career, including .364 in 1964. He played 16 seasons in the Majors, appearing in four All Star Games and winning the World Series three times with the Oakland Athletics. Bando spent eight years as the General Manager of the Milwaukee Brewers after retiring as a player. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



7 / ALAN BANNISTER 1970-1972

A two-time First Team All-American, Alan Bannister had his number retired by the Sun Devils on January 9, 1999. A .355 career hitter, Bannister helped lead the Sun Devils to the 1972 College World Series with his .380 average, 13 home runs and 90 RBI. He rapped out 225 hits during his three seasons in Tempe and went on to play 12 seasons in the Major Leagues. He was the #1 overall pick of the 1973 MLB Draft, going to the Philadelphia Phillies.



7 / HUBIE BROOKS 1977-1978

One of the greatest hitters in Sun Devil history, Hubie Brooks saw his #7 retired by ASU on March 3, 2000. Brooks hit .396 during his career, including .432 in 1978. A member of the 1977 National Champions, Brooks went to Omaha both seasons he wore the Maroon and Gold. Hubie played 15 seasons in the Majors, twice being named to the All-Star Team. He was the third overall pick of the 1978 draft, selected by the New York Mets.



9 / ALVIN DAVIS 1979-1982

Alvin Davis had his Sun Devil #9 retired on May 14, 2006. A four-year player, Davis hit .362 as a Sun Devil, including .395 during the National Championship year of 1981. Davis knocked in 200 runs during his tenure in Tempe and was a sixth round pick of the Seattle Mariners in the 1982 MLB Draft. Davis went on to win the 1984 American League Rookie of the Year Award. He played nine seasons in the Majors and was an All-Star in 1984.



12 / KEVIN ROMINE 1981-1982

On May 14, 2006, Kevin Romine had his number retired by Arizona State. One of only two people in school history to ever hit over .400 twice, Romine closed out his ASU career with a .408 average. A National Champion in 1981, Romine totaled 176 in his two seasons in Tempe. He was a second round pick of the Boston Red Sox in the 1982 MLB Draft and went on to play seven big league seasons.





14 / LARRY GURA 1967-1969

January 18, 1998 saw one of the most dominant Sun Devil pitchers ever have his number retired. Larry Gura compiled a 25-6 career record for ASU, including the 1969 season that saw him go 19-2 with a 1.01 ERA. A two-time National Champion, Gura was a First Team All-American in 1969. He was selected by the Chicago Cubs in the second round of the 1969 Draft and went on to play 16 seasons of big league ball, including his All-Star season of 1980.



16 / PAUL LO DUCA 1993

On January 28, 2005, Paul Lo Duca's #16 was retired by ASU Baseball. Lo Duca spent only one season in Tempe, but it was a memorable one. His .446 batting average in 1993 set the school's single season mark, helping him be named the National Player of the Year by *The Sporting News*. A hitting-machine, Lo Duca totaled 129 hits, 14 home runs and 88 RBI on his way to earning Co-Pac-10 Player of the Year honors. Lo Duca played 11 Major League seasons and was a four-time All-Star, including a starter in the 2006 game.



19 / FLOYD BANNISTER 1974-1976

January 18, 1997 was the day Floyd Bannister, one of the greatest pitchers in Sun Devil history, had his number retired by ASU. Bannister earned 38 wins during his ASU career, including a school record-tying 19 in 1976. He had a career ERA of 1.88 and is second in school history with his 478 career strikeouts. He was a member of two College World Series teams and was a First Team All-American in 1975 and 1976. The first overall pick in the 1976 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros, Bannister played 15 seasons and was named an All-Star in 1982. Floyd was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008.



21 / EDDIE BANE 1971-1973

Eddie Bane had his #21 retired by ASU on February 16, 2000. Bane is ASU's all-time strikeout leader, fanning 535 batters during his career. He is tied for third all-time in school history with 40 wins, and his 11 career shut outs helped him record a career ERA of 1.64. Bane is the only Sun Devil to ever throw a perfect game, turning the trick against Cal State-Northridge on March 2, 1973. A two-time All-American, Bane pitched in two College World Series'. Bane was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Twins in 1973 and played three seasons in the Majors. Eddie was inducted into the College baseball Hall of Fame in 2008 and was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 CWS.



24 / BARRY BONDS 1983-1985

On March 19, 1993, one of the greatest sluggers of all-time had his number retired by Arizona State. Barry Bonds hit 45 home runs during his Sun Devil career, fourth most in school history. An All-American in 1985, Bonds played in two College World Series, setting a record with hits in seven consecutive CWS at-bats. The seven-time National League MVP is baseball's all-time Home Run King with 762 round-trippers. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend during the 2010 College World Series.



24 / MIKE KELLY 1989-1991

Kelly's number 24 was retired on March 8, 2014, and was the last number to be retired at Packard Stadium. The first three-time All-American in ASU history, Kelly was the last Sun Devil to win the prestigious Golden Spikes Award in 1991 and was inducted into the ASU Hall of Fame in 2002. He earned consensus National Player of the Year honors in 1990 after becoming the fifth Sun Devil to join the 80-80 Club with 82 RBI and 83 runs scored. A career .350 hitter, his 46 home runs rank as the second most in ASU history. He was selected second overall in the 1991 MLB Draft by the Atlanta Braves and went on to play parts of six seasons on four different teams in the Major Leagues.



27 / RICK MONDAY 1965

Rick Monday's number 27 was retired by ASU on January 25, 1997. Monday made the most of his one varsity season in Tempe, earning National Player of the Year honors from The Sporting News for the 1965 National Champions. He hit .359 that year and blasted two home runs during the College World Series. Monday became the first ever player drafted by Major League Baseball, as he went #1 overall to the Kansas City A's in the first MLB Amateur Draft in 1965. He pitched 19 seasons in the Majors, twice earning All-Star Game appearances and winning a World Series in 1981 with the Los Angeles Dodgers.



33 / JIM BROCK 1972-1994

The winningest coach in ASU baseball history, Brock had his number retired posthumously on January 21, 1995. Brock, who passed away in 1994 after leading ASU to the College World Series, amassed 1,099 victories in his 23 seasons as head coach. He was a four-time National Coach of the Year and led the Sun Devils to Omaha 13 times, capturing National Titles in 1977 and 1981. Brock coached 15 First Round picks and had his name added to the baseball facilities (Winkles Field - Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark) in 2006. Dr. Brock was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame as well as the ABCA Hall of Fame.



44 / REGGIE JACKSON 1966

Perhaps the most clutch playoff performer in baseball history saw his number retired on January 13, 1990, as Mr. October Reggie Jackson was honored by the Sun Devils. Jackson came to ASU on a football scholarship and decided to walk-on to the 1966 baseball team. Reggie went on to win National Player of the Year honors, thanks to his .327 average and 15 home runs. He led the team in hits, runs and RBI and was drafted #2 overall by the Kansas City A's in the 1966 MLB Draft. He went on become a Hall-of-Fame player, hitting 10 World Series home runs, picking up two World Series MVP trophies and the 1973 AL MVP Award. He was inducted into the baseball Hall of Fame in 1993.



WINKLES FIELD-PACKARD STADIUM AT BROCK

Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark was the home of Arizona State baseball from 1974 through 2014. Known for its wonderful aesthetic features, the outfield wall was lined with palm trees, and just beyond the right-field fence was the award-winning Karsten Golf Course. In left field, sparkling Tempe Town Lake and the Tempe construction boom was visible, and in the distance, the Superstition Mountains offered a picturesque backdrop. But for every bit of beauty that enveloped the facility, there was an equal dose of tradition.

The facility was the home of two national championship teams and 18 NCAA regional tournaments. Arizona State's all-time record at Packard was 1,122-307-1*, for a winning percentage of .785.

In 2012, ASU went 23-6 at home and swept four straight Pac-12 home series' for the first time since 1988 and only the third time in program history (the other came in 1981). Since 2007, the Sun Devils have an astounding home record of 214-39*.

Dimensions of Packard were 338 feet down the lines, 368 feet in the power alleys and 395 to straightaway center. The fence was 10 feet high. Located five feet beyond the center-field wall was the "Green Monster," a 30-foot-high batting eye. Only 25 players ever hit a home run over the Monster.

With a capacity of more than 4,000, Packard had more than 3,000 permanent seats in the main grandstand. Field-level box seats were also available behind home plate. The remaining seats were located on popular grass berms, which ran down the first-base and third-base lines. Berm seating offered outstanding views of the game and provided fans with a different way to watch and enjoy the game.

The Packard Stadium press box, situated atop the grandstand directly behind home plate, included booths for television and radio coverage, as well as space for print media.

In 1995, the Sports Turf Manager Association awarded groundskeeper Brian Johnson and Packard Stadium Field of the Year honors. In addition, a 2003 coaches survey published in *Baseball America* ranked ASU's baseball facilities among the Top 15 in the nation.

Over the years Packard received numerous upgrades, including a practice infield (1997) and indoor hitting facility (1998). The practice infield was donated by the Arizona Diamondbacks and offered a full size infield that was used for various defensive, bunting and baserunning drills. The 6,000 square foot hitting facility was provided by a private donation and included five batting cages and a separate area for speed and movement exercises. A Daktronics scoreboard was installed in left-center field in 1999 and was equipped for graphics, animation and messages on its

matrix board.

Just before the 2003 season, ASU installed a brand new playing surface featuring major league quality drainage and irrigation systems. The playing surface consisted of tiff green grass in the infield and Bermuda grass in the outfield. The dirt portion of the infield was crushed red brick, which can be found at many major league stadiums. The playing surface was annually referred to as one of the nation's best.

A new players' facility, opened in August 2004, included a clubhouse and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility. The clubhouse also included a video room, study area and meeting room.

Packard's existence was made possible through a gift to Arizona State University from Guthrie and Peter Packard. Both were alumni of ASU, and the stadium was a tribute to their late father, William Guthrie Packard, a prominent member of the publishing industry for many years. Mr. Packard served the Shephard Company for 51 years, rising from sales representative to President and Chairman of the Board. He was also active in various community and church affairs in Colorado and Arizona.

The playing surface was named Bobby Winkles Field during a ceremony in 2001. Winkles was the first-ever varsity head coach at Arizona State as he led the Sun Devils to three national titles in his 13 seasons at the helm.

Dr. Jim Brock's name was added to the facility prior to the 2006 season. Brock is the school's all-time leader in victories with 1,099. He led the Sun Devils to two national titles and 13 appearances in the College World Series. He was the head coach from 1972 until his death in 1994.
