Leading Off:

Pac-10 Champion Arizona State will make its 22nd all-time appearance in the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska. This is the second consecutive trip to the CWS for Arizona State, the first back-to-back berths since 1993 and 1994. It is the fourth trip to Omaha since 2005.

National Seed:

Arizona State was named the #1 Overall Seed in the 2010 NCAA Tournament. The Sun Devils earned a national Top Eight seed for the fourth straight season and sixth time since the NCAA began using the format in 1999. This is the first time Arizona State will be the #1 national seed. They have twice been #5 (2007, 2009), #7 (2000, 2004) and #3 once (2008).

Arizona State and the College World Series:

The Sun Devils will appear in their 22nd College World Series, third most in college baseball history. The Devils are 61-36 all-time in Omaha with five national titles, five second place finishes and six third place finishes.

Back Home In Omaha:

ASU Head Coach **Tim Esmay** is very familiar with Rosenblatt Stadium, making six prior appearances as both a player and coach. **Esmay** was a member of the 1987 Arizona State squad that played in the College World Series, teaming with current assistant coach **Mike Benjamin** to form the ASU middle infield (**Esmay** at 2nd and **Benjamin** at short). **Esmay** was also an assistant coach on five different teams that advanced to the CWS (1988, 1994, 2005, 2007 and 2009).

Former Sun Devil player and assistant coach Tim Esmay is in his first season as Head Baseball Coach at Arizona State and 10th overall season with the program. Esmay spent the past five seasons as an assistant coach for ASU Baseball, including the last three as Assistant Head Coach. He played two seasons as an infielder under Jim Brock in 1986 and 1987. Esmay was the head baseball coach at the University of Utah from 1997 to 2004, winning a WAC title and WAC Coach of the Year honors in 1997. In eight seasons at Utah he compiled a 213-235-1 record. Following his playing days, Esmay served as an assistant coach at Arizona State under Jim Brock from 1988 to 1990, then again in Brock's final season of 1994. Esmay has been a part of seven teams that have played in the College World Series in Omaha. He was named the 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Maggi-Cal Super Regional:

The Sun Devils and Arkansas Razorbacks played a Super Regional for the ages, as both games went 12 innings to decide the winner. Arizona State used a **Deven Marrero** walk-off single in the bottom of the 12th to win Game One 7-6. Game Two looked all but over in the bottom of the ninth, as the designated home team Arkansas was down to its final strike, trailing 5-4 in the ninth. But a homer by Brett Eibner tied it, setting up **Drew Maggi** to add his name to Sun Devil baseball lore. With two gone and a man on in the top of the 12th, **Maggi**, who was 0-5 on the night entering the at bat, blasted a rocket off the scoreboard in left center for a two-run homer and a 7-5 ASU lead. **Jordan Swagerty**, who gave up the homer in the ninth, then put away the Razorbacks in the bottom of the 12th to get the win and send the Sun Devils to Omaha.

Back To The 'Blatt:

15 members of the 2010 Sun Devils will be returning to the College World Series, led by **Raoul Torrez**, who will be making his third appearance in Omaha. The senior co-captain saw action in two games in 2007 and three last year. **Jake Borup** and **Brandon Magee** made the trip last year but did not appear in a game.

First Timers:

11 members of the active roster will be making their first trip to the College World Series. Also making their first trips to Omaha are assistant coaches **Travis Jewett** and **Ken Knutson**. **Jewett** is in his ninth year as an assistant coach, first at ASU. He previously coached at Washington State and Gonzaga. **Knutson** is in his first season at Arizona State after spending the past 17 years as Head Coach at Washington. During his tenure with the Huskies, **Knutson** went to the NCAA Tournament six times, twice falling one win shy of a CWS berth. All told, **Knutson** has been involved in college baseball for over 30 years as both a player and coach, and finally has a trip to Omaha and the College World Series.

Walk It Out:

Senior **Kole Calhoun** walked into the ASU record books in Game One of the Tempe Super Regional against Arkansas. **Calhoun** walked five times in that game, tying the single game school record. **Alvin Davis** (1982) and **Fred Nelson** (1967) also walked five times in a game.

Home Cooking:

Arizona State has been a dominant team at home over the past several seasons. In the last two seasons alone, ASU is 72-7 at home, including a 36-3 mark in 2010. Kole Calhoun especially loved hitting at Packard, as he homered in seven straight home games, a streak that ended in Game Two of the Super Regional. Calhoun hit 13 of his 17 home runs at home. The Sun Devils averaged 3,507

2010 vs. 2009:

Consider this: Arizona State's top pitcher from the 2009 team that finished #3 in the country is currently in the starting rotation for the Cincinnati Reds (**Mike Leake**). The #2 starter and Omaha star (**Josh Spence**) missed the entire 2010 season with an injury. ASU's top two hitters in 2009 (**Jason Kipnis** and **Carlos Ramirez**) are both playing minor league baseball and the Sun Devils entered 2010 with a brand new coaching staff. The result? A 52-8 record, the #1 National Seed and a 22nd trip to the College World Series.

Zack Mac-Three:

Zack MacPhee's triple on May 23rd against Oregon State gave him 14 on the season,

passing **Alan Bannister** for the Arizona State single season record. **Bannister**, a 2010 College Baseball Hall of Fame Inductee, set the previous record of 13 in 1971, when college baseball still used wood bats.

Save Me!:

With his two saves at Stanford, **Jordan Swagerty** has taken over the top spot in the Arizona State record books for the most saves in a single season. The previous record was 12, held by **Doug Nurnberg** (1965) and **Kevin Dukes** (1981).

Mitch Lambson, My College Roommate:

Sophomore lefty bullpen ace **Mitchell Lambson** has been outstanding once again for the Sun Devils. **Lambson** has made a Pac-10 high 37 appearances this year, compiling an 8-2 record with three saves. Even more impressive, **Lambson** has totaled 13 holds (entering with lead of four runs or less) and overall has pitched 19 times where he has entered the game with a lead and kept it, but did not receive a win or a save. **Lambson** threw the final five innings of Game One against Arkansas, earning the win in the 7-6 victory in 12 innings. It was his longest relief outing of the season.

Historical Start To A Season:

The 24 straight wins to open the 2010 campaign is the best start in school history. The previous record was set by the 1961 team, who began the year 21-0. The 24-game winning streak also set the mark for the second longest winning streak in school history. The school record for longest winning streak is 32, set in 1972.

Historical Start To A Coaching Career:

With Arizona State's 24-game winning streak to start the 2010 season, Head Coach **Tim Esmay** set a new standard for wins to start a career as Arizona State's head baseball coach. **Jim Brock** held the previous record for best start by a first year coach, going 12-0 to begin his ASU coaching career in 1972. **Pat Murphy** won the first five games of his first season in 1995. **Bobby Winkles** began his career 0-1-1 in 1959, the first year of varsity baseball at Arizona State. **Esmay** also became the first coach in the modern era of Pac-10 play to win a conference title in his first season as head coach.

All-Americans:

Four Sun Devils were named Louisville Slugger All-Americans by *Collegiate Baseball*, led by First Teamer **Zack MacPhee**, who was also named a First Team Rivals.com All-American. **Seth Blair** earned Second Team honors, while **Jordan Swagerty** and **Riccio Torrez** were named to the Third Team. Both **Brady Rodgers** and **Deven Marrero** were named Freshman All-Americans by *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA. **Rodgers** earned First Team honors from the NCBWA, while **Marrero** was named to the Second Team.

Pac-10 Awards Show:

For a record-setting fourth consecutive season, the Pac-10 Player of the Year has come from Arizona State. Sophomore second baseman **Zack MacPhee** was named the 2010 Pac-10 Player of the Year, following the following **Brett Wallace** (2007 and 2008) and **Jason Kipnis** (2009). Junior pitcher **Seth Blair** was named the 2010 Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year, becoming the third straight Sun Devil to win, also a Pac-10 record. Head Coach **Tim Esmay** was named the 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, the fourth straight season the winner has come from ASU. Seven Sun Devils were named First Team All-Pac-10: **MacPhee**, **Blair**, SS/LF **Drew Maggi**, OF **Kole Calhoun**, 1B **Riccio Torrez**, LHP **Mitchell Lambson** and RHP **Jordan Swagerty**. It is the second straight season **Lambson** has earned First Team honors. **Blair**, **Riccio Torrez**, **Maggi**, **MacPhee**, **Calhoun** and **Swagerty** were all honorable mention choices last year. Eight Devils earned Honorable Mention: C **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Jake Borup**, RHP **Merrill Kelly**, SS **Deven Marrero**, RHP **Brady Rodgers**, OF **Johnny Ruettiger**, 3B **Raoul Torrez** and DH

Academic All-Pac-10:

Three Sun Devils earned Academic All-Pac-10 honors, led by sophomore 1B **Riccio Torrez**, who was named to the First Team. Junior RHP **Seth Blair** and junior OF **Matt Newman** were each named to the Second Team. Blair was a First Team choice in 2009, while Newman repeats as a member of the Second Team.

Stopper of the Year Finalist:

Sophomore closer **Jordan Swagerty** has been named one of five finalists for the 2010 Stopper of the Year Award. Swagerty, the only finalist from the Pac-10, has a school record 14 saves this season, most in the Pac-10 Conference.

Golden Spike Semifinalist:

Sophomore 2B **Zack MacPhee** was named one of 30 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award. This is the fourth straight season Arizona State has had a semifinalist.

Sun Devil Grads:

Seniors **Kole Calhoun**, **Raoul Torrez** and **Josh Spence** all earned their BIS degrees from Arizona State on Saturday. The three traveled with the team to Tucson on Friday, then drove back to Tempe on Saturday morning to participate in graduation ceremonies. They then drove back to Tucson, making it in time for batting practice. To cap off the day, **Calhoun** hit his 10th home run of the season during a 12-4 victory.

College World Series Legends:

Four former Sun Devil greats were named to the College World Series Legends Team, named to honor the final year of the College World Series at Rosenblatt Stadium. **Eddie Bane**, **Sal Bando**, **Bob Horner** and **Barry Bonds** all represent Arizona State on the 28-man team. The four ASU greats ties Texas for most players on the team. **Bando** (1965) and **Horner** (1977) both won the Most Outstanding Player award at the College World Series. **Bane** pitched in the CWS in 1972 and 1973, **Bando** appeared in 1964 and 1965, **Bonds** in 1983 and 1984 and **Horner** went to the College World Series in 1976, 1977 and 1978.

Double Up:

The Sun Devils were in a twin-killing mood in the series finale against Washington, turning five double plays against the Huskies to tie the school record. ASU had turned five double plays four other times (2008, 1999, 1989 and 1985).

50-Win Threshold:

For the 48th straight season and 50th overall, Arizona State baseball has surpassed the 30 win total. For the fourth straight year and 31st time overall, the Sun Devils have topped the 40-win mark. This is the 18th time in school history and the second straight year that ASU has won 50 games.

All-Tempe Regional Team:

Six Sun Devils were named to the All-Tempe Regional Team, led by Most Outstanding Player **Kole Calhoun**. **Calhoun** was joined by **Zack MacPhee**, **Deven Marrero**, **Riccio Torrez**, **Seth Blair** and **Merrill Kelly**.

92nd Major Leaguer:

On Sunday April 11, former Sun Devil pitcher **Mike Leake** made his Major League Debut for the Cincinnati Reds, becoming the 92nd Arizona State baseball player to play in the Major Leagues. **Leake**, who was the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, became the 21st player since Major League Baseball began the draft in 1965 to make his big league debut without playing in the Minor Leagues. **Leake** is the first player to accomplish the feat since **Xavier Nady** in 2000, and the first pitcher since **Darren Dreifort** in 1994. He also becomes the third Sun Devil to do it, joining **Eddie Bane** (1973) and **Bob Horner**

On Monday April 19, former Sun Devil infielder/pitcher **Ike Davis** made his Major League Debut for the New York Mets, becoming the 93rd Arizona State baseball player to play in the Major Leagues. **Davis**, who was the 18th pick in the 2008 MLB Draft, becomes the second Sun Devil to make his Major League debut in 2010, joining **Mike Leake**. **Davis** was a three-time All-Pac-10 First Team selection and a Unanimous First Team All-American in 2008. **Davis** was 2-4 with an RBI in his debut. **Davis** homered in the 2007 College World Series.

Swipe Here:

Sophomore **Drew Maggi** has been a stolen base machine in 2010, stealing 35 bases. **Maggi** stole four in the win over Washington State on April 10 to tie the school record for stolen bases in a game. **Maggi** becomes only the ninth player in school history to steal 20+ bases in back-to-back seasons.

The 1-0 win over Oregon on April 1 was a rare occurrence indeed. The last time the Sun Devils were involved in a 1-0 ballgame was back in 2000, when they beat the Oregon State Beavers 1-0 on April 7.

Team Captains:

The 2010 Sun Devils are led by two team captains in the College World Series. Senior **Raoul Torrez** is in his second season as a captain after serving with **Mike Leake** as co-captain last



season. Joining **Torrez** will be senior **Kole Calhoun**. **Torrez** is in his fourth year with the program, while **Calhoun** is in his second.

Turn His Swag On:

On March 21 against Houston, **Jordan Swagerty** proved his worth to the Sun Devils yet again. The ASU closer had spent the first 8.2 innings behind the plate as the starting catcher, but when the Devils needed the door slammed on the Cougars, **Swagerty** was ready. He shed his catcher's gear, grabbed his glove and closed the door on the Cougars, picking up his seventh save of the season. It marked the first time since 2006 that an ASU player caught and pitched in the same inning. The last Sun Devil to do it was **CJ Retherford**, who did it against Prairie View A&M in the 2006 NCAA Tournament in Houston. Just for good measure, **Swagerty** did it again against USC on April 17, catching the first 8.2 innings before retiring the last batter and earning the save.

Award Semifinalists:

Seth Blair has been named a semifinalist for the Pitcher of the Year Award, while **Drew Maggi** has been named a finalist for the Brooks Wallace Award (outstanding shortstop). **Zack MacPhee** has been named a semifinalist for the Howser Award.

Man vs. Food Visits Packard:

Hit Travel Channel show Man vs. Food made a stop in Phoenix, and one of the spots they visited was Packard Stadium. Host **Adam Richman** threw out the first pitch for the Friday night game vs. Houston, then filmed a segment for the show on the field on Saturday. Assistant Coach **Ken Knutson** made a special guest appearance in the episode, which is scheduled to air sometime in June.

Quality Time With A Hall of Famer:

Several Sun Devils got a thrill in Surprise, as they got a chance to meet Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan**. **Ryan**, who is President of the Texas Rangers, was signing autographs for fans as the Devils took the field. He was in front of ASU's dugout, and several Sun Devils were able to shake his hand, pose for a photo or get an autograph before going out for pre-game stretching.

Players of the Week:

Sophomore **Zack MacPhee** was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week, The NCBWA's National Hitter of the Week and a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* following opening weekend against Northern Illinois. It was the third straight season a Sun Devil has been named the Pac-10 Player of the Week following opening weekend. **MacPhee** also earned the award following the San Diego and Washington State games. Sophomore **Jake Borup** was named the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week and a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* following the Cal series. It was the first weekly honor of **Borup's** career. **Drew Maggi** was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week following the Oregon series, the first conference honor of his career. **Riccio Torrez** was the Pac-10 Player of the Week after the USF/UCLA week. **Brady Rodgers** was the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after the Arizona game. **Kole Calhoun** was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week and a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week following the Oregon State series.

Another ASU Hall of Famer:

Alan Bannister will become the sixth Sun Devil in the College Baseball Hall of Fame during Fourth of July weekend in Lubbock, Texas. **Bannister** was a member of the 8-man 2010 Hall of Fame class that was announced by the College Baseball Foundation. **Bannister** played three seasons at ASU from 1970 to 1972, earning First Team All-American honors in 1971 and 1972. The shortstop was a career .355 hitter and was the #1 pick in the 1973 January MLB Draft. He played 12 seasons in the Majors.

Triple The Fun:

On March 9, 1963, the Sun Devils hit six triples in a 12-0 win over Utah State, setting a school record. That record stood for 47 years, until ASU tied it on February 20 during the second game of the doubleheader with Northern Illinois. In ASU's 26-1 win in seven innings, the Devils collected six three-baggers, tying the school record. The NCAA record is seven, set in 1976 and tied in 1992. ASU had not had more than four triples in a game since 1975. The six triples also tied the Pac-10 record, set in 1945. So far in 2010, ASU has tripled 36 times. The school record is 58, set in 1970.

Family Ties:

Arizona State baseball has become a true family affair in recent years. Junior OF **Matt Newman** has Maroon and Gold in his blood, as his father, **Randy**, was a pitcher for the Sun Devils in 1981 and 1982, winning 15 career games and the 1981 National Championship. Last season, **Matt** and **Randy** joined a select list as a father-son combo who both played in the College World Series...Sophomore OF **Johnny Ruettiger** is the nephew of **Rudy Ruettiger**, the former Notre Dame football player who had a movie about his life made...Senior **Danny Duffy** is the brother of former Sun Devil and Major Leaguer **Chris Duffy**, who played for ASU in 2001...Freshman catcher **Kyle Arnsberg** is the son of former Major Leaguer and current Toronto Blue Jays pitching coach





Brad Arnsberg...Freshman shortstop **Deven Marrero** is the cousin of **Chris Marrero**, a rising star in the Washington Nationals' system.

Brotherly Love:

Last season, the Sun Devils boasted a set of brothers who started next to each other in the infield, marking the first time in school history that brothers started next to each other on the diamond. In Omaha, when **Raoul Torrez** manned the hot corner for the Devils and his brother **Riccio** handled first base, they became the first brother duo since 2004 to start a game in the College World Series. The **Torrez** brothers are the fifth set of brothers to suit up for the same Sun Devil team. They are joined this season by **Drew** and **Beau Maggi**, who become the sixth brother tandem to play for ASU. **Drew** enters his sophomore season, while his brother **Beau** begins his freshman year. The other Sun Devil brothers to play on the same teams are **Kevin** and **Pat Dukes** (1980-81), **Dale** and **Larry Eiler** (1976-78), **John** and **Tom Sain** (1973) and **Brett** and **Greg Bordes** (2005-06).

The Mayor of Omaha:

Kole Calhoun had a memorable trip to Omaha for the 2009 College World Series, earning All-CWS honors thanks to his .563 average over the four games. **Calhoun** drove in 11 runs, slugged 1.250 and hit three home runs, including a grand slam. He became only the fourth Sun Devil to ever hit a grand slam at the College World Series, joining **Sal Bando** (1965), **Bob Horner** (1978) and **Michael Collins** (1998). **Calhoun** quickly became a fan favorite at Rosenblatt Stadium, collecting his own cheering section in left field. **Calhoun** will look for re-election in 2010, this time in right field.

School Ties:

Many players on the ASU roster are quite familiar with one another. The Sun Devils have five student-athletes who all attended Brophy Prep in Phoenix. **Raoul** and **Riccio Torrez**, **Drew** and **Beau Maggi** and **Matt Newman** all played on the Brophy baseball team. **Josh Spence**, **Jimmy Patterson** and **Xorge Carrillo** all played for Central Arizona in 2008, while **Patterson** and **Carrillo** also played together at McClintock High School in Tempe, along with **Daniel Milner**. **Josh Moody** and **Zack MacPhee** both played at Sandra Day O'Connor in Phoenix.

Double Duty:

Sophomore OF **Brandon Magee** is no stranger to ASU athletics, playing linebacker for the Sun Devil football team. **Magee** joins **Mike Jones** as recent Sun Devils who played both football and baseball. **Jones** played football from 2005 to 2008, while splitting time with baseball from 2006 to 2008. **Magee** recorded 34 tackles in 2009, including seven for loss with two QB sacks. He also intercepted a pass while playing in all 12 games. **Magee** collected his first career hit against UC Riverside in Surprise.

1,000 Times Yes:

With its 8-0 win over Northern Illinois on February 19, Arizona State recorded its 1,000th victory at Packard Stadium. Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark has been the home field of the Sun Devils since 1974, with the exception of the 2002 season when ASU played at Hohokam Park in Mesa during Packard renovations. ASU has compiled a home record of **1,035-272-1** at Packard Stadium.

Pac-10 Picks:

The Sun Devils were picked to win the Pac-10 Championship by the Pac-10 coaches for the second straight year, proving the coaches correct when they captured the 2010 crown. ASU received seven of the nine first place votes. This was the third time in school history Arizona State has been picked to win the conference, joining 2007 and 2009.

Leader of the Pac:

Since the 2000 season, the Arizona State Sun Devils have been the most consistent program in the Pac-10 conference. Since 2000, ASU leads the Pac-10 in wins (485), conference wins (177), NCAA Tournament appearances (11), Top 25 finishes (10), All-Americans (33), draft picks (80) and First Team All-Pac-10 players (54). The Devils have won four Pac-10 titles since 2000, including 2010.

Feeling The Draft:

Ten members of the Sun Devils were drafted during the 2010 MLB Draft, led by junior RHP **Seth Blair** who was the 46th overall choice by the St. Louis Cardinals in the Compensation A Round of the draft. Entering the 2010 season, 22 members



of the Sun Devils had previously been drafted, including three who had been drafted twice before. Arizona State has had 368 players drafted since the draft began in 1965, most in the NCAA. ASU has 15 draft eligible players on its roster, including **Andy Workman**, who missed the season with an injury, and **Danny Duffy**, who had to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Arizona State's starting catcher is a converted middle infielder and the backup is the closer on the pitching staff.

Nothing is more astounding for the nation's second-ranked team than for Austin Barnes and Jordan Swagerty to be more than adequately handling a position held in recent years by such elite catchers as Tuffy Gosewisch, Petey Paramore and Carlos Ramirez.

Xorge Carrillo, coming from Central Arizona, was the most likely replacement for Ramirez until suffering an early-season forearm injury. So the job went to Barnes, a sophomore who never played catcher while at Riverside (Calif.) Poly High School.

"I never thought I'd be a catcher here," said Barnes, pressed into learning the position last year when backup Andrew Pollak was injured. "They saw my hands were working well in the infield and realized my arm was pretty strong. And they thought I was real slow."

Because Ramirez was an ironman, playing in all 65 games in his only season at ASU, Barnes saw limited time and only 17 at-bats. This season he's started in 24 of 40 games and is on the receiving end of one of the nation's premier pitching staffs.

Coach Tim Esmay, converted from a catcher to second baseman during his ASU playing days, is thankful for Barnes since Carrillo has only been able to make six starts at catcher and none since March 16.

"There are a lot of things to catching," Esmay said. "It's not just catching a ball. It's setting up hitters, knowing how to work with pitchers, the game within the game. He (Barnes) is really starting to grasp that. He's starting to settle in to be a catcher and not just an infielder who's back there catching."

Opponents are testing Barnes, who has caught 19 of 24 runners trying to steal. He picked up loose ball to throw out a San Francisco runner in the ninth inning Tuesday, the same game in which he cleared the bases with a two-out double when the outcome still was in doubt.

"Catching is definitely my first priority," Barnes said. "Making sure I get everything I can out of the pitchers comes first. I've caught these guys for awhile now so I have a pretty good idea what everyone wants to do, what they like to throw, what's their out pitch."

When working with junior Seth Blair as he'll do Friday night at UCLA, Barnes is allowed to call pitches. Otherwise, pitching coach Ken Knutson makes the calls to free the still inexperienced Barnes from that stress.

"He does some really good things back there that allowed him to perform a lot quicker than a lot of guys because he's so athletic," Esmay said. "His hands work well, and he's got a good exchange."

The 5-foot-10 Barnes said he's holding up physically, in part because Swagerty is spelling him once a week. He's hitting .276, good enough for someone at the bottom of the order, with seven doubles.

"We don't ask him to be one of the top hitters," Esmay said. "We're asking him to be the top guy handling the pitching staff and to handle the game. Once you get that idea then you can start settling in from the offensive standpoint. What's nice is we're getting good at-bats from him, not tired at-bats. They are actually getting stronger."

Long Journey To The Hill

Lora Borup could hardly believe her eyes.

Sitting in the stands at famed Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb., last June, a glance to the bullpen revealed a sight that shifted her heart rate into overdrive.

Lora's son Jake, a then-redshirt freshman pitcher, was warming up, perhaps preparing to enter a game on the biggest stage of his life: The College World Series.

"I thought I was going to lose my lunch," Lora Borup said. "I called my sister and said, 'Oh my gosh, they're warming him up,' and then I hung up."

With her insides churning, Lora watched as Jake, the middle child among a trio of boys, loosened his arm up in the 'pen, absorbing all the nervous energy her son may have been feeling at the time.

But then Jake sat down. It wasn't his time yet. And that was OK with his mother.

"Moms live and die with every pitch," Lora Borup said.

She knew there were still plenty of pitches to come.

Destined to be a Sun Devil

For Jake Borup, it seems like it's been a long time since he first draped the maroon and gold jersey over what were then a narrow set of shoulders — a jersey he had been hoping most of his life to wear.

In his current "sophomore" season, the now 22-year-old 6-foot-5, 203-pound pitcher has been perhaps the most solid starter on a rotation without a blemish on its record.

Borup has begun the season — one that features a 20-0 record by the No. 1 Sun Devils, the second-best start in school history — with a 5-0 record coupled with a 2.42 earned run average, lowest among the team's starters.

Not bad numbers by sophomore standards. And Borup is not your typical sophomore.

"I feel like I've been a part of this program for a long time," said Borup as he sits in the dugout in gym shorts and flip flops, a smile slowly climbing up his face. "I've grown up around Sun Devil baseball ... It's been a privilege to play here and a privilege to be a part of."

Borup's story at ASU began in 2005. After playing just two seasons of high-school ball at Mountain View High School in Mesa, he was only recruited locally.

First UA came calling, a tough pill to swallow for Lora Borup, who has worked in the ASU football office for the better part of the last decade.

“I was dying,” Lora Borup said with a laugh. “I was like, ‘I’ll only come to the games you’re pitching, and I can’t cheer for the Wildcats.’ When ASU called we were celebrating, because he’s always wanted to be a Sun Devil.”

Borup enrolled at ASU in the fall of 2005 and decided to redshirt during the ensuing spring baseball campaign.

Putting dreams on hold

In the middle of his first season on the team, one in which he could only practice with his teammates, Borup decided to answer a higher calling.

He shed the maroon and gold practice uniform for a white dress shirt and tie, accepting a Mormon mission call in Charleston, W. Va.

The mission stretched Borup, he said, both physically and mentally. With days full of scripture studying and Gospel sharing that began at dawn and ended well after the sun rested below the horizon, life lessons were gathered in abundance.

“He had matured, and you see that with all missionaries,” Lora said. “He left a young man, but he came back a solid, mature man ready to take on life.”

As if serving a two-year mission across the country wasn’t enough, Borup was also called to serve as Spanish-speaking missionary.

Considering he had quit a Spanish class in eighth grade because it was “too hard,” the Mesa native was nervous at first about the undertaking, but he considered it an opportunity to test himself.

“When you take on a goal or an assignment, it kind of helps you see other aspects of life,” Borup said. “It took me a while to conquer Spanish, but now I’ve gotten that and I’m going to continue to go forward with something else. I couldn’t tell you I loved Spanish when I started, but I’m thankful I’ve had it since I got home.”

With his new language down, Borup threw himself into his missionary work, consumed by a desire to share his faith with others. But thoughts of being back with his team crept into his mind from time to time. How could they not? Being a Sun Devil had been a lifelong dream.

When ASU made its run to the College World Series in 2007, Lora would send Jake newspaper clippings and articles about the team. Sometimes he would walk into a restaurant and say to one of his mission companions, “Hey, that’s my team playing.”

“[The mission] was a great experience, and obviously I would never take it back, but there were times I thought about baseball a lot,” Borup said. “I missed it, but you’ve just got to put that in the back of your mind.”

A missionary family

While missions can be tough work for the young men who embark on them, they can also be trying for the families of the missionaries. Phone calls come just twice a year — one on Mother's Day and the other on Christmas — and e-mails can be sent weekly.

But Lora Borup, a single mother who moved with her three sons to Mesa from California when Jake was 6, has seen them all go on missions, and she knew what it would do for Jake.

"A mission is mentally hard," she said. "That toughens a young person up and helps develop so many wonderful qualities. ... I think the mission did all positive things for him."

Borup said the mission did something else for him as well. It made him fully appreciate what his mother had provided for him and his brothers — the opportunities that were made available and the unending support she continues to rain upon them.

"I never really got an idea of what she had done for my family until I was out on my mission," Borup said. "I realized as I was out on my own providing for myself what an amazing job she did. Growing up, she inspired me ... Seeing her support me the way she did just made the transition back to baseball so much easier."

Jake has also had the support of his two brothers, the older Jeff and the younger Josh.

Jake is four years younger than Jeff but was always eager to prove himself as an athletic equal to his older brother's friends.

"I think Jeff broke Jake's nose a couple times by being rough and playing and everything, so they can compete that way," Lora Borup said. "But they had a 'boy, don't pick on my brother'-type syndrome."

Added Jake: "[Jeff and I] were always growing up arguing who was better at what. ... I thank him, because he always encouraged me to become a better person."

Back to baseball

To say Borup was excited to return to the diamond following his mission would be an understatement.

Arriving home on a Saturday in July 2008, he used Sunday to relax, reunite with friends and family and attend church.

But on Monday, it was time to get back to work.

"The first thing I did when I got back was meet with the coaching staff and make sure everything was good to come back," Borup said. "That Monday and Tuesday, and the rest of the work week on, I just tried to get back into baseball shape. Obviously, it was one of the first things I wanted to do when I got back."

Borup, who grew an inch and gained 30 pounds while on his mission, knew the task in front of him was a tall one. While he was able to keep up his conditioning during exercise time on his mission, getting his arm back to its earlier form was a challenge.

Borup threw just eight innings in his first season back with the Sun Devils, and while he admitted that it was frustrating at times to not be able to contribute more, he said the limited work was valuable.

“Of course you’re disappointed when you can’t help your team out as much as you think you can,” Borup said. “However, I was fortunate to get in the innings I did. It taught me a lot about college baseball and the speed of the game. Those eight innings taught me a lot.”

After experiencing a trip to Omaha with a talented team last season, Borup said he was determined to make an impact when the next season rolled around.

“I just remember him saying, ‘I’m going to work really hard,’” Lora Borup said. “[He said], ‘I’m going to do my best and do my part, and we’ll see how it goes.’”

It has gone well for Borup, who will go for his sixth win of the season during ASU’s Pac-10-opening series with California this weekend.

After biding his time for the past five years, Borup is realizing the potential people like ASU interim coach Tim Esmay saw in the young right-hander before he even stepped on the mound in Tempe.

“I was at University of Utah, so I’ve seen [that] with pitchers that go on missions — it always takes them a year to get back into throwing shape,” Esmay said. “I knew watching him go through his struggles last year that he would have his opportunity the following year.”

The journey to the hill has been a long one for Borup. But while he is beginning to reap the rewards of his dedication to his craft and the sacrifices he’s made, the charismatic pitcher says he’s just getting started.

“If you told me last season I’d be where I’m at at this point, I’d probably say ‘That’s incredible,’” Borup said. “But at the same point, as I’ve gone through it, I feel like I could be doing a lot better. I feel like I have a lot of improvement to do.”

Sounds like that journey is far from over.

Kole Calhoun Leads Sun Devils to Scorching Start

Kole Calhoun can't say precisely why third-ranked Arizona State is nine innings away from matching its best start in school history, but he has a pretty good idea.

For starters, the Sun Devils, who need a victory Friday in their Pac-10 Conference opener against visiting California to tie the program mark of 21-0 set in 1961, are accustomed to hot starts. They are 33-1 over the first three weeks of the last three seasons.

Yet, Calhoun, one of two senior starters and one of three team captains, believes this year's team has also been quick to bond despite its overall youth. Eleven players have made their ASU debut this season.

"We've talked about this being a team, the whole year we are going to play as a team and not be selfish and everyone has bought into it," Calhoun told FanHouse. "Everyone is buying into one idea, working on the process of being a great team."

That brings up another great point.

Many wondered just what kind of team ASU would be this season following Pat Murphy's sudden resignation last November. Murphy, one of the most successful coaches in college baseball during his 16-year tenure at ASU, was forced to resign in the midst of an investigation into NCAA violations.

Former Murphy assistant Tim Esmay took over as interim head coach and provided immediate stability.

Esmay has been quick to credit the players for their approach and work ethic. Calhoun, a hero from last year's College World Series team that finished tied for third, says the Sun Devils are focused on making sure that team expectations don't change. ASU has won five national titles, the last in 1981.

"I don't think a coach can really change the style of play that this school has had for the past 50 years," said Calhoun, who capped the 2009 season with a memorable effort at the CWS, where he hit .563 with three home runs (one was a grand slam) and 11 RBI.

"There always has been, and always will be, a Sun Devil baseball way. We are not going to change how we play baseball and how we have been raised to play the game."

That way is to have fun and play with energy.

What has made ASU's start extra impressive is the Sun Devils are winning minus two key

players from last year's team -- two-time Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year Mike Leake and Pac-10 Player of the year Jason Kipnis. Additionally, senior ace Josh Spence has yet to pitch this season because of soreness in his forearm. His return is still at least two weeks away.

Not to worry.

The Sun Devils, one of two undefeated teams in Division I with UCLA (16-0), are performing well on all fronts. They are hitting .362 as a team, posting a 2.97 ERA on the mound and featuring a solid .969 fielding percentage.

They swept through a strong field at the Coca-Cola Classic in early March, beating Cal Poly, UC Riverside and Florida International. They have registered blowouts and close wins, including last Sunday's 6-5 home win over Houston after nearly squandering a four-run advantage in the ninth inning.

The right side of the infield leads the Sun Devils offensively -- second baseman Zach MacPhee (.484) and first baseman Zach Wilson (.441) are each batting over .400. Junior righty Merrill Kelly is off to a 5-0 start, while sophomore righty Jordan Swagerty has seven saves with a 0.73 ERA.

"It's cool to look right now and see that we are 20-0 but we know we still have a long way to go - the season is a marathon, not a sprint," Calhoun said. "We have to keep getting better every day, come out ready to play and ready to win that day."

Calhoun, an outfielder, is working hard, too.

He's proud to be a team captain and is determined to help leave a positive legacy. Although off to a slow start by his standards -- batting .288 with 20 RBI - Calhoun's mindset hasn't changed. This is his final go-around at ASU and he wants to enjoy every minute.

Calhoun, a junior-college transfer, hit .313 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI last season and earned honorable mention Pac-10 honors. Raised in Buckeye, Ariz. -- his father Gregg was recruited to play baseball by ASU coach Jim Brock in the early 1980s but elected to focus on rodeo -- Calhoun is quick to admit he has been a Sun Devil "my whole life at heart."

Calhoun would love nothing more than to help the Sun Devils win their first national title in 29 years.

ASU went 2-2 in the CWS last year, beating North Carolina twice but losing to Texas twice. The Longhorns scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth to eliminate ASU 4-3. LSU beat Texas in the best-of-three championship series.

"I think that's all the motivation in the world, being that close and almost reaching the goal that you set for your team and yourself," said Calhoun, who is scheduled to graduate in May (Interdisciplinary Studies major).

"This is my last shot in college, so I want everybody to have an opportunity to get to the College World Series, but not just get there, but win the whole thing."

Of course, that means ASU must match its hot start with a strong finish.

Tim Esmay, Seniors Key ASU Baseball's 20-0 Start

Packard Stadium has an entirely different vibe these days.

The lineup card is ready - gasp - hours before first pitch. No one in coaching attire is verbally sparring with a fan. It's high-energy and low maintenance and exactly what Arizona State baseball needed.

The No. 1-ranked Sun Devils open Pac-10 play Friday against California and are just a victory away from tying the school's best all-time start of 21-0. It's a remarkable feat considering the recent instability of this program and a nod to an interim coach and group of players who didn't let a turbulent off-season get the best of them.

Two weeks after Pat Murphy's forced resignation, the athletic department called players together to introduce them to their temporary coach.

"When he walked in the room, it was kind of like, 'Everything's going to be OK,' " pitcher Jake Borup said.

"He" was Tim Esmay, 45, a Valley product with deep ASU ties. He played for Jim Brock in the mid-1980s and had several stops in Tempe as an assistant when he wasn't the head coach at Utah. He worked under Murphy until the end of the 2008-09 season, when he received the surprising news saying his services were no longer needed.

Turns out they were. When Vice President for Athletics Lisa Love and Senior Associate Athletic Director Don Bocchi were looking for a replacement for Murphy, whose resignation was followed by NCAA allegations, they thought of Esmay, who had a hand in the day-to-day operations of the program and who was more even-keeled than the colorful Murphy.

Murphy, now working as a special assistant for the San Diego Padres, was always a divisive figure, pushing buttons in all the best and worst ways. He maintained ASU's great baseball legacy, sending the program to the College World Series four times and numerous talented players to the major leagues.

But in an off-season highlighted by drama and an NCAA investigation, the Sun Devils needed a cooler head. Enter Esmay.

"After (Murphy's exit) everybody was pretty nervous," senior infielder Raoul Torrez said. "We didn't know who was going to come in. When Ez's name came up, everybody pushed for it. It was really comforting knowing it was a Sun Devil."

Esmay brought a different style. Murphy would often hand in the lineup card at the last minute, leaving everyone, including players, guessing. He coached by instinct and the dugout at times was a nervous ball of energy.

With Esmay, there aren't a lot of surprises. Players know where they stand, what to expect in a game and their roles are well defined.

"His communication skills are unbelievable," Torrez said. "There's a lot of trust between the players and him.

"I'm a big believer in you just can't call guys in when they're not doing well," Esmay said. "You've got to call them in when they're doing well and let them know to keep fighting the fight."

This group of players deserves a big nod, too, for the way they rallied.

It's a group with great senior leadership - from Torrez to outfielder Kole Calhoun to pitcher Josh Spence - a rare find these days in a top program.

"The leadership made the transition easy," sophomore Borup said. "I was more worried about the young guys but they looked to our leaders, who have led by example

"It's an us-against-everyone-else deal and we kind of learned that this off-season and I think a lot of the credit should go to those leaders."

It's more than just about feel-good stuff. This team can play. Borup is 5-0 and part of a pitching staff that hasn't even seen the return of Spence (arm injury) yet. The Sun Devils' 2.97 ERA is eighth in the nation and its batting average is seventh (.362).

ASU is balanced, deep and drawing impressive crowds for it being so early in the season.

Esmay, meanwhile, said he isn't preoccupied by the interim tag but would be thrilled if it could turn into something permanent.

"This is the place," he said. "This has always been the place for me."

For now at least, it's a heck of a fit.

Arizona State's Esmay Proving His Worth

LOS ANGELES – Arizona State athletic director Lisa Love might finally have an easy decision to make at the end of the season.

With NCAA allegations hanging over the baseball program and athletic department back in November, Love had the tough chore of confronting long-time coach Pat Murphy. Murphy, in turn, resigned his post with the Sun Devils after 15 seasons with the program.

Though there are plenty of observers and Arizona State fans that realize Love had to make a move, there also are those out there that believe Love overstepped her bounds, jumped to conclusions and forced Murphy out without due process.

So, when this season comes to a close with popular interim coach Tim Esmay in charge, you can bet there will be plenty of observers watching what Love decides to do.

With an interim label this spring, there absolutely is no guarantee that Esmay will remain head coach after the season. He may not even be retained as a coach on next year's staff.

But with the Sun Devils sitting at 37-5 this season after clinching a series win over UCLA on Saturday, there's no question which direction Love and the Sun Devils should go when it comes to their coaching search during the upcoming summer.

The only thing Love needs to do is hand Esmay the keys for good.

"I look at my situation this way, and playing and coaching here has taught me this. Each day you look at the lineup and realize it's so competitive. If you have a chance to play well, you better play well to stay in the lineup. Right now, I'm staying in the lineup and that is a good thing."

Esmay's road to this point has been interesting to say the least.

When Murphy resigned, the Sun Devils were sure they weren't going to go out and start a national search for a permanent head coach in November. For weeks, though, the name of Ken Knutson, who currently is an assistant, was hot and heavy in the discussion for the post of interim head coach.

Lost in the mix, though, was Esmay.

You see, Esmay spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach under Murphy. However, he was let go by Murphy following the 2009 season and his name was mum the couple of weeks after Murphy's resignation.

In the end, Love and the Sun Devils surprised some and decided to give the reigns to Esmay, who is now in his 10th overall season with the program.

The Sun Devils haven't looked back.

"I thought he was going to do a great job from the beginning," Arizona State veteran Kole Calhoun said. "He played here, he coached here under two different great coaches and he knows how we do things around here."

Esmay also knows how to win, too.

That is something Love should remember when making her final decision about the future of the program in the next couple of months.

"I think it would be special [to help Esmay get the head job]," Calhoun said. "You always have a pretty close bond with your head coach. But it's just great that we're able to talk to him about baseball, life and everything else. It is just great to help him get a long-term job."

"This is his [Esmay] dream job. He's taking it and running with it."

Love, meanwhile, is watching.

She should like what she is seeing.

ASU Baseball's Tradition Difficult To Top

It was hard to beat the atmosphere at the Tempe Super Regional on Sunday night.

Arizona State players charged to the middle of the field and dove into a giant dogpile. Packard Stadium fans chanted "A-S-U. A-S-U." Even former Sun Devils football coach Frank Kush was dancing in the stands after ASU's 7-5 victory in 12 innings that translated into another trip to the College World Series.

It was a moment ASU's athletic administration hopes its other sports can capture.

It shows what a program rich in tradition can accomplish. Football. Basketball. Are you paying attention?

"This is the model," ASU Vice President for Athletics Lisa Love said during the game. "This is the heartbeat."

It is not just about success, although that is obviously a huge part of it.

It is the fan base.

Arizona State has led baseball attendance among West Coast universities for the past six years. It never will rival the stadiums in the Southeastern Conference, where college baseball is everything and facilities such as the Razorbacks' Baum Stadium typically bring in 10,000.

But Packard Stadium holds its own. Nearly half of the stadium - 4,500 is capacity - is filled by season-ticket holders. The renewal rate frequently hits 99 percent. One year, all but one season-ticket holder renewed.

"Why is that?" the coach asked.

The person died, he was told.

ASU baseball's loyal fan base is an impressive feat considering all the competition in town for the sports-entertainment dollar. There are Major League Baseball's Diamondbacks to consider, not to mention an NBA season that can stretch into June.

With weather that often hits triple digits midway through the season, fans have an abundance of built-in excuses not to come.

They come anyway.

That's what a rich tradition steeped in success can do for you.

The Sun Devils own five national titles, the first in 1965 and the most recent in 1981.

They are in the hunt for a strong postseason push almost yearly, always giving ASU fans a reason to come.

Winning cures a lot of ills.

It's a definite chicken-and-the-egg situation at work, too. This base gives the Sun Devils a home-field advantage. ASU, 51-8 going into Sunday's game, didn't lose a game at Packard until two months into the schedule and lost just three here overall.

These fans can be a raucous bunch at times, but they definitely provide an energy boost for the team.

"There's a real sense of community," Love said.

With a super conference likely in the near future, attendance becomes even more important - for all programs. The recruiting landscape is about to change and strong home support can only help.

Additionally, better revenue streams will be needed. Schools such as Texas and Texas A&M pay their coaches and assistants big-time salaries.

For ASU to survive in the new-look college-football landscape, it will need its fans to step up. Just like baseball's have.

"I don't think people appreciate enough how entertaining these games can be," said Phoenix's Sue Friedman, who attended Sunday's game with her daughter. "You get to know the people around you and you're watching a lot of players who will be stars someday."

Packard is an aesthetically pleasing park. Palm trees line the outfield walls, and the berm seating down the first- and third-base lines is a popular option. Like any park, it can use more upgrades but for now, fans seem to be enjoying it just fine.

A winning program will do that for you.

ASU Baseball Team Continues To Make Magic

You knew it would happen.

If you watched Arizona State baseball at all this season, you knew this little engine that could, this team void of superstars but not heart, would pull it out.

It took 12 innings but the Sun Devils did. ASU 7, Arkansas 6.

Designated hitter Deven Marrero drove a line drive to left-center for the game winner.

"That's one of my best hits," he said. "I'll never forget that."

Nor will his teammate, Kole Calhoun, who scored the winning run.

"I knew it was going to be like this," Calhoun said. "That was a fun baseball game."

Once again, the Sun Devils received contributions from a variety of places. And not just the obvious ones.

There was Calhoun, who doesn't get enough credit for his patience at the plate. He was 1 for 2 with five walks and one RBI. He also scored three runs.

There was Mitchell Lambson, who pitched the final five innings, allowing just one hit while striking out seven.

It was a rare temperate evening for a June baseball game in Tempe and the perfect night for the past to meet the present.

Among the fans watching was Bobby Winkles, the university's first baseball coach who laid the foundation for this program's success and won three national titles in his 11 seasons.

"They're a very balanced team," he said during the game. "There is a lot to like about them."

Winkles, 80, would know. He had his share of talent here, playing like Reggie Jackson and Rick Monday.

This team is different. It is lacking in superstars, which may sound like a backhanded compliment but it is more a nod to its versatility and selflessness.

On any given night, a different player steps up. Early in Saturday's game it was catcher Austin Barnes, who thwarted two Arkansas attempts to steal.

What impressed Winkles most about this team was its poise, a trait it once again displayed in this game, rallying from a two-run deficit to send the game into extra innings.

It's a credit to Coach Tim Esmay.

"He doesn't get too excited," Winkles said. "You have to keep your emotions chest-high. Plus, he's assembled as good a staff as there in the country."

ASU needed that poise because there was a fair share of drama late in the game.

In fact, it appeared the Sun Devils would get their magic done in the ninth.

With the bases loaded and two outs, ASU's Johnny Ruettiger grounded into a fielder's choice. The throw to second was close. The crowd held its collective breath and glared at the umpire near second as Zack McPhee scored.

Out at second

The fans booed.

In the bottom of the 10th, the Razorbacks, who had some fielding issues during the game, came up big. Bo Bingham made a huge catch of a popout to centerfield despite a collision with shortstop Tim Carver as both dove.

In the top of the 11th, Lambson took care of business on the mound, striking out James McCann, Matt Vinson and Tim Carver, all swinging.

ASU may have come into this game as the top-seeded team in the tournament but Arkansas is certainly no slouch.

Eight players from the team were taken in major league baseball's first-year player draft last week. Three of the top four hitters were selected in the first five rounds.

The SEC is an impressive conference. Florida already has qualified for the College World Series and Alabama, South Carolina and Vanderbilt are all a victory away from advancing.

ASU will do its best not to let the Razorbacks be another.

Winkles said this postseason field is as good as any he has seen in a long time.

"But ASU has such a good mix of players that you can't count them out," he said. "It takes a little bit of luck as this stage but it also takes defense and pitching. We have that. Everyone thinks it's just about hitting but it's about a lot more than that."

It was about a team void of superstars stepping up to the challenge.

It was about winning the first game of a super regional.

Gift of the Maggi Sends ASU to Omaha

The gift of the Maggi was a long time coming, but it was good enough to advance top-seeded Arizona State to its 22nd College World Series.

Leadoff man Drew Maggi, who was just 4 for 25 in the postseason, blasted a two-run home run in the top of the 12th inning to give the Sun Devils a 7-5 win over Arkansas and a two-game sweep in a hotly-contested series that included 24 innings and eight and a half hours of baseball.

Suffice it to say, every run mattered between these two teams.

"Arkansas gave us all that we could handle," said Sun Devils coach Tim Esmay, who only recently had the "interim" removed from his title.

Game 2 was a mirror image of Game 1, though the Sun Devils found a way to win both. In Game 1, ASU tied the game in the bottom of the ninth with two outs. On Sunday, playing as the home team, the Razorbacks returned the favor with two outs in the bottom of the ninth when Brett Eibner blasted a hanging slider on a 1-2 pitch from dominant closer Jordan Swagerty over the left field fence to tie the game at 5-5.

"Brett just hammered it," Arkansas coach Dave Van Horn said. "I just wish somebody would have been on base."

In the opener, the Razorbacks pounded ASU ace Seth Blair. The Sun Devils provided the same rough treatment to Arkansas' Drew Smyly. They jumped to a 4-0 lead on three home runs, a pair of solo shots by Zach Wilson and a monstrous two-run rip from Riccio Torrez that hit the top of the scoreboard in left center.

Smyly, who didn't start Game 1 because he's nursing a blister on his left, throwing hand, wasn't himself. He only lasted 4 2/3 innings.

But, just like Mitchell Lambson picked up Blair with five quality innings, so did D.J. Baxendale do the same for Smyly. The freshman allowed just one unearned run over 6 1/3 innings.

Swagerty (2-0) blew the save but got the win, striking out seven in 4 1/3 innings. The home run was the only real damage Arkansas did to him.

While ASU jumped ahead with an early power show, Arkansas only needed a leadoff single to plate two runs in the fourth. Sun Devils starter Merrill Kelly suddenly lost his control, walking two and hitting two with pitches.

Defense was a difference in the series. Arizona State had one error in two games; the Razorbacks had five, which cost them two unearned runs in Game 1 and one in Game 2.

And one of the biggest plays of the game was a outstanding defensive effort by the Sun Devils in the seventh. With runners on first and second, Andy Wilkins flew out to right field. The runners tagged, but Eibner got caught between first and second. A rundown commenced, at which point Zack Cox tried to sneak home. But Torrez saw Cox make his break and nailed him at the plate.

Between the early power show and Maggi's blast, ASU struggled to get a big hit. Twice - in the second and fifth inning -- the Sun Devils has runners on second and third and couldn't get them home. In the eighth, they had the bases loaded with one out but Torrez hit into a double play. After stranding 19 in their 7-6 victory in Game 1, they left 14 on in Game 2.

Arizona State, which has been to four College World Series since 2005 and finished third last year, improved to 52-8. Arkansas finished its season at 43-21.

Esmay, 45, was hired in December to replace the controversial Pat Murphy, whose contract was terminated without cause in November in the wake of an NCAA investigation into the program. While his players throughout the year have talked openly about their singular goal to win the school's first national championship since 1981, Esmay has emphasized not looking "past the process" as well as "enjoying the ride."

"It's not been easy, but it sure is a lot of fun," he said.

June Brings Calhoun Heat Wave

Last June, before his team headed to Omaha for its 21st appearance in the College World Series, Arizona State outfielder Kole Calhoun was unhappy. The object of his ire was Major League Baseball.

MLB was ignoring him. Or playing hard to get. While it seems that everyone who plays for the Sun Devils, almost as a rule, gets drafted, Calhoun didn't in 2009.

"I told my [academic] adviser that I'm just going to go and be the player of the College World Series," Calhoun said. "I was angry. Not angry. But I felt like I had a chip on my shoulder and I had to go prove myself. And what better stage to try to do that?"

There is none, and on the biggest stage in college baseball, Calhoun went nuts, going 9-for-16 -- a cool .563 clip -- with three home runs and 11 RBIs. His slugging percentage was a robust 1.250.

It wasn't enough, though. The Sun Devils, who won the last of their five national titles in 1981, finished third.

Those CWS numbers capped a postseason when Calhoun went 17-for-37 (.459) at the plate with 18 RBIs. Considering that Calhoun hit .364 with three homers and six RBIs as the Sun Devils swept through three games in last weekend's Tempe NCAA Regional, it might be reasonable to officially name the senior, "Mr. June."

That's a fine title and everything, but it's not the one Calhoun and his teammates are most interested in as they prepare to face Arkansas (43-19) in a three-game series in Packard Stadium, with Game 1 starting at 9 p.m. (ET) on Saturday.

ASU's goal is singular this postseason. The top-seeded Sun Devils (50-8) are not just happy to be here. They won't be satisfied with just another trip to Omaha. They feel there's only one happy ending to the season.

"It's something we've been telling the guys the entire season," said Calhoun, one of three team captains. "It's Omaha and win the whole thing or it's bust. That's why we all came here to play -- to win a national championship."

Calhoun believes last year's squad was fully capable of winning the national title, but the starting pitching, most notably current Cincinnati Reds sensation Mike Leake, faltered and the bullpen wasn't deep enough to pick up the slack.

This year, the Sun Devils' starters are fresher and the bullpen is outstanding, led by closer Jordan Swagerty (2.05 ERA, 14 saves).

But that's not the only reason Calhoun is optimistic about ASU's chances. He thinks the team's state of mind was different last year.

"We wanted to win the whole thing but I kind of think the whole mantra of the team was, 'OK, we're here.' It wasn't a burning desire to win the thing," he said.

Calhoun's state of mind is pretty good at present, too. Not only is he hanging up big numbers again this postseason, he didn't require a chip on his shoulder to make it happen: He was one of 10 Sun Devils drafted this week, going in the eighth round to the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim.

So he's feeling chipper. Moreover, if he should lose his groove, he might know how to recover it. After he graduated a month ago, his grandfather gave him a journal/organizer so he could record his thoughts. It's probably not surprising most of those focus on hitting.

Here's an entry: "Dear Diary: I continue to knock the pooh off the ball. Isn't it great there's an In-N-Out Burger right across the street from Packard!"

Kidding.

Mostly Calhoun, who earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors as a right fielder, keeps track of the nuances of hitting -- what he's thinking, what he's doing with his hands, his stride, etc. Considering he's been on a hot streak since he started jotting things down in the journal, it figures to come in handy if he finds himself struggling when he joins a minor league team.

"Every time I might get into a slump or something I can go back and read what I was thinking and what I was doing when I was on this hot streak," he said.

Still, he doesn't claim to have tapped into some well of hitting wisdom. While he asserts he's not superstitious, like most baseball players he pleads ignorance as to why he's presently in the hitting zone.

And Mr. June isn't about to question it.

"I can't really attribute it to anything, but I'll just keep trying to ride the hot streak," he said. "If I keep getting hot in the playoffs, that's fine with me because that's when it really counts. That's when we're trying to win championships."

Last year, Calhoun finished hot and unhappy. At present, he's hot and happy and hoping to stay that way.
