# SEASON IN REVIEW





## SUN DEVIL 2007-2008 HIGHLIGHTS

•Posted a 20-win season (21-13) for just the fourth time in 27 years after being picked ninth in the Pac-10 media poll. Notched nine Pac-10 wins for the third time in the past 13 seasons and had six wins over RPI top-60 teams Xavier (9), Stanford (14), USC (28), Arizona (twice,

37) and Oregon (58).

•Had two All-Pac-10 selections (first-team pick James Harden and third-team pick Jeff Pendergraph) for the first time since Sun Devils Eddie House, Bobby Lazor and Mike Batiste all earned the honor in 1998-99.

•Won a school-record 15 home games (15-5), including wins over NCAA teams Coppin State, Xavier, Oregon, Arizona, Stanford and USC and NIT wins over Alabama State and Southern Illinois.

> ·Sun Devil freshmen made a leagueleading and school record 96 starts, played more than 47 percent of the minutes and accounted for more than 52 percent of the scoring as ASU's 13-win improvement was tied for the best in the nation.

•TV ratings on FSN Arizona enjoyed an increase of 196% over the previous season. The 15 Sun Devil games on FSN AZ averaged a 1.5 rating/3 share in the Phoenix market (an average of 27,039 households in the Valley).

• James Harden, the youngest player

in the Pac-10, had an ASU freshman record 16 20-point games (thirdbest in Pac-10), led the Pac-10 with 73 steals (three shy of ASU record and a Sun Devil freshman record) and averaged 17.8 points (tied for fifth in Pac-10), second-best by a freshman in ASU history and eighth-best by a freshman in Pac-10 history. He became just the fifth freshman to lead the Pac-10 in steals and is the first freshman in league history with 70

steals and a

17.0 points per game average. He also notched 20 points in five straight games from Dec. 29-Jan. 17, a first for an ASU freshman.

•ASU became just the fifth team in 30 years of the Pac-10 to go from a last-place finish (2-16 in 2006-2007) to a .500 record in conference play the next year (9-9).

•ASU's four overtime wins (4-0) was the most by an ASU team since 1985-86. ASU won overtime games over LSU in Maui, at California, vs. Arizona and Stanford (in Tempe).

•Jeff Pendergraph became the 30th member of the ASU 1,000-point club against USC on March 1. He has 1,065 points in 90 career games (11.8 ppg.). He also has 652 career rebounds (7.2 pg.), just four away from joining ASU top-10 list.


•Last season marked the first time in the 25year history of the Pac-10 Player of the Week award three separate Sun Devils took home the honor (Jeff Pendergraph, Ty Abbott and James Harden).

•Ty Abbott set ASU freshman records for starts (34) and three-pointers made (76). The 76 three-pointers is fourth-most by a freshman in Pac-10 history.

•Shot .739 from the free throw line, the fifthbest mark in ASU history and second-best in past 21 seasons.

•Team posted a 3.18 GPA in spring of 2008 and its cumulative GPA for the roster is now 2.98.

•Beat seventh-ranked Stanford 72-68 in overtime on Feb. 14 despite trailing by 14 in the second half and by seven with 1:49 left. It marked the highest ranked opponent ASU has beaten since its 90-87 overtime win at No. 4 Stanford on Jan. 31, 1998, and earned its first win over a top-10 team since Jan. 23, 2002 (88-72 win over No. 10 Arizona in Tempe)



# SUN DEVIL 2007-2008 HIGHLIGHTS



- •Ranked in the Associated Press poll for the first time since the final poll of the 1994-95 season (March 13) as ASU was No. 22 (No. 25 in ESPN poll) on Jan. 14 and then was 24th in the AP poll on Jan. 21.
- •Played back-to-back regular season games against top-10 teams for just the second time in school history with games vs. sixth-ranked Washington State (Jan. 26) and at fifth-ranked UCLA (Jan. 31). The only other time was when ASU fell to fourth-ranked Arizona (93-74) on Jan. 3 and then fell to fourth-ranked Stanford (63-62) on Jan. 8, 2004.
- •Won its fourth straight game at California with a wild 99-90 double-overtime win on Jan. 17, 2008. James Harden (27), Jeff Pendergraph (26) and Ty Abbott (25) became the first trio of Sun Devils to score 25 points in the same game since Jan. 4, 1977, when ASU beat Portland State 115-92.
- •Beat Arizona 64-59 in overtime on Jan. 9, the program's first win over the Wildcats since 2002, which ended a 12-game losing streak to Arizona. Came back from 22-6 deficit to then win at Tucson for the first time since March 11, 1995, and earned first season sweep over Arizona since 1994-95 season and sixth in 30 seasons of Pac-10 play.
- •Beat Oregon State 72-53 on Jan. 5, the program's biggest margin of victory in a Pac-10 game since a 108-78 win over USC on Feb. 13, 2003.
- •Started Pac-10 play 4-0 for just the third time in program history with wins over Oregon, Oregon State, Arizona and at California.
- •Won its Pac-10 opener, 64-59 over Oregon on Jan. 3, for just the fourth time in 20 seasons.
- •Set a school record by making 73.3 percent of its three-pointers (11-of-15) against Saint Francis (Pa.) on Dec. 29 and shot 72.1 percent (31of-43) from the field in that game, second-best in school history.

•Won 10 straight games from Dec. 5 until Jan. 17, the longest Sun Devil win streak since the 1980-81 team won 11 straight.

•Beat No. 17 Xavier 77-55 on Dec. 15, the largest margin of victory over a ranked team in school history. It also marked ASU's highest ranked win over a non-conference foe since ASU beat seventh-ranked Maryland 97-90 on Nov. 23, 1994, in the Maui Invitational.

•Scored 54 points vs. Florida Gulf Coast on Nov. 28, the most points in the first half since a 58-30 lead against USC on Feb. 13, 2003.

•Outrebounded Cal Poly by 29 on Nov. 26 (52-23), ASU's largest rebounding margin since a 49-19 margin vs. American-Puerto Rico on Nov. 26, 1997. Also held Cal Poly to 14-of-55 (.255) from the floor, its best defensive effort since Dec. 2, 2000, when it held NCAA Tournamentbound BYU to just 15-of-59 (.254), but then ASU held Delaware State to just 20.8 percent on Dec. 5 (11-of-53).

•ASU started four freshmen (Ty Abbott, James Harden, Jamelle McMillan and Rihards Kuksiks) against against No. 17 Xavier on Dec. 15 for the first time in school history.

•Ty Abbott, James Harden and Jamelle Mc-Millan all started the opening game against Illinois on Nov. 19 in the Maui Invitational, the first time three freshmen had started the season opener for ASU. ASU went 2-1 in Maui with wins over Princeton and LSU.
