



ARIZONA STATE 2006-2007 HIGHLIGHTS

- •Sophomore Jeff Pendergraphearned honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors after finishing second in the league in rebounding in both Pac-10 (8.9) and overall (9.1) games, and also finished second in field goal percentage (.553 in Pac-10 and .555 overall). He posted eight double-doubles and also led teaminch arges drawn (19) and the Herb Sendekstaff category of deflections (234). Pendergraph grabbed 19 boards at Oregon (Feb.8) and vs. Colgate (Dec. 19), the most by a Sun Devilsince Mike Batiste had 20 vs. Wagner on Nov. 19, 1997. His 9.1 rebounding mark is the second-best by a Sun Devilin 26 seasons and his 3.93 of fensive rebounds in 30 games led the league.
- •Squadnotcheda 2.88 gradepoint average in the fall of 2006 and raised its cumulative GPA to 2.83 at that time, its highest in six years.
- •The trio of Serge Angounou (B.A., Spanish), Robby Alridge (B.A., Sociology) and Allen Morill (B.I.S., Theatre and Communications) joineds even other Sun Devilmen's basket ball players who have earned their degrees in the past three years.

•Atriooffreshmenaccountedfor 69 starts, as Christian Polkhad 26, Jerren Shipp 22 and Derek Glasser 21. They combined to average 87.3 minutes per game.

•Fourteen of ASU's final 15 games were decided by 10 points or less, including its final 10 games. ASU was in 14 games decided by five points or less (including eight in Pac-10), the most by a Sun Devils quadin 23 years. In addition, ASU led the Pac-10 in games of 10 points or less (21).

- ASU's 68-58 win over No. 22 USC was its firstvictoryoverarankedteamsinceMarch20, 2003, when ittopped No. 19 Memphis in the NCAATournament. Its napped a 22-gamelosing streaktoranked teams and was the 30 thwin over aranked team in Herb Sendek's 14-year career.
- ASUfinished third in Pac-10 games in scoring defense at 61.7 points per game, and the other tops ix teams were NCAAT our naments quads.
- •ASU gave upjust 61.8 points per game over all, the fourth-best markin ASU history and the lowest since the 1949-50 squad gave upjust 59.8. ASU also was fourth in Pac-10 games in field goal percentage defense (.437) and three-point field goal defense (.353).



•ASU's four true freshmen averaged 92.1 minutes pergame (23.0 perplayer), second-most in ASU history behind only the 1999-2000 squad which had six freshmen play 96.8 minutes per game. Jerren Shipp's 30 minute pergame marken ded third on the ASU freshmen list, behind only Byron Scott (32.3 in 1979-80) and Ike Diogu (32.2 in

2002-03).

•ChristianPolk's64three-pointersiseighth-bestbyafreshmen in Pac-10 history and second only to ASU's Ron Riley, who had66asafreshmenin 1992-93. Hisfour 20-point games is four th-best by a freshmen in ASU history.

- Derek Glasser, elected the team's Most Improved Player, averaged 32.2 minutes in league play, the third-most by a freshmen in ASU's 29-year league history. He was 16-of-32 (.500) from the three-point stripe in the final nine games.
- •Coach Sendek watched three of his former assistant coaches reach the NCAAT our nament as head coaches, as Charlie Coles (Miami of Ohio), Sean Miller (Xavier) and Thad Matta (Ohio State) all coached in March Madness with Matta reaching the Final Four.
- •The Sun Devils posted 23 offensive boards against Oregon State on Jan. 13, its most in a Pac-10 games inceithad 24 at Washington on Jan. 11, 2001.
- •ToppedColgate52-36onDec.19,thefewest pointsbyanASUopponentsincetheUniversity ofWashingtonatSt.LouisfelltoASU47-34in the 1949-50 season.
- •ASUstartedthreefreshmen (Derek Glasser, Jerren Shippand Christian Polk) against Iowa on Nov. 25 for the first time since Feb. 12, 2000, when Kyle Dodd, Shawn Redhage and Tommy Smithstarted at Washington. It was just these condtime in 15 seasons three freshmen started for ASU, although it would happen 11 times on the year.
- Jerren Shipphad 23 points and Christian Polk had 22 in the opening game against Northern Arizona on Nov. 13, marking the top two games by a Sun Devil freshman in an opener. With Polk and Shipp starting, it marked just the second time in 15 seasons two freshmen had started the opening game. Eleven freshmen have now started season openers in the past 20 seasons (1987-88 to 2006-07) and four times in that span a pair of freshmen have started.
- •The Nov. 13, 2006, opening game against Northern Arizonamatched the second-earliest starting date in school history, topped only by the Nov. 10, 2000, game against Tulsain the NABC Classic held in Raleigh.




