





ASU's 40-Year Holiday Tournament

Arizona State hosted an annual holiday tournament for 40 years. Through the years it operated under several names, such as the Sun Devil Classic (1963-'69 and 1974-'76), the Fiesta Classic (1977-'83), the Kactus Klassic (1984-'88), The Tribune Classic (1989-1997) and the Fiesta Bowl Classic (1998-2004) and Sleep America Classic (2005-2006). ASU's annual tourney began in 1963 and ran continuously from 1974-2007.

In the 40 tournaments, a number of outstanding players from around the nation competed in this Tempe tradition. Top names include 2001 NBA first-round draft picks Brandon Armstrong of Pepperdine and Rodney White of Charlotte, Kerry Kittles of Villanova, Earl Boykin of Eastern Michigan, Erick Dampier of Mississippi State, Rick Mount of Purdue, Greg Ballard of Oregon, Rudy Tomjanovich of Michigan, Greg Anderson of Houston, Byron Larkin of Xavier, and Alec Kessler and Litteral Green of Georgia. And, of course, Sun Devil stars like Eddie House, Mario Bennett, Jumpin' Joe Caldwell, Fat Lever, Lionel Hollins, Ron Riley, Byron Scott and 2005 NBA Lottery selection Ike Diogu all were chosen tournament MVPs.

Arizona State won 29 of the 40 events, including 13 of the final 18, with championship victories against Georgia, Texas, Northwestern, Detroit Mercy, Villanova, Vanderbilt, Eastern Michigan, Penn State, Northwestern, Nebraska, Valparaiso and Northern Arizona. ASU advanced to the championship 32 of the final 33 years, and 37 of 40 overall (the only exceptions in 1966, 1969 and 2000). ASU's all-time record in the tournament was 66-14 (.825).
