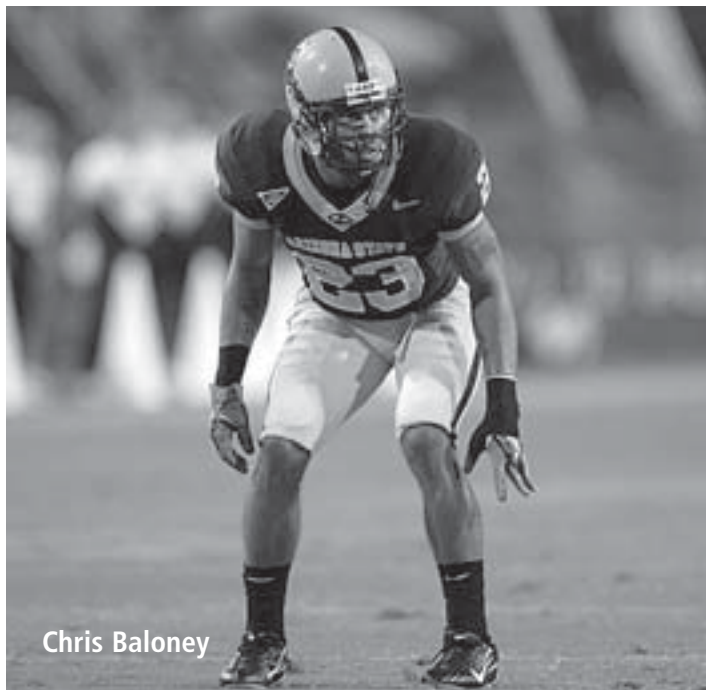

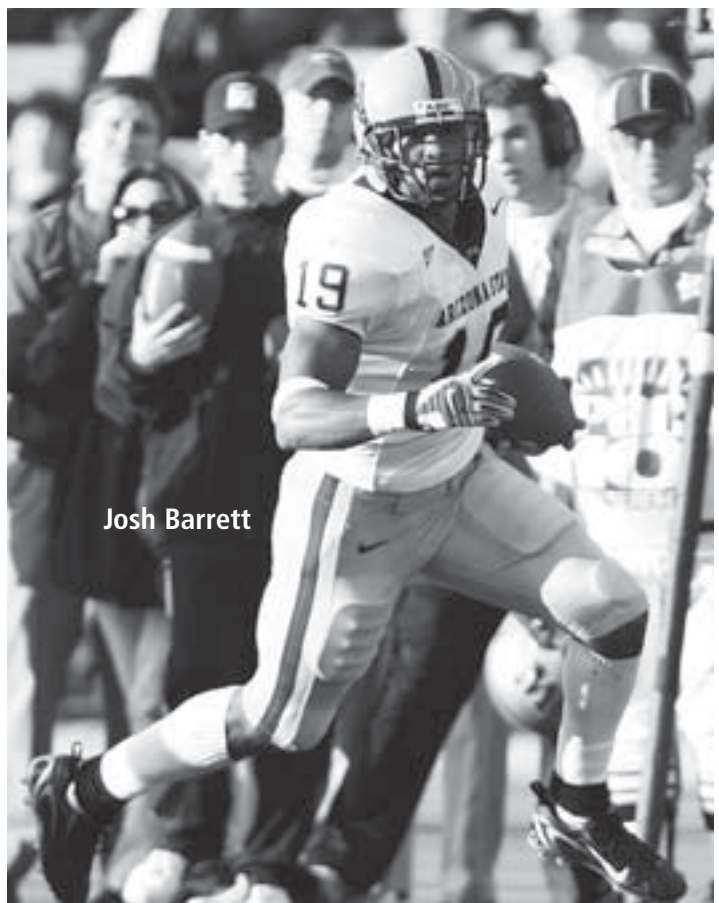

ASU: One of the most versatile athletes and one of the top all-purpose threats in the nation...has been ASU's "jack-of-all-trades", having played wide receiver, tailback, cornerback, kickoff and punt returner and has thrown a touchdown pass during his Sun Devil career...moves back to wide receiver full-time, after spending time also playing cornerback in 2006...was limited due to injury last season but enters 2007 in full health and is poised to be ASU's top receiving threat...exited the spring as ASU's starting slot receiver and had game-highs of seven receptions for 72 yards in the Sun Devils' spring game...is the only active player in the Pac-10 Conference with over 1,000 career rushing and receiving yards...has accumulated 2,991 career all-purpose yards with 15 total touchdowns on 375 total touches (223 carries for 1,051 yards and six touchdowns; 91 receptions for 1,069 yards and nine touchdowns; 31 punt returns for 233 yards; 30 kickoff returns for 638 yards)...averages 90.6 all-purpose yards-per-game for his career...has appeared in 33 games with 20 starts, the most starts among active Sun Devil skill position players...is an excellent special teams coverage athlete as well, totaling 12 career tackles (10 solo) between time spent as a defensive back and on special teams...listed as the No. 36 wide receiver in the nation and a preseason second-team All-Pac-10 selection by Phil Steele's College Football Yearbook.
