#### Tim Esmay



Head Coach **Position: Experience:** 14 Years at ASU

Former Sun Devil player and assistant coach Tim Esmay is entering his fifth season as Head Baseball Coach at Arizona State and 14th overall season with the program.

Coach Esmay owns an overall coaching record of 381-305-2, including a 168-70-1 mark at Arizona State. His .810 winning percentage over his first 100 games at Arizona State is the second highest in school history.

In the past four seasons under coach Esmay, the Sun Devils rank 1st in slugging percentage, fewest sacrifice bunts and home runs per season, and 2nd in batting average, hits per season and RBI per season. Click here for a full rundown of where the Devils stack up against the Pac-12 since 2010.

In his four seasons at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball team, coach Esmay has guided ASU to the second-highest regular-season winning percentage in the Pac-12 since 2010. His record of 168-70-1 (.703) is just behind UCLA (183-74, .712), but ahead of Oregon State (165-76, .684) and Oregon (163-83-1, .662). Coach Esmay has posted a winning record in the 78 games he has played against top-25 teams (43-35) and also has a winning record against four of the top teams in the Pac-12, including Arizona (11-9), Oregon State (7-6), Oregon (7-5) and UCLA (7-5).

Coach Esmay served as an assistant coach (hitting coach) for the 2013 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team. Under his guidance, he has sent nine Sun Devils to play for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team since 2007, including one in each season, which is the longest streak among all schools.

He is one of just 10 Pac-12 coaches all-time to guide their teams to consecutive College World Series appearances (09-10), moved to 11-6 all-time in the postseason, including 8-2 in Regional play.

Coach Esmay joins former Sun Devil head coach Jim Brock as the only two managers in school history to lead the Sun Devils to the postseason in three of their first four seasons in Tempe.

Thirty-eight Sun Devils have been taken in the MLB Draft in coach Esmay's four seasons at ASU, which is the most of any Div. I school in that time span and five more than the next closest team, Florida. Coach Esmay produced an NCAA-best 10 selections in the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft, including five in the first five rounds for the first time in program history since 1984.

Since coach Esmay's arrival in 2010, ASU leads the Pac-12 in First Team All-Conference selections with 20, two more than UCLA and Arizona, who each have 18. Oregon State has 14, followed by Oregon and Cal with nine, Stanford with seven, Washington State with four and USC with two.

He has twice orchestrated six three-game series sweeps in a single season in his four-year tenure after the feat had only been accomplished 10 times in the 30 years prior to his arrival. The Sun Devils also recorded four straight Pac-12 home series sweeps in 2012 for the first time since 1988 and only the third time in program history.





Esmay turned in one of the most memorable debut seasons at a school in history in 2010. After being named interim head coach on December 3, 2009, Esmay made his debut as Arizona State's head baseball coach on February 19, 2010, an 8-0 win over Northern Illinois. That started a winning streak that would last 24 games, breaking the school record set in 1961 for most consecutive victories to open a season. Esmay and the Devils finished the regular season with a 52-10 record, including a 20-7 mark in Pac-10 play. Arizona State won another Pac-10 title and was the #1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Sun Devils would win all five postseason games played at Packard Stadium, including two thrilling Super Regional wins over Arkansas to send Arizona State to the College World Series for the second straight year. For his efforts, Esmay was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year. Zack MacPhee was named Pac-10 Player of the Year and Seth Blair was named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year, while MacPhee was also a unanimous First Team All-American.

Esmay was the head baseball coach at the University of Utah from 1997 to 2004, winning a WAC title and WAC Coach of the Year honors in 1997. In eight seasons at Utah he compiled a 213-235-1 record. Esmay had 18 of his players go on to play professional baseball, including three from his last team in 2004. He also had 27 players earn all-conference honors during his tenure. Esmay's eight-year career at Utah also saw his teams completely rewrite the Ute record books. In his first season directing the Utah baseball program, Esmay did what no Ute coach had done in 32 years when he led Utah to a WAC division title and a 36-21-1 record in 1997. The Utes posted a 22-8 record in the Northern Division that year. They also set nine school records as Esmay was named the 1997 Louisville Slugger WAC Coach of the Year. In 2002, Esmay guided Utah to a 33-26 overall and 16-14 conference record. The 33 wins is the second most in school history since 1963, and the second-place league finish is the Utes best since joining the MWC in '99. Senior pitcher Mitch Maio garnered 2002 MWC Co-Player of the Year honors.

Esmay spent five seasons as an assistant coach for ASU Baseball, including three as Assistant Head Coach. A former Sun Devil player and assistant coach, he played two seasons as an infielder under Jim Brock in 1986 and 1987 and was a member of Brock's coaching staff from 1988 to 1990 and in 1994.

Esmay began his coaching career following his playing days at Arizona State (1986-87). He served as an assistant coach at Arizona State under Jim Brock from 1988 to 1990, then again in Brock's final season of 1994. He returned to Arizona State in 2005 as an assistant coach, helping the team to a third place national finish and an appearance in the College World Series. He was named the Assistant Head Coach prior to the 2007 season and served in that capacity for three seasons.

Over his playing and coaching career, Esmay has been a part of numerous teams that played in the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska, including once as a player in 1987, twice as an assistant under Jim Brock in 1988 and 1994, three times as an assistant under Pat Murphy in 2005, 2007 and 2009, and once as a head coach in 2010.

Esmay was a two-year starter for the Sun Devils following an All-American career at Scottsdale Community College. The infielder hit .305 (121-for-397) during his two years in Tempe with 23 doubles and five home runs. He was a member of ASU's 1987 College World Series team and was named to the All-West Region team that season. Esmay was inducted into the Scottsdale Community College Hall of Fame in 2011. He hit .397 during his career at SCC and is still the school's record holder for career doubles.

A graduate of Horizon High School, where his number 5 was ret<mark>ired in</mark> 1998, Esmay also coached at Brophy College Prep in Phoenix for two years (1992-93) and was an assistant at Grand Canyon University (1995) and Utah (1996) before taking over the head job in Salt Lake City in 1997.

Ken Knutson enters his second season as Associate Head Coach/Recruiting Coordinator after spending the previous three as pitching coach at Arizona State. Knutson came to ASU after spending 17 seasons as the head coach at the University of Washington.

Knutson has now mentored two Devils who have ended their careers with two of the lowest ERA in school history (aluminum bat era). Brady Rodgers' (2010-12) 2.39 career ERA is second lowest in school history and Trevor Williams' (2011-13) 3.00 career ERA ranks as the sixth lowest.

Dating back to his tenure as head coach at Washington, Knutson has coached at least one All-Conference pitcher every season since 1993, including one in each of his four seasons at ASU. He has also coached 16 All-Conference pitchers in his four years with the Devils.

Knutson has an impressive knack for sending his players to the professional ranks.

Since joining the Sun Devils prior to the 2010 season, Knutson has now had 14 pitchers drafted by the MLB, including five in the first two rounds. He also coached two-time Cy Young Award winner Tim Lincecum at Washington as well as current minor league all-stars Jake Barrett and Brady Rodgers, among others.

Knutson has called two no-hitters in his coaching career, including most recently Ryan Kellogg's on March 23, 2013, against Oregon State. Knutson's first came in March 2006 with the Washington Huskies when Lincecum combined with Nick Hagadone for a no-hitter against Santa Clara. Lincecum, a Knutson protégé, also threw a no-hitter for the San Francisco Giants on July 14, 2013.

In 2013, Knutson led a pitching contingent that featured a pair of freshmen All-Pac-12 selections. Kellogg became the first freshman in school history to begin his career 11-0 and is just the fifth freshman in school history to lead the team in wins (11) en route to becoming just the fourth Devil in school history to earn freshman All-America honors from three or more publications. Fellow freshman Ryan Burr set ASU's freshman single-season saves record with 12 and his .141 opposing batting average was the lowest mark in school history.

Knutson guided a pitching staff that finished in the top 10 in Div. I in both walks allowed per nine innings and WHIP in 2012, and mentored one of the top pitching duos in the country that season. Brady Rodgers and Trevor Williams both placed in the top four in the Pac-12 in ERA and walks allowed, and in the top six in innings pitched and wins. Rodgers finished his three-year career with the school's second-lowest ERA and Williams was the conference's only 12-game winner in 2012 and just the 25th Sun Devil in the aluminum bat era to record 12 wins in a season.

His second season with the Sun Devils featured five pitchers who earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors (Alex Blackford, Kramer Champlin, Mitchell Lambson, Rodgers and Williams), as well as a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American (Williams). He was instrumental in helping Lambson become only the third Sun Devil with 20+ wins and 10+ saves, guiding him to a combined 15 wins and 12 saves in 2010 and '11, and helped a trio of Sun Devil pitchers get drafted by the MLB (Champlin, Lambson and Kyle Ottoson).

In his first season handling the Sun Devil pitchers in 2010, Knutson oversaw a staff that featured three 10-game winners (Seth Blair 12, Jake Borup 11 and Merrill Kelly 10), a closer who set a new school record for single-season saves (Jordan Swagerty, 14) and the top two ERA pitchers in the Pac-10 Conference (Rodgers, 2.11, and Mitchell Lambson, 2.16). Blair earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year, the third time a pitcher coaches by Knutson has received the award (Tim Lincecum, 2004 and 2006).

During Knutson's time at the helm of Washington, he compiled a career record of 584-399-2, including a 240-189 record in Pac-10 play. He is Washington's all-time leader in coaching victories and won four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and two overall Pac-10 titles







during his tenure. He led the Huskies to six NCAA Tournaments and was three times named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year (1996, 1997 and 1998).

Knutson coached 31 All-Americans at Washington, including 2006 Golden Spikes Award winner and current San Francisco Giant Tim Lincecum, as well as closers Will Fenton and Buck Merrick. Merrick is the school's all-time leader in saves with 31, while Fenton is second with 23, including the 2003 season where he did not allow a run while recording 12 saves. While at Washington, Knutson spent much of his head coaching career as the UW's pitching coach, coaching at least one All-Pac-10 pitcher every year he served in that capacity.

Prior to being named Washington's head coach in 1993, Knutson spent nine seasons with the Huskies as both a player and an assistant. In 1981, the lefty Knutson compiled a 5-2 record with a 2.89 ERA, helping lead Washington to the Pac-10 Northern Division title, their first since 1959. He was a First Team All-Pac-10 selection that season after transferring from Seattle University, where he was an all-league performer.

From 1982 to 1986, Knutson was in charge of the Husky pitching staff, including the 1985 season when UW led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. After coaching semi-pro ball in the Seattle area, Knutson returned to Washington as the lead assistant coach and pitching coach from 1990 to 1992 before being named head coach.

Born in Sisseton, S.D., Knutson was raised in Seattle. He was an all-state pitcher at Seattle's Evergreen High School in 1976 and also quarterbacked the football team.

Knutson was married on August 31, 1991, to his wife Pam. They have three children - Halie, Andrew and Camille.

#### KEN KNUTSON HEAD COACHING CAREER

Knutson served as Washington head coach from 1993 through 2009. He concluded his UW career with the most coaching wins in UW baseball history, and 15th-most in Pac-10 history.

#### Knutson's accomplishments during his 17-year head coaching tenure at Washington:

- Spent 17 seasons as head coach at Washington, compiling a career overall record of 584-399-2 and a career record of 240-189 in Pac-
- 584 wins were most in UW baseball history and tied for 15th-most in the history of the Pac-10.
- Won Pac-10 Northern Division championships in 1993, 1996, 1997 and 1998 and won the overall Pac-10 Championship in 1997 and 1998.
- Earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament in 1994, 1997, 1998, 2002, 2003 and 2004, accounting for six of Washington's eight all-time NCAA berths.
- In those six NCAA Tournaments, never failed to win at least two games in regional play each year and posted a record of 16-12 in six regional appearances.
- Twice led the Huskies to within one victory of a berth in the College World Series (1994, 1997).
- In 17 seasons, coached 55 All-Pac-10 first-teamers and earned Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1996, 1997 and 1998.
- Had 76 players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Of those 76 players, only 21 were drafted out of high school and all but three of those players were selected in a higher round out of college.
- Recruited and coached seven players who made it to the Major Leagues, accounting for almost half of the 15 Washington alumni ever to make the big leagues.
- Coached 31 players who earned some level of All-America honors, including two-time All-America Tim Lincecum, the winner of the 2006 Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top amateur player.
- Before 1993, no Husky had ever participated in the USA National Team program, but eight Huskies have represented the USA since then.
- During much of head coaching career, also served as the UW's pitching coach. Coached at least one All-Pac-10 pitcher every year as pitching coach.

Former Sun Devil infielder and big leaguer Mike Benjamin enters his fifth season as an assistant coach on Tim Esmay's staff. Esmay and Benjamin were teammates at Arizona State during the 1986 and 1987 seasons under head coach Jim Brock. Benjamin was inducted into the Arizona State University Hall of Fame in 2011.

In 2013, Benjamin helped the Sun Devil finish in the top 30 in Div. I in triples (sixth), home runs (20th), slugging percentage (25th) and doubles (29th), and ranked 42nd in runs, 46th in scoring and 47th in hits.

ASU was also first in the Pac-12 in slugging percentage, runs scored, RBI, doubles, home runs and total bases, second in hits and triples, third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.

Since joining the staff in 2010, Benjamin has helped the Sun Devils rank 1st in slugging percentage, fewest sacrifice bunts and home runs per season, and 2nd in batting average, hits per season and RBI per season. Click here for a full rundown of where the Devils stack up against the Pac-12 since 2010.

Under Benjamin's tutelage, current Red Sox minor leaguer Deven Marrero earned 2011 Pac-10 Defensive Player of the Year honors and was drafted in the first round of the 2012 MLB Draft. Benjamin also helped second baseman Zack MacPhee earn 2010 Pac-10 Player of the Year honors.

Benjamin played shortstop for the Sun Devils in 1986 and 1987, earning First Team All-American and First Team All-Pac-10 honors in 1987. He hit .315 in his ASU career, including .327 with 18 homers and 55 RBI during the '87 season. Benjamin also stole 30 bases, helping lead the Sun Devils to Omaha and the College World Series that year. He was a third round pick of the San Francisco Giants in the 1987 MLB Draft. Benjamin was named to the All-1980's squad for Arizona State Baseball by the East Valley Tribune as a shortstop.


Benjamin played 13 seasons of Major League Baseball, the first seven of which he spent with the San Francisco Giants. He made his Major League debut for the Giants on July 7, 1989 and played there through the 1995 season. He spent 1996 with the Philadelphia Phillies before joining the Boston Red Sox in 1997. He played two seasons in Boston, playing in the 1998 American League Divisional Series, before finishing his career with the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Following his pro career, Benjamin was a coach for the Chandler National Little League team that advanced to the Little League World Series in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Benjamin' son, Michael Jr., played three seaons with the Sun Devils from 2011-13 and was drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the 13th round of the 2013 MLB Draft.

Greg Bordes returns to the Sun Devil baseball program for his second season as an assistant coach. Bordes was a three-year letterwinner for the Sun Devils and was a member of two College World Series teams (2005, 2007) and two Pac-10 Championship squads (2007 and 2008). He also served as a team manager in 2011.

In 2013, Bordes helped mentor All-Pac-12 catcher Max Rossiter, as well as freshman All-America catcher RJ Ybarra.

Bordes played in 72 games from 2005-08, including 44 in his junior season in 2008. He started 21 games that season and batted .304 with 21 RBI en route to being named to the All-Tempe Regional team. He started all three games at shortstop that series and collected five RBI and scored three runs.

He signed with the Arizona Diamondbacks following the 2008 season and played two seasons in the minor leagues. He graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Interdisciplinary Sciences with a focus on business and education.

Bordes appeared in 16 games, making one start, in 2007, and redshirted in 2006. He played in 12 games and made two starts as a freshman in 2005. He made a diving stop against Ohio State (3/6) that saved two runs and helped lead ASU to a 3-0 victory. He played summer baseball for the Rochester Honkers in the Northwoods League.

He is a 2004 graduate of Dobson High School in Mesa, Ariz., where he earned three varsity letters under head coaches Bob Hershey (2002) and Dave Tykoski (2003-04). He was a captain of his team junior and senior year and played summer baseball for the Swampdogs (2002-03) and the Reds (2004). He helped Dobson to the 2002 East Valley Regional title and was named honorable mention East Valley Region after hitting .330 with 25 walks as a sophomore. He hit .390 as a junior and was named first-team all-region and went .340 with three home runs and was 14-for-14 stealing bases as a senior. He wss was ranked as the No. 16 high school prospect in the state of Arizona by Perfect Game/Baseball America and earned the All-Around Senior Award for academics.

Sun Devil Legacy: His brother, Brett, is a former Sun Devils pitcher who spent time in the Baltimore Orioles farm system. Brett holds the school record for most career appearances with 109.


Baseball Bloodlines: His father, Charlie, played professionally with the Texas Rangers, reaching as high as the Triple-A level. Charlie also played in college at Southwestern Louisiana (currently Louisiana Lafayette) and was voted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 1998 with former major league pitcher Ron Guidry. His grandfather, Bill Cutler, is a former president of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League, while an uncle, Jack Heidemann, played six years of professional baseball with the Brewers and Indians.

he Sun Devils were hungry entering the 1965 season after making their first College World Series appearance the previous year. Though they made an early exit with two losses in three games in 1964, their journey to Omaha, Nebraska, had given them a taste of the good life.

There was no stopping Coach Bobby Winkles' team in '65. They stormed through the regular season with a 47-7 record, won the Western Athletic Conference title at 9-3 and swept two games from Colorado State in the District 7 playoffs in Phoenix to earn another trip to Omaha sporting a No.-1 national ranking

from Collegiate Baseball.



Slugging center fielder Rick Monday was the backbone of that team. He batted .359 with a school-record 11 home runs and became the first of 13 Sun Devils to be named National Player of the Year. He was the first player chosen (by the Kansas City Athletics) in Major League Baseball's initial amateur draft. John Pavlik (12-0), Jim Merrick (13-2) and Ron Lea (11-3) headed the pitching staff.



### ASU VS. LAFAYETTE-JUNE 7

ASU entered the tourney ranked first in the final national poll prior to the CWS, and lived up to the billing. The Devils blasted three Lafayette pitchers for a 14-1 win. Top Sun Devil sluggers included starting pitcher John Pavlik (2-for-3, 1 RBI), Sal Bando (3-for-5 with a double, a homer and 3 RBI), Jim Armstrong (3-for-4, 2 RBI and 3 runs scored) and Glenn Smith, with a 3-for-4 performance. Pavlik limited Lafayette to just three singles in getting the win, and was helped by Alan Schmelz in the ninth. Pavlik had a no-hitter for six innings before a run scored on three singles in the seventh.

The 1967 Sun Devils did not have an easy path to Omaha, where they captured their second national championship in three years. The Devils lost four of their first five Western Athletic Conference games before rallying to capture the Southern Division title and earn a spot against Brigham Young University in the WAC playoffs.

In a game still considered by many the greatest in school history, the 11th-ranked Sun Devils beat 9th-ranked Arizona, 3-2, in a one-game Southern Division playoff in front of 8,314 fans at Phoenix Municipal

Stadium. Sun Devil pitcher Gary Gentry, who had shut out the Wildcats, 3-0, in the final regular-season game, pitched all 15 innings of the four-hour, 17-minute marathon. Working on just two days' rest, Gentry scattered nine hits, walked five and struck out 18. He threw 208 pitches.

After disposing of BYU in the WAC championship series, the Sun Devils won two of three from Air Force in the District 7 playoffs in Phoenix to earn a spot in Omaha, where they won five of six games to claim National Title No. 2.

Outfielder Paul Ray Powell led the Sun Devils in batting (.366), home runs (11) and RBI (73) and was named College Player of the Year by The Sporting News. Powell was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Twins in the 1969 June amateur draft, the seventh

player drafted overall. Powell also played safety on the football team and led the nation in kick

Left-hander Larry Gura was the pitching star of the 1969 Sun Devils. He put together a season that still ranks as one of the best in college history. Gura set a NCAA record for pitching victories with a 19-2 record and established a school record with a sparkling 1.01 ERA. He struck out 196 batters in 169 innings. He made four pitching appearances — two as a starter and two in relief — as the Sun Devils shook off a first-round loss to Texas to win their third national title in Omaha.

Longhorn freshman pitcher Burt Hooten limited ASU to only three hits in this 4-0 ASU loss. The 1977 Sun Devils were a determined bunch after compiling a 65-10 overall record and 17-1 WAC mark in 1976 but falling short in their quest for the school's fourth national title. Their 1977 record (57-12, 15-3) wasn't quite as impressive and they were down a bit in most statistical categories, but this time they got it right at Omaha.

Coach Jim Brock's Devils hit their stride in mid April, rolling up 19 consecutive victories in a streak that continued into the post season. They swept BYU in the WAC playoffs and stormed through a NCAA Regional

tournament in Tempe with one victory over Cal State Fullerton and two over Washington State, taking a No. 1 national ranking into the College World Series.

Though they lacked the dominant pitching of some earlier ASU clubs, the Devils bludgeoned opponents with an attack that featured the likes of Bob Horner, Hubie Brooks, Chris Bando, Dave Hudgens and Jamie Allen. Horner won virtually every major college baseball award after leading the nation in hits (102), home runs (22), RBI (87) and total bases (191)



### ASU VS CLEMSON—JUNE 10

Sun Devil bats blistered Clemson early, and ASU then hung on for a 10-7 win. The Devils knocked undefeated Clemson hurler Ron Musselman out of the game early with one run in the first and a three-run third inning. In the fifth, Jamie Allen led off with a homer and Steve Michael doubled in a run to give ASU a 6-0 lead, but ASU starter Jerry Vasquez faltered and allowed the Tigers five runs in the bottom of the inning. About the only blip was a three-game sweep at the hands of Stanford in a late-season road series, but the Devils rebounded to sweep rival Arizona in the final regular-season series to take some momentum into the post season. They beat Gonzaga once and Cal State Fullerton twice to sweep the NCAA West Regional in Tempe and earn a trip to Omaha.



A devastating offense led by Mike Sodders (.424, 22 HR, 100 RBI), Kevin Romine (.410, 81 R, 27 SB) and Stan Holmes (.366, 14 HR, 82 RBI) set school records for team batting average (.356), home runs (110) and runs (694). Other big contributors were Donnie Hill (.378, 81 R, 22 SB), Ricky Nelson (.345, 18 HR, 68 RBI) and Alvin Davis (.396, 72 R). The bullpen was the strength of the pitching staff. Kendall Carter led the nation in victories with a 19-1 record, mostly in relief. Kevin Dukes, who beat Oklahoma State in the national title game, was 8-2 with 12 saves.

The Sun Devils' explosive offense scored early and often as ASU defeated Texas, 11-2, on the first day of competition. ASU's Jeff Ahern picked up the win, despite allowing nine walks through five innings. Texas would strand 13 runners in the game. Randy Newman notched his first save for the Devils, going 4.0 innings and allowing only one run. Shortstop Donnie Hill went 4-for-4 at the plate with two runs scored and two RBI. Third baseman Mike Sodders turned in a 3-for-4 performance with one run scored.





# COLLEGE BASEBALL HALL OF FAME



In July of 2006, Sun Devil legends Bobby Winkles and Bob Horner were part of the first-ever 10 member induction class in the new College Baseball Hall of Fame in Lubbock, Texas.


The Sun Devils' eight Hall of Famers are the second most in college baseball, behind only Texas with nine. ASU leads all Pac-12 schools, ahead of Arizona and USC with three, Washington State with two and UCLA with one.

Players are eligible for the College Baseball Hall of Fame ballot five years after the student-athlete's final collegiate season, not to include


any active player or coach on a professional baseball team roster. Former players must have made an All-American team or an All-League team during at least one year at a fouryear institution.

Coaches are eligible after ending their collegiate career, not to include an active coach on a professional team. They must have achieved 300 career wins, or have won at least 65% of their games.













# ASU HALL OF FAME



stablished in 1975 to honor the school's most distinguished student-athletes in all sports, the Arizona State University Sports Hall of Fame honors over 200 former Sun Devil student-athletes. The Hall of Distinction, recognizing contributions from coaches and administrators, was inaugurated in 1982 and features over 20 honorees. Plaques describing the athletic achievements of each inductee are displayed on the concourse level of Wells Fargo Arena, while memorabilia and other historical artifacts are on display in the Bill and Judy Schaefer Sports Hall of Fame in the Carson-Student Athlete Center at Sun Devil Stadium.

47 Sun Devil baseball players, some of whom played multiple sports at ASU, have been inducted into the Arizona State Sports Hall of Fame. Bobby Winkles and Jim Brock are both in the Hall of Distinction.

## RETIRED NUMBERS



## O / ODDIBE MCDOWELL 1983-1984

The first Sun Devil baseball player to have his number retired, McDowell hit a combined .380 with 30 home runs and 31 doubles in his two years in Tempe. His 1984 season, in which he hit .405 with 23 home runs and 117 hits, remains one of the best offensive performances in school history and earned him a spot on the US Olympic team as well as the Golden Spikes Award. Oddibe had his number 0 retired, but legend has it that the digit on his back was actually the letter "O", making him the only player to have a letter retired. McDowell played seven seasons in the Major Leagues after being a First Round pick of the Texas Rangers in 1984.



## 1 / BOBBY WINKLES 1959-1971

The first varsity baseball coach at ASU, Winkles had his number retired February 25, 1972. Winkles guided the Sun Devils to a 524-173-1 mark from 1959 to '71, including four College World Series appearances. He captured three national championships and was inducted into both the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame and the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He went on to manage in the Major Leagues, leading both the California Angels and the Oakland Athletics. Winkles was honored for his numerous coaching milestones at ASU when the field at Packard Stadium was dedicated as Bobby Winkles Field in 2001.



## 5 / BOB HORNER 1976-1978

On February 11, 1996, Bob Horner saw his number retired by Arizona State. The first Golden Spikes Award winner in 1978, Horner hit 56 home runs over his three seasons in Tempe. He was the MOP of the 1977 College World Series and the 1978 National Player of the Year. He hit .412 during his senior season and led the Devils to Omaha all three years he played for ASU. Horner was the first pick of the 1978 MLB Draft, going to the Atlanta Braves. He spent 10 years in the Majors, winning the 1978 National League Rookie of the Year Award and playing in the 1982 All-Star Game. He was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



## 6 / SAL BANDO 1964-1965

February 23, 1996 saw Sal Bando's number retired by the Sun Devils. The MOP of the 1965 College World Series, Bando helped lead Arizona State to Omaha in both of his seasons in Tempe. Bando hit .319 over his Sun Devil career, including .364 in 1964. He played 16 seasons in the Majors, appearing in four All Star Games and winning the World Series three times with the Oakland Athletics. Bando spent eight years as the General Manager of the Milwaukee Brewers after retiring as a player. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



## 7 / ALAN BANNISTER 1970-1972

A two-time First Team All-American, Alan Bannister had his number retired by the Sun Devils on January 9, 1999. A .355 career hitter, Bannister helped lead the Sun Devils to the 1972 College World Series with his .380 average, 13 home runs and 90 RBI. He rapped out 225 hits during his three seasons in Tempe and went on to play 12 seasons in the Major Leagues. He was the #1 overall pick of the 1973 MLB Draft, going to the Philadelphia Phillies.



## 7 / HUBIE BROOKS 1977-1978

One of the greatest hitters in Sun Devil history, Hubie Brooks saw his #7 retired by ASU on March 3, 2000. Brooks hit .396 during his career, including .432 in 1978. A member of the 1977 National Champions, Brooks went to Omaha both seasons he wore the Maroon and Gold. Hubie played 15 seasons in the Majors, twice being named to the All-Star Team. He was the third overall pick of the 1978 draft, selected by the New York Mets.



## 9 / ALVIN DAVIS 1979-1982

Alvin Davis had his Sun Devil #9 retired on May 14, 2006. A four-year player, Davis hit .362 as a Sun Devil, including .395 during the National Championship year of 1981. Davis knocked in 200 runs during his tenure in Tempe and was a sixth round pick of the Seattle Mariners in the 1982 MLB Draft. Davis went on to win the 1984 American League Rookie of the Year Award. He played nine seasons in the Majors and was an All-Star in 1984.





## 12 / KEVIN ROMINE 1981-1982

On May 14, 2006, Kevin Romine had his number retired by Arizona State. One of only two people in school history to ever hit over .400 twice, Romine closed out his ASU career with a .408 average. A National Champion in 1981, Romine totaled 176 in his two seasons in Tempe. He was a second round pick of the Boston Red Sox in the 1982 MLB Draft and went on to play seven big league seasons.



## 14 / LARRY GURA 1967-1969

January 18, 1998 saw one of the most dominant Sun Devil pitchers ever have his number retired. Larry Gura compiled a 25-6 career record for ASU, including the 1969 season that saw him go 19-2 with a 1.01 ERA. A two-time National Champion, Gura was a First Team All-American in 1969. He was selected by the Chicago Cubs in the second round of the 1969 Draft and went on to play 16 seasons of big league ball, including his All-Star season of 1980.



## 16 / PAUL LO DUCA 1993

On January 28, 2005, Paul Lo Duca's #16 was retired by ASU Baseball. Lo Duca spent only one season in Tempe, but it was a memorable one. His .446 batting average in 1993 set the school's single season mark, helping him be named the National Player of the Year by *The Sporting News*. A hitting-machine, Lo Duca totaled 129 hits, 14 home runs and 88 RBI on his way to earning Co-Pac-10 Player of the Year honors. Lo Duca played 11 Major League seasons and was a four-time All-Star, including a starter in the 2006 game.



## 19 / FLOYD BANNISTER 1974-1976

January 18, 1997 was the day Floyd Bannister, one of the greatest pitchers in Sun Devil history, had his number retired by ASU. Bannister earned 38 wins during his ASU career, including a school record-tying 19 in 1976. He had a career ERA of 1.88 and is second in school history with his 478 career strikeouts. He was a member of two College World Series teams and was a First Team All-American in 1975 and 1976. The first overall pick in the 1976 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros, Bannister played 15 seasons and was named an All-Star in 1982. Floyd was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008.



## 21 / EDDIE BANE 1971-1973

Eddie Bane had his #21 retired by ASU on February 16, 2000. Bane is ASU's all-time strikeout leader, fanning 535 batters during his career. He is tied for third all-time in school history with 40 wins, and his 11 career shut outs helped him record a career ERA of 1.64. Bane is the only Sun Devil to ever throw a perfect game, turning the trick against Cal State-Northridge on March 2, 1973. A two-time All-American, Bane pitched in two College World Series. Bane was a First Round pick of the Minnesota Twins in 1973 and played three seasons in the Majors. He is currently the Director of Scouting for the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. Eddie was inducted into the College baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



## 24 / BARRY BONDS 1983-1985

On March 19, 1993, one of the greatest sluggers of all-time had his number retired by Arizona State. Barry Bonds hit 45 home runs during his Sun Devil career, fourth most in school history. An All-American in 1985, Bonds played in two College World Series, setting a record with hits in seven consecutive CWS at-bats. The seven-time National League MVP is baseball's all-time Home Run King with 762 round-trippers. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend during the 2010 College World Series.



## 27 / RICK MONDAY 1965

Rick Monday's number 27 was retired by ASU on January 25, 1997. Monday made the most of his one varsity season in Tempe, earning National Player of the Year honors from The Sporting News for the 1965 National Champions. He hit .359 that year and blasted two home runs during the College World Series. Monday became the first ever player drafted by Major League Baseball, as he went #1 overall to the Kansas City A's in the first MLB Amateur Draft in 1965. He pitched 19 seasons in the Majors, twice earning All-Star Game appearances and winning a World Series in 1981 with the Los Angeles Dodgers.



## 33 / JIM BROCK 1972-1994

The winningest coach in ASU baseball history, Brock had his number retired posthumously on January 21, 1995. Brock, who passed away in 1994 after leading ASU to the College World Series, amassed 1,099 victories in his 23 seasons as head coach. He was a four-time National Coach of the Year and led the Sun Devils to Omaha 13 times, capturing National Titles in 1977 and 1981. Brock coached 15 First Round picks and had his name added to the baseball facilities (Winkles Field - Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark) in 2006. Dr. Brock was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame as well as the ABCA Hall of Fame.



## 44 / RÉGGIE JACKSON 1966

Perhaps the most clutch playoff performer in baseball history saw his number retired on January 13, 1990, as Mr. October Reggie Jackson was honored by the Sun Devils. Jackson came to ASU on a football scholarship and decided to walk-on to the 1966 baseball team. Reggie went on to win National Player of the Year honors, thanks to his .327 average and 15 home runs. He led the team in hits, runs and RBI and was drafted #2 overall by the Kansas City A's in the 1966 MLB Draft. He went on become a Hall-of-Fame player, hitting 10 World Series home runs, picking up two World Series MVP trophies and the 1973 AL MVP Award. He was inducted into the baseball Hall of Fame in 1993.



## WINKLES FIELD-PACKARD STADIUM AT BROCK

Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark, home of Arizona State baseball since 1974, is one of the nation's most beautiful collegiate ballparks. Known for its wonderful aesthetic features, the outfield wall is lined with palm trees, and just beyond the right-field fence is the award-winning Karsten Golf Course. In left field, sparkling Tempe Town Lake and the Tempe construction boom is visible. In the distance, the Superstition Mountains offer a picturesque backdrop. But for every bit of beauty that envelops the facility, there is an equal dose of tradition.

The facility is the home of two national championship teams and 18 NCAA regional tournaments. Arizona State's all-time record at Packard is 1,103-296-1\*, for a winning percentage of .788.

In 2012, ASU went 23-6 at home and swept four straight Pac-12 home series' for the first time since 1988 and only the third time in program history (the other came in 1981). Since 2007, the Sun Devils have an astounding home record of 214-39\*.

Dimensions of Packard are 338 feet down the lines, 368 feet in the power alleys and 395 to straightaway center. The fence is 10 feet high. Located five feet beyond the centerfield wall is the "Green Monster," a 30-foothigh batting eye. Only 25 players have ever hit a home run over the Monster.

With a capacity of over 4,000, Packard has more than 3,000 permanent seats in the main grandstand. Field-level box seats are also available behind home plate. The remaining seats are located on popular grass berms, which run down the first-base and third-base line. Berm seating offers outstanding views of the game and provides fans with a different way to watch and enjoy the game.

The Packard Stadium press box, situated atop the grandstand directly behind home plate, includes booths for television and radio coverage, as well as space for print media.

In 1995, the Sports Turf Manager Association awarded groundskeeper Brian Johnson and Packard Stadium Field of the Year honors. In addition, a 2003 coaches survey published in *Baseball America* ranked ASU's baseball facilities among the Top 15 in the nation.

Over the years Packard has received numerous upgrades, including a practice infield (1997) and indoor hitting facility The practice infield was donated by the Arizona Diamondbacks and offers a full size infield that is used for various bunting and defensive. baserunning drills. The 6,000 square foot hitting facility was provided by a private donation and includes 5 batting cages and a separate area for speed and movement exercises. A Daktronics scoreboard was installed in left-center field in 1999 and is equipped for graphics, animation and messages on its matrix board.

Just before the 2003 season, ASU installed a brand new playing surface featuring major league quality drainage and irrigation systems. The playing surface consists of tiff green grass in the infield and Bermuda grass in the outfield. The dirt portion of the infield is crushed red brick, which can be found at many major league stadiums. The playing surface is annually referred to as one of the nation's best.

A new players' facility, opened in August 2004, includes a clubhouse and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility. The clubhouse also includes a video room, study area and meeting room.

Packard's existence was made possible through a gift to Arizona State University from Guthrie and Peter Packard. Both are alumni of ASU, and the stadium is a tribute to their late father, William Guthrie Packard, a prominent member of the publishing industry for many years. Mr. Packard served the Shephard Company for 51 years, rising from sales representative to President and Chairman of the Board. He was also active in various community and church affairs in Colorado and Arizona.

The playing surface was named Bobby Winkles Field during a ceremony in 2001. Winkles was the first ever varsity head coach at Arizona State, leading the Sun Devils to three national titles in his 13 seasons at the helm.

Dr. Jim Brock's name was added to the facility prior to the 2006 season. Brock is the school's all-time leader in victories with 1,099. He led the Sun Devils to two national titles and 13 appearances in the College World Series. He was the head coach from 1972 until his death in 1994.
