Chasson is in his eighth season heading the men's and women's swimming programs at ASU. Chasson has led the men to top-20 NCAA finishes each of the last seven years. The women have finished in the top-15 each of the last four years. The women placed 10th in 2002 and 2003, the first back-to-back top-10 finishes for the program since 1989 and 1990. ASU swimmers have accumulated 200 All-America honors during his tenure. Chasson came to Tempe from Harvard, where he coached the Crimson to six Eastern Seaboard Championships and was named Ivy League Coach of the Year three times. He is assisted by Associate Head Coach Annemarie Miskovic, and assistants Greg Winslow and Phil Spiniello.

#### Head Diving Coach, Mark Bradshaw --

The 2003 and 2005 Men's NCAA Diving Coach of the Year, Bradshaw is one of the nation's premier coaching talents. Bradshaw has coached five All-Americans, three individual Pac-10 champions, one national champion and two Pac-10 Divers of the Year.

## MEN, LAST TIME IN THE POOL\_

ASU men's swimming competed against rival Arizona Feb. 11 at the Mona Plummer Aquatic Center. The Sun Devils fell to the Wildcats 172-123. Sophomore Lucas Azevedo (Belo Horizonte, Brazil) and sophomore C.J. Nuess (Medical Lake, Wash.) finished first and second in the 1,000-yard freestyle respectively. Azevedo was clocked at 9:08.04 and Nuess touched the wall in 9:10.00. Azevedo also finished second in the 500-yard freestyle. Senior David Kolozar (Budapest, Hungary) captured the title in the 200-yard butterfly with a time of 1:48.43. In diving, senior Joona Puhakka (Helsinki, Finland) won the one-meter dive and finished second in the three-meter dive. In the one-meter, Puhakka recorded a 335.40 and in the three-meter he scored a 343.80.

## PUHAKKA AT THE PAC-10s

At the Pac-10 Diving Championships held in Federal Way, Wash. at the Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatic Center, Joona Puhakka came away with two more Pac-10 championships. He earned titles in the one-meter and three-meter sprinboards becoming the first diver in Pac-10 history to win four consecutive Pac-10 titles in an event. In all, Puhakka has earned eight Pac-10 championships, six Zone E championships and four national championships. He was also honored as Pac-10 Diver of the Year three straight years (2003-05) and National Diver of the Year in 2005. Puhakka competed for Finland in the 2000 and 2004 Summer Olympics.

## ANDREW HAS THE ANSWER

Sophomore Caitlin Andrew (San Antonio, Texas) finished in second place in the 100-yard butterfly at the Pac-10s last week. She also recorded a school record in finishing fourth in the 100-yard backstroke by touching the wall in 53.81. Andrew also swam the opening leg of the 400-yard freestyle relay team that recorded ASU's fifth-fastest time in history by touching the wall in 3:21.33. She currently holds school records in the 100-yard freestyle, 100-yard backstroke and 100-yard butterfly. Andrew recorded her school records in the 100-yard freestyle and the 100-yard backstroke this season, with the record in the 100 back coming in the Pac-10 Championships. Also, Andrew has the school's second-fastest time in ASU history in the 50-yard freestyle and the 200-yard backstroke. At the FINA World Cup Series held in East Meadow, N.Y. Feb. 3-4, Andrew was the third-highest American woman in the medal count. In the 50-meter backstroke Andrew touched the wall in 27.84 to capture the title. She also finished in second in the 100-meter backstroke and third in the 50-meter butterfly by recording times of 1:00.25 and 26.49 in the events respectively. Last season, Andrew was the Pac-10 champion in the 100-yard butterfly.
