Head Swimming Coach, Michael Chasson --

Chasson is in his seventh season heading the men's and women's swimming programs at ASU. Chasson has led the men to top-20 NCAA finishes each of the last five years. The women have placed 14th this past season following two top-ten finishes in the prior two seasons. 41 swimmers have accumulated 200 All-America honors during his tenure. Chasson came to Tempe from Harvard, where he coached the Crimson to six Eastern Seaboard Championships and was named Ivy League Coach of the Year three times. He is assisted by Annemarie Miskovic, Greg Winslow and Phil Spiniello.

THIS WEEK

The Arizona State University swimming and diving program heads to the Midwest this weekend where the women will battle against Purdue, Indiana and Notre Dame while the men take on Purdue. The women's meet against Purdue and Notre Dame is set for Friday, October 29 at 6:00 p.m. CT at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center. The women then travel to Indiana on Saturday, October 30 to take on the Hoosiers at the Counsilman-Billingsley Aquatic Center, events are scheduled to begin at 12 p.m. CT. The men will swim against the Boilermakers on Friday and Saturday with Friday's meet scheduled for 6:00 p.m. and Saturday's meet set for 11 a.m.

THE POLLS

The Sun Devils open up the 2004-05 CSCAA rankings with both the men and women ranked in the top-25. The men come in at No. 17 while the women step into the polls at No. 21.

ASU vs. Purdue

The Sun Devil men took on the Boilermakers for the first time last season where they came out on top, 180-120, in Tempe, Ariz. ASU comes into the meet ranked No. 17 while Purdue enters in at No. 23. The women will battle against Purdue for the first time. They enter into meet at No. 21 and Purdue comes in at No. 25.

ASU vs. Notre Dame, Women

The women head into their matchup with the Fighting Irish ranked four spots ahead in the polls with Notre Dame entering into the top-25 at No. 25.

ASU vs. Indiana, Women _

The Sun Devil women will take on the Hoosiers for the first time in the history of the program. Indiana enters into the meet ranked No.17.

ASU, THIS SEASON IN THE POOL

The Arizona State Sun Devils opened their swimming and diving season on October 22, with a dual meet at home against UNLV. The women came away victorious 214-86 while the men fell 152.5-141.5. In the swimming pool, the Sun Devil women came away with victories in 11 events with Florencia Szigeti and Caitlin Andrew leading the way with two individual and two relay victories apiece. Szigeti touched the wall first in the 100 freestyle (51.00) and the 100 backstroke (57.83) while Andrew came out on top in the 200 butterfly (2:03.86) and the 200 backstroke (2:05.38). Szigeti's 100 freestyle time is good for an NCAA consideration time. The ASU men claimed victories in five events in the swimming pool, with Lucas Azevedo capturing two of those. He touched the wall first in both the 500 freestyle (4:32.06) and the 1000 freestyle (9:27.49). Over in the diving pool, Joona Puhakka came out on top in both the 1-meter (300.83) and 3-meter (283.83) events for the men while Trisha Tumlinson did the same for the ladies with scores of 270.45 and 295.13 respectively.

ROOKIE REPORT

Both the men and women welcome six newcomers apiece to the squad this season and the Sun Devil rookies are already making a splash in the water this season as they claimed eight of the 16 victories in the first dual meet. CJ Nuess and Lucas Azevedo lead the way for the men as Nuess took the title in the ASU pentathlon and continued to show his speed claiming first in the 400 IM against the Rebels while Azevedo took home two first-place finishes in the meet. For the ladies, freshman Caitlin Andrew took home the title in the pentathlon and never slowed claiming four first-place finishes in the season opener, two individual and two as a member of a relay.

UP NEXT FOR THE SUN DEVILS

The weekend of November 19-20, both squads will head Los Angeles, Calif. with the women taking on both UCLA and USC while the men battle against USC in two meets. The women are set to take on UCLA on Friday, November 19 while the men swim against USC. Saturday, November 20 will see both the men and women take on the Trojans.
