#### Head Swimming Coach, Michael Chasson --

Chasson is in his fourth season heading the men's and women's swimming programs at ASU after seven with Harvard. There, he coached the Crimson to six Eastern Seaboard Championships and was named Ivy League Coach of the Year three times.

At ASU, Chasson has led the men to NCAA finishes of 16th, 10th and 14th, while the women have placed 23rd once and 21st the past two seasons. 21 swimmers have accumulated 35 All-America honors during his tenure. He is assisted by Keri Buff, John Pontz and Adam Schmitt.

## SUN DEVILS TO MEET WISCONSIN IN TUCSON

NOVEMBER 2, 2001 • TUCSON, ARIZ.

#### THIS WEEK

Two weeks after opening the 2001-02 season in Hawaii, Arizona State's men's and women's swimming and diving teams make the short trip south to face the University of Wisconsin at Hillenbrand Aquatic Center on the campus of the University of Arizona in Tucson. The Badgers will also be competing against Arizona, but ASU will only be scored in a dual vs. Wisconsin. Competition begins at 2:00 p.m. MST.

#### THE POLLS --

The College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) releases national rankings on a bi-weekly basis. The 2001-02 preseason poll (and/or the first set of rankings) has not yet been released. Last year, the preseason poll was posted October 26. For more information, access www.cscaa.org.

#### ASU vs. WISCONSIN

While Arizona's swimming and diving teams will also be in the pool, Sun Devil teams will only be scored against teams from the University of Wisconsin. Ironically, while ASU has a storied rivalry with the Wildcats, there is very little history with the Badgers Records are incomplete, but it appears that ASU has not faced Wisconsin in dual action since the final day of the 1981 calendar year. On that day (Dec. 31, 1981), the ASU women are listed as defeating Wisconsin, although no scores are available. Wisconsin's men's and women's teams placed 18th and 19th, respectively, at the 2001 NCAA Championships.

#### ASU, LAST TIME IN THE POOL

One week after opening its regular season with a pair of wins in Hawai'i, ASU appeared in intrasquad action October 26, in the ASU Pentathlon. Sophomore Nick Brunelli won the men's side of the meet with a five-event total time of 5:28.03, ahead of fellow sophomore Rich Jacobs' 5:33.96 second-place effort. Leading the women was freshman Ágnes Kovács, whose five-event time of 5:56.90 was well ahead of senior Sarah Baham in second-place at 6:04.81. A pair of ASU newcomers turned in impressive performances. Sophomore Gerrit Hillebrand, a transfer from Auburn University, placed third in the pentathlon in 5:36.18, while freshman Kari Wilcox took third for the women in 6:12.04.

The Sun Devils have appeared in one regular-season competition this season, recording convincing victories at the University of Hawaii, October 19 (men: 193-101; women: 230-70). The ASU men swept the top-three spots in six events, while the women took first-place points in all 16 races. Ágnes Kovács made her collegiate debut by swimming onto three ASU all-time lists, now ranking second in both the 100 breast (1:02.14) and 200 breast (2:11.87), and sixth in the 200 IM (2:02.96). Nick Brunelli began his sophomore season with a sweep of the 50 (20.62) and 100 free (45.65).

#### UP NEXT FOR THE SUN DEVILS

Both Sun Devils teams are off from competition next week, but return to action with a pair of home meets the following weekend. ASU opens its home slate Friday, November 16 vs. UCLA (women) and the SoCal All-Stars (women/men) at 2:00 p.m. Saturday, November 17, both the men and women will meet USC at noon. The men and women of USC finished fourth and sixth in the nation last season, respectively. The UCLA women placed 15th at the 2001 NCAA Championships.
