






Through the first 29 games of 2003 Larish exploded for 11 home runs and 59 RBI. While he has cooled off just a little bit, Larish is in the midst of an All-American caliber season hitting .367 (65-for-177) with 12 doubles, two triples and 15 home runs. He leads the Pac-10 with 79 RBI and with five more walks will become only the second Sun Devil to join the 70-70 (RBI-BB) club in a single season (Alvin Davis; 1982). Larish currently has a career-high 14-game hitting streak and was one of three Sun Devils to be invited to the 2003 USA Baseball National Team Trials this summer.

ASU's starting shortstop in all 53 games this season, sophomore Dustin Pedroia currently leads the Pac-10 in hitting with a .419 (95-for-227) batting average. Pedroia needs only five more hits to become only the 22nd Sun Devil to record 100 hits in a season and is bying to become only ASU's 16th player to hit over .400 in a season. Ranked first in the nation with 29 doubles, Pedroia is only one off the ASU single-season record of 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978 and only two off the Pac-10 record of 31 set by Mike Kinkade (WSU) in 1994. Pedroia has recorded a hit in 50 of ASU's 53 games, including 32 multi-hit games and has had three separate hitting streaks of 10 or more games.

After leading the Pac-10 with a 2.37 ERA and finishing second with eight saves, ASU's junior closer Ryan Schroyer is putting together another good season in 2003. Schroyer is 4-2 with seven saves and a 1.47 ERA in 24 appearances. Schroyer did not give up an earned run until giving up a run in his 16th game of the year (Stanford; 3/23). A preseason All-America selection by NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball who has a combined 1.51 ERA and 15 saves as a closer over the last two seasons (77.2 IP, 13 ER). Schroyer was also named a second-team summer All-American by *Baseball America* after going 1-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA.
