NATIONAL RANKINGS

Arizona State (39-9) is ranked in all three national polls and is the No. 5 team in the nation by Sports Weekly/ ESPN and also ranked No. 11 by both Baseball America and No. 7 Collegiate Baseball. ASU has been in the national top 10 all season including spending two weeks at No. 1 (SW). The **Sun Devils** have now been ranked in the national polls for <u>71</u> consecutive polls.

All three games vs. Washington State will be broadcast on the radio on NBC 1190 AM with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all the action from the Packard Stadium press box. All three games will also be carried over the world wide web on www.TheSunDevils.com. The statistical GameTracker will also be up and running for the threegame series vs. the Cougars. AZ-TV will also broadcast the first two games of the series with George Allen and Doug Gerlach handling the play-by-play duties. The games are carried locally on Cox Cable Channel 13.

THE STORYLINE

Arizona State (39-9, 7-5) returns to the diamond this weekend with a three-game series against Washington State (13-26, 4-8) at Packard Stadium. ASU is currently in second place in the Pac-10 tied with arch rival Arizona and two games back of conference leader Stanford (9-3). ASU is coming off a disappointing series loss to UCLA last weekend at home and will try to rebound against the Cougars. ASU is 2-4 at home this year in Pac-10 play, compared to 5-1 on the road. ASÚ leads the league in both pitching (3.44 ERA) and batting (.347) heading into the series. Sophomore SS Dustin Pedroia needs three more doubles to break the ASU single-season record of 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978.

Quick Hits:

- After starting the season 28-1 (ASU's best start ever), the Devils are 12-8 in their last 20 games.
- ASU is currently in second place in the Pac-10 with a 7-5 record two games behind league leader Stanford (9-3).
- ASU leads the Pac-10 with a .347 batting average and 3.44 ERA. They are third in the NCAA in batting average.
- The Devils also rank 18th in the nation with a 3.44 ERA and fourth in scoring with 10 runs per game.
- ASU has scored 10 or more runs in 24 games this year and recorded 10 or more hits in 36 of 48 games.
- ASU has scored in a NCAA record 481 consecutive games dating back to April 7, 1995. The old NCAA record was 349.
- ASU's roster consists of 18 upper classmen (juniors and seniors) and 18 lower classmen (freshman and sophomores).
- The four runs given up in the Cal series are the least given up in a three-game Pac-10 series by ASU in 25 years.
- The Devils have recorded 115 big innings (2 or more runs) this year, including 25 innings of five or more runs. The Jan. 16 season-opener was the second earliest start in ASU history and was the first collegiate game in 2003.
- Arizona State currently has an ISR (overall strength) of 5 and a projected RPI of 22 by Boydsworld.com.
- SS Dustin Pedroia leads the Pac-10 with 28 doubles and stands atop the NCAA rankings with 0.58 per game.
- Senior Jered Liebeck leads the Pac-10 with a 2.55 ERA and is 7-0 heading into the weekend series with WSU.
- Junior DH Jeremy West has been hot as of late hitting .424 (28-for-66) in his last 25 games.
- Sophomore SS Dustin Pedroia is third in the Pac-10 in hitting at .413 and has 29 multi-hit games and 28 doubles.
- Pedroia has recorded a hit in 45 of ASU's 48 games and 56 of last 59 games dating back to end of 2002 season.
- Junior closer Ryan Schroyer is 4-2 with seven saves and a 1.10 ERA in 22 games. He has struck out 34 in 32.2 IP.
- Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 72 RBI (1.60 per game) and is second with 14 home runs. He had 9 RBI vs. SDSU (1/26).
- ASU has hit 10 grand slams this year (two off NCAA record) and Larish set an ASU single-season record with his fourth.
- ASU has 54 home runs by 12 different players this year. ASU had only 38 total home runs in 58 games in 2002.
- Jeff Larish, Dustin Pedroia, Erik Averill and Travis Buck all earned midseason honors from Baseball America.
- The starting pitchers have combined to go 21-2 with a 3.34 ERA this year. The starters this weekend are a combined 16-0.
- Of ASU's nine losses, five have been by one run and seven of the nine have been by three or less runs. ASU's next home run will be No. 500 since Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995.

Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Reaches 481:

The Arizona State baseball program has now scored in an NCAA record 481consecutive games dating back to the 1995 season. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game. The Devils broke the 12-year-old NCAA record in a 5-1 loss to USC exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field. The Devils recently celebrated the eighth anniversary of the start of the streak with a 10-2 win over Grand Canyon on April 7. The one run scored in the 3-1 loss to Stanford (4/12/ 02) marked only the 12th time during the streak that ASU has scored only one



run. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in three games dating back to the 1990 season. <u>ASU is a combined 318-162-1 during the streak.</u> Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State).

Poll Mechanics:

Arizona State remained in the top 10 in three of the four national polls despite dropping two close games last weekend at home to UCLA. ASU is ranked No. 5 by Sports Weekly/ESPN, No. 7 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 11 by Baseball America. Ranked as high as No. 8 in the preseason polls, the Devils have spent virtually the entire season in the top 10 and for two weeks manned the top spot in two of the three national rakings, marking the first time being No. 1 since heading into the 1993 College World Series. ASU has been ranked for 71 consecutive national polls dating back to the start of the 2000 season. ASU entered the 2003 season ranked as high as No. 8 in the nation by Baseball America in the preseason collegiate polls. Arizona State also earned a preseason No. 9 ranking by Sports Weekly/ESPN, No .10 by NCBWA and No. 12 ranking by Collegiate Baseball. The No. 8 preseason ranking is the highest by an ASU squad since opening the 2001 season as the consensus No. 6 team in the nation.

The Grand Salami:

After hitting only one grand slam all of last year, the Sun Devils have gone on a binge this year hitting 10 in their first 48 games. Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish broke the single-season school record by hitting his fourth grand slam vs. UCLA (4/19). Larish broke the old record of three set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Junior second baseman Steve Garrabrants also has two slams, while Ryan Bosch, Travis Buck, Rod Allen and Jeremy West each have one. ASU is also quickly approaching the NCAA record for grand slams in a season of 12 set by Oklahoma State in 1995. ASU has been clutch in 2003 with the bases loaded hitting at a combined clip of .400 (50-for-125). Larish leads the team hitting .684 (13-for-19) with the sacks full.

Close Games:

Arizona State has built up a 39-9 record heading into the final 14 games of the 2003 regular season. The Sun Devils have lost straight games this year only two times and have suffered a number of close losses this year. Of the Devils nine losses this year, five have come by one run and seven by three or less runs. ASU's five Pac-10 setbacks have come by way of four one-run games and a two-run contest to Stanford.

All This Guy Does Is Get On Base:

Junior utility player Nick Walsh has one goal in mind when he steps in the batters box... get on base. Walsh, a native of Alamo, Calif., is one of ASU's hottest hitters going 11-for-19 (.579) in his last five games. He is ranked sixth in the Pac-10 with a .500 on-base percentage and has drawn six walks in the last five games. During his torrid five-game stretch, Walsh has recorded four multi-hit games.

ASU Continues To Lead Pac-10 in Hitting and Pitching:

The Sun Devils lead the Pac-10 in two of the three major statistical categories heading into the conference series with Washington State. ASU is tops in the league with a .347 batting average and also first with a 3.44 ERA. The Devils lead in the batting category by 11 percentage points over arch rival Arizona (.336) and by a wide margin over Stanford in the pitching department (4.16). Nationally the Devils rank third in batting average, 18th in team ERA and fourth in scoring averaging 10 runs per game. Defensively the Devils are third in the Pac-10 with a .972 percentage, and rank 21st nationally.

Pitching and Defense Dominate in Cal Series:

The pitching staff dominated the California Golden Bears over the weekend combining to give up only four runs (three earned) and tallied an 1.00 ERA in the series. The four runs given up are the lowest combined total in a three-game conference series during ASU's 25-year history in the Pac-10. In Sunday's double-header the Devils allowed only one run in 18 innings and outscored the Bears 16-1. Giving up the only run of the second game in the seventh inning, ASU nearly recorded its first back-to-back shutouts in Pac-10 play. The four runs given up in a three-game Pac-10 series are the least dating back to giving up seven runs in three-game sweep vs. Cal in 1993 (11-1, 11-4, 11-2). The lowest number of runs given up in a three-game Pac-10 series before the Cal series was five runs vs. USC (4/16-18) during the national championship 1981 season. Behind every good pitching note is an even better defensive stat. ASU turned six double plays (two in each game) during the series and committed only two errors. Solid defense from the outfield also included an outfield assist from right fielder Andre Ethier to gun down a potential run at the plate.

Four Sun Devils Bring Home Midseason Honors:

Four Sun Devils earned mention in *Baseball America's* midseason review. Freshmen Travis Buck (OF) and Erik Averill (LHP) both were named to the midseason All-America freshman team, while sophomores Dustin Pedroia (SS) and Jeff Larish (DH) were picked for their respective class. Here is what BA had to say about Larish being named the "Biggest Surprise of the First Half of the Season":

"Larish slowed down a bit after a torrid start to the 2003 season. He came down with back spasms in mid-March and missed a couple of games, but few college players have ever put together a better half season than Larish, a sophomore who was supposed to redshirt last year but was pressed into the lineup at midseason and hasn't stopped hitting. A left-handed hitter, he was batting .372-13-64. He had driven in all those runs in just 38 games despite drawing 51 walks, and his .551 on-base percentage probably has Athletics general manager Billy Beane drooling for the '04 draft."

Last Year vs. Washington State:

Arizona State took two of three from the Cougars last year in a three-game series at Bailey-Brayton Field in Pullman (April 5-7). For the second straight year the Cougs won the series opener, defeating ASU 7-4 behind a complete-game from Eddie Bonine. ASU rallied to defeat WSU 13-7 and 22-4 in the next two games to earn the series victory. Jeremy West homered in each of the three games and combined to go 6-for-14 (.429) with five runs scored and seven RBI to earn Pac-10 Player of the Week honors. Additionally, Steve Garrabrants (.455), Andre Ethier (.400) and Ryan McKenna (.400) each had good weekends at the plate. Ethier had a career day a the plate in the series finale going 3-for-4 with five runs scored, five RBI and two home runs. On the mound Ryan Schroyer (3 H, 0 R, 3 IP) and Robbie McClellan (9 H, 7 IP, 4 ER) picked up the pitching wins.

Last Time vs. Washington State at Packard Stadium:

The Cougars last visited Packard Stadium for a three-game set April 12-14 during the 2001 season. Just like in 2002, WSU opened the series with a victory posting a 2-1 win with current University of Hawaii pitcher Justin Cayetano allowing only one run in 7.1 innings. The Devils bounced back to win the second game on a Nick Walsh home run in the seventh inning and then completed the series victory with a 14-4 win.

Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same

time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in three of the past five years, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy is 345-173-1 in his ninth season in Tempe and posts an all-time 24-18 record in NCAA Tournament action. With a career 718-344-4 record in 19 seasons as a head coach, Murphy is the winningest active baseball coach under the age of 45 at any collegiate level. Murphy recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory in 2002 and recorded his 700th career coaching victory (all levels) with a 14-8 come-from-behind win over No. 11 Notre Dame (2/23). ASU has been in 70 straight national polls under Murphy.

Sun Devils Record Best Start in School History:

Arizona State's 28-1 start to the season goes down in the record books as the best start in school history. The 28-1 record includes an 11-game winning streak to start the season before a loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State (Jan. 31) and a 19-game win streak up until suffering a 6-5 loss to Oklahoma (3/14). During the 28-1 start to the season ASU's pitchers posted an impressive 3.11 ERA and the hitters combined for a .360 team batting average.

About the 19-Game Winning Streak:

After starting the year 9-0, ASU suffered its first setback with an 11-5 loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State on Jan. 31. After that loss, ASU went on a 19-game winning streak combining to go 13-0 in February and won the first six games in March before losing 6-5 to No. 30 Oklahoma (3/14). The 19-game winning streak is the longest by an ASU squad since the 1990 team won 23 straight games. Dustin Pedroia led ASU during the streak hitting .432 (35-for-81) with 11 of his Pac-10 leading 28 doubles. As a team the Sun Devils hit at a .344 clip and pitched for an impressive 2.56 ERA.

Home Run Notes:

Through 48 games of the 2003 season the Sun Devils have already surpassed their entire season total from 2002 with 54 home runs. ASU has hit 38 of those home runs at Packard Stadium and 16 in its 18 road or neutral site games. Of the 30 games played at Packard Stadium the Devils have hit at least one home run in 21 games. A total of 12 different players have hit at least one home run and eight players have two or more home runs. Sophomore Jeff Larish leads the way with 14 round-trippers, including an ASU single-season record of four grand slams. The Devils have homered in 30 of their 48 games, including 17 multi-home run games. The Devils also have 10 grand slams on the season with Larish (4), Steve Garrabrants (2), Jeremy West, Rod Allen and freshmen Ryan Bosch and Travis Buck all leaving the yard with the bases loaded. ASU had only one grand slam in 2002 and four in 2001. ASU's home run breakdown includes 13 solo shots, 19 two-run homers, 12 three-run home runs and 10 grand slams.

Pedroia On Fire at the Plate-

Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) has been the spark plug to ASU's early season success and an integral part to ASU's 39-9 record. ASU's only player to play and start in all 48 games, Pedroia is third in the Pac-10 in hitting at .413 (85-for-206) with 28 doubles and 38 RBI. He is first in the Pac-10 in hits (85), doubles (28) and total bases (124) and leads ASU with 32 extra base hits. He has also recorded 29 multihit games to pace the ASU offense and has ignited several ASU scoring rallies as is evident by his .506 (43x85) average as a leadoff hitter (inning and game). In a rare performance, Pedroia went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in ASU's 4-2 win over LBSU (2/2) to have his career-long 22-game hitting streak come to a halt. The streak, which spanned 11 games each at the end of 2002 and 11 games to begin 2003, fell just two games off the top six in ASU Baseball history. It is the longest streak since current Houston Astros prospect Brooks Conrad had a 21-game streak in 2000. During the streak Pedroia combined to hit .390 (41x105). He also recently had a 17-game and 13-game hitting streaks come to an end. Pedroia now has a hit in 56 of his last 59 games, including hits in all but three games this year (45 of 48). In his two years as a Sun Devil he already has 167 hits, 41 of which are doubles, and has never missed a start in 106 consecutive games. In the field Pedroia has also been the rock to ASU's solid .971 team fielding percentage. The slick fielding shortstop has committed eight errors in 207 total chances for a .964 fielding percentage and has been part of 27 double plays.

Pedroia Going For School and Pac-10 Doubles Record:

With three more doubles in the UCLA series, Pedroia notched his 26th, 27th and 28th doubles of the season. He is now just two off the school record of 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978 and three off the Pac-10 record of 31 set by Washington State's Mike Kinkade in 1994. Pedroia is ranked first in the NCAA with his average of 0.58 doubles per game.

Pedroia Named To Initial Watch List For Golden Spikes Award:

Arizona State sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia was included among 25 players named to the initial watch list for the 2003 Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's top amateur baseball player. The 2002 Team USA member was one of only two Pac-10 players to be named to the initial watch list (Carlos Quentin, Stanford). Five finalists will be announced in June, with the winner being revealed in July. Arizona State sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish is also among 175 players around the nation that remain in contention for the prestigious award. Arizona State has a long tradition of Golden Spikes Award winners as three past Sun Devils have won the award. Bob Horner (1978), Oddibe McDowell (1984) and Mike Kelly (1991) have all won the award. Only Florida State and Cal State Fullerton have matched ASU's legacy also with three winners of the annual Golden Spikes Award.

The Jeff Larish Watch:

Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish has quickly put his name atop the list of as a top candidate for national player of the year and the Golden Spikes Award in 2003. Larish is hitting .367 (58-for-158) with 14 home runs, 11 doubles and leads the conference with 72 RBI. Larish has recorded at least one hit in 37 of 45 games and one RBI in 34 of 45 games this year. He also leads the conference with 57 walks (1.27 per game) and has an unbelievable on-base percentage of .534. For the season he is slugging .728 (second in Pac-10) and is second on the team with 27 extra base hits. He had connected on four grand slams this year, breaking the single-season school record set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. In addition, he is batting .684 (13x19) with the bases loaded and leads the team with 29 two-out RBI. Larish, who was supposed to redshirt in 2002 but played midway through the season, hit .328 with three home runs in 34 games last year. Drafted in the 32nd round in 2001 by the Chicago Cubs, Larish etched his named in the ASU record books with a memorable game in the series finale vs. San Diego State (1/26). In what turned out to be a 24-9 ASU route, Larish was 3-for-4 and tied the school single-game record with nine RBI. He had a two-run single in the first inning, a two-run home run in the third, a grand slam homer in the fourth and then tied the 13-year-old school record (Tommy Adams) by walking with the bases loaded in the eighth.

Larish Breaks Single-Season Record With Four Grand Slams:

With his fourth grand slam of the season in the eighth inning of ASU's 17-1 blowout of UCLA on April 19, sophomore Jeff Larish broke the single-season record for grand slams. The previous record was three set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Here is a look at Larish's four grand slams this year:

Liebeck and Thurmond Leading the Pac:

Senior right-handed pitchers Jered Liebeck (Glendale, Ariz.) and Ben Thurmond (Hopkins, S.C.) are ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the Pac-10 in the ERA race. Liebeck is 7-0 with a league best 2.55 ERA, while Thurmond is 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA. As a team the pitching staff leads the league with a 3.44 ERA.

Freshman Records About To Go Down:

Freshman Travis Buck and Erik Averill are making a serious dent in the ASU freshman record books despite there being 14 games left in the regular season. Averill is already tied for ninth with his seven wins, eighth in ERA (3.36), and tied for 10th with 40 strikeouts. Buck is ranked seventh with 63 hits with Barry Bonds, eighth with 11 doubles and fifth with 47 runs scored.

Liebeck Making Most of Senior Season:

Senior right-handed pitcher Jered Liebeck is making the most of his senior season turning into one of ASU's go-to pitchers in crucial game situations. Liebeck leads the Pac-10 with a 2.55 ERA and is a perfect 7-0 on the season. He has allowed only one earned run in his last 10.1 innings and striking out 42 in 60.0 innings on the year. He earned national and Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors early in the season (2/3) when he threw a complete-game three-hit shutout against Long Beach State.

2.300 In The Books:

With the series sweep of California last weekend ASU notched win No. 2,300 since baseball start in 1907. ASU is now 2,302-1,124-6 in its 92nd year of baseball competition.

Ethier Starting to Heat Up:

Junior outfielder Andre Ethier entered the season as a third-team preseason All-American selection by the NCBWA and with 14 games left in the 2003 regular season is starting to heat up. After going 8-for-17 (.471) with two home runs in the series vs. UCLA, Ethier is now hitting .348 (62-for-178) with nine doubles and four home runs. The 2002 First-Team All-Pac-10 selection now has hits in eight of his last nine games (16-for-41; .390). Ethier has proven to be clutch this year with one of his home runs coming on a three-run shot to tie the game vs. Stanford (3/23) in the ninth inning and another being a solo homer to tie the game in the bottom of the 11th inning vs. UCLA (4/18).

ASU has recorded a Pac-10 best 121 doubles on the year (2.52 per game average). Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the team and Pac-10 with 28 and Steve Garrabrants is tied for fifth with 14. The team | Single Season Doubles: record for doubles in a season is 185 set in 1988, while the individual season record is 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978.

#### West Looking To Get Back in Lineup:

Junior designated hitter Jeremy West has been one of ASU's hitters as of late going 28-for-66 (.424) in his last 25 games to raise his season batting average all the way from .216 to its current mark of .333. Although he hasn't hit a home run since March 14 vs. Oklahoma, ASU's active leader with 28 career long balls has been getting hits when he is in the lineup. West started Saturday in the series finale vs. UCLA tying a career high with four hits and is expected to see time either at first base (his starting spot in 2002) or at designated hitter in the coming Washington State series.

#### Travis Buck Hits For The Cycle:

Freshman outfielder Travis Buck went 5-for-5 with even RBI and hit for the cycle in ASU's 19-0 win over Southern Utah (3/7). He became only the seventh Sun Devil in recorded history to record the elusive cycle and became the first freshman in Pac-10 history to hit for the cycle. Buck capped his perfect night with a grand slam home run as part of an eight-run sixth inning to become ASU's first player to hit for the cycle since Mitch Jones on May 21, 2000 at Arizona. Buck, ASU's normal starting left fielder who was making only his second start in right field, had a single in the first, a double in the third and a triple in the fifth before connecting on his second home run of the year for the cycle. He also added a run-scoring single in the fourth and tied a career high with two stolen bases. For the season Buck, who was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week after going 8-for-11 (.727) vs. USC, is hitting .371 (63-for-170) with 11 doubles and three home runs. #### Schroyer Ranks Fifth in ASU History With 15 Career Saves:

Junior closer Ryan Schroyer has been all but unstoppable in 2003 out of the bullpen. The hard-throwing right-hander is 4-2 with seven saves this year and has a 1.10 ERA allowing only four earned runs to score in his 32.2 innings pitched. The preseason All-American has scattered 29 hits in his 22 outings and has struck out 34 batters. He is coming off a season-high outing of 4.2 innings in which he kept ASU close giving up only one run and three hits in ASU's 8-7 loss in 13 innings. The save over USC (3/30) in which he scattered three hits in 1.2 innings moved him into fifth place in the ASU career record books with his 15th career save. Including his summer All-American season with the NBC World Series Champion Alaska Goldpanners, Schroyer is 5-2 with 14 saves in his last 50.2 IP (64 K's). After recording eight (8) as the league's top pitcher (2.37 ERA) in 2002, Schroyer is looking to continue to move up the charts. Here is a look at ASU's top save leaders in school history:

#### Pitching To Near Perfection:

A big reason behind ASU's stellar 39-9 season is because of the Chris Sinacori led pitching staff. Through 48 games the pitchers have combined for a Pac-10 best 3.44 ERA while striking out 393 and walking 159. On 25 different occasions the staff has combined to walk three or less batters, including not allowing a walk in three games, most recently in a 10-2 win over Grand Canyon. ASU's pitchers have also combined to strike out eight or more batters in 27 games, including a season-high 16 vs. Utah (3/8) and vs. UCLA (4/18). The starters have been especially hot, combining to go 21-2 with a 3.34 ERA, while the relievers are 18-7 with seven saves and a 3.54 ERA. Seniors Jered Liebeck and freshman lefty Erik Averill lead the team with seven wins each. ASU ranks 18th nationally in pitching with a 3.44 ERA. The lowest combined team ERA during the eight-year Pat Murphy era (1995-P) was 4.40 by last year's team.

#### Sun Devils Hot at the Plate:

The Sun Devils are leading the Pac-10 in hitting with a team .347 batting average and rank fourth nationally averaging 10 runs per game. ASU has recorded 10 or more hits in 36 of its 48 games and is averaging 12.48 hits per game. The Devils also lead the conference in runs scored with 478. Dustin Pedroia leads he team in hitting at .413 (85-for-206) and sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish leads the team with 72 RBI and 14 home runs. ASU has already hit 54 home runs, already surpassing the entire season total of 88 hit in 58 games in 2002. As a team ASU has combined to record 167 multi-hit games (led by the 29 from Pedroia) and 105 multi-RBI contests (led by the 14 from Larish).

#### Catching Position Turing Into a Real Battle:

The catching battled between sophomores Tuffy Gosewisch and Joel Bocchi has been about as even as ossible. Gosewisch has the small edge with 25 starts compared to Bocchi's 22 starts. Gosewisch has tarted 10 of the last 12 games and is hitting .341 (29-for-85) with 24 RBI and one home run. Gosewisch, whose brother Chip was a Sun Devil from 1996-99, is coming off a good weekend vs. UCLA going 4-for-(.667) while hitting his first career home run. Bocchi started the season on a tear hitting over .400 until the lotre Dame series, but has cooled off as of late to bring his season average down to .338 (26-for-77) with wo home runs and 20 RBI.

#### Not a Bad To Have Him on the Bench:

When Jeff Larish went down with back spasms, inserting Mike Guerrero into the lineup was not a hard decision to make. Guerrero, a junior who transferred to ASU in 2001 and redshirted last year, responded by hitting .375 (6-for-16) with six doubles with Larish out of the lineup. For the season Guerrero is second on the team in batting at .389 (28-for-72) with 12 doubles, two triples, two home runs and 21 RBI. Guerrero has made 11 starts this year, with two coming in the last two games against UCLA.

#### **Multi-Hit Madness:**

Led by the 29 from Dustin Pedroia, nine different Sun Devils have 10 or more multi-hit games to their credit this year. Amazingly, Pedroia has recorded 21 two-hit games, five three-hit contests and three fourhit affairs for his 29 multi-hit games. Jeff Larish (17), Andre Ethier (17), Steve Garrabrants (16), Travis Buck (16), Dennis Wyrick (11), Tuffy Gosewisch (11), Frank Mesa (10) and Jeremy West (10) all have 10 or more multi-hit games. Last year seven Sun Devils finished the season with 10 or more multi-hit games, led by the 27 from Pedroia.

#### The Big Inning:

The Sun Devils have been a scoring machine this year ranking third in the nation averaging 10 runs per game this year (ranked fourth in the NCAA). ASU has also proven to be an explosive team at the plate, recording 115 big innings (2 or more runs). The team has also recorded 25 innings when they score five or more runs. ASU's biggest run production in a single frame has been nine runs on two different occasions, most recently with a two-out rally in the 14-8 win over Notre Dame (2/23).

### **Attendance Marks Impressive at Packard Stadium:**

Arizona State is always in the national top 10 for attendance marks when playing at Packard Stadium and once again fans keep coming through the turnstile in 2003. In ASU's 30 home games this year, the Devils are averaging a home crowd of just under 3,000 (2,858) with a total of 85,762 fans attending the games. ASU's largest single-game crowd was the series opener vs. Oklahoma (4,155). The home season opener vs. San Diego State also had a good crowd drawing 3,972 fans. ASU also had 10,043 attend the threegame series against San Diego State and 7,008 attend the two games against Notre Dame. The Oklahoma three-game series had a total of 10.861 fans for the three-game set, while the largest three-game crowd was established vs. Stanford with 10,889 turning out for the series.

#### **Perrault Takes His Shirt Off:**

Junior right-handed pitcher Josh Perrault was scheduled to use the 2003 season as a redshirt season, but after having success in practice, Perrault will become a key factor in the ASU bullpen for the rest of the season. He made his 2003 debut vs. Stanford (3/23) with one scoreless inning. Perrault was 0-0 with a 6.97 ERA in nine games (2 starts) as a sophomore in 2002.

Over the last two years the Sun Devils have had a flare for scoring runs with two outs. In 2002 the Devils scored 232 of their 450 total runs (52%) with two outs. ASU is back at it again in 2003 scoring 189 of their 478 runs (39%) after two outs have been recorded. During the season-high nine-run sixth inning that led to ASU's 14-8 come-from-behind victory over Notre Dame (2/23), all nine runs came with two outs after a full-count walk to Jeff Larish. Larish leads the team with 29 two-out RBI, while catcher Tuffy Gosewisch leads the team hitting .414 (12x29) with two outs. As a team the Devils are batting .322 (177x549) after two outs have been recorded.

#### **Home Sweet Home:**

ASU returns to Packard Stadium in 2003 after playing in Mesa (Hohokam Park) in 2002. The Devils recorded their 800th career victory at Packard Stadium (3/1 vs. PSU) and have an all-time 808-230-1 dating back to 1974. ASU will play 40 of its 62 games in the state of Arizona and 37 at Packard Stadium this year. After playing nine of its first 12 games on the road, the Devils spent nearly the entire months of February and March in the state of Arizona with only three games away from Packard Stadium at the new spring training facility of the Texas Rangers/Kansas City Royals in Surprise. After going 29-10 in designated home games last year, the Devils are 23-7 at home this year now have a combined 156-50-1 (.756) home record in the last five years dating back to 1998. ASU is hitting .342 with 38 home runs in 30 home games and pitching for a 3.76 team ERA on the mound.

#### **Buck and Bosch Among Fab 50 Freshmen:**

ASU's freshman outfield tandem of Travis Buck and Ryan Bosch has both been tabbed as part of Baseball America's Freshman Fab 50 prior to the start of the 2003 season. Buck, a 23rd round draft choice of the Seattle Mariners last June, is ranked No. 25 on the list. Buck has started 43 of ASU's 45 games and is hitting .380 with two home runs and 35 RBI. Bosch, ranked No. 41, has started 26 games in center field and is hitting .202 with 20 hits, three home runs and 22 RBI.

Through the first 48 games of the season the Devils have mixed and matched for 44 different batting lineups and 28 different positional lineups.

#### Larish, Pedroia and Schroyer on Player of the Year Watch List.

Sophomores Jeff Larish and Dustin Pedroia, and junior Ryan Schroyer have been named to the Rotary Smith Award's preliminary watch list for the annual player of the year award. Amongst the 130 Division 1 college baseball players to be selected to the initial list, the ASU trio is in contention for the prestigious award that is celebrating its 16th year of honoring the nation's finest collegiate baseball player. The only Sun Devil to ever win the Smith Award was Mike Kelly in 1990. The Smith Award is conducted by the Rotary Club of Houston and benefits several charities, including the Texas Children's Hospital and the Karl Young League. Pedroia and Larish are also on USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award watch list.

#### A Nice Way To Rebound:

With an overall 39-9 record heading into the Washington State series, the Sun Devils have only lost back-to-back games two times this year. After seven of their nine losses, the Devils have responded by winning the next game.

#### Liebeck Sweeps Pac-10 and National Pitcher of the Week Honors:

Senior RHP Jered Liebeck swept the national and Pac-10 awards (Feb. 4) after throwing a complete-game, three-hit shutout against the No. 13 Long Beach State 49ers. Liebeck struck out two and did not allow a hit past the fifth inning to improve to 2-0. He allowed only one runner reach second base and until issuing his first walk of the game in the ninth inning, had retired 10 straight LBSU batters down the stretch. The complete-game shutout (9.0 IP) was the first by a Sun Devil since Drew Friedberg one-hit Hawaii-Hilo in 1999. He was named the Collegiate Baseball and NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week and became the 45th ASU pitcher to earn Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week acclaim.

#### A Tough Schedule For ASU Baseball:

The Sun Devils 2003 schedule is once again be one of the toughest in the nation, which includes 11 teams that were listed on Baseball America's Preseason Top 50. The 62-game regular-season schedule also features 25 games against nine teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament a year ago. In the recent stretch of 25 straight games in the state of Arizona (started with BYU series, ended with Stanford series), ASU hosted Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, Wichita State, Notre Dame and Stanford. ASU has already gone 15-6 against teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last year and is 8-5 against ranked (at least one poll) opponents. ASU currently has a No. 5 rating on Boydworld.com's ISR and a pseudo RPI of No. 22.

#### **How They Compare To Past Years:**

The Sun Devils are 39-9 through the first 48 games of the 2003 season after recording the best start in school history at 28-1. Here is a look at how the Devils have fared in games 45-55 since 1995.

#### **Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:**

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last five years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999 and 10.97 runs per game in 2000. The Devils paced the Pac-10 in 2001, hitting at a .327 clip and averaging 8.26 runs per game to rank 17th in the nation. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark, trailing Stony Brook by one point. During Pat Murphy's nine seasons at ASU, the Sun Devils have been a scoring machine with 4,777 runs in 519 games, averaging 9.20 runs per game and hitting at an overall .330 clip. ASU leads the Pac-10 in hitting again this year at .347 and is averaging 9.96 runs per game. Below is an offensive team breakdown of Murphy's ASU teams:

#### **ASU And Team USA Connections:**

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 11 as a supplier to the National Team. ASU has had eight players don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984, with the first being Oddibe McDowell in the 1984 Olympics played at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. Jim Austin played for Team USA in 1990 and ASU has had five more players play with Team USA in the last five years. 1999 Pac-10 Player of the Year Willie Bloomquist played in the summer of 1998, 2000-2001 Pac-10 Player of the Year Casey Myers played in the summer of 2000 and was also a member of the Team USA Junior National Team before arriving at ASU in 1998. Current Tampa Bay Devil Ray prospect Jon Switzer was also a member of the 2000 National Team and Mike Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA in the summer of 2001. Sophomore Dustin Pedroia played for the National Team last summer and was the starting shortstop until getting hurt near the end of the season. Current Sun Devils Dennis Wyrick and Ryan Schroyer played for the Team USA Junior teams during their respective prep careers.

#### **Golden Spikes Common At Arizona State:**

While Khalil Greene of Clemson was the recipient of the 2002 Golden Spikes award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, it should be noted that three Arizona State players have won the award. In addition to ASU, only Cal State Fullerton and Florida State have won three Golden Spikes Awards. Bob Horner, who was a standout at ASU from 1976-78, won the inaugural award in 1978. Oddibe McDowell, who was a member of the first Team USA baseball team to compete in an Olympics, won the award in 1984. Mike Kelly, who ranks second in ASU history with 46 home runs from 1989-91, won the award in 1991. In all, 12 players that have worn the Maroon and Gold have been named a Player of the Year for college baseball.

#### **ASU Leader of the Pac When It Comes to Player of the Week:**

Arizona State has amassed 46 Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week and 67 Players of the Week since 1981. That total leads all Pac-10 member schools. Senior RHP Jered Liebeck became the first Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game, three-hit shutout of Long Beach State (2/1) and Ryan Schroyer earned his first award on Feb. 25. Junior Jeremy West joined Schroyer as ASU swept the weekly awards on Feb. 25. Andre Etheir and West (twice) were named Pac-10 Players of the Week in 2002, while Robbie McClellan and Mike Esposito earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors last year.

#### **Arizona State in Postseason Play:**

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has now advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 26 of the program's 44 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 124-51 (.709) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three third-place finishes. Arizona State is 15-10 in the NCAA Tournament under ninth-year head coach Pat Murphy. In addition to advancing three straight years, ASU has been left out of the tournament only once (1999) in the last six years and played for the national championship in 1998.



#### **Drafted Devils:**

A total of 16 players on the 2003 Arizona State squad have been taken in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Since the inception of the draft in 1965, ASU has had more players chosen (303), more first-round draft picks (21) and more No. 1 picks (3) than any other school in the nation. Both Bryce Kartler and Josh Perrault have been selected twice in the draft, but both times decided to stay and play college baseball. Newcomers Travis Buck, Chris Beatty, Seth Dhaenens, Ben Thurmond and Beau Vaughan have all been selected as well. ASU's three No. 1 picks were Rick Monday (1965), Floyd Bannister (1976) and Bob Horner (1978, Atlanta). No other college has had more than on No. 1 overall selection in the draft.

#### Horner Ranks Second As Collegiate Player of the Century:

Former Sun Devil greats Bob Horner and Eddie Bane were honored by Baseball America by being placed on the publication's "Team of the Century." Horner, an ASU great under Jim Brock from 1976-78, hit .383 for his career and belted a school record 56 home runs. Horner was listed second on the team behind Oklahoma State slugger Pete Incaviglia (1983-85). Bane, a top pitcher for the Sun Devils from 1971-72, posted a career 40-4 record and a 1.64 ERA. #### 92 Years of Sun Devil Baseball Tradition:

While the history of baseball at Arizona State University goes back all the way to the early 1900's, the school officially began sponsoring varsity baseball in 1959. Prior to 2002, the ASU Baseball Media Guide referred only to those players that played from 1959 to present. ASU now officially recognizes those players, coaches and seasons from 1907-1958. In 91-plus years of baseball at Arizona State, the program has built a legacy matched by few in the college baseball world. With a 2.302-1.124-6 all-time record, Arizona State has advanced to the College World Series 18 times, won five national championships, won six Pac-10 titles, produced 12 Players of the Year and three Golden Spikes Award winners, and has gone to the NCAA Tournament 26 times. Under current head coach Pat Murphy, the Sun Devils have finished in the top 12 in three of the last five years and finished second in the nation in 1998. They have been ranked in at least one top 25 poll for 67 consecutive weeks.
