- ASU has hit 12 grand slams this year to tie the NCAA record set by Oklahoma State in 1996. Larish has four to set an ASU record.
- ASU recorded a school record with a 28-1 start to the season that included a 19-game winning streak.
- ASU enters the Oregon State series in second place in the Pac-10 with a 10-5 record and is 1.5 games behind Stanford.
- Arizona State leads the league in hitting (.351), pitching (3.26) and is second in fielding (.973). • •
 - After 53 games the Devils are averaging 10.36 runs and 12.74 hits per game this year.
- ASU has scored 10 or more runs in 27 games this year and recorded 10 or more hits in 40 of 53 games.
- ASU has scored in a NCAA record 486 consecutive games dating back to April 7, 1995. The old NCAA record was 349. ASU's roster consists of 18 upper classmen (juniors and seniors) and 18 lower classmen (freshman and sophomores).
- The three runs given up in the WSU series are the least given up in a three-game Pac-10 series by ASU in 25 years.
- For the first time in ASU's 25-year history in the Pac-10, the Devils scored 20 runs twice in a conference series (WSU).
- The Jan. 16 season-opener was the second earliest start in ASU history and was the first collegiate game in 2003. The Devils have recorded 129 big innings (2 or more runs) this year, including 29 innings of five or more runs.
- Jeremy West earned his fourth career Pac-10 Player of the Week award after the WSU series, marking ASU's 69th all-time. SS Dustin Pedroia leads the Pac-10 with 29 doubles and is also first with a .419 batting average (32 multi-hit games).
 - Senior pitchers Jered Liebeck and Ben Thurmond are currently tied for the Pac-10 lead with identical 2.35 ERA's.
- . Jeremy West has hit seven home runs in the last five games and with 16 this year is now 10th all-time with 35 in his career. Pedroia, Jeff Larish and Travis Buck have all been been invited to the USA Baseball National Team Trials.
- Pedroia has recorded a hit in 50 of ASU's 53 games and needs only one double to tie the ASU record of 30 (Chris Bando). Junior Nick Walsh has raised his batting average 135 points over the last 10 games combining to go 20-for-38 (.526). .
- . Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 79 RBI (1.58 per game) and 65 walks (1.30 per game). He also has 15 home runs.
 - ASU has 66 home runs by 12 different players this year. ASU had only 38 total home runs in 58 games in 2002.
- Jeff Larish, Dustin Pedroia, Erik Averill and Travis Buck all earned midseason honors from Baseball America.
- The starting pitchers have combined to go 24-2 with a 3.13 ERA this year. The relievers are a combined 20-7 with a 3.38 ERA. . Of ASU's nine losses this year, five have been by one run and seven of the nine have been by three or less runs.

Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Reaches 486: 2003 National Polls

The Arizona State baseball program has now scored in an NCAA record 486 consecutive games dating back to the 1995 season. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game. The Devils broke the 12-year-old NCAA record in a 5-1 loss to USC exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field. The Devils recently celebrated the eighth anniversary of the start of the streak with a 10-2 win over Grand Canyon on April 7. The one run scored in the 3-1 loss to Stanford (4/12/



02) marked only the 12th time during the streak that ASU has scored only one run. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in three games dating back to the 1990 season. ASU is a combined 323-162-1 during the streak. Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State).

Poll Mechanics:

Arizona State remains a consensus top-10 team in all four national polls with the current six-game winning streak. ASU is ranked as high as No. 3 by Sports Weekly/ESPN, and also check in at No. 4 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 by Baseball America. Ranked as high as No. 8 in the preseason polls, the Devils have spent virtually the entire season in the top 10 and for two weeks manned the top spot in two of the three national rakings, marking the first time being No. 1 since heading into the 1993 College World Series. ASU has been ranked for 73 consecutive national polls dating back to the start of the 2000 season. ASU entered the 2003 season ranked as high as No. 8 in the nation by Baseball America in the preseason collegiate polls. Arizona State also earned a preseason No. 9 ranking by Sports Weekly/ESPN, No .10 by NCBWA and No. 12 ranking by Collegiate Baseball. The No. 8 preseason ranking is the highest by an ASU squad since opening the 2001 season as the consensus No. 6 team in the nation.

44 Wins In The Bag:

With an overall 44-9 record the 2003 Sun Devils have already matched the most wins in a season under current head coach Pat Murphy. The 2000 team finished the year 44-15 after losing in the regional final to Texas. The 44 wins also marks the third time during the Murphy era that the Devils have reached the 40-win plateau, with the 2000 and the 1998 (41-23) teams also achieving that milestone. ASU's last 50-win season was in 1990 when the Devils went 52-16.

The Grand Salami:

With a pinch-hit grand slam from Rod Allen in the seventh inning at Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City on April 30, Arizona State tied the NCAA record for grand slams in a season with their 12th of the year. The Devils are currently tied with Oklahoma State that also hit 12 in 1996. After hitting only one grand slam all of last year, the Sun Devils have gone on a binge this year hitting 12 in their first 53 games. Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish broke the single-season school record by hitting his fourth grand slam vs. UCLA (4/19). Larish broke the old record of three set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Steve Garrabrants, Rod Allen and Jeremy West each have two slams, while Ryan Bosch and Travis Buck each have one.

Close Games:

Arizona State has built up a 44-9 record heading into the final nine (9) games of the 2003 regular season. The Sun Devils have lost straight games this year only two times and have suffered a number of close losses this year. Of the Devils nine losses this year, five have come by one run and seven by three or less runs. ASU's five Pac-10 setbacks have come by way of four one-run games and a two-run contest to Stanford. ASU is currently on a six-game win streak heading into the Oregon State series.

Larish Looking to Join 70-70 Club:

Sophomore Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 79 RBI and 65 walks and has been a big reason behind ASU's 44-9 record in 2003. Larish's amazing season also includes 12 doubles, 15 home runs and with a current careerhigh 14-game hitting streak intact is hitting .367 (65-for-177). Even more amazing is that Larish needs only five more walks to become only the second player in ASU Baseball history to join the 70-70 (RBI-BB) club. Former Sun Devil and major leaguer Alvin Davis, who played first base for the Sun Devils from 1979-82, is the only other member of that club after recording 91 RBI and a single-season school record 87 walks in 1982.

Devils on the Road:

The Sun Devils will take to the road this weekend as they embark on its longest road trip of the season. Although the Devils opened the season with six games at Hawaii-Hilo, the upcoming trip to Oregon State and Washington will feature six consecutive Pac-10 contests in a stretch of eight days. The Devils, who own an impressive 17-2 record this season while playing away from Packard Stadium, will leave Saturday for Corvallis and then play Monday (5 p.m.), Tuesday (5 p.m.) and Wednesday (4 p.m.) against the Beavers. ASU will then bus up Interstate-5 to Seattle and play the Huskies in a three-game set starting Saturday (1 p.m.) and continuing Sunday (1 p.m.) and Monday (6:30 p.m.). The Devils had the schedule the rough stretch of games to accommodate the ASU's final exams that took place this week.

Leaders of the Pac:

Through 53 games the Sun Devils continue to lead the Pac-10 in several key offensive and defensive statistical categories. The offense paces the league hitting .351, with Dustin Pedroia (.419) ranked first and Frank Mesa (.385) ranked seventh. The Devils are also first in runs scored (549), hits (675), doubles (129) RBI (509), on-base percentage (.456) and second with 66 home runs. ASU's pitchers have dominated thus far leading second place Stanford by nearly a full point with a 3.26 team ERA. The Devils also rank second in the conference with a team .973 fielding percentage.

Recapping April:

The Sun Devils capped off one of the programs most successful Aprils in recent years with a 9-4 win over Oklahoma (4/30) at Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City. ASU finished the month with a 9-3 record, including going 7-2 in Pac-10 play. Junior slugger Jeremy West paced the ASU offense hitting .545 (18-for-33) in the month with five home runs and 17 RBI. Junior Nick Walsh made sure his name will be penciled into the lineup on a regular basis going 19-for-39 (.487) in 11 games in April with five doubles and 13 RBI. As a team the Devils hit .358 with 22 doubles, five triples and 19 home runs. The pitchers continued their success in 2003 by maintaining an impressive 2.87 ERA in the 12 games. Senior Ben Thurmond went 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in three games and 14.0 IP in April.

Buck, Larish and Pedroia Invited To USA Baseball Trials:

Arizona State Baseball players Travis Buck, Jeff Larish and Dustin Pedroia have been invited to the 2003 USA Baseball National Team Trials, to be held in Tucson, Ariz., from June 21-27. Buck, Larish and Pedroia were part of a selection show Thursday where 18 more players were invited to the Team USA Trials. One more wave of 10 invitees will be announced before the trials begin in June at Hi Corbett Field. Pedroia and Georgia Tech's Eric Patterson were selected after both playing for Team USA last summer. Phillip Humber (Rice) and Huston Street (Texas) also played in 2002 for Team USA and were part of the first wave of selections last month. Georgia Tech and ASU each had three players selected for the trials during the second wave. Buck, Larish and Pedroia are looking to become the latest in a long line of Sun Devils who have played for the USA Baseball National Team. ASU has sent five players to the national team in the last five years and eight total players since 1984. In recent years Willie Bloomquist (1998), Jon Switzer (2000), Casey Myers (2000), Mike Esposito (2001) and Pedroia (2002) have donned the Red, White and Blue for USA Baseball.

Nick Walsh on a Tear:

Junior utility player Nick Walsh has one goal in mind when he steps in the batters box... get on base. Walsh, a native of Alamo, Calif., was struggling up to the Cal series hitting only .238 (10-for-42) while playing in 32 games and making only five starts. But then he was inserted into the leadoff spot vs. the Golden Bears and finished the series 6-for-8 (.750) and since that series has gone on a tear going 20-for-38 (.426) to raise his season average 137 points to .375. He had a career-best game vs. Washington State (4/27) in which he went 6-for-6 with three doubles, seven RBI, five runs scored and recorded six different run-scoring hits. The three doubles, six hits and five runs scored were each one off the single-game ASU record and his seven RBI were two away from the school record. He is currently ranked fifth in the Pac-10 with a .500 on-base percentage.

Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same

time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in three of the past five years, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy is 350-173-1 in his ninth season in Tempe and posts an all-time 24-18 record in NCAA Tournament action. With a career 723-344-4 record in 19 seasons as a head coach, Murphy is the winningest active baseball coach under the age of 45 at any collegiate level. Murphy recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory in 2002 and recorded his 700th career coaching victory (all levels) with a 14-8 come-from-behind win over No. 11 Notre Dame (2/23). ASU has been in 70 straight national polls under Murphy.

The Return of Jeremy West:

Junior designate hitter Jeremy West has slowly but surely returned to his 2002 form in which he led the Pac-10 with 71 RBI and earned first-team all-conference honors. Riding a current nine-game hitting streak, West has gone 20-for-37 (.541) during that stretch with seven home runs and 21 RBI to raise his season average to .362 (48-for-133). Over his last 22 games West has raised his season average from .280 to .362 going 31-for-69 (.449) with 31 RBI. In his last five games he has hit seven home runs, including his third multi-homer game of the season Tuesday vs. UC Irvine. He recorded a career-best weekend vs. Washington State in which he earned his fourth career Pac-10 Player of the Week award. In the three-game set vs. the Cougars, West combined to go 9-for-16 (.562) with five home runs, seven runs scored and 13 RBI. He homered in all three games (extending his consecutive games homer streak vs. WSU to six games), including hitting a walk-off two-run homer in the 10th inning in Saturday's 5-3 victory and belting an ASU single-game record tying three on Sunday. Going 5-for-7 in the series finale, West tied the single-game home run mark with a two-run, threerun and grand slam home run and also equaled the school record with nine RBI. For the season, West now has 16 home runs to lead the team, including a trio of multi-home run games, and with 35 career homers is now tied for 10th in the ASU career record books. His .654 career slugging percentage also ranks fourth in ASU history heading into the Oregon State series this weekend.

All-Time Series vs. Oregon State:

Arizona State leads the all-time series against Oregon State 23-9 and has won five straight against the Beavers. Since both teams joined the combined Pac-10 in 1999, ASU owns an 8-4 record in Pac-10 games. Last Time at Goss Stadium at Coleman Field:

The Devils have an all-time 3-3 record at Goss Stadium at Coleman Field on the Oregon State campus. The Devils went 2-1 in their inaugural trip to Corvallis in 1999 and suffered a 2-1 series loss in 2001. After winning the series opener 10-2 in 2001, the Beavers stormed back to win game two 4-1 and took the rubber game in convincing fashion with a 12-2 victory. Current senior Dennis Wyrick has had success in Corvallis in his only trip there going 6-for-12 (.500) with a double and Jeremy West went 3-for-7 (.429) as a freshman. The normally potent ASU offense combined to hit only .260 with two extra base hits in its last trip to Corvallis (2001).



Earlier This Year vs. Oregon State:

The Sun Devils and Beavers met earlier this year on Feb. 16 in the final game of the Surprise Spring Training Classic in Surprise, Ariz. ASU defeated the Beavers 9-4 to improve to 17-1 with senior RHP Jered Liebeck picking up the win. The Devils did all of the damage in only three innings, taking a 1-0 lead after the first inning and then scored four runs in each the third and fifth frames. Dustin Pedroia went 3-for-4 with three runs scored and blasted a solo home run. Steve Garrabrants and Rod Allen also homered at the spring training complex of the Kansas City Royals and Texas Rangers. OSU's starter Stephen Copeland, who is Wednesday's scheduled starter, took the loss giving up three hits and three runs in 2.2 IP.

Scoring at Will:

Arizona State heads into the Oregon State series ranked third in the nation averaging 10.36 runs per game and has scored 10 or more runs in 27 of its 53 games (51%). The Devils have also scored 20 or more runs in three games this season and as a team are also ranked third in the nation hitting .351.

Production at First Base:

The first base position has proven to be ASU's big run producer this year with Jeff Larish, Mike Guerrero and Jeremy West combining to torture opposing teams. In ASU's 53 games, Larish has played in 46 games, Guerrero in 14 games and West in one game at first base. The trio when playing the position have combined to go 82-for-204 (.402) with 21 doubles, 17 home runs and 90 RBI.

Pitching To Near Perfection:

A big reason behind ASU's stellar 44-9 season is because of the Chris Sinacori led pitching staff. Through 53 games the pitchers have combined for a Pac-10 best 3.26 ERA while striking out 437 and walking 181. On 27 different occasions the staff has combined to walk three or less batters, including not allowing a walk in three games, most recently in a 10-2 win over Grand Canyon. ASU's pitchers have also combined to strike out eight or more batters in 31 games, including a season-high 16 vs. Utah (3/8) and vs. UCLA (4/18). The starters have been especially hot, combining to go 24-2 with a 3.13 ERA, while the relievers are 20-7 with seven saves and a 3.38 ERA. Senior Beau Vaughan has the distinction of leading the team in both wins (8) and losses (3). He also has the team lead with 88 strikeouts, good for second place in the Pac-10. ASU ranks 11th nationally in pitching with a 3.26 ERA, marking the lowest ERA by a Sun Devil squad since joining the Pac-10 in 1979 and tied for the second lowest since college baseball adopted the aluminum bat and the designated hitter. The lowest combined team ERA during the eight-year Pat Murphy era (1995-P) was 4.40 by last year's team.

Thurmond Shows His Stuff:

Senior Ben Thurmond came to ASU in the offseason with impressive credentials earning All-America status in 2001 at Winthrop and played for the USA Baseball National team that summer. After enduring minor arm injuries last year, Thurmond started the season slow, but has since turned into one of ASU's best pitchers. For the season Thurmond is 6-0 with a Pac-10 tying best ERA of 2.35. He has struck out 49 batters in 57.1 IP and has walked only 17. <u>He has won four straight starts and over that stretch of games has a 0.53 ERA giving up only one run in 17 innings with 15 strikeouts.</u>

Beau is No "Wild Thing" Vaughan:

One of ASU's most valuable pitchers this year comes in the form or a senior transfer who virtually had no success at any of the other three colleges he played for. Hard-throwing right-hander Beau Vaughan has blossomed under the tutelage of pitching coach Chris Sinacori and leads the team with eight wins and is second in the Pac-10 88 strikeouts. After starring at Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Vaughan played at Phoenix College, South Mountain Community College and last year at New Orleans where he was only 1-0 with an 8.84 ERA in 19.1 innings pitched. As a Sun Devil Vaughan, who played in high school with teammate Jered Liebeck, has been stellar in both relief and as a starter. He is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA out of the bullpen and is 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA as a starter. In his second appearance of the year back on Jan. 17 vs. Hawaii-Hilo, Vaughan registered eight straight strikeouts for the second most in ASU pitching history.

Sun Devils Record Best Start in School History:

Arizona State's 28-1 start to the season goes down in the record books as the best start in school history. The 28-1 record includes an 11-game winning streak to start the season before a loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State (Jan. 31) and a 19-game win streak up until suffering a 6-5 loss to Oklahoma (3/14). During the 28-1 start to the season ASU's pitchers posted an impressive 3.11 ERA and the hitters combined for a .360 team batting average. Here is a look at ASU's best starts in school history:

About the 19-Game Winning Streak:

After starting the year 9-0, ASU suffered its first setback with an 11-5 loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State on Jan. 31. After that loss, ASU went on a 19-game winning streak combining to go 13-0 in February and won the first six games in March before losing 6-5 to No. 30 Oklahoma (3/14). The 19-game winning streak is the longest by an ASU squad since the 1990 team won 23 straight games. Dustin Pedroia led ASU during the streak hitting .432 (35-for-81) with 11 of his Pac-10 leading 28 doubles. As a team the Sun Devils hit at a .344 clip and pitched for an impressive 2.56 ERA.

Home Run Notes:

Through 53 games of the 2003 season the Sun Devils have nearly doubled their entire season total from 2002 with 66 home runs. ASU has hit 49 of those home runs at Packard Stadium and 17 in its 19 road or neutral site games. Of the 34 games played at Packard Stadium the Devils have hit at least one home run in 25 games. A total of 12 different players have hit at least one home run and eight players have two or more home runs. Junior Jeremy West leads the team with 16 round-trippers after hitting seven in his last five games. Sophomore Jeff Larish is second with 15, including an ASU single-season record of four grand slams. The Devils have homered in 35 of their 53 games, including 20 multi-home run games, and a string of eight straight games with at least one home run. The Devils also have 12 grand slams on the season with Larish (4), Steve Garrabrants (2), Jeremy West (2), Rod Allen (2) and freshmen Ryan Bosch and Travis Buck all leaving the yard with the bases loaded to tie the NCAA record. ASU had only one grand slam in 2002 and four in 2001. ASU's home run breakdown includes 16 solo shots, 23 two-run homers, 15 three-run home runs and 12 grand slams to account for 28% of the total run production in 2003 (155 runs). Listed below are ASU's home run totals since the NCAA adopted the current bat rules for the 1999 season.

Pedroia On Fire at the Plate:

Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) has been the spark plug to ASU's early season success and an integral part to ASU's 44-9 record. ASU's only player to play and start in all 53 games, Pedroia currently leads the Pac-10 in hitting at .419 (95-for-227) with 29 doubles and 44 RBI. He also leads the conference in hits (95), doubles (29) and leads ASU with 34 extra base hits. He has also recorded 32 multi-hit games to pace the ASU offense. In a rare performance, Pedroia went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in ASU's 4-2 win over LBSU (2/2) to have his career-long 22-game hitting streak come to a halt. The streak, which spanned 11 games each at the end of 2002 and 11 games to begin 2003, fell just two games off the top six in ASU Baseball history. It is the longest streak since current Houston Astros prospect Brooks Conrad had a 21-game streak in 2000. During the streak Pedroia combined to hit .390 (41x105). He also had a 17game and 13-game hitting streaks earlier this year, and is one game away from notching his fourth hitting streak of 10 or more games. During his current nine-game hitting streak Pedroia is hitting .415 (17-for-41). Pedroia now has a hit in 61 of his last 64 games dating back to the end of last year, including hits in all but three games this year (50 of 53). In his two years as a Sun Devil he already has 177 hits, 42 of which are doubles, and has never missed a start in 111 consecutive games. In the field Pedroia has also been the rock to ASU's solid .973 team fielding percentage. The slick fielding shortstop has committed eight errors in 242 total chances for a .967 fielding percentage and not made an error in 11 straight games.

Pedroia Going For School and Pac-10 Doubles Record:

With his leadoff double in the first inning against UC Irvine (5/6), sophomore Dustin Pedroia notched his 29th double of the season. He is now just one off the school record of 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978 and two off the Pac-10 record of 31 set by Washington State's Mike Kinkade in 1994. Pedroia is ranked second in the NCAA with his average of 0.55 doubles per game.

Pedroia Proves to be Sparkplug:

Pedroia has ignited several ASU scoring rallies this year as is evident by his .538 (49x91) average as a leadoff hitter (inning and game). The percentage marks the amount of times he has reached base to either lead off the game or an inning for the Devils. All told, Pedroia has batted leadoff in 48 of ASU's 53 games this year with the Devils going 42-6 when his name is penciled in first on the lineup card. Amazingly, Pedroia has reached base safely in 26 of those games to lead off the game for the Devils, with 20 hits (seven extra base hits) and has scored ASU's first run in 16 of those games.

Pedroia Named To Initial Watch List For Golden Spikes Award:

Arizona State sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia was included among 25 players named to the initial watch list for the 2003 Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's top amateur baseball player. The 2002 Team USA member was one of only two Pac-10 players to be named to the initial watch list (Carlos Quentin, Stanford). The five finalists were named this week without Pedroia making the final cut. Arizona State has a long tradition of Golden Spikes Award winners as three past Sun Devils have won the award. Bob Horner (1978), Oddibe McDowell (1984) and Mike Kelly (1991) have all won the award. Only Florida State and Cal State Fullerton have matched ASU's legacy also with three winners of the annual Golden Spikes Award.



The Jeff Larish Watch:

Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish started off with a bang in 2003 hitting 11 home runs in his first 29 games. Although he has cooled off a little as of late, Larish is still having a banner season hitting .367 (65-for-177) with 15 home runs, 12 doubles and leads the conference with 79 RBI. Larish has recorded at least one hit in 42 of 50 games and one RBI in 37 of 50 games this year. He also has a current 14-game hitting streak in which he has gone 20-for-58 (.345). He also leads the conference with 65 walks (1.30 per game) and has an unbelievable on-base percentage of .536. For the season he is slugging .712 and is second on the team with 29 extra base hits. He has connected on four grand slams this year, breaking the single-season school record set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. In addition, he is batting .684 (13x19) with the bases loaded and leads the team with 32 two-out RBI. Larish, who was supposed to redshirt in 2002 but played midway through the season, hit .328 with three home runs in 34 games last year. Drafted in the 32nd round in 2001 by the Chicago Cubs, Larish etched his named in the ASU record books with a memorable game in the series finale vs. San Diego State (1/26). In what turned out to be a 24-9 ASU route, Larish was 3-for-4 and tied the school single-game record with nine RBI. He had a two-run single in the first inning, a two-run home run in the third, a grand slam homer in the fourth and then tied the 13-year-old school record (Tommy Adams) by walking with the bases loaded in the eighth.

Larish Breaks Single-Season Record With Four Grand Slams:

With his fourth grand slam of the season in the eighth inning of ASU's 17-1 blowout of UCLA on April 19, sophomore Jeff Larish broke the single-season record for grand slams. The previous record of three was set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Here is a look at Larish's four grand slams this year:

The Senior Trio Pacing ASU's Pitching Staff:

Arguably ASU's three big horses in the pitching staff this year have been seniors Jered Liebeck, Ben Thurmond and Beau Vaughan. The trio have combined to go 21-3 this year with a collective 2.99 ERA. Vaughan leads the staff with eight wins, while Thurmond (6-0) and Liebeck (7-0) are tied for the team and Pac-10 lead with an impressive 2.35 ERA.

Nine RBI:

Twice this year two Sun Devils have tied the ASU single-season record with nine RBI in a single game. Sophomore Jeff Larish was the first to do it in a 24-9 win over San Diego State (1/26). Larish accomplished the nine RBI with a two-run single, two-run home run, a grand slam home run and a bases loaded walk. Junior Jeremy West also had nine RBI in his record setting game vs. Washington State (4/27) in which he went 5-for-7 with three home runs. West recorded his nine RBI with a two-run homer, a three-run homer and a grand slam. The only other Sun Devil to record nine RBI in a game was Tommy Adams on May 2, 1990 vs. UNLV.

Freshman Records About To Go Down:

Freshman Travis Buck and Erik Averill are making a serious dent in the ASU freshman record books despite there being nine games left in the regular season. Averill is already tied for ninth with his seven wins, nine in ERA (3.43), and 10th with 42 strikeouts. Buck is ranked seventh with 67 hits with Barry Bonds, tied for seventh (with Barry Bonds) with 12 doubles and third with 50 runs scored.

Double Vision:

ASU has recorded a Pac-10 best 129 doubles on the year (2.43 per game average). Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the team and Pac-10 with 29 and Steve Garrabrants is second on the team with 14. The team record for doubles in a season is 185 set in 1988, while the individual season record is 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978.

National Players of the Week:

Two Sun Devils have earned national player of the week honors this year. Senior RHP Jered Liebeck earned national acclaim after his complete-game, three-hit shutout against nationally ranked Long Beach State on Feb. 1. He was named the Collegiate Baseball and NCBWA pitcher of the week for his performance. Junior designated hitter Jeremy West earned Pac-10 Player of the Week and Collegiate Baseball and CollegeBaseballInsider.com national player of the week after hitting five home runs in three games against Washington State (4/25-27). Freshman Travis Buck also earned CBI's western regional player of the week honor after his impressive series vs. USC (3/28-30).

Kartler Knows His Role:

Senior left-handed pitcher Bryce Kartler knows he has a role of coming in and getting one or two hitters out and he has succeeded greatly in that role. Making 20 pitching appearances this year, Kartler has pitched in 16.0 innings and has maintained a 6.19 ERA. While his ERA is one of the highest on the team, if you were to take way his first two relief appearances of the year against San Diego State (Jan. 24, Jan. 26) where he gave up nine runs in two-thirds of an inning, Kartler would have a 1.17 ERA giving up only two earned runs in 15.1 innings.

Travis Buck Hits For The Cycle:

Freshman outfielder Travis Buck went 5-for-5 with even RBI and hit for the cycle in ASU's 19-0 win over Southern Utah (3/7). He became only the seventh Sun Devil in recorded history to record the elusive cycle and became the first freshman in Pac-10 history to hit for the cycle. Buck capped his perfect night with a grand slam home run as part of an eightrun sixth inning to become ASU's first player to hit for the cycle since Mitch Jones on May 21, 2000 at Arizona. Buck, ASU's normal starting left fielder who was making only his second start in right field, had a single in the first, a double in the third and a triple in the fifth before connecting on his second home run of the year for the cycle. He also added a run-scoring single in the fourth and tied a career high with two stolen bases. For the season Buck, who was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week after going 8-for-11 (.727) vs. USC, is hitting .356 (67-for-188) with 12 doubles and three home runs. Schroyer Ranks Fifth in ASU History With 15 Career Saves:

Junior closer Ryan Schroyer has been nearly unstoppable in 2003 out of the bullpen. The hard-throwing right-hander is 4-2 with seven saves this year and has a 1.47 ERA allowing only six earned runs to score in his 36.2 innings pitched. The preseason All-American has scattered 31 hits in his 24 outings and has struck out 41 batters. His save over USC (3/30) in which he scattered three hits in 1.2 innings moved him into fifth place in the ASU career record books with his 15th career save. Including his summer All-American season with the NBC World Series Champion Alaska Goldpanners, Schroyer is 5-2 with 14 saves and an 1.02 ERA in his last 52.2 IP (72 K's). After recording eight (8) as the league's top pitcher (2.37 ERA) in 2002, Schroyer is looking to continue to move up the charts. Here is a look at ASU's top save leaders in school history:

Pinch Hits:

As a team the Sun Devils are hitting .327 (32-for-98) in pinch-hitting opportunities with four doubles, two triples and three home runs. Junior Rod Allen has been ASU's leading pinch-hitter as of late going 6-for-9 (.667) with nine RBI, two doubles and two grand slam home runs. Senior Dennis Wyrick (.455, 5-for-11), Nick Walsh (.350, 7-for-20) and Mike Guerrero (.333, 7-for-21) have also been solid off the bench for ASU this year.



Not a Bad To Have Him on the Bench:

When Jeff Larish went down with back spasms, inserting Mike Guerrero into the lineup was not a hard decision to make. Guerrero, a junior who transferred to ASU in 2001 and redshirted last year, responded by hitting .375 (6-for-16) with six doubles with Larish out of the lineup. For the season Guerrero is second on the team in batting at .395 (30-for-76) with 12 doubles, two triples, two home runs and 22 RBI. Guerrero has made 11 starts this year and has played in 38 games.

Multi-Hit Madness:

Led by the 32 from Dustin Pedroia, 10 different Sun Devils have 10 or more multi-hit games to their credit this year. Amazingly, Pedroia has recorded 32 two-hit games, seven three-hit contests and three four-hit affairs for his 32 multi-hit games. Andre Ethier (20), Jeff Larish (19), Steve Garrabrants (18), Travis Buck (17), Jeremy West (14), Dennis Wyrick (11), Tuffy Gosewisch (11), Frank Mesa (11) and Rod Allen (10) all have 10 or more multi-hit games. Last year seven Sun Devils finished the season with 10 or more multi-hit games, led by the 27 from Pedroia.

The Big Inning:

The Sun Devils have been a scoring machine this year ranking third in the nation averaging 10.36 runs per game this year (ranked third in the NCAA). ASU has also proven to be an explosive team at the plate, recording 129 big innings (2 or more runs). The team has also recorded 30 innings when they score five or more runs and have scored over 10 runs in an inning twice. ASU's biggest run production in a single frame was 12 in the opening game vs. Washington State (4/25).

The Big First Inning:

Arizona State has scored in the first inning in 25 of its 53 games this year and owns a record of 23-2 when they put at least one run on the board in its first at-bat. ASU's biggest opening frame of the year was a 10-run outburst vs. Washington Štate (4/27) en route to a lopsided 25-0 victory. ASU scored its 10 runs in the inning by way of nine hits, two home runs and sent 15 batters to the plate. The nine hits in the inning are tied for fourth most in ASU single-season history, last accomplished vs. UNLV in 1983.

Attendance Marks Impressive at Packard Stadium:

Arizona State is always in the national top 10 for attendance marks when playing at Packard Stadium and once again fans keep coming through the turnstile in 2003. In ASU's 34 home games this year, the Devils are averaging a home crowd of just under 3,000 (2,775) with a total of 94,356 fans attending the games. ASU's largest single-game crowd was the series opener vs. Oklahoma (4,155). The home season opener vs. San Diego State also had a good crowd drawing 3,972 fans. ASU also had 10,043 attend the three-game series against San Diego State and 7,008 attend the two games against Notre Dame. The Oklahoma three-game series had a total of 10,861 fans for the three-game set, while the largest three-game crowd was established vs. Stanford with 10,889 turning out for the series.

Pitching and Defense Dominate in Cal and WSU Series:

The pitching staff dominated the California Golden Bears and Washington State Cougars in a pair of Pac-10 three-game sets in recent weeks. ASU gave up only four runs (three earned) and tallied an 1.00 ERA in the series against Cal and combined to out-score WSU 51-3 while posting two pitching shutouts. The four runs given up in a three-game Pac-10 series are the least dating back to giving up seven runs in threegame sweep vs. Cal in 1993 (11-1, 11-4, 11-2) and the three given up to WSU tied the school mark for the least amount of runs given up in a three-game conference series. The 1990 Sun Devils limited rival Arizona to three runs (3-0, 3-1, 9-2) Mar. 16-18 at Packard Stadium. In Sunday's doubleheader vs. Cal (4/13) the Devils allowed only one run in 18 innings and outscored the Bears 16-1. Giving up the only run of the second game in the seventh inning, ASU nearly recorded its first back-to-back shutouts in Pac-10 play. Behind every good pitching note is an even better defensive stat. ASU turned six double plays (two in each game) during the Cal series and committed only two errors. Solid defense from the outfield also included an outfield assist from right fielder Andre Ethier to gun down a potential run at the plate.



Two Out Rallies:

Over the last two years the Sun Devils have had a flare for scoring runs with two outs. In 2002 the Devils scored 232 of their 450 total runs (52%) with two outs. ASU is back at it again in 2003 scoring 217 of their 549 runs (39%) after two outs have been recorded. During the season-high nine-run sixth inning that led to ASU's 14-8 come-from-behind victory over Notre Dame (2/23), all nine runs came with two outs after a full-count walk to Jeff Larish. Larish leads the team with 32 two-out RBI, while designated hitter Jeremy West leads the team hitting .465 (20x43) with two outs. As a team the Devils are batting .326 (198x608) after two outs have been recorded.

Home Sweet Home:

ASU returns to Packard Stadium in 2003 after playing in Mesa (Hohokam Park) in 2002. The Devils recorded their 800th career victory at Packard Stadium (3/1 vs. PSU) and have an all-time 808-230-1 dating back to 1974. ASU will play 40 of its 62 games in the state of Arizona and 37 at Packard Stadium this year. After playing nine of its first 12 games on the road, the Devils spent nearly the entire months of February and March in the state of Arizona with only three games away from Packard Stadium at the new spring training facility of the Texas Rangers/Kansas City Royals in Surprise. After going 29-10 in designated home games last year, the Devils are 27-7 at home this year now have a combined 160-50-1 (.758) home record in the last five years dating back to 1998. ASU is hitting .351 with 49 home runs in 34 home games and pitching for a 3.43 team ERA on the mound.

ASU Continuing To Mix Things Up:

After mixing and matching for 41 different starting batting lineups in 58 games last year, head coach Pat Murphy continues to keep the lineup fresh in 2003. Through the first 53 games of the season the Devils have mixed and matched for 46 different batting lineups and 30 different positional lineups. ASU has used the same batting lineup in four of the last five games, marking the first time this year a lineup has been used more than twice.

How They Compare To Past Years:

The Sun Devils are 44-9 through 53 games inf the 2003 season after recording the best start in school history at 28-1. The 44 wins already matches the most by an ASU squad since going 44-15 in 2000. Here is a look at how the Devils have fared in games 50-60 since 1995.

Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last five years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999 and 10.97 runs per game in 2000. The Devils paced the Pac-10 in 2001, hitting at a .327 clip and averaging 8.26 runs per game to rank 17th in the nation. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark, trailing Stony Brook by one point. During Pat Murphy's nine seasons at ASU, the Sun Devils have been a scoring machine with 4,848 runs in 524 games, averaging 9.25 runs per game and hitting at an overall .331 clip. ASU leads the Pac-10 in hitting again this year at .351 and is averaging 10.36 runs per game. Below is an offensive team breakdown of Murphy's ASU teams:

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 11 as a supplier to the National Team. ASU has had eight players don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984, with the first being Oddibe McDowell in the 1984 Olympics played at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. Jim Austin played for Team USA in 1990 and ASU has had five more players play with Team USA in the last five years. 1999 Pac-10 Player of the Year Willie Bloomquist played in the summer of 1998, 2000-2001 Pac-10 Player of the Year Casey Myers played in the summer of 2000 and was also a member of the Team USA Junior National Team before arriving at ASU in 1998. Current Tampa Bay Devil Ray prospect Jon Switzer was also a member of the 2000 National Team and Mike Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA in the summer of 2001. Sophomore Dustin Pedroia played for the National Team last summer and was the starting shortstop until getting hurt near the end of the season. Pedroia, Travis Buck and Jeff Larish have also been invited to USA Baseball National Team USA Junior teams during their respective prep careers.

Golden Spikes Common At Arizona State:

While Khalil Greene of Clemson was the recipient of the 2002 Golden Spikes award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, it should be noted that three Arizona State players have won the award. In addition to ASU, only Cal State Fullerton and Florida State have won three Golden Spikes Awards. Bob Horner, who was a standout at ASU from 1976-78, won the inaugural award in 1978. Oddibe McDowell, who was a member of the first Team USA baseball team to compete in an Olympics, won the award in 1984. Mike Kelly, who ranks second in ASU history with 46 home runs from 1989-91, won the award in 1991. In all, 12 players that have worn the Maroon and Gold have been named a Player of the Year for college baseball.

ASU Leader of the Pac When It Comes to Player of the Week:

Arizona State has amassed 46 Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week and 67 Players of the Week since 1981. That total leads all Pac-10 member schools. Senior RHP Jered Liebeck became the first Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game, three-hit shutout of Long Beach State (2/1) and Ryan Schroyer earned his first award on Feb. 25. Junior Jeremy West joined Schroyer as ASU swept the weekly awards on Feb. 25. Andre Etheir and West (twice) were named Pac-10 Players of the Week in 2002, while Robbie McClellan and Mike Esposito earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors last year.

Arizona State in Postseason Play:

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has now advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 26 of the program's 44 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 124-51 (.709) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three third-place finishes. Arizona State is 15-10 in the NCAA Tournament under ninth-year head coach Pat Murphy. In addition to advancing three straight years, ASU has been left out of the tournament only once (1999) in the last six years and played for the national championship in 1998.

Drafted Devils:

A total of 16 players on the 2003 Arizona State squad have been taken in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Since the inception of the draft in 1965, ASU has had more players chosen (303), more first-round draft picks (21) and more No. 1 picks (3) than any other school in the nation. Both Bryce Kartler and Josh Perrault have been selected twice in the draft, but both times decided to stay and play college baseball. Newcomers Travis Buck, Chris Beatty, Seth Dhaenens, Ben Thurmond and Beau Vaughan have all been selected as well. ASU's three No. 1 picks were Rick Monday (1965), Floyd Bannister (1976) and Bob Horner (1978, Atlanta). No other college has had more than on No. 1 overall selection in the draft.

Horner Ranks Second As Collegiate Player of the Century:

Former Sun Devil greats Bob Horner and Eddie Bane were honored by Baseball America by being placed on the publication's "Team of the Century." Horner, an ASU great under Jim Brock from 1976-78, hit .383 for his career and belted a school record 56 home runs. Horner was listed second on the team behind Oklahoma State slugger Pete Incaviglia (1983-85). Bane, a top pitcher for the Sun Devils from 1971-72, posted a career 40-4 record and a 1.64 ERA. 92 Years of Sun Devil Baseball Tradition:

While the history of baseball at Arizona State University goes back all the way to the early 1900's, the school officially began sponsoring varsity baseball in 1959. Prior to 2002, the ASU Baseball Media Guide referred only to those players that played from 1959 to present. ASU now officially recognizes those players, coaches and seasons from 1907-1958. In 91-plus years of baseball at Arizona State, the program has built a legacy matched by few in the college baseball world. With a 2,302-1,124-6 all-time record, Arizona State has advanced to the College World Series 18 times, won five national championships, won six Pac-10 titles, produced 12 Players of the Year and three Golden Spikes Award winners, and has gone to the NCAA Tournament 26 times. Under current head coach Pat Murphy, the Sun Devils have finished in the top 12 in three of the last five years and finished second in the nation in 1998. They have been ranked in at least one top 25 poll for 67 consecutive weeks.

An Early Season Opener:

The Jan. 16 season opener at Hawaii-Hilo was the second earliest start in ASU Baseball history and the earliest start by any collegiate team in 2003. The Devils opened the 1999 season at home with a game at Packard Stadium against the University of Utah on Jan. 15. Arizona State's previous earliest start before 1999 was a Jan. 19 home contest against Grand Canyon (W, 12-2) in 1990. With the 9-0 blanking of UHH on 1/16, ASU is now 25-2 in season-opening games (dating back to 1977) and head coach Pat Murphy is 8-1 in season-openers at ASU (15-1 at D1).

How They Have Finished:

Arizona State has finished four seasons ranked in the top 10 in the final Collegiate Baseball national poll since 1990, ranking 10th of all college baseball programs. The schools with the most Top 10 Collegiate Baseball finishes are listed below:

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But lately academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past four years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as First-Team Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation since 1995. Ryan McKenna, Aaron Klusman, Cesar Castillo, Nick Walsh and Mike Esposito all earned Pac-10 Academic Awards in 2002.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 58-38 record in league play. Even more impressive is that besides last season (2002) no other player besides a Sun Devil has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. In all, ASU has won nine (9) Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Peery and Marc Barcelo).

Schroyer Named Baseball America Summer All-American:

Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Schroyer was named a second-team Summer All-American by Baseball America after he helped lead the Alaska Goldpanners to the NBC World Series Championship. Schroyer joined the Goldpanners in the Alaskan League after not making the final Team USA roster. Ranked as the No. 3 prospect from the league by BA, Schroyer tamed the league with a 1-0 record, six saves and a 0.00 ERA.

Pedroia Becomes Eighth Devil to Play for Team USA:

Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia became the eighth Sun Devil since 1984 to play for the USA Baseball National Team. After hitting .347 and setting an ASU freshman record with 82 hits in his freshman season, Pedroia made Team USA after being invited to the trials in Tucson, Ariz. Pedroia spent most of the summer as the team's starting shortstop before having to leave after suffering a broken cheek bone in the Harlem Honkball Tournament in The Netherlands.

Hitting For The Cycle... in the First Inning:

In what may be one of the rarest feats of Arizona State baseball history, the Devils led off the Feb. 9, 2002 game vs. Tennessee in grand fashion with the first four hitters combining to hit for the cycle in the first inning. Leadoff hitter Steve Garrabrants led off the game with a first-pitch home run, then Dustin Pedroia followed with a double, then Rod Allen singled and to cap off the amazing event, Jeremy West tripled to give ASU the early 2-0 lead. ASU also accomplished the rarity in the 10-run first inning against Washington State (4/27) in 2003 when the first five batters (Pedroia, 3B; Walsh, 1B; Larish, 2B; West HR) combined to hit for the cycle.

Why Not #9 Murphy:

Most who are close to the ASU Baseball program know what the No. 9 means to head coach Pat Murphy. Often his slogan to "Play all 9 Innings", Murphy and No. 9 are synonymous with each other... until last year. In a preseason meeting with team, Murphy gave a speech on how you have to be able to give up anything for the team. In this case, he even offered up his prize No. 9, knowing no one would take it. That is, until ASU's Steve Garrabrants raised his hand and said, I'll take it, and with that, the leader of the Devils is willing to give up anything for the team and will wear No. 7 again this year.


