NATIONAL RANKINGS

Arizona State (47-12) is ranked in all three national polls and checks in this week as the No. 4 team in the nation by *Sports Weekly/ESPN* and *Collegiate Baseball*. The Devils are also No. 6 in the recent *Baseball America* poll. The **Sun Devils** have now been ranked in the national polls for <u>75</u> consecutive polls. Arizona (35-18) is ranked No. 15-16-20 (CB-BA-SW).

The last three games of the Arizona State Baseball regular season and all postseason games will be broadcast over the radio in the Phoenix area on NBC 1190 AM with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all the action. The statistical GameTracker on www.TheSunDevils.com will return this weekend for the Arizona series. All three of ASU's games vs. Arizona will be broadcast live on AZ-TV.

DID YOU KNOW?

That Arizona State currently leads the Pac-10 in hitting (.349) and pitching (3.40) and is second in fielding (.972). ASU comes into the series after a 3-3 road trip that featured six conference games in the eight days. Shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the Pac-10 in hitting at .424 and hits with 108. He has already broken the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 32 doubles.

THE STORYLINE

Arizona State (47-12) and the Arizona Wildcats (35-18) meet this weekend in the annual dual in the desert at Packard Stadium. The Devils and Wildcats are currently tied for second place in the Pac-10 and will be playing for postseason positioning. ASU is 9-3 against the Wildcats over the last three seasons and has not lost a season series against its rival since Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995.

Ouick Hits

- ASU has hit 12 grand slams this year to tie the NCAA record set by Oklahoma State in 1996. Larish has four to set an ASU record.
- ASU recorded a school record with a 28-1 start to the season that included a 19-game winning streak.
- ASU is 9-3 against Arizona over the last three years and 27-15 against the Wildcats dating back to 1995.
- Arizona State leads the league in hitting (.349), pitching (3.40) and is second in fielding (.972).
- After 59 games the Devils are averaging 10.03 runs, 12.69 hits and 3.93 extra base hits per game this year.
- ASU has scored 10 or more runs in 30 games this year and recorded 10 or more hits in 44 of 59 games.
- ASU has scored in a NCAA record 492 consecutive games dating back to April 7, 1995. The old NCAA record was 349.
- ASU's roster consists of 18 upper classmen (juniors and seniors) and 18 lower classmen (freshman and sophomores).
- The three runs given up in the WSU series are the least given up in a three-game Pac-10 series by ASU in 25 years.
- For the first time in ASU's 25-year history in the Pac-10, the Devils scored 20 runs twice in a conference series (WSU).
- The Jan. 16 season-opener was the second earliest start in ASU history and was the first collegiate game in 2003.
- The Devils have recorded 139 big innings (2 or more runs) this year, including 32 innings of five or more runs.
- Dustin Pedroia earned Pac-10 Player of the Week award after the OSU and UW series, marking ASU's 70th all-time. SS Dustin Pedroia broke the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 32 doubles and leads the Pac-10 in hitting (.424).
- Pedroia has recorded 37 mulit-hit games, four separate hitting streaks of 10 or more games and has 108 hits.
- Jeremy West has hit seven home runs in the last 11 games and with 16 this year is now 10th all-time with 35 in his career.
- Pedroia, Jeff Larish and Travis Buck have all been been invited to the USA Baseball National Team Trials.
- Senior RHP Robbie McClellan went 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA on the recent road trip and is 7-0 with a 3.52 ERA this year.
 Junior Nick Walsh has raised his batting average 113 points over the last 16 games combining to go 23-for-52 (.442).
- Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 83 RBI (1.48 per game) and 69 walks (1.23 per game). He also has 15 home runs.
- ASU has 70 home runs by 12 different players this year. ASU had only 38 total home runs in 58 games in 2002.
- ASU's bullpen overtook the ERA lead from the pitchers on the recent road trip, going 3-0 with a 1.21 ERA in the six games.
- Of ASU's 11 losses this year, five have been by one run and eight have been by three or less runs. ASU is 9-2 after a loss.

Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Reaches 492:

The Arizona State baseball program has now scored in an NCAA record 492 consecutive games dating back to the 1995 season. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game. The Devils broke the 12-year-old NCAA record in a 5-1 loss to USC exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field. The Devils recently celebrated the eighth anniversary of the start of the streak with a 10-2 win over Grand Canyon on April 7. The one run scored in the 5-1 loss to Washington (5/17/03) marked only the 14th time during the streak that ASU has scored only one run. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU



also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in three games dating back to the 1990 season. <u>ASU is a combined 328-166-1 during the streak.</u> Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State).

Poll Mechanics:

Arizona State remains a consensus top-10 team in all four national polls heading into the Arizona three-game series. ASU is ranked as high as No. 4 by Sports Weekly/ESPN, and also check in at No. 4 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 by Baseball America. Ranked as high as No. 8 in the preseason polls, the Devils have spent virtually the entire season in the top 10 and for two weeks manned the top spot in two of the three national rakings, marking the first time being No. 1 since heading into the 1993 College World Series. ASU has been ranked for 75 consecutive national polls dating back to the start of the 2000 season. ASU entered the 2003 season ranked as high as No. 8 in the nation by Baseball America in the preseason collegiate polls. Arizona State also earned a preseason No. 9 ranking by Sports Weekly/ESPN, No. 10 by NCBWA and No. 12 ranking by Collegiate Baseball. The No. 8 preseason ranking is the highest by an ASU squad since opening the 2001 season as the consensus No. 6 team in the nation.

47 Wins In The Bag:

With an overall 47-12 record in 2003, the Sun Devils have already set the mark for the most wins in a season under current head coach Pat Murphy. The 2000 team had the previous best record finishing the year 44-15 after losing in the regional final to Texas. The 47 victories also marks the third time during the Murphy era that the Devils have reached the 40-win plateau, with the 2000 and the 1998 (41-23) teams also achieving that milestone. ASU's last 50win season was in 1990 when the Devils went 52-16. The 47 wins are the most since the 1990 squad went 52-16.

The Grand Salami:

With a pinch-hit grand slam from Rod Allen in the seventh inning at Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City on April 30, Arizona State tied the NCAA record for grand slams in a season with their 12th of the year. The Devils are currently tied with Oklahoma State that also hit 12 in 1996. After hitting only one grand slam all of last year, the Sun Devils have gone on a binge this year hitting 12 in their first 53 games. Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish broke the single-season school record by hitting his fourth grand slam vs. UCLA (4/19). Larish broke the old record of three set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Steve Garrabrants, Rod Allen and Jeremy West each have two slams, while Ryan Bosch and Travis Buck each have one.

Recapping the Road Trip:

The Sun Devils endured one of the toughest and most challenging road trips a college baseball program can go through. ASU played six league games, all on the road, during a stretch of eight days on an 11-day road trip to the Pacific Northwest. The games came and the end of ASU's final exams week with several players having to take finals on the road. ASU split the six games going 3-3 with a pair of wins at Oregon State and a victory at Washington. As a team the Devils hit .330 at the plate with Dustin Pedroia going 13-for-28 (.464) with eight runs scored, three doubles (to break the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record), one home run and four RBI. Andre Ethier (.458, 11-for-24), Tuffy Gosewisch (.364, 8-for-22) and Steve Garrabrants (.364, 8-for-22) also put together a solid week at the plate. ASU's starting pitchers struggled to go 0-3 with a 9.70 ERA during the trip, with senior RHP Beau Vaughan going 0-2 with a 10.00 ERA. The relievers picked up the slack though gaining all three victories and posting a 1.21 ERA in the six games. Robbie McClellan was 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA, giving up one run and five hits in 8.2 innings.

Comparing 2003 to 1981:

Arizona State has put together an amazing season in 2003 leading the league in pitching (3.40 ERA), hitting (.349), second in fielding (.972) and is among the national leaders in runs per game (10.03) and is the NCAA leader with 47 wins. ASU's fifth and last national championship came in 1981 with a Sun Devil squad that is arguably the best to take the field in program history. The 1981 squad set school records in home runs (110), runs (694) and batting average (.356). Star performers on the 1981 club included Pac-10 Player of the Year Mike Sodders (.424, 22 HR), Alvin Davis (.395, 20 2B) and Kevin Romine (.410, 12 HR, 20 2B). Here is a comparison look at the two squads:

Injury Bug Bites The Sun Devils:

The Sun Devils not only had a tough road trip with six games in eight days, but also suffered two key injuries with the regular season winding down and the postseason looming. Junior outfielder Rod Allen broke a bone in his left hand during the series opener vs. Oregon State (5/12) when he fouled a ball off his hand. Allen, who was hitting .305 (36-for-118) with six home runs and 41 RBI, is out for the Arizona series and will be re-evaluated before postseason play. Junior second baseman Steve Garrabrants is also doubtful for the Arizona series after injuring his left shoulder while trying to steal second base against Washington (5/19). Garrabrants, who also missed the Arizona series last year with a back injury, was hitting .351 (66-for-118) with seven home runs 53 RBI and is second in the Pac-10 with 23 stolen bases. Garrabrants is expected to return to the lineup if ASU makes postseason play.

Pac-10 Batting Race On The Line:

If there wasn't enough intrigue to come out and watch ASU take on rival Arizona this weekend with the teams battling for second place in the Pac-10 and postseason positioning, fans will want to see the battle between Dustin Pedroia and Jeff Van Houten for the Pac-10 batting title. Pedroia currently leads the league with a .424 (108-for-255), while Van Houten is close behind at .418 (81-for-94). Both players are considered strong candidates for Pac-10 Player of the Year.

Pedroia Named Pac-10 Player of the Week:

Pedroia, from Woodland, Calif., helped the Sun Devils to three Pac-10 wins last week going 10-for-23 (.435) during that stretch with eight runs scored, two doubles, one home run and four RBI. With his two doubles, he broke the ASU single-season record formerly held by Chris Bando (30, 1978) and tied the Pac-10 record of 31. While not factoring into the voting, Pedroia added to his impressive season Monday night going 3-for-5 in a 6-4 loss to the University of Washington. He broke the Pac-10 record with his 32nd double of the season, passing former Washington State Cougar and current Los Angeles Dodger Mike Kinkade (31 in 1994). He now has 108 hits on the year tying for ninth in the ASU single-season record books and has recorded 37 multi-hit games and leads the Pac-10 in hitting with a .424 batting average heading into the regular-season finale this weekend against rival Arizona. The Player of the Week honor is the first for Pedroia in his career and the 70th selection all-time and fourth in 2003 for Arizona State.

Close Games:

Arizona State has built up a 47-12 record heading into the final three (3) games of the 2003 regular season. The Sun Devils have lost straight games this year only two times and have suffered a number of close losses this year. Of the Devils 12 setbacks this year, five have come by one run and eight by three or less runs. ASU's eight Pac-10 setbacks have come by way of four one-run games and two, two-run contests.

Larish Looking to Join 70-70 Club:

Sophomore Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 83 RBI and 69 walks and has been a big reason behind ASU's 47-12 record in 2003. Larish's amazing season also includes 14 double and 15 home runs. Even more amazing is that Larish needs only one more walk to become only the second player in ASU Baseball history to join the 70-70 (RBI-BB) club. Former Sun Devil and major leaguer Alvin Davis, who played first base for the Sun Devils from 1979-82, is the only other member of that club after recording 91 RBI and a single-season school record 87 walks in 1982.

A Nice Way To Rebound:

With an overall 47-12 record heading into the Arizona series, the Sun Devils have only lost back-to-back games two times this year. After nine of their 12 losses, the Devils have responded by winning the next game.



ASU HEAD COACH Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same

time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in three of the past five years, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy is 353-176-1 in his ninth season in Tempe and posts an all-time 24-18 record in NCAA Tournament action. With a career 726-347-4 record in 19 seasons as a head coach, Murphy is the winningest active baseball coach under the age of 45 at any collegiate level. Murphy recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory in 2002 and recorded his 700th career coaching victory (all levels) with a 14-8 come-from-behind win over No. 11 Notre Dame (2/23). ASU has been in 75 straight national polls under Murphy.

Pedroia Sets School and Pac-10 Doubles Record:

With three doubles on the recent road trip to Oregon State and Washington, sophomore Dustin Pedroia set the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 32 doubles of the year. He tied the record of 30 set by Chris Bando in 1978 in Monday's series opener vs. OSU (5/12) and broke the record with a first-inning double on Tuesday (5/13). Pedroia broke the Pac-10 record of 31 set by Washington State's Mike Kinkade in 1994 vs. Washington (5/18) with a shot down the left field line. Pedroia is the NCAA leader with his average of 0.54 doubles per game and is now only four doubles off the NCAA record of 36 doubles in a season.

All-Time Series vs. Arizona:

Arizona State will play its traditional rival, the University of Arizona, this weekend in a three-game series at Packard Stadium. The Sun Devils and Wildcats have met 400 prior times dating back to the start of ASU baseball in 1907. Arizona leads the all-time series (1907-P) 219-181, but the Sun Devils hold a 158-102 edge since the Sun Devil Baseball program became a varsity sport in 1959. The two schools have combined for eight national championships, with ASU winning five and Arizona winning three. Since Pat Murphy took over the ASU program in 1995 the Sun Devils are 27-15 against the Wildcats, including a 14-7 record at Packard Stadium. Arizona has never won a season series against ASU since 1995 and last won a three-game series from the Devils in 1999.

Last Time vs. Arizona at Packard Stadium:

ASU is 14-7 against Arizona at Packard Stadium dating back to 1995 and took two of three in the last series played in Tempe in 2001. ASU won the opener 7-4 with Mike Esposito picking up the win throwing six strong innings. Brooks Conrad was the hitting hero with two home runs and three runs scored. Arizona battled back with a 3-1 win in the second game behind a strong pitching performance from Sean Rierson (7.2 IP, 7 H, 1 R). The Devils then took the rubber match of the series 6-5 when Mike Lopez plated the winning run on a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth inning with the bases loaded.

Last Time They Were Both Ranked:

The last time Arizona and Arizona State faced each other when both teams were ranked was back in 2000. ASU was ranked No. 15 and Arizona No. 25 when the teams met in a non-conference series at Packard Stadium (Mar. 3-5). The Sun Devils easily handed the Wildcats a series sweep, combining to beat them 55-18, including a 32-3 victory in the second game of the series.

Buck. Larish and Pedroia Invited To USA Baseball Trials:

Arizona State Baseball players Travis Buck, Jeff Larish and Dustin Pedroia have been invited to the 2003 USA Baseball National Team Trials, to be held in Tucson, Ariz., from June 21-27. Buck, Larish and Pedroia were part of a selection show Thursday where 18 more players were invited to the Team USA Trials. One more wave of 10 invitees will be announced before the trials begin in June at Hi Corbett Field. Pedroia and Georgia Tech's Eric Patterson were selected after both playing for Team USA last summer. Phillip Humber (Rice) and Huston Street (Texas) also played in 2002 for Team USA and were part of the first wave of selections last month. Georgia Tech and ASU each had three players selected for the trials during the second wave. Buck, Larish and Pedroia are looking to become the latest in a long line of Sun Devils who have played for the USA Baseball National Team. ASU has sent five players to the national team in the last five years and eight total players since 1984. In recent years Willie Bloomquist (1998), Jon Switzer (2000), Casey Myers (2000), Mike Esposito (2001) and Pedroia (2002) have donned the Red, White and Blue for USA Baseball.

Scoring at Will:

Arizona State heads into the Arizona series ranked fourth in the nation averaging 10.03 runs per game and has scored 10 or more runs in 30 of its 59 games (51%). The Devils have also scored 20 or more runs in three games this season and as a team are also ranked second in the nation (first in Pac-10) hitting .349. Even though the Devils are leading the Pac-10 in scoring, ASU as struggled in the last six games averaging 7.16 runs per game and overall is averaging 9.19 runs per game in 21 Pac-10 contests. The 10.03 runs per game average is currently the fourth best during 45 years of ASU varsity baseball history. With 30 games of scoring 10 or more runs, ASU trails only the 2000 (31) and 1999 (31) squads for the most games with double-digits in runs since the 1993 season (30).

Nick Walsh on a Tear:

Junior utility player Nick Walsh has one goal in mind when he steps in the batters box... get on base. Walsh, a native of Alamo, Calif., was struggling up to the Cal series hitting only .238 (10-for-42) while playing in 32 games and making only five starts. But then he was inserted into the leadoff spot vs. the Golden Bears and finished the series 6-for-8 (.750) and since that series has been on a tear going 23-for-52 (.442) to raise his season average 113 points to .351. He had a career-best game vs. Washington State (4/27) in which he went 6-for-6 with three doubles, seven RBI, five runs scored and recorded six different runscoring hits. The three doubles, six hits and five runs scored were each one off the single-game ASU record and his seven RBI were two away from the school record. He is currently ranked ninth in the Pac-10 with a .470 on-base percentage and leads all players with a .434 average in Pac-10 play.

Pedroia Makes Case For Pac-10 Player of the Year:

Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) has been the spark plug to ASU's early season success and an integral part to ASU's 47-12 record. ASU's only player to play and start in all 59 games, Pedroia currently leads the Pac-10 in hitting at .424 (108-for-255) with 32 doubles, four home runs and 48 RBI. He also leads the conference in hits (108), doubles (32) and leads ASU with 38 extra base hits. In 21 Pac-10 contests Pedroia is hitting .423 (41-for-97) with 10 doubles and 16 RBI. He has also recorded 37 multi-hit games to pace the ASU offense. With his 108 hits Pedroia has become only the 22nd Sun Devil in school history to surpass the 100-hit plateau and the first since Willie Bloomquist in 1999. The 108 hits are currently tied for ninth in ASU single-season history. His .424 average is currently tied for fifth in the ASU record books and his .387 career average currently ranks seventh. In a rare performance, Pedroia went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in ASU's 4-2 win over LBSU (2/2) to have his career-long 22-game hitting streak come to a halt. The streak, which spanned 11 games each at the end of 2002 and 11 games to begin 2003, fell just two games off the top six in ASU Baseball history. It is the longest streak since current Houston Astros prospect Brooks Conrad had a 21-game streak in 2000. During the streak Pedroia combined to hit .390 (41x105). He also had streaks of 17, 13 and 12 games this year to combined for four separate hitting streak of 10 or more games. Pedroia now has a hit in 66 of his last 70 games dating back to the end of last year, including hits in all but four games this year (55 of 59). In his two years as a Sun Devil he already has 190 hits, 45 of which are doubles, and has never missed a start in 117 consecutive games. In the field Pedroia has also been the rock to ASU's solid .972 team fielding percentage. The slick fielding shortstop has committed only eight errors in 274 total chances for a .971 fielding percentage and not made an error in 17 straight games. Pedroia is ASU's leading hitter with runners in scoring position, going 39-for-77 (.506) with nine doubles and 44 RBI.

Pedroia Proves to be Sparkplug:

Pedroia has ignited several ASU scoring rallies this year as is evident by his .538 (56x104) average as a leadoff hitter (inning and game). The percentage marks the amount of times he has reached base to either lead off the game or an inning for the Devils. All told, Pedroia has batted leadoff in 54 of ASU's 59 games this year with the Devils going 45-9 when his name is penciled in first on the lineup card. Amazingly, Pedroia has reached base safely in 29 of those games to lead off the game for the Devils, with 23 hits (nine extra base hits, 1 HR) and has scored ASU's first run in 18 of those games.

West, Ethier and Gosewisch Streaking:

Heading into the Arizona series this weekend, Jeremy West and Andre Ethier have hitting streaks of 10 or more games. West is currently riding a career-high 15-game streak dating back to April 2 when he went 2-for-3 vs. New Mexico. During the streak West has combined to go 28-for-61 (.459) with 12 runs scored, seven home runs and 24 RBI. Ethier is also in the midst of a career-high streak, spanning 14 games dating back to April 17 vs. UCLA. Ethier has combined to go 27-for-63 (.429) during the streak with 17 RBI, four home runs and two doubles. While not riding a hitting streak of 10 or more games, sophomore catcher Tuffy Gosewisch has put together a current six-game streak that is the longest of his career. The Return of Jeremy West:

Junior designated hitter Jeremy West has slowly but surely returned to his 2002 form in which he led the Pac-10 with 71 RBI and earned first-team all-conference honors. Riding a current 15-game hitting streak, West has gone 28-for-61 (.459) during that stretch with seven home runs and 24 RBI to raise his season average to .358 (59-for-165). Over his last 28 games, West has raised his season average from .280 to .358 going 39-for-93 (.419) with 34 RBI. In his last 11 games he has hit seven home runs, including his third multi-homer game of the season vs. UC Irvine (5/6). He recorded a career-best weekend vs. Washington State in which he earned his fourth career Pac-10 Player of the Week award. In the three-game set vs. the Cougars, West combined to go 9-for-16 (.562) with five home runs, seven runs scored and 13 RBI. He homered in all three games (extending his consecutive games homer streak vs. WSU to six games), including hitting a walk-off two-run homer in the 10th inning in Saturday's 5-3 victory and belting an ASU single-game record tying three on Sunday. Going 5-for-7 in the series finale, West tied the single-game home run mark with a two-run, three-run and grand slam home run and also equaled the school record with nine RBI. For the season, West now has 16 home runs to lead the team, including a trio of multi-home run games, and with 35 career homers is now tied for 10th in the ASU career record books. His .649 career slugging percentage also ranks fifth in ASU history heading into the Washington series this weekend.

Production at First Base:

The first base position has proven to be ASU's big run producer this year with Jeff Larish, Mike Guerrero and Jeremy West combining to torture opposing teams. In ASU's 59 games, Larish has played in 52 games, Guerrero in 14 games and West in one game at first base. The trio when playing the position have combined to go 89-for-228 (.390) with 23 doubles, 17 home runs and 94 RBI.

McClellan Mows Them Down:

Senior right-handed reliever Robbie McClellan has emerged as one of ASU's best pitchers after enduring some struggles earlier in the season. McClellan, who entered the year as the Pac-10's leading strikeout pitcher after recording 91 as a junior in 2002, is 7-0 this year with a 3.52 ERA. Pitching in 24 games, McClellan has made four starts going 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA and is 5-0 with a 3.82 ERA out of the bullpen. He has come on strong as of late going 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA in his last six outings (12.2 IP).

Sun Devils Record Best Start in School History:

Arizona State's 28-1 start to the season goes down in the record books as the best start in school history. The 28-1 record includes an 11-game winning streak to start the season before a loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State (Jan. 31) and a 19-game win streak up until suffering a 6-5 loss to Oklahoma (3/14). During the 28-1 start to the season ASU's pitchers posted an impressive 3.11 ERA and the hitters combined for a .360 team batting average. Here is a look at ASU's best starts in school history:

About the 19-Game Winning Streak:

After starting the year 9-0, ASU suffered its first setback with an 11-5 loss at nationally ranked Long Beach State on Jan. 31. After that loss, ASU went on a 19-game winning streak combining to go 13-0 in February and won the first six games in March before losing 6-5 to No. 30 Oklahoma (3/14). The 19-game winning streak is the longest by an ASU squad since the 1990 team won 23 straight games. Dustin Pedroia led ASU during the streak hitting .432 (35-for-81) with 11 of his Pac-10 leading 28 doubles. As a team the Sun Devils hit at a .344 clip and pitched for an impressive 2.56 ERA.



Home Run Notes:

Through 59 games of the 2003 season the Sun Devils have nearly doubled their entire season total from 2002 with 70 home runs. ASU has hit 49 of those home runs at Packard Stadium and 21 in its 25 road or neutral site games. Of the 34 games played at Packard Stadium the Devils have hit at least one home run in 25 games. A total of 12 different players have hit at least one home run and nine players have two or more home runs. Junior Jeremy West leads the team with 16 round-trippers after hitting seven in his last 11 games. Sophomore Jeff Larish is second with 15, including an ASU single-season record of four grand slams. The Devils have homered in 39 of their 59 games (66%), including 20 multi-home run games. The Devils also have 12 grand slams on the season with Larish (4), Steve Garrabrants (2), Jeremy West (2), Rod Allen (2) and freshmen Ryan Bosch and Travis Buck all leaving the yard with the bases loaded to tie the NCAA record. ASU had only one grand slam in 2002 and four in 2001. ASU's home run breakdown includes 18 solo shots, 25 two-run homers, 15 three-run home runs and 12 grand slams to account for 27% of the total run production in 2003 (161 runs). The Jeff Larish Watch:

Sophomore first baseman Jeff Larish started off with a bang in 2003 hitting 11 home runs in his first 29 games. Although he has cooled off a little as of late, Larish is still having a banner season hitting .358 (72-for-201) with 15 home runs, 14 doubles and leads the conference with 83 RBI. Larish has recorded at least one hit in 46 of 56 games and one RBI in 39 of 56 games this year. He also leads the conference with 69 walks (1.23 per game) and has an unbelievable on-base percentage of .518 For the season he is slugging .672 and is second on the team with 31 extra base hits. He has connected on four grand slams this year, breaking the single-season school record set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. In addition, he is batting .700 (14x20) with the bases loaded and leads the team with 32 two-out RBI. Larish, who was supposed to redshirt in 2002 but played midway through the season, hit .328 with three home runs in 34 games last year. Drafted in the 32nd round in 2001 by the Chicago Cubs, Larish etched his named in the ASU record books with a memorable game in the series finale vs. San Diego State (1/26). In what turned out to be a 24-9 ASU route, Larish was 3-for-4 and tied the school single-game record with nine RBI. He had a two-run single in the first inning, a two-run home run in the third, a grand slam homer in the fourth and then tied the 13-year-old school record (Tommy Adams) by walking with the bases loaded in the eighth.

Larish Breaks Single-Season Record With Four Grand Slams:

With his fourth grand slam of the season in the eighth inning of ASU's 17-1 blowout of UCLA on April 19, sophomore Jeff Larish broke the single-season record for grand slams. The previous record of three was set by Dave Hudgens in 1977. Here is a look at Larish's four grand slams this year:



Nine RBI:

Twice this year two Sun Devils have tied the ASU single-season record with nine RBI in a single game. Sophomore Jeff Larish was the first to do it in a 24-9 win over San Diego State (1/26). Larish accomplished the nine RBI with a two-run single, two-run home run, a grand slam home run and a bases loaded walk. Junior Jeremy West also had nine RBI in his record setting game vs. Washington State (4/27) in which he went 5-for-7 with three home runs. West recorded his nine RBI with a two-run homer, a three-run homer and a grand slam. The only other Sun Devil to record nine RBI in a game was Tommy Adams on May 2, 1990 vs. UNLV.

Pedroia Named To Initial Watch List For Golden Spikes Award:

Arizona State sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia was included among 25 players named to the initial watch list for the 2003 Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's top amateur baseball player. The 2002 Team USA member was one of only two Pac-10 players to be named to the initial watch list (Carlos Quentin, Stanford). The five finalists were named this week without Pedroia making the final cut. Arizona State has a long tradition of Golden Spikes Award winners as three past Sun Devils have won the award. Bob Horner (1978), Oddibe McDowell (1984) and Mike Kelly (1991) have all won the award. Only Florida State and Cal State Fullerton have matched ASU's legacy also with three winners of the annual Golden Spikes Award.

Beau is No "Wild Thing" Vaughan:

One of ASU's most valuable pitchers this year comes in the form or a senior transfer who virtually had no success at any of the other three colleges he played for. Hard-throwing right-hander Beau Vaughan has blossomed under the tutelage of pitching coach Chris Sinacori and leads the team with eight wins and is second in the Pac-10 95 strikeouts. After starring at Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Vaughan played at Phoenix College, South Mountain Community College and last year at New Orleans where he was only 1-0 with an 8.84 ERA in 19.1 innings pitched. As a Sun Devil Vaughan, who played in high school with teammate Jered Liebeck, has been stellar in both relief and as a starter. He is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA out of the bullpen and is 3-3 with a 4.43 ERA as a starter. In his second appearance of the year back on Jan. 17 vs. Hawaii-Hilo, Vaughan registered eight straight strikeouts for the second most in ASU pitching history.

Recapping April:

The Sun Devils capped off one of the programs most successful Aprils in recent years with a 9-4 win over Oklahoma (4/30) at Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City. ASU finished the month with a 9-3 record, including going 7-2 in Pac-10 play. Junior slugger Jeremy West paced the ASU offense hitting .545 (18-for-33) in the month with five home runs and 17 RBI. Junior Nick Walsh made sure his name will be penciled into the lineup on a regular basis going 19-for-39 (.487) in 11 games in April with five doubles and 13 RBI. As a team the Devils hit .358 with 22 doubles, five triples and 19 home runs. The pitchers continued their success in 2003 by maintaining an impressive 2.87 ERA in the 12 games. Senior Ben Thurmond went 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in three games and 14.0 IP in April.

Leaders of the Pac:

Through 59 games the Sun Devils continue to lead the Pac-10 in several key offensive and defensive statistical categories. The offense paces the league hitting .349, with Dustin Pedroia (.424) ranked first, Frank Mesa (.378) ranked eighth and Andre Ethier (.362) ranked ninth. The Devils are also first in runs scored (592), hits (749), doubles (143) RBI (548), on-base percentage (.451) and third with 70 home runs. ASU's pitchers have dominated thus far leading second place Stanford by nearly a full point with a 3.40 team ERA. The Devils also rank second in the conference with a team .972 fielding percentage.

Freshman Records About To Go Down:

Freshman Travis Buck and Erik Averill are making a serious dent in the ASU freshman record books as the regular season winds down. Averill is already tied for ninth with his seven wins, 10th in ERA (3.82), and 10th with 46 strikeouts. Buck is ranked third with 73 hits, tied for fifth with 13 doubles and second with 54 runs scored.

Double Vision:

ASU has recorded a Pac-10 best 143 doubles on the year (2.42 per game average). Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the team and Pac-10 with a school and league record 32. Junior Steve Garrabrants is second on the team with 16. The team record for doubles in a season is 185 set in 1988, while the individual season record was previously 30 by Chris Bando in 1978.

National Players of the Week:

Two Sun Devils have earned national player of the week honors this year. Senior RHP Jered Liebeck earned national acclaim after his complete-game, three-hit shutout against nationally ranked Long Beach State

on Feb. 1. He was named the *Collegiate Baseball* and NCBWA pitcher of the week for his performance. Junior designated hitter Jeremy West earned Pac-10 Player of the Week and *Collegiate Baseball* and CollegeBaseballInsider.com national player of the week after hitting five home runs in three games against Washington State (4/25-27). Freshman Travis Buck also earned CBI's western regional player of the week honor after his impressive series vs. USC (3/28-30).

Kartler Knows His Role:

Senior left-handed pitcher Bryce Kartler knows he has a role of coming in and getting one or two hitters out and he has succeeded greatly in that role. Making 20 pitching appearances this year, Kartler has pitched in 18.0 innings and has maintained a 5.50 ERA. While his ERA is one of the highest on the team, if you were to take way his first two relief appearances of the year against San Diego State (Jan. 24, Jan. 26) where he gave up nine runs in two-thirds of an inning, Kartler would have a 1.04 ERA giving up only two earned runs in 17.1 innings.

Travis Buck Hits For The Cycle:

Freshman outfielder Travis Buck went 5-for-5 with even RBI and hit for the cycle in ASU's 19-0 win over Southern Utah (3/7). He became only the seventh Sun Devil in recorded history to record the elusive cycle and became the first freshman in Pac-10 history to hit for the cycle. Buck capped his perfect night with a grand slam home run as part of an eight-run sixth inning to become ASU's first player to hit for the cycle since Mitch Jones on May 21, 2000 at Arizona. Buck, ASU's normal starting left fielder who was making only his second start in right field, had a single in the first, a double in the third and a triple in the fifth before connecting on his second home run of the year for the cycle. He also added a run-scoring single in the fourth and tied a career high with two stolen bases. For the season Buck, who was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week after going 8-for-11 (.727) vs. USC, is hitting .349 (73-for-209) with 13 doubles and four home runs. Schroyer Ranks Fifth in ASU History With 15 Career Saves:

Junior closer Ryan Schroyer has been nearly unstoppable in 2003 out of the bullpen. The hard-throwing right-hander is 5-2 with seven saves this year and has a 1.49 ERA allowing only seven earned runs in 42.1 innings pitched. The preseason All-American has scattered 35 hits in his 26 outings and has struck out 47 batters. His save over USC (3/30), in which he scattered three hits in 1.2 innings, moved him into fifth place in the ASU career record books with his 15th career save. Since becoming ASU's closer midway through the 2002 season, Schroyer has been dominating going 8-2 with a 1.51 ERA and 15 saves. During that stretch he has 97 strikeouts in 83.1 innings (47 appearances). Schroyer also put together a solid summer going 1-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA to help lead the Alaska Goldpanners to the NBC World Series title. After recording eight (8) as the league's top pitcher (2.37 ERA) in 2002, Schroyer is looking to continue to move up the charts. Here is a look at ASU's top save leaders in school history:

Pinch Hits:

As a team the Sun Devils are hitting .306 (33-for-108) in pinch-hitting opportunities with four doubles, two triples and three home runs. Junior Rod Allen has been ASU's leading pinch-hitter as of late going 6-for-10 (.600) with nine RBI, two doubles and two grand slam home runs. Senior Dennis Wyrick (.357, 5-for-14), Nick Walsh (.318, 7-for-22) and Mike Guerrero (.348, 8-for-23) have also been solid off the bench for ASU this year.



The Big Inning:

The Sun Devils have been a scoring machine this year ranking fourth in the nation averaging 10.03 runs per game this year. ASU has also proven to be an explosive team at the plate, recording 139 big innings (2 or more runs). The team has also recorded 32 innings when they score five or more runs and have scored over 10 runs in an inning twice. ASU's biggest run production in a single frame was 12 in the opening game vs. Washington State (4/25).

Pitching Shutouts:

ASU has already pitched eight shutouts this year, after recording only six in the previous three years. Included in the eight shutouts, of only one is a complete-game shutout by Jered Liebeck, three have come in Pac-10 play. Since the Pac-10 North and Pac-10 South (Six Pac) merged in 1999, the three Pac-10 shutouts are more than the previous four years combined in league play. ASU currently leads the conference with a 3.40 ERA, marking the best staff ERA since ASU joined the Pac-10 in 1979.

Home Sweet Home:

ASU returns to Packard Stadium in 2003 after playing in Mesa (Hohokam Park) in 2002. The Devils recorded their 800th career victory at Packard Stadium (3/1 vs. PSU) and have an all-time 808-230-1 dating back to 1974. ASU will play 40 of its 62 games in the state of Arizona and 37 at Packard Stadium this year. After playing nine of its first 12 games on the road, the Devils spent nearly the entire months of February and March in the state of Arizona with only three games away from Packard Stadium at the new spring training facility of the Texas Rangers/Kansas City Royals in Surprise. After going 29-10 in designated home games last year, the Devils are 27-7 at home this year now have a combined 160-50-1 (.758) home record in the last five years dating back to 1998. ASU is hitting .351 with 49 home runs in 34 home games and pitching for a 3.43 team ERA on the mound.

ASU Continuing To Mix Things Up:

After mixing and matching for 41 different starting batting lineups in 58 games last year, head coach Pat Murphy continues to keep the lineup fresh in 2003. Through the first 53 games of the season the Devils have mixed and matched for 46 different batting lineups and 30 different positional lineups. ASU has used the same batting lineup in four of the last five games, marking the first time this year a lineup has been used more than twice.

How They Compare To Past Years:

The Sun Devils are 47-12 through 59 games in the 2003 season after recording the best start in school history at 28-1. The 47 are the most by an ASU squad since going 46-20 in 1993. Here is a look at how the Devils have fared in games 50-60 since 1995.

Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last five years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999 and 10.97 runs per game in 2000. The Devils paced the Pac-10 in 2001, hitting at a .327 clip and averaging 8.26 runs per game to rank 17th in the nation. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark, trailing Stony Brook by one point. During Pat Murphy's nine seasons at ASU, the Sun Devils have been a scoring machine with 4,891 runs in 530 games, averaging 9.23 runs per game and hitting at an overall .331 clip. ASU leads the Pac-10 in hitting again this year at .349 and is averaging 10.03 runs per game. Below is an offensive team breakdown of Murphy's ASU teams:

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 11 as a supplier to the National Team. ASU has had eight players don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984, with the first being Oddibe McDowell in the 1984 Olympics played at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. Jim Austin played for Team USA in 1990 and ASU has had five more players play with Team USA in the last five years. 1999 Pac-10 Player of the Year Willie Bloomquist played in the summer of 1998, 2000-2001 Pac-10 Player of the Year Casey Myers played in the summer of 2000 and was also a member of the Team USA Junior National Team before arriving at ASU in 1998. Current Tampa Bay Devil Ray prospect Jon Switzer was also a member of the 2000 National Team and Mike Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA in the summer of 2001. Sophomore Dustin Pedroja played for the National Team last summer and was the starting shortstop until getting hurt near the end of the season. Pedroia, Travis Buck and Jeff Larish have also been invited to USA Baseball National Team Trials this June in Tucson, Ariz. Current Sun Devils Dennis Wyrick and Ryan Schroyer played for the Team USA Junior teams during their respective prep careers.

Golden Spikes Common At Arizona State:

While Khalil Greene of Clemson was the recipient of the 2002 Golden Spikes award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, it should be noted that three Arizona State players have won the award. In addition to ASU, only Cal State Fullerton and Florida State have won three Golden Spikes Awards. Bob Horner, who was a standout at ASU from 1976-78, won the inaugural award in 1978. Oddibe McDowell, who was a member of the first Team USA baseball team to compete in an Olympics, won the award in 1984. Mike Kelly, who ranks second in ASU history with 46 home runs from 1989-91, won the award in 1991. In all, 12 players that have worn the Maroon and Gold have been named a Player of the Year for college baseball.

ASU Leader of the Pac When It Comes to Player of the Week:

Arizona State has amassed 46 Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week and 67 Players of the Week since 1981. That total leads all Pac-10 member schools. Senior RHP Jered Liebeck became the first Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game, three-hit shutout of Long Beach State (2/1) and Ryan Schroyer earned his first award on Feb. 25. Junior Jeremy West joined Schroyer as ASU swept the weekly awards on Feb. 25. Andre Etheir and West (twice) were named Pac-10 Players of the Week in 2002, while Robbie McClellan and Mike Esposito earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors last year.

Arizona State in Postseason Play:

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has now advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 26 of the program's 44 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 124-51 (.709) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three third-place finishes. Arizona State is 15-10 in the NCAA Tournament under ninth-year head coach Pat Murphy. In addition to advancing three straight years, ASU has been left out of the tournament only once (1999) in the last six years and played for the national championship in 1998.

Drafted Devils:

A total of 16 players on the 2003 Arizona State squad have been taken in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Since the inception of the draft in 1965, ASU has had more players chosen (303), more first-round draft picks (21) and more No. 1 picks (3) than any other school in the nation. Both Bryce Kartler and Josh Perrault have been selected twice in the draft, but both times decided to stay and play college baseball. Newcomers Travis Buck, Chris Beatty, Seth Dhaenens, Ben Thurmond and Beau Vaughan have all been selected as well. ASU's three No. 1 picks were Rick Monday (1965), Floyd Bannister (1976) and Bob Horner (1978, Atlanta). No other college has had more than on No. 1 overall selection in the draft.

Horner Ranks Second As Collegiate Player of the Century:

Former Sun Devil greats Bob Horner and Eddie Bane were honored by Baseball America by being placed on the publication's "Team of the Century." Horner, an ASU great under Jim Brock from 1976-78, hit .383 for his career and belted a school record 56 home runs. Horner was listed second on the team behind Oklahoma State slugger Pete Incaviglia (1983-85). Bane, a top pitcher for the Sun Devils from 1971-72, posted a career 40-4 record and a 1.64 ERA. 92 Years of Sun Devil Baseball Tradition:

While the history of baseball at Arizona State University goes back all the way to the early 1900's, the school officially began sponsoring varsity baseball in 1959. Prior to 2002, the ASU Baseball Media Guide referred only to those players that played from 1959 to present. ASU now officially recognizes those players, coaches and seasons from 1907-1958. In 91-plus years of baseball at Arizona State, the program has built a legacy matched by few in the college baseball world. With a 2.310-1.127-6 all-time record. Arizona State has advanced to the College World Series 18 times, won five national championships, won six Pac-10 titles, produced 12 Players of the Year and three Golden Spikes Award winners, and has gone to the NCAA Tournament 26 times. Under current head coach Pat Murphy, the Sun Devils have finished in the top 12 in three of the last five years and finished second in the nation in 1998. They have been ranked in at least one top 25 poll for 67 consecutive weeks.

An Early Season Opener:

The Jan. 16 season opener at Hawaii-Hilo was the second earliest start in ASU Baseball history and the earliest start by any collegiate team in 2003. The Devils opened the 1999 season at home with a game at Packard Stadium against the University of Utah on Jan. 15. Arizona State's previous earliest start before 1999 was a Jan. 19 home contest against Grand Canyon (W, 12-2) in 1990. With the 9-0 blanking of UHH on 1/16, ASU is now 25-2 in season-opening games (dating back to 1977) and head coach Pat Murphy is 8-1 in season-openers at ASU (15-1 at D1).

How They Have Finished:

Arizona State has finished four seasons ranked in the top 10 in the final Collegiate Baseball national poll since 1990, ranking 10th of all college baseball programs. The schools with the most Top 10 Collegiate Baseball finishes are listed below:

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But lately academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past four years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as First-Team Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation since 1995. Ryan McKenna, Aaron Klusman, Cesar Castillo, Nick Walsh and Mike Esposito all earned Pac-10 Academic Awards in 2002.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 58-38 record in league play. Even more impressive is that besides last season (2002) no other player besides a Sun Devil has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. In all, ASU has won nine (9) Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Peery and Marc Barcelo).

Schroyer Named Baseball America Summer All-American:

Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Schroyer was named a second-team Summer All-American by Baseball America after he helped lead the Alaska Goldpanners to the NBC World Series Championship. Schroyer joined the Goldpanners in the Alaskan League after not making the final Team USA roster. Ranked as the No. 3 prospect from the league by BA, Schroyer tamed the league with a 1-0 record, six saves and a 0.00 ERA.

Pedroia Becomes Eighth Devil to Play for Team USA:

Sophomore shortstop Dustin Pedroia became the eighth Sun Devil since 1984 to play for the USA Baseball National Team. After hitting .347 and setting an ASU freshman record with 82 hits in his freshman season, Pedroia made Team USA after being invited to the trials in Tucson, Ariz. Pedroia spent most of the summer as the team's starting shortstop before having to leave after suffering a broken cheek bone in the Harlem Honkball Tournament in The Netherlands.

Hitting For The Cycle... in the First Inning:

In what may be one of the rarest feats of Arizona State baseball history, the Devils led off the Feb. 9, 2002 game vs. Tennessee in grand fashion with the first four hitters combining to hit for the cycle in the first inning. Leadoff hitter Steve Garrabrants led off the game with a first-pitch home run, then Dustin Pedroia followed with a double, then Rod Allen singled and to cap off the amazing event, Jeremy West tripled to give ASU the early 2-0 lead. ASU also accomplished the rarity in the 10-run first inning against Washington State (4/27) in 2003 when the first five batters (Pedroia, 3B; Walsh, 1B; Larish, 2B; West HR) combined to hit for the cycle.

Why Not #9 Murphy:

Most who are close to the ASU Baseball program know what the No. 9 means to head coach Pat Murphy. Often his slogan to "Play all 9 Innings", Murphy and No. 9 are synonymous with each other... until last year. In a preseason meeting with team, Murphy gave a speech on how you have to be able to give up anything for the team. In this case, he even offered up his prize No. 9, knowing no one would take it. That is, until ASU's Steve Garrabrants raised his hand and said, I'll take it, and with that, the leader of the Devils is willing to give up anything for the team and will wear No. 7 again this year.
