NATIONAL RANKINGS

Arizona State (21-7) enters the Pac-10 series against USC ranked No. 10 by Sports Weekly and No. 14 by Baseball America. The Devils are also ranked No. 17 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 9 by the NCBWA. The Sun Devils have now been ranked in the national polls for 87 consecutive weeks, including 29 straight in the top 10 (at least one poll). USC (12-14) is not currently ranked, but appeared as high as No. 16 in the preseason rankings (CB).

All three games of the USC series will be broadcast on the radio or internet with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all the action from Packard Stadium. Friday and Sunday will be on KDUS 1060 AM, while Saturday will be on 1440 AM. Friday's series opener will also be televised locally on AZ-TV with George Allen and Doug Gerlach calling the action. DID YOU KNOW?

Arizona State and USC have combined for 17 national championships in baseball... as one of college baseball's greatest rivalries, USC leads the alltime series by a small margin of 85-84... USC and ASU played in the national championship game in 1998 with the Trojans winning 21-14... ASU junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the Pac-10 hitting .443 (51-for-115) with 16 doubles and five home runs... sophomore right fielder Travis Buck is tied for the league lead with seven home runs and is first with 36 RBI... ASU has advanced to the CWS in two of the last three seasons in which they started 2-4 in the Pac-10 (1988, 1993, 1997).

The Sun Devil Baseball team (21-7, 2-4 Pac-10) continues their 25-game homestand this weekend with a three-game conference series against the University of Southern California Trojans. The Devils are 13-5 during the current homestand. USC (13-14, 0-0 Pac-10) has won five of their last seven games after defeating Cal State Fullerton 6-4 on Wednesday. Following the USC series, ASU will host Oral Roberts (Apr. 8-10) and Arizona (Apr. 12) before heading back on the road at UCLA (Apr. 16-18). The Devils will play 16 of their final 21 games on the road this season, including four of the last five Pac-10 series.

Recapping Last Week:

The Sun Devils went 1-2 last weekend dropping a Pac-10 Conference series to the University of Washington. The Huskies won the opener 11-1 and ASU answered with a 9-4 victory on Saturday to set up the rubber match. ASU lead 5-2 after six innings, but UW answered with a Zach Clem (Pac-10 Player of the Week) grand slam in the seventh to take a 6-5 lead. After Nick Cadena homered in the seventh to tie the game, Clem gave UW the lead for good with a two-run single in the ninth for the 8-6 victory. Junior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch led ASU at the plate in the series going 4-for-9 (.444) with three runs and one RBI.

- Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia has hits in 25 of ASU's 28 games and is hitting .443 with 16 2B, 5 HR and 27 RBI.
- Freshman relief pitcher Pat Bresnehan is 3-1 with five saves and leads the team with a 2.73 ERA in 13 games. Travis Buck is tied for the Pac-10 lead with seven home runs and leads the conference with 36 RBI.
- Pedroia is ninth in the ASU record books with 253 career hits and fourth with a career .390 batting average.
- Travis Buck became the first Pac-10 player to earn back-to-back Player of the Week honors since 1998.
- The Devils have been ranked in 87 consecutive national polls, including 29 straight weeks in the top 10. ASU's next victory will give head coach Pat Murphy his 700th Division I victory (17th season).
- ASU has left 10 or more runners on base in 13 of 28 games this season, including 31 in three games against UW.
 - Pedroia has a current 10-game hitting streak, marking his seventh career hitting streak of 10 or more games. Sophomore left-hander Brett Bordes has 28 strikeouts in 21.1 IP this season for a 11.81 K/9.0 IP average.

Pedroia Off To Another Torrid Start:

Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia is a leading candidate for Pac-10 and National Player of the Year honors. He leads the Pac-10 hitting .443 (51-for-115) with 40 runs scored, 16 doubles, five home runs and 27 RBI. He has hits in 25 of ASU's 28 games, including 14 multi-hit affairs and four games with two or more doubles. He also has a current 10-game hitting streak in which he is 21-for-41 (.512). As a sophomore, Pedroia hit .404 (120-for-297) and was named the Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year. He led the NCAA with 34 doubles, setting the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record and tied for third all-time in the NCAA record books. With 16 doubles this season, Pedroja now has 63 in his career, ranking fifth in the ASU career record books. He also had 253 hits to rank 9th and his career .390 batting average (253-for-648) ranks fifth. He has played and started all 154 games of his Sun Devil career and has recorded at least one hit in 132 games (86%). He has also recorded 82 career multi-hit games and is a .400 career hitter in 54 Pac-10 games (96-for-240). Additionally, the 2003 Collegiate Baseball Defensive Player of the Year has made only 17 errors in 668 total chances in the field for a career .975 FLD%. He was a two-year starter for the USA Baseball National Team and was named to the all-tournament team in the 2003 Pan American Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. Here is a look at Pedroia's career highlights and statistics:

- Leads the Pac-10 in hitting (.443), hits (51), doubles (16), on-base percentage (.543), runs (40) and total bases (82).
- Currently riding a 10-game hitting streak (.512, 21-for-41), his seventh career hitting streak of 10 or more games.
- Broke a rare 0-for-10 streak by going 4-for-4 with a home run and a career-high five RBI against No. 11 Tulane (3/13).
- Second on the team and tied for seventh with five home runs. Entered the season with only five career homers.
- Has recorded 14 multi-hit games this season and 82 in his career. Has six three-hit games and three four-hit contests. Rated as the No. 28 overall position player by Baseball America for the 2004 MLB Draft.
- A career .390 (253-for-648) hitter to rank ninth in hits (253) and fourth in batting average in the ASU career record books.
- Hitting .400 (96-for-240) in his career in Pac-10 play, including .440 (11-for-25) in six games this season.

- Has recorded at least one hit in 132 of 154 career games (86%) and has started every game of his career. Has hit 63 career doubles, ranking fifth in the ASU career record books. With one more double he will move into fourth place. Set the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 34 doubles in 2003. Old ASU record was 30 by Chris Bando in 1978.
 - Named the 2003 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year with Stanford's Ryan Garko and was a first-team All-American.
 - Played for the USA Baseball National Team in 2002 and 2003, leading Team USA to a bronze medal in the Pan Am Games.

Pedroia Times Two:

Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia is a doubles machine. Through ASU's first 28 games, Pedroia has 16 doubles. He has picked up right where he left off in 2003, setting an ASU and Pac-10 record while leading the NCAA with 34 doubles. In 154 career games, the Woodland, Calif., native has 63 doubles to rank fifth in the ASU record books. He has averaged .41 doubles per game over his career.

Pedroia Passes Barry Bonds:

With 253 career hits in his career, junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia recenlty moved into ASU's career top 10 list. He passed Barry Bonds (1983-85), who had 247 during his three years in Tempe. After recording five hits against UW, Pedroia is now ninth after passing Rick Peters (251, 1974-77). The all-time school record is 322 set by Clay Westlake from 1973-76.



Poll Mechanics:

After going 1-2 last week against Washington, Arizona State (21-7) moved a little in the national polls. The Devils dropped one spot from No. 9 to No. 10 by *ESPN/Sports Weekly* and five spots from No. 9 to No. 14 by *Baseball America*. The Devils are also ranked No. 17 in the recent *Collegiate Baseball* poll and No. 9 by the NCBWA. ASU is in its spent the previous four weeks as a consensus top 10 team (all four polls) and is in its 29th straight week ranked in the top 10 in at least one poll. The Devils have now been ranked for 87 consecutive weeks dating back to the start of the 2000 season. ASU entered the 2004 season ranked in all four of the national preseason polls (#7 CB, #10 SW, #11 NCBWA, #18 BA). ASU finished the 2003 season with a 54-14 record and earned a consensus top 10 ranking in all four national polls.

The Best College Baseball Rivalry in the Nation:

When USC and Arizona State take the field this weekend at Packard Stadium, 17 national championships will be represented. USC has won a record 12 national championships, while ASU is tied for second with five (1965, 1967, 1969, 1977, 1981). The Devils and Trojans first met in 1961, and 43 years and 169 games later, the all-time series is nearly deadlocked at 85-84 (USC leads). The Devils and Trojans are also among the elite college programs in the nation when it comes to producing major league talent, with USC furbishing 89 eventual big leaguers and ASU 79. ASU has won five of the last seven in the series, including two of three last year at Dedeaux Field in Los Angeles. ASU and USC last met at Packard Stadium in 1999.

Travis Buck Going For Triple Crown:

Sophomore right fielder Travis Buck leads ASU in two of the three Triple Crown categories with seven home runs and 36 RBI. He is tied for the Pac-10 lead in home runs and paces the league race with his 36 RBI. Buck is hitting .364 (36-for-99) with eight doubles and a .657 slugging percentage. He is third on the team with eight multi-hit games and leads the Devils with nine multi-RBI contests. He also leads the team with four outfield assists and is 6-for-6 stealing bases. He was named Pac-10 Player of the Week and the Collegiate Baseball/Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week after going 10-for-12 (.833) with 13 RBI in the three-game series against UConn (2/27-29). The sophomore outfielder is a career .337 (114-for-338) hitter with 11 home runs and 93 runs scored.

Buck Repeats As Pac-10 Player of the Week:

After going 5-for-10 with home runs in all three games against East Carolina, Travis Buck earned his second consecutive Pac-10 Player of the Week award. With his third career Pac-10 POW award, he became the 16th conference player and first since 1998 to repeat since Cal's Xavier Nady earned the award in consecutive weeks in 1998 (Apr. 27, May 4). He is the first Sun Devil since Oddibe McDowell in 1984 to earn back-to-back conference honors.

Five Times The Fun:

Travis Buck had a string of hitting a home run in five straight games dating back to the Sunday victory over Connecticut (2/29). He is the first Sun Devil to hit homers in five straight since single-season home run record holder Mitch Jones cleared the fences in five straight games during that save 2000 season against Florida State (2/6), Duke (2/11-13) and LSU (2/18).

The Last Time ASU Was 2-4 In Pac-10 Play:

The Devils have gotten off to a sluggish 2-4 record to start the Pac-10 season, but if history as anything to say about it ASU is sure to rebound. ASU entered the Pac-10 slate having cruised through a brutal 22-game non-conference schedule going 19-3, including a 10-1 record against ranked opponents. ASU has lost a pair of home conference series, dropping two of three games each to California and Washington. ASU was also 2-4 to open the conference season in 1988, 1993 and 1997. Each season the Devils advanced to postseason play and in 1988 and 1993 the Devils advanced to the College World Series. ASU also opened the 1987 season with a 1-5 record in the Pac-10 and advanced to the CWS.

The Half Wav Point:

The Sun Devils hit the half way point in the 2004 season after Sunday's 8-6 loss to Washington. Through 28 games the Devils have built an impressive 21-7 record against arguably the toughest schedule in the nation. Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia leads the Pac-10 in several offensive categories, including batting average (.443), hits (51), doubles (16) and total bases (82). The Devils lead the Pac-10 hitting .315 and are fourth with a 4.05 ERA. ASU was 29-2 at the half way point of last season's 62-game regular season.

Bresnehan Inching Towards Freshman Saves Record:

Only 28 games into his ASU career, freshman relief pitcher Pat Bresnehan is on the fast track to demolish the ASU freshman record for saves in a season. Bresnehan already has five saves to rank third in the freshman annals. He trails only Mitch Dean (8 in 1976) and Ryan Bradley (6 in 1995). The hard-throwing right-hander is 3-1 with five saves and leads ASU with a 2.73 ERA. He has 27 strikeouts in 26.1 innings.

Two-Way Zinicola:

Freshman Zechry Zinicola is becoming a regular in the Sun Devil lineup, whether as a starting pitcher on Sunday or the designated hitter on Friday and Saturday. Zinicola has moved in the starting pitching rotation and has built a 2-1 record with a 3.91 ERA. He recorded a strong seven-inning effort against California (3/21) in which he scattered two runs and six hits to pick up the victory. He had to leave his last start against Washington after aggravating a groin injury. At the plate, Zinicola has made 10 starts at designated hitter and has recorded hits in nine of his 12 games played. He is hitting .300 (12-for-40) with two home runs and 13 RBI (.500 SLG%). He is ASU's first full-time two-way player since Richy Leon (1995-98). Leon was a career .298 hitter as an outfielder and was 8-3 with a 4.67 ERA in 48 pitching appearances.

ASU HEAD COACH

Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same time establishing

himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in four of the past seven seasons, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy has combined to go 381-185-1 in his 10 seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 28-20 record in NCAA Tournament action. He has a career 754-356-4 record in 19 seasons as a head coach. Murphy recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory in 2002 and recorded his 700th career coaching victory (all levels) with a 14-8 come-from-behind win over No. 11 Notre Dame (2/23/03). ASU has been in 86 straight national polls under Murphy. The Sun Devils also set an NCAA record scoring in 506 straight games.

Urquidez Named To Clemens Award Watch List:

Arizona State starting pitcher Jason Urquidez is part of a list of 40 hurlers who are included in the first Roger Clemens Award Watch List. The list is comprised of all Division I pitchers who were named as pre-season All-Americans by either Baseball America or Collegiate Baseball, in addition to those pitchers who have been honored so far this season as National Pitchers of the Week. Urquidez earned national POW honors from Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA, Sports Weekly and CollegeBaseballInsider.com. He was also named the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game three-hitter against No. 1 and defending national champion Rice Owls at Reckling Park in Houston last weekend. A junior college transfer from Central Arizona College, Urquidez is 6-2 with a 2.83 ERA. He has recorded 39 strikeouts in 41.1 IP and opposing hitters are batting only .223 off him. In its inaugural year, The Roger Clemens Award will be presented to the nation's top college pitcher at the conclusion of a gala dinner in Houston on July 15.

Lineup Changes:

Through 28 games of the 2004 season, ASU skipper Pat Murphy has authored 23 different batting lineups and 18 different positional lineups. The 2003 squad featured 57 different batting lineups during the 68-game season. The pitching rotation last weekend of Jason Urquidez (Friday), Brett Bordes (Saturday) and Zechry Zinicola (Sunday) is also the fourth different three-man rotation featured during a weekend series.



Tuff Behind the Plate:

Junior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch is the epitome of his name behind the dish... tough. In his second year as a full-time starter, Gosewisch has taken ASU's young pitching staff by the reigns to help lead the Devils to success with a 21-7 record and the fourth best ERA in the Pac-10 (4.05). Additionally, he is to a great start at the plate, hitting .347 (33-for-95) with 19 runs, six doubles, one home run and 16 RBI. He has recorded at least one hit in 21 of ASU's 28 games and is second with 10 multi-hit games. The Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year candidate has thrown out nine of 28 attempted base stealers and has a .987 FLD%.

Larish Injures Wrist Just As He Was Heating Up:

Junior All-American outfielder Jeff Larish injured his right wrist diving for a fly ball in the Friday game against California (3/19). Described as a sprained wrist, Larish toughed it out to play in the Washington series, but struggled at the plate going 2-for-13 (.154). The injury comes just as the All-American was starting to heat up at the plate with eight hits in his five previous games. Larish is hitting .271 (29-for-107) with 11 doubles, two home runs and 25 RBI. As a sophomore he hit .372 (87-for-234) with 18 home runs and 95 RBI. Making 26 starts in left field this season, Larish is at his third position as a Sun Devil in as many years (3B in 2002, 1B in 2003. Last season, Larish became only the second Sun Devil to join the 70-70 club (RBI-BB) when he had 95 RBI (fifth most in ASU history) and led the NCAA with 78 walks. The Tempe native is a career .337 (158-for-469) hitter with 144 RBI and 126 walks (.475 on-base percentage and 1051 OPS). The 2004 preseason All-American is listed as the No. 10 prospect for the annual June Amateur Draft by *Baseball America*.

Pedroia And Buck Lead It Off:

Dustin Pedroia and Travis Buck have hit No. 1 and No. 2 in the lineup in 20 of ASU's 28 games this year and have been the catalyst behind ASU's quick starts. The Devils have scored in the first inning in 16 of those games for 37 total runs. Pedroia and Buck have reached base in successive order in their first at-bats in 11 of those 20 games, including both getting hits in six games. Against FSU (2/8) and Cal State Northridge (2/13), Buck and Pedroia each led off the game hitting doubles to plate a run each time. Pedroia has a knack for getting on base while leading off a game (13 of 28), while Buck has reached base in 21 of his 28 first at-bats (11 hits, 2 HR). Whether leading off the game or an inning, Pedroia has reached base in 26 of 51 opportunities (51%).

Undefeated... No Problem:

ASU has played arguably the toughest schedule in the nation and heads into the USC series with the No. 3 RPI (Boydsworld.com) in the nation. Additionally, ASU has gone 10-1 against ranked opponents (top 25 at time playing). In five of the last 10 games, ASU has faced an undefeated starting pitcher and beaten them in four of those contests. It started by beating Tulane's J.R. Crowel (3-0), then Cory Hahn (3-0), then Oklahoma State's Daniel Rew (3-0) and Spencer Grogan (4-0). ASU lost last Friday to Washington's Tim Lincecum (2-0) and will have another opportunity this weekend when taking on USC's undefeated freshman Ian Kennedy (4-0).

Hitting Streaks:

Three Sun Devils are currently riding hitting streaks of four or more games heading into the Pac-10 series against USC. Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia is in the midst of a team-high 10-game streak in which he is batting .512 (21-for-41). This is Pedroia's second hitting streak of 10 or more games this season and the seventh of his career. He had a career-high 22-game streak that spanned from the end of his freshman season to the first 11 games of 2003. Here is a look at the streaking Devils:

Preseason All-Americans:

Sun Devil juniors Dustin Pedroia and Jeff Larish earned preseason All-America honors from every publication. Pedroia earned first-team honors from the NCBWA, Collegiate Baseball, CollegeBaseballInsider.com, and was a third-team pick by Baseball America. He was also selected as the preseason pick for Pac-10 Player of the Year by Baseball America. Larish, who moves to the outfield for the 2004 season, was a first-team pick by the NCBWA. Larish was also selected as the preseason College Baseball Player of the Year by Street & Smith's.

A Tale of Two Sundays:

From one Sunday to another, the Arizona State baseball program was the buzz of the college baseball world. On Sunday, Feb. 15, the Devils saw their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak come to an end in a 6-0 shutout by the University of Oklahoma at Surprise Stadium in Surprise, Ariz. The streak spanned parts of nine seasons dating back to April 7, 1995 and blew away the old record of 349 set by Coastal Carolina. Just one week later, on Feb. 22, the Devils stunned No. 1 Rice in a 3-1 victory at Reckling Park, ending an 18-game winning streak by ace pitcher Jeff Niemann. Niemann, regarded as the top-pitching prospect in the nation, had not lost a decision dating back to the end of the 2002 season, including a 17-0 record as a sophomore. ASU pitcher Jason Urquidez was named the National Pitcher of the Week for his complete-game, three-hit victory over the defending national champion Owls.

Welcome To College Baseball:

Going into the season, preseason prognosticators tabbed the Sun Devils as a young and inexperienced team. Having lost 12 players to the annual MLB draft and returning only two pitchers from the Pac-10's leading pitching staff (3.32 ERA in 2003), the Devils have had to look to several newcomers to become impact players. Through ASU's first 28 games, 14 newcomers and three redshirts have seen action. ASU had as many as four freshman in the starting lineup last weekend.

Throwbacks Are Classic:

The Sun Devils unveiled a new 'Throwback' uniform for the 2004 season and it has gotten rave reviews. Originally slated to be the designated Sunday uniform, the Devils have worn the classic threads in 23 of the 28 games this season and gone 18-5. The off-white uniform features a baggier look and an old-school 'Devils' script across the chest. The Devils wear black spikes and high socks to compliment the 'old school' look. ASU is also 3-1 in the all white uniforms (worn with white spikes) and 0-1 in the road gray sleeveless jersey.

Tough Against Ranked Teams:

The Sun Devils are off to an impressive 21-7 start and boast an even more impressive 10-1 record against ranked opponents (top 25 at time played). ASU played 22 non-conference games before beginning the conference slate against California and Washington. ASU played 13 of those games against teams that have appeared in the national rankings at some point this season. The Sun Devils swept No. 18 Florida State (Feb. 6-8) to open the season and also beat No. 1 Rice (3-1, Feb. 22), No. 16 Arizona (4-0, Feb. 26), swept No. 18 ECU (Mar. 5-7) and took two of three from No. 11 Tulane. Five of ASU's seven losses have also come against teams that have appeared in at least one of the four top 25 polls this season.

Devils No. 3 in Projected RPI:

In the March 28 release of the projected RPI on www.Boydsworld.com, Arizona State holds the No. 3 ranking in the country. The Devils had previously been ranked No. 1 on Mar. 15 and No. 2 on Mar. 22. The NCAA uses the rating system to help determine selections and seedings for postseason play. Boyd Nation has come up with an RPI index that has proven to be an accurate depiction of the same RPI the NCAA uses. The Devils are 21-7 midway through the 2004 season and has played arguably the toughest schedule in the nation. ASU has seven of the top 25 teams in this week's RPI on the 2004 slate. Of the 11 pitchers that have seen action on the mound this season, nine are wearing a Sun Devil uniform for the first time. All but 42.1 of the 224.0 IP have been newcomers to the Sun Devil pitching staff... and they have helped ASU to a 20-5 record and a 10-1 mark against ranked opponents. Six of the nine are freshmen (Josh Blake, Quentin Andes, Pat Cassa, Pat Bresnehan, Travis Webb, Zechry Zinicola), with three others transfers (Jeff Mousser, Jason Urquidez, Ty Marotz). Sophomore left-handers Brett Bordes (1-0, 7.04 ERA) and Erik Averill (2-0, 5.00 ERA) are the lone returnees on Chris Sinacori's staff that led the Pac-10 with a 3.32 ERA in 2003. ASU is second in the Pac-10 with a 3.78 ERA.

NCAA Record Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Ends at 506:

The Sun Devils had a piece of history come to an end when their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak came to an end Feb. 15 against Oklahoma. The Sooners ended a streak that began April 8, 1995, a day after the USC Trojans shut out the Sun Devils during Pat Murphy's first year at ASU. "The Streak" saw the Devils go 338-167-1 during the 506-game stretch, scoring 4,755 runs (9.40 per game average) from 1995-2004. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game, breaking the 12-year-old NCAA record exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that



game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field by left-hander Randy Flores. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in four games dating back to the 1990 season. Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Mark Prior (USC), Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State). Top prospect David Purcey and Jarod McAuliff led the Sooner to the shutout of the Devils. ASU has started a new streak and is currently at 22 games!

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA Baseball National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 8 as a supplier to the National Team. With the selections of Jeff Larish and Dustin Pedroia to the 2003 team, ASU has now had nine players and 10 total selections don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984. ASU has also had at least one player on Team USA in five of the last six years. Pedroia and Larish helped Team USA to a silver medal in the 2003 Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

Sustained Excellence:

In a recent ranking provided by Boydsworld.com, the website dedicated to college baseball rankings and RPI, the Arizona State Baseball program ranked No. 9 in the nation for sustained excellence over the past three and five years. The ranking is a direct reflection of the strength of the recently departed recruiting class (the three-year ranking) or the strength of the program in general (the five-year ranking). The rankings are the result of a system of calculations designed to properly weight a team's winning percentage and strength of schedule, while taking interregional play into account. Over the last three years, ASU has combined to go 128-55 with a strength of schedule ranked 17th. Over the past five years, Murphy's squads have combined for an impressive 211-91 (.699) record and a strength of schedule listed as No. 24. The Sun Devils have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last seven years and have finished in the top 12 in the nation in four of those seven years.

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past five years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as First-Team Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation since 1995. Tuffy Gosewisch, Bryce Kartler and Nick Walsh all earned All-Pac-10 Academic Honorable Mention honors in 2003.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 74-46 record in league play. Even more impressive is that in four of the five years a Sun Devil has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. Dustin Pedroia shared the Pac-10 Player of the Year award with Stanford senior catcher Ryan Garko. In all, ASU has won 10 Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Dustin Pedroia, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Peery and Marc Barcelo).

Kings of the Draft:

Over the course of the last 10 years, no college baseball team even comes close to Arizona State for producing players for the annual major league draft. ASU has had 81 total players drafted dating back to 1994, including a modern record of 12 last year. Since the inception of the draft in 1965, ASU also leads all schools with 324 total draft picks and a record 21 first-round picks.
