No. 14 Arizona State Sun Devils Bring Four-Game Win Streak Into Crucial Pac-10 Series Against Oregon State Beavers



What's On Tap:

The Sun Devil Baseball team (32-13, 7-8 Pac-10) plays at Packard Stadium for the final time during the 2004 regular season by hosting Oregon State (27-15, 7-8 Pac-10) to a crucial three-game Pac-10 series this weekend. OSU and ASU, along with USC and Arizona, are all tied for fourth in the league race. ASU has won four straight games and nine of its last 11 overall. The Devils have also won four of their last six conference games after starting the season with three straight Pac-10 series losses. Following the series with the Beavers, ASU will play its final eight games of the regular season on the road. The Devils will play New Mexico (May 18), New Mexico State (May 19), Arizona (May 21-23) and league-leading Stanford (May 28-30).

So Long Packard Stadium:

The Devils will complete the home portion of the 2004 regular season this weekend with a three-game series against the Oregon State Beavers. ASU is 22-9 this season at Packard Stadium and will look to improve upon the 3-6 home record in Pac-10 contests. After playing 29 of the first 35 games of the year at home, ASU is ending the season playing 16 of its last 21 games on the road.

Quick Hits:

Of ASU's 45 games this season, 27 have been played against teams that have been ranked or are currently ranked.
Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia has hits in 38 of ASU's 45 games and leads the Pac-10 hitting .412 with 22 2B.
The Devils have used 40 different starting batting lineups and 30 different positional lineups this season.
Josh Asanovich is second on the team hitting .367 and is 12-for-21 (.571) in his last seven games.
Jason Urquidez is tied for the league lead with nine wins (9-2) and is also third with a 3.15 ERA.
The Devils have been ranked in 93 consecutive national polls dating back to the start of the 2000 season.
Freshman closer Zechry Zinicola has two wins and three saves in his last nine outings (1.13 ERA, 17 K).
ASU is 25-10 all-time against Oregon State and has won seven of the last eight games against the Beavers.
10th year head coach Pat Murphy needs eight (8) more wins to record his 400th as a Sun Devil.
Jeff Mousser has won his last four starts to improve to 5-3 and is fifth in the Pac-10 with a 3.44 ERA.
Jeff Larish has a current 11-game hitting streak (.388, 19-for-49) to raise his season average to .302.
Travis Buck is hitting .343 with eight home runs and was invited to the USA Baseball National Team Trials. ASU holds the No. 3 projected RPI in the nation (www.BoydsWorld.com) and is 13-3 against top 25 teams.

Pedroia For National Player of the Year:

Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia is a leading candidate for Pac-10, National Player of the Year honors and the prestigious Golden Spikes Award. Through 45 games, Pedroia leads Pac-10 and is 23rd in the NCAA hitting .412 (78-for-187) with 60 runs scored, 22 doubles, eight home runs and 41 RBI. He has hits in 38 of ASU's 45 games, including 23 multi-hit affairs and four games with two or more doubles. Pedroia also leads the Pac-10 in runs scored (60), hits (77), doubles (22), on-base percentage (.511) and is third with a .658 slugging percentage. As a sophomore, Pedroia hit .404 (120-for-297) and was named the Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year. He led the NCAA with 34 doubles, setting the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record and tied for third all-time in the NCAA record books. With 22 doubles this season, Pedroia now has 69 in his career, ranking fourth in the ASU career record books. He also has recorded 279 hits to rank fifth and his career .388 batting average (279-for-720) ranks tied for sixth in the ASU record books. He has played and started all 171 games of his Sun Devil career and has recorded at least one hit in 145 games (85%). He has also recorded 91 career multi-hit games and is a .391 career hitter in 63 Pac-10 games (109-for-279). He was a two-year starter for the USA Baseball National Team and was named to the all-tournament team in the 2003 Pan American Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. Here is a look at Pedroia's season/career highlights and statistics:

- Hitting .412 overall (77-for-187) with 22 doubles, eight home runs, 41 RBI and a .511 on-base percentage.
- Leads the Pac-10 in several categories, including hitting (.412), runs (60), hits (77), doubles (22) and is second in assists (146). Has hits in 38 of 45 games this season and leads the team with 30 extra base hits.
- Has a pair of 10-game hitting streaks this season and seven career streaks of 10 or more games.
- Tied for the team lead with eight home runs and has 13 in his career. Entered the season with only five career homers. Has recorded 23 multi-hit games this season and 91 in his career. He has eight three-hit games and four, four-hit contests this season.
- Rated as the No. 28 overall position player by Baseball America for the 2004 MLB Draft. A career .388 (279-for-720) hitter to rank fifth in hits (279) and tied for sixth in batting average in the ASU record books.
- Has recorded at least one hit in 145 of 171 career games (85%) and has started every game of his career. Has hit 69 career doubles, ranking fourth in the ASU career record books. He needs two more doubles to rank third.
- Set the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 34 doubles in 2003. Old ASU record was 30 by Chris Bando in 1978. Named the 2003 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year with Stanford's Ryan Garko and was a first-team All-American.
 - Played for the USA Baseball National Team in 2002 and 2003, leading Team USA to a bronze medal in the Pan Am Games. Named the 2003 Defensive Player of the Year, he has a career .973 fielding percentage with only 20 errors in 754 total chances. Played for the USA Baseball National Team in 2002 and 2003, leading Team USA to a bronze medal in the Pan Am Games.

Pedroia Times Two:

Junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia is a doubles machine. Through ASU's first 45 games, Pedroia has 22 doubles to lead the Pac-10 and ranks fourth in the nation (0.49 doubles per game). Pedroia set an ASU and Pac-10 record while leading the NCAA with 34 doubles in 2003. Pedroia ranks fourth in school history with 69 career doubles.

Pedroia Inching Towards 300:

With 279 career hits, junior shortstop Dustin Pedroia ranks fifth in school history and is only 21 hits short of the 300 mark. With 21 more hits, he will become only the fourth Sun Devil to reach 300 hits in a career and the first to do so in three ore less seasons. Pedroia is also ninth in the ASU record books with 720 career at-bats and has never missed a game in his Sun Devil career (171 games). The all-time school record is 322 set by Clay Westlake from 1973-76.

Pole Position:

Coming off a two-game sweep of New Mexico State and winners of nine of the last 11 games, Arizona State remains a consensus top 20 team. The Devils are ranked No. 14 in the ESPN/Sports Weekly Coaches poll, No. 17 by *Collegiate Baseball* and No. 19 by *Baseball America*. Ranked in the coaches poll every week this season, ASU has extended a streak of 93 consecutive weeks in the national rankings dating back to the start of the 2000 season. ASU entered the 2004 season ranked in all four of the national preseason polls (#7 CB, #10 SW, #11 NCBWA, #18 BA). ASU finished the 2003 season with a 54-14 record and earned a consensus top 10 ranking in all four national polls.

Buck Providing Power and Production:

Sophomore right fielder Travis Buck leads ASU in two of the three Triple Crown categories with eight home runs and 49 RBI. He is also third in the Pac-10 in RBI and leads the conference with 37 walks. He is also amongst the league leaders in runs scored (47, 9th), doubles (12, 10th) and on-base percentage (.475, 7th). Buck is hitting .343 (58-for-169) with 15 multi-hit games and leads the Devils with 13 multi-RBI contests. He also leads the team with five outfield assists and is 8-for-10 stealing bases. He was named Pac-10 Player of the Week and the Collegiate Baseball/Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week after going 10-for-12 (.833) with 13 RBI in the three-game series against UConn (2/27-29). Buck currently has a career-high eight game hitting streak and is a career .333 (136-for-408) hitter with 12 home runs, 106 runs scored and 95 RBI.

Buck Repeats As Pac-10 Player of the Week:

After going 5-for-10 with home runs in all three games against East Carolina, Travis Buck earned his second consecutive Pac-10 Player of the Week award. With his third career Pac-10 POW award, he became the 16th conference player to repeat and first since 1998 when Cal's Xavier Nady earned the award in consecutive weeks in 1998 (Apr. 27, May 4). He is the first Sun Devil since Oddibe McDowell in 1984 to earn back-to-back conference honors.

Buck Invited to USA Baseball National Team Trials:

Travis Buck has been invited to the USA Baseball National Team Trials for the second straight year. The sophomore outfielder was one of the first 19 players invited to attend the tryouts in Durham, N.C., in mid June. ASU ranks eighth for producing players to USA Baseball and has had at least one player on Team USA in five of the last six years. Juniors Dustin Pedroia and Jeff Larish helped the 2003 Team USA squad to a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

A Triple Play For The Ages:

Leading 10-1 in the seventh inning in the series opener at UCLA (4/16), the Sun Devils completed a baseball oddity when they turned the first triple play in recorded school history. With no outs and runners on second and third, Bruin catcher Chris Denove hit what appeared to be a three-run home run over the right field fence. But, ASU sophomore outfielder Travis Buck leaped over the fence and pulled the ball back into play to record the out. He then relayed the ball to the infield where Dustin Pedroia and Seth Dhaenens recorded outs to complete the triple play. Instead of three runs, it was three outs.

Flashing The Leather:

The Sun Devils have won nine of their last 11 games and much of it is because of solid defense. While ranking fifth in the Pac-10 with a .971 fielding percentage, ASU also ranks 30th in the NCAA (out of 285 schools). ASU has played error-free ball this year in 14 games and has made only nine errors in the last 11 games (.979 FLD%).

Asanovich Heating Up:

Junior infielder Josh Asanovich has raised his batting average 111 points from .256 (3/17) to its current mark of .367 by going 26-for-59 (.441) in his last 21 games. Asanovich has three home runs and 27 RBI while seeing action in 36 games (28 starts). He is riding a current five-game hitting streak in which he is hitting .667 (10-for-15). Over his last 11 games, Asanovich is 14-for-30 (.467) with 15 runs scored and 12 RBI.

Urquidez Dominating On The Mound:

Junior right-handed pitcher Jason Urquidez is tied for the Pac-10 lead with eight wins, ranking 12th in the NCAA. The junior college transfer from Central Arizona College is 9-2 with a team-leading 3.15 ERA in 15 games this season. In addition to leading the league in wins, he is also third in ERA (3.15), eighth in strikeouts (68) and sixth in opponents batting average (.246). ASU HEAD COACH

Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same time establishing

himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in four of the past seven seasons, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy has combined to go 392-191-1 in his 10 seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 28-20 record in NCAA Tournament action. He has a career 765-362-4 record in 19 seasons as a head coach. Murphy recorded his 700th victory at the Division I level on April 2, 2004 in a 10-3 win over USC. In 17 seasons split between Notre Dame and ASU, Murphy has averaged over 40 wins per season. ASU has been ranked in 93 straight national polls under Murphy. ASU also set an NCAA record scoring in 506 straight games.

Devils No. 3 in Projected RPI:

In the May 9 release of the projected RPI on www.Boydsworld.com, Arizona State moved up to No. 3 in the nation behind Miami, Fla. (36-9) and Texas (46-8). The Devils have been ranked as high as No. 1 (3/15) and moved up three spots from No. 6 after going 2-0 last week. The NCAA uses the rating system to help determine selections and seedings for postseason play. Boyd Nation has come up with an RPI index that has proven to be an accurate depiction of the same RPI the NCAA uses. The Devils are 32-13 this season and has played arguably the toughest schedule in the nation. ASU has 14 of the top 50 teams in this week's RPI ratings on the 2004 slate. Urguidez Named To Clemens Award Watch List:

Arizona State starting pitcher Jason Urquidez is part of a list of 40 hurlers who are included in the first Roger Clemens Award Watch List. The list is comprised of all Division I pitchers who were named as preseason All-Americans by either Baseball America or Collegiate Baseball, in addition to those pitchers who have been honored so far this season as National Pitchers of the Week. Urquidez earned national POW honors from Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA, Sports Weekly and CollegeBaseballInsider.com. He was also named the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game three-hitter against No. 1 and defending national champion Rice Owls at Reckling Park in Houston. A junior college transfer from Central Arizona College, Urquidez leads the Pac-10 with an 9-2 record and paces the ASU pitching staff with a 3.15 ERA. He has recorded 68 strikeouts in 74.1 IP and opposing hitters are batting only .246 off him. In its inaugural year, The Roger Clemens Award will be presented to the nation's top college pitcher at the conclusion of a gala dinner in Houston on July 15.

Bounce Back Wins:

The Sun Devils have done a nice job of bouncing back from a loss, going 10-3 this season after suffering a loss. The trend goes back to last season when ASU was 11-2 following a loss. Dating back to the start of the 2003 season, ASU has played 106 games and compiled a stellar 80-26 (.755) record. During that span of games, the Devils are 22-5 following a loss, including gaining an opening-day victory after losing to Cal State Fullerton last season in the NCAA Super Regionals.

Walsh Making Most Of Senior Season:

Senior second baseman Nick Walsh is making the most of his fifth year in the Arizona State baseball program. After redshirting in 2000, Walsh has been an occasional starter during his career for the Sun Devils. He finished the 2003 season on a strong note earning 22 of his 26 starts after the midpoint of the season. Walsh hit .353 (42-for-119) with seven doubles and 23 RB in 2003. Like his previous three seasons, Walsh has found his way into the starting lineup with a clutch bat. Over his last 15 games he is hitting .404 (23-for-57) with 15 runs, nine RBI and five stolen bases. For the season, Walsh is fifth on the team batting .342 (38-for-111) with six doubles and 20 RBI. Starting with a 10-for-14 Home (.714) performance in the three-game series against USC (April 2-4), Walsh has raised his season average 64 points from .278 to its current mark of .342. Undefeated... No Problem:

ASU has played arguably the toughest schedule in the nation and heads into the Oregon State series with the No. 3 projected RPI (Boydsworld.com) in the nation. Additonally, ASU has gone 13-3 against ranked opponents (top 25 at time playing) this season and has a 27-9 record against teams with a winning record. ASU has faced a number of top pitchers during the season and handed most their first ... and sometimes only ... loss of the season. It started by beating Tulane's J.R. Crowel (3-0), then Cory Hahn (3-0), then Oklahoma State's Daniel Rew (3-0) and Spencer Grogan (4-0). ASU lost to Washington's Tim Lincecum (2-0), but bounced back to hand USC's undefeated freshman Ian Kennedy (previously 4-0) his first loss of the season. ASU also Baseball History ended the 17-game win streak of Rice ace Jeff Niemann and handed Wichita State's Mike Pelfrev his first loss after going 6-0 before running into ASU. Junior left fielder Jeff Larish is in the midst of a season-high 11-game hitting streak. Dustin Pedroia has had a pair of 10-game hitting streaks this season and seven in his career. Tough Against Ranked Teams:

The Sun Devils are off to a 24-11 start and boast an even more impressive 13-3 record against ranked opponents (top 25 at time played). ASU played 22 non-conference games before beginning the conference slate and compiled a 19-3 record. Through 45 games, the Devils have played 27 games against teams that are either currently ranked or have been ranked at one point in 2004. The Sun Devils swept No. 18 Florida State (Feb. 6-8) to open the season and also beat No. 1 Rice (3-1, Feb. 22), No. 16 Arizona (4-0, Feb. 26), swept No. 18 ECU (Mar. 5-7), took two of three from No. 11 Tulane and then went on the road to beat No. 7 Wichita State in two straight games. Nine of ASU's 13 losses have also come against teams that have appeared in at least one of the four top 25 polls this season.

Tuff Behind the Plate:

Junior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch is the epitome of his name behind the dish... tough. In his second year as a full-time starter, Gosewisch has taken ASU's young pitching staff by the reins to help lead the Devils to a 32-13 record and the second-best ERA in the Pac-10 (4.48). Additionally, he has been solid at the plate, hitting .355 (54-for-153) with 31 runs, 12 doubles, two home runs and 38 RBI. He currently has a fivegame hitting streak (.438, 7-for-16) and over his last 14 games is hitting .435 (20-for-46). He has recorded at least one hit in 34 of ASU's 45 games and is second on the team with 17 multi-hit games. The Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year candidate has thrown out 14 attempted base stealers and has a .983 FLD%.

Larish Finds His Groove At The Plate:

Junior All-American outfielder Jeff Larish struggled early in the season to find consistency at the plate, but is starting to heat up. Larish is in the midst of a current 11-game hitting streak (.388, 19-for-49) to raise his season batting average over .300 for the first time this year. The junior outfielder is hitting .302 (54-for-179) with 16 doubles, three home runs and 37 RBI. As a sophomore he hit .372 (87-for-234) with 18 home runs and 95 RBI. Making 36 starts in left field this season, Larish is at his third position as a Sun Devil in as many years (3B in 2002, 1B in 2003). Last season, Larish became only the second Sun Devil to join the 70-70 club (RBI-BB) when he had 95 RBI (fifth most in ASU history) and led the NCAA with 78 walks. The Tempe native is a career .338 (183-for-541) hitter with 156 RBI and 134 walks (.467 on-base percentage and 1027 OPS). The 2004 preseason All-American is listed as the No. 10 prospect for the annual June Amateur Draft by Baseball America.

Freshman Zechry Zinicola is becoming regular contributor for the Sun Devils, whether as a starting pitcher, designated hitter or even at first base. Zinicola (San Bernadino, Calif.) has made 18 pitching appearances (4 starts) and is 4-2 with four saves and is third on the team with a 3.61 ERA. Moving back into the closer role after making four starts, Zinicola has been dominant in his last nine outings, going 2-1 with three saves and a 1.13 ERA while striking out 17 batters. At the plate, Zinicola has made 14 starts at designated hitter and two at first base. He has recorded at least one hit in 14 of 20 games played and has four multi-hit games. He is hitting .281 (18-for-64) with two home runs and 19 RBI. Zinicola had a hand in ASU's 4-3 win over UCLA (4/17) in both roles, picking up the win on the mound with 1.1 perfect innings and drove home the game-winning run with a sacrifice fly in the top of the ninth inning. He is ASU's first full-time two-way player since Richy Leon (1995-98). Leon was a career .298 hitter as an outfielder and was 8-3 with a 4.67 ERA in 48 pitching appearances.

Lineup Changes:

Through 45 games of the 2004 season, ASU skipper Pat Murphy has authored 40 different batting lineups and 30 different positional lineups. The 2003 squad featured 57 different batting lineups during the 68-game season. The pitching rotation this weekend of Jeff Mousser, Jason Urquidez and Brett Bordes is one of five different three-man rotations featured this season.

Marotz Likes Them Loaded:

Junior right-handed pitcher Ty Marotz has seen more action in recent games due his clutch pitching performances. In his last three relief outings, Marotz has come into the game with the bases loaded and did not relinquish a run in each game. For the season, the Mesa CC transfer is 0-0 with a 4.76 ERA in 17.0 innings. He has inherited 19 runners this season and allowed only three to score. He leads ASU with a 3.60 ERA out of the bullpen.

Bresnehan Inching Towards Freshman Saves Record:

Only 45 games into his ASU career, freshman relief pitcher Pat Bresnehan is on the fast track to break the ASU freshman record for saves in a season. Bresnehan has five saves to rank tied for third in the Pac-10 and rank third in the freshman annals. He trails only Mitch Dean (8 in 1976) and Ryan Bradley (6 in 1995). The hard-throwing right-hander, who will likely pitch in middle relief this weekend, is 3-2 with five saves and a 5.26 ERA in 37.2 innings this season. He has struggled in the second half of the season, giving up 23 of his 29 runs on the season in his last 11 outings to raise his season ERA from 1.25 to 5.26.

Preseason All-Americans:

Sun Devil juniors Dustin Pedroia and Jeff Larish earned preseason All-America honors from every publication. Pedroia earned first-team honors from the NCBWA, Collegiate Baseball, CollegeBaseballInsider.com, and was a third-team pick by Baseball America. He was also selected as the preseason pick for Pac-10 Player of the Year by Baseball America. Larish, who moves to the outfield for the 2004 season, was a first-team pick by Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, CollegeBaseballInsider.com, and was a second-team pick by the NCBWA. Larish was also selected as the preseason College Baseball Player of the Year by Street & Smith's.

Dominating Arizona:

With the 9-5 non-conference victory over Arizona (4/12), the Sun Devils have now won five straight games against their rivals to the south. Dating back to the 2000 season, the Devils have won 14 of the last 17 games. Since head coach Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995, the Devils have gone 32-15 and never lost a season series to the Wildcats. ASU and Arizona will face off in a key threegame Pac-10 series in Tucson near the end of the season (May 21-23).

On The Road Again:

Arizona State will play eight of their final 11 games during the 2004 regular season on the road. After hosting Oregon State to complete a mini five-game homestand, the Devils will travel to New Mexico, New Mexico State, Arizona and Stanford for the final eight games of the season. The regular-season ending eight game road trip ties a season high for the Devils, as they recently finished another eight-game road swing by going 6-2 against UCLA, Washington State and Wichita State.

Welcome To College Baseball:

Going into the season, preseason prognosticators tabbed the Sun Devils as a young and inexperienced team. Having lost 12 players to the annual MLB draft and returning only two pitchers from the Pac-10's leading pitching staff (3.32 ERA in 2003), the Devils have had to look to several newcomers to become impact players. Through ASU's first 45 games, 14 newcomers and three redshirts have seen action. ASU had as many as four freshman in the starting lineup this year.

Young Guns:

Of the 11 pitchers that have seen action on the mound this season, nine are wearing a Sun Devil uniform for the first time. Six of the nine are freshmen (Josh Blake, Quentin Andes, Pat Cassa, Pat Bresnehan, Travis Webb, Zechry Zinicola), with three others transfers (Jeff Mousser, Jason Urquidez, Ty Marotz). Sophomore left-handers Brett Bordes (2-0, 6.75 ERA) and Erik Averill (3-2, 5.12 ERA) are the lone returnees on Chris Sinacori's staff that led the Pac-10 with a 3.32 ERA in 2003. ASU is currently second in the Pac-10 with a 4.48 ERA.

A Tale of Two Sundays:

From one Sunday to another, the Arizona State baseball program was the buzz of the college baseball world. On Sunday, Feb. 15, the Devils saw their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak come to an end in a 6-0 shutout by the University of Oklahoma at Surprise Stadium in Surprise, Ariz. The streak spanned parts of nine seasons dating back to April 7, 1995 and blew away the old record of 349 set by Coastal Carolina. Just one week later, on Feb. 22, the Devils stunned No. 1 Rice in a 3-1 victory at Reckling Park, ending an 18-game winning streak by ace pitcher Jeff Niemann. Niemann, regarded as the top-pitching prospect in the nation, had not lost a decision dating back to the end of the 2002 season, including a 17-0 record as a sophomore. ASU pitcher Jason Urquidez was named the National Pitcher of the Week for his complete-game, three-hit victory over the defending national champion Owls.

Throwbacks Are Classic:

The Sun Devils unveiled a new 'Throwback' uniform for the 2004 season and it has gotten rave reviews. Originally slated to be the designated Sunday uniform, the Devils have worn the classic threads in 29 of the 45 games this season and gone 21-8. The off-white uniform features a baggier look and an oldschool 'Devils' script across the chest. The Devils wear black spikes and high socks to compliment the 'old school' look. ASU is also 5-2 in the all white uniforms (worn with white spikes), 5-2 in the road gray sleeveless jersey and 1-1 in the maroon BP uniform.

Pedroia and Urquidez Sweep Pac-10 Awards:

Arizona State juniors Dustin Pedroia and Jason Urquidez swept the weekly Pac-10 Baseball Awards (Feb. 24) after helping the No. 7 Sun Devils to a 3-1 record with wins over Gonzaga, Memphis and Rice. Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) earned his second Pac-10 Player of the Week award in his career after hitting .688 (11-for-16) with six runs, three doubles, one home run and five RBI. He had three doubles in a 4-for-5 performance against Gonzaga (2/16) and hit his first home run of the year to lead off the game against Lamar (2/20). Urquidez (Simi Valley, Calif.) swept the national awards, also earning Collegiate Baseball, Sports Weekly and College Baseball Insider National Pitcher of the Week honors with his victory over No. 1 and defending national champion Rice. He struck out seven and walked only two in a complete-game, three-hit victory over the Owls. The Player of the Week honor was the second for Pedroia in his career and Urquidez earned his first Pac-10 weekly award in only his third start as a Sun Devil.

Urquidez Tames No. 1 Rice To Earn Pitcher of the Week Honors:

Junior starting pitcher Jason Urquidez was named the Collegiate Baseball National Pitcher of the Week after his complete-game three-hitter against No. 1 and defending national champion Rice on Sunday. Urquidez, a junior college transfer from Central Arizona, limited the top-ranked Owls to only one run on three hits, while striking out seven and walking only one. He gave up his only run in his 138-pitch effort with a two-out single in the bottom of the ninth inning. With his third victory of the year, Urquidez went head-to-head with and beat the nation's top pitching prospect in Rice ace Jeff Niemann. Niemann recorded his first loss since late in the 2002 season after going 17-0 as a sophomore in 2003.

One Tough Schedule:

The Sun Devils are in the midst of a brutally tough 56-game regular season schedule that has a SoS (strength of schedule) rated No. 12 in the nation (www.Boydsworld.com). ASU is scheduled to play 24 games against teams that were listed on Baseball America's preseason top 25 and another 15 games against teams that were listed in the top 50. The Devils lead all NCAA teams by playing 54% (30 of 56) of their games against teams that avere disted and T1% (40 of 56) against teams that have advanced to the NCAA to the postseason in either of the last two years. ASU finished the 2003 season with a 54-14 record and an overall RPI ranked 12th in the ration. The 2004 schedule features six schools that are picked to finish first in their respective conferences: Stanford (Pac-10), Rice (WAC), Wichita State (Missouri Valley), Oral Roberts (Mid-Continent), Tulane (Conference USA), Lamar (Southland).

A Long Awaited Debut For Urquidez:

Junior starting pitcher Jason Urquidez took a long patch to make his Sun Devil debut against Florida State (2/8)... but what a debut it was. Urquidez, a junior college transfer from Central Arizona College, struck out nine and allowed only one run in five innings to pick up the win and help the Devils to the series sweep. He improved to 3-0 with a complete-game, three-hitter against defending national champion Rice. His effort earned him a clean sweep of the National Pitcher of the Year honors. Urquidez heads into the series with Oregon State with is 9-2 record and a 3.15 ERA. Urquidez, a native of Simi Valley, Calif., first laid eyes on ASU in the summer of 2000 and signed his first NLI with the program in November 2000. A non-qualifier academically, Urquidez ended up at Central Arizona College and played two years under former Sun Devil catcher Clint Myers. Going 19-5 and winning a NJCAA National Championship during his career at CAC, Urquidez made his dream of playing in the Maroon and Gold a reality when arrived on campus last August.

Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last five years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999, 10.97 runs per game in 2000 and finished second averaging 10.03 runs per game in 2003. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark. During the Pat Murphy era (1995-P), the Sun Devils have been a trademark offensive program. During that stretch ASU has averaged 9.15 runs per game and scored in 582 of the 584 contests. NCAA Record Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Ends at 506:

The Sun Devils had a piece of history come to an end when their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak came to an end Feb. 15 against Oklahoma. The Sooners ended a streak that began April 8, 1995, a day after the USC Trojans shut out the Sun Devils during Pat Murphy's first year at ASU. "The Streak" saw the Devils go 338-167-1 during the 506-game stretch, scoring 4,755 runs (9.40 per game average) from 1995-2004. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game, breaking the 12-year-old NCAA record exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that



game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field by left-hander Randy Flores. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in four games dating back to the 1990 season. Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Mark Prior (USC), Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State). Top prospect David Purcey and Jarod McAuliff led the Sooner to the shutout of the Devils. ASU has started a new streak and is currently at 39 games!

ASU has also had at least one player on Team USA in five of the last six years. Pedroia and Larish helped Team USA to a silver medal in the 2003 Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

Sustained Excellence:

In a recent ranking provided by Boydsworld.com, the website dedicated to college baseball rankings and RPI, the Arizona State Baseball program ranked No. 9 in the nation for sustained excellence over the past three and five years. The ranking is a direct reflection of the strength of the recently departed recruiting class (the three-year ranking) or the strength of the program in general (the five-year ranking). The rankings are the result of a system of calculations designed to properly weight a team's winning percentage and strength of schedule, while taking interregional play into account. Over the last three years, ASU has combined to go 128-55 with a strength of schedule ranked 17th. Over the past five years, Murphy's squads have combined for an impressive 211-91 (.699) record and a strength of schedule listed as No. 24. The Sun Devils have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last seven years and have finished in the top 12 in the nation in four of those seven years.

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past five years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as First-Team Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation since 1995. Tuffy Gosewisch, Bryce Kartler and Nick Walsh all earned All-Pac-10 Academic Honorable Mention honors in 2003.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 74-46 record in league play. Even more impressive is that in four of the five years a Sun Devil has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. Dustin Pedroia shared the Pac-10 Player of the Year award with Stanford senior catcher Ryan Garko. In all, ASU has won 10 Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Dustin Pedroia, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Peery and Marc Barcelo).

Kings of the Draft:

Over the course of the last 10 years, no college baseball team even comes close to Arizona State for producing players for the annual major league draft. ASU has had 81 total players drafted dating back to 1994, including a modern record of 12 last year. Since the inception of the draft in 1965, ASU also leads all schools with 324 total draft picks and a record 21 first-round picks.
