The Sun Devils are receiving votes in both the ESPN/Sports Weekly Coaches poll and also in the NCBWA rankings... USC (13-6) is ranked No. 21 by ESPN/Sports Weekly and No. 23 by Baseball America... ASU has played 14 of its 28 games this season against teams that have appeared in the national rankings at some point this season.

FUN FACTS

Junior Travis Buck has recorded at least one hit in 12 of his last 13 games and has 10 multi-hit games during that stretch of games... senior Jeff Larish ranks second in the NCAA and first in the Pac-10 with 10 home runs... the Sun Devils have won 10 of their last 13 games, including going 8-2 in the month of March... junior LHP Erik Averill has three complete games and leads the Pac-10 with 52.1 IP... the three games at USC will mark a string of 18 of the last 24 games the Sun Devils will play on the road... ASU head coach Pat Murphy needs 10 more wins to reach 800.

What's On Tap:

The Sun Devils (16-12, 0-0 Pac-10) take back to the road this weekend with a three-game series against USC (13-6, 0-0 Pac-10) to open the 2005 Pac-10 slate. ASU is coming off a weekend sweep of the Oklahoma Sooners and head into the conference opener having won 10 of its last 13 games. The Sun Devils and Trojans will play an unconventional Thursday-Saturday series to accommodate the Easter weekend. The Devils were predicted to finish third in the conference standings by the Pac-10 coaches and by Baseball America, and second by Collegiate Baseball. USC leads the all-time series against ASU 90-82 and has won four of the six conference series since the Pac-10 joined the North and South divisions in 1999. Following the series at USC, ASU will return home for its final non-conference series of the year against Wright State (Apr. 1-3).

Ouick Hits:

ASU set a school record with 35 hits in the 30-13 win over Western Illinois (3/13). Travis Buck went 6-for-8. 11 of ASU's 12 losses this season have come against teams that have appeared in the national rankings. The Sun Devils are scheduled to face their eighth preseason All-American pitcher this weekend in Ian Kennedy. ASU has played half of its schedule (14 of 28) against ranked teams and have No. 23/21 USC on tap this weekend. ASU has been road warriors this season playing 18 of its first 31 games away from Packard Stadium.

- 16 Sun Devils, including 10 true freshman, have made their debuts in the Maroon and Gold this season.
- 12 players have at least one SB this season and ASU leads the Pac-10 with 51 stolen bases (51-for-69). After 28 games the Sun Devils have 11 triples, surpassing the season total of seven triples in 59 games in 2004.

ASU owns a 229-100-1 record for a .695 winning percentage this decade (2000-P). Of ASU's 56 games this season, 28 will be played against teams that played in the 2004 NCAA Tournament (50%). Senior Jeff Larish ranks second the NCAA with 10 home runs and seventh in ASU history with 38 career homers. Sr. Tuffy Gosewisch is only the second player in ASU history to start three seasons at catcher (Don Wakamatsu). Travis Buck has raised his batting average 125 points (.246-.371) by going 31-for-63 (.492) over his last 13 games. In 28 games this season ASU has used 23 different starting batting lineups and 18 different defensive lineups. Joey Hooft returned to the lineup after sitting out 11 games with a hamstring injury and went 3-for-5 vs. Oklahoma. Senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch has thrown out 13 of 32 attempted base stealers this season (41%). Freshman reserve catcher Austin Stockfisch has hits in four straight at-bats and is hitting .800 (4-for-5). Jeff Larish recorded six walks last weekend and has 19 this year and 161 in his career. Four of the walks were IBB. Colin Curtis has ASU's longest active hitting streak at seven games. Overall he is hitting .342 with 20 RBI. Travis Buck was teammates on the USA Baseball National Team with USC's Jeff Clement and Ian Kennedy.

Recapping Last Weekend:

The Sun Devils head into conference play coming off a series sweep of the University of Oklahoma Sooners last weekend. ASU won Friday's opener 5-4 on a walk-off solo home run from senior Jeff Larish and clinched the series with a 5-1 victory on Saturday behind a complete-game five hitter from junior left-hander Erik Averill. A SU clinched the series sweep with a 6-5 come-from-behind victory on Sunday. Travis Buck went 3-for-3 with three runs scored and hit his second home run of the season to help ASU to its first non-conference series sweep in over a year. With the game tied 3-3 in the bottom of the seventh inning, senior second baseman Joey Hooft hit a three-run double that stood up as the gamewinning hit. Senior Jason Urquidez notched his first career save with two scoreless innings. Buck led the Devils at the plate going 7-for-13 (.538) with five runs scored and Hooft returned from his hamstring injury to go 3-for-5 (.600) with

A Good Omen:

Batting

Through the halfway point of the 2005 season the Sun Devils are 16-12. The last time ASU was 16-12 after 28 games was in 1998 when the Sun Devils last advanced to the College World Series and played for the National Championship. In both 1998 and earlier this season, ASU tied a school record earlier this season by losing six straight games. After enduring the six-game losing streak in 1998, ASU finished up strong winning 18 of its last 27 regular season games that season to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

four RBL Senior Jeff Larish started all three games in left field and hit .500 (4-for-8) with a home run and recorded six walks. The pitching staff combined for a 3.00 ERA in the series with Averill leading the way with his third complete

Will be making his sixth start of the season on the mound Thursday vs. USC... is 2-2 with one save and a 5.70 ERA in nine pitching appearances this season... is 0-2 with 5.55 ERA and 21 strikeouts in 24.1 IP in five starts this season... in his last start he was perfect through the first three innings, then allowed four runs on four walks, three hit-by-pitches and two wild pitches over his final two innings while taking the no-decision ... has lasted five or more innings in three of his five starts ... opened the year and spent all last season as ASU's closer ... named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List... tied the ASU freshman record with eight saves last season after going 6-4 with a 4.17 ERA... is 6-4 with nine saves and a 4.17 ERA in 34 career pitching appearances.

Friday - Erik Averill, LHP (Orange, Calif.)

Will be making his Pac-10 leading ninth start of the season Friday against USC... leads the ASU pitching staff going 5-2 with a 2.75 ERA and has recorded 47 strikeouts and only 10 walks in 52.1 IP this season... ranks eighth in the Pac-10 in ERA (2.75) and fifth in strikeouts (47)... coming off his best start of the season in which he recorded his third complete game of the year ... limited Oklahoma to only five singles and one unearned run, while striking out seven... has lasted five or more innings in seven straight starts... earned National Pitcher of the Week honors after striking out career-high 14 batters in complete-game shutout over New Mexico State (2/4)... is 17-8 with a 3.98 ERA in 54 career pitching appearances (27 starts)... owns a career 3-3 record and 5.67 ERA in 18 games in Pac-10 play... has made three pitching appearances vs. USC, going 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA.

Saturday - Pat Bresnehan, RHP (Sherborn, Mass.)

Scheduled to make his first career Pac-10 start this weekend and his sixth start of 2005... is 1-2 with a 4.91 ERA with 30 strikeouts in 29.1 innings... ranks sixth in the Pac-10 with 16 strikeouts looking... in five starts this season is 1-2 with a 7.16 ERA... in his last start against Oklahoma (3/20) he gave up two hits and three runs in 3.0 innings... is 4-4 with five saves and a 4.84 ERA in 34 career pitching appearances (6 GS).

Krawczyk Returns To USC:

The Pac-10 opening series against USC marks a homecoming of sorts for first-year pitching coach Jack Krawczyk. Krawczyk played for years for the Trojans from 1995-98 and is the NCAA single-season and career saves leader. He is widely considered the top relief pitcher in college baseball history after recording 49 saves during his career. He also holds the USC, Pac-10 and NCAA single-season record with 23 saves set during the Trojans 1998 National Championship season. Overall, Krawczyk was 13-8 with a 3.35 ERA in 114 career pitching appearances and was a first-team All-American and All-College World Series selection in 1998. Following his illustrious career at USC, Krawczyk went on to play six professional seasons with three different organizations (Arizona Diamondbacks, Oakland A's, Milwaukee Brewers) and was 30-18 with 28 saves during his minor league career.

Welcome Home:

The trip to Southern California this weekend marks a return home for seven of 31 players on this year's roster. Five of the players (Erik Averill - Orange, Jason Urquidez - Simi Valley, Zechry Zinicola - San Bernadino, Andrew Romine - Lake Forest, Joe Persichina - Rolling Hills Estates) all hail from southern California, while Jeff Landry (Walnut Creek) and DJ Butler (Benicia) are from northern California.

ASU in Pac-10 Openers:

The Sun Devils begin their 27th season in the Conference of Champions with a three-game series this weekend against rival USC. ASU owns an all-time 427-314 (.576) record in Pac-10 play and has won six conference championships (last in 2000). Since the Pac-10 North and Pac-10 South joined in 1999, ASU is 87-57 (.604) in league play and 268-121-1 overall. ASU has lost the last two Pac-10 opening series (both at home) and in 10 seasons under head coach Pat Murphy the Sun Devils have won five of the conference opening series. The Devils last opened league play against USC in 1997, losing two of three to the No. 3 Trojans in what remains the earliest league series in school history (Jan. 31-Feb. 2, 1997).

Larish Leads Pac-10, Second In NCAA in Home Runs:

Senior Jeff Larish hit his Pac-10 leading 10th home run of the season with a walk-off solo homer in the bottom of the ninth inning in ASU's dramatic 5-4 win over Oklahoma last Friday. Larish has hit five home runs in his last six games, including a pair of multi-home run contests in back-to-back games against Western Illinois. He ranks second in the NCAA behind New Mexico State's Mark Aranda. Larish has hit his home runs in bunches this season, with eight of his 10 homers spread across only four days this season. He has three multi-homer games and also hit a home run in each half of a doubleheader against Oklahoma and South Alabama (2/12). Overall, Larish is hitting .324 (36-for-111) with 19 extra base hits. Of his nine home runs this season, he has hit four solo homers, two two-run shots and four three-run bombs. Nine of his 10 homer have also come on the road. Larish Climbs ASU Career Charts:

With his five home runs over the last six games and 10 on the season, senior Jeff Larish now ranks in the top 10 in ASU career history in home runs (38), RBI (197) and walks (161). His 38 home runs are tied for seventh in the record books, only two away from tying Andrew Beinbrink (1996-99) and moving into the career top five. His 197 RBI currently are seventh most in school history and his 161 walks are ranked second. Larish is also nearing the career top 10 for at-bats (710), runs scored (185), hits (238), doubles (47) and total bases (411). Through 28 games, Larish is hitting .324 (36-for-111) and has been especially hot with hits in six of his last seven games, going 13-for-27 (.481) during that stretch of games to raise his batting average from .273 to .324 (51 points). Gosewisch Named To Johnny Bench Award Watch List:

Arizona State senior starting catcher Tuffy Gosewisch has been named to the watch list for the 2005 Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year Award. ASU's three-year starter behind the plate was also named one of 15 semifinalists for the 2004 Bench Award. Gosewisch is in his third year as ASU's everyday starting catcher and has caught all but seven innings of ASU's 28-game schedule so far in 2005. He is only the second three-year starting catcher in Sun Devil baseball history, joining former major leaguer and current Texas Ranger bench coach Don Wakamatsu. The senior backstop has gotten off to a torrid start in 2005 and is among the team leaders in several offensive categories. He is hitting .324 (34-for-105) with five doubles, five home runs and 27 RBI. He has recorded at least one hit in 21 of 28 games and has tabbed nine multi-hit and nine-multi-RBI games this season. As stellar as his offensive production has been, Gosewisch has made the most impact behind the plate. He has a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage on 243 total chances. He has also thrown out 13 of 32 attempted base stealers (41%). Arizona State has a long tradition with the Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year Award, with Casey Myers being selected as a finalist in 2000 and 2001.



ASU HEAD COACH

Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same time establishing

himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in four of the past eight seasons, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy has combined to go 417-208-1 in his 11 seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 29-22 record in NCAA Tournament action. He has a career 790-379-4 record in 21 seasons as a head coach. Murphy recorded his 700th victory at the Division I level on April 2, 2004 in a 10-3 win over USC. In 18 seasons split between Notre Dame and ASU, Murphy has averaged over 40 wins per season. ASU set an NCAA record scoring in 506 consecutive games from 1995-2004 and set the NCAA record with 14 grand slams in 2004.

Series History vs. USC:

The Sun Devils and Trojans have met on the Diamond 172 times dating back to the first meeting on March 30, 1961. USC leads the all-time series 90-82 and has won six of the last 10 and 12 of the last 20 meetings against the Sun Devils. ASU and USC have combined for 17 national championships, with the Sun Devils winning five (last in 1981) and the Trojans winning an NCAA leading 12 (last in 1998). In ASU's last trip to Dedeaux Field in 2003, ASU won the series winning two of the three games. USC won the final two games of last year's series at Packard Stadium to take the series.

Last Time at Dedeaux Field:

ASU hasn't had the best of luck at Dedeaux Field over the years, but earned a series win over the Trojans in its last trip to Los Angeles in 2003. The Sun Devils last played USC on the road March 28-30, 2003 and won the first (11-4) and third (7-5) games to win its first three-game conference series at Dedeaux Field since a three-game sweep in 1993. Then in his freshman season, Travis Buck earned the first of his four Pac-10 Player of the Week awards by going 8-for-11 (.727) with three runs, three RBI and four walks. Carlos Arguello (2 G, 3.1 IP, 2.70 ERA) and Brett Bordes earned wins in the series.

The Trojans enter their Pac-10 opening series with a 13-6 record and winners of four straight and six of their last seven. USC was supposed to play a non-conference game Tuesday against Pepperdine, but was rained out. The Trojans are coming off a successful weekend in which they went 3-0 at the UC Irvine Tournament, including gaining a pair of shutouts over Stony Brook (10-0) and the host Anteaters (5-0). The Trojan pitching staff has combined for a 3.62 team ERA and heads into Thursday's game with a streak of 23 consecutive scoreless innings. Preseason All-American RHP Ian Kennedy leads the pitching staff going 2-1 in five starts and has 40 strikeouts in 30.0 IP. The starting pitching trio of Kennedy, Zack Kalter (2-2, 1.88 ERA) and Brett Bannister (4-1, 3.90 ERA) have combined to go 8-4 with a 3.15 ERA. At the plate the Trojans are hitting .282 (177-for-628) with 38 doubles, five triples, eight home runs and are 11-for-25 stealing bases. Outfielder/DH Cyle Hankerd leads the team and ranks seventh in the Pac-10 hitting .394 (26-for-66) with six doubles and 17 RBI. Preseason All-American junior catcher Jeff Clement is hitting .308 (20-for-65) with four home runs and 18 RBI. In addition to starting the year 13-6, the Trojans are also in line to gain another win after leading nationally ranked Cal State Fullerton 7-2 with one out in the top of the eighth inning in a halted game due to rain (2/20). The game will be completed on April 20, followed by another nine-inning contest against the defending national champion Titans at Goodwin Field in Fullerton, Calif.

Buck Continues Hot Hitting:

Junior Travis Buck continued his torrid streak at the plate hitting .538 (7-for-13) with one double, one triple, one home run and two RBI. The preseason All-American has raised his batting average 125 points from .246 to .371 over the last 13 games while batting .492 (31-for-63) with six doubles, three triples, two home runs and 17 RBI. During that stretch of games he has recorded 10 multi-hit games and has recorded 17 of his 21 RBI on the season. The Wallace Award Player of the Year candidate leads the team in hitting at .371 (46-for-124) with 10 doubles, 21 RBI and eight stolen bases. He also leads the team with 14 multi-hit games and paces the Pac-10 with 46 hits. His name also appears among the league leaders in runs (31, 3rd), doubles (10, 2nd), triples (3, 2nd), total bases (68, 4th) and stolen bases (8, 4th). With his outstanding week at the plate against Baylor (.571, 8-for-14, 6 H, 6 RBI, Buck was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week and was also named to the College Baseball Foundation Honor Roll. The Player of the Week honor was the fourth career award for Buck, while it was the 75th such honor for Arizona State University. He also won the award twice last season (Mar. 2, Mar. 9) and once during his freshman season (Apr. 1).

Buck Prefers Hitting Second:

In his three seasons as a Sun Devil, junior right fielder Travis Buck has enjoyed his most success while hitting in the No. 2 spot in the lineup. In 91 career games in the No. 2 spot in the lineup, Buck is a career .416 (148-for-356) hitter with 113 runs scored, 12 home runs and 90 RBI. While hitting No. 2, Buck has accounted for 72% of his run production (90 of 125 RBI), 73% of his runs scored (113 of 154), 80% of his home runs (12 of 15) and 71% of his total hits (148 of 208). This season Buck is hitting .493 (35-for-71) with 22 runs scored and 17 RBI in 15 games batting in the second spot. He has combined to hit just .208 (11-for-53) this season when batting either leadoff (.118, 2-for-17) or third (.250, 9-for-36). Overall, the preseason All-American is a career .354 hitter (208-for-588) with 154 runs scored, 15 home runs and 125 RBI.

Position Changes for Buck and Larish:

Junior preseason All-American Travis Buck was highly regarded as arguably the best outfielder in the Pac-10 and is listed by several publications as a possibility to be the highest drafted college outfielder in the 2005 MLB Amateur Draft. But, Buck won't be spending much time in the outfield as he has moved to third base. After starting the first 145 games of his ASU career in left or right field, Buck has made six of his last seven starts at the hot corner. The former prep shortstop has also held his own, making only two errors and recorded an ASU single-game high with seven assists against Oklahoma (3/19). Senior Jeff Larish has also shown to be versatile in the field, starting games at three different positions (3B/1B/LF). In the 19-1 win over Western Illinois (3/12), Larish played four different positions -- 1B/SS, LF, CF.

A Tough Slate For The Sun Devils:

After having the top-rated non-conference schedule in the nation last season, the Sun Devil baseball program has set another challenging slate for the 2005 season. ASU's rigorous 2005 schedule includes 23 games against eight teams ranked in the Sports Weekly/ESPN preseason top 25. Seventeen (17) of ASU's first 31 2004 in Review games are against teams ranked that have been ranked in the national polls at some point this season. Here is a look at the games ASU has played against ranked opponents this season:

Hitting Streaks:

Four Sun Devils currently have hitting streaks of two or more games heading into the weekend series against USC. Sophomore Colin Curtis is riding his second seven-game hitting streak of the season. During his current streak he is batting .344 (11-for-32) with seven runs scored, four doubles and five RBI. Travis Buck has his season-high nine-game streak snapped by going 0-for-3 vs. LSU (3/13), but has recorded at least one hit in 14 of his last 16 games and has a current three-game streak (.538, 7-for-13, 5 R, 2 RBI). Welcome To the Show:

A total of 16 players have made their ASU debuts in the first 28 games of the season. Four newcomers were in the starting lineup on opening day, including Joey Hooft (DH), Andrew Romine (SS), J.J. Sferra (CF) and Vinny Biancamano (2B). Freshman LHP Josh Satow made his debut in the Maroon and Gold against Western Illinois, becoming the 10th true freshman have made it into a game this season. ASU has now started six true freshman and two redshirt freshman position players this season. The Sun Devil roster consists of 18 of 30 active players that have never seen action before this season.

Triple Your Pleasure:

After 28 games the Sun Devils have 11 triples to rank second in the Pac-10 and have already surpassed the entire season total of seven from last season. Travis Buck ranks second in the league with three triples, while Rocky Laguna has a pair of triples to rank tied for seventh. J.J. Sferra, Andrew Romine, Jeff Larish, Tuffy Gosewisch, Colin Curtis and Joe Persichina have each recorded a three-bagger during the season. In 59 games last season, ASU had only seven triples, ranking 245th of 285 teams in the NCAA.

Devils Facing Big League Arms:

The Sun Devils will face USC right-handed pitcher Ian Kennedy Thursday night, marking the eighth preseason All-American pitcher ASU will face this season. In addition to Kennedy, who is listed by Baseball America as the No. 5 sophomore in the nation and was a third-team preseason All-America selection, the Sun Devils have already faced Cesar Ramos (Long Beach State), Brian Bogusevic (Tulane), Micah Owings (Tulane), Neil Jamison (Long Beach State), P.J. Walters (South Alabama), Mark McCormick (Baylor) and Andrew Miller (North Carolina). ASU also beat a pair of second-round (Trey Taylor) and third-round (Cory VanAllen) draft picks during the Baylor series.

Team Speed:

The Sun Devils lead the Pac-10 in stolen bases and are 51-for-69 (74%) on the season. At one point early in the season the Sun Devils had a streak of 17 consecutive that ended during the Coca-Cola Classic. ASU has three of the top 10 base stealers in the Pac-10, with Travis Buck and Colin Curtis tying for fourth with eight. Senior Joey Hooft ranks 10th with six stolen bases. Redshirt freshman Rocky Laguna tied the ASU single-game record with four stolen base against New Mexico State (2/7). A total of 12 different Sun Devils have recorded a stolen base and eight players have two or more steals. Buck currently has a string of five straight games with a stolen base. In 2004, ASU had only 56 total stolen bases.

The Luck of the White Shoes:

The Sun Devils have found a small secret to success this season by going 8-2 when wearing white spikes this season. ASU is also 7-1 when wearing their home white "Devils" jersey. The Devils are expected to debut the gray version of their "old school" style jerseys this weekend.

Dominating the Arizona Baseball Rivalry:

Arizona and Arizona State are the only two Division I baseball programs in the state of Arizona and have met 409 times since 1907. While Arizona leads the overall rivalry 222-188, ASU leads the series 165-105 since the school officially adopted the program as a varsity sport in 1959. Additionally, ASU has dominated the rivalry in recent years, winning 16 of the last 22 (16-6) games since 2000. The Sun Devils won four of the five meetings in 2004 and seven of the last 10 overall. Since head coach Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995, ASU is 34-18 (.654) and has never lost a season series to the Wildcats. ASU is 0-2 against Arizona in a pair of non-conference games this season and is schedule to face the Wildcats again in a three-game Pac-10 series May 14-16 in Tempe.

Averill Earns National Pitcher of the Week Honors:

Arizona State junior left-handed pitcher Erik Averill is off to a fast start to the 2005 season and has been named to the watch list for the Roger Clemens National Pitcher of the Year Award. In eight starts he is 5-2 with a 2.75 ERA and has three complete-game victories to his credit. Averill ranks fifth in the Pac-10 with 47 strikeouts and is also eighth with a 2.75 ERA. He has also walked only nine in his eight appearances this season. He was named the Pro-Line Cap National Pitcher of the Week after throwing a complete-game, 14-strikeout shutout against New Mexico State (2/4) and backed that performance up with a complete-game, eight-strikeout win over South Alabama (2/12). The complete-game shutout against NMSU was the first by a Sun Devil since Jered Liebeck beat Long Beach State in 2003 to earn National Pitcher of the Week honors. His 14 strikeouts were also the most by a Sun Devil since 2002 (Robbie McClellan). Here is a look at Averill's career statistics:

On the Road Again:

The Sun Devils take back to the road this weekend after playing only six of their last 21 games at home at Winkles Field at Packard Stadium. The four-game trip to Baton Rouge, La. (Mar. 11-13), marked the third and final cross-country flight for ASU this season. During the stretch of games, ASU spent four of five weeks on the road, including road trips of seven and eight games. Following the Coca-Cola Spring Training Classic in Surprise, Ariz., ASU played five consecutive road games at Arizona and top-ranked Tulane. After a home series against nationally ranked Baylor (Feb. 25-27), ASU took back to the road for the Keith LeClair Classic hosted by East Carolina University (Mar. 4-6) and then two games each against LSU and Western Illinois (Mar. 11-13) in Baton Rouge, La.

Taking on the Tough Guys:

With three games against No. 23/21 USC this weekend, ASU continues a trend of playing nationally ranked opponents this season. ASU has played half of its games (14 of 28) against ranked teams and will play 18 of the first 31 against teams that will have appeared in the national polls at some point this season. After playing fifth-ranked LSU twice two weekends ago, the Sun Devils have now played 11 of their last 18 games against top 10 opponents. ASU recently concluded a stretch of nine straight games against top 10 opponents, including winning three of the final four games against No. 8 Baylor and No. 4 North Carolina. The Sun Devils have played 15 of their 28 games this season against teams that have been ranked this season, going 4-11 against what could be considered the toughest schedule in the nation. Eleven of ASU's 12 losses have come against teams that have been ranked at some point this season.

A Classy Gesture:

Prior to ASU's game against East Carolina, every player and coach of the Sun Devil baseball team made its way from the playing field to the press box to pay honor to former ECU coach Keith LeClair. The team came up to LeClair's special area in the press box to speak to the former ECU coach who is battling Lou Gehrig's Disease. They presented LeClair and his family an Arizona State jersey signed by every member of the program and expressed their gratitude for being one of the first teams to play at the new stadium named in his honor (Clark-LeClair Stadium).

From Batboy To Center Field:

Freshman outfielder J.J. Sferra is no stranger to the batters box at Packard Stadium, only in 2005 he will be hitting there, instead of picking up bats. The son of 10th-year assistant coach Jay Sferra, the younger Sferra spent several seasons in the late 90's as ASU's batboy, including duties at the 1998 College World Series. After a stellar prep career at Mountain Pointe High School, Sferra has become a mainstay in center field for the Sun Devils. He is listed at the No. 33 top incoming freshman in the nation by Baseball America. He has started 20 of ASU's 28 games this season and is hitting .253 (20-for-79) with three doubles, one triple, six RBI and three stolen bases. He also leads ASU with five bunt base hits and three sacrifice bunts.

Curtis Coming of Age:

Sophomore center fielder Colin Curtis is third on the team with a .342 (38-for-111) batting average and has recorded at least one hit in 22 of 28 games. Curtis is also among the Pac-10 leaders with 20 RBI, 20 walks and eight stolen bases. In addition, Curtis has recorded 12 multi-hit games and has six games with two or more RBI. He set a career-high with four hits in ASU's 7-6 loss in 14 innings to Arizona (2/15). Curtis came up with the game-winning single with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning in a 11-10 win over New Mexico State (2/7). He was named honorable mention All-Pac-10 as a freshman last season after hitting .300 (57-for-190) with five home runs, 36 RBI and 12 stolen bases.

Tuffy Keeps Getting Tougher:

Senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch joins former Sun Devil Don Wakamatsu (1982-85) as the only other full-time, threeyear starter at the catching position in school history. Gosewisch has started 143 games behind the plate over the last three seasons and has combined to go 146-for-437 (.334). This season he is hitting .324 (34-for-105) with five home runs and 26 RBI. He has been one of ASU's most consistent hitter with hits in 21 of 28 games and leads the team with nine multi-RBI games. The 2004 Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year semifinalist and one of 37 players named to the 2005 Bench Award Watch List, is a career .320 hitter with nine home runs, 118 RBI and a .993 fielding percentage. A top candidate for the 2005 Bench Award, Gosewisch has been perfect behind the dish this year with a 1.000 fielding percentage in 243 total chances. He has gunned down 13 of 32 base stealers and has not allowed a passed ball. He has caught all but seven innings this season and showed his true "tuffness" when he played the next day after suffering a mild concussion and had several stitches after being hit in the head against Baylor (2/25). Here is a look at Tuffy's progression at the plate in games started during his Sun Devil career:

Just a Walk in the Park For Larish:

Senior OF/1B Jeff Larish ranks second in ASU history with 161 career walks (see list on page 4) and has recorded at least one walk in 111 of 184 career games. His 78 walks in 2003 are second most in ASU single-season history and he is only the second player in school history to join the 70/70 (RBI/BB) club in a season. Former major leaguer Alvin Davis recorded 87 walks and 91 RBI in 1982 and holds the school record with 207 career walks. Additionally, the third-team preseason All-American (*Collegiate Baseball/Baseball America*) has recorded 40 career multi-walk games, 71 multi-hit games, 51 multi-RBI contests and 91 career extra base hits for a .579 slugging percentage. He has recorded a hit in 78% of his games played (143 of 184) and has five career multi-home run games (three this season). Larish jumped into the national spotlight during his sophomore season (2003) in which he was named a first-team All-American after hitting .372 (87-for-234) with 80 runs, 18 doubles, 18 home runs, 95 RBI and 78 walks. Larish was also a first-team Summer All-American in 2003 after leading the USA Baseball National Team to a silver medal in the Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic and led Team USA with 23 RBI and eight home runs.

It's All About Family For Romine, Gosewisch, Bordes and Sferra:

Father/son combinations and brothers have played a unique part of the storied history of Arizona State Baseball. In all, four father/son combinations have played at Arizona State including current freshman shortstop Andrew Romine and his father, Kevin. Kevin Romine played at ASU from 1981-82 and later went on to play seven years with the Boston Red Sox. He holds the ASU career batting average record hitting .408 (223-for-547) and helped lead ASU to the 1981 National Championship. Assistant coach Jay J. Sferra will also get the chance to coach his son, freshman outfielder J.J. Sferra. Father Eddie Bane (1971-73) and son Jaymie Bane (1997), Casey Myers (1998-2001) and his father Clint Myers (1971-73) and Brian Berger (2000) and his father Bill Berger (1970-73) round out the four father/son combos to don the Sun Devil uniform. Nine sets of brothers have graced the ASU rosters through the years, including senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch and his brother Chip (1996-99) and junior pitcher Brett Bordes and his freshman brother Greg. The other brother combinations include Chris (1975-78) and Sal (1964-65) Bando, Kevin (1978-81) and Pat (1980-82) Dukes, Byron (1979), Dale (1976-79) and Larry (1976-78) Eiler, Greg (1968) and Skip (1964) Hancock, Darrell (1974-77) and Dwayne (1979) Jackson, Jeff (1994) and Mike (1993) Rensmeyer, and John (1971-73) and Tom (1973-75) Sain. Of the nine sets of brothers, four sets played at least one year together at Arizona State.

Preseason All-Americans:

The Sun Devils feature a trio of preseason All-Americans in 2005. Senior third baseman Jeff Larish, junior right fielder Travis Buck and senior right-handed pitcher Jason Urquidez all earned national preseason honors from various publications. Buck, who hit .373 with nine home runs and 58 RBI last season, earned first-team honors from *Baseball America*, second-team from *NCBWA* and third-team from *Collegiate Baseball*. Buck was also named to the initial watch list for the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year award. Larish was a third-team selection by *Baseball America* and Urquidez was second-team by the *NCBWA* and third-team by *Collegiate Baseball*.

Team USA Connections:

Junior right fielder Travis Buck will face a pair of his Team USA teammates this weekend when the Sun Devils play USC. USC junior catcher Jeff Clement and sophomore RHP Ian Kennedy teamed with Buck on the Gold Medal winning USA Baseball National Team. Buck was named a first-team Summer All-American by *Baseball America* after hitting .412 (28-for-68) with six multi-hit games, two home runs and 14 RBI. He was a big part of Team USA's impressive end-of-the-summer run that saw the Red, White and Blue win the gold medal at the FISU World University Baseball Championship in Tainan, Taiwan. Buck became the seventh Sun Devil since 1998 to play on the USA Baseball National Team. Of the 22 players on the 2004 National Team, Buck will play against nine of his summer teammates (Troy Tulowitzki, Jed Lowrie, John Mayberry Jr., Trevor Crowe, Mark Romanczuk, Ian Kennedy, Jeff Clement, Daniel Bard, Cesar Ramos).



NCAA Record Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Ends at 506:

The Sun Devils had a piece of history come to an end when their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak came to an end Feb. 15, 2004 against Oklahoma. The Sooners ended a streak that began April 8, 1995, a day after the USC Trojans shut out the Sun Devils during Pat Murphy's first year at ASU. "The Streak" saw the Devils go 338-167-1 during the 506-game stretch, scoring 4,755 runs (9.40 per game average) from 1995-2004. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game, breaking the 12-year-old NCAA record exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-



0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field by left-hander Randy Flores. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in four games dating back to the 1990 season. Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Mark Prior (USC), Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State).

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA Baseball National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 8 as a supplier to the National Team. With the selection of Travis Buck to the 2004 USA Baseball National Team, ASU has now had 10 players and 11 total selections don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984. ASU has also had at least one player on Team USA in six of the last seven years. Buck helped Team USA win the Gold Medal in the FISU World University Baseball Championships last summer in Tainan, Taiwan. Larish was a member of the 2003 squad that finished the summer with a 27-2 record and won a silver medal in the Pan Am Games.
