NATIONAL RANKINGS

After a five-week hiatus from the national polls, Arizona State re-entered the rankings after winning 12 of the last 16 games. ASU is ranked No. 24 by Baseball America, No. 29 by the NCBWA and No. 30 by Collegiate Baseball. ASU is also listed as No. 26 in the receiving votes section of the ESPN/Sports Weekly Coaches Poll. The Sun Devils have played 19 of their 31 games this season against ranked teams.

MEDIA EXPOSURE ASU returns to the airwaves this weekend with all three games of the non-conference series against Wright State broadcast locally on KDUS 1060 AM with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all the action from the Packard Stadium press box. All 24 Pac-10 games are scheduled to be broadcast on KDUS 1060 AM and also on the internet. Every game this season will be able to be followed via GameTracker on the Internet at www.thesundevils.com.

FUN FACTS

The Sun Devils have won 12 of their last 16 games after staring the season 6-9... in 10 games as a third baseman, junior Travis Buck is hitting .442 (19-for-43) with 10 extra base hits and nine RBI... senior Jeff Larish leads the NCAA with 12 home runs and has hit seven homers in the last nine games... Larish also ranks fifth in ASU history with 40 career home runs... ASU has the No. 17 projected RPI in the country and has played 18 of its 31 games against ranked opponents... ASU head coach Pat Murphy needs eight (8) more wins to reach 800 in his college head coaching career.

What's On Tap:

The Arizona State Sun Devils (18-13, 2-1 Pac-10) return home for only the third time in the last seven weeks for their final non-conference series of the season. ASU hosts the Wright State Raiders (10-10, 0-0 Horizon) to a three-game set starting Friday (April 1) at 6:30 p.m. and continues Saturday (6:30 p.m.) and Sunday (1 p.m.). ASU enters the series having won 12 of its last 16 games and kicked off the start of conference play with a series win over the University of Southern California Trojans last weekend in Los Angeles. The Devils finally get to take a break from playing ranked opponents as 15 of the last 21 games have come against teams listed in the national polls. Following the series with Wright State, the Sun Devils will play 21 of their final 22 games against Pac-10 opponents, including a three-game series against the California Golden Bears in Berkeley, Calif. (Apr. 8-10). ASU will then return to Packard Stadium for back-to-back conference series against nationally ranked Stanford (Apr. 15-17) and UCLA (Apr. 22-24).

Quick Hits:

- ASU set a school record with 35 hits in the 30-13 win over Western Illinois (3/13). Travis Buck went 6-for-8.
- 12 of ASU's 13 losses this season have come against teams that have appeared in the national rankings.
- The Sun Devils have faced eight preseason All-American pitchers this season
- ASU has played over half of its schedule (17 of 31) against ranked teams this season.
- ASU has been road warriors this season playing 19 of its first 31 games away from Packard Stadium.
 - 16 Sun Devils, including 10 true freshman, have made their debuts in the Maroon and Gold this season.
- 12 players have at least one SB this season and ASU leads the Pac-10 with 53 stolen bases (53-for-73). After 31 games the Sun Devils have 12 triples, surpassing the season total of seven triples in 59 games in 2004.
- ASU owns a 231-101-1 record for a .695 winning percentage this decade (2000-P).

Of ASU's 56 games this season, 28 will be played against teams that played in the 2004 NCAA Tournament (50%). Senior Jeff Larish leads the NCAA with 12 home runs and is tied for fifth in school history with 40 career homers. Sr. RHP Jason Urquidez is 16-5 with a 3.89 ERA in 32 career pitching appearances (22 starts) as a Sun Devil. Travis Buck has raised his batting average 116 points (.246-.362) by going 35-for-77 (.455) over his last 16 games. In 31 games this season ASU has used 26 different starting batting lineups and 20 different defensive lineups.

Senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch has thrown out 13 of 33 attempted base stealers this season (39%). Freshman reserve catcher Austin Stockfisch has hits in five straight at-bats and is hitting .833 (5-for-6). Pat Bresnehan threw a complete-game four hitter against USC (3/25) to earn Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors. Travis Buck (#17) and Jeff Larish (#40) are rated among the top 50 college prospects by Baseball America.

Recapping Last Weekend:



The Sun Devils opened Pac-10 play in impressive fashion by winning two of three from the University of Southern California Trojans over the weekend at Dedeaux Field. After walking a season-high nine batters in Thursday's series opening 9-8 loss, the pitching staff bounced back to allow only one run in each of the final two games of the series. Sophomore Pat Bresnehan threw a complete-game four-hitter in Friday's lopsided 17-1 victory and Jason Urquidez. Brett Bordes and Zechry Zinicola combined to limit the Trojans to one run in the series clinching 2-1 victory in 10 innings on Saturday. Overall, the pitching staff recorded a 3.33 ERA and held the Trojans to a .222 batting average in the three-game series. The offense combined to hit .322 (38-for-118) with 27 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple and three home runs. Senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch led ASU going 8-for-16 (.500) with five runs scored and six RBI. Sophomore second baseman Seth Dhaenens (.400, 4-for-10) and redshirt freshman Rocky Laguna (.333, 4-for-12) also had impressive performances while starting all three games.

A Good Omen:

Through the halfway point of the 2005 season the Sun Devils were 16-12 (currently 18-13). The last time ASU was 16-12 after 28 games was in 1998 when the Sun Devils last advanced to the College World Series and played for the National Championship. In both 1998 and earlier this season, ASU tied a school record by losing six straight games. After enduring the six-game losing streak in 1998, ASU finished up strong winning 18 of its last 27 regular season games that season to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Following ASU's six-game losing streak this season, the Sun Devils have won 12 of their last 16 games.

The Starting Pitchers:

Friday - Erik Averill, LHP (Orange, Calif.)

Will be making his Pac-10 leading ninth start of the season Friday against Wright State... leads the ASU pitching staff going 5-2 with a 3.31 ERA and has recorded 47 strikeouts and only 12 walks in 54.1 IP this season... tied for the league lead with 54.1 innings pitched and ranks sixth with 47 strikeouts... pitched only two innings last weekend out of the bullpen against USC (2.0 IP, 2 H, 4 ER)... in his last start against Oklahoma (3/19) he recorded his third complete game of the year... he limited the Sooners to only five singles and one unearned run, while striking out seven... has lasted five or more innings in seven straight starts... earned National Pitcher of the Week honors after striking out career-high 14 batters in complete-game shutout over New Mexico State (2/4)... is 17-8 with a 4.11 ERA in 55 career pitching appearances (27 starts).

Saturday - Pat Bresnehan, RHP (Sherborn, Mass.)


Coming off his best career start last weekend against USC... limited the Trojans to only four hits and one unearned run in his first career complete game... earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors... scheduled to make his seventh start of 2005 and eighth in his career on Saturday against Wright State... is 2-2 with a 3.76 ERA with 35 strikeouts in 38.1 innings... ranks eighth in the Pac-10 with 15 strikeouts looking... in six starts this season is 2-2 with a 4.62 ERA... is 5-4 with five saves and a 4.29 ERA in 35 career pitching appearances (7 GS).

ASU in Pac-10 Openers:

The Sun Devils began their 27th season in the Conference of Champions last weekend with a series victory over USC last weekend at Dedeaux Field. The series victory snapped a streak of having lost the last two Pac-10 season opening series. ASU owns an all-time 429-315 (.577) record in Pac-10 play and has won six conference championships (last in 2000). Since the Pac-10 North and Pac-10 South joined in 1999, ASU is 89-58 (.605) in league play and 270-122-1 overall. In 11 seasons under head coach Pat Murphy the Sun Devils have won six of the conference opening series and own an all-time 150-116 (.564) record.

Arizona State Sun Devils (18-13 Overall, 2-1 Pac-10)

Larish Leads Pac-10 And NCAA in Home Runs:

Senior Jeff Larish hit his Pac-10 and NCAA leading 12th home run of the season in Saturday's 2-1 win over USC. Larish has hit seven home runs in his last nine games, including a pair of multi-home run contests in back-to-back games against Western Illinois and a walk-off solo home run in the bottom of the ninth inning against Oklahoma (3/18). Larish is one of only eight players in the NCAA to have recorded double-digits in home runs so far this season and is tied for the national lead with LSU's Ryan Patterson. Larish has hit his home runs in bunches this season, with eight of his 12 homers spread across only four days this season. He has three multi-homer games and also hit a home run in each half of a doubleheader against Oklahoma and South Alabama (2/12). Overall, Larish is hitting .320 (39-for-122) with 21 extra base hits. Of his nine home runs this season, he has hit five solo homers, three two-run shots and four three-run bombs. Eleven (11) of his 12 homers have also come on the road. Larish Climbs ASU Career Charts:

With his seven home runs over the last nine games and an NCAA and Pac-10 leading 12 on the season, senior Jeff Larish now ranks in the top 10 in ASU career history in home runs (40), RBI (201) and walks (165). His 40 home runs are tied for fifth in the record books with Andrew Beinbrink (1996-99) and only four way from fourth place (Dan Rumsey, 1986-89). His 201 RBI currently are sixth most in school history and his 165 walks are ranked second. Larish also ranks 10th in career at-bats (721), 10th in total bases (420) and is nearing the ASU career top 10 in runs scored (188). Through 31 games, Larish is hitting .320 (39-for-122) and has been especially hot with hits in eight of his last 10 games, going 16-for-38 (.421) during that stretch of games to raise his batting average from .273 to .320 (47 points). Gosewisch Named To Johnny Bench Award Watch List:

Arizona State senior starting catcher Tuffy Gosewisch has been named to the watch list for the 2005 Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year Award. ASU's three-year starter behind the plate was also named one of 15 semifinalists for the 2004 Bench Award. Gosewisch is in his third year as ASU's everyday starting catcher and has caught all but nine innings of ASU's 31-game schedule so far in 2005. He is only the second three-year starting catcher in Sun Devil baseball history, joining former major leaguer and current Texas Ranger bench coach Don Wakamatsu. The senior backstop has gotten off to a torrid start in 2005 and is among the team leaders in several offensive categories. He is hitting .347 (42-for-121) with six doubles, five home runs and 33 RBI. He has recorded at least one hit in 24 of 31 games and has tabbed 12 multi-hit and 11 multi-RBI games this season. He is coming off a solid weekend at the plate against USC in which he hit .500 (8-for-16) with five runs scored and six RBI, including a record-breaking 5-for-6 performance in Friday's 17-1 blowout. As stellar as his offensive production has been, Gosewisch has made the most impact behind the plate. He has a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage on 256 total chances. He has also thrown out 13 of 33 attempted base stealers (39%). Arizona State has a long tradition with the Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year Award, with Casey Myers being selected as a finalist in 2000 and 2001.

Buck Continues Hot Hitting:

Junior Travis Buck continued his torrid streak at the plate hitting .286 (4-for-14) with three doubles last weekend against USC. The preseason All-American has raised his batting average 116 points from .246 to .362 over the last 16 games while batting .455 (35-for-77) with nine doubles, three triples, two home runs and 18 RBI. During that stretch of games he has recorded 11 multi-hit games and has recorded 18 of his 22 RBI on the season. The Wallace Award and Baseball America Player of the Year candidate leads the team in hitting at .362 (50-for-138) with 13 doubles, 22 RBI and nine stolen bases. He also leads the team with 15 multi-hit games and paces the Pac-10 with 50 hits. His name also appears among the league leaders in runs (36, 3rd), doubles (13, 2nd), triples (3, 3rd), total bases (75, 4th) and stolen bases (9, 6th). With his outstanding week at the plate against Baylor (.571, 8-for-14, 6 H, 6 RBI, Buck was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week and was also named to the College Baseball Foundation Honor Roll. The Player of the Week honor was the fourth career award for Buck and the 75th such honor for Arizona State University. He also won the award twice last season (Mar. 2, Mar. 9) and once during his freshman season (Apr. 1).

Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same time establishing

himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in four of the past eight seasons, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy has combined to go 419-209-1 in his 11 seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 29-22 record in NCAA Tournament action. He has a career 792-380-4 record in 21 seasons as a head coach. Murphy recorded his 700th victory at the Division I level on April 2, 2004 in a 10-3 win over USC. In 18 seasons split between Notre Dame and ASU, Murphy has averaged over 40 wins per season. ASU set an NCAA record scoring in 506 consecutive games from 1995-2004 and set the NCAA record with 14 grand slams in 2004.

Bresnehan Named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week:

Arizona State University sophomore right-handed pitcher Pat Bresnehan has been named Pac-10 Baseball Player and Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 22-28. Bresnehan threw a complete-game four-hitter to help lead the Sun Devils to a 17-1 victory over USC on Mar. 25. A day after six ASU pitchers combined for nine walks and three hit batters, Bresnehan got ASU back on the winning track and helped save the bullpen with his first career complete game. He did not allow an earned run and scattered four singles to pick up his second victory of the season. He struck out five and walked only two. For the season, Bresnehan is 2-2 and is second on the team with a 3.76 ERA. The Pitcher of the Week honor is the first for Bresnehan and the 46th selection all-time for Arizona State. Current senior RHP Jason Urquidez also earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors last season.

Buck Prefers Hitting Second:

In his three seasons as a Sun Devil, junior right fielder Travis Buck has enjoyed his most success while hitting in the No. 2 spot in the lineup. In 94 career games in the No. 2 spot in the lineup, Buck is a career .411 (152-for-370) hitter with 118 runs scored, 12 home runs and 91 RBI. While hitting No. 2, Buck has accounted for 72% of his run production (91 of 126 RBI), 74% of his runs scored (118 of 159), 80% of his home runs (12 of 15) and 72% of his total hits (152 of 212). This season Buck is hitting .459 (39-for-85) with 27 runs scored and 18 RBI in 16 games batting in the second spot. He has combined to hit just 208 (11-for-53) this season when batting either leadoff (118, 2-for-17) or third (250, 9-for-36). Overall, the preseason All-American is a career .352 hitter (212-for-602) with 159 runs, 15 home runs and 126 RBI.

Position Changes for Buck and Larish:

Junior preseason All-American Travis Buck was highly regarded as arguably the best outfielder in the Pac-10 and is predicted by several publications to be the highest drafted college outfielder in the 2005 MLB Amateur Draft. But, Buck won't be spending much time in the outfield as he has moved to third base. After starting the first 145 games of his ASU career in left or right field, Buck has made nine of his last 10 starts at the hot corner. The former prep shortstop has also held his own, making only two errors and recorded an ASU single-game high with seven assists against Oklahoma (3/ 19). In 10 games as a third baseman, Buck is hitting .442 (19-for-43) with 13 runs, six doubles, three triples and nine RBI. Senior Jeff Larish has also shown to be versatile in the field, starting games at three different positions (3B/1B/ LF). In the 19-1 win over Western Illinois (3/12), Larish played four different positions -- 1B/SS, LF, CF. Larish has made 23 starts at first base, three at third base and five in left field. In eight games played in the outfield he is hitting .421 (8-for-19) and has recorded nine of his NCAA leading 12 home runs while playing first base. In 87 career games as a first baseman, Larish is hitting .358 (113-for-316) with 26 home runs and 115 RBL

Buck and Larish Rated Among Top 50 College Prospects:

Junior 3B/OF Travis Buck and Senior 1B/OF Jeff Larish were both rated in the top 50 in Baseball America's annual mideason report rating the top college prospects for the upcoming MLB June Amateur Draft. Buck was ranked No. 17 and the No. 2 outfielder behind Winthrop's Daniel Carte. Larish was ranked No. 40 and is hte top listed senior position player. Nebraska third baseman Alex Gordon, a teammate of Buck's on the 2004 USA Baseball National Team, was selected as the top college prospect.

Tuffy Keeps Getting Tougher:

Senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch joins former Sun Devil Don Wakamatsu (1982-85) as the only other full-time, threeyear starter at the catching position in school history. Gosewisch has started 146 games behind the plate over the last three seasons and has combined to go 154-for-453 (.340). This season he is second on the team hitting. 347 (42-for-121) with five home runs and 33 RBI. He has been one of ASU's most consistent hitter with hits in 24 of 31 games and leads the team with 11 multi-RBI games. The 2004 Johnny Bench Catcher of the Year semifinalist and one of 37 players named to the 2005 Bench Award Watch List, is a career .326 hitter with nine home runs, 125 RBI and a .993 fielding percentage. A top candidate for the 2005 Bench Award, Gosewisch has been perfect behind the dish this year with a 1.000 fielding percentage in 256 total chances. He has gunned down 13 of 33 base stealers and has not allowed a passed ball. He has caught all but nine innings this season and showed his true "tuffness" when he played the next day after suffering a mild concussion and had several stitches after being hit in the head against Baylor (2/25). Welcome To the Show:

A total of 16 players have made their ASU debuts in the first 31 games of the season. Four newcomers were in the starting lineup on opening night against Long Beach State, including Joey Hooft (DH), Andrew Romine (SS), J.J. Sferra (CF) and Vinny Biancamano (2B). Freshman LHP Josh Satow made his debut in the Maroon and Gold against Western Illinois, becoming the 10th true freshman have made it into a game this season. ASU has now started six true freshman and two redshirt freshman position players this season. The Sun Devil roster consists of 18 of 30 active players that have never seen action before this season.

Triple Your Pleasure:

After 31 games the Sun Devils have 12 triples to rank second in the Pac-10 and have already surpassed the entire season total of seven from last season. Travis Buck ranks third in the league with three triples, while Rocky Laguna and Tuffy Gosewisch have a pair of triples to rank tied for eighth. J.J. Sferra, Andrew Romine, Jeff Larish, Tuffy Gosewisch, Colin Curtis and Joe Persichina have each recorded a three-bagger during the season. In 59 games last season, ASU had only seven triples, ranking 245th of 285 teams in the NCAA.

Devils Facing Big League Arms:

The Sun Devils faced USC right-handed pitcher Ian Kennedy in the series opener last Thursday, marking the eighth preseason All-American pitcher ASU will face this season. In addition to Kennedy, who is listed by Baseball America as the No. 5 sophomore in the nation and was a third-team preseason All-America selection, the Sun Devils have already faced Cesar Ramos (Long Beach State), Brian Bogusevic (Tulane), Micah Owings (Tulane), Neil Jamison (Long Beach State), P.J. Walters (South Alabama), Mark McCormick (Baylor) and Andrew Miller (North Carolina). ASU also beat a pair of second-round (Trey Taylor) and third-round (Cory VanAllen) draft picks during the Baylor series.

Team Speed:

The Sun Devils lead the Pac-10 in stolen bases and are 53-for-73 (73%) on the season. At one point early in the season the Sun Devils had a streak of 17 consecutive that ended during the Coca-Cola Classic ASU has two of the top seven base stealers in the Pac-10, with Travis Buck ranking sixth with nine and Colin Curtis ranking seventh with eight. Redshirt freshman Rocky Laguna tied the ASU single-game record with four stolen bases against New Mexico State (2/7). A total of 12 different Sun Devils have recorded a stolen base and eight players have two or more steals. Buck currently has a string of five straight games with a stolen base. In 2004, ASU had only 56 total stolen bases in 59 games.

Dominating the Arizona Baseball Rivalry:

Arizona and Arizona State are the only two Division I baseball programs in the state of Arizona and have met 409 times since 1907. While Arizona leads the overall rivalry 222-188, ASU leads the series 165-105 since the school officially adopted the program as a varsity sport in 1959. Additionally, ASU has dominated the rivalry in recent years, winning 16 of the last 22 (16-6) games since 2000. The Sun Devils won four of the five meetings in 2004 and seven of the last 10 overall. Since head coach Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995, ASU is 34-18 (.654) and has never lost a season series to the Wildcats. ASU is 0-2 against Arizona in a pair of non-conference games this season and is schedule to face the Wildcats again in a three-game Pac-10 series May 14-16 in Tempe.

Averill Earns National Pitcher of the Week Honors:

Arizona State junior left-handed pitcher Erik Averill is off to a fast start to the 2005 season and has been named to the watch list for the Roger Clemens National Pitcher of the Year Award. In eight starts he is 5-2 with a 3.31 ERA and has three complete-game victories to his credit. Averill ranks sixth in the Pac-10 with 47 strikeouts and is first with 54.1 innings pitched. He has also walked only 12 in his nine appearances this season. He was named the Pro-Line Cap National Pitcher of the Week after throwing a completegame, 14-strikeout shutout against New Mexico State (2/4) and backed that performance up with a complete-game, eight-strikeout win over South Alabama (2/12). The complete-game shutout against NMSU was the first by a Sun Devil since Jered Liebeck beat Long Beach State in 2003 to earn National Pitcher of the Week honors. His 14 strikeouts were also the most by a Sun Devil since Mike Esposito had 17 against Washington in 2002. The back-to-back complete games marks a first for the Sun Devils since 2002 (Robbie McClellan). Here is a look at Averill's career statistics:

Averill Proves To Be Strikeout Machine Since Summer in the Cape:

Adding in his stellar summer performance with the Orleans Cardinals in the prestigious Cape Cod League, junior LHP Erik Averill has registered 109 strikeouts and walked only 27 in the last 118.0 IP. Averill went 5-3 with one save and a 1.70 ERA in 10 games with Orleans.

Climbing RPI:

Winners of five of its last six, including a series win over nationally ranked USC last weekend, ASU's projected RPI on BoydsWorld.com jumped 19 spots from No. 36 all the way to its current mark of No. 17. Helped in part by what is widely considered the toughest non-conference schedule in the nation, ASU has played over half of its games (18 of 31) against teams that have been ranked in the national polls at some point this season. Just a Walk in the Park For Larish:

Senior OF/1B Jeff Larish leads the Pac-10 with 23 walks, including 13 walks in the last eight games (8 IBB) and he ranks second in ASU history with 165 career walks (see list on page 4) and has recorded at least one walk in 113 of 187 career games. His 78 walks in 2003 are second most in ASU single-season history and he is only the second player in school history to join the 70/70 (RBI/BB) club in a season. Former major leaguer Alvin Davis recorded 87 walks and 91 RBI in 1982 and holds the school record with 207 career walks. Additionally, the third-team preseason All-American (Collegiate Baseball/Baseball America) has recorded 41 career multi-walk games, 72 multi-hit games, 53 multi-RBI contests and 93 career extra base hits for a .583 slugging percentage. He has recorded a hit in 78% of his games played (146 of 187) and has five career multi-home run games (three this season). Larish jumped into the national spotlight during his sophomore season (2003) in which he was named a first-team All-American after hitting .372 (87-for-234) with 80 runs, 18 doubles, 18 home runs, 95 RBI and 78 walks. Larish was also a first-team Summer All-American in 2003 after leading the USA Baseball National Team to a silver medal in the Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic and led Team USA with 23 RBI and eight home runs.



Zinicola Moves Into Record Books For Career Saves:

Despite making most of his pitching appearances as a starer this season (6 of 11), sophomore RHP Zechry Zinicola has recorded a pair of saves this year and now has 10 in his career to move into a tie for eight place in the ASU record books with former All-Pac-10 closer Eric Doble (1999-2001). Zinicola tied the ASU freshman record with eight saves last season and owns a career 5-2 record with a 3.64 ERA in 26 career relief appearances. In 10 career starts, Zinicola is 1-2 with a 4.46 ERA. - Returning From The Road:

The Sun Devils have been road warrios this season playing 18 of their first 31 games away from Packard Stadium. ASU returns home this weekend after spending four of hte last seven weeks on the road, including a three-game series against USC last weekend at Dedeaux Field. In addition to playing over half of their games on the road, the Sun Devils have made three cross country flights to Greenville, N.C. and New Orleans, La. (twice). ASU will also play its first two Pac-10 series on the road at USC (won two of three) and California (Apr. 8-10). The Sun Devils are 9-4 at Packard Stadium and are hitting .307 (138-for-44). On the road, ASU is 9-9 while batting .299 (202-for-675) with 19 of the team's 26 home runs.

A Classy Gesture:

Prior to ASU's game against East Carolina (3/5), every player and coach of the Sun Devil baseball team made its way from the playing field to the press box to pay honor to former ECU coach Keith LeClair. The team came up to LeClair's special area in the press box to speak to the former ECU coach who is battling Lou Gehrig's Disease. They presented LeClair and his family an Arizona State jersey signed by every member of the program and expressed their gratitude for being one of the first teams to play at the new stadium named in his honor (Clark-LeClair Stadium).

From Batboy To Center Field:

Freshman outfielder J.J. Sferra is no stranger to the batters box at Packard Stadium, only in 2005 he will be hitting there, instead of picking up bats. The son of 10th-year assistant coach Jay Sferra, the younger Sferra spent several seasons in the late 90's as ASU's batboy, including duties at the 1998 College World Series. After a stellar prep career at Mountain Pointe High School, Sferra has become a mainstay in center field for the Sun Devils. He is listed at the No. 33 top incoming freshman in the nation by Baseball America. He has started 22 of ASU's 31 games this season and is hitting .267 (23-for-86) with three doubles, one triple, eight RBI and three stolen bases. He also leads ASU with six bunt base hits and three sacrifice bunts.

Curtis Coming of Age:

Sophomore center fielder Colin Curtis is third on the team with a .339 (43-for-127) batting average and has recorded at least one hit in 24 of 31 games. Curtis is also among the Pac-10 leaders with 24 RBI, 20 walks and eight stolen bases. In addition, Curtis has recorded 14 multi-hit games and has seven games with two or more RBI. He set a career-high with four hits in ASU's 7-6 loss in 14 innings to Arizona (2/15) and also came up with the game-winning single with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning in a 11-10 win over New Mexico State (2/7). He was named honorable mention All-Pac-10 last season after hitting .300 (57-for-190) with five home runs, 36 RBI and 12 stolen bases.

Five Sun Devils Ranked Among Nation's Top 50:

Five Arizona State Sun Devils have been ranked among the nation's top 50 of their class in the 2005 *Baseball America* Preseason College Baseball Preview. In the Freshmen Fab 50, shortstop Andrew Romine (#3) and outfielder J.J. Sferra (#33) were both ranked. Outfielder Colin Curtis ranked No. 26 among the sophomores and Travis Buck was listed No. 13 amongst the star-studded junior class. Seniors JeffLarish (#1) and Jason Urquidez (#6) were ranked among the top 10 seniors in the nation.

It's All About Family For Romine, Gosewisch, Bordes and Sferra:

Father/son combinations and brothers have played a unique part of the storied history of Arizona State Baseball. In all, four father/son combinations have played at Arizona State including current freshman shortstop Andrew Romine and his father, Kevin. Kevin Romine played at ASU from 1981-82 and later went on to play seven years with the Boston Red Sox. He holds the ASU career batting average record hitting .408 (223-for-547) and helped lead ASU to the 1981 National Championship. Assistant coach Jay J. Sferra will also get the chance to coach his son, freshman outfielder J.J. Sferra. Father Eddie Bane (1971-73) and son Jaymie Bane (1997), Casey Myers (1998-2001) and his father Clint Myers (1971-73) and Brian Berger (2000) and his father Bill Berger (1970-73) round out the four father/son combos to don the Sun Devil uniform. Nine sets of brothers have graced the ASU rosters through the years, including senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch and his brother Chip (1996-99) and junior pitcher Brett Bordes and his freshman brother Greg. The other brother combinations include Chris (1975-78)

Of the nine sets of brothers, four sets played at least one year together at Arizona State.

Preseason All-Americans:

The Sun Devils feature a trio of preseason All-Americans in 2005. Senior third baseman Jeff Larish, junior right fielder Travis Buck and senior right-handed pitcher Jason Urquidez all earned national preseason honors from various publications. Buck, who hit .373 with nine home runs and 58 RBI last season, earned first-team honors from Baseball America, second-team from NCBWA and third-team from Collegiate Baseball. Buck was also named to the initial watch list for the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year award. Larish was a third-team selection by Baseball America and Urquidez was second-team by the NCBWA and third-team by Collegiate Baseball.

Team USA Connections:

Junior right fielder Travis Buck will faced a pair of his Team USA teammates last weekend when the Sun Devils played USC. USC junior catcher Jeff Clement and sophomore RHP Ian Kennedy teamed with Buck on the Gold Medal winning USA Baseball National Team. Buck was named a first-team Summer All-American by Baseball America after hitting .412 (28-for-68) with six multi-hit games, two home runs and 14 RBI. He was a big part of Team USA's impressive end-of-the-summer run that saw the Red, White and Blue win the gold medal at the FISU World University Baseball Championship in Tainan, Taiwan. Buck became the seventh Sun Devil since 1998 to play on the USA Baseball National Team. Of the 22 players on the 2004 National Team, Buck will play against nine of his summer teammates (Troy Tulowitzki, Jed Lowrie, John Mayberry Jr., Trevor Crowe, Mark Romanczuk, Ian Kennedy, Jeff Clement, Daniel Bard, Cesar Ramos).

A Record Breaking Ninth Inning:

The Sun Devils set or tied three school records during the amazing 15-run ninth inning in the 30-13 win over Western Illinois. ASU set a record by recording 16 hits in the inning and sent 21 batters to the plate in the frame. The 15 runs tied a school record, last achieved against Stanford in 1980, and the 16 hits bettered the old record of 12 set against California in 1997. ASU also tied a school record by recording eight consecutive hits in the inning. Travis Buck (single), Colin Curtis (double), Austin Stockfisch (single), Jeff Larish (home run), Willy Fox (double), Joe Persichina (double), Seth Dhaenens (home run) and Greg Bordes (double) to put their names aside a piece of Sun Devil Baseball history. Fox alone went 3-for-3 in the inning falling just a triple short of hitting for the cycle.

More Records:

In addition to setting several records in the ninth inning against Western Illinois (3/13), ASU made several other entries into the record books. Buck and Larish Named Preseason All-Pac-10 by Baseball America:

Arizona State had a pair of players named to the annual preseason All-Pac-10 team as selected by Baseball America. Junior right fielder Travis Buck (OF) and senior third baseman Jeff Larish (DH) both were named to the squad. In addition, Larish was voted as having the "best strike zone discipline" and Buck was voted as having the "best outfield arm" and as being the "best all-around athlete" in the league. Buck was also named the Pac-10's No. 3 prospect for the 2005 MLB Draft. Other preseason honors handed out to the Devils by Baseball America included shortstop Andrew Romine being named the Pac-10's No. 2 top newcomer and sophomore closer Zechry Zinicola recognized as having the league's best fastball.

NCAA Record Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Ends at 506:

The Sun Devils had a piece of history come to an end when their NCAA record 506 consecutive games scoring streak came to an end Feb. 15, 2004 against Oklahoma. The Sooners ended a streak that began April 8, 1995, a day after the USC Trojans shut out the Sun Devils during Pat Murphy's first year at ASU. "The Streak" saw the Devils go 338-167-1 during the 506-game stretch, scoring 4,755 runs (9.40 per game average) from 1995-2004. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game, breaking the 12-year-old NCAA record exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-



0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field by left-hander Randy Flores. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in four games dating back to the 1990 season. Notable pitchers the Devils have faced during the streak include Mark Prior (USC), Jeremy Guthrie (Stanford), Barry Zito (USC), Kirk Saarloos (CS Fullerton), Jason Young (Stanford), Ben Diggins (Arizona), Adam Johnson (CS Fullerton), Ryan Drese (Cal), Jeff Weaver (Fresno State), Chad Hutchinson (Stanford), Abe Alvarez and Adam Pettyjohn (Fresno State).

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA Baseball National team during the summers. In a recent poll distributed by USA Baseball, ASU ranked No. 8 as a supplier to the National Team. With the selection of Travis Buck to the 2004 USA Baseball National Team, ASU has now had 10 players and 11 total selections don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984. ASU has also had at least one player on Team USA in six of the last seven years. Buck helped Team USA win the Gold Medal in the FISU World University Baseball Championships last summer in Tainan, Taiwan. Larish was a member of the 2003 squad that finished the summer with a 27-2 record and won a silver medal in the Pan Am Games.

ASU led 1-0 through seven innings on Larish's solo home run that led off the fourth inning. Senior starting pitcher Jason Urquidez held the Trojans scoreless until All-American catcher Jeff Clement drove a 3-2 fastball onto the parking structure in right field to tie the game. Travis Buck led off the top of the 10th inning with a walk and moved to third base on a single by senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch. Larish delivered the eventual game-winner lofting a 3-2 pitch from closer Paul Koss to right field to plate Buck with a sacrifice fly. USC attempted a comeback in the bottom of the 10th when center fielder Dale Legaspi led off the frame with a double to the right field gap off reliver Brett Bordes (2-3). After a sacrifice bunt to move Legaspi to third base, sophomore Zechry Zinicola got Blake Sharpe to strike out and, after an intentional walk to Clement, got right fielder Cyle Hankerd to bounce into a game-ending fielder's choice.


