The 11th-ranked ASU Baseball team plays five games in six days for the second time this season as they host

Utah Valley for a two-game home series on Tuesday and Wednesday before traveling to Southern California to open Pac-12 conference play against UCLA in a three-game series over the weekend. First pitch for the weekday games at Packard are both set for 6:30 p.m. (PT). Friday's game at Jackie Robinson Stadium is slated for 6 p.m. (PT), while Saturday's game will start at 2 p.m. (PT) and Sunday's is scheduled for 1 p.m. (PT).

#### Devils vs. Utah Valley:

The Sun Devils are 1-1<sup>^</sup> all-time against the Utah Valley Wolverines, beating them 11-3 at Packard Stadium on May 16, 2007 in their last meeting.

#### Devils vs. UCLA:

The Sun Devils are 111-64<sup>^</sup> all-time against the UCLA Bruins. The two teams met last season May 27-29, with ASU taking one-out-of-three at Packard Stadium in Tempe, Ariz. ASU lost the first two games, 0-3 and 3-10, respectively, before winning the final contest, 10-5. The Devils swept UCLA last time they met at Jackie Robinson Stadium in Los Angeles in 2010, winning by a combined 18 runs (23-5; 5-1, 6-1, 12-3).

#### **Head Coach Tim Esmay**

Tim Esmay is in his third season as head baseball coach at Arizona State after taking over his alma mater in 2010 and leading them to a Pac-10 title and a berth in the College World Series. The 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year. Esmav is in his 12th overall season as a coach at Arizona State. He spent 2005 to 2009 as an assistant coach, including the last three as the assistant head coach. He played two seasons as an infielder under Jim Brock in 1986 and 1987. Esmay was the head baseball coach at the University of Utah from 1997 to 2004, winning a WAC title and WAC Coach of the Year honors in 1997. In eight seasons at Utah he compiled a 213-235-1 record. Following his playing days, Esmay served as an assistant coach at Arizona State under Jim Brock from 1988 to 1990, then again in Brock's final season of 1994.

pitched a complete-game in a 3-1 win over Southern Utah over the weekend. That win was sandwiched between wins of 12-5 and 10-0 over the T-Birds to sweep three games from the in-state rival over the weekend in Cedar City. Sean Moysh batted .538 in the series with two triples. In the series opener, Austin Heaps had a three-hit, five-RBI day as part of a 19-hit afternoon for the Wolverines. In the finale, five different pitchers combined on a two-hit shutout. Goose Kallunki leads Utah Valley with a .373 batting overall.

#### A Look At UCLA:

UCLA extended its winning streak to 10 games with a three-game series sweep at then-No. 9 Georgia over the weekend and is 12-3 on the season. Jeff Gelalich went 9-for-13 (.692) in three games at Georgia's Foley Field, while Adam Plutko struck out 11 batters with no walks in his second career complete game on Friday evening and lowered his earned-run average to a 2.13 mark while improving to 2-1 on the season. Gelalich went 4-for-4 with one double, logging a career-high four hits, in the series opener. Through games played Sunday, March 11, Gelalich ranks fifth in the nation with a .491 batting average (27-for-5). The Bruins are batting at a .303 clip, which is 63 points higher than UCLA was hitting after the first 15 games in 2011 (.240). UCLA's pitchers have logged a 3.22 ERA, totaling 111 strikeouts in 134.0 innings. One year ago, UCLA went 8-7 through its first 15 games and had one player (Jeff Gelalich, .302) hitting above .300 at that point. Entering Tuesday's game at Dodger Stadium, UCLA has two players hitting over .400 and five players hitting above .300 (minimum 15 at-bats).

#### **Devils In The NCAA Rankings:**

ASU ranks 10th in the NCAA in batting average at 0.333, 17th in runs per game at eight, fifth with nine triples, and 11th and tops in the Pac-12 in slugging percentage at 0.493. On the mound, ASU is 10th in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 in ERA at 2.08, and 15th in hits allowed per nine innings with 6.85. Individually, **Joey DeMichele** is 11th in the country with a 0.481 batting average, 12th in runs-per-game at 1.43, second in triples with four, and 15th in RBI-per-game with 1.50, slugging percentage at 0.852 and total bases with 46. **Kasey Coffman** leads the Pac-12 and is 29th in the NCAA with nine stolen bases. On the mound, **Brady Rodgers** is 14th in the country with a 0.58 ERA and 25th with 31 strikeouts, and **Trevor Williams** is fifth in the NCAA with four victories (4-0). Both rank 15th with four games started.

#### A Deep Staff:

Arizona State has used 15 pitchers through the first 11 games of the season. The Devils only used 11 all season last year. Right-hander **Mark Lambson**, who appeared in 10 games and threw 23.2 innings in 2011, has not made an appearance yet this season. Six pitchers have also made at least one start this season.

#### Joining The Century Club:

Head coach **Tim Esmay** recorded his 100th win as head coach at ASU with the Devils' 11-2 win over UC Riverside on Feb. 26. Coach Esmay collected 52 wins in his first season at the helm of the Devils en route to a 2010 Pac-10 Championship, a berth in the College World Series and Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors. He followed that up with 43 victories in 2011 and led the Devils to a spot in an NCAA Super Regional. He has five wins through six games this season, giving him a .775 winning percentage through 2-plus years in Tempe.

#### Long Beach Recap:

The baseball team (10-4) took two in a three-game series against Long Beach State in Long Beach, Calif over the weekend. The Sun Devils, playing their second

extra-innings game in the past three contests, beat Long Beach State 3-2 in 12 innings on Friday night. **Andrew Aplin** drove a two-out single to right field for the go-ahead run and right-hander **Jake Barrett** (1-1) earned his first win of the season after pitching three perfect innings in relief. Starting right-hander **Brady Rodgers** went all nine innings and struck out seven in a no-decision. He gave up his first earned run of the season in the second, ending his consecutive scoreless-innings pitched streak at 23 2/3 frames. The Devils fell to Long Beach State 7-3 on Saturday afternoon. After giving up six runs in the first three frames, the Sun Devils held LBSU to one run over the next five innings. ASU closed out the series with a 6-1 win on Sunday. Right-hander **Trevor Williams** recorded his team-leading fourth win of the season after going a career-long eight innings.

#### **Golden Spikes Watch List:**

Three Arizona State student-athletes have been named to USA Baseball's 2012 preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list: **Joey DeMichele, Deven Marrero** and **Brady Rodgers**. **Marrero** was named to the watch list last year as well.

#### **Legacy Devils:**

The 2012 Sun Devil team features four student-athletes with unique connections to Arizona State. Sophomore **Trever Allen** is the son of **Jamie Allen**, who played three seasons at ASU, including the 1977 National Championship year. **Jamie** was a lifetime .333 hitter at ASU and he also went 6-2 on the mound. He was a two-time All-WAC team member and was a member of the 1977 All-College World Series team. Freshman INF/OF **Jake Wakamatsu** also has Maroon and Gold in his blood, as his father **Don** was a four-year letterwinner for Arizona State from 1982 to 1985. A three-year starter at catcher, **Don** was a three-time First Team All-Pac-10 selection and was a member of two Pac-10 Championships teams and twice played in the College World Series. **Don** played for the Chicago White Sox in 1991 and became the first former Sun Devil baseball player to be named a Major League Baseball manager when he was hired by the Seattle Mariners prior to the 2009 season. He is currently the bench coach of the Toronto Blue Jays. Joining **Wakamatsu** and **Allen** as Legacy Devils are redshirt freshman **Tucker Esmay** and sophomore **Michael Benjamin**. Esmay is the son of head coach **Tim Esmay** and **Benjamin** is the son of assistant coach **Mike Benjamin**. The elder **Esmay** and **Benjamin** were teammates on the 1986 and 1987 Sun Devils.

#### **Notable Connections:**

Freshman LHP **Brandon Bonilla's** father Bobby played 16 seasons in the Major Leagues (1986-2001) for eight different teams, including the Chicago White Sox, New York Mets, Los Angeles Dodgers, Atlanta Braves and St. Louis Cardinals. He was a six-time All-Star and won the 1997 World Series as a member of the Florida Marlins. **Brandon** is also the godson of former Sun Devil legend and MLB Home Run King **Barry Bonds**, who was teammates with his father on the Pittsburgh Pirates...Fellow freshman INF **Drew Stankiewicz's** father Andy also played in the Major Leagues, spending seven seasons with the New York Yankees, Houston Astros, Montreal Expos and Arizona Diamondbacks. Andy was an assistant coach at Arizona State from 2007-09, collecting two Pac-10 titles and a trip to the 2009 College World Series, and is currently the head baseball coach at Grand Canyon University...Redshirt sophomore catcher **Beau Maggi** is the brother of **Drew Maggi**, who starred at ASU in 2009 and 2010...Sophomore RHP Mark Lambson is the brother of **Mitchell Lambson**, who made 102 appearances for ASU from 2009-11, tied for the second most in school history... Sophomore shortstop **Deven Marrero** is the cousin of Chris Marrero, a first baseman for the Washington Nationals.

#### 2012 Preseason Honors:

Deven Marrero was the sole unanimous First Team selection in Baseball America's Preseason All-American poll and was one of just six repeat recipients (Second Team in 2011). He was also named a Preseason First Team All-American by Collegiate Baseball, CollegeBaseballInsider.com, Perfect Game and College Baseball Daily, and earned a spot on College Sports Madness' Second Team. He was joined on both NCBWA's Third Team and College Sports Madness' All-Conference First Team by Brady Rodgers and Joev DeMichele, who were both also named honorable mentions by CollegeBaseballInsider. com. Rodgers was selected to the Second Team by Collegiate Baseball and was a Third Team choice by both Baseball America and Perfect Game, while DeMichele was named to Perfect Game's Second Team and College Sports Madness' Fourth Team. Jake Barrett was a Second Team pick by Baseball America. Head coach **Tim Esmay** was selected as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year by College Sports Madness.

#### 2011 Pac-10 Awards:

Arizona State, after finishing second in the Pac-10, took home a litany of conference accolades, headlined by Defensive Player of the Year recipient Deven Marrero. ASU had five First Team All-Pac-10 performers: Austin Barnes, Joey DeMichele, Marrero, Johnny Ruettiger and Riccio Torrez. Alex Blackford, Kramer Champlin, Mitchell Lambson, Zack MacPhee, Matt Newman, Brady Rodgers, Trevor Williams and Zach Wilson all earned Honorable Mentions. DeMichele joined Andy Workman on the Academic All-Pac-10 first team. Marrero and Torrez earned a spot on the Second Team, and Xorge Carrillo and Newman were Honorable Mentions.

#### 2011 All-Americans:

Joey DeMichele earned First Team honors from the ABCA and took home Third Team honors from Baseball America. Trevor Williams earned Freshman All-American honors from Baseball America and Andy Workman was named a Second-Team Academic All-American.

#### **Inter-Conference Battles:**

In addition to facing the schools in the Pac-12, which now includes Utah, the Devils will also take on teams from nine different conferences in 2011. ASU will face three teams from the Big West (Long Beach State, Cal State Fullerton, UC Riverside), two from the Mid-American (Northern Illinois, Western Michigan), two from the West Coast (Gonzaga, Saint Mary's) and one each from the Atlantic 10 (Saint Louis), Big 12 (Texas Tech), Big South (Winthrop), Great West (Utah Valley), Mountain West (New Mexico) and Western Athletic (UNLV).

#### Feeling The Draft:

There are 13 members of the 2012 Sun Devils who have had their name called during the annual Major League Baseball draft, including five freshmen. Everyone except for Max Rossiter, who was drafted following two successful seasons at Central Arizona College, was selected after high school but opted to attend ASU.

#### Pac-12 Picks:

Arizona State was picked to finish third in the 2012 Preseason Pac-10 Coaches' Poll and received one first-place vote. Stanford was picked to finish first, receiving 10 first-place votes, with Arizona in second.

#### **Tough Schedule:**

The Sun Devils will play 19 games this season against teams ranked in the Preseason Top 30, including 10 at Packard Stadium and nine on the road. ASU will host a three-game series against both No. 26 Cal (March 23-25) and No. 22 Oregon State (April 5-7), and will welcome No. 18 Arizona for two separate single-game sets on April 17 and May 16, respectively. No. 19 Cal State Fullerton will also come to Tempe for a two-game tilt March 27-28. The Devils travel to Los Angeles March 16-18 to face No. 20 UCLA and will play No. 2 Stanford in Palo Alto, Calif., April 20-22. They finish the season with a three-game series against the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz., May 25-27.

#### Up Next:

Arizona State have a four-game home stand next weekend. They host UNLV on March 21 for one game, with first pitch set 6:30 p.m. (PT), before playing Cal in a three-game series at Packard Stadium March 23-25. The first two games are will begin at 6:30 p.m. (PT) and the Sunday contest is slated for 12:30 p.m. (PT).
