Pac-10 Player/Pitcher of the Week

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. – OREGON STATE junior catcher **Bryan Ingram** has been named Pac-10 Baseball Player of the Week and USC junior right-hander **Mark Prior** has been named Pac-10 Baseball Pitcher of the Week for March 19-March 26, Commissioner Tom Hansen announced today.

Ingram, from Everett, Wash., batted .636 in Oregon State's 2-1 series win over then-No. 3 Arizona State. His 7-for-11 plate performance included a triple and two sacrifice hits. He also added three runs and three RBI and threw out five baserunners.

Prior, from Bonita, Calif., pitched his second consecutive complete game, with a 8-0 shutout over Arizona. He struck out a career-high 15 batters, while allowing zero earned runs or walks and scattering three hits. One of Prior's most impressive stats to date is that he owns a 95-6 strikeout to walk ratio.

The Player of the Week honor is the first for Ingram in his career, and the 45th selection all-time for OREGON STATE. The Pitcher of the Week honor is the second for Prior in his career, and the 44th selection all-time for USC.

Also nominated for Player of the Week were **Brian Horwitz**, CAL; **Carlos Quentin**, STAN; **Bill Peavey**, USC. Also nominated for Pitcher of the Week were **Jon Switzer**, ASU; **Jason Dennis**, CAL; **Scott Nicholson**, OSU; **Jeff Bruksch**, STAN.

2001 Team Notes

ARIZONA (19-15, 2-4):

Last Week: USC L 0-8, 4-6, 7-8 (10 inn)

This Week: Oregon State

Sancet Field was not friendly to the Wildcats last weekend. Arizona was swept by USC to put them at 2-4 in Conference games ... Freshman CF **Brian Anderson**, senior 1B **Ernie Durazo** and junior DH **Justyn St. Clair** were the only Wildcats that managed to get on base in the first game of the series. USC pitcher Mark Prior notched 15 Ks in that contest ... Senior 3B **Erik Torres** had his eight-game hitting streak stopped in that game after an 0-for-4 plate performance. He did well in the second game of the series, going 3-for-4 with two doubles ... Durazo extended his hitting streak to six games before being halted in the second game of the series. He has hit safely in 32 of Arizona's 34 games this season ... As a team, the Wildcats' average fell a few points to .297 ... Freshman RHP **Sean Rierson** and Senior LHP **Rob Elias** both picked up their third losses on the season. Each will try to rebound this weekend against Oregon State ... Arizona leads the Conference in several categories including hits (363), triples (15), total bases (527), innings pitched (311.0), saves (11), putouts (933) and assists (362).

ARIZONA STATE (19-7-1, 3-3):

Last Week: at Oregon State W 10-2, L 1-4, 2-12 This Week: Stanford

The Sun Devils took one game from Oregon State last weekend in Corvallis. The 10-2 win over the Beavers featured junior LHP **Jon Switzer's** third career complete game and a strong offensive performance from junior RF **Mel Stocker**. Switzer improved to 4-0 by allowing only two earned runs on eight hits while striking out 10 batters. Stocker went 2-for-5 on the day with two runs scored and one RBI. He also stole home ... ASU was outscored 16-3 and out-hit 23-13 in the final two games of the series. The losses marked only the second time the Sun Devils have fallen twice in a row this season ... **Drew Friedberg** has pitched well for ASU. In 10 appearances, the senior lefty has a 0.74 ERA, 3-0 record and has struck out 30 batters in 24.1 innings pitched ... The Sun Devils stand atop several Pac-10 offensive stat categories. ASU leads the Conference in batting with a .351 average, runs scored (272), doubles (68), on base percentage (.453), RBI (243), sacrifice flies (21) and stolen bases (73) ... After two straight Conference series on the road, ASU takes on Stanford at home this weekend.

CALIFORNIA (15-13, 2-4):

Last Week: Washington State L 6-8, 6-7, W 10-1 This Week: Pacific, at Washington

The Bears dropped the first two games against Washington State before beating the Cougars 10-1 in the third game of the series. The double-digit win marks the second Sunday in a row, Cal has exploded offensively. Cal knocked in 10 runs on nine hits in the first two innings of that game. Junior LHP **JasonDennis** got the win after pitching six innings, allowing no earned runs, on four hits with four strikeouts... The Bears struggled offensively in the first two games, marred by seven errors ... Senior 1B **Clint Hoover** hit his 33rd career home run, a grand slam during Friday's game. The homer places him fourth on Cal's all-time list ... Freshman LF **Brian Horwitz** continues on his 23-game hitting streak. His streak is believed to be the longest in Cal history. He has now hit safely in 26 of the 27 games he has played in. He leads the Bears in batting average (.380), doubles (12) and runs scored (22). In the Pac-10, he ranks sixth in batting average, first in doubles, seventh in hits (41) and is tied for eighth in stolen bases (7) ... Freshman 3B **ConoJackson** is riding a 10-game hitting streak. Last weekend he went 4-for-11 with four runs scored ... Cal has a midweek game with Pacific before venturing on their first Pac-10 road trip to Washington.

OREGON STATE (18-10, 2-1):

Last Week: Arizona State L 2-10, W 4-1, 12-2 This Week: at Arizona

Oregon State fared well against then No. 3-Arizona State, taking the final two games to win the series. It marked the first time the Beavers have taken two from the Sun Devils since 1967 ... Oregon State's first win in the series came behind a strong pitching performance from senior **Scott Nicholson**. The lefty pitched a complete game six-hitter in the 4-1 victory. He allowed only one run and struck out four batters ... On the weekend, the Beavers were led offensively by junior C **Bryan Ingram**. Ingram batted .636 (7-for-11), with a triple, three runs

and three RBI. He was awarded his first Pac-10 Player of the Week honor for his efforts ... Oregon State has won 10 of their last 12 games ... The Beavers play a midweek game at Portland before heading to the desert to take on Arizona.

STANFORD (21-5, 3-0):

Last Week: Washington W 9-3, 9-0, 13-4 This Week: at Arizona State

The Cardinal swept Washington in its first Pac-10 series. Stanford has won 19 of its last 21 contests and now stands at 13-1 at Sunken Diamond ... Stanford has beaten the Huskies eight consecutive times dating back to 1999. The series win marks their 14th consecutive regular season series victory dating back to last season ... The Cardinal once again got top pitching performances from sophomore RHP Jeremy Guthrie and junior RHP Jeff Bruksch. Guthrie got the first win of the series after throwing eight innings allowing two earned runs on seven hits while striking out nine. He kept the Huskies scoreless from the second through the seventh innings. Bruksch earned the win in the next game after pitching seven scoreless innings on three hits. He struck out a career-high tying nine batters ... Stanford also got several prolific plate appearances as evidenced by their season-high 16-hit performance in Saturday's 9-0 win ... Junior LF JasonVanMeetren and freshman RF Carlos Quentin led the Cardinal on the weekend. Both players hit .500. VanMeetren went 6-for-12 with six runs scored and four RBI. He added three doubles, a home run and stolen base. Quentin was 7-for-14 with five RBI, a home run and stolen base. He leads the team with a .358 average ... The team is now hitting at a .293 clip ... The Cardinal leads the Pac-10 in pitching (2.77 ERA) and fielding percentage (.978). The next best ERA is Cal's 3.40 ... Stanford continues on in Pac-10 play at Arizona State this weekend.

UCLA (17-7, 1-2):

Last Week: Cal State Los Angeles W 9-6, at Cal State Northridge W 5-4 This Week: at San Diego, at WSU

The Bruins went 2-0 last week taking non-conference games from Cal State Los Angeles and Cal State Fullerton ... The Bruins pounded out 14 hits against the Golden Eagles, as every player in the lineup recorded a hit. Seniors, DH Brian Baron (3-for-5), CF Matt Pearl (2-for-4), and juniors LF Adam Berry (2-for-4) and 3B Randall Shelley had multi-hit games ... Against Cal State Northridge, UCLA scored three runs in the final two innings to give them a one-run edge in the win ... Sophomore lefty MikeKunes picked up his second win after allowing only one hit and one run in 3.1 innings of work ... UCLA ranks third in the Conference in both hitting (.310) and pitching (3.59 ERA). Baron leads the Pac-10 in batting (.517) and on base percentage (.566) ... UCLA is on the road this week, taking on San Diego before heading North to play Washington State.

USC (19-10, 4-2):

Last Week: at Arizona W 8-0, 6-4,m 8-7 (10 inn)

This Week: at CS Fullerton, San Diego State

USC is coming off a weekend sweep at Arizona. The Trojans are now 19-2 in their last 21 games at Sancet Field. The Trojans have won four games in a row, adding a midweek win against Pepperdine ... Junior RHP Mark Prior was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week and Pacific-10 Player of the Week for the second consecutive time for his efforts against the Wildcats. He threw a three-hitter for his second consecutive complete game, shutting out the 'Cats while notching a career-high 15 strikeouts and giving up no free passes. Prior is 6-1 with a 1.36 ERA on the season. In his last four starts he has struck out 52 batters, while allowing only one walk ... Senior SS Seth Davidson set a USC record with his 58th career stolen base. His RBI single in the top of the 10th inning was the game-winner in Sunday's game that sealed the sweep for the Trojans ... As a team, USC has the second-best Conference fielding percentage of .972. They also rank second in walks (126), opposing batting average (.243), innings pitched (263.2) and putouts (791) ... The team leads the Pac-10 in batters struck out (280) ... USC is out of Conference action this week and plays midweek games against Cal State Fullerton and San Diego State.

WASHINGTON (13-7, 2-4):

Last Week: WSU (W 8-3, 7-4) at Stanford (L 3-9, 0-9, 4-13)

This Week: Puget Sound, California

The injury bug has hit Washington. The Huskies had a tough road trip last weekend after being swept by Stanford and were without the help from starters **Marc Rittenhouse**, **Jefferson Thiel** and **Sean White** ... Senior 2B Rittenhouse will remain out for three to five more weeks after undergoing surgery on a thumb ligament.

Sophomore catcher and Johnny Bench award candidate, Thiel, has not caught a game since Mar. 17 due to a partial tear of an elbow ligament. Sophomore RHP White, was slated as last weekend's third-day starter, but lasted only one inning after feeling pain in his right shoulder ... The bright spots for the Huskies have been replacements, freshman **JohnOtness** and junior **Tim Rice**. Since taking over for Rittenhouse, Otness is 11-for-31 (.355) with no errors in 50 fielding chances. Rice has made five starts at catcher and batted .300 (6-for-20)... Sophomore RHP **Scott Robertson** has been impressive in the Husky bullpen. The closer has a 1-0 record with four saves. He has allowed only one run in 7.1 innings pitched, while striking out nine ... Washington plays a midweek game against Puget Sound before taking on California at home.

WASHINGTON STATE (10-17, 2-1):

Last Week: at Washington (L 3-8, 4-7), at California (W 8-6, 7-6, L 1-10)

This Week: UCLA

The Cougars put together a strong showing in their first Pac-10 series, taking two from the Golden Bears in Berkeley. Washington State had dropped two games at Washington earlier in the week ... The Cougars won the first game of the series 8-6, cranking out 16 hits led by junior CF **Evan Hecker**. Hecker's solid plate performance included four hits with two runs scored. Washington State used three double plays to limit Cal's scoring ... In their second win, junior RHP **Justin Cayetano** earned his second win after giving up only one earned run on three hits with three strikeouts in seven innings pitched ... Sophomore 1B **Stefan Bailie** continues to lead the Cougars offensively. His name is marked in several Pac-10 statistical categories including runs scored (9th, 28), slugging percentage (2nd, .714), total bases (5th, 70), RBI (4th, 34) and home runs (3rd, 9) ... Washington State hosts UCLA this weekend in its home opener.

2001 Preseason Notes

Over the Summer: Six Pac-10 players played on the USA National Baseball Team. ARIZONA STATE C Casey Myers and LHP JonSwitzer, STANFORD LHP MikeGosling, UCLA RHP Josh Karp and USC right-handers Mark Prior and Anthony Reyes all helped the USA National Team to a 27-3-1 record. Myers hit .310 with 22 hits, nine RBI and four doubles. Karp had a 3-0 record with 38 strikeouts in 34.2 innings. Prior went 3-2 for a 1.60 ERA and was second on the team with 44 strikeouts. Reyes notched a 2-1 record, while Gosling and Switzer earned one win apiece. Prior was named a first-team summer All-American by Baseball America.

Top Recruits: Collegiate Baseball ranked five Pac-10 teams on their top-30 recruiting list, with three others receiving mention. The list includes No. 3 ARIZONA STATE, No. 6 STANFORD, No. 22 USC, No. 23 ARIZONA, No. 29 WASHINGTON and CAL, UCLA and OSU received mention. Collegiate Baseball compiles its list by giving a school points for every recruit that was drafted, received All-America, All-State or All-League honors, and was named a state or national player of the year.

Attendance Marks: Arizona State and Stanford both posted national marks for attendance during the 2000 season, 9th and 16th for total home attendance, respectively. ASU posted the 14th best mark for average attendance (2,715), while Stanford came in 16th averaging 2,176 fans a game. The Sun Devils posted the second highest attendance in the west, behind Fresno State.

Ballparks: OREGON STATE boasts what is believed to be the second-oldest (1907) college ballpark in the country, behind Vermont (1906). The Beavers have never had any other home field and have an all-time record of 866-371-1 (.700) at Coleman Field. Since the start of the 1993 season, OSU is 114-42 (.731) at home.

Record Watch: Stanford head coach Mark Marquess needs only five more victories to reach 1,000 wins (broken on 2/9)...He would become the 23rd coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach 1,000 ... Arizona's Shelley Duncan needs only six home runs this season to break the school record (36) (broken on 2/4) ... ASU's Casey Myers needs only 78 RBI to break the career school and Pac-10 record held by former teammate Andrew Beinbrink (283) ... Myers had 97 RBI last season ... Trojan Rik Currier is also in line to break a former teammate's record, he needs 91 strikeouts this season to break Seth Etherton's Pac-10 record for career strikeouts (329) ... Currier had 141

record for career strikeouts (329) ... Currier had 141 K's in 2000 ... Trojan Seth Davidson is primed to break some USC records ... He is 53 hits, 35 runs and six stolen bases away from setting new Trojan records ... Husky Jeff Carlsen is only five wins away from Washington's career record (27) ... With 252.1 career innings pitched, Carlsen can also possibly break the UW record of 270.0.

Casey at the Bat: Last season's Pac-10 Player of the Year, Casey Myers, returns to ASU for his senior season behind the plate. Myers hit .412 with 18 home runs and 97 RBI in 2000. Last year he was named a first-team All-American in 2000 by the Sporting News and National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and earned the GTE baseball Academic All-American of the Year honor. A career .380 hitter, Myers is vying for the top spot in the record books for RBI. He needs 78 to break the ASU and Pac-10 record.

Other 2001 Notes: Stanford opens its season on Jan. 21, the earliest start for the Cardinal in its 108 year history ... Sun Devil Casey Myers is the only Pac-10 player listed as a preseason All-American by Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA ... The following players return after being drafted in 2000: Jeff Carlsen, WASH; Seth Davidson, USC; Eric Doble, ASU; Drew Friedberg, ASU; Nick Lyon, UCLA; Casey Myers, ASU and Scott Nicholson, OSU ... Stanford will make its 2001 home debut in a newly remodeled Sunken Diamond when the Cardinal hosts Fresno State in a three-game series starting January 26.

2000 In Review

The 2000 season made history as the first time in 85 years of Pac-10 baseball that three teams shared the Pac-10 Championship. ARIZONA STATE, STANFORD and UCLA all finished the season at 17-7 in Conference play. The Pac-10 sent two teams to the College World Series for the 23rd time, last being in 1998 when USC defeated ASU in the title game. Stanford made its 12th trip to Omaha and swept through its bracket, but fell to Louisiana State 6-5 in the National Championship game. It was the Cardinal's first loss in the championship game, having won titles in 1987 and '88. USC made its 20th appearance in the World Series, going 1-2. Cardinal's Joe Borchard, Edmund Muth, Craig Thompson and Trojan Beau Craig were named to the All-CWS team.

The Pac-10 sent four teams to postseason play for the eighth time in history. ASU was upset in its regional by Texas. UCLA swept through its regional, but was eliminated by LSU in the Super Regionals. Stanford finished 2nd in the final national rankings, while USC was 4 and 5, ASU 12 and 16 and UCLA 15, 16 and 17. ASU's Casey Myers was honored as Pac-10 Player of the Year. Stanford's Justin Wayne and USC's Rik Currier were named co-Pitchers of the Year. USC's Anthony Lunetta earned the first Pac-10 Freshman/Newcomer of the Year award, and ASU's Pat Murphy was honored with his first Coach of the Year award.

Stanford's John Gall inked his name in the Pac-10 record books, breaking the old marks for hits (368), doubles (80), total bases (592) and at bats (1027) in a career. He is the first player to eclipse the 1,000 barrier. Gall also finished with 263 RBI, good for second on the list behind ASU's Andrew Beinbrink. Cardinal Justin Wayne tied a Pac-10 record with 16 consecutive wins. He tied John Olerud of WSU who had 16 consecutive wins during the 1987-88 season. UCLA's Chase Utley and Bill Scott became the third and fourth players in Bruin history to have 100 hits and 20+ home runs (1997- Troy Glaus, 34 HR, 108 hits, Jon Heinrichs, 28, 107). These four are the only ones to reach the feat in Pac-10 history. The also have combined for 218 hits, a Pac-10 record. ASU hit three grand slams Feb. 25, tying the NCAA record. ASU broke the Pac-10 record, scoring in their 279th consecutive game Mar. 12. Their streak is fourth best all-time in NCAA history and currently stands at 313 games.

Fifty players were drafted by Major League Baseball in its annual June amateur draft, 22 of which went in the first 10 rounds. Twenty-one different players were named to All-America teams, including five freshman All-Americans. Seven Pac-10 players were members of the 2000 USA Baseball National Team this summer as well. They included RHP Mike Gosling, STAN, RHP Josh Karp, UCLA, C Casey Myers, ASU, 3B Xavier Nady, CAL, RHP Mark Prior, USC, RHP Anthony Reyes, USC and LHP Jon Switzer, ASU. USC's Mike Gillespie served as head coach.
