Arizona State All-American shortstop **Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.)** is one of only five finalists for the prestigious Golden Spikes Award and became only the fourth player in ASU history to earn three consecutive First-Team All-Pac-10 awards. Pedroia finished second in the Pac-10 hitting .393 (96-for-244) with 24 doubles, 78 runs scored, nine home runs and 49 RBI. He also had a .502 on-base percentage and a .611 slugging percentage. He led ASU with 30 multi-hit games and hit safely in 48 of ASU's 59 games in 2004. He ended his career with 98 multi-hit games and hit safely in 155 of 185 career games. Pedroia put together an unbelievable "Ironman" streak by starting in all 185 games of his ASU career and ranks seventh with a .384 career batting average. He fell just two hits shy of reaching 300 for his career, but still ranks fourth with 298 career hits and third with 71 doubles. Here is a look at Pedroia's career and 2004 season highlights:

- Second-round selection (65th overall) by the Boston Red Sox in the 2004 MLB June Amateur Draft.
- Hit .393 (96-for-244) in 2004 with 24 doubles, nine home runs, 48 RBI and a .502 on-base percentage.
- Golden Spikes Award Finalist and Dick Howser Player of the Year Award Semifinalist.
- 2004 First-Team Sports Weekly/USA Today All-American.
- 2004 second-team *Collegiate Baseball*/Louisville Slugger All-American.
- 2004 First-Team All-Pac-10 selection, becoming fourth ASU player to earn three consecutive All-Pac-10 awards.
- Hit safely in 48 of 59 games in 2004 and 155 of 185 in his career. Led the team with 34 extra base hits (24 2B, 1 3B, 9 HR).
- Recorded 30 multi-hit games this season and 98 in his career. Had 15 multi-hit games in ASU's last 25 contests.
- Has a pair of 10-game hitting streaks this season and seven career streaks of 10 or more games.
- Tied for the team lead with nine home runs and had 14 in his career. Entered the season with only five career homers.
- Rated as the No. 53 overall prospect by Baseball America and No. 16 rated position player for the 2004 MLB Draft.
- A career .384 (298-for-777) hitter to rank fourth in hits (298) and tied for seventh in batting (.384) in the ASU record books.
- Hit 71 career doubles, ranking third in the ASU career record book.
- Set the ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 34 doubles in 2003. Old ASU record was 30 by Chris Bando in 1978.
- Named the 2003 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year with Stanford's Ryan Garko and was a first-team All-American.
- Named the 2003 Defensive Player of the Year, he has a career .974 fielding percentage with only 21 errors in 802 total chances.
- Starting shortstop for USA Baseball National Team in 2002 and 2003, leading Team USA to a bronze medal in the Pan Am Games.
- NCAA All-Regional selection in 2002 (Mesa), 2003 (Tempe) and 2004 (Fullerton). Named 2003 Tempe Regional Most Outstanding Player.

**CAREER SUMMARY:** Put together three of the best seasons in Arizona State baseball history... completed his career with a .384 (298-for-777) batting average to rank tied for seventh in the record books... was also fourth with 71 career doubles and fourth with 298 hits... came only two hits shy of becoming the first Sun Devil player to reach 300 career hits in only three years... started all 185 games of his Sun Devil career... a three-time First-Team All-Pac-10 selection... joins Alvin Davis, Don Wakamatsu and Andrew Beinbrink as the only Sun Devils to earn three All-Pac-10 awards... recorded 98 career multi-hit games and had a career .972 FLD%... sixth in school history with 212 runs scored, averaging 1.15 runs scored per game during his career... hit safely in 155 of his 185 (84%) career games... two-time USA Baseball National Team starting shortstop... three-time On Deck Circle Team MVP... described by head coach Pat Murphy as a throwback style of player... gave back his scholarship after his freshman season... described by former UNLV and current TCU head coach Jim Schlossnagle as the "Pete Rose of College Baseball".

**2003 (Sophomore):** Recorded one of the best single-season offensive and defensive performances in ASU history... named Pac-10 co-Player of the Year with Stanford's Ryan Garko and was nearly a consensus first-team All-American... selected as a first-team All-American by *Collegiate Baseball*, *ESPN/Sports Weekly*, ABCA, NCBWA and *CollegeBaseballInsider.com*... a second-team pick by *Baseball America* and was the District IX Player of the Year (NCBWA)... selected for second straight year to play for the USA Baseball National Team... set ASU and Pac-10 single-season record with 34 doubles and led the NCAA... the old ASU record for doubles was 30 set by Sal Bando (1978) and the Pac-10 record was previously held by former WSU Cougar and current Los Angeles Dodger Mike Kinkade (31, 1994)... also ranked 31st in the NCAA in batting and was the fourth toughest to strikeout (1 K every 22.8 at-bats)... finished the season hitting .404 (120-for-297), marking the 16th time a Sun Devil has finished the season hitting over .400... only 11th Sun Devil to record over 100 hits and hit over .400 in the same season... his 120 hits are fourth most in ASU single-season history and his 297 at-bats are fourth most... finished second in the Pac-10 in hitting (.404), sixth in on-base percentage (.472), first in runs scored (83), first in hits (120), second in total bases (172) and sixth in walks (36)... finished the season at .404 despite going 0-for-13 in the super regional against Cal State Fullerton... named the Tempe Regional Most Outstanding Player after going 8-for-16 (.500)... also named MVP of the Coca-Cola Classic hitting .417 (5-for-12) and was named to the all-tournament team at the Bob Schaefer Memorial Classic... named one of 25 players on the initial Golden Spikes Award Watch List... recorded 41 multi-hit games and went hitless in only seven games all year... was the only Sun Devil to play and start in all 68 games... of his 41 multi-hit games, 15 were with three or more hits... recorded four separate hitting streaks of 10 or more games and five streaks of eight or more games... started the season with an 11-game streak going 20-for-45 (.444)... also had a 17-game streak in February and early March in which he went 34-for-72 (.472)... defensively did not make an error in his last 26 games (124 total chances) and finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage... named Pac-10 Player of the Week (5/19) after going 10-for-23 (.435) in a five-game stretch at Oregon State and Washington... in addition to his 34 doubles, also had three triples and four home runs to lead the team with 41 extra base hits... hit .478 (43-for-90) with runners in scoring position... repeated as team member of USA Baseball National team... hit .294 (30-for-102) for Team USA with five doubles, one home runs and 12 RBI... started 28 of 29 games and helped lead Team USA to a 27-2 record and a silver medal in the 2003 Pan Am Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic... named to the Pan Am Games All-Tournament Team... named a first-team Summer All-American by *Baseball America*.
