Leading Off:

The Arizona State Sun Devils will make their 30th NCAA Tournament appearance this weekend when they head to Houston, Texas in the Houston Regional hosted by Rice. ASU is the #2 seed in the regional and will take on the third seeded Baylor Bears in the opening game of the Tournament. This is the seventh consecutive tournament bid for the Sun Devils.

The Sun Devils at the Houston Regional:

ASU will see some familiar foes in the Houston Regional at Rice. The Devils will open with Baylor on Friday night, a team they faced in February in Waco. The Devils took two of three at Baylor Ballpark. They also faced Rice in March at the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi. Arizona State beat the #1 ranked Owls 6-5 in 10 innings. The Sun Devils have never faced Prairie View.

RB-Ike! RB-Ike!:

Ike Davis closed out his first regular season in style, drawing a bases loaded, game-winning walk to sweep Cal on Sunday. That RBI gave Davis 65 on the season, a new Arizona State freshman record. It also gave **Davis** the most RBI in the Pac-10 during the regular season, one more than Chris Minaker of Stanford. Ike's 77 hits tied him with Colin Curtis for the team lead and are the fourth most hits by a freshman in school history. Dustin Pedroia had 82 during his debut season in 2002. The nine home runs by Davis ties Bob Horner for third most by a freshman, two short of **Barry Bonds**. Davis was named the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year for his efforts.

Rankings:

The Sun Devils are ranked #16 by Baseball America in their final regular season poll. They are ranked #17 by Collegiate Baseball and #18 by the NCBWA. The USA Today Coaches Poll has them at #14. ASU rose to as high as #10 in all four polls at some point this season.





Head Coach Pat Murphy

Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, while at the same time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State University to Top 12 rankings in five of the past nine seasons, including last season's third place finish at the 2005 College World Series. In his eleven seasons in Tempe. Murphy owns a record of 473-240-1. In his 18 seasons at the Division I level, Murphy has a record of 794-356-2. He has led ASU to CWS berths in 1998 and 2005, was the Baseball America Coach of the Year in 1998 and was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 2000.

Cal Wrap-Up:

The Sun Devils closed out the 2006 regular season on the right foot, sweeping the California Golden Bears at Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark...Josh **Satow** got the start on the hill Friday night, going five innings to pick up the win. Satow allowed only one run on four hits before giving way to Brady Martinez. Martinez threw the final four innings, striking out six to earn the save in the 13-5 ASU victory. Colin Curtis went 3-5, knocking in four runs to lead the Sun Devil offense. Eric Sogard also had three RBI for ASU...Tony Barnette was once again impressive, fanning ten in seven innings on Saturday night as the Devils picked up a 9-3 win. Mike Jones went 2-3 and had the game-winning RBI in his first plate appearances of the season...Sunday saw ASU jump to an early 3-0 lead, only to allow six Cal runs in the third innings to find themselves in a 6-3 hole. The pitching staff would not allow a run the rest of the way, giving the offense time to chip away at the lead. Eric Sogard evened things up in the ninth with his two-run double, and ASU walked away with the win when Ike Davis walked with the bases loaded in the eleventh inning. Brett Bordes picked up his team-leading seventh victory of the season as the Devils earned their first Pac-10 series sweep of the season.

Ike Davis, Pac-10 Freshman of the Year:

Ike Davis was named Freshman of the Year by the Pacific-10 Conference, becoming the first Sun Devil to earn the award. **Davis** is batting .339 with nine home runs and a conference leading 65 RBI. The 65 runs batted in are a new ASU freshman record.

First Team All-Pac-10:

Four Sun Devils garnered All-Pac-10 honors, led by Freshman of the Year **Ike Davis**. **Davis** was joined by **Colin Curtis, Preston Paramore** and **Eric Sogard** on the first team. **Daryl Arreola, Tony Barnette, Brett Bordes** and **Brett Wallace** all earned Honorable Mentions. **Curtis** and **Bordes** both earned Honorable Mentions in 2005, a vear that saw two Sun Devils earn First Team honors.

30 Win Mark:

2006 is the 44th straight season Arizona State has surpassed the 30-win total, and 46th time in school history. Head Coach **Pat Murphy** has won over 30 games every season since he began coaching Division I baseball at Notre Dame in 1988. ASU finished the regular season with 36 victories. Last year they ended regular season play with 34 wins.


Pac-10 All-Academic Team Honors:

Two Sun Devils earned Academic All-Pac-10 honors in 2006. Junior **Joe Persichina** and sophomore **Willy Fox** were both named to the All-Pac-10 All-Academic Second Team. This is the second straight selection for **Persichina**, who was an Honorable Mention a season ago. In order to qualify for the honor, a student-athlete must be a significant contributor to the team and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. True freshmen and transfer students are not eligible.

Old Reliable:

No one in the history of Arizona State University baseball has more career pitching appearances than senior lefty **Brett Bordes**. **Bordes** has pitched in 29 games this season, giving him 107 career appearances. Earlier this year **Bordes** broke the ASU record held by **Kendall Carter**, who appeared in 102 games from 1981 to 1984. Of the 107 games **Bordes** has pitched in, 95 of them have come in a relief role, including all 29 this year. **Bordes** leads the team with his 7-1 record and is second with four saves.

For Starters:

Head Coach **Pat Murphy** has used 11 different starting pitchers this season after using only eight a season ago. **Ike Davis** leads ASU with 12 games started, yet he has started only twice in the past 29 games. In all, 16 different Sun Devils have climbed the hill this year. **Zechry Zinicola** began the season as a starter, was moved to the closer role, sat out after being suspended, then returned to the starting rotation, and is now back in the closer position.

Facing The Best:

Arizona State has faced some of the top pitchers in the Pac-10 Conference this season, including three who went on to win Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors after facing the Devils. Washington's **Tim Lincecum** was named after his win on April 7 against ASU, UCLA's **Dave Huff** picked up the honor after his win over the Devils on April 22, and Stanford's **Greg Reynolds** was given the award after his April 28 win over ASU. Arizona State has faced seven pitchers who are rated as Top 50 prospects by *Baseball America*: UW's **Lincecum** (#2), Houston's **Brad Lincoln** (#3), Stanford's **Reynolds** (#5), Cal's **Brandon Morrow** (#10), UCLA's **Huff** (#22), USC's **Ian Kennedy** (#40) and Oregon State's **Dallas Buck** (#48).

Walk This Way:

ASU was among the Pac-10 leaders in walks, drawing 256, second most in the conference. Willy Fox (36), Colin Curtis (34) and Preston Paramore (33) all ranked in the top six.

Hit Me!:

Arizona State finished regular season play as the best hitting club in the Pac-10 Conference. The Devils hit .321 during their 55 game regular season, tops in the conference. ASU has led the conference for six of the past eight years and has hit over .300 as a team every season **Pat Murphy** has been in Tempe.

Beep Beep:

Colin Curtis has set a new career high this season with 21 stolen bases. The junior outfielder stole 17 last season and 12 in his freshman season. **Curtis** finished the regular season tied with Arizona's **Brad Boyer** for the conference lead.

Lone Star Record:

Heading to Houston, the Devils have become very familiar with the Lone Star state in 2006. Arizona State played 12 regular season games against teams from Texas this season, finishing with a 9-3 record, including a 5-3 mark in Texas. They won two of three from Baylor in Waco and won all three games of the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi, including a 6-5 win over Rice. They lost to Texas at Austin and fell to Texas Tech in Lubbock.

Honors:

Sophomore second baseman **Eric Sogard** was named Pac-10 Player of the Week for his play vs. USC and Texas Tech...Sophomore shortstop **Andrew Romine** was named to the College Baseball Foundation's Honor Roll and was named Pac-10 Player of the Week for his performance against Washington State and Arizona...Freshman lefty **Jeff Urlaub** was named to the College Baseball Foundation's Honor Roll for the week of February 21st...**Ike Davis** earned a spot on the Honor Roll for the week of March 7th, the same week he earned National

Player of the Week and Pac-10 Player of the Week honors.

Ranked Opponents:

The Sun Devils played 30 of their 55 games against teams that spent at least one week ranked in one of the four major polls. They finished 18-12 in those games, inlcuding wins over #1 Rice

and #4 Oregon State. ASU won 12 of the 16 weekend three-game series, sweeping Northern Illinois, Houston, Auburn, the Whataburger College Classic, Penn State and California.

Two Out Blues:

The Devils have no trouble getting two outs in an inning, it's closing out the frame where the Sun Devils struggle. Arizona State has allowed 151 two-out runs this season, 44% of the 329 runs they have allowed this year.

Mike Jones! Who? Mike Jones!:

When the line-up was announced on Friday night for the game with Cal, starting in center field was none other than freshman Mike Jones, the same Mike Jones who is a wide receiver on the Sun Devil football team. Jones, who joined the baseball team mid-season, made the most of his opportunity. He started all three games, although did not bat on Friday. When he did get to hit he made a difference, going 3-7, drawing a walk, scoring three runs and knocking in the game-winning run on Saturday night. It's been quite a spring for **Jones**, who had an impressive showing in the spring football game to lock up a starting job for the fall. He is the first athlete to play baseball and football in the same season at ASU since Jon Sheaffer in 2000-2001

Big League Devils:

Arizona State has five former Sun Devils currently in the Major Leagues. Barry Bonds (San Francisco), Willie Bloomquist (Seattle), Paul LoDuca (NY Mets), and Ian Kinsler (Texas) were joined by Andre Ethier, who became the 84th Sun Devil to play in the big leagues. He made his debut with the Los Angeles Dodgers against the Diamondbacks in his hometown of Phoenix on May 2nd. ASU trails only USC and Texas for the most Major Leaguers in NCAA baseball history.

Honoring '81:

Prior to the Sun Devils game with the Beavers on Sunday, May 14th, Arizona State University retired the numbers of Alvin Davis (#9) and Kevin Romine (#12) who were both members of the 1981 National Championship team. Davis and Romine became the 15th and 16th players to have their

numbers retired by the baseball program.

Johnny Bench Award Watch:

Freshman catcher Preston Paramore has been named to the 2006 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award Watch List, the award given to the best collegiate catcher. The list features 26 catchers from 15 conferences, with **Paramore** one of only two backstops from the Pac-10 on the list. **Paramore** is also the only freshman on the list. This is the third straight season in which ASU has had a catcher on the

Watch List, as **Tuffy Gosewisch** was a semi-finalist for the award in each of the last two seasons.

Stopper of the Year Watch:

Junior RHP Zechry Zinicola was named to the Stopper of the Year Watch List, the award given to the best relief pitcher in college baseball. Zinicola has made 19 appearances this year, 17 of them in relief. He leads the team with six saves and is third in school history with 18 career saves.

Gene Autry Winner:

On March 20th, Colin Curtis was honored as a recipient of the Gene Autry Courage Award at a banquet in Tempe. For 13 years the awards have been presented to athletes who have overcome obstacles. Curtis was diagnosed with testicular cancer as a freshman at Issaquah High School, but has now been cancer-free for more than five years. Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim manager Mike Scioscia presented Colin with the award, which is named for the legendary actor and cowboy who once owned the Angels franchise. Dr. Jim Brock received an Autry Award posthumously in 1995.

Colin Curtis, All-American:





Junior OF **Colin Curtis** was named a First Team Preseason All-American by *Baseball America*, as well as a Preseason All-Pac-10 selection. **Curtis** hit .342 last season, knocking in 45 runs and stealing 17 bases. He was named to the All-College World Series Team and the All-Tempe Regional Team.

Coaches Voted Devils Third in Pre-Season Pac-10 Poll:

Arizona State was picked to finish in a tie with Stanford for third in the Pac-10 according to the Annual Pac-10 Preseason Coaches Poll. Oregon State, who won the Pac-10 last season, had been picked to win it again this season. The Beavers did indeed finish at the top of the conference, with ASU finishing second.
