Coming Attractions: With only Pac-10 contests remaining on the schedule, the Wildcats are off to their annual three-game meeting with instate rival Arizona State. The Wildcats trail the Sun Devils 132-156 in the all-time series and the Pac-10 Co-Champs handed Arizona its worst loss in school history last season with a 32-3 pounding in a non-conference game in Tempe. This season the two teams are tied at 7-8 in the conference race with nine conference games remaining.

Wildcats on the Air: Ryan Radtke and Brian Jeffries of 790 KNST will bring all three days of the Wildcat-Sun Devil action to the radio. KNST has been providing coverage of Arizona athletics as its flagship station for 20 seasons. In addition to radio coverage, Fox Sports Net has selected Saturday's game as its Pac-10 Game of the Week. The game, originally scheduled for 7 p.m., has been bumped to 1 p.m. to accommodate the T.V. cover-

Arizona's Last Game: The Wildcats over came a seven run deficit to salvage game three in the series with California last weekend. Trailing 9-2 early on, the Cats tied the game in the ninth at 11-11 and Brian Anderson's single in the tenth brought home Shelley Duncan from third for the winning run. Anderson, who finished the game 3-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored, also earned his first collegiate victory on the mound. The freshman worked the final two innings surrendering only a one-out single in the tenth.

Anderson's April: Center fielder Brian Anderson has been one of the Arizona's top hitters for the month of April. Starting all 11 games, the first-year Wildcat leads the team with a .522 batting average (24-for-46) collecting at least one hit in 10 of the 11 games during that span. In six of the 11 games he has multiple hits and multiple RBI, including a career game-high five against Cal (2/22). He has scored 10 runs and driven in 19 in while his on-base percentage of .569 trails only senior teammate Ernie Durazo's .576 in the month.

Three and Counting: Already the career home run leader at Arizona, junior Shelley Duncan's assault on the Arizona home run record book continues. Heading into this weekend's action, the slugger needs only three more home runs to tie George Arias (1993) for the school's single-season home run record of 23. He is also only one four-bagger away from tying Dave Shermet's Arizona record for career conference home runs of 17. Duncan slugged eight his freshman year, two in the injury plagued 2000 campaign and he has hit six against Pac-10 foes this season. See page three of the notes for a break down on Duncan's career power surge.

Opening Up the Record Books: A quick glance into the Arizona record books reveals that the seven home runs hit by the Cats in April 8th's game against Washington State broke a 17-year old school record for HR in a single game. The previous record of six was accomplished by the 1974 team against BYU. Of Arizona's 18 hits in the game, 11 went for extra bases. The mark ties the 1985 team for a single game. Matt Abram, who finished the game 5-for-5 with a single, a double, a triple and two home runs, ended up tied for third with Ron Hassey (1974) for the most total bases in a single game. His 14 TBs were just one shy of the school record shared by Dennis Haines (1972) and Kevin Long (1988).

It's a Cycle Built For Two: For just the 10th and 11th times in school history Arizona players have hit for the cycle. Only six days apart from each other sophomore Matt Abram and junior Shelley Duncan came up with games in which they singled, doubled, tripled and homered. Arizona now owns half of the 22 cycles hit in Pac-10 history. Abram went for the cycle first when tripled in the first, doubled in the third, homered in the fifth and singled in the seventh against Washington State on April 8. Six days later, on April 13, Duncan doubled in the first, homered in the third, singled in the fourth and fifth and hit just his second career triple in the sixth against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Amazingly, Cougar shortstop Bookie Gates was only a triple away from hitting for the cycle in the same game as Abram and Wildcat senior Erik Torres needed only a double in the game against TAMU-CC. Both Abram and Duncan were perfect at the plate, finishing their respective games 5-for-5. Arizona's "Cyclists"

At First Glance: After a quick search through the past Arizona box scores it is believed that Shelley Duncan's five-game home run streak was the third longest in school history. Duncan hit six home runs in five contests (April 7-14). George Arias hit a round-tripper in seven straight games from Feb. 27-March 12, 1993 and Jason Hendricks (1996-98) homered in six straight games from Jan. 25-Feb 6, 1998.

Viva Ernesto: Since having his school-record-tying 28-game hitting streak snapped in the second game against UCLA, Ernie Durazo has hit in 19 of Arizona's last 21 games to give him at least one hit in 44 of Arizona's 47 games this season.

The Cats in the Pac: The Wildcats continue to lead the Pac-10 in a number of offensive statistical categories. UA leads the conference in runs (381), hits (553), triples (27), total bases (827), at bats (1734) and plate appearances (1,981). The Cats also lead with 340 RBI. They are currently second to Oregon State in home runs (44). On the mound, Arizona leads in innings pitched (425). The pitching staff is also second in wins (23), saves (12) and runners picked off (11). Individually, Ernie Durazo leads the conference with 51 runs and 17 doubles and is second in hits (68). He ranks third in RBI with 51 and fifth in average (.399). Pac-10 home run leader Shelley Duncan (20) is also the Pac-10 leader RBI (63). He is second in runs scored (54) and in walks (29). He leads in slugging (.700) and sixth in hits (64). Erik Torres tops the triples list with six. See page four of the notes for the league leaders and where the Wildcats rank.

Impressive Improvements: Although the Arizona pitching staff is composed mostly of newcomers to the Wildcat program, they are way ahead of the UA pitching performance of last season. Through 47 games, the 2001 squad has a team ERA of 5.46 in 425 innings pitched, an improvement of just under two runs better than 2000's 7.23 ERA through 47 games and 411 innings pitched. While strikeouts are down (329 in 2001, 405 in 2000), so too are walks (169 in 2001, 252 in 2000, an improvement of 83 less free passes). The 2000 K-to-BB ratio is much better (2.0-1.6) as well. Opponents are also hitting 13 points lower against the 2001 staff (.291-.306). All the improvements have translated into six more victories through 47 games this season.

**The Streak Ends:** Senior Ernie Durazo's 28-game hit streak came to an end in the second game of the UCLA series (May 19, 2000 -March 9, 2001) to earn him a tie with Jack Daugherty for the top spot on the all-time list at Arizona. Durazo finished his streak with 42 hits in 117 at bats for a .359 average. The No. 3 hitter in Arizona's lineup also drove in 30 runs and scored 24 times himself during the streak.

**Streak Notes:** Durazo's 25-game hitting streak was the longest streak for any Wildcat single season ... Among the two-season hit streaks, Durazo is the only player to extend the majority of his streak further into the next season (three in 2000 - 25 in 2001). Daugherty had at least one hit in the final 23 games of '81 and first five of '82. Hurd had a hit in the final 23 games of '57 and first two of '58 and Stegman hit in the last 18 games of '74 and the first six of '75.

**Doin' It With Two:** The Wildcats have scored 381 runs in 47 games this season, an average of 8.1 runs per game. Impressively, nearly half, 169 runs and 44% to be exact, have come with two outs in an inning. The Wildcats have scored as many as ten in a single game (1/26 vs. BYU) and have plated all their runs in a game with two outs four times (1/19 at Hawaii-Hilo, 1/31 vs. St. Mary's, 2/2 vs. Long Beach State, 3/9 at UCLA).

**Tops With Two Out:** Senior Ernie Durazo, junior Shelley Duncan and sophomore Matt Abram lead the way for the Cats with two down in an inning. Durazo and Duncan, who lead the team with 51 and 63 RBI overall, have knocked runners home 27 and 30 times, respectively, with two out, including Durazo's three run homer against Long Beach (2/2) and Duncan's six in three games against Washington State. Abram is close behind with 20 two-out RBI. Durazo sports a nifty .442 batting average with two gone while Abram checks in at .312 and Duncan at .351. As a team Arizona is hitting .314 with two out.

Now Batting... Brian Anderson: Freshman Brian Anderson accomplished a rare feat against Texas A&M (2/18) when he led off an inning four consecutive times. The No. 7 hitter in the Arizona batting order, Anderson got his first opportunity to bat in the third inning, he singled and score a run. His hit that inning would start a string of three straight innings of Arizona sending nine hitters to the plate. In the fourth Anderson reached on an error and scored. In the fifth he tripled to leadoff the inning and again scored and finally in the sixth he singled again and again come around to score. For those of you keeping track, credit Anderson with three hits and four runs scored in four consecutive innings as a leadoff hitter.

**One Way To Score:** Ernie Durazo made his way around the bases in the game against Houston (3/14) in a rather unusual way. Durazo walked in first and then proceeded to advance to second, third and eventually score on three wild pitches by Houston starter Michael Reiss. Reiss would finish the game with four wild pitches to his credit.

Cycling Part Two - Pac-10 Player of the Week-Shelley Duncan: Junior Shelley Duncan was named the April 9-15 Player of the Week by the Pac-10 Conference for his efforts against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. In addition

to hitting for the cycle, the second in six days, the slugger wrapped up the three game series with 10 RBI and eight runs scored on .615 hitting (8-for-13). He hit a home run in each game and improved his overall batting average 22 points. Duncan led the team with an outstanding 1.538 slugging percentage against the Islanders. It was the third time this season an Arizona player had been honored and the second consecutive week.

Two of Every Kind - Pac-10 Player of the Week- Matt Abram: Pac-10 Player of the Week for April 2-9 Matt Abram hit .533 (8-for-15) with two singles, two doubles, two triples and two home runs for the weekend. He also chipped in with six RBI and six runs scored. It was the second time this season (Ernie Durazo - 3/19) that a Wildcat player has been named to the honor and the 35th all-time for an Arizona player.

**Dependable Durazo - Pac-10 Player of the Week - Ernie Durazo:** Senior Ernie Durazo became the first Arizona Pac-10 Player of the Week this season for his exploits in the week of March 12-18. The first baseman hit .667 in four games (10-for-15) with nine RBI and nine runs scored. He hit two home runs and a triple, assisting him to a 1.200 slugging percentage against Houston and Southern Utah.

**Not Since...:** Shelley Duncan and Matt Abram's back-to-back home runs against Washington State (4/8) were the first consecutive jobs for the Wildcats since Duncan and Ernie Durazo did it against Long Beach this season (2/3). Erik Torres and Kenny Huff hit back-to-back home runs against Washington State last season ... Ernie

Durazo's five hit game against Southern Utah (3/16) was the first for a Wildcat since April 22, 2000 when Kenny Huff hit for the cycle against Washington State. Matt Abram and Shelley Duncan matched Huff's feat with their five-hit cycles against Washington State (4/8) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi... Marc Kaiser's complete game performance against Oregon State (3/30) was the first since Ben Diggins went all nine against Cal on March 17, 2000.

He's Got Clout: With two round trippers against Long Beach (2/4) outfielder Shelley Duncan became the all-time home run leader in Arizona history. Duncan tied the record with a two-run blast to left in the first inning. The record would be the Tucson native's alone six innings later when he muscled a 1-0 pitch over the center field wall for a three run dinger. Duncan also set a personal best with seven RBI in the game. The junior swatted a freshman record 20 home runs in 1999 and tallied 11 in 32 games last season. Kenny Corley, who played for Arizona from 1995-98, was the all-time leader with 36 prior to Duncan. Corley's brother, Klent, is a redshirt freshman right-hander for the Wildcats this season and is Duncan's roommate.

**Best Of:** Baseball America has announced its "Best Tools" in the Pac-10 for 2001. Shelley Duncan is listed as having the best raw power in the conference. He is also projected as the Pac-10's most draftable position player. Freshman Marc Kaiser is noted as one of the top three high school players to bypass the pros and enroll in school. The publication has also ranked Duncan as the 19th best college prospect for the 2001 draft, teammate Kenny Huff is listed at no. 97.

Preseason Honors: Junior outfielder Shelley Duncan has been named to two preseason All-America teams in 2001. A second-team All-American by Baseball America and a third-team Collegiate Baseball honoree, it is the second consecutive year that he has been named All-America by both publications. Duncan hit .332 in 32 games last season while tying for the team lead in home runs with 11.

Round Trip Airfare: Outfielder Shelley Duncan tied an Arizona school record with three home runs in consecutive at-bats against Utah (2/23). Three other Wildcats had three HRs in a game prior to Duncan. Dennis Haines was first in 1972, followed by Arizona Hall of Famer Ron Hassey in 1974 and finally Duncan's teammate Erik Torres last season. He finished the game 4-for-4 with four runs and five RBI. Duncan's three at-bats, three home runs ties him with Ron Hassey for the most consecutive four baggers in a row.

In Dedication to Kelsey: The Wildcats have dedicated the 2001 season to their teammate Kelsey Osburn. Osburn, an infielder for Arizona the past two seasons, passed away on July 17, 2000 after being struck by a ball during batting practice in a summer league game in New York. The Wildcats have his number, 41, stitched into the back of their caps and retired his jersey in a ceremony at Sancet Field on Jan. 27. The Osburn family has established a scholarship fund in Kelsey's honor for future Wildcat athletes. Retired Jerseys: Kelsey Osburn joins a select group on the left field wall of Frank Sancet Field. Arizona has retired only four jerseys in its history; former head coach Jerry Kindall, former assistant coach Jim Wing, All-American Terry Francona and Osburn's.

**Head Coach Jerry Stitt:** Now in his fifth season as the skipper of Arizona baseball, head coach Jerry Stitt has compiled a 152-121 (.557) record in his first four-plus seasons. In 1999 he took the Wildcats to the postseason for the first time since 1993. Only the fourth coach to lead Arizona since 1922, Stitt also played three seasons for the Wildcats from 1966-68. He joined the Arizona staff in 1978 as an assistant coach. In 1992 he was named associate head coach before being promoted to the head spot on July 3, 1996.


