NATIONAL RANKINGS

Arizona State (27-16, 9-6) kept its streak alive by staying in the national polls for the 53rd straight week with a No. 19 ranking from Baseball Weekly/ESPN. The Devils fell out of the Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball polls despite winning two of the last three. Stanford, the preseason No. 1, is currently ranked No. 7 by Baseball America, No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 7 by Baseball Weekly.

MEDIA EXPOSURE

All three games vs. the Stanford Cardinal can be heard over the airwaves on XTRA 910 in the Phoenix area with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all of the action from Sunken Diamond. ASU Baseball fans can also listen around the world via the internet webcast at www.TheSunDevils.com. The LiveStats feature will once again be available this weekend with live scoring updated after every play. ASU will next be on TV May 18 vs. USC at Hohokam Park (KAZ-TV).

SETTING UP THE SERIES

The Sun Devils (27-16, 9-6) head into a crucial threegame series with Stanford (33-13, 9-6) this weekend having won two of the past three and six of the last 10 games overall. Locked in a three-way tie for third place in the conference with Stanford and Oregon State, ASU plays its remaining nine conference games against three of the top four teams in the league. ASU will conclude its road schedule this weekend at Sunken Diamond, having not played at Stanford since enduring consecutive sweeps in 1998 and 1999. No player on the current ASU roster has ever played at Sunken Diamond. The Sun Devils will be without two of their leading hitters with Jon Sheaffer (.364) currently suspended and Andre Ethier (.362) out with a broken thumb.

What's On Tap:

With only 11 games remaining in 2002, the 19th-ranked Sun Devils take to the road for the final time this season with a three-game weekend series at No. 7 Stanford. Posting a 7-9 record in 2002 on the road this year, the Devils will meet the Cardinal in a crucial three-game Pac-10 series starting Friday night at 6 p.m. ASU and Stanford are currently tied for third in the Pac-10, two games behind leader USC. Following the series with Stanford, ASU will complete its non-conference schedule with two midweek games against Portland before hosting Pac-10 rival USC next weekend (May 17-19) at Hohokam Stadium. ASU will close out its 2002 regular season schedule with Oregon State (May 24-26).

- Pat Murphy is currently four wins short for 300 in his ASU career. He recently coached in his 1,000th career game. The Sun Devils are 15-6 when not hitting a home run this year, while just 12-10 when at least one player connects for a homer.
- Dustin Pedroia is hitting .391 in Pac-10 play and has only two errors in the field in 167 total chances (.988 FLD %).
- The Sun Devils had their string of eight consecutive Pac-10 series victories snapped vs. Cal in their last league series.
- Dustin Pedroia is the only Sun Devil to play and start in all 43 games this year. He has started at three positions.
- Since hitting home runs in all three games vs. WSU (4/5-5/7), Jeremy West is only 6-for-30 (.200) in his last nine games.
- Starting catcher Cesar Castillo is hitting .438 (7x16) with two doubles and five RBI during his current five-game hit streak.
- Of ASU's 330 runs scored this year, 165 (50%) have come with two outs. ASU also has 100 1-out runs and 65 0-out runs.
- Robbie McClellan is 5-2 as a starter this year and is fourth in the Pac-10 with his 75 strikeouts in 76.1 innings.
- Through 43 games, ASU has four complete games. The Devils had only one all of last year (Jon Switzer). The Devils have scored in the first inning in 24 of their 43 games (56%). ASU is 19-5 when scoring in the first.
- The Sun Devils have used 34 different lineups this year, including a string of 26 different lineups in the last 27 games.
- ASU has scored in a NCAA record 418 consecutive games dating back to April 7, 1995. The old record was 349.
- In his 14 appearances out of the bullpen (22.2 IP), sophomore Ryan Schroyer has struck out 33 batters (0.79 ERA).
- ASU returned only 39.5% of hits, 38.7% of RBI, 38.6% of runs, 24.3% of pitching wins and 37.9% of K's from last year.

More Ouick Hits:

- Andre Ethier is second in the team in hitting at .362 and has 16 multi-hit games. He is currently out with a broken left thumb.
 - Sophomore RHP Mike Esposito notched his third 10-plus strikeout performance in his last outing vs. NMSU.
- Freshman Nick Cadena blasted two home runs and drove home a career-high four RBI in ASU's 14-2 win over NMSU.
- Esposito is currently ranked third in the Pac-10 with 82 strikeouts in 82.0 innings pitched. He is tied for the team lead with seven wins.
- ASU's 28 home runs is only five short of the entire total from last year with 11 regular season games remaining.
- The Sun Devils have given up nine home runs in the last eight games after allowing only 15 in the first 35 games of 2002.
- Led by Ryan McKenna (5x9, 22B, 1 HR), the Sun Devils pinch-hitters are a combined 20-for-70 (.286) this year.
- ASU is hitting .307 with runners in scoring position. Andre Ethier is an amazing 21-for-49 (.429) with RISP.
- ASU is 5-5 against ranked opponents this year and have played 19 of their 43 games against teams appearing in the polls. ASU has already had four players earn Pac-10 Player of the Week honors and two players earn National Pitcher of the Week.
- Cesar Castillo has started 12 of the last 14 games at catcher, adding to his two previous career starts. He is hitting .280.
- Ryan Schroyer leads the Pac-10 with a 2.34 ERA. He is 4-1 overall with three wins and a save in each of his last four appearances.
- Relief pitcher Mark Sopko has been tough when inheriting base runners, allowing only six of 26 inherited runners score.
- The Devils have struggled in Sunday games, going 7-6, each time wearing their maroon uniforms.
- The Devils are currently tied for third place in the Pac-10 with a 9-6 record. USC leads the conference with a 11-4 mark.
- Junior reliever Carlos Árguello has a 0.79 ERA in 11.1 bullpen innings. He has posted six consecutive shutout innings.
- ASU is 20-3 when leading after six innings this year and 25-6 when scoring five or more runs.

The Streak Continues. ASU Enters Weekend With Scoring Streak at 418:

The Arizona State baseball program has scored in 418 consecutive games dating back to the 1995 season. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game. The Devils broke the 12-year-old NCAA record in a 5-1 loss to USC exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field. The one run scored in the 11-1 loss to Arizona (3/24) marked only the 12th time during the streak that ASU has scored only one run. The streak continues at 418 consecutive games with ASU scoring in each of the 43 games this year. The Devils have extended the streak early in a majority of its games, with a run in the first inning 24 times in 2002. ASU was neck-in-neck for the record with Wichita State, which had not been shutout in 332 games, but had its streak ended with a 1-0 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette in the middle of the 2001 season. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in three games dating back to 1990. ASU celebrated its 7th anniversary of the streak with a 22-4 win over WSU on Apr. 7, 2002.

Schroyer + Bullpen = Dominating:

Arizona State sophomore pitcher Ryan Schroyer opened his 2002 season in style by being named the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Collegiate Baseball National Pitcher of the Week after his 11strikeout performance against Southern Utah on Feb. 1. After three more starts, Schroyer moved into the closer role where he has recorded an amazing 33 strikeouts in just 22.2 innings of work as a reliever. For the season he is 4-1 with four saves and a Pac-10 best 2.34 ERA. Överall he has struck out 58 batters in just 42.1 innings of work. The All-American nominee would rank fifth in the NCAA with 12.3 strikeouts per nine innings and 32nd in ERA if he had two-thirds more innings pitched to qualify. In 22.2 total bullpen innings, Schröver is 3-0 with four saves and a nearly impeccable 0.79 ERA. He has allowed only two earned runs and 10 hits over that span. Schroyer has picked three wins and a save in his last four outings, allowing only six hits and one run in his last 11.0 innings of work.

The Last Time Out:

The Sun Devils took last weekend off from action to focus on final exams, but are still hoping to capitalize off a strong 14-2 victory over New Mexico State on April 30 at Hohokam Stadium. Behind a strong 11-strikeout performance from Mike Esposito in six innings, the Devils pounded out 19 hits en route to the big win. Playing without starting right fielder and top hitter Andre Ethier (broken thumb) and three suspended players, the Devils hammered Aggie pitching for 19 hits. Freshman right fielder Nick Cadena stepped into the starting role and produced a career night with two home runs and a career-high four RBI.

And Down The Stretch They Come:

With 11 games remaining in the regular season for the Devils, ASU faces a tough slate of nine conference games against three of the top four teams. Currently tied for third in the conference with a 9-6 mark with Stanford and Oregon State, the Devils are 2.0 games behind league leader USC (28-18, 11-4). Washington has played well as of late to move into second place with a 10-5 mark, but take on the Trojans at Dedeaux Field this weekend. The Devils are very much in the race for their second Pac-10 Championship in the last three years, playing Stanford, USC and Oregon State in the next three weekends.

Suspended Players:

Seniors Jon Sheaffer (CF) and Doug Schutt (CF), and junior third baseman Dennis Wyrick have been indefinitely suspended from the team for breaking team rules on a recent road trip to South Bend, Ind. The trio of players were suspended prior to the New Mexico State game (4/30) and it is not known if they will return this year. Sheaffer was ASU's leading hitter at .364 and started 31 games. Wyrick was hitting .315 in 25 games this year and was a career .371 hitter in Pac-10 play. Schutt was a reserve outfielder who had 12 hits in 30 games (14 starts).

Devils Prove To Be Clutch With Two Outs:

In the 15-2 win over UCLA (4/14), Arizona State scored 12 of its 15 runs with two outs. Looking back at all 43 games this year, ASU has scored exactly half of their runs with two outs. The Sun Devils have tabbed 65 runs with no outs, 100 with one out and a remarkable 165 of 330 with two outs. As a team the Sun Devils are hitting .291 (135x464) with two outs and have recorded 111 two-out RBI.

West Continues Season Trend By Being Named Pac-10 Player of the Week:

Jeremy West became the fourth ASU player to earn a Pac-10 Player of the Week honor when he earned the award after the Washington State series (4/5-4/7). West, from Las Vegas, helped lead ASU to a series win over WSU by hitting a home run in each game against the Cougars. The Player of the Week honor was the first for West in his career. It is the 65th selection all-time for Arizona State. ASU has now had two Pac-10 Player of the Week awards this year in addition to two Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week awards. Andre Ethier has also been named the Pac-10 Player of the Week this year (Mar. 26), while Mike Esposito (Apr. 1) and Robbie McClellan (Mar. 12) have been named Pac-10 Pitcher's of the Week.

Hail Cesar:

The Sun Devils have been through four catchers this year, but seems as if they have found their match in former walk-on Cesar Castillo. The senior backstop from Yuma, Ariz., has started the 12 of the last 14 games and now has a total of 16 career starts under his belt. While hitting .280 (14x50) on the year, Castillo has been stellar in the last two Sunday series finales vs. Washington State and UCLA. Castillo has combined to go 5-for-7 (.714) with five RBI and two doubles in the last two Sunday games. Castillo is also riding a current career-long five-game hitting streak in which he is 7-for-16 (.438) with three of his five doubles.

34 Flavors:

Looking to find the perfect starting lineup as the Sun Devils play their final 11 regular season games, head coach Pat Murphy has used a different starting lineup in 26 of the last 27 games and 34 different lineup combinations during the 2002 season. Mixing and matching with a number of players earning starts, only two starting batting orders have remained the same since back-to-back games vs. Loyola Marymount (3/3) and New Mexico State (3/5). ASU has also mixed and matched for 26 different starting lineups by position.

A Very Young Team Indeed:

The Sun Devils feature a very young team in 2002, with 21 of the 32 players on the roster listed as underclassman. Losing seven of its top position players from the 2001 team and several top pitchers, a very young team Sun Devil team has taken to the field this year. The normal starting lineup has five sophomores, two true freshman and at least one senior on the field. When the Devils made the cross country trek to Tallahassee for the FSU series, 13 of the 27 on the travel roster were making their first road trip as a Sun Devil. The starting pitching rotation figures to have one sophomore and two juniors, one of which is a newcomer after transferring from a junior college. To show how young ASU really is, when ASU plays Stanford this weekend, no player on the roster has ever played at Sunken Diamond with ASU last playing in Palo Alto in 1999.

Last Year Against The Cardinal:

The Sun Devils took one game in the three-game series played last year March 30-April 1 at Packard Stadium. Then ranked No. 1 in the country before going on to finish second in the 2001 College World Series, the Cardinal out-scored ASU 25-21 in the three-game set. ASU dropped the first two games by close scores of 6-2 and 5-2, but salvaged the series with a 6-5 win in Sunday's finale. Rod Allen hit .333 (3x9) with one double and is the only returning Sun Devil with a hit against Stanford.

ASU HEAD COACH Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same

time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in three of the past five years, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy is 296-159-1 in his eight seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 22-16 record in NCAA Tournament action. With a career 669-330-4 record in 17 seasons as a head coach, Murphy is the winningest active baseball coach under the age of 43 at any collegiate level. He also became the youngest collegiate coach to reach 500 career victories (with 75 percent of the wins at the Division I level) on March 22, 1998, with a 7-6 victory over California. Murphy recently recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory.

The All-Time Series vs. Stanford:

ASU narrowly leads the all-time series between the two schools by a one-game margin at 75-74. The Cardinal have dominated the series as of late though, taking 11 of the last 15 games, including the last six straight at Sunken Diamond. No active player on the ASU squad has more than three career at-bats against the Cardinal and no pitcher has logged more than one career outing vs. Stanford. ASU took two of three from Stanford during the 2000 Pac-10 championship season and also won the season series 4-2 in 1997. ASU head coach Pat Murphy is 11-22 in his career against the Cardinal.

The Last Time at Sunken Diamond:

Arizona State has not visited the beautiful confines of Sunken Diamond since enduring a series sweep back in 1999. The Devils were out-scored 28-14 in those three games while only hitting .238. ASU was also swept in 1998 during its College World Series run, but swept a series in 1997. ASU is 5-10 under Murphy on The Farm.

The Streak Stops at Eight:

The Sun Devils had their impressive streak of eight straight Pac-10 series wins come to an end with the 2-1 series loss vs. Cal. Starting in Apr. 12-14, 2001 with a 2-1 series win over Washington State, the Devils had not lost since with series wins against Arizona (2-1), Washington (3-0), UCLA (2-1), at Arizona (2-1), Washington (2-1), at Washington State (2-1) and at UCLA (2-1).

Where They Compare To Past Years:

After 43 games, the Sun Devils are currently 11 games over .500 at 27-16 overall with 11 regular season games to be played. The Sun Devils were also 27-16 back in 1996 and 1997. Here is a look at how the Devils have fared after their 44th, 45th and 46th (games coming up this weekend) since Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995.

The Wild. Wild West:

Sophomore first baseman Jeremy West leads the Sun Devils in several offensive category and has proven he is one of the best young power hitters in school history. West hit a home run in each of ASU's three games at Washington State (4/5-4/7) and now has a team-leading 11 home runs on the year. West has been in a bit of a slump lately, going 6-for-30 since being named Pac-10 Player of the Week. West is still fourth on the team with a .342 batting average and he also leads the team with 15 doubles, 49 RBI and 29 extra base hits. He is tied for the team lead with 19 multi-hit games and 12 multi-RBI games. He has tabbed at least one RBI in 25 of his 42 games played this year (60%). In the Pac-10 he is ranked fifth with his 49 RBI, fourth in slugging percentage at .690 and fifth with 15 doubles. Murphy Picks Up Career Division 1 Victory #600; Eyes No. 300 as a Sun Devil:

With a convincing 10-0 win over UNLV in seven innings March 8, Sun Devil Head Coach Pat Murphy reached the 600 plateau for Division I victories in his 15 years of coaching at the top level of collegiate baseball. Murphy has now fashioned a career 669-330-4 record the 1,003 career games of his 18 seasons as a head coach, with 55 of those wins coming at Maryville (Tenn.) College and Claremont-Mudd Scripps. In his 15 years at the D1 level, Murphy has averaged nearly 40 wins per year and is 296-159-1 in his eight-year ASU career. He recently coached in his 1,000th career game April 21, 2002 in the series finale against Cal. He is also only four wins short of the 300 mark in his eight-year ASU career.

Devils Home Run Drought Comes To An End:

After seven games and 269 at-bats, ASU's streak of not hitting a home run came to an end with a solo home run from freshman Nick Cadena in the third inning in the 14-2 win over New Mexico State. ASU now has 28 home runs on the year, led by the 11 from sophomore Jeremy West.



Why Not #9 Murphy:

Most who are close to the ASU Baseball program know what the No. 9 means to head coach Pat Murphy. Often his slogan to "Play all 9 Innings", Murphy and No. 9 are synonymous with each other... until this year. In a preseason meeting with team, Murphy gave a speech on how you have to be able to give up anything for the team. In this case, he even offered up his prize No. 9, knowing no one would take it. That is, until ASU's sophomore Steve Garrabrants raised his hand and said, I'll take it, and with that, the leader of the Devils is willing to give up *anything* for the team and will wear No. 7 this year.

Sun Devil Baseball Successful in May:

The Sun Devil baseball program now has an all-time 289-126 record in the month of May dating back to the 1959 season when varsity baseball started. ASU was 7-5 last year in May, including a 1-2 record in the NCAA Regional in Fullerton, Calif. ASU is 19-11 in the month of May over the last three years. ASU head coach Pat Murphy is a combined 36-24 in the month of May in his eight years in Tempe.

You're The Best; Mike Esposito:

While not claiming to be the best, sophomore Mike Esposito comes out to the song from the Karate Kid sound track labeled, "You're the Best," before each of his home starts. A song held special to his heart because the man singing the song is his father, Joe Esposito, who is popular lounge singer at Paris Casino in Las Vegas as part of a group called Cat Daddy. "Espo", as known by his teammates, who was a fifth-round pick by the Cincinnati Reds out of high school, has been solid for ASU on the mound this year with a 7-5 record and a 3.40 ERA. He is currently third in the Pac-10 with 82 strikeouts in 82.0 innings and is ranked fourth with his 3.40 ERA. He has turned in three 10-plus strikeout performances this year, last being a 11 strikeout effort vs. New Mexico State (4/30) in six innings. Esposito had one of the best pitching performances in Sun Devil baseball history when he struck out 17 batters in a complete-game victory over the University of Washington (3/29) at Hohokam Stadium. He allowed only three runs (two earned) and eight hits in his second complete-game of the year. Esposito, a redshirt sophomore from Las Vegas, Nev. (Cimarron-Memorial High School) registered the sixth most K's in a single game in ASU history and the most since 1997. The preseason All-American (*Baseball America third team*) and 2001 Team USA member is now 13-7 in his two-years at ASU.

A Night to Remember; Esposito Strikes Out 17 vs. Washington:

Here is how Esposito's 17-strikeout game ranks among the top performances in ASU school history. It is the most by a Sun Devil pitcher since Ryan Mills struck out 17 vs. Southern Illinois in 1997 and no on has had more in a Sun Devil uniform since the 1973 season.

McClellan Tough at 5-2 As Devils Sunday Starter:

Robbie McClellan is tied for the team lead with a 7-4 record despite going 0-2 in his last two starts. McClellan is now 5-2 as a starter this year with a 4.50 ERA in those games. He is currently ranked fourth in the Pac-10 with 75 strikeouts and is fifth with opposing batters hitting only .245 off him. McClellan, from Liberal, Kan., became the first Sun Devil to notch back-to-back complete games since 1999, striking out a career-high 10 batters in a seven-inning win against UNLV (3/8). He allowed just four hits and did not allow a run in the 10-0 win over the Rebels. He also went all nine innings in a 7-2 win over Loyola Marymount (3/2). McClellan has an overall 4.48 ERA in 76.1 innings pitched, a mark that is third best among ASU's everyday pitchers. He became the 43rd selection all-time for Arizona State as Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his performance vs. UNLV. McClellan is nicknamed "The Child" by his teammates for his boyish looks. He transferred to ASU from Seward County CC in Liberal, Kan., where he set school records for strikeouts and was 16-4 in his two years.

Home Sweet Home:

The Devils will return to Hohokam Park next week to play their final eight games of 2002 at home. The Devils have played nine of their last 13 games on the road, going 7-6 during that stretch of games. The Devils are now 7-9 this year on the road. The two wins at Washington State (4/5-4/7) marked the first wins this year outside of the state of Arizona and ASU's win over Oklahoma (4/24) was the first nonconference road win of the year for the Devils. ASU is currently 20-7 at home this year, going 16-7 at Hohokam Stadium in Mesa and 3-0 at Packard Stadium on the ASU campus. The Devils are hitting .315 at home (15 HR), compared to a .284 mark (13 HR) on the road. The pitching has varied greatly with a 3.38 ERA at home and a 6.08 mark in ASU's 16 road games this year. ASU was 25-9-1 at home last year and 11-9 on the road in 2001.

Team USA Connections:

Four players from the 2001 Team USA Red, White and Blue Tour will be on the field this weekend when the Devils and Cardinal meet for three games at Sunken Diamond. Saturday's pitching match-up will feature to Team USA alumni in ASU's Mike Esposito and Stanford's Tim Cunningham. Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA last summer for the Red, White and Blue, while Cunningham was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA. Stanford's sophomore combination of Sam Fuld and Carlos Quentin were also members of the 2001 Team USA squad that won 21 of the 29 games.

Ethier On The Mend With Broken Left Thumb:

Sophomore Andre Ethier, ASU's second leading hitter at .362, is currently sidelined with a broken left thumb. Ethier had an interesting journey en route to becoming ASU's leading hitter this year. He came to ASU in the fall of 2000, left ASU to play at Chandler-Gilbert CC, and now is back as the starting right fielder for the Sun Devils. The sweet-swinging Ethier is currently second on the team in hitting through 43 games with a .362 (58x160) batting average. Ethier has 16 multi-hit games on the year, six of which have been three-hit affairs and one a four-hit game. He also has recorded at least one hit in 32 of his 42 games played this year and is second on the team with 19 extra base hits. After earning All-State honors at St. Mary's High School as a senior in 2000, Ethier followed his dreams and came to Arizona State University to play baseball. With playing time not working out, Ethier decided to play his freshman year at Chandler-Gilbert CC. Making a name for himself by hitting .468 at the JC level last year, Ethier spurned an offer from the Oakland Athletics after being drafted in the 37th round and came back to Arizona State.

Three-Position Pedroia:

Freshman Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) has been consistent in the field and at the plate in his rookie campaign. Hitting .335 overall on the season, Pedroia is also a .391 hitter in Pac-10 play. He has started the last 21 games at shortstop (his third position started at this year) and has played nearly flawless defense this year with only two errors in 167 total chances (.988 FLD %). For the year Pedroia is fifth on the team with his .335 batting average and has managed at least one hit in 33 of his 43 games played.

A Tough Schedule in 2002 For ASU:

The Sun Devils face a tough schedule in 2002, with 12 combined games against teams that participated in the 2001 College World Series (3 - Tennessee, 3 - USC, 3 - Stanford, 3 - Cal State Fullerton). ASU will play 22 of its 55 (40%) scheduled games against teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last year. The Devils schedule includes road contests against Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Florida State, Stanford and UCLA. Arizona State is listed as having the ninth toughest schedule in the nation on www.Boydsworld.com. So far this year the Devils are 5-5 against teams ranked in at least one of the national polls at the time they played. ASU's 5-5 record against ranked teams does not include playing Oklahoma, which moved from unranked to No. 18/22 in the polls after taking two of three from the Devils.

One, Two and Three-Run Misery:

Playing one of the nation's toughest schedules this year, Arizona State has had a handful of close games that haven't gone their way. In fact, of the squad's 17 losses this year, eight have come by three or less runs. ASU is 4-2 in one-run games and 3-4 in two run games this year.

Jeff Larish Makes Strong Sun Devil Debut:

Freshman infielder Jeff Larish had not dressed for a game this year and was in the stands as a redshirt candidate before finding out he would be the starting third baseman in ASU's Mar. 16 game vs. Oklahoma. Larish made the most of the opportunity, going 3-for-4 with a triple and run scored in his ASU debut vs. the Sooners. For the season he is sixth on the team in hitting at .333 (23x69) with two doubles, two triples, one home run and 13 RBI. He was 4-for-5 with a big two-run home run vs. UCLA (4/12) to help lead the Devils to a 4-3 win in 11 innings. The freshman starred at Tempe McClintock High School last year and was a 32nd-round draft choice of the Chicago Cubs last June.

Garrabrants Proves To Be a Sparkplug:

Sophomore Steve Garrabrants has been a sparkplug for ASU all year, with the team going 21-10 when he hits in the leadoff spot. Garrabrants missed seven games with an injury that occurred Mar. 9 (neck/shoulder) and it proved key as ASU went 3-4 in those games. For the season Garrabrants tied for second on the team with a .362 batting average. Garrabrants has five hits in his last eight at-bats and is second on the team with 18 multi-hit games. He is also second in the Pac-10 with five triples and his .474 on-base percentage ranks fifth.

Devils Better Score Early and Often:

The Sun Devils have had good success this year when scoring before their opponent, going 20-8 in those games. Even more importantly, when ASU scores in the first inning they are 19-5. Five runs or more seem to be the magic number for the Devils, as ASU is 25-6 in games when scoring five or more runs. The Devils are also 20-3 when leading after six innings and 24-1 when leading after eight innings.

Allen Down But Not Out:

Sophomore Rod Allen has had a rough start to the 2002 season after being named a first-team preseason All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Through 43 games Allen is hitting .257 (39x152) with nine doubles, five home runs and 38 RBI. He is starting to turn it around though, with five hits in his last three games, including a big three-run double against Oklahoma (4/24) to help ASU to a 7-5 win. Allen has not hit a home run since the New Mexico State game (3/12), but has still been productive with 38 RBI on the season that ranks just out of the Pac-10 top 10. Allen has started 41 games this year (all in left field) and is 2-for-2 with two, two-run doubles as a pinch-hitter. Allen hit an ASU freshman record .389 in 2001 and became ASU's first freshman to be named to the All-Pac-10 team.

Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last three years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999 and 10.97 runs per game in 2000. The Devils paced the Pac-10 in 2001, hitting at a .327 clip and averaging 8.26 runs per game to rank 17th in the nation. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark, trailing Stony Brook by one point. During Pat Murphy's eight seasons at ASU, the Sun Devils have been a scoring machine with 4,179 runs, averaging 9.16 runs per game and hitting at an overall .329 clip. Hohokam is ASU's Home Away From Home in 2002:

While a \$2 million renovation will begin in late March to Packard Stadium, the Sun Devils will call Hohokam Stadium in Mesa home for the 2002 season for all but three home games. Hohokam Park is also the spring training home of the Chicago Cubs and the Arizona Fall League home of the Mesa Solar Sox. The facility will provide ASU with a first-class facility while Packard Stadium undergoes renovation. Hohokam Park, which opened in 1997, has a seating capacity of 12,623, with 8,000 theater-style seats.

Is it HoHoKam or Hohokam... Stadium... or Park:

While it can be up for debate on the actual spelling of Hohokam Stadium, the City of Mesa has recognized the official spelling of Hohokam Park to be without the capital H and capital K in the middle of the word. The group that call themselves the HoHoKam's use the capital letters, but the actual group of Native Americans that the park is named after is spelled 'Hohokam.' To extend the debate, is it Hohokam Park or Hohokam Stadium. While both are acceptable, the games are played in Hohokam Stadium, which is located in Hohokam Park.

Hitting For The Cycle... in the First Inning:

In what may be one of the rarest feats of Arizona State baseball history, the Devils led off the Feb. 9 game vs. Tennessee in grand fashion with the first four hitters combining to hit for the cycle in the first inning. Leadoff hitter Steve Garrabrants led off the game with a first-pitch home run, then Dustin Pedroia followed with a double, then Rod Allen singled and to cap off the amazing event, Jeremy West tripled to give ASU the early 2-0 lead.

This Sergio Garcia Doesn't Golf:

Senior infielder Sergio Garcia has a familiar name, but this Sergio Garcia is not a golfer. Garcia will fill in the role as ASU's valued utility man, able to play third, second and his most familiar position, shortstop. Garcia transferred from Oklahoma where he hit .311 for the Sooners last year and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. For the season Garcia is hitting at a .317 clip (19x60) with two doubles and eight RBI. He is also seventh in the Pac-10 with 12 stolen bases.

2002 Newcomers Highly Touted By National Publications:

The group of 17 players that make up the newcomers for the 2002 season have been highly touted as the No. 8 recruiting class in the nation by *Collegiate Baseball* and the No. 11 class by *Baseball America*. The group includes Ian Kinsler (Central Arizona CC), Andre Ethier (Chandler-Gilbert CC), Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.), (Horizon HS) and Robbie McClellan (Seward County CC).

The Apollo Connection:

Arizona State and Apollo High School in Glendale has formed quiet a relationship. Former Sun Devil All-American and Major Leaguer Bob Horner started the tradition back in the late 1970's and still holds the ASU career record for home runs with 56. Current Los Angeles Dodger Paul Lo Duca, who was the *Sporting News* College Player of the Year in 1993 and holds the ASU single-season batting average record at .446 was also a prep standout at Apollo High School. The latest in the line of ASU players to come from Apollo High School is freshman infielder Nick Cadena. Cadena broke the school and state home run records for a career set by Horner and also bettered several of Lo Duca's long-standing records. Cadena belted his first career home run (3-Run HR) vs. Washington State (4/7). To add to the connection, ASU Baseball beat writer Paul Coro of the Arizona Republic is also an Apollo graduate.

Monday's With Murphy at Boston's:

New for the 2002 baseball season is a weekly coaches radio show for ASU head coach Pat Murphy. Held every Monday from 6-6:30 p.m. on XTRA 910 AM, Murphy and the voice of ASU Baseball, Tim Healey, will preview upcoming ASU Baseball games and talk Sun Devil baseball. A roundtable discussion on ASU and College Baseball is held from 5:30-6 p.m. and is open to the public and all media. Selected players and ASU assistant coach Mike Rooney will also be present at the weekly event.

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA National team during the summers. ASU has had six players don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984, with the first being Oddibe McDowell in the 1984 Olympics played at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. Jim Austin played for Team USA in 1990 and ASU has had four players play with Team USA in the last four years. 1999 Pac-10 Player of the Year Willie Bloomquist played in the summer of 1998, 2000-2001 Pac-10 Player of the Year Casey Myers played in the summer of 2000 and was also a member of the Team USA Junior National Team before arriving at ASU in 1998. Current Tampa Bay Devil Ray prospect Jon Switzer was also a member of the 2000 National Team and current pitcher Mike Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA last summer. Current Sun Devils Dennis Wyrick and Ryan Schroyer also played for the Team USA Junior teams during their respective prep careers.

Homegrown Devils:

A total of 20 of ASU's 32 players hail from the state of Arizona. Rod Allen (Phoenix), Joel Bocchi (Phoenix), Nick Cadena (Glendale), Cesar Castillo (Yuma), Andre Ethier (Phoenix), Steve Garrabrants (Phoenix), Tuffy Gosewisch (Scottsdale), Mike Guerrero (Mesa), J.J. Jackson (Chandler), Bryce Kartler (Phoenix), Ian Kinsler (Tucson), Aaron Klusman (Phoenix), Jeff Larish (Tempe), Matt Leaf (Peoria), Jered Liebeck (Glendale), Josh Perrault (Mesa), Ryan Schroyer (Casa Grande), Doug Schutt (Gilbert) and Josh Smith (Lake Havasu) are all native Arizonans. The team is also represented by players from Alaska (1), California (4), Colorado (1), Illinois (2), Kansas (1), Nevada (2) and New Mexico (1).

Frequent Flyers... and Drivers:

With the three-game series at Florida State in Tallahassee, ASU embarked on its first of many roadtrips this season. The Devils traveled a total of 3,572 miles last weekend, flying from Phoenix to Atlanta and then on to Tallahassee. For the season ASU will log 10,192 miles in the air, with flights to Oklahoma City, Chicago, Spokane, Wash., Las Vegas and San Jose, Calif. In addition, ASU plans to make two big bus trips this year to Las Cruces, N.M. (770 miles round trip) for the Mar. 12 game at New Mexico State and to UCLA (792 miles round trip) for the three-game Pac-10 series in April. In all, ASU will drive 2,136 miles on a bus this year to get to games.

Calling All Lettermen

Prior to the 2002 baseball season, the Arizona State Baseball Media Guide, the official source of ASU Baseball information, only referred to records and lettermen dating back to 1959. Although 1959 is the year Bobby Winkles officially took over the program, making the sport have varsity recognition at ASU, baseball in Tempe dates back to 1907. Integrating the research of Barry Sollenberger from his book, "Bulldog Baseball," lettermen and records prior to 1959 have been added to the ASU Baseball Media Guide. The list of letterman is ever evolving, so if you know of any name that should be on the list of a player that played in at least one *VARSITY* game, please contact the ASU Media Relations office at jeff.evans@asu.edu.

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But lately academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past three years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as National Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation over the last three years.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 43-29 record in league play. Even more impressive is that no one other than an ASU player has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. In all, ASU has won nine (9) Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Perry and Marc Barcelo).

Golden Spikes Common At Arizona State:

While Mark Prior of USC was the recipient of the 2001 Golden Spikes award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, it should be noted that three Arizona State players have won the award. Bob Horner, who was a standout at ASU from 1976-78, won the inaugural award in 1978. Oddibe McDowell, who was a member of the first Team USA baseball team to compete in an Olympics, won the award in 1984. Mike Kelly, who ranks second in ASU history with 46 home runs from 1989-91, won the award in 1991. In all, 13 players that have worn the Maroon and Gold have been named a Player of the Year for college baseball.

ASU Leader of the Pac When It Comes to Player of the Week:

Arizona State has amassed 44 Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week and 65 Players of the Week since 1981. That total leads all Pac-10 member schools. The Sun Devils had two players honored as Pac-10 POW last year with Mike Esposito taking home the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honor on May 5 and Mike Lopez won the Pac-10 Player of the Week on April 28. The 2002 season has already seen four Sun Devils earn Pac-10 POW honors. Andre Etheir and Jeremy West have been named Pac-10 Players of the Week, while Robbie McClellan and Mike Esposito have been named Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week.

Arizona State in Postseason Play:

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 25 of the program's 42 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 122-49 (.730) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three third-place finishes.

Horner Ranks Second As Player of the Century:

Former Sun Devil greats Bob Horner and Eddie Bane were honored by *Baseball America* by being placed on the publication's "Team of the Century." Horner, an ASU great under Jim Brock from 1976-78, hit .383 for his career and belted a school record 56 home runs. Horner was listed second on the team behind Oklahoma State slugger Pete Incaviglia (1983-85). Bane, a top pitcher for the Sun Devils from 1971-72, posted a career 40-4 record and a 1.64 ERA. Bane was listed as the ninth best player of the 20th Century by *Baseball America*. The top 10 players of the century were voted on by fans, coaches and baseball writers and are listed below:

91 Years of Sun Devil Baseball Tradition:

While the history of baseball at Arizona State University goes back all the way to the early 1900's, the school officially began sponsoring varsity baseball in 1959. Prior to 2002, the ASU Baseball Media Guide referred only to those players that played from 1959 to present. ASU now officially recognizes those players, coaches and seasons from 1907-1950. In 90-plus years of baseball at Arizona State, the program has built a legacy matched by few in the college baseball world. With a 2,230-1,094-6 all-time record, Arizona State has advanced to the College World Series 18 times, won five national championships, won six Pac-10 titles, produced 12 Players of the Year and three Golden Spikes Award winners, and has gone to the NCAA Tournament 25 times. Under current head coach Pat Murphy, the Sun Devils have finished in the top 12 in three of the last five years and finished second in the nation in 1998. They have been ranked in the top 20 for 40 consecutive national polls.

Seven Devils Earn Freshman All-America Honors in 2001:

Seven Sun Devils earned freshman All-America honors during the 2001 season. Rod Allen and Jeremy West both earned first-team acclaim from Collegiate Baseball and Allen was also named to the Baseball America Freshman All-America team. Allen set an ASU freshman record with a .389 batting average and became the first Sun Devil freshman in school history to be named a first-team All-Pac-10 player. Mike Esposito, Aaron Klusman, Ryan Schroyer, Steve Garrabrants and Nick Walsh were all named to the Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-America team as honorable mention selections.

Puting A Recent Event In Perspective:

The University of Texas recently set a Big 12 record by recording a string of 41 consecutive shutout innings. The nationally ranked Longhorns set the record over the course of four full games and part of two others. The record drastically fails in comparison to the NCAA record of 64 consecutive shutout inning by the 1972 Arizona State pitching staff. ASU, behind wins from Sun Devil pitching legends Jim Otten, Craig Swan and Eddie Bain combined for seven straight shutouts. As part of one of the greatest teams in ASU history, the Devils went 64-6 that year, setting school records for ERA (1.76), strikeouts (732), complete games (43) and shutouts (24). Bane ended the year 14-1, Otten was 9-0 and Swan was 16-1.
