Leading Off:

After a three-game sweep of the California Golden Bears at Evans Diamond in Berkeley, California, the Arizona State Sun Devils will wrap-up the road portion of their non-conference schedule with a midweek trip to Tucson. Following the game with the Wildcats, Arizona State will begin an eight game home stand, starting with a three-game Pac-10 series with the Stanford Cardinal. The series with the Cardinal will get underway on Friday night from Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark.

Devils vs. Arizona:

Since baseball became a varsity sport at ASU in 1959, Arizona State leads the all-time series with Arizona 184-117*. ASU took two of three from UA earlier this season in the first Pac-10 series of the year for both teams, then won the first meeting in Tucson 10-5.

Devils vs. Stanford:

The Sun Devils hold a 91-85[^] advantage in the all-time series with Stanford. Last season, Arizona State closed out the regular season by winning two of three from the Cardinal at Sunken Diamond.

Throwing Up 0's:

The Sun Devil pitching staff was locked in against California over the weekend. ASU held the Golden Bears scoreless over the final 22 innings of the series, including backto-back complete game shutouts by **Kramer Champlin** and **Jake Barrett**. The back-to-back complete game shutouts were the first by Sun Devil pitchers since **Jason Franzblau** blanked Winthrop and **Mike Leake** held Oregon scoreless in May of 2009.

Epic Battle:

Arizona State's game with California in the series opener on Thursday was an instant classic. The two teams played 17 innings, the second longest game in both ASU and Cal history. Twice the Sun Devils scored runs in the extra frames only to see the Golden Bears battle back and tie the game. **Deven Marrero's** two-run single in the 17th proved to be the difference in the 6-4 ASU victory. Each team used five pitchers, with ASU's **Mark Lambson** earning the victory. **Lambson** threw three innings of shutout ball, striking out three. The longest game in ASU history was an 18 inning affair against UCLA on February 23, 1990, a 6-5 Sun Devil victory.

Head Coach Tim Esmay

Tim Esmay is in his second season as Head Baseball Coach at Arizona State after taking over his alma mater in 2010 and leading them to a Pac-10 title and a berth in the College World Series. The 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year. Esmay is in his 11th overall season as a coach at Arizona State. He spent 2005 to 2009 as an assistant coach, including the last three as the Assistant Head Coach. He played two seasons as an infielder under Jim Brock in 1986 and 1987. Esmay was the head baseball coach at the University of Utah from 1997 to 2004, winning a WAC title and WAC Coach of the Year honors in 1997. In eight seasons at Utah he compiled a 213-235-1 record. Following his playing days, Esmay served as an assistant coach at Arizona State under Jim Brock from 1988 to 1990, then again in Brock's final season of 1994.

Cal Recap:

A Thursday afternoon affair turned into an early evening epic, as the Devils and Golden Bears needed 17 innings to decide a winner in the series opener. After ASU had leads of 2-0, 3-2 and 4-3, **Deven Marrero** finally put Arizona State up for good with his two-run single in the 17th to give the Devils the 6-4 win. **Mark Lambson** threw three scoreless innings out of the bullpen to earn the win...Friday was **Kramer Champlin's** day, as the tall righty turned in a virtuoso performance, shutting out Cal in a 5-0 complete game victory. **Champlin** struck out five to pick up his second complete game of the year... **Jake Barrett** matched **Champlin's** performance in the series finale, leading ASU to a three-game sweep on a complete game shutout of his own. **Joey DeMichele** and **Zach Wilson** provided the fireworks, each homering in the 6-0 triumph.

Honoring Cory Hahn:

As a tribute to injured Sun Devil **Cory Hahn**, the team will wear special wristbands with **Cory's** name and #34 and also has had his number embroidered on the team's stirrups. Players will also wear his initials and number on their hats. The entire team visited Hahn during their trip to Fullerton and Hahn attended the first game of the series at Goodwin Field.

Pac-10 Player of the Week:

For the second time this season, junior third baseman **Riccio Torrez** has been named Pac-10 Player of the Week. **Torrez** was red hot against the Golden Bears, batting .438 (7-16) in the series, including a five-hit game in the opener to establish a new career high. He also scored three times, drove in a run, stole two bases and played flawless defense at third. **Torrez** was also named Pac-10 Player of the Week following the opening weekend of play.

100th Game:

Tuesday's game at Arizona will be the 100th game as Arizona State's head coach for **Tim Esmay**. **Esmay** has the second highest winning percentage among the four ASU head coaches through their first 100 games. **Dr. Jim Brock** holds the record, going 91-9 (.910).

Assistance:

Senior **Matt Newman** has developed a reputation as being one of the steadiest fielders in the country. The outfielder has committed only one career error and has 13 career outfield assists. He has played both left and right field in his four years in Tempe, as well as pitched during his freshman and sophomore years. **Newman** made 16 fielding assists as a pitcher and has a career fielding percentage of .996 (257 chances).

Century Men:

Senior Matt Newman and junior Zack MacPhee are both members of an exclusive club in Sun Devil baseball. Each has drawn over 100 career walks, putting them in select company. Newman has been walked 118 times, tied with Colin Curtis for 11th most in school history. MacPhee is right on his heels with 113 walks, 15th most in school history. Only 27 players in school history have ever drawn 100 or more walks in their careers. The career record for walks by a Sun Devil is 207 set by Alvin Davis during his four-year career in Tempe from 1979 to 1982. MacPhee has drawn 32 walks this season, tops in the Pac-10.

Productive Hitting:

Arizona State's hitters have done a phenomenal job this season of advancing runners, meaning times the batter advanced at least one runner during a plate appearance. **Andrew Aplin** leads the team with his .569 success rate (29-51). **Riccio Torrez** and **Zach Wilson** have been Mr. Clutch with two outs, leading the team with their 11 two-

out RBI. **Zack MacPhee** has been the most effective at moving runners over with an out, 20 times advancing the runners when he has not reached safely.

Keeping Busy:

Last weekend in Berkeley, second baseman **Zack MacPhee** was kept very busy over the three games. **MacPhee** had 27 defensive chances over the three games, making 20 assists. Shortstop **Deven Marrero** was the only other Sun Devil with double digit assists with 11. First baseman **Zach Wilson** had 47 putouts in the series, including 20 during the 17 inning game. It was the first time since 1999 that a Sun Devil recorded 20 putouts in a game. **Jeff Phelps** had 21 in a game against Stanford that season.

Johnny Lightning:

Junior **Johnny Ruettiger**, who entered 2011 with 22 career stolen bases, has swiped 17 this season. That is a new career high, breaking the previous high of 12 which was set during his freshman season.

20 Game Winner:

While in Auburn, junior lefty **Mitchell Lambson** picked up his 20th career victory. **Lambson** is 20-10 in his career, making 91 appearances with only one start. His one start, at Washington in 2009, was a complete game. **Lambson's** 20 wins puts him third all-time in school history for wins by pitchers who were primarily relievers in their career. **Lambson** trails only **Sam Cook**, who recorded 25 wins in 60 appearances (11 starts) from 1961 to 1963 and **Kevin Dukes**, who won 21 games in 82 appearances (18 starts) from 1978 to 1981. **Lambson's** brother **Mark** earned his first career win at Auburn (naturally, out of the bullpen).

More on Mitch:

Lambson picked up his 10th career save against Oral Roberts, putting him in an exclusive club. Only three pitchers in Arizona State history have ever recorded at least 20 victories with at least 10 saves. Only **Kevin Dukes**, who pitched from 1978 to 1981, won 21 games and saved 20 games and **Mitch Dean**, who won 25 games and saved 11 from 1976 to 1980, had ever accomplished the feat prior to **Lambson**. **Lambson** now has five saves on the season and 13 in his career.

Brothers With Arms:

With one appearance last week, **Mitchell Lambson** has now made 91 career appearances, fourth most in ASU history. Last season he tied a school record with his 39 appearances. His brother, **Mark**, is a right handed reliever out of the ASU bullpen. **Mark** retired the first 11 hitters he faced in his Sun Devil career against Delaware. He also picked up his first career win against Auburn. **Mitchell** and **Mark** are the sixth set of brothers to play in the same season for Arizona State. They have pitched in the same game twice, most recently at Cal during the 17 inning game.

Newman's Golden Glove:

Matt Newman's error against Kansas was the first of his Sun Devil career. It happened in his 176th game for ASU. **Newman's** errorless streak reached 211 chances before it ended in right field at Surprise Stadium on a ground ball that **Newman** kicked away, allowing the runner to reach third on a double.

State Farm Territorial Cup Series Baseball Point Awarded:

On the strength of their 10-5 victory in Tucson, the Sun Devils have won the State Farm Territorial Cup Series point for baseball. Arizona State currently leads the five-game season

series three games to one, earning them the point for the series victory. ASU won the Pac-10 series from the Wildcats two games to one in Tempe in March.

Career Highs:

Several Sun Devils have established single game career highs already this season. **Deven Marrero** set new career highs in hits (4) and runs scored (4) against Arizona on April 5; **Xorge Carrillo** set a new high in RBI with three at Auburn on March 12; **Joey DeMichele** recorded five hits, including three doubles, at Auburn on March 12; **Johnny Ruettiger** collected four hits against UC Riverside at Surprise on March 6; **Riccio Torrez** homered twice against New Mexico on February 18. He also drove in five runs, setting a new high. He collected five hits at Cal on April 21; **Zach Wilson** collected five hits, including three doubles, against Delaware on February 26. He tied his career high with five RBI against Northern Illinois on March 4 at Surprise; **Andy Workman** has twice tied his career high with three hits, against Delaware on February 26 and at Auburn on March 11; **Andrew Aplin** tied a career high with three hits against Oral Roberts on March 18.

Legacy Devils:

The 2011 Sun Devil team features a unique connection for four student-athletes. Senior OF Matt Newman has Maroon and Gold in his blood, as his father, Randy, was a pitcher for the Sun Devils in 1981 and 1982, winning 15 career games and the 1981 National Championship. Matt and Randy joined a select list as a father-son combo who both played in the College World Series. But Matt Newman is not the only Sun Devil who has a father with an ASU National Championship ring. Freshman Trever Allen is the son of Jamie Allen, who played three seasons at ASU, including the 1977 National Championship year. Jamie was a lifetime .333 hitter at ASU and he also went 6-2 on the mound. He was a two-time All-WAC team member and was a member of the 1977 All-College World Series team. Joining Newman and Allen as Legacy Devils are freshmen Tucker Esmay and Michael Benjamin. Esmay is the son of Head Coach Tim Esmay and Benjamin is the son of assistant coach Mike Benjamin. The elder Esmay and Benjamin were teammates on the 1986 and 1987 Sun Devils.

Notable Connections:

Junior 3B Riccio Torrez's brother Raoul was a four-time letterman and two-time team captain, including teaming with Riccio the last two years...Redshirt freshman catcher Beau Maggi is the brother of Drew Maggi, who starred at ASU the last two years...Junior Mitchell Lambson will be joined by his brother Mark on the 2011 Sun Devils...Junior OF Johnny Ruettiger is the nephew of Rudy Ruettiger, the former Notre Dame football player who had a movie about his life made....Sophomore shortstop Deven Marrero is the cousin of Chris Marrero, a rising star in the Washington Nationals' system.

Brotherly Love:

In each of the last two seasons, the Sun Devils boasted a set of brothers who started next to each other in the infield, marking the first time in school history that brothers started next to each other on the diamond. **Raoul** and **Riccio Torrez** became the fifth set of brothers to play for the same Sun Devil team. The other Sun Devil brothers to play on the same teams are **Kevin** and **Pat Dukes** (1980-81), **Dale** and **Larry Eiler** (1976-78), **John** and **Tom Sain** (1973) and **Brett** and **Greg Bordes** (2005). **Drew** and **Beau Maggi** were both on the team last season, but **Beau** sat out the year utilizing his redshirt season. This year, **Mitchell Lambson** is joined on the pitching staff by his brother **Mark**.

Double Duty:

Junior OF **Brandon Magee** is no stranger to ASU athletics, playing linebacker for the Sun Devil football team. Magee was second on the team in tackles this past season, totaling 73 including five for loss and 1.5 sacks.

Hall "0" Famer:

The 2011 College Baseball Hall of Fame Class was announced by the College Baseball Foundation and Sun Devil Legend **Oddibe McDowell** was one of eight men to earn induction. **McDowell** will become the seventh member of the Hall of Fame to come from Arizona State. **McDowell** was a standout in the outfield from 1983 to 1984. He was a career .380 hitter with 30 home runs and 31 doubles. In 1984, he hit .405 with 23 home runs, a performance that earned him the Golden Spikes Award. That same year he was





named Player of the Year by both Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America. He also was a two-time All-American and was the first Sun Devil to have his number retired.

Feeling The Draft:

There are 19 members of the 2011 Sun Devils who have had their name called during the annual Major League Baseball draft, including **Xorge Carrillo**, who was drafted last season but opted to return to school. Carrillo has been drafted three times, as has **Kyle Ottoson**.
