

Sun Devils To Host Houston, San Diego and New Mexico State In NCAA Regional, ASU Hosts Second Regional In Last Three Years.

What's On Tap:

For the second time in three years, the Arizona State baseball team will host an NCAA regional. Finishing the year 35-19 overall and third place in the Pac-10 at 15-9, the Sun Devils will host Houston, New Mexico State and San Diego to Hohokam Park this weekend for one of the 16 NCAA Division Baseball Regional Championships. ASU will take on San Diego at 6 p.m. Friday, while seventh-ranked Houston will battle New Mexico State in the 12 p.m. game. ASU last hosted a regional in 2000, getting knocked off by the Texas Longhorns in the regional final. The winner of the Arizona State Regional will play the winner of the regional hosted by the University of Texas.

Arizona State in Postseason Play:

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has now advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 26 of the program's

43 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 122-49 (.730) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three thirdplace finishes. Arizona State is 13-8 in the NCAA Tournament under eighth-year head coach Pat Murphy. In addition to advancing three straight years, ASU has been left out of the tournament only once (1999) in the last six years and played for the national championship in 1998. ASU is a combined 42-5 vs. the schools in the Mesa regional.

Not A Bad Way To Finish:

ASU had a great finish to the 2002 regular season, winning eight of its last 10 games to finish the year 16 games above .500 at 35-19. ASU started the 10-game stretch with a convincing 10-2 win at then eighth-ranked Stanford at Sunken Diamond. ASU then took two of three from Pac-10 champion USC and swept Oregon State to end the season. ASU tied for third place in the Pac-10 with Washington, posting a 15-9 record in league play. During the impressive 10-game stretch the Sun Devils hit .354 as a team (120x339) and out-scored their opponents 120-99. The pitchers also had a good run with a very respectable 4.66 team ERA.

Ouick Hits:

- Pat Murphy recorded wins No. 302, 303 and 304 in his ASU career this past weekend against Oregon State.
- The Sun Devils are 19-7 when not hitting a home run this year, while just 16-12 when at least one player connects for a homer.
- Dustin Pedroia has only three errors in the field in 205 total chances (.985 FLD %). He also has 23 multi-hit games.
- With his 5-for-5 performance vs. USC (5/19), Sergio Garcia raised his batting average 39 points from .321 to .360.
- Dustin Pedroia is the only Sun Devil to play and start in all 54 games this year. He has also started three positions.
- Jeremy West is hitting .514 (18x35) with six extra base hits and 18 RBI in his last 10 games.
- Senior catcher Cesar Castillo is hitting .292 (21x72) since taking over the starting catcher job and is hitting .272 overall.
- Of ASU's 426 runs scored this year, 220 (52%) have come with two outs. ASU also has 124 1-out runs and 82 0-out runs.
- ASU's 4.44 team ERA is second in the Pac-10 behind Stanford and currently the best in the Pat Murphy era.
- Through 54 games, ASU has four complete games. The Devils had only one all of last year (Jon Switzer).
- The Devils have scored in the first inning in 30 of their 54 games (56%). ASU is 24-6 when scoring in the first. The Sun Devils have used 42 different lineups this year, including a string of 34 different lineups in the last 38 games.
- ASU has scored in a NCAA record 429 consecutive games dating back to April 7, 1995. The old record was 349.
- In his 19 appearances out of the bullpen (34.0 IP), sophomore Ryan Schroyer has struck out 44 batters (1.32 ERA). ASU returned only 39.5% of hits, 38.7% of RBI, 38.6% of runs, 24.3% of pitching wins and 37.9% of K's from last year.
- ASU's sweep over Oregon State to end the year was the first in Pac-10 play this year for the Devils.
- The Devils were 11-13 this year against teams that make up the NCAA Tournament Field of 64.
- Relief pitcher Mark Sopko got ASU out of several jams in 2002, inheriting 34 runners, allowing only eight to score (24%).
- ASU is 18-1 when scoring 10 or more runs this year and have tallied double-digits in runs in five of the last 10 games.

More Ouick Hits:

- Andre Ethier returned to the lineup last weekend with five hits. He is now leading the team in hitting at .377.
- Sophomore RHP Mike Esposito notched his third 10-plus strikeout performance of the year vs. NMSU (4/30).
- Esposito is 9-5 with a 3.47 ERA and is ranked third in the Pac-10 with 93 strikeouts in 96.0 innings pitched.
- Freshman Nick Cadena has five home runs and is hitting .333 (16x48) with five home runs and 19 RBI in his last 12 games.
- The Devils hit .315 in the 24 Pac-10 games and .308 in Non-conference play. Ethier leads the team with a .431 average in Pac-10 play.
- ASU's 35 home runs is already four more than the entire total from last year. West leads the team with 13 home runs.
- The Sun Devils have given up 19 home runs in the last 19 games after allowing only 15 in the first 35 games of 2002.
- West's eight RBI vs. Portland (5/15) were the most by a Sun Devil since 1999 and second most in the ASU record books.
- Bryce Kartler made his first career start at DH vs. Portland (5/15) and went 2-for-3 with a double and two RBI.
- ASU is 8-8 against ranked opponents this year and played 25 of their 54 games against teams appearing in the polls.
- ASU has already had five players earn Pac-10 Player of the Week honors and two players earn National Pitcher of the Week.
- Cesar Castillo has started 22 of the last 25 games at catcher, adding to his two previous career starts. Ryan Schroyer leads the Pac-10 with a 2.35 ERA. He is 4-1 overall with three wins and four saves in his last nine appearances.
- Rod Allen and Jeremy West both passed the 100-career RBI mark last weekend vs. Oregon State.
- Jered Liebeck struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-long seven-inning outing against USC (5/17).
- ASU is 27-8 in home games this year and 24-8 at Hohokam Park. The Devils are hitting .327 at home and pitching for a 3.78 ERA.
- Redshirt freshman walk-on Garrett Schoenberger recorded his first hit as a Sun Devil with a single vs. Portland (5/14).
- Steve Garrabrants is hitting .346 overall and leads the Pac-10 with seven triples and is ranked 4th with 15 stolen bases.

Media Exposure:

All of ASU's NCAA Tournament games will be broadcast over the radio in the Phoenix area on XTRA 910 AM with Tim Healey and Bob Eger calling all the action from the Hohokam Park press box. The game can also be heard world-wide via the internet at www.TheSunDevils.com. The LiveStats feature will also be in effect for the postseason, with fans able to access the updated play-by-play at www.TheSunDevils.com. All official tournament information can be viewed on www.NCAAChampionships.com and an official regional website will be available on ASU's site. None of the regional games are scheduled to air on TV this weekend. The Devils are 19-14 this year during radio broadcasts and 2-2 on television.

The Houston Cougars:

Selected as the No. 1 seed for the regional, the Houston Cougars bring a very impressive 44-15 record into the postseason. Houston won the Conference USA regular season title and advanced to the championship of the conference tournament only to lose to East Carolina 4-0. Ranked No. 7 in the nation by Baseball America, the Cougars are led by catcher Chris Snyder (.349, 14 HR, 68 RBI) and a strong pitching staff that bolsters a very impressive 3.07 team ERA. Snyder played on Team USA last summer where he played with ASU's Mike Esposito. All-American Brad Sullivan leads the pitching staff with a 11-1 record and a 2.08 ERA. He has 142 strikeouts in 112.1 innings and is holding opposing hitters to a .170 batting average. Junior relief pitcher Jessee Crain has a 0.00 ERA while pitching in 23 games and 32.1 innings. Arizona State and Houston have met six prior times, with the Sun Devils going 5-1.

The New Mexico State Aggies:

A familiar opponent of ASU, the New Mexico State Aggies are making their first ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Winners of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament after shocking South Alabama 20-9 in the championship game, the Aggies bring a 37-23 overall record into postseason play. An offensive powerhouse under head coach Gary Ward, the Aggies are hitting .323 as a team with 95 home runs. Senior Ryan Kenning is among the NCAA leaders in home runs with 24 and set the single-season NMSU record this year with 96 RBI. Gabe Veloz leads the Aggies with a .412 batting average (93x226) and also has 15 home runs and 91 RBI. The pitching staff has a combined 6.77 ERA, led by the 8-1 record of Jason Williams. Arizona State went 2-1 against NMSU this year, winning 10-5 and 14-2 at Hohokam Park, and losing in the ninth inning 8-7 at Presley Askew Field in Las Cruces. The Devils lead the all-time series 25-2.

The San Diego Torero's:

The Torero's advanced to the NCAA Tournament after beating Pepperdine in the West Coast Conference Championship held last weekend at Pepperdine. San Diego has a 37-23 record heading into the regional after going 19-13 in their division of the West Coast Conference. Hitting .316 as a team, sophomore infielder David Bagley leads the team with a .401 batting average and 13 home runs in 47 games played. The pitching staff has combined for a respectable 4.85 ERA with opposing hitters batting .289. Junior left-hander Ricky Barrett shores up the pitching staff with a 10-1 record and a 3.38 ERA. He has struck out 97 batters in 114.1 innings. The Devils are a combined 12-2 all-time against San Diego.

The Last Time They Hosted:

The Devils last hosted an NCAA Regional in 2000 when they were one of the national No. 1 seeds. ASU cruised in the opener, beating Miami (OH) 15-7 and then defeated Texas 3-1. The Longhorns battled back through the loser's bracket and eventually beat ASU twice on the final day to advance to the Super Regionals and eventually the 2000 College World Series. Prior to the 2000 season, ASU last hosted in 1993, 1990, 1988 and 1987.

Consecutive Games Scoring Streak Reaches 429:

The Arizona State baseball program has scored in 429 consecutive games dating back to the 1995 season and has not endured a shutout in seven years and 55 days heading into this weekend's NCAA Regional. The Devils made history on April 7, 2001 when they scored at least one run in their 350th consecutive game. The Devils broke the 12-year-old NCAA record in a 5-1 loss to USC exactly six years to the day when they were last shut out. ASU was shut out 9-0 in that game on April 7, 1995 at Dedeaux Field. The one run scored in the 3-1 loss to Stanford (4/12) marked only the 13th time during the streak that ASU has scored only one run. The streak continues at 426 consecutive games with ASU scoring in each of the 54 games this year. The Devils have extended the streak early in a majority of its games, with a run in the first inning 28 times in 2002. ASU was neck-in-neck for the record with Wichita State, which had not been shutout in 332 games, but had its streak ended with a 1-0 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette in the middle of the 2001 season. Coastal Carolina previously held the NCAA record at 349 games set from 1983-1989. ASU also had a stretch of 278 games without being shut out from 1990 to 1994, meaning the program has only been shutout in three games dating back to the 1990 season. ASU celebrated its 7th anniversary of the streak with a 22-4 win over WSU on Apr. 7, 2002. ASU is a combined 272-150-1 during the streak.

Schroyer + Bullpen = Dominating:

Arizona State sophomore pitcher Ryan Schroyer opened his 2002 season in style by being named the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and *Collegiate Baseball* National Pitcher of the Week after his 11-strikeout performance against Southern Utah on Feb. 1. After three more starts, Schroyer moved into the closer role where he has recorded an amazing 44 strikeouts in 34.0 innings of work as a reliever. For the season he is 4-1 with seven saves and a Pac-10 best 2.35 ERA. Overall he has struck out 69 batters in 53.2 innings of work The All-American nominee would rank in the top 15 in the NCAA with 11.6 strikeouts per nine innings and would be in the top 30 in ERA (2.35) if he had one-third more of an inning pitched to qualify. In 34.0 total bullpen innings, Schroyer is 3-0 with seven saves and a nearly impeccable 1.32 ERA. He has allowed only five earned runs and 22 hits over that span. Schroyer has picked three wins and four saves in his last nine outings. He picked up his last save with 3.1 strong innings in ASU's 5-2 sweep-clinching victory over Oregon State.



ASU HEAD COACH Pat Murphy



Since inheriting the Sun Devil program in August of 1994, Arizona State Baseball Head Coach Pat Murphy has carefully nurtured the tradition of excellence in Tempe, at the same

time establishing himself as one of the top collegiate head coaches in the nation. He has guided Arizona State to top-12 national rankings in three of the past five years, including an appearance in the 1998 College World Series national championship game. Murphy is 304-162-1 in his eight seasons in Tempe and posts an all-time 22-16 record in NCAA Tournament action. With a career 677-333-4 record in 17 seasons as a head coach, Murphy is the winningest active baseball coach under the age of 43 at any collegiate level. He also became the youngest collegiate coach to reach 500 career victories (with 75 percent of the wins at the Division I level) on March 22, 1998, with a 7-6 victory over California. Murphy recently recorded his 600th career Division 1 victory.

A Clean Sweep of the Beavers:

The Sun Devils earned their third series sweep of the year and the first in Pac-10 play by taking all three games from Oregon State to end the 2002 regular season. The Devils opened with a 13-7 victory, then took an exciting 9-8 game Saturday by scoring three runs in the bottom of the ninth inning. ASU took the brooms out of the closet to earn their first series sweep since beating Loyola Marymount three straight in early March. Continuing a trend that has seen ASU score 93 runs and hit .354 over the last 10 games, ASU beat the Beavers with a potent combination of clutch hitting and solid relief pitching. The team combined for a .359 batting average and out-scored OSU 27-17. Andre Ethier was 5-for-7 with four RBI in his first two games back from a broken thumb. The pitching staff was led by the two wins from junior reliever Bryce Kartler and the four and a third shutout innings from closer Ryan Schroyer.

Devils Take Two of Three From Pac-10 Leading USC:

The Sun Devils picked up an impressive 2-1 series victory over Pac-10 Champion USC May 17-19 at Hohokam Park. ASU opened with a 3-1 win behind a Jered Liebeck pitching gem, lost Saturday's game 9-5, then rebounded with its best offensive performance in Pac-10 play this year in a 17-8 victory. Senior infielder Sergio Garcia hit .583 (7x12) in the series, including a 5-for-5 performance Sunday. The Sun Devils out-scored the Trojans 25-18 in the series and hit .340 in the series.

An Impressive Last 10 Games:

There is no better way to end the regular season then riding a hot streak. Well, the Sun Devils did just that, winning eight of their last 10 games to finish the year 35-19, 16 games above the .500 mark. In those 10 games, the Sun Devils hit a robust .354 with 93 runs scored (9.3 per game). The pitching staff also had a good stretch, maintaining a 4.66 team ERA, while striking out 78 batters in 87.0 innings pitched. Sophomore first baseman is ASU's hottest hitter, going 18-for-35 during that stretch with 18 RBI, 14 runs scored and two of his team-leading 13 home runs. Jered Liebeck, Carlos Arguello, Bryce Kartler and Mike Esposito each have two wins on the mound.

Sun Devils Dominate 2002 All-Pac-10 Team:

Arizona State baseball players Jeremy West, Andre Ethier and Dustin Pedroia were all named to the All-Pacific-10 Conference First Team and nine other Sun Devils earned honorable mention distinction when the 2002 Pac-10 Baseball awards were announced. In addition to West, Ethier and Pedroia being named to the first team, senior catcher Cesar Castillo (Yuma), sophomore pitcher Mike Esposito (Las Vegas), senior infielder Sergio Garcia (Paramount, Calif.), sophomore utility player Steve Garrabrants (Phoenix), freshman third baseman Jeff Larish (Tempe), junior pitcher Jered Liebeck (Glendale), junior pitcher Robbie McClellan (Liberal, Kan.), sophomore relief pitcher Ryan Schroyer (Casa Grande) and senior outfielder Jon Sheaffer (Mesa) all earned honorable mention awards. Garcia has now earned honorable mention in back-to-back years from the Big 12 at Oklahoma last year and from the Pac-10 this year.

Pedroia and Schrover Selected For Team USA:

Arizona State players Ryan Schroyer and Dustin Pedroia were selected for the 2002 Team USA National team trials to be held at Hi-Corbett Field in Tucson in June. Pedroia has started a three different infield positions this year and made only three errors in 205 total chances (.985 FLD %). He is also having a great rookie campaign at the plate with a .333 overall batting average and hit at a .381 clip in Pac-10 play. Schroyer leads the team with seven saves and has a nearly impeccable 1.32 ERA and 44 strikeouts in 34.0 innings as a relief pitcher. ASU has had at least one player represented on Team USA in three of the past four years. Schroyer was a member of the 2000 Team USA Junior National Team.

Standing Tall On The Mound:

The Devils have had great success this year much in part to the great effort of the pitching staff. The 4.44 team ERA is currently the lowest during the Pat Murphy era (4.56 in 2001) and is second in the Pac-10 behind Stanford. Mike Esposito leads the team with nine saves, while Ryan Schroyer's seven saves are ranked in the top five in the conference. The starting pitchers have been solid with a combined 4.37 ERA, striking out 263 batters and walking only 135. The relief corps has a 4.54 ERA and is 14-7 on the year with 11 saves. Opposing batters are hitting only .259 off ASU pitchers, a mark that led the Pac-10. ASU was 24-10 in the regular season when the starter lasted five or more innings.

Suspended Players:

Heading into postseason play, seniors Jon Sheaffer (CF) and Doug Schutt (CF), and junior third baseman Dennis Wyrick have been indefinitely suspended from the team for breaking team rules on a recent road trip to South Bend, Ind. The trio of players were suspended prior to the New Mexico State game (4/30) and it is not known if they will return this year. Sheaffer was ASU's leading hitter at .364 and started 31 games. Wyrick was hitting .315 in 25 games this year and was a career .371 hitter in Pac-10 play. Schutt was a reserve outfielder who had 12 hits in 30 games (14 starts).

Devils Prove To Be Clutch With Two Outs:

In the 15-2 win over UCLA (4/14), Arizona State scored 12 of its 15 runs with two outs, a trend that has been with the Devils all year. ASU also had a big night with two outs in a 16-7 win over Portland (5/13), scoring 12 of the 16 runs with two outs. Looking back at all 54 games this year, ASU has maintained the two-out phenomenon, scoring over half of their runs with two outs. The Sun Devils have tabbed 82 runs with no outs, 124 with one out and a remarkable 220 of 426 total runs with two outs (52%). As a team the Sun Devils are hitting .313 (188x600) with two outs and have recorded 154 total two-out RBI.



West Continues Season Trend By Being Named Pac-10 Player of the Week:

Jeremy West became the fourth and fifth selections for an ASU player to be named Pac-10 Player of the Week honor this year. West, a native of Las Vegas, helped lead ASU to a 4-1 record over USC and Portland two weeks ago while hitting .562 (9x16) with 11 RBI in four games vs. Portland and USC. The Player of the Week honor was the second for West this year and he became only one of two Pac-10 players this year (Conor Jackson - Cal) to earn the honor twice. It is the 66th selection all-time for Arizona State. ASU has now had three Pac-10 Player of the Week awards this year in addition to two Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week awards. Andre Ethier has also been named the Pac-10 Player of the Week this year (Mar. 26), while Mike Esposito (Apr. 1) and Robbie McClellan (Mar. 12) have been named Pac-10 Pitcher's of the Week.

Hail Cesar:

The Sun Devils have been through four catchers this year, but seems as if they have found their match in former walk-on Cesar Castillo. The senior backstop from Yuma, Ariz., has started 22 of the last 25 games and now has a total of 24 career starts under his belt. While hitting .272 (22x81) on the year with eight doubles and 17 RBI, Castillo has been exceptionally hot as of late. He is hitting .292 (21x72) since taking over the starting catcher role. He recently notched his fifth multi-hit game of the year vs. Portland (5/14), going 2-for-2 with two doubles and tying a career-high with three RBI. He has also been very solid behind the plate, throwing out 31% of would-be base stealers (12-of-39). Sunday's game against Oregon State could have almost been titled "Cesar Castillo Day", as he was the only senior on the team with more than one year spent in the program. He responded by hitting his first career triple.

42 Flavors:

Looking to find the perfect starting lineup as the Sun Devils play their final six regular season games, head coach Pat Murphy has used a different starting lineup in 34 of the last 38 games and 42 different lineup combinations during the 2002 season. Mixing and matching with a number of players earning starts, only four starting batting orders have remained the same since back-to-back games vs. Loyola Marymount (3/3) and New Mexico State (3/5). ASU has also mixed and matched for 31 different starting lineups by position.

A Team Effort

With the three suspensions and injury/dismissal of freshman pitcher Miguel Sanchez, several Sun Devils have been forced into playing time in a year that would have otherwise been a learning experience from the bench. Of the 33 players that were on the roster when the 2002 season began, 28 players have played a significant role on the team. Four of the remaining players are using their redshirt season (Matt Leaf, Bret Berglund, Josh Smith, Mike Guerrero) and walk-on catcher Garrett Schoenberger has made two Pac-10 road trips as a backup catcher.

The Streak Stops at Eight:

The Sun Devils had their impressive streak of eight straight Pac-10 series wins come to an end with the 2-1 series loss vs. Cal. Starting in Apr. 12-14, 2001 with a 2-1 series win over Washington State, the Devils had not lost since with series wins against Arizona (2-1), Washington (3-0), UCLA (2-1), at Arizona (2-1), Washington (2-1), at Washington State (2-1) and at UCLA (2-1).

Where They Compare To Past Years:

After 54 games, the Sun Devils are currently 16 games over .500 at 35-19 overall heading into postseason play. The Sun Devils were a nearly identical 35-18-1 last year at this same point in the season. Here is a look at how the Devils have fared after their 54th, 55th, 56th, 57th, 58th, 59th and 60th games possibly coming up this weekend) since Pat Murphy took over the program in 1995.

Pat Murphy Hits No. 300 And Keeps on Going:

With a convincing 10-0 win over UNLV in seven innings March 8, Sun Devil Head Coach Pat Murphy reached the 600 plateau for Division I victories in his 15 years of coaching at the top level of collegiate baseball. Murphy has now fashioned a career 677-333-4 record in the 1,014 career games of his 18 seasons as a head coach, with 55 of those wins coming at Maryville (Tenn.) College and Claremont-Mudd Scripps. In his 15 years at the D1 level, Murphy has averaged nearly 40 wins per year and with the sweep of Oregon State las weekend, is now 304-162-1 in his eight-year ASU career. He recently coached in his 1,000th career game April 21, 2002 in the series finale against Cal. Murphy has a career 22-16 (.579) record in postseason play. The Devils have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in five of the last six years under Murphy.

The Wild West

Sophomore Jeremy West heads into postseason play with a career-long nine-game hitting streak. He is hitting .514 (18x35) with 18 RBI, three doubles, a triple and two home runs during that stretch of games. For the season the Baseball America Midseason All-American is batting .368 (71x193) while leading the team in several offensive categories, including runs scored (54), doubles (18), home runs (13), RBI (67), slugging percentage (.705) and extra base hits (35). He has recorded a hit in 39 of 52 games this year and at least one RBI in 30 of those games. He also leads the team with 25 multi-hit games and 16 multi-RBI contests. He also passed the 100-RBI mark for his career, becoming only the 10th Sun Devil to record 100 or more RBI after his freshman and sophomore years. West recently put his name into the ASU record books with his eight-RBI game against Portland (5/15). The eight RBI, which included a grand slam home run, are the second most in single-game school history and the most by an ASU player since Andrew Beinbrink (the ASU career RBI leader) had eight in a game vs. Boston College in 1999. West currently has a six-game hitting streak in which he is batting .565 (13x23) with 14 RBI, 10 runs scored and five extra base hits. Below is a look at how West's 18 career home runs stack up in ASU history for players in their freshman and sophomore years.

Three-Position Pedroia:

Freshman Dustin Pedroia (Woodland, Calif.) has been impressive in the field and at the plate in his rookie campaign. Hitting .333 overall on the season and .381 in Pac-10 play, the Freshman All-America candidate has been one of ASU's most potent offensive weapons this year. He has started 30 of the last 32 games at shortstop (his third position started at this year) and has played nearly flawless defense this year with only three errors in 205 total chances (.985 FLD %). He has managed at least one hit in 42 of his 54 games played and is the only Devil to start every game this year. He also has one home run, is fifth on the team with 16 extra base hits and has recorded 23 multi-hit games. He has also been invited to the 2002 Team USA National Baseball Trials. He is currently second in ASU freshman history with 72 hits (leader has 81) and is tied with Bob Horner (1976) in second with 49 runs scored.

Sun Devil Baseball Successful in May:

With a 8-3 record in the month of May, he Sun Devil baseball program now has an all-time 297-129 (.697) record in the month dating back to the 1959 season when varsity baseball started. ASU was 7-5 last year in May, including a 1-2 record in the NCAA Regional in Fullerton, Calif. ASU is now 27-13 in the month of May over the last three years. ASU head coach Pat Murphy is a combined 44-27 in the month of May in his eight years in Tempe. Looking ahead to June, the Devils have an all-time 63-31 record.

Devils Finally Hit The Grand Slam (Home Run Update):

The Sun Devils endured a home run draught that put the team through a stretch of seven games without a home run (UCLA/Cal). Freshman Nick Cadena ended that run with two home runs vs. New Mexico State (4/30). While ASU equaled its entire home run total from 2001 with Sergio Garcia's home run vs. Stanford (the 31st of the year for ASU), the Devils had not hit a grand slam. Sophomore Jeremy West ended the streak by hitting a grand slam in the sixth inning of ASU's 48th game of the year. The squad now has 18 solo home runs, six two-run homers and 10 three-run home runs. Ranked last in the Pac-10 in round trippers, ASU has a better winning percentage when not hitting a home run. In fact, the Devils are 19-7 when not hitting a home run, while 16-12 when the team hits at least one home run. Jeremy West leads the team and is 6th in the Pac-10 with 13 home runs. Cadena, who is second on the team with six homers, also leads the Devils with two multi-homer games.

Why Not #9 Murphy:

Most who are close to the ASU Baseball program know what the No. 9 means to head coach Pat Murphy. Often his slogan to "Play all 9 Innings", Murphy and No. 9 are synonymous with each other... until this year. In a preseason meeting with team, Murphy gave a speech on how you have to be able to give up anything for the team. In this case, he even offered up his prize No. 9, knowing no one would take it. That is, until ASU's sophomore Steve Garrabrants raised his hand and said, I'll take it, and with that, the leader of the Devils is willing to give up *anything* for the team and will wear No. 7 this year.

Cadena Gets Hot Just In Time:

Freshman Nick Cadena was hitting just .097 after going 0-for-2 at Notre Dame (4/26), but has since caught fire after being inserted into the starting lineup for the injured Andre Ethier. The former high school All-American from Apollo High School, Cadena has made the switch from infielder to the outfield and has started the last 12 games in right field and designated hitter. Over that stretch of games Cadena is hitting .333 (16x48) with five home runs and 19 RBI. Cadena is now hitting .241 overall with six home runs and 26 RBI. His six home runs are tied for the fifth most by a freshman in ASU school history, with Jeremy West and Rod Allen also belting six in 2001.

Just Like The Golfer, This Sergio Garcia is on a Roll:

Senior infielder Sergio Garcia has a familiar name, but this Sergio Garcia is not a golfer. Garcia, a solid infielder who can play shortstop, second base or third base, transferred in the off-season from Oklahoma where he hit .311 for the Sooners last year and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. Garcia has started 28 games this year for the Sun Devils and has provided veteran leadership to an otherwise young ASU team. He has started 21 games at second base and seven games at shortstop this year. He had a career-best game vs. USC (5/19) in which he went 5-for-5 with three RBI in ASU's 17-8 win over the Trojans. With the five hits, he became the first Sun Devils since Brooks Conrad in 2000 to record five hits in a game. Further more, the five hits improved his batting average 39 points from .321 to .360 in just one game. He is fourth best on the team at .351 heading into postseason play. Garcia has also lived up to his golf surname, going 9-for-13 (.692) with four RBI in his last three Sunday's as if it were the final round of a major golf tournament. His 15 stolen base are tied for fourth in the Pac-10 with teammate Steve Garrabrants.

Liebeck Lights Them Up:

Junior right-handed pitcher Jered Liebeck has been a nice surprise for the Devils down the stretch. Little used in the first three months of the season as a reliever, Liebeck has come on strong as of late to assume the role as the team's Friday night starter. Liebeck had a strong showing vs. No. 7 Stanford, giving up three runs to record the no-decision while matching up against All-American Jeremy Guthrie. He then took to the mound in the first game against Pac-10 leader USC and gave the Devils a career-best outing to help get ASU off to a 1-0 series lead. Liebeck struck out eight in seven innings against the Trojans to improve to 2-0 on the week. He also picked up the win in relief vs. Portland in a midweek game. For the season the Glendale, Ariz., native is 2-1 with one save and a 5.14 ERA.

You're The Best; Mike Esposito:

While not claiming to be the best, sophomore Mike Esposito comes out to the song from the Karate Kid sound track labeled, "You're the Best," before each of his home starts. A song held special to his heart because the man singing the song is his father, Joe Esposito, who is popular lounge singer at Paris Casino in Las Vegas as part of a group called Cat Daddy. "Espo", as known by his teammates, has been solid for ASU on the mound this year with an 9-5 record is ranked in the top five in the Pac-10 with a 3.47 ERA. He is currently third in the Pac-10 with 93 strikeouts in 96.0 innings. The redshirt sophomore has not allowed an earned run in three of his last four starts. He has turned in three 10-plus strikeout performances this year, last being a 11 strikeout effort vs. New Mexico State (4/30) in six innings. Esposito had one of the best pitching performances in Sun Devil baseball history when he struck out 17 batters in a complete-game victory over the University of Washington (3/29) at Hohokam Stadium. He allowed only three runs (two earned) and eight hits in his second complete-game of the year. Esposito, a redshirt sophomore from Las Vegas, Nev. (Cimarron-Memorial High School) registered the sixth most K's in

a single game in ASU history and the most since 1997. The preseason All-American (*Baseball America third team*) and 2001 Team USA member is now 15-7 in his two-years at ASU. Esposito was a fifth-round draft choice in June 1999 by the Cincinnati Reds. After undergoing Tommy John surgery in March 2000, Esposito has not missed a start this year or in his career since coming back from the arm injury.

A Night to Remember; Esposito Strikes Out 17 vs. Washington:

Here is how Esposito's 17-strikeout game ranks among the top performances in ASU school history. It is the most by a Sun Devil pitcher since Ryan Mills struck out 17 vs. Southern Illinois in 1997 and no on has had more in a Sun Devil uniform since the 1973 season.

He's Back. Andre Ethier Returns To Lineup Like He Never Left:

Sophomore Andre Ethier broke his right thumb vs. Notre Dame (4/26), but was able to return to the lineup sooner than expected when he played last weekend against Oregon State. The junior went 5-for-7 with four RBI in two starts just as if he hadn't missed a game. The sweet-swinging lefty now has 18 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI contests. He hit .431 (28x65) in 17 Pac-10 games and recorded at least one hit in 34 of his 44 games played. Ethier had an interesting journey en route to becoming ASU's leading hitter this year. He came to ASU in the fall of 2000, left ASU to play at Chandler-Gilbert CC, and now is back as the starting right fielder for the Sun Devils. The sweet-swinging. After earning All-State honors at St. Mary's High School as a senior in 2000, Ethier followed his dreams and came to Arizona State University to play baseball. With playing time not working out, Ethier decided to play his freshman year at Chandler-Gilbert CC. Making a name for himself by hitting .468 at the JC level last year, Ethier spurned an offer from the Oakland Athletics after being drafted in the 37th round and came back to Arizona State.

Tough Luck McClellan Is Still 5-3 As A Starter:

Robbie McClellan is second on the team with his 7-5 record despite going 0-3 with two no-decisons in his last five starts. He has not picked up a win since April 14 at UCLA, but has pitched three good games against Notre Dame, Stanford and USC during that stretch. The junior pitched well on a cold night at Notre Dame and gave up only three runs in 7.1 innings at No. 8 Stanford. Both performances yielded a tough loss. He also gave up only two runs (one earned) in a no-decision against USC. McClellan is now 5-3 as a starter this year with a 4.66 ERA in those games. He is currently ranked fourth in the Pac-10 with 89 strikeouts and is second with opposing batters hitting only .249 off him. McClellan, from Liberal, Kan., became the first Sun Devil to notch back-to-back complete games since 1999, striking out a career-high 10 batters in a seven-inning win against UNLV (3/8). He allowed just four hits and did not allow a run in the 10-0 win over the Rebels. He also went all nine innings in a 7-2 win over Loyola Marymount (3/2). McClellan has an overall 4.61 ERA in 93.2 innings pitched. He became the 43rd selection all-time for Arizona State as Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after his performance vs. UNLV. McClellan is nicknamed "The Child" by his teammates for his boyish looks. He transferred to ASU from Seward County CC in Liberal, Kan., where he set school records for strikeouts in a career and season, and was 16-4 in his two years.

Home Sweet Home:

The Sun Devils couldn't be happier that they are hosting the NCAA Regional at Hohokam Park. ASU was 27-8 this year at home, while only 8-11 on the road. The offense has been drastically improved at spacious Hohokam Park with a .327 batting average and 290 of the 426 total runs. ASU is averaging 10.7 hits and 8.28 runs per game in home contests. The Sun Devils have gone 24-8 at Hohokam Park and were a perfect 3-0 at Packard Stadium this year. The pitching has also been better at home with ASU's hurlers posting a very impressive 3.78 ERA in the 35 home games. In ASU's 18 road games, the pitcher's were hit for a 5.91 ERA, giving up 101 earned runs in 153.2 innings.

Hitting For The Cycle... in the First Inning:

In what may be one of the rarest feats of Arizona State baseball history, the Devils led off the Feb. 9 game vs. Tennessee in grand fashion with the first four hitters combining to hit for the cycle in the first inning. Leadoff hitter Steve Garrabrants led off the game with a first-pitch home run, then Dustin Pedroia followed with a double, then Rod Allen singled and to cap off the amazing event, Jeremy West tripled to give ASU the early 2-0 lead.

Allen's Production Down. But Not Far Off:

Preseason All-American Rod Allen has lived up to the term 'Sophomore Jinx,' but, overall his season statistics are not all that far off from his remarkable freshman campaign in which he hit .389. Allen is hitting .268 overall (52x194), but the rest of his statistics are very comparable to 2001. He is second on the team with 47 RBI (only six off last years total of 53), has six more stolen bases (14 compared to six), has one less home runs (five compared to six) and has equaled his double total of 14 from last year. The main difference is in the hit column with 52 this year and 70 last year. The sophomore has had quiet a power outage though, now not hitting a home run in over two months since Mar. 24 at Arizona (90 at-bats). Allen recently became only the 9th Sun Devil in ASU history to record 100 or more RBI in his freshman and sophomore years. Teammate Jeremy West also passed the 100-RBI mark last weekend, becoming the 10th player in school history to reach 100 RBI after the freshman and sophomore years of a Sun Devil career. Home Sweet Home:

The Sun Devils couldn't be happier they ending the 2002 season with the final eight games at Hohokam Park. ASU improved to 24-8 this year at home with the two wins against USC last weekend. ASU was only 8-11 on the road this year, but had a winning mark in Pac-10 play on the road (7-5). The offense has especially enjoyed playing at spacious Hohokam Park with a .324 batting average and 269 of the 399 total runs. ASU is averaging 10.75 hits and 8.41 runs per game in home contests. The Sun Devils have gone 21-8 at Hohokam Park and were a perfect 3-0 at Packard Stadium this year. The pitching has also been better at home with ASU's hurlers posting a very impressive 3.66 ERA in the 32 home games. In ASU's 18 road games, the pitcher's have been hit for a 5.91 ERA, giving up 101 earned runs in 153.2 innings.

Jeff Larish Makes Strong Sun Devil Debut:

Freshman infielder Jeff Larish had not dressed for a game this year and was in the stands as a redshirt candidate before finding out he would be the starting third baseman in ASU's Mar. 16 game vs. Oklahoma. Larish made the most of the opportunity, going 3-for-4 with a triple and run scored in his ASU debut vs. the Sooners. Larish has since heated up to become one of the team offensive leaders with a .339 (38x112) batting average with 22 RBI. He was 4-for-5 with a big two-run home run vs. UCLA (4/12) to help lead the Devils to a 4-3 win in 11 innings. He also hit a big three-run home run vs. Stanford (5/10). He has recorded 11 multi-hit games, four of which have been three and four-hit contests. The freshman starred at Tempe McClintock High School last year and was a 32nd-round draft choice of the Chicago Cubs last June.

Garrabrants Proves To Be a Sparkplug:

Sophomore Steve Garrabrants has been a sparkplug for ASU all year with the team going 27-13 when he hits in the leadoff spot. For the season Garrabrants is fifth on the team with a .346 batting average (64x185). He is second on the team with 23 extra base hits (14 2B, 7 3B, 2 HR) and has recorded at least one hit in 37 of his 47 games (79%). Garrabrants is tied for second on the team with Dustin Pedroia with 23 multi-hit games and also has contributed 10 multi-RBI contests. He heads finished the regular season with a Pac-10 leading seven triples and his 15 stolen bases ranked fourth with teammate Sergio Garcia. Garrabrants started 47 games for the Devils, with 24 coming at second base, 16 at designated hitter and six in center field.

Murphy's Teams Know How To Score:

A true icon of the Pat Murphy system is scoring runs. The Sun Devils have done plenty of that since he arrived in 1995. ASU has led the NCAA in scoring in two of the last three years, averaging 11.32 runs per game in 1999 and 10.97 runs per game in 2000. The Devils paced the Pac-10 in 2001, hitting at a .327 clip and averaging 8.26 runs per game to rank 17th in the nation. ASU also led the nation in batting average with a team total of .356 in 1999 and fell just percentage points shy of matching that feat a second year in a row in 2000 with a .346 mark, trailing Stony Brook by one point. During Pat Murphy's eight seasons at ASU, the Sun Devils have been a scoring machine with 4,275 runs, averaging 9.15 runs per game and hitting at an overall .329 clip. Before the Saturday game of the Cal State Fullerton series, four San Diego Padre players stopped by unannounced to talk to both the Titans and Sun Devils about the affects of drinking and driving and wearing a seatbelt. Former CSF All-Americans Phil Nevin and Mark Kotsay were joined by all-star closer Trevor Hoffman and Padre pitcher Kevin Jarvis as they talked to both teams after losing teammate and good friend Mike Darr in an alcohol related acceded before the start of spring training in the Phoenix area.

Devils Better Score Early and Often:

The Sun Devils have had good success this year when scoring before their opponent, going 25-9 in those games. ASU has scored in the first inning in 30 of its 54 games this year (56%) and is 24-6 in those games when scoring in their first at-bat. Five runs or more seem to be the magic number for the Devils, as ASU is 32-7 in games when scoring five or more runs. The Devils are also 27-4 when leading after six innings and 30-1 when leading after eight innings. ASU is also 17-1 when scoring 10 or more runs and have scored 10 or ore in five of its last 10 games. ASŪ has come from behind twice in the ninth inning, scoring four runs at Arizona (3/22) and three vs. Oregon State (5/25).

How They Have Finished:

A Tribute To Joe Black:

The Sun Devils wore black socks and their black hat two games this year in the series against USC, honoring the late Joe Black, who starred in the Negro and Major Leagues, talked to the team during the preseason on various topics about baseball and life.

Hohokam is ASU's Home Away From Home in 2002:

While a \$2 million renovation will begin in late March to Packard Stadium, the Sun Devils will call Hohokam Stadium in Mesa home for the 2002 season for all but three home games. Hohokam Park is also the spring training home of the Chicago Cubs and the Arizona Fall League home of the Mesa Solar Sox. The facility will provide ASU with a first-class facility while Packard Stadium undergoes renovation. Hohokam Park, which opened in 1997, has a seating capacity of 12,623, with 8,000 theater-style seats.

Success in the Classroom As Well As On The Field:

ASU has long enjoyed much success on the diamond, and with 18 College World Series appearances, it is known as one of the gems of college baseball. But lately academics, as well as on-field talent, has shown its true colors in the storied program. Pat Murphy's Sun Devil squads have produced four Academic All-Americans over the past three years (Willie Bloomquist, Mark Ernster, Jeff Phelps, Casey Myers), including Myers being named the Academic All-American for college baseball in 2000 and 2001. The four players honored as National Academic All-Americans is the most by any college baseball program in the nation over the last three years.

ASU Owns Pac-10 Player of the Year Award:

Since the old Pac-10 North (formerly Washington State, Washington, Oregon State, Portland State) and the Six-Pac joined to form the unified Pac-10 baseball conference in 1999, Arizona State has enjoyed much success with a combined 43-29 record in league play. Even more impressive is that no one other than an ASU player has won the annual Pac-10 Player of the Year award. Willie Bloomquist won the inaugural award in 1999, while Casey Myers took home the hardware in 2000 and 2001 to become only fourth player in Pac-10 history to win the award twice in a career. In all, ASU has won nine (9) Pac-10 Player of the Year Awards dating back to 1978 (Myers (2), Bloomquist, Jacob Cruz, Paul Lo Duca, Linty Ingram, Oddibe McDowell, Alvin Davis, Mike Sodders) and two Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year (Noah Perry and Marc Barcelo).

ASU And Team USA Connections:

Arizona State baseball has had a long-standing tradition of sending players to play for the USA National team during the summers. ASU has had six players don the Red, White and Blue for Team USA since 1984, with the first being Oddibe McDowell in the 1984 Olympics played at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles. Jim Austin played for Team USA in 1990 and ASU has had four players play with Team USA in the last four years. 1999 Pac-10 Player of the Year Willie Bloomquist played in the summer of 1998, 2000-2001 Pac-10 Player of the Year Casey Myers played in the summer of 2000 and was also a member of the Team USA Junior National Team before arriving at ASU in 1998. Current Tampa Bay Devil Ray prospect Jon Switzer was also a member of the 2000 National Team and current pitcher Mike Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA last summer. Current Sun Devils Dennis Wyrick and Ryan Schroyer also played for the Team USA Junior teams during their respective prep careers. Schroyer and freshman shortstop Dustin Pedroia have a chance to join this elite list, as they have both been invited to the 2002 Team USA National Trials to be held in June in Tucson, Ariz.

Homegrown Devils:

A total of 20 of ASU's 32 players hail from the state of Arizona. Rod Allen (Phoenix), Joel Bocchi (Phoenix), Nick Cadena (Glendale), Cesar Castillo (Yuma), Andre Ethier (Phoenix), Steve Garrabrants (Phoenix), Tuffy Gosewisch (Scottsdale), Mike Guerrero (Mesa), J.J. Jackson (Chandler), Bryce Kartler (Phoenix), Ian Kinsler (Tucson), Aaron Klusman (Phoenix), Jeff Larish (Tempe), Matt Leaf (Peoria), Jered Liebeck (Glendale), Josh Perrault (Mesa), Ryan Schroyer (Casa Grande), Doug Schutt (Gilbert) and Josh Smith (Lake Havasu) are all native Arizonans. The team is also represented by players from Alaska (1), California (4), Colorado (1), Illinois (2), Kansas (1), Nevada (2) and New Mexico (1).

Allen and Esposito Named Summer All-Americans:

Sun Devil sophomores Rod Allen and Mike Esposito were named to *Baseball America*'s second-team Summer All-America team. Allen was ranked as the No. 8 prospect out of the Alaskan League after hitting .314 with 24 stolen bases to help lead the Anchorage Glacier Pilots to the National Baseball Congress (NBC) World Series Championship in Wichita, Kan. Esposito was 3-1 with a 1.56 ERA for Team USA. Junior pitcher Robbie McClellan also had great summer success, helping lead the Liberal BeeJays (Kansas) to the NBC World Series. McClellan was named an NBC All-American after going 2-0 with a 0.52 ERA in the 2001 World Series.

Golden Spikes Common At Arizona State:

While Mark Prior of USC was the recipient of the 2001 Golden Spikes award as the nation's top amateur baseball player, it should be noted that three Arizona State players have won the award. Bob Horner, who was a standout at ASU from 1976-78, won the inaugural award in 1978. Oddibe McDowell, who was a member of the first Team USA baseball team to compete in an Olympics, won the award in 1984. Mike Kelly, who ranks second in ASU history with 46 home runs from 1989-91, won the award in 1991. In all, 13 players that have worn the Maroon and Gold have been named a Player of the Year for college baseball.

ASU Leader of the Pac When It Comes to Player of the Week:

Arizona State has amassed 44 Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week and 66 Players of the Week since 1981. That total leads all Pac-10 member schools. The Sun Devils had two players honored as Pac-10 POW last year with Mike Esposito taking home the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honor on May 5 and Mike Lopez won the Pac-10 Player of the Week on April 28. The 2002 season has already seen five Sun Devils earn Pac-10 POW honors. Andre Etheir and Jeremy West (twice) have been named Pac-10 Players of the Week, while Robbie McClellan and Mike Esposito have been named Pac-10 Pitchers of the Week.

Arizona State in Postseason Play:

The Sun Devil baseball program has created a dynasty in college baseball that has been matched by few. With 18 appearances in the College World Series, ASU ranks fifth for the most trips to Omaha. Arizona State has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 25 of the program's 42 varsity seasons (dating back to 1959), amassing an incredible 122-49 (.730) record. ASU's five National Championships rank as the second most of any NCAA school. In addition to ASU's five national championships, the Sun Devils have also turned in five second-place teams and three third-place finishes.


