2008-09 RECAP: ASU (25-10) posted 25 wins in 2008-2009 for the first time since the 1974-75 squad went 25-4. ASU's record for wins is 26 set in 1962-63 (26-3)...10-6 against 2009 NCAA Tournament teams (1-0 vs. BYU, 3-0 against UA, 2-0 vs. UCLA, split games with Cal and 1-2 against Washington and USC)...defeated UA (68-56) and top-seeded UW (75-65) but fell to USC in the Pac-10 title game 66-63...defeated Temple but lost to No. 13 Syracuse in Miami at the NAAs...was 6-4 in road games and 7-3 in neutral games (20 of 35 games away from Tempe)...ASU had a RPI of 31 (second in Pac-10) and a strength of schedule of 37.

68-33 (.673) PAST THREE SEASONS: The Arizona State's men's hoops team, in its fourth season under 2009-10 Pac-10 Coach of the Year Herb Sendek and winners of 20 games (22-10) in three straight seasons for the first time since JFK was President, makes its third straight postseason appearance for the first time since the mid-1990s when it takes on Atlantic Sun regular season co-champion Jacksonville (19-12) in NIT action on Tuesday, March 16, at 8 p.m. PT in Tempe. The winner will take on the winner of the Seton Hall (19-12)/Texas Tech (17-15) game also held Tuesday, with time/date/location and TV information announced later.

QUICKIES ON THE SUN DEVILS: The Sun Devils, 8-3 in their past 11 games, 7-2 in past nine and 12-5 since opening the season 0-2 on the Los Angeles road trip, finished second in the Pac-10 (12-6) for the first time since 1980-81 after being picked for seventh in the preseason media poll and tenth by *Sporting News*... Herb Sendek became just the second Sun Devil to earn Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors in ASU's 32 years of Pac-10 play (Ned Wulk in 1979-80)...ASU finished 7-2 in the second half of Pac-10 play and has held 16 of 32 opponents to under 40 percent shooting, including seven of the nine Pac-10 schools (33 of its past 67 opponents have shot under 40 percent)...ASU is 32-22 (.593) in Pac-10 regular season games the past three seasons, tied for the second-best mark with Washington...ASU enters this week eighth in the nation in scoring defense (58.5 points per game) and 23rd in three-pointers made per game (8.2)...after going 8-22 in Coach Sendek's first year (2006-2007), ASU is 68-33 (.673) and giving up just 60.7 ppg. in his 130 games...the Sun Devils are the only team in the Pac-10 to post 20 wins in each of the past three seasons...Herb Sendek is 11-3 in first-round games of postseason play overall as he is 6-1 in NCAA action and 5-2 in NIT play.

PERSPECTIVE: With its Feb. 25 win at Stanford, ASU clinched its third straight 20-win season for the first time since 1961-63. This manufactured note says it all...ASU posted its 20th win for the third straight season (en route to 26) on Feb. 16, 1963, a 104-87 win at BYU. Six days later on Feb. 22, Herb Sendek was born. Here is another way to say it. ASU has three 20-win seasons under Herb Sendek in four years...it had three 20 win-seasons in the previous 25 seasons.

WOW: ASU was picked to finish seventh in the Pac-10 media poll and some had them tagged for last, as ASU was one of just seven schools to have two draft picks in the top 35 last year (James Harden was third and Jeff Pendergraph 31st), joining North Carolina (three), USC, Louisville, Wake Forest and UCLA. This year marks the first time ASU has posted three straight winning seasons since Bill Frieder led ASU to five straight from 1990-91 to 1994-95 (and also the last time ASU had posted back-to-back winning seasons before last year). ASU has produced 68 wins in the past two-plus seasons, just the second-time in school history a three-year period has produced 68 wins. ASU has notched 20 wins for the third straight season after reaching 20 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1979-80 and 1980-81. ASU had not had three straight 20-win seasons since the 1960-61 (23-6), 1961-62 (23-4) and 1962-63 (26-3) teams racked up 73 wins.

ASU enters this week eighth in the nation in scoring defense, giving up 58.5 points per game.

ASU has posted three straight 20-win seasons for the first time since 1960-61, 1961-62 and 1962-63

THE POINT GUARD: DEREK GLASSER has set the ASU record for games played in a career, as he has played in 130. Jeff Pendergraph played in 126 to set the mark last year, and **JERREN SHIPP** is second on the list as he has played in 128 games...averaging 10.3 points and is shooting 86.6 percent from the free throw line (110-of-127) this year...led league in assist-to-turnover ratio in Pac-10 games at 1.9 (75 assists and 20 turnovers)...leads the league in assists per game (4.8) and in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.2 (152 assists and 69 turnovers)...is the ASU career assist record holder with 545, topping the mark held by the late Bobby Thompson, who had 454 from 1983-87, and his 292-of-348 (.839) shooting from the free throw line currently is the best in school history...posted a career-high 24 points in the Nov. 27 win over LSU...has played 20 turnover free games in his 130-game career...has five 20-point games in his career...the first Sun Devil with 1,000 points (1,025) and 500 assists (545).

ASU IN NIT STUFF: ASU has made 10 appearances in the NIT and is 5-10 overall, with its most recent appearance in 2008 when it beat Alabama State and Southern Illinois before falling to defending NCAA champion Florida...ASU and Jacksonville have met once, with ASU winning a 111-69 contest in the season opener on Nov. 22, 1996...ASU beat Seton Hall 66-53 on Dec. 3, 1983, in its only meeting...Texas Tech holds a 22-19 series lead over ASU with the last meeting taking place on Dec. 8, 1988, an 81-75 ASU win in Lubbock...Herb Sendek has never faced Texas Tech or Jacksonville and is 0-1 vs. Seton Hall, as NC State fell to the Hall in Raleigh 83-65 on Jan. 25, 2006.

HERB SENDEK IN NIT: Herb Sendek is 8-8 in the NIT...he was 0-2 at Miami of Ohio with appearances in 1994 and 1996...he was 6-5 at NC State with appearances in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2002...his 2000 team advanced to the semifinals with wins over Tulane, Arizona State and Mississippi...at ASU he is 2-1.

SAME STAT: ERIC BOATENG leads the Pac-10 in field goal percentage at .661 (113-of-171) and finished even better in Pac-10 play at 68-of-103 (.660). Last year Sun Devil Jeff Pendergraph led the nation in field goal percentage at .660, the best mark by a Pac-10 player since Todd MacCullough of Washington shot .662 in 1998-99. Boateng won't have enough makes to qualify for national honors but no team has had different players lead the league in shooting since Washington State's Fred Ferguson (1993-94) and Mark Hendrickson (1994-95).

AT HOME: ASU is 43-11 (.796) at home in the past three seasons, including a 15-5 mark in 2007-08 that set the ASU mark for total home wins that was topped by this year's 16-3 (.842) mark. ASU is 28-6 (.824) the past two seasons at home.

FIRST-TEAM ALL-PAC-10: Junior **TY ABBOTT** is averaging 15.2 points and 5.6 boards in the past 17 games and is 53-of-129 (.411) from the three-point stripe in that time...in the 18 league games, Abbott finished ninth in the loop in scoring (14.7 points per game), 11th in rebounding (5.7 rpg.), ninth in free throw percentage (.818 as he was 36-of-44), fourth in three-point percentage (.411 as he was 53-of-129), second in three-pointers made per game (2.9) and sixth in defensive rebounds per game (5.0)...had monster road tilt with 28 points on 11-of-17 shooting, including 5-of-8 three-pointers, in season-high 39 minutes in 73-69 win at Tucson on Feb. 21...posted a season-high 29 points vs. Stanford, including seven three-pointers, and also added a career-best 12 rebounds, all on the defensive end...played 38 minutes, posted 20 points and matched season highs in assists (four) and steals (three) vs. California on Jan. 28...last year he shot 19-of-86 (.221) from the floor, 8-of-59 (.136) from the three-point stripe and averaged 2.9 points and 3.7 rebounds in Pac-10 play...missed one game after having arthroscopic surgery on his right knee in mid-October...Jan. 8-10 Pac-10 Player of the Week after the sweep of the Washington schools as he scored 17 points in each win...has played in 100 games in his three-year career and started in 89...closing in on 1,000 career points as he has 956 (9.6 points per game)...when Abbott scores in double digits, ASU is 37-11 (.771) and 25-7 (.781) the past two seasons.

BOAT: ERIC BOATENG already has his degree in Global Studies, speaks a little bit of Chinese and an African dialect called "Twi" and is taking advantage of the 24-hour access for ASU's new practice facility (Weatherup Center)...averaging 8.8 points and 7.3 boards while shooting 66.1 percent from the field (113-of-171), as he has scored 281 points after scoring 57 last year...68-of-103 (.660) from the field in Pac-10 play, best in the league...had monster game vs. UCLA on March 6 with 16 points, 14 rebounds, three assists, four blocks and zero turnovers in 34 minutes...notched 19 points and 13 boards vs. Cal on Jan. 28...in his past 12 games he is 56-of-81 (.691) from the floor and is averaging 11.2 points and 9.0 boards with 16 blocks...had made 14 straight shots entering the March 4 USC game, as he is the only D-I player to make 11-of-11 in D-I in a game this year when he did it at Stanford on Feb. 25. Jon Avery of IUPUI was 10-of-10 against Oral Roberts on Jan. 14, 2010 as was Dominic Calegari of UC Davis vs. UC Irvine on the same night)...had career-best 24 points at Stanford on Feb. 25.

HE IS THAT YOUNG AND BEEN COACHING THAT LONG: Herb Sendek earned the Miami of Ohio job in the spring of 1993 at age 30. Three years later he took over the NC State program at age 33. Some 17 years later he ranks near the top of the youngest coaches with 300 career wins, as he turned 47 on Feb. 22.

COACH SENDEK NOTES...

BIG WINS: With the victory at ninth-ranked UCLA on Jan. 17, 2009, Herb Sendek has led his teams to 12 top-10 wins in his past 10 seasons.

POINTS: NC State's 75.8 ppg. mark in the ACC in 2005-2006 would translate into a first-place offensive ranking among Pac-10 teams last year. Cal led the Pac-10 in scoring in Pac-10 games last year at 75.0 points per game.

NBA READY: Herb Sendek is one of just three coaches who had a NBA first-round draft pick in 2005 and 2006. Julius Hodge was the 20th pick of the Denver Nuggets in 2005. Cedric Simmons was the 15th pick of the New Orleans/Oklahoma City Hornets in 2006.

FREE THROWS: NC State led the nation and set the ACC record for free throw shooting (.799) in 2003-2004. That mark is tied for the best mark in the nation in the past 11 seasons with St. Joseph's in 2005-06 and is tied for the seventh-best mark in NCAA history.

HISTORY: Herb Sendek was the first coach to knock off the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament in consecutive years. NC State beat Maryland (2002) and Wake Forest (2003). Maryland was ranked second while Wake Forest was ninth.

DEFENSE: In Herb Sendek's 10 seasons, NC State led the ACC in scoring defense four times and held opponents to just 54.7 points per game in 1996-97, an ACC record.

FINAL FOURS: Herb Sendek coached in two Final Fours (1987 Providence and 1993 Kentucky).

NCAA SUCCESS: Under Herb Sendek, NC State was one of only eight teams who won a NCAA Tournament game from 2004-06.

THREE: NC State averaged nine threes in 2005-06, best in the ACC and ninth in nation.

YOUNG TALENT: NC State placed seven players on the All-ACC freshman team under Coach Sendek, and James Harden and Trent Lockett followed that in the past two seasons.

THREES: ASU hit a school record 18 three-pointers against USF on Nov. 20, 2009. It topped the previous mark of 17 set against Idaho State on Dec. 23, 2008.

50: ASU is 40-2 when it shoots 50 percent under Coach Sendek, including 12-0 in 2007-2008, 17-1 in 2008-2009 and 2-1 in his first year (2006-07). It is 10-0 this year. The only time ASU lost in the past three years (39-1) when it shot 50 percent was in the Pac-10 Championship on March 14, 2009, when it was 26-of-49 (.531) but lost 66-63. ASU was 2-of-4 from the free throw line, USC 13-of-21.

ONE MORE COACH HONOR: For the second time in four seasons, Herb Sendek earned United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX honors (California, Oregon, Washington, Hawaii, Arizona and Alaska). He also earned the honor in 2007-08 and earned District III (Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Maryland) honors in 2003-04. One note on the honor for this year...he was the only coach of the nine honored to not have a player on his All-District team.

REALLY?: ASU had a winning record at the halfway mark of the Pac-10 season (5-4) for just the third time in the past 15 seasons (1995-96 to present) and for the second straight season under Herb Sendek. ASU was 5-4 at the turn last year en route to the NCAA Tournament with NBA draft picks James Harden and Jeff Pendergraph leading the way. In 2002-03, ASU also was 5-4 at the turn, with Freshman of the Year Ike Diogu (and eventual NBA Lottery pick) and four seniors in the starting lineup and also advanced to the NCAA Tournament. This year also marks the fourth straight year Herb Sendek's Sun Devils posted at least the same Pac-10 record in the second half as it did in the first half, as it was 5-4 through first nine games and 7-2 in the final nine. ASU is 14-22 (.389) in the first half of Pac-10 play under Coach Sendek but 20-16 (.556) in the second half. ASU notched its first 7-2 "half" record in a Pac-10 season since the 1982-83 team went 7-2 in the back half of Pac-10 play en route to a 12-6 league mark. In the past three seasons ASU is 14-13 in the first half of Pac-10 play (.519) but 18-9 (.667) in the second half.

SOLID D NOTE: Eight of ASU's 22 opponents have had season-lows in points against ASU... Cal, UW, WSU, SDSU, UCSB, Delaware State, Western Illinois and UCLA all had or matched season-lows in points vs. ASU...ASU has held the top three scoring teams in the Pac-10 to its season low...Cal is at 78.0 but ASU held the Bears to 62 on Feb. 27 in Berkeley...UW is at 79.8 but had 51 on Jan. 8, while WSU is at 71.9 and had 46 on Jan. 10...ASU held UCLA (66.8) to 46 on March 4, matching a Bruin season-low...San Diego State is at 70.6 ppg. but had just 52 on Dec. 19...Big West Champion UCSB is averaging 68.2 ppg. but ASU held the Gauchos to 42 on Dec. 21...others with season-lows against ASU are Delaware State (34 but averaging 58.5) and Western Illinois (35 but averaging 59.0)...Jimmer Fredette of BYU, who had 49 at Arizona and is averaging 21.7 points, was 1-of-13 from the field against ASU and missed all his three-point attempts on Dec. 8 in Provo...WSU's Klay Thompson averaged 19.6 points, was 3-of-11 from the floor and posted nine points on Jan. 10 and was 6-of-20 from the floor and 2-of-10 from the three-point stripe on Feb. 4...Duke is averaging 78.4 but had 64 on Nov. 25.

ETC.: ASU's 43 points in the second half at Arizona on Feb. 21 is the most it has scored in the second-half of a Pac-10 game since it had 47 at Stanford last year on Jan. 2. ASU also had 40 at Stanford on Feb. 25...only three players have scored 25 points against ASU this year. Jerome Randle and Jerome Boykin of California both had 25 Jan. 28 and Tweety Carter had 27 for Baylor on Dec. 3...Rihards Kuksiks had 10 rebounds vs. UCLA on March 6...in his past 10 games Jerren Shipp is averaging 7.1 points and in the past eight games he is averaging 7.5 points...Rihards Kuksiks had 17 points off the bench in the UA win, matching a Sun Devil high with Trent Lockett who had 17 vs. Texas State on Nov. 16. Those digits mark the most points off the bench by a Sun Devil since Christian Polk had 18 vs. Arizona on Feb. 25, 2007.

BEST TREE IN THE LAND: Herb Sendek has eight former assistants who are D-I coaches, the best mark of any coach in the nation, ahead of Mike Montgomery and Rick Pitino (seven each). Twelve-year sidekick Mark Phelps earned the Drake spot in the spring of 2008 after serving for 10 years on the staff at NC State and for two years at ASU. Former NC State sidekick John Groce also earned the Ohio University position in the spring of 2008. The others are Jim Christian at TCU (Miami assistant in 1995-96), Charlie Coles at Miami of Ohio (Miami assistant from 1994-96), Larry Hunter at Western Carolina (NC State assistant from 2001-05), Ron Hunter of IUPUI (Miami assistant from 1993-94), Ohio State's Thad Matta (Miami assistant in 1994-95) and Arizona's Sean Miller (assistant at both Miami from 1993-95 and at NC State from 1996-2000).

A FEATHER IN THE CAP: ASU became just the third Pac-10 team to win three straight in McKale Center in the past 27 seasons (1983-84 to present) when it beat UA 73-69 in Tucson on Feb. 21. Stanford under Mike Montgomery won four straight from 2001-2004 and UCLA under Ben Howland won three straight from 2006-08.

OFFENSE: ASU'S 88 points vs. Stanford on Jan. 30 is the second-most in a Pac-10 regulation game under Herb Sendek. It then posted 81 at Washington State on Feb. 4, the first time since Jan. 13-15, 2005, it had scored at least 80 points in back-to-back Pac-10 games.

AT THE OTHER END: ASU has the tough-to-defend combination of being leading the league in three-pointers made per game (8.2) and is second in percentage (.368). In the 23 seasons since the three-pointer has been used (1986-87), only five teams have led the league in both three-bombs made and percentage (Oregon in 2007-08, 2003-04, 2002-03 and 2001-02 and Stanford in 1999-2000). Also, it is not just a get-fat-on-non-conference-opponent type of thing... ASU finished third in Pac-10 games only by shooting .351 from the arc and making 7.9 per game, best in the league.

ALL OVER STAT SHEET: Junior Jamelle McMillan was all over the stat sheet the eight games prior to his injury in mid-January, as he missed four games, and ASU was 2-2. In the eight games prior to the injury he averaged 32.8 minutes, 9.3 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.3 assists and had 12 steals and just 11 turnovers. What is eye-opening are the numbers with him playing and not playing for the Sun Devils. Some notes to ponder... ASU is giving up 56.8 points per game in the 28 games he has played yet gave up 70.5 in his absence...as the point man in the zone, ASU opponents shot .450 from the field and .363 in the games he was missing, yet in the games he played those numbers drop to .394 and .311...and no one is happier than Derek Glasser to have Jamelle in the backcourt...Glasser is shooting .438 from the three-point stripe in games Jamelle plays, in the four games without him he was 7-of-30 (.233) from the field and 0-of-11 (.000) from the three-point stripe.

IMPRESSIVE: Freshman Trent Lockett, a native of Golden Valley, Minn., comes from one of the top high school programs in the country (Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minn.) and has made a solid first impression as he earned a spot on the Pac-10 All-Freshman five-man all-freshman team. His 17 points against Stanford (Jan. 30) matched his second-best scoring night, as he had 19 vs. USF on Nov. 20 and 17 vs. Texas State on Nov. 16. He also added a career-best eight assists (he had 15 assists entering the game) vs. Stanford. He is averaging 6.8 points, 3.5 boards and is shooting 75-of-155 (.484) from the field. He has nine double-figure scoring games on the year, including a 17-point, six-rebound and eight assist effort against Stanford on Jan. 30.

PAC-10: In overall statistics, ASU leads the league in assist-to-turnover ratio (+1.2 tied with Cal), fewest turnovers per game (11.7) and three-pointers made per game (8.2). It is second in three-point percentage (.368), scoring defense (58.5 ppg.), field goal percentage defense (.407) and is third in turnover margin (+1.3) and scoring margin (+8.3). Derek Glasser leads the league in assists per game (4.8) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.2) and is fourth in free throws (.866) while Ty Abbott is sixth in three-point shooting (.408) and fifth in threes made per game (2.4). Eric Boateng is first in field goal percentage at .661 (113-of-171) and fourth in rebounding (7.3).

PAC-10 LEADERS IN CONFERENCE TILTS: In Pac-10 regular season games only, ASU led the league in three-pointers made (7.9) and fewest turnovers per game (11.4)...ASU ranked second in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.2) and field goal percentage defense (.410)...ASU ranked third in scoring margin (+3.8), scoring defense (60.7 ppg.), free throw percentage (.715) and three-point percentage (.351)...Ty Abbott finished ninth in the loop in scoring (14.7 points per game), 11th in rebounding (5.7 rpg.), ninth in free throw percentage (.818 as he was 36-of-44), fourth in three-point percentage (.411 as he was 53-of-129), second in three-pointers made per game (2.9) and sixth in defensive rebounds per game (5.0)...Derek Glasser was first in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.9), third in assists per game (4.2) and fifth in free throw percentage (.871)...Eric Boateng finished third at 7.6 boards per game and first in field goal percentage at .660 (68-of-103).

DEFENSE: Just how good has the defense been since Herb Sendek took over? ASU has given up less than 62 points per game in each of the past three seasons. Those that followed Coach Sendek's career won't find it a big shocker. In his 10 seasons in Raleigh, NC State led the ACC in scoring defense four times and held opponents to just 54.7 points per game in 1996-97, an ACC record. Last year's 60.5 points per game allowed was the lowest by ASU since the 1949-50 team gave up 59.8.

PAC-10 POLL: The 37 media members who voted in the Pac-10 poll announced on Oct. 29 predicted the Sun Devils for a seventh-place finish. The complete poll: 1. Cal (350/25 first-place votes); 2. UW (330/7); 3. UCLA (302/5); 4. UA (221); 5. OSU (218); 6. UO (175); 7. ASU (144); 8. WSU (123); 9. USC (109); 10. Stanford (63).

THE SHOOTER: Junior Rihards Kuksiks was the third-best returning three-point shooter in the nation according to official NCAA statistics. Kuksiks was 93-of-210 from the arc, eighth in the nation. He shot .420 from the three-point stripe in the 16 games against NCAA Tournament teams last year and is 22-of-45 (.489) in his past seven games against ranked opponents. He was clutch in close games last year, as ASU played four games of two points or less (and went 3-1), and Rik was 14-of-30 (.467) from three. He averaged 10.3 points (third-best on the team) and his 93 three-pointers is the third-best in school history, while the 44.3 percent shooting is tied for the fourth-best. He matched career-highs in points (27) and rebounds (nine) in the Jan. 8 win over No. 24 Washington. He has five 20-point games on the year with 27 vs. USF and Washington, 25 at Oregon and 24 vs. USC and UCSB.

THE HEAD COACH: Herb Sendek, 76-54 (.580) at ASU, is in his 17th season as a head coach in 2009-2010 and has averaged 19.2 wins per season. He led the NC State Wolfpack to five straight NCAA appearances from 2002-06 and is now 330-213 (.608) in 17 seasons and was 191-132 (.591) at NC State. The 47-year-old (born Feb. 22, 1963) Pittsburgh, Pa., native remains the third-youngest coach in the Pac-10. Only Duke posted more ACC wins (regular season and ACC Tournament) than NC State's 53 victories from 2002-2006. Another overlooked note is his 10-year stay at NC State. To compare it to the Pac-10, since the league expanded to 10 teams in 1978-79, only five coaches have coached at their schools for at least 10 years: Lute Olson (24/Arizona), Ralph Miller (19/Oregon State), Mike Montgomery (18/Stanford), Ernie Kent (in his 13th at Oregon) and Ben Braun (12/California).

ABOUT THE ROAD: ASU at 10-8 is the only team in the Pac-10 with a winning league road record in the past two seasons, as it has gone 5-4 each year away from Tempe...after losing its first eight Pac-10 road games under Herb Sendek, ASU is 15-13 (.536) since...ASU swept the Oregon trip for the second straight year, just its second Pac-10 road sweep since January of 2005 and its third road sweep in the past six seasons...ASU has now won the past three in Tucson and is 3-1 at UA under Herb Sendek after winning once in Tucson in the previous 23 tries (win was in 1994-95, from 1983-84 through 2006-07 period)...ASU won four straight Pac-10 roadies last year for the first time since the 1980-81 team won five straight...ASU won five Pac-10 road games for just the sixth time in its 32-year history this year. It went 8-1 in 1980-81, 7-2 in 1979-80 and 5-4 in 2009-10, 2008-09, 1994-95 and 1982-83.

POINTS ALLOWED: Quietly the Jan. 10 71-46 win over Washington State and the 56-46 wins over Oregon State (Feb. 13) and UCLA (Mar. 6) were three of the best in terms of points allowed by ASU in its Pac-10 history. It is the eighth-fewest points allowed in ASU's 576 Pac-10 regular-season contests.
