HEATING UP: Sophomore newcomer Bryson Krueger, who played for assistant coach Brooks Thompson at Yavapai C.C. last year, is 13-of-16 (.813) from the floor and 7-of-10 (.700) from the three-point stripe in the past two games. He had a season-high 23 points against UC Riverside on Dec. 12 after posting 14 points against Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 6 and 12 vs. UTEP on Nov. 26.

FREE THROWS: ASU shot 73.5 percent at the free throw line last year, the fifth-best mark in school history and second-best in the past 17 seasons. It is shooting 72.3 percent this year, including 61-of-76 (.803) in the past three games. Ike Diogu leads the way as he is 82-of-91 (.901) from the line, including 37-of-39 (.949) in the past four games. ASU was third in the nation last year in free throw attempts at 27.56 per game, behind only Texas Southern (28.3) and Niagara (28.2). It is averaging 26.6 attempts per game this year.

MORE DIOGU NOTES: Ike Diogu averaged 22.8 points per game in 2003-2004, which not only led the Pac-10 but was ninth in the nation...<u>has scored in double digits in all 67 career games, the best active streak in the</u> nation...in his career he now has eight 30-point games (three this year), 34 20-point games (five this year), 19 double-doubles (four this year) and 12 other games with nine rebounds...is 505-of-634 (.797) from the free throw line in his career...entered 2004-2005 season as the nation's third-leading returning scorer and is the first Pac-10 scoring leader to be back on campus the following season since Reggie Miller won the honors in 1985-86 and returned in 1986-87...also averaged a Pac-10 best 36.9 minutes per game and grabbed 8.9 rebounds per game (second in the Pac-10) last year...Garland, Texas, native averaged 11.03 free throw attempts per game last year and broke the 40 year-old Pac-10 season record for free throws made with 243.

KRUGER, PART II: Sophomore Kevin Kruger is making a difference on the perimeter as well, as he is 15-of-33 (.455) from the three-point stripe and has notched double digits in three games. He provided a spark in the final nine games last year, averaging 29.0 minutes, 12.4 points and shot 27-of-59 (.448) from the three-point stripe. He was the team's second-leading scorer in those nine games. After shooting 4-of-27 (.148) from the three-point stripe in the first 18 games of his career, he is 42-of-92 (.457) in his past 17 contests.

ABOUT THE RECENT WINS: ASU enters the Northwestern game on a five-game win streak. ASU has posted just one six-game win streak in the past 10 years, as the Sun Devils won six straight from Dec. 5-29, 1998, before losing its Pac-10 opener to USC 72-70 on Jan. 2, 1999. The Sun Devils have posted four six-game win streaks in the past 24 seasons (1990-91, 1992-93, 1994-95 and 1998-99), but have not won seven straight since they won their first seven games in 1980-81 and then won 11 straight that same year.

DEVIL DATA: Jason Braxton is averaging 7.7 rebounds and 5.3 assists in the past three games. He tied a career-high with eight boards against both UC Riverside and Cal State Northridge and has 31 assists and just 11 turnovers on the year. His 131 career steals is tenth on the ASU career chart...sophomore **Serge Angounou** is averaging 9.6 points and 7.6 rebounds in the past five games. He already has posted 12 more rebounds (51) than he did in 15 games last year (39) and has more field goals through eight games (25) as he did last year (24)..**Steve Moore** has two 20-point games on the year and is shooting 79.6 per-

cent (109-of-137) from the free throw line in his 35-game career...the Sun Devils are 34-16 (.680) in the past four seasons and are 67-37 (.644) under Evans in his seven years in Wells Fargo Arena....ASU has outrebounded seven of eight opponents on the year and is 7-0 in those games. It has outrebounded its past five opponents by 11.4 boards per game...only two Sun Devils have finished in the nation's top-10 in scoring. Eddie House was fourth in 1999-2000 (23.0 points per game), while Ike Diogu was ninth last year at 22.8.

NEWCOMERS: ASU's experience (and depth) this year is a lot better, as last year at this time Rob Evans was trying to play up to seven new-comers. ASU's seven newcomers combined to average 118.1 minutes per games played last year, compared to just 46.4 minutes this year.

NORTHWESTERN SERIES: ASU is 3-2 against the Wildcats with all of the games except last year's contest taking place in Tempe, including a 77-60 Sun Devil victory on Dec. 29, 2001, in the final of ASU's holiday tournament. ASU forced 24 turnovers in that game and had 14 offensive rebounds. ASU is 3-1 against Big Ten teams under Rob Evans, as it beat Penn State in 1999-2000, Northwestern in 2001-2002 and Purdue in 2003-2004.

AT NORTHWESTERN (DEC. 17, 2003): ASU trailed at the half for the fourth straight game and fell behind by as many as 13 before taking the lead, but a T.J. Parker jump shot with no time remaining gave Northwestern a 63-61 win in Evanston on Dec. 17, 2003. Ike Diogu led ASU with 23 points and 14 rebounds and was the only Sun Devil in double

digits. ASU matched a season-low with eight turnovers, outrebounded Northwestern 43-35 and had 15 more field goal attempts than the Wildcats but made just one of its first 10 three-pointers. Northwestern had 20 assists and led 40-27 early in the second half. ASU was just 5-of-22 (.227) from the three-point stripe. Diogu matched season-highs with 17 field goal attempts and seven offensive boards. Northwestern had ASU opponent lows in fouls (13) and bench points (six).

VS. SANTA CLARA: ASU is 4-2 against the Broncos, with the Sun Devils winning the last meeting 74-55 on Dec. 21, 1999 in Tempe. ASU held Santa Clara to just 18-of-57 (.316) from the field in that game, including 1-of-13 (.077) from the three-point stripe. Eddie House had 21 points, while Shawn Redhage added 12 points, six assists and six boards. ASU has a four-game game winning streak in the series that began in 1956-57 but the teams did not play from until 1999-2000 after a 91-74 ASU win on Dec. 14, 1979.

RECRUITS GET HIGH MARKS: ASU's recruiting class was ranked 14th (tied with Indiana) by Clark Francis of *Hoop Scoop.* ASU has added Tyrone Jackson (Fresno C.C.), Bryson Krueger (Yavapai C.C.), Tim Pierce (Hercules High School/Oakland) and Craig Austin (El Camino High School/San Diego), while others ranked in the top 15 from the Pac-10 included Oregon (eighth) and USC and UCLA (tied for ninth). The rankings were in the June issue of *Basketball Times*.

ACADEMICALLY: Despite published reports (since corrected) that said "the state's three public universities have graduated only two male basketball players in the past five years" and "...not a single men's basketball player graduated from the three institutions last year" ASU has had success in the classroom recently. Here's a look at scholarship players already earning degrees who have played for Rob Evans: Kenny Crandall (B.I.S., Business and Communications, 2004), Justin Allen (B.S., Justice Studies, 2003), Tyson Johnston (B.A., Sociology 2003), Chad Prewitt (B.I.S., Business and Communications, 2002), Awvee Storey (B.I.S., Sociology, 2001), Okeme Oziwo (B.S.W., Social Work, 1999) and Bobby Lazor (B.S., Marketing, 1998).

ROB EVANS: <u>Rob Evans (183-171/.517) is in his seventh season at Arizona State (13th overall)</u> <u>after being hired on April 7, 1998.</u> The 1997 SEC Coach of the Year spent six seasons at Ole Miss, compiling an 86-81 (.515) record. He led the Rebels to a 42-16 record in his final two seasons after going 44-65 (.403) in his first four, winning two SEC West titles, and led Ole Miss to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 1937-38. The 58-year old Evans is a 1968 graduate of New Mexico State, where he captained two NCAA Tournament teams and is a 1989 inductee of the Athletic Hall of Fame. He is 97-90 (.519) at ASU and has led the Sun Devils to three postseason appearances, including a 2003 NCAA appearance that was the school's first since 1995. He is 140-102 (.579) in the past nine seasons.</u>
