ASU IN WEST REGION AT NCAAs: The 10th-seeded Arizona State men's basketball team (19-11; 11-7 and fourth in the Pac-10 Conference) takes on the Memphis Tigers on Thursday, March 20, in NCAA Tournament West Region first round action at the Ford Center in Oklahoma City at 6:10 p.m. (5:10 MST). The winner will face the Kansas/Utah State winner at approximately 7 p.m. (6 p.m. MST) on Saturday.

Arizona State went 6-3 in the second half of Pac-10 play to clinch the fourth spot in the standings. The Sun Devils will try to notch their first 20-win season since 1995 and their second in the past 13 seasons. ASU is in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1995, the second time in the past 12 seasons and for just the third time in 22 seasons. Its only NCAA appearances in the previous 21 seasons were in 1994-95 and 1990-91.

MEET IKE DIOGU: Ike Diogu, the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and the only freshman to earn All-Pac-10, is averaging 20.3 points and 10.2 rebounds in the past 12 games and has 11 20-point games. Diogu, Cal senior Joe Shipp and Oregon junior Luke Ridnour are the only Pac-10 players who have posted double digits in every game. Diogu is the only Pac-10 player who ranks in the league's top five in scoring and rebounding as he is third in scoring (19.1 ppg.) and fourth in rebounding (7.9 rpg.).

The Garland, Texas, native also has set the ASU freshman record for starts (30), points (572), field goals made (195), rebounds (237) and minutes (966). He has set school records for free throws made (175) and attempted (238) and his 18 rebounds vs. Oregon in the Pac-10 Tournament set the ASU freshman singlegame mark and is a Pac-10 Tournament record. The 18 rebounds is the most by a Sun Devil since Mike Batiste had 18 in a triple-overtime game at Texas A & M on Dec. 18, 1998, a span of the past 141 games.

NCAA HISTORY: This year marks ASU's 12th NCAA appearance and first since 1995. ASU is 11-12 in the previous 11 appearances and has reached the Final Eight on three occasions. The Sun Devils did it in 1961, 1963 and 1975 — all under coach Ned Wulk. Utah, Oregon State and UCLA eliminated ASU in those years. In 1995, ASU (the No. 5 seed in the Southeast), beat Ball State 81-66 and topped Manhattan 64-54 in Memphis to advance to the Sweet Sixteen, where it fell to second-ranked Kentucky 97-67 in Birmingham.

PATIENCE: When Rob Evans arrived at ASU in the spring of 1998, many talked about his final two years at Ole Miss when he went 42-16 (.724) and won two SEC West titles with a program that had been to just one NCAA Tournament. Before those two seasons, Evans took a program many called "below ground" and had a 44-65 (.403) mark in his first four seasons. At ASU, Evans was 60-60 in his first four years before the 19-11 (.655) record this year. Overall, Evans is 104-125 (.454) in his first four years of building a program and is 61-27 (.693) after the rebuilding process.

MILLAGE HEATING UP: Curtis Millage has made 55-of-63 (.873) free throws in the past 14 games and is 113-of-226 (.500) from the field in the past 18 games. He averaged 17.4 points per game in Pac-10 play, tied for fifth in the loop, and his 16.1 points per game is currently eighth in the league. Millage has 13 20-point games in his career, including 27 vs. USC on Feb. 13 and 27 vs. Oregon on March 6 which matched his career high. He also has made 42-of-46 (.913) free throws in the past eight games and is averaging 21.6 points in that span, tied with Diogu for the team leader.

AWAY FROM TEMPE: ASU opened Pac-10 play with five of its first seven and seven of its first 11 on the road and played 15 games away from Tempe and is 7-8, including neutral site wins over Mountain West top-seed Utah (Maui Invitational) and Purdue (Las Vegas Showdown). ASU played 15 home games and 15 games away from Tempe.

RPI CHATTER: ASU finished the season with an RPI of No. 32, according to collegeRPI.com (Mar. 16). Others in the Pac-10 include Arizona (2), Stanford (20), California (33), Oregon (50), USC (111), UCLA (136), Oregon State (157), Washington (161), and Washington State (232). ASU was 5-10 against the top 100.

IN THE PAC-10: ASU ranks first in the Pac-10 in field goal percentage (.484) and blocks per game (4.33), second in fewest turnovers per game (13.9), and is third in scoring defense (69.3 ppg), scoring offense (76.8), scoring margin (+7.5), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.14) and rebounding margin (+4.8). Tommy Smith has posted a Pac-10 leading 64 blocks (2.13 per game) while Kyle Dodd leads the loop with a 4.54 assist-to-turnover ratio (100 assists and 22 turnovers).

EVERYONE LIKES IKE: Freshman **Ike Diogu** leads the team at 19.1 points and 7.9 rebounds. The Garland, Texas, native has already been to the line a Pac-10-leading 238 times and is shooting .735 percent from the charity stripe (175-of-238). <u>He also is shooting 60.7 percent from the field (195-of-321), second in the Pac-10, and finished at 63.8 percent (120-of-188) in Pac-10 games, first in the league.</u>

ALL-PAC HONORS: Diogu became just the ninth freshman to earn all-league honors since Arizona and Arizona State joined the loop in 1978-79 (25 seasons ago) and just the fourth to earn All-Pac-10 in the past seven seasons. Before Diogu, no freshman had earned All-Pac-10 since Jason Gardner (Arizona), Casey Jacobsen (Stanford) and Jason Kapono (UCLA) in 1999-2000. He could become the first freshman since Cal's Shareef Abdur-Rahim in 1995-96 to finish in the league's top 10 in scoring and rebounding (Abdur-Rahim was the league's Player of the Year). He is Arizona State's third Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, joining Jamal Faulkner in 1990-91 and Byron Scott in 1979-80.

ROB EVANS: Rob Evans (165-152/.521) is in his fifth season at Arizona State (11th overall) after being hired on April 7, 1998. The 1997 SEC Coach of the Year spent six seasons at Ole Miss, compiling an 86-81 (.515) record. He led the Rebels to a 42-16 record in his final two seasons after going 44-65 (.403) in his first four, winning two SEC West titles, and led Ole Miss to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 1937-38. The 56-year old Evans is a 1968 graduate of New Mexico State, where he captained two NCAA Tournament teams, is a 1989 inductee of the Athletic Hall of Fame and was named to the school's All-Time team. He is 79-71 (.527) at ASU. Evans' Ole Miss squads were known as tough man-to-man teams which ranked 13th in the nation and second in the SEC in 1997-98 in rebounding at +6.6. Ole Miss held opponents to just 30 percent from the three-point stripe, best in the SEC, and to just 40.6 percent from the field. He is 121-84 (.590) in the past seven seasons.

ROB EVANS VS. THE FIELD: Arizona State coach Rob Evans has never faced Memphis, Kansas or Utah State in his 11-year head coaching career.

EVANS IN THE NCAA: Rob Evans took Ole Miss to NCAA Tournament in back-to-back seasons, a first in school history, in 1997 and 1998. Ole Miss had been to just one NCAA Tournament before Evans arrived (1981).

Evans and eighth-seeded Ole Miss fell to ninth-seeded Temple 62-40 in the first round on March 14, 1997, in Kansas City.

In 1998, fourth-seeded Ole Miss fell to 13th-seeded Valparaiso 70-69 in Oklahoma City on March 13, 1998. Valparaiso then beat Florida State 83-77 in overtime to advance to the Sweet Sixteen where it fell to Rhode Island.

DODD PLAYING WELL: Point guard Kyle Dodd has <u>54 assists and just nine turnovers in the past 11 games</u>. He posted a season-high 14 points vs. UCLA on Feb. 16. <u>Dodd leads the Pac-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio at 4.54 and also had 76 assists and just 13 turnovers in the 18 league games, a league-leading 5.85 ratio in the loop.</u>

AT THE LINE: <u>Ike Diogu's 238 free throw attempts (7.93 per game) broke the ASU record of 234 (7.09 pg) set by Mario Bennett in 1994-95.</u> He would crack the Pac-10 single-season list and would register the most free throws in the loop since Harold Miner attempted 286 in 1991-92, which is third on the Pac-10 single-season list, if he reaches 265.

REDHAGE SOLID: Shawn Redhage posted one of the best performances off the bench in all of college basketball this season on Feb. 8 at Washington in ASU's 79-77 overtime win. Redhage had a career-high 29 points (8-of-11) from the floor, and also had career highs in free throws made (11) and attempted (18). The construction science major with a 3.61 grade point average and two-time Pac-10 All-Academic selection posted season highs in rebounds (eight, but since topped with 12 vs. USC), assists (five) and minutes (34). On Feb. 13 against USC, Redhage had 16 points (including 8-of-9 from the free throw line) and matched his career-high with 12 rebounds for the second double-double of his career. Redhage has 12 double-figure scoring games this year after having three all of last year. Redhage matched the ASU freshman record with 28 starts in 1999-2000 and has posted double digits in nine of the past 13 games. His 29 points is the most by a Sun Devil off the bench in school history. In the past five games, including the past four games in which he started, Redhage is averaging 13.0 points.

IKE ON PAC-10 LIST: Ike Diogu's 19.1 points per game is currently the third-best mark in Pac-10 history by a freshman. Only Shareef Abdur-Rahim (21.1 points per game in 1995-96) and Harold Miner (20.6 in 1989-90) have posted better scoring numbers in their initial seasons.

DOUBLE DIGITS: Ike Diogu's 30 straight double-figure scoring games is the best since senior Jeremy Veal also notched double digits in the first 30 games in 1997-98. Even in Eddie House's amazing 1999-2000 season, his longest double-digit scoring streak was 10 straight games. A look at the best ASU streaks beginning with the 1990-91 season:

BAD LUCK: Since 1990, 53 of 54 Pac-10 teams who have won at least 11 conference games have been selected to the NCAAs. The exception? ASU in 1992-93, when it was 11-7 and tied for third. Also, 58 of 60 teams since 1990 who have posted 18 wins and 10 Pac-10 wins have qualified. Again, the odd teams out were ASU in 1992-93 and 1999-2000.

MAKING HIS MARK: Ike Diogu's 27-points vs. Oregon on March 13 in the Pac-10 Tournament, at Oregon on Jan. 4 and against Lafayette on Nov. 30 are tied for the fourth-best freshman scoring mark in ASU history. It is the best scoring mark by a freshman since Mario Bennett set the mark with 35 against fifth-ranked Arizona on Feb. 20, 1992. Diogu now owns eight of the top 13 freshman scoring games in ASU history and is the first Sun Devil freshman to post back-to-back 25-point games, as he had 26 vs. USC and UCLA. MAKING HIS MARK, II: Ike Diogu's set the ASU freshman record and the Pac-10 Tournament record with 18 rebounds vs. Oregon on March 13. His 14 rebounds vs. Oregon on March 6 and vs. Stanford on Feb. 1 are tied for the third-best freshman rebounding mark in ASU history. In the past 12 seasons, only two ASU freshmen have posted double-doubles (eight occasions). In addition to his 27-point, 18-rebound effort vs. Oregon in the Pac-10 Tournament, Diogu had 14 points and 10 boards at Oregon State on Jan. 2, 18 points and 13 boards vs. No. 20 California on Jan. 30, 16 points and 14 rebounds vs. Stanford on Feb. 1, 26 points and 10 boards at Washington State on Feb. 6, 15 points and 10 boards vs. top-ranked Arizona on Feb. 22 and 17 points and 14 boards vs. Oregon on March 6. Chad Prewitt had 15 points and 10 boards vs. Stephen F. Austin on Dec. 8, 1998. When you tally it, the feat has been accomplished by a Sun Devil frosh just eight times in the past 336 games and just seven times (all by Ike Diogu) in the past 142 games. It was ASU's first road sweep since it swept the Oregon schools in February of 2001...ASU's 33-point win at Washington State (87-54) was the school's biggest road win since a 36-point win (91-55) at California on Feb. 3, 1979...Rob Evans is 11-8 in overtime in his career (6-6 at Arizona State)...the Pac-10 schedule did not work in Evans' favor again this year as it marked the fourth time in his five-year ASU career that the Sun Devils opened on the road to start league play. PAC-10 POLL: ASU was picked fourth by the Pac-10 Media, announced Nov. 6. It marks the highest preseason prediction for ASU since 1994-95 when it also was picked fourth. Arizona was a unanimous choice for the top spot among the 27 media types. The poll: 1. UA; 2. UO; 3. UCLA; 4. ASU; 5. Cal; 6. USC; 7. Stanford; 8. OSU; 9. UW; 10. WSU.

was in 2000-2001 against second-ranked Stanford...Diogu was one of only four Pac-10 freshman to start a season opener, joining Mike Jensen (Washington), Lamar Hurd (Oregon State) and Andre Igoudala (Arizona)...ASU's 59-56 Nov. 22 win over Morehead State was its 13th straight home opening win. Rob Evans is now 9-2 in season lid-lifters (4-1 at ASU)...ASU played one of its most efficient games with its 70-53 win over Purdue on Dec. 21 in the Las Vegas Showdown. ASU was 25-of-46 (.543) from the field, outrebounded Purdue 35-26 and led by as many as 20. ASU's 46 field goal attempts is the fewest in the past 229 games, dating to when it also attempted just 46 in a win over SMU on Dec. 29, 1995. ASU held Purdue to just 17-of-43 (.395) from the field and allowed 26 rebounds and just four assists...the last ASU opponent to score 100 in Tempe was third-ranked UA on Feb. 27, 1988 (101-73). The current streak of an ASU opponent not scoring 100 points in Tempe stands at 251 games...ASU is 7-18 in its first Pac-10 road game in its 25 Pac-10 seasons. ASU won Pac-10 road openers this season (Jan. 2 at OSU) and in 1991-92, 1987-88, 1984-85, 1980-81, 1979-80 and 1978-79...ASU won its 36th holiday tournament for the 27th time this year. ASU is now 60-12 (.833) in the tournament, as Ike Diogu became the first freshman since Mario Bennett in 1991 to earn MVP honors...ASU's win over Cal on Jan. 30 snapped a 17-game losing streak when ASU trailed at the half. The last time ASU had come back from a halftime deficit was March 3, 2001, when it trailed Oregon State 31-30 before winning 61-59. ASU also came back from a 39-35 halftime deficit to beat UCLA on Feb. 15.

HISTORY LESSON: ASU is 1-7 vs. the nation's top-ranked, with the win coming 22 years ago (March 7, 1981) in one of the greatest wins in Sun Devil history. ASU, coached by 2003 Pac-10 Hall of Honor inductee Ned Wulk, travelled to Corvallis and led 40-20 at the half against top ranked Oregon State and won 87-67 on the final day of the regular season. All five ASU starters (Sam Williams, Paul Williams, Alton Lister, Byron Scott and Fat Lever) in that game were future NBA first- or second-round draft picks. ROTATION UPDATE: Injuries affected the rotation, as highly touted 6-8 freshman Serge Angounou missed the season after injuring his kneecap in the first exhibition. Angounou had surgery on Nov. 15 and will apply for a redshirt. Also, swingman Kenny Crandall is still recovering from a broken right fibula suffered in April and is limited. Curtis Millage, the team's top returning scorer from last year, missed the first three games due to an eligibility issue.

WULK HALL INDUCTEE: The Sun Devil family inducted Ned Wulk into the 2003 Pac-10 Hall of Honor on March 12, 2003. Byron Scott was ASU's initial inductee last year. The Hall of Honor was created to recognize athletes and coaches who have made significant contributions to the tradition and heritage of the Pac-10. ASU honored Wulk in March of 1999, as the arena floor where he won 20 straight contests was renamed "Ned Wulk Court" in his honor as he won 406 games from 1958-82. Wulk was 406-272 (.599) in his 25-year run as Sun Devil head coach and was honored at a banquet on March 5, 1999, which was held on the floor of Wells Fargo Arena.

SUN DEVIL DATA: ASU went 6-3 in the second half of Pac-10 play to clinch fourth place...non-conference wins included Utah at the Maui Invitational and Purdue at Las Vegas Showdown...ASU is in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1995, the second time in the past 12 seasons and for just the third time in 22 seasons. Its only NCAA appearances in the past 21 seasons were in 1994-95 and 1990-91...Ike Diogu, the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and the only freshman to earn All-Pac-10 honors, is averaging 20.3 points and 10.2 rebounds in the past 12 games. Diogu's 19.1 points per game is currently the third-best freshman mark in Pac-10 history. Only Shareef Abdur-Rahim (21.1 ppg. in 1995-96) and Harold Miner (20.6 in 1989-90) have posted better scoring numbers in their initial seasons...Curtis Millage is averaging 21.6 points in the past eight games...ASU had just one loss outside the RPI top 50 (76-74 at USC on Jan. 18). It was 5-10 against RPI top-100 teams and the USC loss is the only one against a non-NCAA Tournament team. Half its games were against top-100 teams.

NCAA: This year marks ASU's 12th NCAA appearance. ASU is 11-12 in the previous 11 appearances and has reached the Final Eight on three occasions. The Sun Devils did it in 1961, 1963 and 1975 — all under coach Ned Wulk. Utah, Oregon State and UCLA eliminated ASU in those years. In 1995, ASU (the No. 5 seed in the Southeast), beat Ball State 81-66 and topped Manhattan 64-54 in Memphis to advance to the Sweet Sixteen, where it fell to second-ranked Kentucky 97-67 in Birmingham.

ROB EVANS: Rob Evans arrived at ASU in the spring of 1998 and many talked about his final two years at Ole Miss when he went 42-16 (.724) with two SEC West titles. He took a program many called "below ground" and had a 44-65 (.403) mark in his first four seasons. At ASU, Evans was 60-60 in his first four years before this year's 19-11 (.655) mark. Evans is 104-125 (.454) in his first four years of building a program and 61-27 (.693) after the rebuilding process.
