The Arizona State Sun Devils will open their 100th season when they host the Northern Arizona Lumberjacks at Frank Kush Field/Sun Devil Stadium on Thursday, August 30 at 7:30 p.m.. The Sun Devil opener will be the coaching debut for Todd Graham at Arizona State. ASU is 561-356-24 (.609) all-time on the gridiron.

SEASON OPENERS: Arizona State is 70-27-2 (.717) all-time in season openers, including victories in the last eight. The Sun Devils have won 12 of their past 13 season openers. ASU holds an all-time mark of 50-15-1 (.765) when opening the season at home. Last year, the Devils beat UC Davis, 48-14, in Tempe to open the season, their 13th straight season opener victory at Sun Devil Stadium. Head Coach Todd Graham is 4-2 in season opening games in his six years as a collegiate coach. This will be his first season opener at the helm of Arizona State.

ON THE AIR: The MidFirst Bank Sun Devil-IMG Sports Network will carry all 12 of ASU's football games live on their 10-station radio network, including flagship station Sports 620 KTAR AM. Tim Healey (play-by-play) and former Sun Devil quarterback Jeff Van Raaphorst (color analyst) will call the action with Doug Franz reporting from the sidelines. This week's game will be broadcast on KMVP 860 AM. Weekly radio coverage begins two hours prior to kickoff with the "Talking Stick Resort Sun Devil Tailgate Show," hosted by Doug Franz. The game will also be available on Sirius Radio Channel 94.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION: Thursday's opener will also mark the opening day of football broadcasts on the inaugural Pac-12 Networks. Action will get underway with Utah taking on Northern Colorado at 4 pm. PST with the Sun Devil matchup to follow. Ron Pitts will provide the play-by-play with Gary Plummer serving as the game analyst. Erin Coscarelli will provide the sideline reports. The game will be broadcast on Pac-12 Arizona on Cox Communications channels 75/1075 HD. The Pac-12 has conveniently created a Channel Finder to allow you to search your local listing for the proper network. The link is here: <http://pac-12.com/AboutPac-12Enterprises/ChannelFinder.aspx>

SUN DEVILS VS. LUMBERJACKS: This will be the 39th meeting between the in-state rivals, with Arizona State holding an 20-14-4 edge. ASU is 13-6-2 at home in the series, including a 41-20 win in 2010, the last meeting between the two schools. The schools have only met four times before since 1950.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR:

--Arizona State University football will commemorate a milestone this season by honoring Emerson Harvey, the school's first African-American football student-athlete 75 years ago and played a major role in breaking the color barrier throughout the Southwest. The Sun Devils will recognize Harvey, who joined the roster in 1937, with black-and-white circular helmet stickers with Harvey's jersey number (57) and he will be honored at halftime.

--Through preliminary research, history says that Arizona State has had just four *true* freshman start in their first opportunity in the first game of the season since the NCAA began allowing freshmen to compete in 1972: WR John Jefferson (1974), DE Terrell Suggs (2000), TE Zach Miller (2004) and current DE Will Sutton (2009). Defending on the lineup ASU sends out on the field on Thursday, DE Jaxon Hood and RB D.J. Foster both have an opportunity to add their name to that list.

INFO-GRAHAM: So you want to know more about what Todd Graham brings to the program? Here's a couple more stats and tidbits about the ASU head coach to give you an idea. Special thanks Doug Haller of the *Arizona Republic* for all this information :

--Over his past four seasons -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Graham's teams have rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. In 2008, Tulsa rushed on 61.4 percent of its total plays. Last year, ASU rushed 44.5 percent of the time.

--Over the past six seasons at Pitt, Tulsa and Rice, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. Last year, Pittsburgh averaged 3.31 sacks, which ranked third nationally.

--In six seasons, Graham is 19-17 in true road games. Over the past four, ASU is 5-16.

--In five of the past six years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. In 2008, Tulsa averaged just 37 penalty yards, which ranked 11th in the nation. Last season, Pitt averaged 39.5, which ranked 18th.

MARSHALL OF THE TOUCHDOWN: Cameron Marshall ran for 18 touchdowns in 2011, tying him with Woody Green (1972) and Terry Battle (1996) for the most ever in a single season by a Sun Devil running back. Marshall led the Pac-12 with his 18 touchdowns on the ground and he scored more rushing touchdowns than seven Pac-12 teams (Arizona 17, Utah 15, Washington 15, Washington State 13, Oregon State 12, USC 12 and Colorado 10). Marshall's previous career high for touchdowns was nine, set in 2010. Marshall had six games with multiple rushing touchdowns during the 2011 season, including three against USC and Colorado.

Marshall has rushed for 29 touchdowns in his three seasons with Arizona State. He is one of only 11 Sun Devils all time to score at least 20 touchdowns on the ground. The 29 puts him in fourth place all-time in ASU history.

MARSHALL, MARSHALL, MARSHALL: Marshall finished 2011 with 1,050 rushing yards, the first Sun Devil to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark since Ryan Torain ran for 1,229 yards in 2006. Marshall becomes the 16th Sun Devil to run for more than 1,000 yards in a season and it marks the 20th time in Sun Devil football history that ASU has had a 1,000 yard rusher. Woody Green did it three times and Freddie Williams did it twice. Marshall ran for more than 100 yards four times in 2011 and has done it six times in his career. The six career 100-yard games are tied for 17th most in school history. He has run for 2,131 yards over his three seasons in Tempe, the 17th player in school history to go over the 2,000-yard mark in his career. He has run for the 12th-most yards ever by a Sun Devil runner and is 343 yards away from joining the Top 10.

SUN DEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

AMONG THE NCAA'S BEST: With his 18 rushing touchdowns in 2011, Marshall returns in 2012 as the nation's fourth-leading returning rushing scorer among NCAA Division I-A student-athletes. Only Wisconsin's Heisman Trophy finalist Monte Ball (33), KSU quarterback Collin Klein (27) and Oklahoma State running back Joseph Randle (24) return having found pay dirt on the ground more than Marshall last season. In addition, Marshall's 29 career rushing touchdowns rank him fifth among active Division I-A student-athletes returning in 2012 that played in 2011. In that category only Ball (55), Klein (33), SMU running back Zach Line (34) and Michigan QB Denard Robinson (35) have more.

OH, HE CAN CATCH ALSO: If you've gotten tired of Cameron Marshall's resume on the ground, he has pretty good hands also. Research done by University of Virginia Assistant Athletics Media Relations Director Vincent Briedis shows that Marshall returns with the fifth-highest career receptions among active running backs at an FBS institution with 55.

100 YARDS ON THE GROUND: Arizona State is 4-2 when Cameron Marshall runs for at least 100 yards. He did it two years ago against Portland State (W) and UCLA (W) and last season against USC (W), Colorado (W), UCLA (L) and California (L). ASU is now 255-54-5 all-time when it has a 100-yard rusher.

RUNNING FOR MILES: Jamal Miles returned his third career kickoff for a touchdown and second last season against Washington State, bringing it back 95 yards for the score. The two kickoff return touchdowns last year tied Miles with Terry Battle (1996) for most kickoff return touchdowns by a Sun Devil in a single season. The kickoff return TD against Washington State made Miles ASU's all-time leader in that category, moving him past Omar Bolden, Terry Battle and Whizzer White who all had two in their careers. The 78-yard punt return by Miles against Oregon State in 2011 was the first punt returned for a touchdown by a Sun Devil since 2005. On November 25, 2005, Terry Richardson returned an Arizona punt 71-yards for the score. It took 68 games before Miles did the same thing against the Beavers.

RETURN RECORD: Over his three seasons in Tempe, Miles has returned 64 kickoffs for 1,517 yards and three touchdowns. The 1,517 yards ties Rudy Burgess for the most career kickoff return yards in school history. Miles totaled 788 of those yards last season, the second highest single-season total in ASU history. Miles' total is second only to the 879 yards that Burgess gained in 2007. Miles has 64 career kick returns, giving him an average of 23.7 yards per return. Burgess had 68 returns, with an average of 22.3 yards per return. Miles has three kick return TDs, while Burgess had one.

COACH GRAHAM/NOTES

TODD GRAHAM NAMED HEAD COACH

Arizona State University named Pittsburgh head coach Todd Graham, who led Rice to its first bowl victory in 45 seasons in 2006 and then led Tulsa to back-to-back 10-plus win seasons for the first time in school history, as its 23rd football coach on December 14, 2011.

As a defensive coordinator, Graham was part of two of the NCAA's top single-season turnarounds in recent history. In 2002 Tulsa was 1-11, but under Graham's defensive leadership the team went 8-4 in 2003. At West Virginia, the Mountaineers were 3-8, but then jumped to 9-4 in his second season.

His teams have been scoreboard changers, as Tulsa twice led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team comprised of mainly his first recruiting class notched 505.6 yards per contest, but on the other side of the line of scrimmage the Golden Hurricane led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36).

Born Dec. 5, 1964, Graham is 49-29 in his six-year head coaching career and most recently was head coach at Pittsburgh in 2011. He is well-known for his four-year stay at Tulsa from 2007-2010 when he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. The Golden Hurricane was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit.

SUN DEVILS TO HAVE NEW SIGNAL CALLER IN 2012: For the fourth time in as many years, the Sun Devil season opener will feature a new quarterback under center. Redshirt sophomore Taylor Kelly will make his first career start August 30 against NAU and will follow Danny Sullivan (2009), Steven Threet (2010) and Brock Osweiler (2011) as the fourth different quarterback to start on opening day since Rudy Carpenter started three straight from 2006-08. Sullivan and Threet were making their first career starts period, while Osweiler had made a start later in the season in 2009 and 2010. Since 1997, ASU quarterbacks making their first career start are 8-5.

According to research done by Jack Duggan at the University of Southern Mississippi, Arizona State is one of just 13 FBS schools that return **no** quarterback with a start for the 2012 season. That list includes: Akron, Arizona State, Boise State, East Carolina, Hawai'i, LSU, Memphis, Michigan State, Northern Illinois, Oklahoma State, Southern Miss, Stanford and Texas A&M.

KICKOFFS FOR TDS: In the 2011 MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, Rashad Ross showed off the track and field speed that won him the 2012 MPSF Conference title in the indoor 200-meter dash as he took the second half kickoff back 98-yards for a touchdown, the third kickoff return for a touchdown of the season (Miles had the other two). The three touchdowns in 2011 is a school record, the first time in school history a Sun Devil team has ever returned multiple kickoffs for touchdowns.

WELCOME BACK, BRANDON: The 2011 Sun Devil squad took a hit prior to the season as Brandon Magee went down during preseason drills with an Achilles injury. Last year's loss is this year's gain, however, as Magee is set to compete as a redshirt senior and will be among the team's leaders from the linebacker position. During a breakout junior year, Magee showed the stuff he was made of with 73 total tackles (second on the team) and 48 solo tackles. Magee signed a contract with the Boston Red Sox to play baseball after he leaves ASU but he is committed to the 2012 campaign and will be among the most visible players on and off the field as the season progresses. Magee was named to the Butkus Award Preseason Watch List, given annually to the nation's top linebacker, and has received much praise from ASU coaches during the offseason in regards to his work ethic and potential.

AND YOU, DEANTRE: There were few players on the field as explosive as then-freshman Deantre Lewis was during the 2010 season. Lewis tallied 987 total yards of offense on the year with 539 rushing yards on just 92 carries (5.9 ypr) and 370 yards on 23 receptions (16.1 ypc). Lewis was forced to sit out the 2011 season with an injury, however, and will be looking to pick up where he left off as the 2012 season commences.

SUN DEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

SENIOR LEADERSHIP: The 2012 Sun Devil roster features 17 seniors at the time of publication, many of which who will play pivotal roles as the season goes on. Brandon Magee (LB), Jamal Miles (WR/KR/PR), Cameron Marshall (RB) and Josh Hubner (P) have all already earned recognition on assorted watch lists and preseason All-Conference teams.

JUST KICKING IT: Redshirt freshman kicker Alex Garoutte turned in a solid season in his first year as the kicker. Garoutte finished the year with 108 points, tops on the team. He finished the season 15-22 on field goals, including a long of 49 yards. He had a string of six consecutive made field goals between the Utah and Colorado games, and finished the season making six of his final seven. He also went 52-53 in PATs, with his only miss a block. He closed out 2011 making 45 straight extra points. His 108 points were the second-most scored by a freshman or redshirt freshman kicker in the country.

PIN 'EM DEEP: Redshirt senior punter Josh Hubner was among the best punters in the nation when it came to pinning opponents down the field, finishing the year tied for 17th in the nation with 24 punts inside the 20. Hubner finished the year with averaging 41.3 yards per punt with seven punts of 50 or more yards and 24 of his 62 punts called for fair catches as he played in all 13 games at the position for the Sun Devils in just his first season with the program. Hubner was selected as an Athlon Sports Preseason All-Pac-12 third-team pick at the position.

SECONDARY A PRIMARY: Despite several big losses to graduation on the defensive end of the ball, the Sun Devils still have plenty of talent in the defensive back positions. ASU's top-four returning tacklers from the 2011 season all come out of the secondary, led by safety Alden Darby. Darby had 51 tackles last season and was one of the Sun Devils' most versatile athletes, seeing time at safety and cornerback. Darby also led the team in interceptions with three and is expected to be one of the team's leaders on and off the field in 2012. Hometown product Keelan Johnson hasn't missed a game during his time at ASU and will provide more veteran ability at the safety spot, showcasing his talents with 48 tackles and two picks in 2011.

ASU returns both starting cornerbacks from 2011 in Osahon Irabor and Deveron Carr. Carr easily posted the most pass breakups last season with 10 while Irabor had 48 tackles and six breakups on the year and has earned recognition from coaches and media for his Spring performance.

A FAMILY AFFAIR: Arizona State will see a couple family ties during the 2012 season. Evan Goodman will join his brother Devin, who redshirted last year, as a true freshman in 2012. Both play offensive line and come to ASU from Lakeland, Fla. The tight end position features a changing of the Kohl's as recently departed senior Trevor Kohl passes the reins off to younger brother Kody, who will be a freshman tight end this year. Junior wide receiver Kevin Ozier is the cousin of former Sun Devil standout running back J.R. Redmond.

COMING ACROSS THE BORDER: There are just 45 Canadian players currently on the roster at an FBS school and none have come further south than Terrell Davis. ASU's freshman running back hails from Mount Douglas Senior Secondary in Victoria, British Columbia. As far as ASU student-athletes go, Davis joins track and field's Christabel Nettey (Surrey, B.C.), divers Riley McCormick (also Victoria, B.C.), Hailey Casper (Alberta, Canada) and Morgan Weller (Vancouver, B.C.) and swimming's Lori Layne Kremer (St. Albert, Alberta), Cassie Morrice (Victoria, B.C.) and Caroline Kuczynski (Montreal, Quebec) and volleyball's Whitney Follette (St. Albert, Alberta) as Canadians representing the Sun Devils this year.

THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL: They don't make college football schedules like they used to and the 2012 ASU schedule is the perfect example of that. The Sun Devils will take part in three Thursday night games (Aug. 30 vs. NAU, Oct. 11 at Colorado and Oct. 18 vs. Oregon). ASU will also take on rival Arizona in Tucson in a Friday-night matchup in the regular season finale on Nov. 23.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS: USC is the favorite to win the 2012 Pac-12 Conference football title in a preseason poll of media members who cover the league. The Trojans were listed in the top spot in the North Division by 117 of the 123 voters participating in the poll, collecting 729 points. 102 of those pollsters tabbed the Trojans to come out on top in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Utah was picked to finish second in the South Division, collecting one first-place vote in the balloting for the division race. Arizona State claimed three of the other five first-place votes, with each of those members of the media casting a vote for the Sun Devils to capture the Pac-12 title.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Interview Policy

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members can shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related. Interviews are conducted at the end of each practice. All other interviews need to be arranged through the Media Relations office. Following ASU's opener against NAU, the Sun Devils will practice on Sept. 2, 4, 5 and 6. Sunday's practice will run from 2-4 p.m. while the weekday practices will run from approximately 8:30-11 a.m. Should this schedule change, the ASU media relations department will inform the media ahead of time.

Post-Game Interviews

The Dutton Theater (located on the third floor of the Carson Student-Athlete Center) is utilized for postgame interviews for ASU. Head coach Todd Graham and selected student-athletes will be available to the media following a "cooling off" period immediately after the final gun sounds. Arizona State's locker room is closed. Those desiring interviews with the opposing coach and players should proceed to the north end of Sun Devil Stadium to the visitor's locker room and check with the school's media relations personnel on their postgame policies.

Todd Graham Press Conference

Head Coach Todd Graham will hold a weekly press conference in the Dutton Theater (on the third floor of the Carson Student-Athlete Center) at noon Mondays prior to each game. At the moment, ASU will not provide a student-athlete at these weekly press conferences as in years past. Those wishing to get quotes from student-athletes will have to do so following ASU's aforementioned interview policies.

Pac-12 Teleconference

Todd Graham and the other 11 Pac-12 head football coaches participate in a teleconference call every Tuesday during the season. Due to shifting practice schedules during the first four weeks of the season, the calls on Aug. 28 and Sept. 11 will start at 9:55 a.m. PT/10:55 a.m. MT, while the calls on Sept. 4 and Sept. 18 will begin at 10:05 a.m. PT/11:05 a.m. MT. Starting Sept. 25, and continuing each Tuesday through the remainder of the season, the calls will begin at 10:15 a.m. PT/11:15 a.m. MT. Each Pac-12 coach will be available for 10 minutes. Graham will be available from 12:05-12:15 p.m. PT. A replay of the call can also be heard at 3:30 p.m. PT each Tuesday following the call and will be available until the next call. Media members may call the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) to request the media-only phone number for the teleconference and for the taped replay.

Photographers (still and video) may shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice. For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.
