THE SERIES

•The all-time series between Oregon and Arizona State is tied, 16-16, but the Ducks have won seven straight and 11 of the last 14, dating to 1998. UO has also taken the last four meetings in Tempe, averaging 43.8 points per game in the process.

QUICK HITS

•Oregon is No. 3 in the initial BCS Standings released Sunday, UO's second-highest debut in the BCS (No. 2 in 2010). The Ducks now have 70 all-time appearances in the BCS Standings, the most of any Pac-12 school and tied for seventh overall with Michigan.

•UO's string of nine consecutive wins is second nationally to Alabama's 10 straight victories.

•Oregon has won 11 straight games on the road, which leads the country – Alabama is second with seven. The Ducks' last road loss occurred on Nov. 7, 2009, at Stanford (51-42) – the only conference road setback in **Chip Kelly's** 3+ year head coaching career.

•UO has scored 30 or more points in 19 straight games, the longest streak in the FBS. The Ducks are 38-2 when scoring 30-plus in the Kelly era.

•Oregon has scored 42 or more points in nine straight games, including eight of 49 or more, and own the longest current streak in the nation of 40-plus points.

•The Ducks have never lost a game from Week 2 through Week 8 (26-0) in Kelly's tenure as a head coach.

•Brothers and fellow running backs **Byron** (Oregon) and **Cameron** (ASU) **Marshall** will be facing each other for the first, and possibly only time, as collegians. Byron, a true freshman, has run for 258 yards and three touchdowns in four appearances, while senior Cameron has 262 yards and five scores over six games.

•The Ducks are 6-0 for the seventh time in 117 seasons, but second time in the last three.

HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY

In five short seasons, Chip Kelly has threatened to redefine the 116-year history of football at the University of Oregon. It started in 2007 in his first year as the Ducks' offensive coordinator and has carried into his fourth season as the University's head coach. Throughout the duration has been the emergence of a program among the nation's elite behind the architect of one of the most prolific offenses in the country that has transformed the standard of college football. No other coach in school history has guided the football team to three consecutive undisputed conference championships - a feat surpassed only twice in league history. And although nine coaches have accumulated more league titles than the Manchester, N.H. native, only USC's John Robinson succeeded in doing so as a first-year head coach. In the process of accumulating a 40-6 ledger in his three-plus seasons at the helm, the two-time conference coach of the year sandwiched a pair of Rose Bowl appearances around the 2011 BCS National Championship Game. Accentuating the success was last year's 45-38 Rose Bowl win over Wisconsin. In addition to accumulating a mark of 28-2 in league play, his .870 overall winning percentage is the highest in school history and his .933 percentage in conference play is the best in league annals.

RETURN MEN

The 2012 Oregon Ducks return 52 letterwinners, including 12 players who were starters last season - five on offense and seven on defense. UO also welcomes back every specialist with the exception of punt returner **LaMichael James**.

FIRST TIMERS

The season opener vs. Arkansas State saw 23 players make their Oregon debut, including 11 redshirt freshmen and two junior college transfers. The seven true freshmen to take the field were WR **Bralon Addison**, DE **Arik Armstead**, TE **Pharaoh Brown**, DE **DeForest Buckner**, TE **T.J. Daniel**, RB **Byron Marshall** and WR **Dwayne Stanford**.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK CHAMPS

With conference crowns in each of the past three seasons, Oregon became just the second team to win three straight outright Pac-12 championships since the conference expanded to ten teams in 1978, joining USC from 2003-05 ('04 and '05 titles since vacated).

FAST STARTS

UO is 6-0 for the third time in three years, but only the seventh time in 117 seasons. The school record for most consecutive victories to start a season is 12 by the 2010 squad.

RED ZONE RESISTANCE

The Ducks' defense has allowed opponents only nine touchdowns in 25 trips inside the red zone this year, including only four TDs in 16 trips inside the 20-yard line in Pac-12 play. Oregon denied Arizona all six times it penetrated the red zone while posting its first shutout in conference play since 2003. Through the first three Pac-12 games, the UO defense has allowed just six Red Zone scores overall (37.5%), which is the best percentage in the FBS among teams that have played three or more conference games.

SUPER MARIOTA

Six games may be a relatively small sample size, but it's hard not to be impressed by the early play of FR QB **Marcus Mariota**. After emerging as the starter at the end of an offseason competition with SO QB **Bryan Bennett**, the 6-4 signal-caller from Honolulu has impressed with his poise, leading the Ducks on nine consecutive touchdown drives to start his career over the first two games. In Week 3, Mariota became the first freshman QB in Oregon history to pass for 300 yards in a game, completing 21 of 28 attempts for 308 yards and four touchdowns. Ranking second in the Pac-12 and 23rd nationally in passing efficiency (156.43), Mariota is completing nearly 68% of his attempts on the season (114 of 168) while accumulating totals of 1,301 yards, 15 TDs and five interceptions. He is the first freshman to start a season at quarterback for the Ducks since **Danny O'Neil** in 1991.

LIGHTNING STRIKES

Of Oregon's 39 drives resulting in touchdowns this season, 24 have lasted less than two minutes and 14 have taken 60 seconds or less.

DUCKS IN THE BCS

Despite a No. 2 ranking in both of the human polls that are components of the BCS formula (*USA Today*, Harris), Oregon came in at No. 3 in the initial BCS Standings released Sunday, Oct. 14, behind SEC programs Alabama and Florida. The Ducks' average computer ranking was sixth. The No. 3 slot was UO's second-highest debut in the BCS (No. 2 in 2010). The Ducks were ranked as

high as No. 4 in the BCS last season and had a final rank of fifth

PICK SIXES

It took until the fourth game of the season, but the Ducks returned not one, but two interceptions for touchdowns in the win over Arizona. SO CB **Ifo Ekpre-Olomu** went 49 yards for a score on his second pick of the game, and SO CB **Troy Hill** sprinted 29 yards for his end zone visit. SO S **Avery Patterson** added his first career TD return (34 yards) the following week against Washington State and scored again from 43 yards in UO's last game vs. Washington, giving the Ducks four on the year, which ties the school record from 1991. Oregon is tied with Fresno State for the FBS lead in pick-sixes and leads the nation in interception return yards with 274.

QUICK STARTERS OR STRONG FINISHERS

The first quarter has been Oregon's most productive from a scoring standpoint, with the Ducks accumulating 112 points in the opening 15 minutes of their first six games. However, Oregon has outscored its last four opponents in the second half, 109-28.

MULTI-TALENTED SCORING THREAT

While SR RB **Kenjon Barner** is tied for 13th in the country in scoring (10.0 avg.) for the second-highest scoring team in the country (52.3 avg.), he is the only Oregon player dating back through at least the 1965 season to score a touchdown via the run (26), receiving (5), punt returns (1) and kickoff returns (1).

ONE-TWO PUNCH

Oregon has scored 39 offensive touchdowns through its first six games this season – running backs **Kenjon Barner** (10) and **De'Anthony Thomas** (9) have combined for almost half of them (19).

SHARING THE WEALTH

Thirty-seven different defensive players have made tackles for Oregon after six games this season, with seven players posting 20 or more tackles. Leading the way are linebackers Kiko Alonso and Michael Clay, who are both averaging a minimum of 6.0 tackles per game

VS. THE TOP 25

The Ducks are 12-5 against AP top 25 teams in the **Chip Kelly** era, including a 2-0 mark this year. At home, Kelly's troops are 9-1 vs. the top 25. Oregon is 2-1 in road games against ranked foes and 1-3 at neutral sites under Kelly. UO's only loss to a non-ranked team during Kelly's tenure came at Stanford on Nov. 7, 2009. The Cardinal became ranked the following week as a result.

VS. THE TOP 10

Oregon is 5-3 against the AP top 10 under **Chip Kelly**, including a 2-1 mark in 2011 with wins at No. 3 Stanford and vs. No. 9 Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl. Two of the defeats have come in BCS bowl games – vs. No. 8 Ohio State in the 2010 Rose Bowl and No. 1 Auburn in the 2011 BCS Championship – and the other vs. No. 4 LSU in the 2011 Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Texas.

SHUTOUTS

Oregon's Sept. 22 shutout of Arizona (49-0) was the third clean sheet during Chip Kelly's three-plus seasons at the helm. The game marked UO's first conference shutout since a 35-0 win over Stanford on Oct. 25, 2003, although the UO defense held Colorado scoreless in last season's 45-2 victory at Colorado, which scored by recording a safety on an Oregon punt return.

HOUSE OF LOUD

With a standing room only crowd of 58,792 at Autzen Stadium on Oct. 6 vs. Washington, the Ducks ran the nation's fourth-longest sellout streak to 87 consecutive games (cap. 54,000), dating to 1999.

KELLY AT AUTZEN

Head coach **Chip Kelly** made his sideline debut at Autzen Stadium Sept. 12, 2009 (W 38-36 vs. Purdue) after spending the prior two seasons calling plays from a booth high above the field as the team's offensive coordinator. Since Kelly's arrival in 2007, the Ducks are 35-4 at Autzen, averaging 46.8 points per home game.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Since 2000, Oregon is 34-6 in regular season,

out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Oklahoma, Wisconsin and Michigan (x2). During that stretch, the Ducks are 3-1 against the SEC, 5-2 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the Big 12, 4-0 against the Mountain West, 12-2 vs. the WAC, 2-0 against Conference USA and 6-0 vs. FCS sides.

RECORD RUNNERS

Oregon's all-time leading rusher **LaMichael James** may be gone, but the Ducks' current roster still features three players who have etched their names on a prestigious rushing list. SO RB **De'Anthony Thomas**, JR WR **Josh Huff** and SR RB **Kenjon Barner** own three of the longest runs in school history. Thomas' 91-yard touchdown run in the 2012 Rose Bowl Game is the second-longest at Oregon, Huff ranks tied for fifth with an 85-yard TD vs. Arizona in 2010 and Barner is ninth with his 84-yard score at Colorado last season.

BO KNOWS SIX

JR LB **Boseko Lokombo** scored three touchdowns in 2011 to give him four during his career. He tied for the national lead in "pick six" interceptions with two, including a 40-yard return and score after intercepting a pass from 2012 NFL Draft No. 1 overall pick **Andrew Luck** of Stanford.

EXPLOSION PLAYS

In 2011, Oregon accumulated 69 "explosion plays" of 25 yards or more from scrimmage. Of that number, the Ducks returned eight players in 2012 who accounted for 35 of those "big plays," including 11 by SO RB **DeAnthony Thomas** and eight by SR RB **Kenjon Barner**. A staple of Oregon's "blur" offensive attack, Oregon has 18 such plays this season, eight of which have gone for touchdowns.

COACHING CONTINUITY

An often overlooked facet of Oregon's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Fourth-year head coach **Chip Kelly**, now in his sixth season on staff, is a relative newcomer in Eugene compared to his core group of assistants, who have remained intact over the course of three different head coaches. Running backs coach **Gary Campbell** is in his 30th year on the Oregon staff, which is the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator **Steve Greatwood** enters his 26th season at UO, linebackers coach **Don Pellum** is in his 20th campaign, while defensive coordinator **Nick Aliotti** has spent 20 full seasons at Oregon over three separate stints. Oregon is the only school in the FBS that has seen zero turnover on staff over the past three seasons.

3-4 DEFENSE

With the Oregon offense piling up 63 points in Week 3 vs. Tennessee Tech, the Ducks' defense took the opportunity by going deep on the depth chart to get reserves ample snaps. The result was 34 different players registering at least one tackle, including JR **Ben Butterfield**, a one-time WR, getting his first licks in at safety.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - When redshirt freshman Marcus Mariota ran out on to the field at Autzen Stadium, he was nervous about his first start for the

Ducks.

By the first snap, the butterflies were gone.

Mariota debuted for No. 5 Oregon by passing for 200 yards and three touchdowns in a 57-34 season-opening victory over Arkansas State. Mariota coolly guided Oregon's speedy spread offense, completing 18 of 22 passes.

"The game in itself, it was fun," he said. "I can't really explain it any more than that."

Sophomore De'Anthony Thomas caught two of Mariota's scoring strikes and ran for another touchdown while collecting 119 yards in total offense.

Kenjon Barner, taking over as starter after the departure of running back LaMichael James, ran for 66 yards and two scores.

Mariota, Thomas and Barner were finished by halftime while Oregon coach Chip Kelly gave his backups some work.

"I would have liked to play a little bit more, but that's the competition nature in me," Mariota said.

The loss spoiled coach Gus Malzahn's first game as coach of the Red Wolves, who went 10-3 last season and won the Sun Belt Conference title.

"We had an idea about their offense. They execute it so well and they've got speed at every position," Malzahn said. "Obviously, we were expecting to do better than we did defensively in the first half."

Arkansas State senior quarterback Ryan Aplin threw for 304 yards and three touchdowns, including a 72-yard scoring pass to Julian Jones just before the half.

Mariota replaced Darron Thomas, who decided to leave Oregon with a year of eligibility left. Thomas passed for 2,761 yards and a school-record 33 touchdowns last season when the Ducks went 10-2 and beat Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl.

Mariota was on the practice squad last season and was something of a mystery because Oregon closes practices, but he beat out Bryan Bennett for the starter's job in fall camp.

The native Hawaiian had shown promise in the Ducks' spring game with a touchdown pass and two scoring runs - including one TD rush of 82 yards.

Mariota is the first freshman to start in an opener for Oregon since Danny O'Neil in 1991.

The Ducks scored on their first drive of the game with Barner's 4-yard dash, then added the 2-point conversion to make it 8-0.

Barner, a senior, was James' backup for the past two seasons. James, the school's career leading rusher, left Oregon early for the NFL draft and was a second-round pick by the San Francisco 49ers.

Mariota connected with Thomas with a 12-yard pass to make it 15-0.

Thomas made a splash last season when he set an Oregon freshman record with 18 touchdowns, rushing for seven, nine on receptions and two on kickoff returns.

Before the first quarter was over, John Huff pulled down a 4-yard touchdown pass from Mariota and Barner added a 17-yard scoring run to make it 29-0.

Brian Davis kicked a 43-yard field goal for the Red Wolves early in the second quarter.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - Kenjon Barner set an example when the Ducks got lethargic.

The senior running back took over and scored late in the fourth quarter to cement No. 4 Oregon's 42-25 victory over persistent Fresno State on Saturday.

Barner ran for a career-best 201 yards, and scored three touchdowns. But he made his statement with his final TD, running the ball nine times before a 16-yard dash into the end zone with 3:51 left in the game. It was Oregon's only touchdown of the second half.

"You've got to keep moving and keep grinding," he said. "You've got to adjust to the mistakes that you make."

The Ducks (2-0) sprinted to a 35-6 first-half lead before the Bulldogs were able to slow them down in the second half.

"We knocked them off schedule when they tried to go fast in the second half. They tried to go fast again, and we knocked them off schedule again," said Fresno State defensive coordinator Nick Toth.

De'Anthony Thomas ran for 102 yards and two additional scores for the Ducks, while redshirt freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota completed 19 of 27 passes for 166 yards and a touchdown.

Derek Carr, the younger brother of former Bulldogs QB David Carr, completed 29 of 47 passes for 234 yards and a touchdown for Fresno State (1-1), a new member of the Mountain West Conference this season. Quentin Breshears kicked four field goals, including one from 43 yards.

The Ducks were coming off a 57-34 victory over Arkansas State in their opener last weekend, while the Bulldogs opened with a 37-10 win over Weber State in new coach Tim DeRuyter's debut.

DeRuyter, who took over when longtime coach Pat Hill was dismissed, has brought in a new spread offense he's dubbed "fast, physical, fanatical" while he and Toth have transformed Fresno State's 4-3 defense from last season into an attacking 3-4.

But in the end the Bulldogs were outmatched by the Ducks.

Fresno State went ahead first on Breshears' 39-years field goal but the lead was short-lived and Thomas scored on his first touch of the game, taking a pitch from Mariota and running 39 yards to make it 7-3.

Thomas appeared to score again on Oregon's next series on a 2-yard run, but the touchdown was nullified when the officials went back and reviewed the previous play, determining that Mariota had gone out of bounds at the 3-yard-line and not the 2. Barner ran the 3-yards remaining for the score on the next play.

Mariota found tight end Colt Lyerla with a 22-yard scoring pass early in the second quarter, and Thomas darted 51 yards, breaking several tackles, for another touchdown to make it 28-3.

Barner added a 3-yard scoring run before Breshears hit a 43-yard field goal to make it 35-6 at halftime.

Fresno State narrowed it to 35-16 in the third quarter when Carr found Isaiah Burse with an 18-yard touchdown pass and Breshears kicked a 25-yard field goal. Breshears added a 37-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make it 35-19.

"Fresno State did a great job adjusting and we kind of came out like we had the game in hand," Barner said. "We didn't have that intensity."

So Barner took it upon himself to rekindle it late in the fourth quarter, when he ran for 66 yards on 10 carries for Oregon's final scoring drive.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - Marcus Mariota threw for 308 yards and four touchdowns before No. 4 Oregon pulled its starters in a 63-14 victory over Tennessee Tech on Saturday.

Multitalented De'Anthony Thomas had 222 all-purpose yards on 10 touches. He ran for a 59-yard touchdown and caught a 16-yard scoring pass from Mariota.

The Ducks (3-0) were playing their final nonconference game before hosting Arizona next Saturday. They had 652 yards in total offense, compared to 177 yards for Tennessee Tech. Oregon did have its issues, however, with 12 penalties for 105 yards.

The Golden Eagles (2-1) have never defeated an FBS-level team in 28 tries. The game against the Ducks was the Ohio Valley Conference team's first against a Pac-12 opponent.

Da'Rick Rogers, who transferred to Tennessee Tech from Tennessee right before the season started, had three catches for 38 yards and the first touchdown of the game. He took a short pass from Tre Lamb and ran for a 23-yard TD.

Rogers was suspended indefinitely by Tennessee on Aug. 23. He told reporters it was because of failed drug tests.

He was a first-team all-SEC receiver in 2011, with 67 receptions for 1,040 yards and nine touchdowns for the Volunteers. He faced Oregon when the Ducks visited Knoxville in 2010, finishing with a carry for 21 yards in Oregon's 48-13 victory.

Last week, Rogers had five catches for 88 yards and a touchdown in Tech's 42-14 victory against North Greenville. The week before he was named Ohio Valley Conference newcomer of the week after three receptions for 75 yards and a touchdown in a win against Hampton.

The Ducks quickly answered Rogers' TD with Kenjon Barner's 1-yard scoring run and Thomas' 59-yard touchdown sprint.

On Oregon's next series, Thomas had a 49-yard run that appeared to be an easy touchdown, but he was caught from behind by Tennessee Tech's DaJuan Brown and fumbled. Ducks right tackle Jake Fisher pounced on it for the 1-yard touchdown to make it 21-7.

Oregon further padded the lead with Mariota's 4-yard scoring pass to tight end Colt Lyster, but Rob Beard's attempt at a 25-yard field goal was blocked.

Thomas pulled down a 16-yard scoring pass from Mariota as the first half ended to give the Ducks a 35-7 lead.

Mariota found Keanon Lowe with a 3-yard touchdown early in the third quarter before Oregon subbed out many of its starters. Backup Bryan Bennett had a 4-yard run to make it 49-7.

Tennessee Tech scored on Darian Stone's 6-yard pass to Doug Page but Bennett added a 6-yard keeper to make it 56-14 at the end of the third quarter.

Freshman Byron Marshall ran for a 4-yard score in the final quarter. Marshall finished with 125 yards rushing in the game.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Redshirt freshman Marcus Mariota threw for 260 yards and two touchdowns, including a 55-yard scoring pass to freshman

Bralon Addison late in the third quarter, and No. 3 Oregon beat No. 22 Arizona 49-0 Saturday night.

Billed as an offensive juggernaut between the Pac-12's fastest scoring teams, Oregon didn't find its stride until the second half - and Arizona never did - and the Ducks (4-0, 1-0) got their seventh straight conference-opening victory.

Much had been made about the meeting between the quick-striking Ducks under Chip Kelly and Arizona's spread offense under no-huddle, up-tempo pioneer Rich Rodriguez. Oregon went into it the averaging 54 points per game, while Arizona wasn't far behind with an average of a little more than 46 points.

However, Arizona (3-1, 0-1) couldn't find the end zone and quarterback Matt Scott, a fifth-year senior who spent the last two seasons behind Nick Foles, passed for 210 yards but was intercepted three times - one returned for a touchdown.

The game got off to a sloppy start as Oregon failed on fourth down and each team turned the ball over before Mariota found Daryle Hawkins with a 17-yard touchdown pass midway through the first quarter.

Arizona got as close as the 2-yard line on the next series, but couldn't punch it in and turned the ball over on downs. The Wildcats' struggles continued when John Bonano's 31-yard field goal was blocked early in the second quarter.

Rob Beard hit a 27-yard field goal to increase Oregon's advantage to 10-0. It was the Ducks' first FG of the season. Beard added a 41-yarder late in the first half to make it 13-0 at the break.

While both offenses appeared to sputter at times, defenses made the difference in the first half.

Oregon's hybrid 3-4 under longtime defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti held the Wildcats to 141 yards in total offense in the first 30 minutes. Meanwhile, Arizona's new 3-3-5 defense kept the normally prolific Ducks from piling on points.

There was more of the same to open the second half, and the first two possessions by both teams ended in punts.

But then the Ducks started rolling. De'Anthony Thomas returned Arizona's third-straight punt 38 yards, setting up a 35-yard pass to Colt Lyster, who finished it off with a 1-yard touchdown run. The drive took just three plays and 29 seconds.

Kiko Alonso intercepted Scott, leading to Mariota's long TD pass to Addison, before Ifo Ekpre-Olomu ran his interception back 54 yards to make it 35-0.

Bryan Bennett added an 8-yard scoring run with 4:02 left in the game before Troy Hill intercepted Scott's backup, B.J. Denker, for a 29-yard touchdown and the final margin.

Arizona opened coach Rodriguez's tenure with a victory over Toledo before upsetting then-No. 18 Oklahoma State 59-38 in their second game. Last weekend in a 56-0 win over South Carolina State, the Wildcats ran a school-record 102 offensive plays.

The Wildcats were the first big test for Oregon, which opened the season with victories over Arkansas State, Fresno State and lower-division Tennessee Tech.

SEATTLE (AP) -- De'Anthony Thomas and Kenjon Barner sandwiched touchdown runs around Avery Patterson's 34-yard interception return

for a score, and No. 2 Oregon used a third-quarter scoring blitz to shake Washington State for a 51-26 win on Saturday night.

Playing for the first time outside the Eugene city limits, the Ducks (5-0, 2-0 Pac-12) looked shaky at times in the first half and led just 23-19 at the break, but put together a nearly flawless third quarter to run away from the Cougars.

Thomas capped an 18-play drive to start the half with a 4-yard TD, then Patterson stepped in front of Connor Halliday's pass for Oregon's third interception return for a TD in two games. After Washington State (2-3, 0-2) went three-and-out, Barner scored on a 10-yard run to cap the 21-point spurt in just over 4 minutes.

Barner finished with four total touchdowns, including scoring runs of 22 yards in the first quarter and an 80-yarder in the fourth to go along with a 30-yard touchdown reception in the first half. His 195 yards rushing was the second-best rushing game of his career behind the 201 yards he had against Fresno State earlier this season.

The Ducks started the second-half with their longest scoring drive - by plays - of the season, a methodical 18-play march that ate up more than 6 minutes. They ran nine times and threw nine times on the drive and only three times faced third down. The last came from the Cougars 4 when Barner went in motion and the middle opened for quarterback Marcus Mariota to hand off to Thomas, who plowed in for his fifth rushing TD of the season.

Before Washington State got a chance to answer, Patterson was stepping in front of a pass intended for Gabe Marks and racing untouched the other direction for a score. Patterson joined Ifo Ekpre-Okumu and Troy Hill with returning interceptions for touchdowns this season.

After another three-and-out by the Cougars and a short punt, Oregon needed just seven plays for Barner to find the end zone for the third time and a 44-19 lead.

Barner put a cap on his night and an explosive second half when he escaped a pileup near the Oregon sideline and skirted free to run 80 yards early in the fourth quarter. His four total TDs is second behind a five-touchdown performance in 2010 against New Mexico. Mariota finished 21 of 32 passing for 169 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in the first road start of his career.

Thomas had just six touches in the first half for a total of 33 yards and no play longer than 15. He got four touches on the first drive of the second half alone including the capping TD run. He also got his first kickoff returns of the season after most teams had refused to kick toward the speedy sophomore, but his longest return was 19 yards.

Connor Halliday threw for 348 yards and Marquess Wilson had 12 catches for 182 yards and a touchdown to become Washington State's all-time leader in yards receiving. But the Cougars had no ground game finishing with (minus)-8 net yards rushing. Halliday was sacked seven times.

Washington State has proved a somewhat problematic foe for the Ducks the past few years. In 2010 in Pullman, the Cougars hung around into the third quarter before losing 43-23 and last year in Eugene, Washington State trailed just 15-10 at halftime before getting overrun in the second half.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - Marcus Mariota threw for 198 yards and four touchdowns, including two TD strikes to tight end Colt Lyerla, and No. 2 Oregon beat No. 23 Washington 52-21 on Saturday night.

Mariota rebounded from an interception on the Ducks' opening series to complete 15 of 24 passes and Oregon (6-0, 3-0 Pac-12) won its ninth straight overall dating back to last season, as well as its ninth straight in the series against the rival Huskies (3-2, 1-1).

Lyerla caught three passes for 71 yards, including touchdowns of 10 and 13 yards.

Kenjon Barner, who went into the game ranked 10th in the nation with an average of 121 yards rushing per game, ran for 122 yards and the Ducks built a 35-7 lead at halftime.

Bishop Sankey ran for 104 yards and two touchdowns for Washington.

The two Pacific Northwest teams have a storied rivalry. Huskies' fans remember "The Pick" in 1994 when freshman cornerback Kenny Wheaton saved the day for the Ducks when he intercepted a pass by Damon Huard and ran it back 97 yards for a score. The victory sent Oregon to the Rose Bowl - and a clip is still played on the video scoreboard for fans before every home game.

The Huskies raised the ire of Ducks' fans in 2002 when, after beating Oregon 42-10, the team danced for nearly an hour on the "O" on the 50-yard line at Autzen Stadium.

But because of Oregon's recent domination of the series, the intensity of the rivalry has diminished in recent years. The Ducks' nine-game winning streak is the longest for either side in the series history, which dates back to 1900.

There was little visible contentiousness between the two teams on Saturday night, except for a brief shoving match in the third quarter.

De'Anthony Thomas opened scoring for the Ducks when he wove his way through several defenders for a 16-yard touchdown, set up when the Huskies fumbled on a punt return and Oregon's B.J. Kelley recovered on the Washington 20.

Mariota found sophomore Keanon Lowe with a 21-yard scoring pass before Avery Patterson scored on a 43-yard interception return. It was Patterson's second straight game with an interception for a touchdown.

Sankey, who had also run for 100 yards in each of Washington's previous two games, had a 1-yard touchdown dive for the Huskies to make it 21-7 early in the second quarter.

The Ducks answered with Mariota's 10-yard TD pass to Lyerla. A short time later, a running Mariota hit Josh Huff with a 34-yard catch-and-run.

Rob Beard, who missed a 41-yards field goal in the first half, made a 28-yarder early in the second to make it 38-7. Sankey ran for a hard-fought 6-yard touchdown before the end of the third quarter.

Lyerla opened the fourth with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Mariota, and a short time later Byron Marshall ran for a score to make it 52-14.

Erich Wilson had a 1-yard TD run for Washington with 32 seconds left in the game.

Washington popped into the rankings last week after a 17-13 victory over then-No. 8 Stanford. The Ducks were the Huskies' third top-10 opponent this season. Washington also fell 41-3 to then-No. 3 LSU.
