TEMPE -- The Arizona State Sun Devils hit the road again this week as they look to rebound from back-to-back home conference losses as the team takes on No. 13 Oregon State in Corvallis, Ore., on Saturday, Nov. 3 at 7:30 p.m. PT. ASU is looking to get back on track after a rout in Tempe to No. 2 Oregon two weeks ago followed by a heartbreaking loss on a last second field goal to UCLA on Saturday. The Sun Devils are 25-12-1 all-time against Oregon State, but have lost three of the last four and have lost the last three in Corvallis. This week's game will be broadcast live on ESPN2 ASU is 566-360-24 (.608) all-time on the gridiron.

ON THE AIR: The MidFirst Bank Sun Devil-IMG Sports Network will carry all 12 of ASU's football games live on their 10-station radio network, including flagship station Sports 620 KTAR AM. Tim Healey (play-by-play) and former Sun Devil quarterback Jeff Van Raaphorst (color analyst) will call the action with Doug Franz reporting from the sidelines. This week's game will be broadcast on KTAR 620 AM. The game will be broadcast on Sirius and Sirius XM channel 85.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION: This week's matchup will be broadcast on ESPN2, marking the fifth time this season the Sun Devils have played on an ESPN affiliate. They are guaranteed one more ESPN game when they take on Arizona in Tucson on Nov. 23. Joe Tessitore and Matt Millen will provide the call from the booth while Tom Luginbill will report from the sidelines. This week's game will also be broadcast live on national radio through Compass Radio Networks Channel 111. Drew Bontadelli will provide the play-by-play with Dale Hellestrae serving as the analyst.

SUN DEVILS vs. BEAVERS: Arizona State leads the all-time series with Oregon State 25-12-1, but has struggled with the Beavers on the road, going only 6-8-1 in Corvallis. Oregon State has won three of the last four meetings including a 31-28 victory two years ago Corvallis. The Sun Devils dropped OSU in Tempe last year by a final score of 35-20.

NOTABLE NUMBERS: A couple season statistics to keep an eye on for Saturday's matchup: --Oregon State enters this weekend's contest having the Pac-12 No.1 ranked scoring defense, allowing just 17.0 points per game. ASU will enter the contest averaging 38.4 points per game, a mark that ranks third in the conference. Oregon State is averaging 24.9 points per game, which is eighth in the conference

--Saturday's matchup pits the Pac-12's first and second-ranked defenses against each other as Arizona State enters as the leader, giving up 322.0 yards per game with Oregon State allowing 344.1

--ASU has struggled on defense when it comes to the run game in the past couple contests and currently ranks 10th in the conference in giving up 173.6 rushing yards per game. Oregon State, however, has struggled to run the ball and sits 11th in the conference in averaging just 108.6 yards on the ground per contest

--Oregon State statistically poses the top passing game the Sun Devils have faced this season, averaging 311.7 yards per game. ASU leads the conference in pass defense, though, giving up just 148.4 yards per game

--Arizona State and Oregon State enter as the first and third-ranked teams, respectively, when it comes to opponent first downs. ASU is giving up just 17.1 first downs per tilt while OSU is allows 18.9. Conversely, ASU is averaging 25.4 first downs per game (third in the conference) while OSU sits at 21.6 (eighth in the conference)

--Oregon State is giving up almost half a field more in the penalty category per game than Arizona State, averaging 77.6 penalty yards per contest while ASU is leading the conference in averaging just 29.2 per game

LAST TIME OUT: Freshman Ka'imi Fairbairn drilled a 33-yard field goal as time expired, lifting UCLA to a wild 45-43 win in front of 55,672 fans. As the Bruins celebrated on the field, the Sun Devils slowly walked over to their student section, knowing an opportunity had been lost. A win, coupled with USC's loss to Arizona, would have vaulted the Sun Devils atop the Pac-12 South. The loss didn't eliminate ASU, but it sure didn't help. Not with a tough remaining schedule that includes No. 7 Oregon State, No. 9 USC, Washington State and the resurgent Wildcats in Tucson. ASU (5-3, 3-2) rallied from a nine-point deficit in the final minutes of the fourth quarter, taking a 43-42 lead when sophomore quarterback Taylor Kelly hit freshman D.J. Foster for a 7-yard touchdown.

OTHER NOTES FROM UCLA:

-In a series that dates back to 1976, UCLA now holds a 18-10-1 record against Arizona State. In the last six meetings, both schools have captured three wins.
 -The Sun Devils drove the ball into the redzone eight times against UCLA, putting up points every time. They scored five touchdowns and kicked three field goals after getting inside the 20, accounting for all 43 points scored.
 -Prior to the UCLA game, the highest number of rushing attempts by ASU this season was 51 against NAU on opening night. They rushed the ball 59 times against the Bruins for a total of 220 yards.
 -ASU punter Josh Hubner refuses to give the opposing teams good field position to start drives. In 30 punt attempts this season, he has pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 12 times. His longest punt of the day sailed 73 yards, forcing UCLA to start at their own 2-yard line. It was the longest punt of his college career. In five attempts against the Bruins, Hubner averaged 52.6 yards and had three punts over 50 yards.
 -Alex Garoutte bumped up his extra point streak 83 against UCLA, going 4-4 on extra points. He is now 88-89 in his career.

LEADING THE PAC: Entering this week's matchup, Arizona State leads the Pac-12 Conference in several statistical categories: **pass efficiency defense (101.80), total defense (322.00), net punting (40.62), pass defense (148.38) and quarterback sacks (4.13).** Additionally, Taylor Kelly leads the conference in passing efficiency at 169.76 while Will Sutton is the conference leader in sacks (1.21) and tackles for loss (2.00).

STRIKE FIRST...STRIKE FAST: ASU has made a habit of scoring first this season, doing so seven times in eight games. ASU is now 5-2 in such contests following a loss to UCLA. The Sun Devils scored on five consecutive possessions against the Utes (getting on the board first for the third time this season) to start the game and put it away early. Arizona State scored on six of its first seven possessions against NAU and four of its first five against Illinois. **ASU has done itself favors early in games this year, outscoring opponents 83-46 in the frame and shutting out NAU, Illinois, Utah, Cal and Colorado on the season in the first quarter.** The Sun Devils didn't have a scoring drive longer than three minutes against the Fighting Illini, its longest lasting 2:59. The quick-hitting offense has been the staple of this year's team, with **32 of ASU's 47 scoring drives this season** coming in three minutes or less.

FINISH STRONGER: While ASU has gotten out to several fast starts this season, the team has closed even more impressively, **allowing just seventeen points on the season to anyone in the quarter and giving up its most by allowing 10 to UCLA. ASU has shut out six teams in the fourth quarter this year.**

PUSH 'EM BACK: ASU has prided itself on its aggressive defense through four games this year, **having forced 75 tackles for a loss of 317 total yards - a 9.38 TFL per game mark that currently ranks second in the nation.** To put that in perspective, the entire ASU team only had 76 total tackles for loss during the 2011 season and no student-athlete logged double digits in the category where this year's team already has three that have accomplished the feat (Will Sutton, Carl Bradford and Chris Young). Not only is ASU getting into the backfield, but it has been a team effort as 19 different players have logged a TFL through the year. **As a whole, ASU has a combined 103 defensive plays that have gone for a loss or no gain out of 574 offensive plays the opposition has run.** That means an impressive **17.9**

percent of the plays run by opponents this year have not advanced beyond the line of scrimmage. If you tack on incomplete passes to the mix, then ASU has forced **213 plays that did not result in positive yardage (37.1 percent of opponent's plays from scrimmage).**

FOREVER YOUNG: One of the driving forces behind ASU's tackle for loss numbers has been SPUR linebacker Chris Young, **who has 13.5 tackles for loss this season. His 1.69 TFL per game ranks 13th in the nation and is currently third in the conference.** To put that number into perspective, Arizona State had no player with more than eight tackles for loss on the entire season in 2011 (Oliver Aaron finished with 8.0). **With 54 total tackles, Young is third on the team and his 6.8 tackles per game is tied for 10th in the conference.**

A SUTTON IMPACT: Perhaps no player on ASU's roster has earned as much praise from Todd Graham as junior defensive tackle Will Sutton. Sutton has been a beast on the interior line for ASU, especially against Cal, where he finished the game with four tackles-for-loss, including two sacks, for a total loss of 21 yards. He recorded three tackles for loss, a forced fumble and an 8-yard sack in the first quarter. Sutton's forced fumble was his first of the season. Sutton was honored as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week and MAACO Bowl Las Vegas Pac-12 Player of the week for the performance. Sutton added three more TFLs and two extra sacks against Colorado to keep the momentum going. Sutton has **posted 14.0 tackles for loss on the season (leads team), 8.5 sacks (leads team) and 40 total tackles (sixth on team). Sutton is currently ranked fourth in the nation at 2.00 TFL per game and fifth in the nation with 1.21 sacks per game.**

FIFTEEN PERCENT OF THE TIME, HE SCORES ALL THE TIME Marion Grice is proving to be one of the top junior college additions to the conference as he currently leads the team with nine touchdowns (five rushing, four receiving) on the season. Grice had a coming out party against Colorado as he posted five receptions for 101 yards and three touchdowns - all career highs. Grice also had three touchdowns (two receptions, one rushing) against UCLA. Grice has also found a knack for getting into the end zone, **having posting touchdowns on 12 of his 80 offensive touches this year (15.0 percent). Grice is ranked third in the conference at 9.0 points per game and 30th in the nation.**

THREE-HEADED MONSTER Aside from the impressive defense and great quarterback play from Taylor Kelly, it has been ASU's stable of running backs that have helped propel the team this year, mainly on the backs of Cameron Marshall, Marion Grice and D.J. Foster. **ASU running backs have have accounted for 35.7 percent of all the team's receiving yards this season. Of the 2,278 total receiving yards, running backs have collected 814. Grice, Marshall and Foster have accounted for 24 of the team's 37 total offensive touchdowns. Grice has 12 (six rushing, six receiving), Marshall with six (five rushing, one receiving) and Foster with six (two rushing, four receiving). That trio is averaging 4.8 yards per carry on the season. (1,022 yards, 211 attempts). Grice, Marshall and Foster are averaging 229.5 yards of total offense per game as a unit. The team is averaging 477.1 total yards per game.**

FOSTER THE PEOPLE D.J. Foster came to ASU this season as what many consider the "gem" of the Sun Devil recruiting class and he has lived up to the hype thus far. **Foster currently leads the team in all-purpose yardage with 825 yards (371 rushing, 454 receiving). Foster also leads the team in yards per carry (5.5) for those with over 30 carries and yards per catch (15.7).** His ability to make what the ASU coaching staff calls "explosive plays" (rushes of 12 or more yards, receptions of 16 or more yards) has helped him stand out amongst an offense full of talented players as **he leads the team in such plays with 28 total (17 receiving and 11 rushing).**

WINNING BY WAY OF TKO (TAYLOR KELLY OFFENSE) While the running backs have been explosive for ASU this season, quarterback Taylor Kelly has been one of the many bright spots for the ASU offense. **The sophomore leads the Pac-12 in passing efficiency at 169.76 and is eighth in the nation in that category.** His ability to extend plays has also been exceptional, as demonstrated by his **303 net rushing yards on 87 attempts** this year - a mark skewed by the fact that sacks count against his rushing total. If you take out sacks, Kelly **would lead the team in yardage with 439 rushing yards this season. Through eight games, he has completed 67.7 percent of his passes out of 217 attempts.** The school record for pass completion percentage (over 301 attempts) is 61.8 percent.

COACH GRAHAM/NOTES

TODD GRAHAM NAMED HEAD COACH

Arizona State University named Pittsburgh head coach Todd Graham, who led Rice to its first bowl victory in 45 seasons in 2006 and then led Tulsa to back-to-back 10-plus win seasons for the first time in school history, as its 23rd football coach on December 14, 2011.

As a defensive coordinator, Graham was part of two of the NCAA's top single-season turnarounds in recent history. In 2002 Tulsa was 1-11, but under Graham's defensive leadership the team went 8-4 in 2003. At West Virginia, the Mountaineers were 3-8, but then jumped to 9-4 in his second season.

His teams have been scoreboard changers, as Tulsa twice led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team comprised of mainly his first recruiting class notched 505.6 yards per contest, but on the other side of the line of scrimmage the Golden Hurricane led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36).

Born Dec. 5, 1964, Graham is 54-32 in his seven-year head coaching career and most recently was head coach at Pittsburgh in 2011. He is well-known for his four-year stay at Tulsa from 2007-2010 when he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. The Golden Hurricane was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit.

NOT PLAYING COY Chris Coyle's performance against Illinois (10 receptions, 131 yards, two touchdowns) garnered him honors as the College Football Performance Awards Football Bowl Subdivision Tight End Performer of the Week. **As of this release, Coyle is second in the nation in tight end receptions per game with 4.75. His 38 receptions lead the Sun Devils, as do his 473 receiving yards on the year.** He is now tied for eighth on ASU's single-season tight end receptions list after logging three against UCLA to match Zach Miller's 2005 total of 38.

MORE ON COYLE: Chris Coyle had a coming out party against Illinois, snagging 10 catches for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Those numbers put the junior in pretty select company at a school with a pretty decent history at the tight end position. His 10 grabs tie for the 15th most ever by a Sun Devil in history and also put him in a tie with Zach Miller as the most single-game snags by a tight end in school history. In addition, his 131 receiving yards are the second most for a tight end in school history behind only Todd Heap's 170 yards against Arizona in 1999. BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS: The Sun Devils haven't given the referees much reason to reach for their pockets this season. ASU was penalized just once for five yards against Illinois (on what appeared to be a purposeful delay of game to create some space for a punt). That marked the lowest single-game total since 2006, when ASU was penalized once for five yards against Washington State. **On the year, ASU has had just 32 penalties for 234 yards.** ASU had just its first penalty on defense called in the Missouri game. **ASU leads the Pac-12 and is fifth in the nation with 29.2 penalty yards per game.** Here's a look at ASU's lowest single game penalties since 2006, four of which having come this year:

SUN DEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

MARSHALL OF THE TOUCHDOWN: With his rushing touchdown against Colorado, Cameron Marshall has rushed for 34 touchdowns in his career with Arizona State. He is one of only four Sun Devils all-time to score at least 30 touchdowns on the ground. Marshall is currently tied for second on ASU's all-time rushing TD list with Leon Burton, just behind just Woody Green (43). There was some confusion as to whether Green had 39 or 43 touchdowns in his career. ASU research has shown that Green's four touchdown performance at the 1972 Fiesta Bowl against Missouri had been omitted from his stats. That correction has been made and Green officially is credited with 43 touchdowns.

RETURN RECORD: Jamal Miles now has 1,728 kickoff return yards in his career. With a 31-yard return to start the game against Illinois and one other kick return, Miles passed Rudy Burgess (2004-07) for the top spot in Sun Devil history. In his prior three seasons in Tempe, Miles had returned 69 kickoffs for 1631 yards and three touchdowns. Miles totaled 788 of those yards last season, the second highest single-season total in ASU history. Miles' total was second only to the 879 yards that Burgess gained in 2007. Miles has 73 career kick returns, giving him an average of 23.4 yards per return. Burgess had 68 returns, with an average of 22.3 yards per return. Miles has three kick return TDs, while Burgess had one.

WELCOME BACK, BRANDON: After sitting out Arizona State's victory against Illinois, senior Brandon Magee made up for lost time against Mizzou, collecting 12 tackles (eight solo) to lead the team while also nabbing his second interception of the season. Magee returned one 45 yards for his first career pick-six against NAU in the opener. Magee earned College Football Performance Awards Bowl Subdivision Linebacker Honorable Mention honors for week three for the performance. Against Utah, Magee forced one fumble and recovered another while adding 10 tackles as he is proving to be a force to be reckoned with from his linebacker position. Despite his absence in that one game, Magee currently leads the team with 58 tackles and is fourth in the conference at 8.30 tackles per game. Magee missed the entire 2011 season with an Achilles injury.

TAYLOR GANG: For the fourth time in as many years, the Sun Devil season opener featured a new quarterback under center. Redshirt sophomore Taylor Kelly made his first career start against NAU and followed Danny Sullivan (2009), Steven Threet (2010) and Brock Osweiler (2011) as the fourth different quarterback to start on opening day since Rudy Carpenter started three straight from 2006-08. Sullivan and Threet were making their first career starts period, while Osweiler had made a start later in the season in 2009 and 2010. Since 1997, ASU quarterbacks making their first career start are 9-5.

According to research done by Jack Duggan at the University of Southern Mississippi, Arizona State is one of just 13 FBS schools that returned **no** quarterback with a start for the 2012 season. That list included: Akron, Arizona State, Boise State, East Carolina, Hawai'i, LSU, Memphis, Michigan State, Northern Illinois, Oklahoma State, Southern Miss, Stanford and Texas A&M.

Interview Policy

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members can shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related. Post-Game Interviews

The Dutson Theater (located on the third floor of the Carson Student-Athlete Center) is utilized for postgame interviews for ASU. Head coach Todd Graham and selected student-athletes will be available to the media following a "cooling off" period immediately after the final gun sounds. Arizona State's locker room is closed. Those desiring interviews with the opposing coach and players should proceed to the north end of Sun Devil Stadium to the visitor's locker room and check with the school's media relations personnel on their postgame policies.

Todd Graham Press Conference

Head Coach Todd Graham will hold a weekly press conference in the Dutson Theater (on the third floor of the Carson Student-Athlete Center) at noon Mondays prior to each game.

Pac-12 Teleconference

Todd Graham and the other 11 Pac-12 head football coaches participate in a teleconference call every Tuesday during the season. Starting Sept. 25, and continuing each Tuesday through the remainder of the season, the calls will begin at 10:15 a.m. PT/11:15 a.m. MT. Each Pac-12 coach will be available for 10 minutes. Graham will be available from 12:05-12:15 p.m. PT. A replay of the call can also be heard at 3:30 p.m. PT each Tuesday following the call and will be available until the next call. Media members may call the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) to request the media-only phone number for the teleconference and for the taped replay.

For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

SUN DEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

SENIOR LEADERSHIP: The 2012 Sun Devil roster features 17 seniors, many of which who will play pivotal roles as the season goes on. Senior RB Cameron Marshall, OL Andrew Sampson, LB Brandon Magee and S Keelan Johnson have been named captains for the 2012 season.

SECONDARY A PRIMARY: ASU's secondary has been among its driving forces this season. The unit ranks third nationally in passing defense (148.38) and is 10th in passing efficiency defense (101.8) and leads the Pac-12 in both. Not a bad start for a group that finished 11th and ninth, respectively, in those categories in the conference last season. In addition, the squad's 11 interceptions this year (giving some love to the linebackers, who have five of those and have returned two for touchdowns) is tied for 18th in the nation.

JUST KICKING IT: Alex Garoutte bumped his extra point streak to 83 against Utah, going 4-for-4 on extra points. He is now 88-for-89 in his career.

PUT ME IN, COACH: Jaxon Hood and D.J. Foster joined John Jefferson (1974), Terrell Suggs (2000), Zach Miller (2004) and Will Sutton (2009) as true freshmen to start season opener at ASU on offense or defense. The NCAA began allowing freshman to compete in 1972, with the 2012 season marking the 40 year anniversary. In total, 25 Sun Devils saw their first Division I action and seven true freshmen played (Evan Goodman, Laiu Moekiola, Carlos Mendoza, Easton Wahlstrom and Richard Smith in addition to Foster and Hood).

EARN YOUR KEEP: ASU has had nine players score their first career touchdowns this season: Taylor Kelly (pass), D.J. Foster (rush), Brandon Magee (INT return), Marion Grice (rush), Michael Eubank (rush), Richard Smith (reception), Chris Coyle (reception), Darwin Rogers (reception) and Anthony Jones (INT return). Brandon Magee put his name on the top of that list with a 45-yard pick-six against NAU - his first defensive touchdown ever. Chris Coyle added his first career TD grab against Illinois, which also served as Eubank's first career touchdown toss.

PIN 'EM DEEP: Redshirt senior punter Josh Hubner was among the best punters in the nation when it came to pinning opponents down the field, finishing the year tied for 17th in the nation with 24 punts inside the 20. He's back at it again in 2012 as he now has 13 punts on the year inside the 20 (out of 30 total punts) and is averaging 47.5 yards per punt, a mark that ranks second in the conference and is fifth in the nation. Hubner has had monster games against Oregon and UCLA, averaging 52.8 yards per punt on nine attempts with three downed inside the 20. For those performances, he was honored by the College Football Performance Awards Punter of the Week for consecutive weeks. Quarterback Taylor Kelly also showed off his talents in the category, having six pooch kicks this year with a long of 49 that have downed the opponents inside the 20 on five of those.

IF YOU GOT IT, FLAUNT IT: The Sun Devils played seven true freshmen in their season opener against NAU (Evan Goodman, Laiu Moekiola, Carlos Mendoza, Richard Smith, D.J. Foster Jaxon Hood and long snapper Easton Wahlstrom). The school record for true freshmen playing in season is 10, set back in 2008. According to research done by Colorado Dave Plati, the three true freshmen that started at their positions (Foster, Hood and Wahlstrom) ties with Washington for the most in the conference in the first week of action.

EMERSON HARVEY: Arizona State University football will commemorate a milestone this season by honoring Emerson Harvey, the school's first African-American football student-athlete 75 years ago and played a major role in breaking the color barrier throughout the Southwest. The Sun Devils will recognize Harvey, who joined the roster in 1937, with black-and-white circular helmet stickers with Harvey's jersey number (57).

LIGHT 'EM UP: With 108 points in its first two games, Arizona State set its highest tally through the first two games of the season in ASU history (now in its 100th season). The prior record was 94 points, under Dirk Koetter in 2005 as his team put up 63 points in a season opening victory against Temple before adding 31 in a tough loss against LSU. At 38.4 points per game, ASU currently ranks 22nd nationally in scoring offense and is third in the conference.

INFO-GRAHAM: So you want to know more about what Todd Graham brings to the program? Here's a couple more stats and tidbits about the ASU head coach to give you an idea. Special thanks Doug Haller (@DougHaller) of the *Arizona Republic* for all this information :

--Over his past four seasons -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Graham's teams have rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. In 2008, Tulsa rushed on 61.4 percent of its total plays. Last year, ASU rushed 44.5 percent of the time.

--Over the past six seasons at Pitt, Tulsa and Rice, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. Last year, Pittsburgh averaged 3.31 sacks, which ranked third nationally.

--In six seasons, Graham is 19-17 in true road games. Over the past four, ASU is 5-16.

--In five of the past six years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. In 2008, Tulsa averaged just 37 penalty yards, which ranked 11th in the nation. Last season, Pitt averaged 39.5, which ranked 18th.

FIRST IMPRESSION WAS GOOD: ASU's 63 points vs. NAU in the Todd Graham debut is the most by a Sun Devil coach in his opener, topping the 47 scored by Frank Kush's squad in 1958 over Hawaii. Not all openers were great for eventual great coaches though, as ASU's 1996 National Coach of the Year Bruce Snyder scored seven in his first game in a 31-7 loss to second-ranked Washington on Sept. 5, 1992.

ON THE BRIGHT SIDE: Despite a relatively rough outing otherwise, ASU allowed just 48 passing yards vs. Oregon, its fewest since it allowed 42 vs. Idaho State on Sept. 5, 2009. It marks the fewest allowed in a conference game since Nov. 2, 1996, when ASU's Pac-10 Conference title team allowed just 20 at Oregon State.

TAKE IT BACK: Rashad Ross took the second-half kickoff back 100 yards for a score vs. Colorado on Oct. 11, the second kick return for a touchdown in his short career. He also took one 98 yards vs. Boise State in the 2011 Las Vegas Bowl. ASU has had seven kickoff returns for a touchdown in the past 29 games, a span that started with Omar Bolden's 97-yard jaunt at No. 11 Wisconsin on Sept. 18, 2010. Ross is just the fifth player in school history to record a 100-yard kickoff return.

GAME 1

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) - Marion Grice ran for three touchdowns, Taylor Kelly was efficient in his desert debut and Arizona State opened the Todd Graham era with a 63-6 rout over Northern Arizona Thursday night.

The Sun Devils overwhelmed Northern Arizona from the opening kickoff, forcing three turnovers and running for five touchdowns while building a 42-0 halftime lead.

Kelly, Arizona State's fourth quarterback in as many years, looked as he'd been under center all along, throwing for 247 yards and a touchdown.

Cameron Marshall had two of Arizona State's seven rushing touchdowns, both in the first quarter, and the Sun Devils rolled up 554 yards of offense while scoring their most points since 2005.

Marshall ran in a 9-yarder to cap Arizona State's first drive, becoming the fourth player in school history with 30 career rushing touchdowns. He made it 31 the next possession, diving in from 1 yard out on a fourth down. D.J. Foster followed with 1-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter, and Grice added another to make it 35-0 midway through, set up by a 50-yard pass from Kelly to Rashad Ross.

Arizona State's defense hammered Northern Arizona throughout the first half, knocking Bauman (head) and Grossart (knee) out in the second quarter while forcing three interceptions.

Linebacker Brandon Magee, back after missing last season with a torn Achilles tendon, returned one of the picks 45 yards for a touchdown just before Grice's TD. Alden Darby later intercepted a pass by Chase Cartwright and returned it 50 yards, setting up Arizona State's fourth 1-yard TD run of the half, this one by quarterback Michael Eubank that made it 42-0.

Arizona State had a 356-92 advantage in total yards in the first half and kept rolling in the second, getting a pair of 4-yard touchdowns from Grice and a 7-yard scoring pass from Kelly to Richard Smith.

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) - Taylor Kelly completed 18 of 24 passes for 249 yards and a touchdown, and Arizona State rolled past Illinois 45-14 on Saturday night to improve to 2-0 under new coach Todd Graham.

Kelly's backup, Michael Eubank, was 5 of 5 passing for 69 yards and two touchdowns and ran 7 yards for a score. Chris Coyle matched a school record for tight ends with 10 catches, totaling 131 yards and two scores. He caught six passes for 73 yards all of last season.

Illinois (1-1) was without quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase because of an ankle injury, but the Illini's biggest problem was on defense, especially against the pass.

Illinois joined Nebraska (to UCLA) and Wisconsin (to Oregon State) as Big Ten teams to lose at Pac-12 schools on Saturday. Tim Beckman got his first loss as Illini coach after directing the team to a win in the Fight Hunger Bowl last season and last week's season opener against Western Michigan.

Arizona State (2-0) could have won even bigger but fumbled the ball away twice inside the Illinois 10.

Freshman Carlos Mendoza had two interceptions for Arizona State, which was without linebacker Brandon Magee because of a concussion.

Both of Scheelhaase's replacements, Reilly O'Toole and Miles Osei, had their struggles, but neither plays defense, where the lion's share of the blame rests.

The Sun Devils scored touchdowns on four of their six first-half possessions. It was almost five TDs, but Cameron Marshall lost a fumble at the Illinois 1.

Arizona State completed its first 14 passes, 10 by Kelly and four by Eubank. The two quarterbacks combined to complete 16 of 18 passes to an array of wide-open receivers in the first half, building a 28-7 lead.

Coyle had seven catches for 101 yards and two touchdowns in the first half.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Corbin Berkstresser ran for a score in his first career start at quarterback in place of injured James Franklin, and Missouri's defense forced four turnovers to ease the pressure on the redshirt freshman in a 24-20 victory over Arizona State on Saturday night.

Missouri (2-1) built a 17-point cushion in the third quarter in front of a sellout crowd of 71,004, the school's first for a non-conference game since Notre Dame in 1984. The Tigers held on late a week after fizzling late in a 21-point loss to No. 7 Georgia that spoiled the school's SEC debut.

Marion Grice scored on a pair of fourth-quarter runs that cut the deficit to four for Arizona State (2-1), which had a fumbled snap on the second extra-point kick.

Kendall Lawrence scored on a pair of short runs, and T.J. Moe was strong overall with eight catches for 88 yards and a 43-yard kickoff return to open the game for Missouri.

Missouri kicker Andrew Baggett made a 46-yard field goal early but missed from 37, 45 and 48 yards.

Kenronte Walker made two big plays late, a pass deflection on fourth and goal from the 2 to turn it over on downs and an end-zone interception and 49-yard return to clinch it in the final minute.

Missouri had quarterback suspense until just before kickoff with Franklin the final starter announced, followed by intrigue when Berkstresser took the field while Franklin wore a cap and headset on the sideline, nursing an elbow injury. It was the first start missed by the Tigers' No. 1 quarterback since coach Gary Pinkel's first season in 2001.

Brad Smith didn't miss a start in four seasons, Chase Daniel made it three years in a row and Blaine Gabbert started every game two years. Franklin had made 15 consecutive starts and warmed up without obvious discomfort prior to the game, throwing several passes of 20 or more yards while watched closely by offensive coordinator Dave Yost.

The Tigers got touchdown runs from Berkstresser and Lawrence on a pair of 18-yard drives off turnovers, with Kip Edwards recovering a fumble and intercepting Taylor Kelly on consecutive possessions.

Coming off a mistake-filled road loss to Missouri, the Sun Devils (3-1, 1-0 Pac-12) used their don't-let-em-rest offense and a smothering defense to run past Utah (2-2, 0-1) on a hot night in the desert.

Kelly eclipsed his season high by halftime with 259 yards and had three touchdown passes as Arizona State built a 31-7 lead.

Cameron Marshall scored two touchdowns and Arizona State rolled up 512 total yards against one of the nation's best defenses to win its ninth straight over the Utes.

Utah followed an impressive win over rival Brigham Young with a dud, falling behind 21-0 in the first quarter and managing 209 total yards - 55 in the second half.

John White lost two fumbles after missing the BYU game last week with an ankle injury and Jon Hays was mostly ineffective in his second game in place of Jordan Wynn, setting up a lopsided loss that may be more disheartening for Utah than its slipup against Utah State in Week 2.

Heading into Saturday's game, Graham was concerned about Utah's defense, which was ranked 15th nationally through the first three games.

The Sun Devils had 347 yards by halftime against a Utah defense that allowed an average of 268 yards its first three games.

The Sun Devils had no trouble against the Utes from the get-go, racing 64 yards in four plays for a touchdown on their opening drive. Kelly capped it with well-executed play, faking a handoff, rolling right to draw the cornerback off and hitting Rashad Ross, who broke a tackle around the 5 for a 38-yard touchdown.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) - Taylor Kelly threw three touchdown passes to help Arizona State send California to its worst start ever under coach Jeff Tedford with a 27-17 victory on Saturday.

Kelly connected with Kevin Ozier twice and Darwin Rodgers once, and Arizona State (4-1, 2-0 Pac-12) used six sacks to improve its impressive start under first-year coach Todd Graham.

The start of the season hasn't gone nearly as well for Cal (1-4, 0-2) and Tedford despite the team returning to renovated Memorial Stadium. The Golden Bears have lost three straight games and are off to their worst start since losing their first 10 games in 2001 under Tom Holmoe - who was succeeded the following season by Tedford.

After a strong start to his tenure, Tedford has a losing record since the start of the 2009 season. His only win this year came against Southern Utah of the FCS, and the frustration from fans was evident all afternoon.

Will Sutton and Junior Onyeali spent much of the day in Cal's backfield, giving Maynard little time to throw. Maynard was inaccurate when he did have time.

Maynard finished 9 for 28 for 126 yards with a touchdown. Isi Sofele rushed for 105 yards and scored Cal's only touchdown in the past two games.

Cal also was hurt by 12 penalties for 119 yards.

Kelly completed 26 of 45 passes for 292 yards, but Arizona State was unable to pull away. The Sun Devils settled for field goal attempts on four drives deep into Cal territory. Alex Garoutte made only two of them, hitting the upright on a 39-yard try in the third quarter and having a 38-yarder blocked by Nick Forbes early in the fourth to keep the lead at 20-10.

Cal responded with an 80-yard scoring drive that featured a 44-yard run by C.J. Anderson and a 10-yard TD pass from Maynard to his brother, Keenan Allen, to make it 20-17.

Kelly coolly led Arizona State on 74-yard drive, completing 4 of 5 passes for 45 yards, capped by a 22-yarder to Ozier to make it 27-17 with 6:17 to play.

Oregon's defense did its part, too, chasing quarterback Taylor Kelly all night while holding the Sun Devils in check until its reserves gave up a couple of long drives late.

Arizona State (5-2, 3-1) got the start it wanted, scoring a touchdown on its first play after Oregon's fumble.

The Sun Devils wilted after that, unable to make up for the early loss of star defensive tackle Will Sutton or find a way to slow down the Ducks as they raced past.

Kelly, the Pac-12's pass efficiency leader, threw two interceptions that set up Oregon touchdowns in the first half and had 93 yards on 10-of-18 passing while running for his life seemingly on every play.

Arizona State's defense, its anchor through the first six games, allowed 454 total yards, including 48 more rushing than it had the previous four games combined.

Arizona State at least got off to a good start, recovering a fumble by Mariota on Oregon's second play, scoring 7 seconds later on a 28-yard touchdown pass from Kelly to Kevin Ozier.

Oregon led 43-7 at halftime and had 329 yards rushing, 29 fewer than Arizona State allowed against Colorado, California, Utah and Missouri combined.

TEMPE, Ariz. (AZ Republic) - Freshman Ka'imi Fairbairn drilled a 33-yard field goal as time expired, lifting UCLA to a wild 45-43 win in front of 55,672 fans. As the Bruins celebrated on the field, the Sun Devils slowly walked over to their student section, knowing an opportunity had been lost.

A win, coupled with USC's loss to Arizona, would have vaulted the Sun Devils atop the Pac-12 South. The loss didn't eliminate ASU, but it sure didn't help. Not with a tough remaining schedule that includes No. 7 Oregon State, No. 9 USC, Washington State and the resurgent Wildcats in Tucson.

ASU (5-3, 3-2) rallied from a nine-point deficit in the final minutes of the fourth quarter, taking a 43-42 lead when sophomore quarterback Taylor Kelly hit freshman D.J. Foster for a 7-yard touchdown.

UCLA had 93 seconds to move into field-goal range, and the Bruins had little trouble doing so. Redshirt-freshman quarterback Brett Hundley, who grew up in nearby Chandler, completed 4 of 6 pass attempts for 45 yards on the drive. Senior Johnathan Franklin rushed for 19.

Hundley torched the nation's top passing defense (statistically), completing 19 of 29 for 274 yards and four touchdowns. Franklin rushed for 164 yards and two scores. Overall, UCLA, improving to 6-2 and 3-2, had 486 total yards, a season high for an ASU opponent.

ASU was shorthanded defensively. Standout junior defensive tackle Will Sutton didn't play because of a knee injury. The Sun Devils later lost junior defensive end Junior Onyeali and junior linebacker Steffon Martin with unspecified injuries.

Kelly completed 25 of 35 for 315 yards and four touchdowns. Foster rushed for 61 yards and caught seven passes for 107 yards and a touchdown. Junior Marion Grice added three scores, but it wasn't enough.
