- Amazing physical specimen, is ASU's largest defensive back and perhaps the team's fastest player.
- Showcased remarkable consistency and leadership last season, leading ASU in tackles and interceptions as a starter in all 13 games and is the third-leading tackler among Pac-10 defensive backs entering 2007.
- In 2006, he led ASU or tied for the team lead in tackles in eight games and established or tied the game-high in tackles in four contests.
- Was named first-team Pac-10 All-Academic in 2006 and is one of eight active Sun Devils to have already earned his degree.
- Earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 recognition in 2006 and returns as one of the top safeties in college football for 2007.
- Was named U.S. Bank Pacific-10 Conference Defensive Player of the Week following ASU's 26-23 overtime victory at Washington on Oct. 28, 2006, during which he led as with nine total tackles and two interceptions.
- Was listed on ESPN's 2006 All-Mayday Team for his tough, relentless playing style and is regarded as the No. 5 senior safety in the nation by ESPN's Mel Kiper and the No. 5 defensive back in the Pac-10 Conference by Rivals.com.
- Has been named to the 2007 Lott Trophy preseason watch list and was one of 13 defensive players nationwide chosen to Rivals.com's "All-Reliable Team", due to his consistency and dependability.

2006 Season

Started all 13 games at safety...earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 accolades and was named first-team Pac-10 All-Academic...was named ASU's Defensive Most Valuable Player at the team's year-end banquet...led ASU with 82 tackles (58 solo) and three interceptions...led all Sun Devil defensive backs with 7.5 tackles-for-loss (-17 yards)...added six pass break-ups, a two-yard sack and a fumble recovery...recorded a team-high eight total tackles (six solo) and recovered fumble at the ASU goal line at Colorado...led ASU with seven solo tackles, adding a three-yard tackle for loss and a pass break-up at No. 21 California...paced the Sun Devils with eight total tackles (five solo) and a pass break-up against No. 12 Oregon...recorded a game-high nine total tackles (seven solo) and a two-yard tackle-for-loss at No. 3 USC...posted four total stops (three solo), one for loss, against Stanford...tied for the game-high with nine total tackles (five solo), adding a pair of interceptions and a pass break-up at Washington...posted five total tackles (two solo) at Oregon State...led ASU with eight total tackles (four solo) in addition to 2.0 tackles-for-loss (-3 yards), a two-yard sack and a pass break-up against UCLA...recorded a game-high and career-best 11 total tackles (10 solo), adding 2.0 tackles-for-loss (-5 yards) at Arizona...tied for the team-lead with eight total tackles (seven solo), along with an interception against Hawai'i in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl...earned Hard Hat Player recognition for his work in ASU's offseason strength and conditioning program, finishing in the top-10 in the team's scoring system.

2005 Season

Played in all 12 games, starting two (Arizona and Rutgers)...totaled 37 tackles (26 solo), 3.0 tackles for loss (-13 yards), one interception, four pass break-ups and a nine yard sack...was the recipient of ASU's Special Teams Iron Man Award...finished seventh on the squad in total tackles...had a career-high and team-leading eight tackles (seven solo), and a one-yard tackle-for-loss against Northwestern...had five total tackles (three solo) at Oregon State...recorded four total tackles and a fourth-quarter interception of a Ryan Hart pass to help seal ASU's comeback victory over Rutgers in the Insight Bowl...tallied three total tackles, including a nine-yard sack of quarterback Drew Olson at UCLA.

2004 Season

Played in 10 games, starting four...finished the season with 17 total tackles (12 solo stops)...recorded a season-high four tackles (two solo) and recovered a fumble in ASU's season opener against UTEP...made a season-best three solo tackles at Northwestern...started the last two games of the season...against Arizona, hauled in the first interception of his career, returning it for 23 yards, and added two solo tackles...tied his season high with four tackles (two solo) in the Sun Bowl, including 0.5 tackles for loss...also recovered a fumble in ASU's victory over the Boilermakers.

2003 Season

Played in the first game of the season vs. Northern Arizona as a true freshman...injured his shoulder in that game and redshirted...earned the Glen Hawkins Scout Team Award for defense.

High School

A 2003 graduate of Reno (Nev.) High School...selected the Northern 4A football Player of the Year in Nevada...a member of the Las Vegas Sun all-state football team on offense and as a returner...garnered first-team all-region honors at wide receiver, defensive back and return specialist as a senior...earned Sierra League first-team honors and was the conference player of the year...first-team All-Sierra League selection at defensive back, receiver and as a returner...also made all-league as a running back...rushed for 490 yards on 60 carries and scored five touchdowns...also caught 22 passes for 365 yards and five more touchdowns...made five interceptions...also returned seven kicks and punts for touchdowns and scored four times on interception returns...as a junior, made Nevada Class 4A, Northern Region and second-team as a returner...made the All-Sierra League first team as a returner...also played basketball as a junior and senior...lettered three times in track...played baseball as a sophomore...captained both football and basketball teams as a senior...helped lead Reno High to a 11-0 record in 2002 before McQueen High defeated the Huskies, 37-6, in the Northern 4A Championship game...boasted a 3.4 grade-point average...was coached by Dan Avansino.
