## WASHINGTON TO HOST THE PACIFIC-10 CONFERENCE MEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

### GENERAL INFORMATION

**WHAT:** The 50th annual Pacific-10 Conference Men's Golf Championship.

**WHEN:** Monday-Wednesday, April 27-29, 2009

**HOST:** Washington will serve as the host for the 72-hole Championship.

**WHO:** Men's golf teams from all 10 institutions will compete for bragging rights at the 2009 Pac-10 Men's Golf Championship.

**LAST YEAR IN PAC-10 MEN'S GOLF**

**FAIRFAX, Calif.** - In what proved to be the most dramatic round of the entire tournament, the 2008 Pac-10 Men's Golf Championship belongs to Arizona State after a playoff round win over USC. **Creighton Honeck** of Arizona took the Individual Pac-10 title after beating **Kevin Chappell** of UCLA, also in a one-hole playoff round.

USC and Arizona State battled all day, with the two schools going back and forth for first place and finally tying at 3-under par. One playoff hole on the 18th was all it took for the Sun Devils (354-361-356-364) to win their first Pac-10 men's golf title since 2000.

In an interesting Pac-10 connection, Arizona State head coach **Randy Lein** was the USC men's golf coach when current Trojan coach **Chris Zambri** was there as a player. During the award ceremony, Coach Lein acknowledged the play of ASU's only senior, Phil Telliard, noting that he was happy Telliard was able to end his collegiate career on a high point.

The individual leader competition was equally heated coming down the stretch with Honeck and Chappell tied at 3-under. In the sudden death playoff round on the 10th hole, Chappell teed off first and made par, then Honeck sank a birdie to win it. As a team, Arizona ended the tournament in sixth place after posting a 4-under par, the best outing of the day.

**GOLFERS TO WATCH**

USC's **Matthew Giles** holds the No. 1 ranking in the nation according to *Golfweek*. The Aussie shot a career-low round of 63 in April at the U.S. Intercollegiate where he tied for fourth. With the second-lowest adjusted stroke average in the nation at 71.07, Giles has shot 17 rounds at par or better this season. The USC sophomore is also a contender for the Ben Hogan Award, which is presented annually to the best collegiate golfer in the nation.

Stanford sophomore **Steve Ziegler** won his first collegiate career individual title in February at the USC/Ashworth Collegiate Invitational. Ziegler carded a 9-under 204 after shooting a career-low tying round of 65 on the last day of competition. Ziegler was named the *Golf World* Player of the Week and the Pac-10 Golfer of the Month following his first-place performance. The sophomore is currently ranked ninth in the nation according to *Golfweek*.

Winning a Washington school-record fourth individual title this season, Husky **Nick Taylor** was named the *Golf World* Player of the Week for April 13-19 with his victory at the U.S. Intercollegiate. The junior shot a career-low 63 in the final round to secure the top spot after starting the day five back from the leader. Taylor, who ranked 12th by *Golfweek*, was also named the Pac-10 Golfer of the month for both November and March. Along with USC's Giles, Taylor is a finalist for the Ben Hogan Award.

UCLA's **Erik Flores** won co-medalist honors at the U.S. Collegiate Championships, the second individual victory of his career, in the beginning of April. Flores shot a season-low 65 in the first round, one stroke off his career-low of 64, to secure the victory. The senior holds a 72.69 scoring average through 26 rounds, with 7 of those rounds shot under par. Flores is ranked 15th nationally by *Golfweek*.
