# RICHES COMPLEX

At the start of the 2005-06 season, the Arizona State University wrestling program moved into its new training home, thanks in part to a joint partnership with Sunkist Kids Wrestling, Inc. The 9,600 square foot complex affords the Sun Devil wrestlers a spacious setting in which to prepare for the best Division I athletes in the nation.

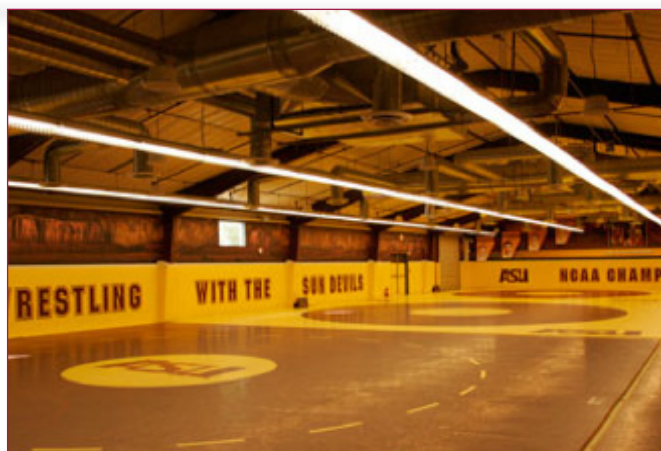
The project was set in motion with Sunkist Kids Wrestling, Inc., and the Riches Family acting as major donors. The SKWI organization was granted permission to create the facility and then donated the building back to the University while retaining the option to lease the space for their own use, such as camps and clinics.

Private investments also played an integral role in the development of the project. Sunkist Kids Wrestling, Inc., agreed to develop this project with the help of other investors interested in creating a first-class wrestling training facility which is essential in helping Sun Devil student-athletes achieve their potential on the mat.

Moving from a smaller training room inside Wells Fargo Arena, the wrestling program equipped its new home with three full size (40 x 40) competition mats spread out over 7,200 square feet of usable mat space. The facility also has the capacity to bring in bleachers for spectators at camps and training sessions. The remaining 2,400 square feet house 40 lockers along with showers and restrooms. Additionally, this area also includes two offices and video areas to help the student-athletes perfect their techniques.

The facility includes a variety of technology ranking it among the premier training centers in the nation. The state-of-the-art building is fixed with the latest in sound and video technology and the latest in wireless information technology.

The entrance to the facility not only serves as the main gateway to the interior of the building, but also as an outdoor reception area. The covered patio is suitable for team building functions as well as friend and fund-raising activities throughout the year.

# WELLS FARGO ARENA

Wells Fargo Arena has served as the home facility for several of Arizona State University's varsity athletic programs since it opened its doors in the spring of 1974. The 14,198-seat arena, which was constructed at a cost of \$8 million, houses not only the Sun Devil wrestling program, but also hosts events for the men's and women's basketball programs, the volleyball program and the gymnastics program. The facility also plays host to graduation ceremonies throughout the year, both for ASU and local high schools.

The structure is 400 feet long, 340 feet wide and six stories high and contains offices and locker rooms for ASU's teams, as well as an athletic training room, weight room and equipment room utilized by many of the other teams on campus. The large hardwood playing surface contains enough space for the Sun Devil wrestling team to place between one and five full-size competition mats to host events ranging from the annual Sunkist Kids/ASU International Open (five mats), to the occasional Pac-10 Conference Championships (three mats) down to one and two-mat configurations for a regular season dual and the Sun Devil Duals, respectively.

Since joining the Pac-10 Conference in time for the 1978-79 academic year, the Sun Devils have played host to four conference tournaments. The Sun Devils finished tied for fifth in the most recent hosting (2004) and won Pac-10 titles the previous three times (1997, 1989 and 1985). Overall, all 16 of the program's Pac-10 team titles and one of its two Western Athletic Conference (WAC) crowns were earned by teams competing inside Wells Fargo Arena. It also has witnessed 59 different individuals combine to win 113 conference crowns with seven individuals claiming 11 WAC titles. On a national level, the 1988 Sun Devils captured the NCAA Championship while five of the program's six individual national champions competed on the mats inside Wells Fargo Arena. Also, 69 different wrestlers have combined to earn 101 All-America honors.

# COACH CHARLES



## THE SHAWN CHARLES FILE

- Has coached in five Division I conferences, including the Big 12, Ivy, Western Athletic, Mid-American and Pacific-10
- Has worked with 40 NCAA Division I All-Americans and three individual NCAA Champions
- Helped teams place among the Top 10 nationally in the NCAA Division I Championships seven times in his coaching career

On May 8, 2009, Shawn Charles, a four-time All-American and two-time national runner-up at Arizona State University, was named the head coach of the Sun Devil wrestling program. An Arizona native and one of the more successful Sun Devils in the program's history, Charles becomes only the sixth head coach in the program's 47-year history.

"I am excited to be back at my Alma mater and to be the guy to put it all together and make Arizona State successful once again," Charles said. "It is a great opportunity to come back to Tempe and strengthen this program as a coach and I am looking forward to goals I have set for this team in the coming years. One of my goals is to get the community involved with our program. I really believe that wrestling is a viable form of entertainment and I would really like to see the communities around Arizona get involved in supporting this form of entertainment.

"I also think it is important for our student-athletes to be recognized not only for their achievements on the mats, but in the classrooms as well," Charles said. "I want to win championships, but I also want to make sure our young men are succeeding academically and setting their sites on the future by graduating from college. For me, I know the environment, I know the community, I know the boosters, I know the alumni and I know the task that is front of me and I know that makes me the best person to help drive this program forward and do the things I need to do to ensure that Arizona State wrestling stays a Division I program and wins championships."

Charles will have a wealth of knowledge at his disposal as he works to bring the program back to the top of the national and conference standings after being there himself as a Sun Devil. In his years in Tempe (1990-93), Charles helped the Sun

Devils to three Pac-10 Championships (1990, 1991 and 1993) while also helping the team place among the Top 6 nationally in each of the those three seasons, including a national runner-up finish in 1990 and a fourth-place showing in 1993. He earned All-America honors in all four of his years on the mat at 126 pounds, placing fifth as a freshman and fourth as a sophomore before taking national runner-up honors in his final two campaigns.

A two-time Pac-10 individual champion (1992 and 1993), Charles collected 103 victories in his collegiate career, ranking him tied for 19th on the program's all-time wins list. He also ranks 19th in career dual-match victories after he posted a 44-15-5 record in those matches. Charles also was a two-time competitor in the East-West All-Star Dual and captured the Las Vegas Invitational twice while also finishing second at the prestigious Midlands Championships once during his Sun Devil career.

In 2011 Charles was awarded the Pac - 10 Coach of the Year for leading his team to the NCAA and Pac - 10 Championship. Anthony Robles and Bubba Jenkins were crowned national champions of their respected weight class. Robles was named the All-American and NCAA Champion (125) as well as Jenkins (157). Robles also won his third Pac - 10 Champion title in a row at 125 pounds. Jenkins also took the Pac-10 Champion title in his 184 weight class. Levi Cooper also finished seventh in the championship and was named an All-American as well as placing third in the Pac-10 Championship (285). Charles guided three more wrestlers to compete in the tournament including Eric Starks, Jake Meredith, and Luke Macchiaroli. Starks finished third in his 174 weight class at the Pac-10 Championship. Arizona State finished the Pac - 10 Championship with 117 team points and 62.5 in the NCAA Championship.

In his first season as the leader of the Sun Devil program (2009-10 season), Charles guided the team to a 9-7-0 record and a 4-2-0 mark in the Pac-10. In the championship season, his squad placed fourth in the Pac-10 Championships with 104.5 points before taking 30th place at the NCAA Wrestling Championships with 19.5 points. Anthony Robles, wrestling one pound lighter (125) than Charles did during his time with the Sun Devils (126) used the head coach's knowledge and his own unique style to win his second Pac-10 title before claiming his second All-America honor in a row by placing seventh overall at the national tournament. Charles also guided four other individuals to berths into the national meet with each winning at least one match during their tournament competition.

Upon earning his Bachelor of Science in Computer Information Systems from ASU in 1993, the native of Tucson, Ariz., began his coaching



career that has taken him all over the nation in the collegiate ranks and around the world as a representative of USA Wrestling. Charles, who has worked with programs in the Big 12 Conference, the Mid-America Conference (MAC), the Ivy League and the Western Athletic Conference (WAC), began his coaching career at Iowa State (1993-95) where he served as an assistant coach before he returned to the Valley of the Sun to serve as the head assistant coach at Phoenix College (1995-96).

From there, he returned to the Big 12 where he worked as the assistant freestyle wrestling coach at Oklahoma (1996-97) before Central Michigan brought him as its head assistant coach (1997-01). While at CMU, 11 wrestlers earned All-America status and one was crowned national champion in 1999. Overall, the team recorded a pair of Top 10 national finishes as well.

Charles was then named the head assistant coach at Nebraska (2001-05) and helped the Corn huskers to two Top 10 finishes with 11 All-Americans and one national champion. With 22 All-Americans, two national champions and four Top 10 team finishes on his resume, Fresno State brought Charles back to the West by naming him the head coach. Despite qualifying four wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, including future Sun Devil Greg Gifford, the program was discontinued after his only year, sending Charles across the nation to Brown (2006-07) for a one-year stint as its assistant coach.

Over the past two seasons, Charles worked with a Big 12 program, this time helping Missouri's program to a seventh-place finish in 2009 and five individual All-America honors. All told in his brief stint in Columbia, Mo., the Tigers earned eight All-America honors and had one individual champion. All told in his 18 years of coaching, Charles has worked with 39 NCAA All-Americans and three individual NCAA champions while also helping teams to Top 10 finishes as the NCAA Championships on seven occasions.

But his dedication to excellence was not only felt on the mats, it was recognized in the classroom as well. Three of his wrestlers were selected for scholar-athlete of the year honors while each of his coaching stops has seen him work with at least one national all-academic honoree. He also has participated in countless community activities at each of his coaching stops while also working to create and/or improve club wrestling programs in those areas.

Away from the collegiate coaching scene, Charles also has coached internationally, which includes him being named to the 2009 University World Team coaching staff after serving on the U.S. Olympic staff in both 2004 and 2008. A coach with Sunkist Kids, Charles also has served as a coach for two World Cups (2003, 2007) and has helped lead the U.S. at two international tournaments in the Ukraine. Most recently, Charles worked with MU wrestler Ben Askren, who represented the U.S. at the 2008 Olympics.

As an international competitor, Charles claimed 14 titles, including victories at tournaments in Iran, Manitoba (Canada), Slovakia, Bulgaria and Turkey while also winning the U.S. Open, the NYAC International and the Pan-American Championships. Along with several U.S. national titles, Charles twice placed second at the World Team Trials and was an alternate on the 1996 U.S. Olympic freestyle team.

Charles began his wrestling career in Tucson and competed for Santa Rita High School. While at SRHS, he captured three state titles over the course of his final three years and also won the division championship all three years.

Charles and his wife, the former Jill Hansen, are the parents of two boys, Shawn Charles, Jr. (eight) and Titus "Tyty" Charles (six).

# COACH PASCOE



## THE TRAVIS PASCOE FILE

Travis Pascoe, a former All-American and four-time NCAA qualifier for the University of Nebraska, joined the Arizona State University wrestling program's coach staff as an assistant coach on August 1, 2011. A four-year starter at 184 pounds for NU, Pascoe will work with the upper weights on the Sun Devil roster, a group that includes returning Pac-10 Champion Jake Meredith (184) and heavyweight All-American Levi Cooper.

The 2011-12 season will mark the seventh year Pascoe has coached in some capacity among the collegiate ranks and his second assistant position after joining Shawn Charles' staff at Fresno State. After the FSU program was discontinued following that season, Pascoe headed north to Corvallis, Ore., where he has served as a volunteer coach at Oregon State for the past five seasons.

While at Corvallis, Pascoe worked with the Beavers' upper weight wrestlers and helped two individuals earn NCAA All-America honors, including Ty Watterson at heavyweight (2007) and Colby Covington at 174 (2011). On the conference level, Pascoe worked with six Beavers that combined to win seven Pac-10 titles (174-184-197-285), including two at the 2011 tournament in Corvallis, while the team won two titles in that same span.

In the 2005-06 season, Pascoe joined Charles at Fresno State. That year, Pascoe worked with Greg Gifford, who captured the 184-pound title at the NCAA West Region Championships and was one of two Bulldogs to reach the NCAA tournament in 2006. Once the program was dropped, Gifford, who went 1-2 at the national meet that year, transferred to ASU for his senior season, where he won the 184 title at the Pac-10 Championships and went 2-2 at the national meet.

Before Pascoe jumped into the coaching ranks, he was a highly ranked wrestler at 184 pounds for Nebraska. Competing as the starter for four years in a row (2001-02 season through the 2004-05 season), Pascoe recorded a career record of 100-36, which ranked as the 13th-most victories in NU history. A four-time national qualifier, Pascoe advanced to the semifinals of the 2005 tournament and eventually finished sixth overall to earn his first All-America honors. Winning at least two matches in each of his four NCAA appearances, Pascoe helped the Huskers to Top 20 finishes all four years, including a fifth-place showing in 2004 and an eighth-place finish in 2002.

Pascoe placed third in the Big 12 Championships each of his first two years and then finished fourth as a junior under. In his senior season, he reached the finals and finished second in the conference to earn a berth into the NCAA tournament.

Brian Stith, a former two-time All-American at Arizona State University, returns for his fourth season as an assistant coach for the Sun Devils in 2010-11 and will once again work with the lower-weight wrestlers in the program. Stith also will assist with the day-to-day administrative operations of the program.

In his first season on staff, Stith helped mentor several rookies in their first collegiate action, including three redshirt freshmen that advanced to the finals of the Pac-10 Championships. With Stith in their corner, rookies Anthony Robles (125) and Chris Drouin (141) each placed second in their first league event while senior Patrick Pitsch (165) captured his third conference crown. All three Sun Devils competed in the NCAA Championships with all three advancing to the Round of 12 at the national meet, just one victory shy of All-America accolades.

Last year, Stith continued to work with the lighter weights and helped four individuals reach the NCAA Championships, including first-time participant Te Edwards, who placed third at the Pac-10 Championships at 157 pounds. Stith will continue to work with the middle of the line-up, that includes a pair of All-American candidates from his hometown in Edwards (at 165) and newcomer Bubba Jenkins (at 157), a transfer from Penn State.

A native of Hampton, Va., Stith as a member of the Sun Devil program for five years and was the team's starter at 157 pounds during his four collegiate seasons. Stith compiled a career record of 114-33 while in Tempe and ranks as the 12th-winningest Sun Devil in program history. His 55-16 record in dual competition gives him the eight-most dual victories in program history as well. On January 12, 2007, he scored a fall at 1:18 over Beau Fisher (Virginia) at the Virginia Duals to become the 22nd Sun Devil to record 100 victories in a career.

Stith, who graduated from Arizona State in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Tourism, was a two-time All-American, placing sixth at the 2005 NCAA Championships before placing as the national runner-up in 2006 as the tournament's No. 10 seed. He also was a two-time Pac-10 Conference Champion, winning his crowns in 2005 and 2007 and placing second in 2006. During his time as a competitor, the Sun Devils captured two Pac-10 titles (2005 and 2006) and recorded a pair of national Top 15 finishes at the NCAA meet, placing 13th in 2005 and sixth in 2006.

Miller was the program's second four-time All-American by virtue of competing at a higher weight class than that of Charles with his honor in 1993. Miller finished fifth, fourth and second at 157 pounds before closing his career as the NCAA Champion at 167 pounds in 1993.

Mollica earned his four honors split between two weight classes and made two of his awards national championships. The Arizona State wrestling team is one of the most decorated programs in the West as the Sun Devils have captured 18 conference titles in its 48-year history, including 16 Pac-10 and two Western Athletic crowns. Since joining the Pacific-10 Conference in time for the 1978-79 season, the Sun Devils have been one of the most dominant member institutions, claiming half of the titles (16 of 32). The only 'Western' school to have won the NCAA Championships, the Sun Devils have accumulated 101 individual Pac-10 titles and 28 WAC crowns (129 total titles in program history).

One of only eight different schools to win a Pac-10 wrestling team title, the Sun Devils' 16 crowns rank second among league teams trailing only Oregon State, who won its 18th in 2010. The two teams also hold the two longest consecutive winning streaks in the history of the championships with ASU taking seven titles in a row (1985-91) and OSU capturing six in a row (1965-70). Combined, the Sun Devils and Beavers have won 35 of the 48 Pac-10 titles contested. Both squads also boast the most Top 3 finishes in the history of the conference with the Sun Devils' 27 ranking second to OSU's 36.

# OLYMPIC SUCCESS

## SUN DEVIL OLYMPIANS

EIGHT SUN DEVILS HAVE REPRESENTED THEIR COUNTRY AT THE OLYMPICS

Eight wrestlers that wore the maroon and gold of Arizona State University also have dawned the national colors of their native lands during Olympic competition. The Sun Devils have been a part of the Summer Games on six occasions with the most recent coming at the 1996 Atlanta Games. There, Team USA was represented by Rob Eiter, Townsend Saunders and Dan Henderson (all three of which placed in the Top 12 of the competitions) while Marco Sanchez represented Puerto Rico. Overall, three Sun Devils have represented their home nation in the Olympics on multiple occasions, including Saunders (1996 and 1992), Henderson (1996 and 1992) and Billy Rosado (1980 and 1976). Among the success of those Sun Devils are the two silver medals won by Saunders in 1996 and Zeke Jones in 1992. Seven times, a Sun Devil has placed in the Games, including Gary Bohay, who took eighth in 1988 for Canada. At 2004 Athens, Jones and Saunders represented Team USA on the sidelines with the freestyle teams as Jones served on the men's staff while Saunders was on the inaugural women's freestyle staff.

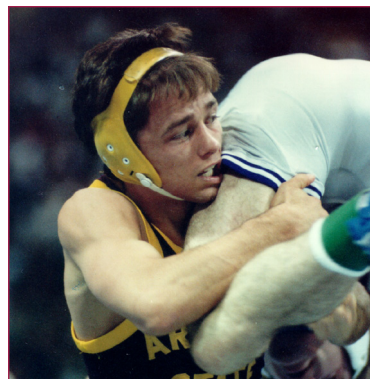

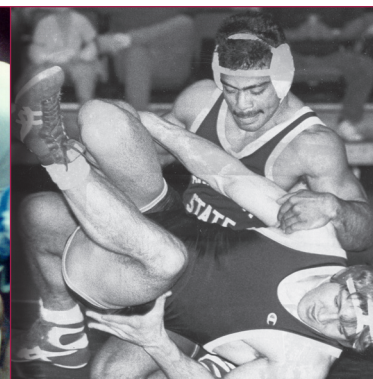

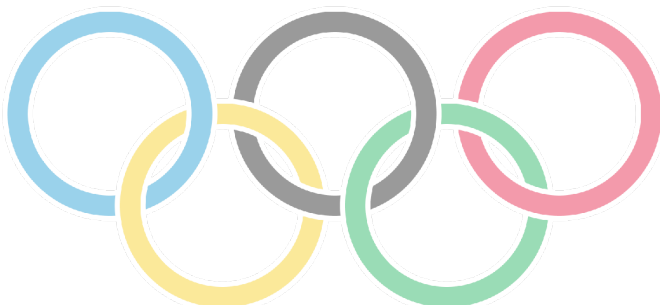
Zeke Jones became the first Sun Devil wrestler to medal at the Olympic Games as he took home the 52kg (114.5) freestyle silver medal at the 1992 Barcelona Games. Jones, the 1991 World Champion, easily won his first two matches (15-0, 16-1) before slipping past Constantin Corduneanu (Romania) in the quarterfinals. Following his 9-5 defeat of Japan's Mitsura Sato in the semifinal, Jones faced Hak-Sun Li (PRK) and dropped an 8-1 decision in the final for his lone loss of the tournament. Jones has been to one other Olympiad as he served as a coach for Team USA in 2004 Athens.

After finishing seventh in the 1992 Barcelona Games, Townsend Saunders was back on the Olympic mats in 1996 in Atlanta as he once again competed at 68kg (150.0) to become the program's third, two-time Olympian. Looking to finisher higher than he had before (fourth at the 1993 Worlds was his best thus far), Saunders opened with three close wins (3-1, 3-1, 4-0) to reach the final where he dropped a 1-1 decision to Vadim Bogiyev (Russia) to earn the silver medal. Saunders returned to the Games for a third time in 2004 Athens as he helped coach the first women's freestyle team.

Although the recent years have not seen a flood of Sun Devils competing at the World level like it had seen in the past, the program is still active both on the mat and in the coaching corner. While several of the former wrestlers have taken on coaching roles at the World Championships, such as Zeke Jones, Rob Eiter and Townsend Saunders, the last three years has seen an influx in Sun Devils on the mat. Most recently, at the 2010 World Championships in Moscow, Kelsey Campbell, a two-year member of the program, competed in women's freestyle (59kg/130) and finished fifth in her first world-level appearance. In 2009, Danny Felix, who was on the Arizona State rosters from 1994-98, finally broke through as he won the U.S. World Team Trials and advanced to the 2009 World Championships. One year prior to that, however, the 2008 Veteran's World Championships saw John Hughes take the bronze medal at 69kg (152.0). Hughes, competing in the 'E' division (56 years old and older), last wrestled at ASU in 1974.

## SUN DEVILS IN EVOLVING STYLES

BEACH WRESTLING, SOMBO AND GRAPPLING ARE CONTINUING TO GROW AND ASU IS WELL REPRESENTED

In recent years, FILA, the governing body of international wrestling, has introduced world championship competitions for several new disciplines of wrestling. In previous years, wrestling was men's freestyle and men's Greco-Roman. After adding women's freestyle wrestling, the Federation has since instituted international events for beach wrestling, grappling, pangration athlima, belt wrestling. Sombro also is on the list of growing events and is practiced world-wide. Beach wrestling is just as it reads, wrestling on the beach with sand serving as the competition surface instead of a mat. Grappling is a form of submission wrestling that sees wrestlers look to immobilize his/her opponent with locks while not striking an opponent (similar to submissions in MMA, but no 'fighting'). Pangration uses controlled kicks and punches during bouts while competitors also look for submission moves to end matches. Belt wrestling involves competitors wearing red belts that his/her opponent holds on to as each competitor looks to throw his/her opponent to the mat while scoring points through technical aspects of those throws. Sombro is form of Russian combat judo that was used by members of the military in their training and battles (hand-to-hand). Throws and submissions are prevalent in this style as well.

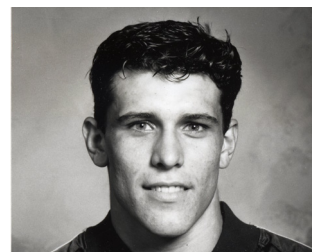

Since 2007, FILA has continued to grow the sport of wrestling with off-shoot tournaments in beach wrestling, grappling (submission) and Sombro and, since that time, former Sun Devil Jeff Funicello has competed in all three events, earning five bronze medals for Team USA.





# MIXED MARTIAL ARTS

In the world of MMA (mixed martial arts), the Sun Devil wrestling program has continually produced some of the top talents in the sport, both now and in the past. While former Sun Devils have held championship belts in the past, including UFC Heavyweight Champion Dan 'The Beast' Severn and Pride Welterweight and Middleweight (at the same time) Champion 'Dangerous' Dan Henderson, the current crop of talent is already turning heads. The trio of talented newcomers includes three Sun Devils that earned All-America honors at the 2006 NCAA Championships: Cain Velasquez, C.B. Dollaway and Ryan Bader.

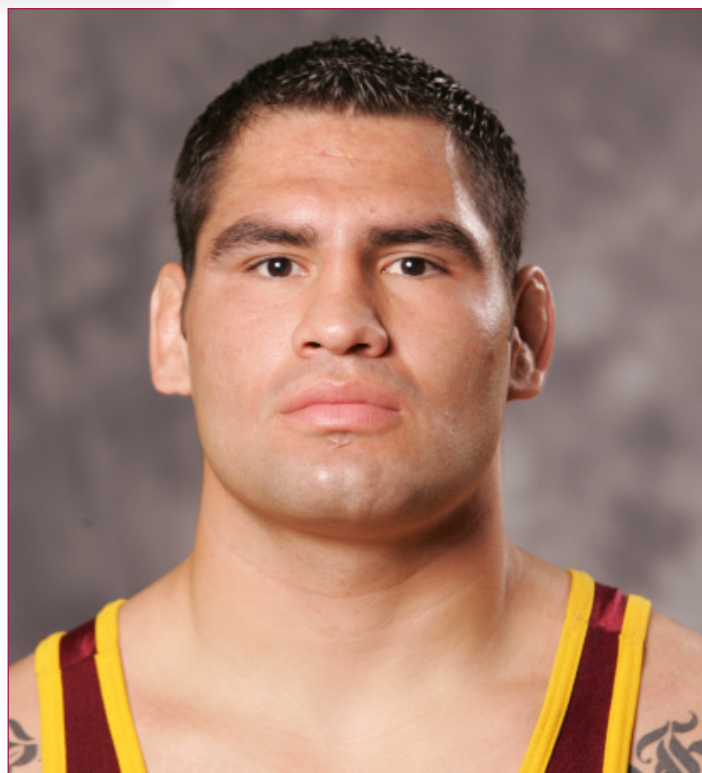
In October 2010, Velasquez' rise to the top culminated with his TKO of Brock Lesnar at UFC 121 where he downed the defending champion and captured the belt to become the UFC World Heavyweight Champion. Velasquez is the first Sun Devil to hold a belt (in the current system of non-tournament fighting) and also is the first fighter of Mexican heritage to hold a title in any major organization.

In Arizona, a trio of former Sun Devil All-Americans are continuing to evolve the sport, not only as fighters, but as trainers. Bader, the TUF Season 8 winner, Dollaway, known as 'The Doberman' and the TUF Season 7 runner-up, and their former coach Aaron 'A-Train' Simpson still train in the Valley and are in the process of opening their own gym in Gilbert. All three are fighters in the UFC, including 'Darth' Bader, who remains undefeated in the light heavyweight division.

Historically, two Severn and Henderson have held distinctions that no other fighters have. Severn is the only UFC Triple Crown winner -- won a UFC tournament (UFC 5), the Ultimate Ultimate Tournament and the UFC Superfight -- while Henderson, who has recently transitioned into the UFC, was a Pride Champion at two weight classes at the same time (middleweight and light heavyweight), the only fighter in Pride's history to hold two belts at one time.

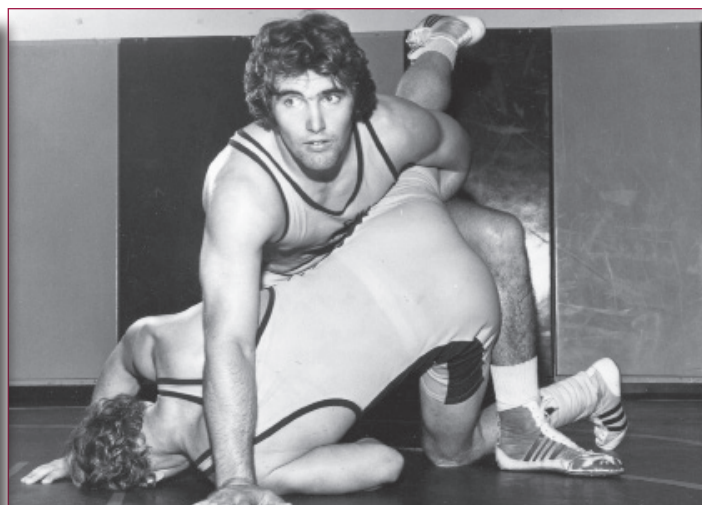

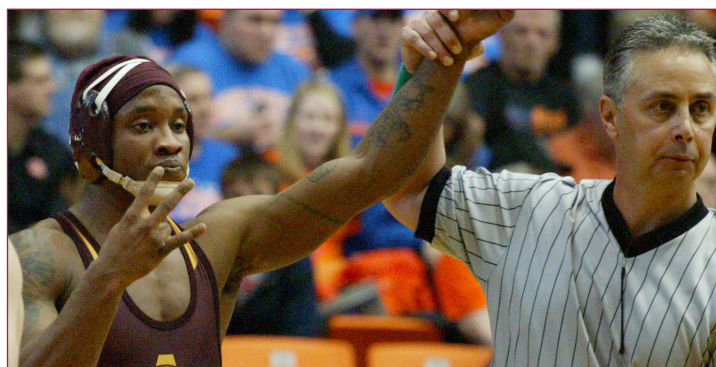

Each year, the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) conducts an all-star event, which pits the top wrestlers in the national rankings against one another in an exhibition setting (results don't count toward each wrestler's season and career results). Dating back to 1967, the Sun Devil entrants have posted a 12-13-1 overall record with four withdrawing prior to the competition (injury or other reasons). At the 2010 Classic, Anthony Robles scored a 20-2 technical fall over Zach Sanders of Minnesota at 125 pounds and Bubba Jenkins won a 12-4 major decision over Adam Hall of Boise State at 157 to snap a two-match losing streak for the program at the annual event. A pair of current Sun Devil coaches also have competed in the event for ASU, including Shawn Charles and Brian Stith. Charles won once and lost once at 126 pounds while Stith lost a 2-1 decision in 2007 at 157 pounds. Charles is one of six Sun Devils that have been selected to be a part of the event multiple times with Dan Severn leading the way with three selections (1-1 and one withdraw due to injury).

Families have played a key role in the development of Arizona State's wrestling program, and not just in the sense of former wrestlers coming back to coach the current members. To date, 28 different families have had multiple members of their family on a Sun Devil wrestler roster, including two current members of the team: Luke Ashmore is currently on the roster after his brother Ben was a member of the team each of the last two seasons. The other is Luke Macchiaroli, who follows his father, Tony, a member of the team in the late 1970's.

Although most families represented are brothers, there has been one deep-rooted tradition at ASU with the father-sons combination of Glenn Sr., Glenn Jr., Wayne and Rob McMinn. Together, they competed for the Sun Devils in three different decades.

# HONORS & AWARDS

## DAN HODGE AWARD

ERIC LARKIN WINS PRESTIGIOUS NATIONAL HONOR IN 2003



The Dan Hodge Award, considered the Heisman Trophy of collegiate wrestling, is given annually to the most dominating and undefeated wrestler in the nation. In 2003, Eric Larkin went 34-0 en route to the NCAA title at 149 pounds, as well as his fourth Pac-10 title, to earn the Hodge and cap a stellar senior campaign in Tempe.

Larkin was only the third Pac-10 wrestler to earn the award first given in 1995, following Stephen Neal of CS Bakersfield in 1999 and Oregon State's Les Gutches in 1996.

The Hodge is named for legendary Oklahoma Sooner wrestler Dan Hodge, takes in to consideration a wrestlers dominance on the mat, his number of pins, his overall record, past credentials, the quality of competition he faces, his sportsmanship, his citizenship and his heart. Hodge exemplified all those things, going 46-0 in his collegiate career and winning three national titles (1955-57) while never surrendering a takedown to any opponent.

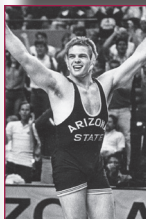

### SHAWN CHARLES

**INDUCTED: 2010 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1989-92**

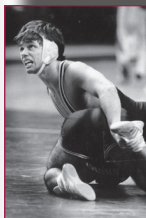
Charles was ASU's first four-time wrestling All-American and was a two-time Pac-10 individual champion at 126. A two-time NCAA finalist, He helped ASU to a second-place finish at the 1990 NAAs as well as three Pac-10 titles (1990, 1991, 1993). He collected 103 victories in his collegiate career, ranking him tied for 19th on the program's all-time wins list at Arizona State. He also ranks 19th in career dual-match victories after he posted a 44-15-5 record in those matches.



### MIKE DAVIES

**INDUCTED: 2003 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1984-88**

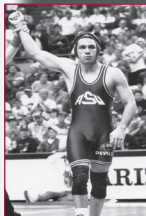
Davies was instrumental in helping ASU become the first western school to win the NCAA team title in wrestling as he captained the team to the crown in 1988, the same year he finished as the national runner-up. A two-time All-American, Davies compiled a 136-32-3 overall record with the Sun Devils to claim the third-most wins in program history. Davies also was a three-time Pac-10 champion at 190 pounds.



### ZEKE JONES

**INDUCTED: 2004 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1987-90**

Jones, who's 134-21-3 record ranks fourth in wins at ASU, was a member of the 1988 NCAA Championship team while also earning three All-America honors and three Pac-10 titles. A national runner-up at 118, Jones later went on to international success as he took the silver medal at the 1992 Barcelona Games. Jones, a 1991 World Champion, also is a Distinguished Member of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.



### RAY MILLER

**INDUCTED: 2006 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1990-93**

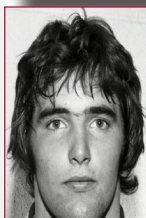
Miller compiled 115 victories in a career that came to a close with the 1993 NCAA Championship at 167 pounds. One of the first two wrestlers in Sun Devil history to earn four All-America honors in a career, Miller also was a national runner-up in 1992. A three-time Pac-10 Champion, Miller was twice honored as the Pac-10 Wrestler of the Year and was a member of three Pac-10 Championship squads.



### ROYE OLIVER

**INDUCTED: 1981 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1975-79**

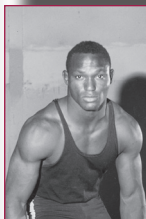
Oliver posted an 81-21-1 overall record during his time in Tempe while earning the distinction of being the program's first three-time All-American. A two-time Western Athletic Conference champion, Oliver twice finished fifth in the nation at 150 pounds before taking eighth at 158 pounds. He also competed in the national all-star meet, winning his bout over Mark Churella of Michigan while also taking the East-West Classic crown.



### DAN SEVERN

**INDUCTED: 1984 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1977-80**

Severn compiled a career record of 127-11-1 in Tempe, the fifth-most wins in the history of the program, while also accumulating a school-record 73 wins by fall in his career. A two-time All-American, Severn is one of only two Sun Devils to win conference titles in both the WAC (one) and Pac-10 (two). Later on, Severn earned the nickname "the Beast" as a champion in the UFC of which he was inducted into its hall of fame as well.



### CHARLIE TRIBBLE

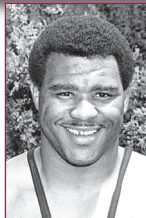
**INDUCTED: 1993 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1965**

Despite competing for the Sun Devils for only one season, Tribble made it successful as he set a program record for highest win percentage (50 wins or less) at .917 and a 32-2-2 record. During the 1965 season, Tribble was a WAC champion at 177 pounds before finishing third at the NCAA Championships to earn All-America honors. At the NCAA meet, Tribble earned the Gorrarian Award (most falls in least time).



### BOBBY DOUGLAS (COACH) • INDUCTED: 1999 • COACHED AT ASU: 1975-92

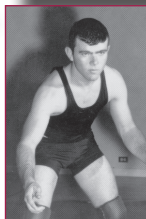
Douglas coached the program for 18 years and established it as the premier wrestling team in the West. His 1988 squad still stands as the only western program to capture the NCAA team title. Douglas coached ASU to nine Pac-10 Championships while his teams finished in the Top 3 of the conference standings in 17 of the 18 tournaments he coached. A career 226-76-6 dual record, Douglas' wrestlers earned 11 individual WAC titles and 53 Pac-10 crowns while also accumulating 59 total All-America honors and three individual NCAA titles. For his efforts on the conference level, Douglas was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year on eight occasions. Douglas, who retired from collegiate coaching at Iowa State following the 2005-06 season, also has served as an Olympic coach for the U.S. five times. He not only has a place in the ASU Sports Hall of Fame, but also a place in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. Douglas gained entry into the Distinguish Member Hall of Fame for his brilliant competitive and coaching career. On his plaque of enshrinement, it lists Douglas as "the first black American to wrestle in the Olympics, the first to captain our Olympic team, and the first to coach wrestling at a major university. He showed, by example, that others could reach such goals."



### CURLEY CULP

**INDUCTED: 1975 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1964-68**

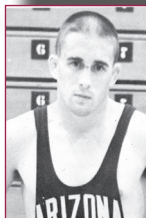
Culp compiled a career record of 84-11-1 with the Sun Devils and was the program's first national champion as he claimed the heavyweight crown at the 1967 NCAA Championships. A four-time Western Athletic Conference (WAC) champion, Culp also was a member of the ASU football program where he earned All-America honors as well. Culp later went on to a stellar career in the NFL where he was an all-pro player.



### BUZZ HAYES

**INDUCTED: 1995 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1962-65**

One of the first All-Americans in the history of the program, Hayes was the first Sun Devil to record 100 or more wins in a career, finishing with a record of 102-11-1. A three-time WAC champion at 147 pounds, Hayes was the first individual from ASU to win a conference championship while also helping the team to its first crown (1965). Hayes still holds the consecutive wins mark at ASU with 41 victories in a row (1963-64).



### GLENN McMINN, SR.

**INDUCTED: 1986 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1964-68**

McMinn Sr., helped put the Sun Devil wrestling program on the mat as he was the first All-American at ASU by placing second in the nation at 115 pounds in 1965. Two years later, McMinn Sr., placed third in the nation to become the first multiple All-American honoree in the history of the program. A two-time Western Athletic Conference champion, McMinn Sr., concluded his career with a 104-11-1 overall record.



### MARKUS MOLLIKA

**INDUCTED: 2008 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1993-96**

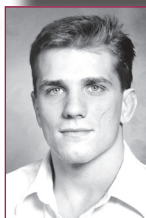
Mollica was a two-time NCAA Champion (158, 1993 & 167, 1995). One of the most decorated wrestlers in school history, his first title came in his freshman season, making him the first ASU freshman in any sport to capture a national title. Mollica was a four-time Pac-10 Champion, including two at 158 pounds and two at 167 pounds, while also garnering All-America honors four times. At the NCAA Championships, Mollica placed first, fifth, first and fourth, respectively.



### BILLY ROSADO

**INDUCTED: 1987 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1976-78**

With a career record of 37-8-0, Rosado ranks sixth on the career win percentage list (50 or less wins) at .822 having competed for only two seasons. An All-American by finishing fifth at 118 pounds at the 1977 NCAA tournament, Rosado was a member of the 1976 WAC championship team before making the United State's Olympic Freestyle Teams in 1976 (did not place) and 1980 (did not compete due to US boycott).



### DAN ST. JOHN

**INDUCTED: 2001 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1986-90**

Arizona State's all-time wins leader with a 147-17-3 record, St. John was the program's first two-time NCAA champion, winning crowns in 1989 (158 pounds) and 1990 (167 pounds). A three-time Pac-10 champion, St. John was a member of four Pac-10 championship teams while also competing for the 1988 NCAA Championship team. St. John also holds program records for wins in a season (45) and career dual wins (71).



### EDDIE URBANO

**INDUCTED: 1999 • COMPETED AT ASU: 1982-85**

Urbano started a stream of talented wrestlers making their way to ASU from Tucson as he posted a career record of 105-17-1 with the Sun Devils. A two-time Pac-10 champion, Urbano earned All-America honors in 1985 when he captured the 150 pound national title. At the time, Urbano's NCAA championship was just the second in the history of the program. As a senior, he helped ASU win the Pac-10 team title.

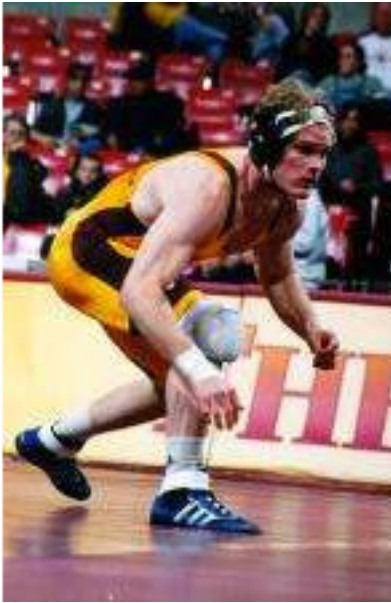

# ASU ADMINISTRATION

## DR. MICHAEL CROW UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Michael M. Crow became the 16th president of Arizona State University on July 1, 2002. He is guiding the transformation of ASU into one of the nation's leading public metropolitan research universities, one that is directly engaged in the economic, social, and cultural vitality of its region.

Under his direction the university pursues teaching, research, and creative excellence focused on the major challenges and questions of our time, as well as those central to the building of a sustainable environment and economy for Arizona. He has committed the university to global engagement, community engagement and to setting a new standard for public service.

Since he took office, ASU has marked a number of important milestones, including the establishment of major interdisciplinary research initiatives such as the Biodesign Institute; the Global Institute for Sustainability; and MacroTechnology Works, a program integrating science and technology for large-scale applications, including the Flexible Display Center, a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Army.

Under his direction ASU has initiated a dramatic research infrastructure expansion to create more than one million square feet of new research space, and has announced naming gifts endowing the W. P. Carey School of Business, the Ira A. Fulton School of Engineering, the Mary Lou Fulton School of Education and the Virginia G. Piper Center for Creative Writing. The university has

also named the Sandra Day O'Connor School of Law.

In 2007, ASU established the nation's first School of Sustainability. The school, part of the Global Institute of Sustainability, addresses some of the most critical challenges of our time, with a specific focus on creating solutions for future generations.

Prior to joining ASU, he was executive vice provost of Columbia University, where he also was professor of science and technology policy in the School of International and Public Affairs. As chief strategist of Columbia's research enterprise, he led technology and innovation transfer operations, establishing Columbia Innovation Enterprises (now Science and Technology Ventures), the Strategic Initiative Program, and the Columbia Digital Media Initiative, as well as advancing interdisciplinary program development.

He helped found the Center for Science, Policy, and Outcomes (CSPO) in Washington, D.C., a think tank dedicated to linking science and technology to optimal social, economic, and environmental outcomes.

In 2003 CSPO was reestablished at ASU as the Consortium for Science, Policy, and Outcomes. A fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration, he is the author of books and articles relating to the analysis of research organizations, technology transfer, science and technology policy, and the theory and practice of public policy.

## LISA LOVE VICE PRESIDENT OF UNIVERSITY ATHLETICS



Lisa Love was named Arizona State's Vice President for University Athletics on April 23, 2005.

At ASU, Love serves as the senior administrative officer of the university's athletic program, which features 12 women's and nine men's sports, including men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, swimming and diving, women's tennis, track/field and cross country; women's gymnastics, soccer, softball, volleyball, and water polo; baseball, wrestling and football.

On the strength of three national championships and eight total Top 10 national finishes this year, the ASU athletics department finished fourth in the 2007-08 U.S. Sports Academy Director's Cup standings, a national ranking of all Division IA institutions.

Love is responsible for the management and development of one of the finest and most comprehensive athletic physical plants in the nation at ASU, playing host to nearly 1 million patrons each year. ASU's athletic staff includes more than 150 full and part-time coaches and administrative and support personnel who provide services to about 500 student-athletes.

Love chaired the Pac-10 Conference's Athletic Director's Revenue Sharing Committee in 2006-07 and actively participates in both Teach for America and Read for America, which requires teaching and reading to seventh and eighth-graders at C.J. Jorgensen School and Copper King Elementary School.

In the short time she has presided over the affairs of ASU Athletics, Love has already established herself as one of the rising administrators in the country. Love's ability to lead was evident right from the start. She had been on the job a little more than two months (officially began July 1, 2005) when ASU had to move its scheduled football game with LSU from Baton Rouge, La., to Tempe – in less than a week's time – because of the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina in the state of Louisiana. In the end, \$1 million was raised through ticket sales from the game to assist with the Hurricane relief effort.

One of only six female athletic directors out of 119 at Division I Schools with football, Love has taken important steps since her appointment to ensure that ASU remains one of the premier athletic programs in the country. She has extended the contracts of head women's basketball coach Charli Turner Thorne (two Pac-10 Championships, five NCAA Tournament appearances and an Elite Eight appearance in 2007); head baseball coach Pat Murphy (five top 12 finishes in the last 11 years and two College World Series appearances); head women's tennis coach Sheila McInerney and women's golf coach Melissa Luellen.

In addition, Love was praised around the country for the hiring of veteran football coach Dennis Erickson, the 11th-winningest active coach in the nation and two-time national champion who helped ASU fashion a 10-3 record and a Pac-10 co-championship in 2007. In addition, she hired North Carolina State's Herb Sendek (12 postseason appearances in 14 seasons as a head coach), who guided the ASU men's basketball program to its first 20-win season in five years in 2007-08. She also hired Kevin Boyd to coach the women's soccer program after leading California to eight NCAA appearances in 10 seasons and volleyball coach Jason Watson, who led BYU to the Elite Eight in 2007.

"In three short years, Lisa Love has made an impact that places her along side the great collegiate athletics leaders of our nation," Arizona State President Michael Crow said. "She has set the bar high, both for athletic and academic performance. She has demonstrated strategic skill in hiring, retaining and developing an exceptional athletic staff. Her vision and personal leadership skills are laying a foundation for sustained success."

Love came to ASU from the University of Southern California where she had been since 1989 as head women's volleyball coach (1989-98) and administrator (1991-2005). After leaving the coaching ranks following the 1998 season, Love devoted herself to administration full-time eventually ascending to the position of Senior Associate Athletic Director in 2002.

At USC Love handled the day-to-day supervision of eight sports and monitored all women's sports at the university. She was active in the athletic department's strategic planning, gender equity, civil rights and NCAA certification issues and she served on the NCAA Management Council. She also served two stints (1992 - 1993 and 2001 - 2002) as vice president of the Pacific-10 Conference.

As a coach, Love was a master teacher at the pinnacle of her profession. She compiled an impressive 404-171 as a college head coach for 17 seasons at Texas Arlington (199-78 from 1982-88) and USC (205-93 from 1989-98). At USC, she led the Trojans to nine NCAA tournament berths and eight finishes in the national Top 15. She was selected as the Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year in 1997. She was national Coach of the Year in 1988 when Arlington went 30-4 and fell one win shy of the Final Four.

Love served as president of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) from 1997-98 and as the chair of the NCAA Division I Volleyball Committee. She worked on the AVCA All-America committee from 1987-89 and was a legislative representative to the AVCA Board from 1992-94. In 2005,
