

AT ASU

Will continue to provide ASU with a strong rebounding, scoring and defensive presence on the inside... Transferred to Arizona State from the University of Tennessee in April 2006... After sitting out the 2006-07 season due to NCAA transfer rules, came in and had an immediate impact last season leading the team in rebounding and field goal percentage... Is an Arizona native, who had a stellar career for Salpointe Catholic in Tucson.

2007-08

- 2008 Pac-10 Defensive Honorable Mention.
- 2008 Pac-10 All-Academic Honorable Mention
- Finished the season as ASU's leader in rebounding (6.4rpg, 10th in the Pac-10) and field goal percentage (.540, third in the Pac-10).
- Scored in double figures 12 times.
- Led or tied for the team lead in rebounds 18 times, including 10 times in ASU's last 14 games of the season.
- In Pac-10 games, paced ASU in rebounding (6.8 rpg) and was third in scoring (8.8 ppg).
- Finished the season with 40 blocks (1.21 blocks per game, fifth in the Pac-10), the fourth-highest total in school history.
- Was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week after averaging 17.0 points and 10.5 rebounds while shooting 57.9 percent in ASU's come-from-behind victories over UCLA (Dec. 28) and USC (Dec. 30).
- Recorded her fourth double-figure rebounding game (11) of the season to go along with nine points and a career-best four blocked shots in win vs. Oregon (Feb. 2).
- Notched her fourth double-double of the season after finishing with 17 points and 10 rebounds in Pac-10 quarterfinal win over Washington (Mar. 8).

2005-06 (UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE)

- Played in 35 games and led the team in field goal percentage (61.5) for the second consecutive season.
- Scored a career-high 12 points against Army in the first round of the NCAA Tournament (Mar. 19).

- Tied a then-career-high in field goals made against Mississippi State (Jan. 15), connecting on four of her five attempts in just 11 minutes of action
- Named the Philips Player of the Game at Temple (Dec. 28) after a nine-point, sixrebound performance against the Owls.
- Came off the bench for a season-high 28 minutes and scored eight points, grabbed nine boards and recorded a career-high two steals against Princeton (Dec. 20).
- Came off the bench for eight points and tied a career-high in rebounds (11) in just 16 minutes of action against UT- Chattanooga (Nov. 21).

2004-05 SEASON (UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE)

- Led the team in field goal percentage, connecting on 56.5 percent of her shot attempts.
- Played in 27 games for the Lady Vols who advanced to the Final Four where they lost to Michigan State in the national semifinal.
 - Registered a career-high three blocks to go along with seven rebounds and four points in the NCAA Tournament opening-round win versus Western Carolina (Mar. 20).
 - Equaled a career high with 11 rebounds in win over Kentucky (Jan. 23).
 - Earned Player of the Game honors following her performance in the team's comeback win over DePaul (Dec. 12). Came off the bench to record her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds in only 14 minutes of action.



Bright, hard-working player who proved to be a difference maker during the Sun Devils' run to the Elite Eight in 2007... Has great skill, athleticism and versatility... Outstanding shooter made 51 percent (80-157) of her career field goal attempts, including 64 percent (7-11) in eight career NCAA Tournament games.

2007-08

- A member of the 2008 Pac-10All-Academic FirstTeam, Engelbrecht earned the team's Academic Award for the third consecutive year.
- Was selected by the ASU Kinesiology Department as the recipient of the Rudy L Lavik Memorial Award for the Outstanding Junior in Kinesiology for 2008.
- Fractured her left hand on the first official day of practice in October and as a result missed ASU's first two games and played with a splint on the hand for her first five games back.
- Connected on 53 percent of her field goal attempts (10-19) during one seven-game stretch.
- Scored a season-best eight points in win over Fresno State (Dec. 17).
- Scored four points and grabbed a career-best seven rebounds in win at Washington State (Jan. 26).
- Made all three of her field goal attempts (seven points), dished out two assists and had three steals in win vs. Arizona (Feb. 8).

2006-07

- Was one of three Sun Devils Aubree Johnson and Kirsten Thompson who shot higher than 50 percent (55.7).
- Continued to be a steady ball handler, tallying 46 assists to only 19 turnovers.
- Earned Pac-10 Second-Team All-Academic honors.
- Connected on 60 percent of her shots in the Pac-10 and NCAA Tournaments (seven games).
- Scored seven points (3-4 FGs), grabbed four rebounds and had two steals while logging a career-high 27 minutes in ASU's 67-49 Sweet Sixteen win over Bowling Green (Mar. 24).
- Recorded career bests in points (11), field goals (5) and steals (3) in ASU's 75-64 win at Washington (Feb. 1).
