UP NEXT

The Arizona State women's basketball team begins play in the 2010 Women's National Invitation Tournament this Wednesday (6:30 p.m. PT) at Wells Fargo Arena when it hosts New Mexico State in a first-round game.

The Sun Devils (17-13, 9-9 Pac-10) are making their 11th consecutive postseason appearance, which includes a recent streak of five consecutive NCAA Tournament bids. Twice during that streak the Sun Devils played for a chance to go to the NCAA Women's Final Four, most recently last season when it fell to current reigning champion Connecticut in the Trenton Region final.

Despite the loss of six seniors from last year's team, including WNBA first-round pick Briann January, and being without their leading scorer from 2008-09 (Dymond Simon), the Sun Devils still found themselves in contention for an NCAA berth during the season's stretch run. However an injury to starting point guard Tenaya Watson began a difficult eight-game stretch to close the season in which the Sun Devils went 3-5. Three of ASU's losses during that stretch were by four or fewer points, including a 63-59 setback at UCLA (a 2010 NCAA Tournament participant).

New Mexico State (18-13, 8-8 WAC) is coming off a fifth-place finish in the Western Athletic Conference. The Aggies are led by senior guard Crystal Boyd, who earned second-team All-WAC honors after leading the team in points per game (15.5), rebounds per game (7.7), steals per game (2.3) and blocks per game (1.6).

The winner of Wednesday's game will face either BYU or Pepperdine in the second round (date and site to be determined).

RADIO

Wednesday's game can be heard live on The Fan AM 1060. Pre-game coverage will begin at 6 p.m. Veteran broadcaster Jeff Munn is in his sixth season as the voice of ASU women's basketball. He will be joined on the broadcast by former Arizona State women's basketball coach Maura McHugh.



Arizona State Head Coach Charli Turner Thorne



- The winningest coach in Sun Devil history (268-167) and No. 4 in the Pac-10 in most career wins (308), Charli Turner Thorne has led the Arizona State women's basketball team to the NCAA Tournament seven times in the last nine years, including the last five seasons in a row. The seven NCAA appearances are four more than what ASU had in the 15 years prior to Turner Thorne's arrival in Tempe.
- In 2009 Turner Thorne guided the Sun Devils to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three seasons.
- With 26 wins in 2008-09, Turner Thorne joined former Washington head coach Chris Gobrecht and current Stanford head coach Tara VanDerveer as the only other coaches in Pac-10 history (since the 1986-87 season) to have led their respective schools to five (or more) consecutive 20-win seasons.
- In 2006-07 Turner Thorne guided the Sun Devils to a school record 31 wins, including a school record 16 Pac-10 wins, and led them to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The Sun Devils concluded the 2006-07 season ranked No. 8 in the final USA Today/ESPN coaches poll and No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll, their highest FINAL rankings in each of the respective polls in school history.
- In 2005-06 Turner Thorne guided ASU to a 25-7 record and also led the Sun Devils to their seventh consecutive postseason berth. During the second half of that season Turner Thorne led ASU on a school record 10-game winning streak after leading the Sun Devils to a school record-tying nine-game winning streak earlier in the season (also led ASU to its first Top 10 ranking in 22 years).
- In 2004-05 directed ASU to a 24-10 overall record and its first NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 22 years.
- Led her 2001-02 team to a 25-9 record, which at the time had tied the single-season school record for most wins.
- Guided ASU to a share of the Pac-10 title in 2001 and the inaugural Pac-10 Tournament title in 2002, the first league championships in school history.
- Led Northern Arizona University to consecutive winning seasons in 1994-95 and 1995-96, the first coach in school history to accomplish that feat.
- As a player, lettered four years at Stanford where she played under Tara VanDerveer.
- During the summer of 2009 Turner Thorne served as the head coach of the USA Women's World University Games Team which went undefeated (7-0) and captured the gold medal at the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia. It was Turner Thorne's second time working with USA Basketball. In the summer of 2007 Turner Thorne served as an assistant coach on USA Basketball's U21 World Championship Team which won the gold medal at the FIBA U21 World Championship in Moscow, Russia.
- Is currently vice president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) Executive Committee.
- Graduated from Stanford in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and later earned her master's degree in education from Washington in 1990.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ASU returns two starters forward Kayli Murphy and guard Danielle Orsillo from last year's active roster that went 26-9 and earned the program's second Elite Eight berth in the last three years. Of ASU's returning players, only seniors Kayli Murphy and Danielle Orsillo and junior Becca Tobin saw significant playing time last season.
- The Sun Devils are without last season's leading scorer Dymond Simon as she spends the season rehabbing from the knee injury she suffered in the 2009 regular-season finale at Stanford. Also missing for the 2009-10 season because of injury is junior guard Markisha Patterson, who transferred to ASU from Central Arizona where she was a teammate of guard Tenaya Watson, who also transferred to ASU.
- ASU is making its 11th consecutive postseason appearance. The Sun Devils began their current streak with their first WNIT appearance in 2000. ASU then made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament (2001-02) followed by back-to-back appearances in the WNIT (2003-04) before beginning a streak of five consecutive NCAA Tournament berths, the longest such streak in school history.
- The Sun Devils will be appearing in the WNIT for the fourth time. Their best finish came in 2003 when they made it to the second round after first-round exits in 2000 and 2004.
- Despite finishing in fifth place in the Pac-10 this season, ASU has still won 76 percent (68-22) of its Pac-10 contests since the 2005-06 season.
- This will be the ninth all-time meeting between the Sun Devils and Aggies. The Aggies have been victorious in five of the previous eight contests, however Wednesday's meeting will be the first between the two school since 1997.
- On Wednesday the Sun Devils will be at home where they are 76-14 (.843) since the 2004-05 season, including a 32-4 record (.889) against non-conference teams.
- Currently ASU's leading scorer averaging 14.2 points per game, senior G Danielle Orsillo has scored in double figures in all but five contests this season. Last month Orsillo set a new career best in scoring in back-to-back contests as she scored 26 points at Oregon State (Feb. 11) only to surpass that mark with 29 at Oregon (Feb. 13). Her final scoring tally at Oregon represented the most points by a Sun Devil since G Kylan Loney scored 32 against Arizona in 2004.
- Orsillo currently ranks No. 6 in program history with 1,358 points. She needs 6 points to pass Kristen Kovesdy (2003-06) for 5th place, 13 points to pass Sherry Poole (1984-87) for 4th place and 17 points to pass Molly Tuter (1994-97) for 3rd place.
- ASU's 126 blocks this season are the second-highest number in school history.
 The Sun Devils would need more blocks to break the single-season record for the fourth consecutive season.
- Currently 5th place on ASU's all-time career list with 76 blocks, junior Becca Tobin needs four more rejections to pass Rachel Holt (1997-00) for 4th place.
- Tobin (30-32) and senior F Kayli Murphy (39-44) have combined to make 69 of their last 76 free throws (.918).

DEVILS BRING THE 'D'

If there is one thing ASU head coach Charli Turner Thorne's teams have become known for over the years it is defense. Earlier this season the Sun Devils set season bests for points allowed (37) and blocks (9) in their 74-37 win over Furman on Dec. 28

Last season six of ASU's nine Pac-10 opponents either scored their fewest points of the season against ASU or tied their lowest point total of the season. In Pac-10 play the Sun Devils led the league allowing only 53.0 points per game. In the last two years the Sun Devils have set single-game Pac-10 records for the fewest points ever allowed by a Pac-10 team (75-23 win over UC Irvine on Dec. 6, 2008) and the fewest points allowed in a Pac-10 game (59-30 win over Washington State on Feb. 21, 2008).

Since the 2005-06 season the Sun Devils have held the opposition to 50 or fewer points 38 times (7x this season).

ORSILLO, TOBIN AND MURPHY EARN PAC-10 RECOGNITION

Three Arizona State women's basketball players were recognized by the Pac-10 on Mar. 10 as the conference announced its annual awards for the 2009-10 season as voted on by the league's head coaches.

One day after being named to the media's 15-member All-Pac-10 Team, senior guard Danielle Orsillo earned the same honor from the coaches as well. Also earning recognition were junior forward Becca Tobin, who was named All-Pac-10 honorable mention and senior forward Kayli Murphy, who earned honorable mention notice on the Pac-10's All-Defensive Team.

A starter in ASU's last 54 games, Orsillo has scored in double figures 36 times in her last 44 contests going back to last season. Currently 10th in the Pac-10 in scoring, averaging 14.5 points per game, Orsillo leads the Sun Devils in scoring, 3-point field goals (25) and steals per game (1.8) and is second in assists per game (2.4) and free throw percentage (.828). Currently in sixth place on ASU's all-time scoring list with 1,351 points, Orsillo has scored 20 or more points four times this season, including a career-high 29 points at Oregon on Feb. 13.

Tobin has started 27 of 29 games for the Sun Devils in 2009-10 and concluded the regular season fourth in the Pac-10 in blocks per game (1.3), fifth in field goal percentage (.505) and 12th in rebounds per game (6.3). The team leader in free throw percentage (.839), Tobin has led or tied for the team lead in rebounding 13 times this season and has scored in double figures 14 times, including a career-high 20 points at Oregon on Feb. 13.

The leader among ASU's post players with 33 steals, Murphy has played a big part in the Sun Devils' success on both sides of the floor this season. A starter in all 29 games, Murphy finished the regular season second on the team in rebounds per game (5.9), field goal percentage (.510) and minutes per game (27.2 mpg) and fourth in points per game (7.4). Defensively, Murphy's contributions helped the Sun Devils finish third in the Pac-10 in scoring defense (59.7 ppg).

CHARLI TURNER THORNE WINS HER 300TH

In addition to giving ASU its first Pac-10 win of the season, ASU's 64-59 win over Washington State on Jan. 9 also represented the 300th career win for Sun Devil head coach Charli Turner Thorne. Now in her 14th season at ASU, Turner Thorne has collected the majority of her 308 wins in Tempe, where she is 268-167. Prior to arriving at ASU, Turner Thorne was 40-40 in three seasons at Northern Arizona.

While 300 wins is impressive on its own merit, a closer look at Turner Thorne's coaching career makes her success look even more remarkable. At NAU, she took over a program that had posted only one winning season in 19 years. She would go on to become the first coach in program history to lead the Lumberjacks to back-to-back winning seasons.

In 1996 Turner Thorne accepted the top position at ASU where she took on the challenge of coaching a squad that had not won more than eight games in three years. Fast forward to the present day and Turner Thorne is the winningest coach in ASU women's basketball history. Along the way she has led the Sun Devils to seven NCAA Tournament appearances (all in the last nine years), including the only two Elite Eight appearances in school history (both coming in the last three years).

ALWAYS FEELING AT HOME

Since 2004 the Sun Devils have won 84.4 percent (76-14) of the games they have played at Wells Fargo Arena. In addition, under Turner Thorne ASU has also proven to be nearly as effective when it is playing away from home. Since the 2006-07 season the Sun Devils have won nearly 70 percent of their games when they were the visiting team or made a trip to a neutral site.

ADRIANNE THOMAS SIGNS WITH ASU

Charli Turner Thorne announced on November 11 that Adrianne Thomas signed a national letter of intent to study and play basketball at Arizona State.

"I could not be more excited about the addition of Adrianne Thomas," Turner Thorne said. "She is a powerful, explosive scoring combo guard who will fit in perfectly with our up-tempo offense and aggressive pressuring defense.

"Adrianne is an extremely tough and smart competitor who has had outstanding coaching through her high school and club programs. I predict she will adapt to the college game very quickly. Besides being one of the top guards in the country, Adrianne comes from an amazing family who has instilled in her great core values including impeccable character and strong leadership. She will be a great Sun Devil."

A 5-9 guard, Thomas will be coming to ASU from Summit High School in Fontana, Calif., where she has earned Sunkist League MVP honors three times. In 2009 Thomas, who has scored in double figures 32 times the last two seasons, earned All-Sunkist League First-Team and All-CIF Southern Section First-Team recognition after leading her team to the state semifinals.

As a sophomore in 2008, Thomas helped Summit to its first CIF sectional championship game and the state quarterfinals. With her FBC club team she was named to the All-Tournament Teams of the adidas Womanhood National Championships, Summertime Invitational and adidas Super 64.

"Adrianne is a superstar on the court, off the court, in the classroom and in the community," said Summit girls basketball coach Alexis Barile. "On the court she's the type of player that won't allow our team to lose. In
