### UP NEXT

The Arizona State women's basketball team begins play in the 2012 Postseason WNIT on Friday (7 p.m. PT) when it travels to Stockton, Calif., to take on the University of Pacific.

The Sun Devils (20-11, 10-8 Pac-12) are making their 13th consecutive postseason appearance following a season in which they won at least 20 games for the seventh time in eight seasons.

ASU won nine of its 11 non-conference games with the two losses coming to 2012 NCAA Tournament teams Rutgers (No. 6 seed in Kingston Region) and DePaul (No. 7 seed in Des Moines Region). The Sun Devils won their first Pac-12 contest (defeated Arizona 60-45 on Dec. 31) before losing three straight games vs. USC, vs. UCLA and at Oregon State to fall into a tie for ninth place in the Pac-12. ASU then rebounded with five straight wins, including wins on the road at Oregon, at Washington and at Washington State, to climb all the way back into a tie for second place. Consecutive home losses to No. 4 Stanford and Cal and a loss on the road to Utah sent ASU back into a tie for fifth place. ASU then bounced back with three straight wins before road losses at UCLA and at USC.

The Sun Devils closed out the regular season by winning at Arizona and entered the Pac-12 Tournament as the No. 4 seed. As one of the top four finishers in conference play, ASU earned a first-round bye and met Arizona in the quarterfinals where it defeated the Wildcats 68-53. Looking to make a final push for NCAA Tournament consideration, the Sun Devils gave second-ranked Stanford one of its toughest games of the season in the Pac-12 semifinals, but came up short of the upset, falling to the Cardinal, 52-43. ASU held Stanford to several offensive lows for the season, including points (52), field goals (15), field goal percent (29.4), 3-point field goals (0), assists (7) and second half points (23).

Kali Bennett averaged 10.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks to lead the Sun Devils in their two Pac-12 Tournament contests. Kimberly Brandon (15 points, six rebounds, three assists), Bennett (10 points, five assists and four blocks) and Jada Blackwell (11 points, six rebounds, two steals) all scored in double figures against Arizona while Bennett (10 points, four steals) and Micaela Pickens (10 points, three steals) recorded double-digit scoring totals against Stanford.

The Sun Devils held Arizona and Stanford to a combined shooting percentage of 29.5 percent in the two games, including 22.7 percent from 3-point range.

Pacific (17-13, 9-7) finished tied for third in the Big West. The Tigers advanced to the semifinals of the Big West Tournament, where they were defeated by eventual tournament champion UC Santa Barbara.

The winner of Friday's game, which will be only the second all-time meeting between ASU and Pacific (ASU won 90-65 in 1982), will play either CS Northridge (17-13) or San Diego (22-8) in the second round.

### ON THE AIR

Friday's game at Pacific can be heard live on The Fan AM 1060. Pre-game coverage will begin at 6:30 p.m. in the Valley. Veteran broadcaster and the state of Arizona's 2010 Broadcaster of the Year Jeff Munn is in his eighth season as the voice of ASU women's basketball.

### Arizona State Interim Head Coach Joseph Anders



- Entering his 11th season at Arizona State (1st season as interim head coach).
- Was named ASU's interim head coach on May 2, 2011 after Charli Turner Thorne announced she was taking a nine-month leave of absence from the program.
- Has played a big role in helping to lead the Sun Devils to seven NCAA appearances during his time at ASU while maintaining the program's current run of 12 consecutive postseason appearances.
- Previously served as the head coach of the Sacramento State men's program for six seasons (75-86 record), guiding the program to the Division I ranks in 1991-92. Anders was originally named Sacramento State's interim head coach in December of 1986 after serving one season as an assistant. He earned Northern California Coach of the Year accolades, was nominated for regional coach-of-the-year honors and was promoted to head coach on a permanent basis the following year. In his first full season as head coach, Anders guided the Hornets to one of the best seasons in school history, posting a 22-6 record, advancing to the 1988 NCAA Division II Tournament and finishing the season ranked eighth in the nation.
- In November, 2011, Anders' 1987-88 Sacramento State squad was honored by the Sacramento State Basketball Hall of Fame.
- First coaching position was working as a student assistant at his alma mater, Arkansas-Monticello (1981).
- Moved to Wilmar (Ark.) High School (1981-84) where he was hired as a full-time teacher and became athletics director and head coach of both

the boys' and girls' basketball teams and track and field teams.

- Helped guide the Wilmar boys' team to the 1982 state title and led the girls to a runner-up finish at the 1984 state tournament.
- First collegiate assistant job came at the University of Arkansas (1984-85) where he was an assistant coach for the women's team.
- After serving as assistant coach/head coach at Sacramento State (1985-92), accepted a position on the men's team at Northern Arizona (1992-94).
- Would also serve as an assistant for the women's programs at Mississippi State (1994-96), New Mexico State (1996-2000) and East Carolina (2000-01) before joining Turner Thorne's staff in 2001.
- Started college career as a walk-on at Southern Baptist College in Walnut Ridge, Ark., where he earned a scholarship after starting 22 of 30 games his freshman season. As a sophomore, he was named a team captain and earned all-conference honors.
- Transferred to the University of Arkansas-Monticello for his final two collegiate seasons where he was a two-time all-conference selection.
- Earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Arkansas-Monticello.

### WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- The Sun Devils (20-11, 10-8 Pac-12) are making their 13th consecutive postseason appearance (eight NCAA Tournaments and five WNITs) after winning 20 games for the seventh time in eight seasons.
- This will be the fifth time ASU has participated in the Postseason WNIT. ASU began its current streak of postseason appearances with its first WNIT appearance in 2000. The Sun Devils also qualified for the WNIT in 2003, 2004 and 2010 with their best finishes coming in 2003 and 2010 when they made it to the second round.
- ASU won its only prior meeting against Pacific (90-65 in 1982).
- As of Mar. 11, ASU is No. 11 in the nation in blocked shots per game (5.8 bpg) and FG pct. defense (.339) and No. 13 in scoring defense (52.5 ppg). ASU leads the Pac-12 in scoring defense (52.5 ppg), blocks (5.8 bpg) and steals (10.6 spg), is second in FG pct. defense (.341) and turnover margin (+2.1) and is third in 3-point FG defense (.277 assists (13.4 apg)).
- As of March 11, ASU was one of only six schools in the country (ASU, Baylor, UConn, Georgetown, Hampton and West Virginia) to be ranked in the top 15 in the nation in both scoring defense AND field goal percentage defense.
- Currently holding opponents to only 52.5 points per game, the Sun Devils have a chance to set the single-season Pac-12 record for fewest average points allowed per game. Stanford currently has the record (53.9 ppg), which it set in 2009-10.
- ASU has averaged only 11 turnovers in its last three contests.
- Kali Bennett (Pac-12 All-Defensive Team, Pac-12 honorable mention), Kimberly Brandon (Pac-12 honorable mention, Pac-12 defensive honorable mention) and Deja Mann (Pac-12 honorable mention, Pac-12 defensive honorable mention) were recognized by the Pac-12 earlier this month as the conference announced its annual awards for the 2011-12 season as voted on by the league's head coaches.
- Eleven of Bennett's 13 double-figure scoring efforts in 2011-12 have come in ASU's last 18 games. Bennett, who in ASU's win over Washington (Feb. 16) set the single-game school record for blocks (9), also owns the school's single-season record for blocks (87) - old record was 55 by Kym Hampton set in 1980-81.
- Currently with 181 blocks this season, ASU has already broken the school's single-season record for blocked shots (134) set by the 2008-09 squad. In ASU's win over Washington (Feb. 16), the Sun Devils also broke the single-game school record (and tied the Pac-12 record) for blocks (16). The 16 blocks were the most ever in a Pac-12 game (two conference teams going head to head).
- Redshirt junior F Janae Fulcher has led or tied for the team lead in scoring three times in ASU's last eight games: 16 points at Colorado (Feb. 11), 11 points vs. Washington State (Feb. 18), 16 points at UCLA (Feb. 23).
- Junior G Deja Mann has tallied double figures in scoring eight times this season, with six of those instances coming in ASU's last 14 games. Mann scored a career-best 22 points (most by a Sun Devil this season) in ASU's loss at USC (Feb. 25).
- The Sun Devils have allowed 20 or fewer points in a half 13 times this season. The nine points scored by Colorado (Jan. 19) were the fewest ever scored by the Buffaloes in a half and tied the second-fewest number of points ever allowed by ASU in a half.
- Ten of ASU's opponents have shot below 30 percent this season while only three opponents (DePaul, California and UCLA) have shot higher than 40 percent.
- ASU has held 14 of its 31 opponents to 50 or fewer points. Since 2005-06, ASU is 58-2 when it has held the opposition to 50 or fewer points.
- The Sun Devils have given up 60 or more points only six times this season (USC - 60, Stanford - 62, Arizona - 63, UCLA - 64, , California - 67, DePaul - 73, ).
- ASU's bench has outscored the opposition's bench in all but four games this season (vs. UTEP - Dec. 28, at Oregon - Jan. 14, vs. Washington - Feb. 16 and at USC - Feb. 25).

### DEVILS BRING THE 'D'

One of the hallmarks of ASU's formula for success over the years has been defense. It has been no different in 2011-12 as the Sun Devils have been consistently coming through with dominant performances throughout the season. How dominant? Thus far in 2011-12 the Sun Devils have held all but one opponent (UCLA) below their scoring average and have held all but four opponents (DePaul, UCLA - 2x, Cal and Arizona) below their field goal percentage for the season. Over the course of this season, the Sun Devils have held the opposition to an average of 13.5 points below its scoring average and 6.1 points below its shooting percentage.

Seven times this season ASU has held an opponent 20 or more points below its scoring average -- vs. Eastern Washington (-27.0), vs. UTEP (-24.6), vs. Arizona (-28.2), at Oregon (-28.9), vs. Colorado (-22.9), vs. Washington (-23.7) and vs. Stanford (-25.8).

Coming into the WNIT, the Sun Devils are ranked 11th in the nation in field goal percentage defense (33.9) and blocks per game (5.8) and 13th in scoring defense (52.5 ppg).

Eight of ASU's opponents have shot below 30 percent this season while only four opponents (DePaul, California, UCLA and Arizona) have shot higher than 40 percent. In addition, ASU has held 14 of its 31 opponents to 50 or fewer points and has given up 60 or more points only six times this season (DePaul - 73, USC - 60, UCLA - 64, Stanford - 62, California - 67, Arizona 63).

ASU currently has the No. 2 shot blocker in the Pac-12 -- Kali Bennett (2nd, 2.8 bpg - 13th in the nation) and two players who are ranked among the top 15 in the conference in steals per game -- Micaela Pickens (11th, 1.9 spg) and Kimberly Brandon (14th, 1.6 spg).

Earlier this month, Bennett (All-Defensive - media and coaches), Brandon (honorable mention - coaches) and Deja Mann (honorable mention - coaches) -- were named to the Pac-12's Defensive Team. ASU's three defensive honorees among the coaches' selections tied Stanford for the most in the Pac-12.

### BRANDON'S PLAY INSTRUMENTAL IN ASU'S SUCCESS

One of the biggest reasons for ASU's success last season was the emergence of Kimberly Brandon, who earned Pac-10 honorable mention recognition in 2011.

After the first month of the 2010-11 season, the decision was made to move Brandon inside after the Chatsworth, Calif., product spent the first five games of the season out on the wing. After the move Brandon's production improved dramatically as she went from averaging 5.6 ppg and 4.2 rpg in the first five games to 12.0 ppg and 9.4 rpg during ASU's ensuing seven-game winning streak. Brandon, who averaged 11.3 points and 6.7 rebounds in Pac-10 play, went on to record five double-doubles last season.

Brandon, who missed her first game of the season (illness) in ASU's 53-38 loss at UCLA (Feb. 23), currently leads ASU in scoring (9.7 ppg) and is second in rebounding (6.4 rpg) and steals (1.7 spg). Earlier this season she earned ASU Classic MVP honors after averaging 14.0 points (13-22 FGs) and 7.0 rebounds in ASU's wins over Eastern Washington and Illinois State (Dec. 2-3). She came within one rebound of a double-double (12 points, 9 rebounds) in the win over EWU (Dec. 2) and scored a game-high 16 points (8-10 FGs) vs. ISU.

Brandon got her first double-double of 2011-12 as she dropped in 15 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in ASU's 47-45 win over UTEP (Dec. 28). She also collected a career-high six steals, the most by a Sun Devil this season. She had her second double-double of 2011-12 (14 points, 13 rebounds) in ASU's 53-49 win at Oregon (Jan. 14) and her third (17 points, 11 rebounds) in ASU's win at Washington State (Jan. 26).

Brandon has scored in double figures 14 times this season. Her 20 points (7-10 FGs) against Colorado (Jan. 19) are the second-most most scored by a Sun Devil in 2011-12. Brandon has also registered double-digits in rebounds six times. She averaged 15.8 points (+4.6 above her season average), 7.8 rebounds and 3.0 steals while shooting 54 percent (28-52) during ASU's earlier five-game winning streak. She was 5-9 (.556) from 3-point range and 18-22 (.818) from the free throw line during that stretch.

#### **Kimberly Brandon's Double-Doubles**

Senior F Kimberly Brandon has recorded eight career double-doubles (5 in 2010-11 and 3 in 2011-12). The Sun Devils have been victorious in each of those games.

**Dec. 3, 2010 vs. Cal Poly** - 15 points (7-9 FGs) and a career-best 16 rebounds - ASU wins 69-58

**Dec. 31, 2010 vs. Oregon State** - 19 points (8-13 FGs) and 11 rebounds and ASU wins 49-46

**Jan. 2, 2011 vs. Oregon** - 19 points (9-13 FGs) and 12 rebounds and ASU wins 86-67

**Jan. 16, 2011 vs. Arizona** - 13 points (6-10 FGs) and 10 rebounds and ASU wins 75-43

**Feb. 19, 2011 at Washington State** - Career-high 21 points and 10 rebounds. Scored 15 of her 21 points in the second half in ASU's come-from-behind 55-47 win.

**Dec. 28, 2011 vs. UTEP** - Scored a game-high 15 points (7-12 FGs), grabbed 10 rebounds to go along with a career-best six steals in 47-45 win. Was 4-5 FGs in the 2nd half.

**Jan. 14, 2012 at Oregon** - Had game highs in points (14) and rebounds (13) and was 5-6 from the line.

**Jan. 26, 2012 at Washington State** - Had game highs in points (17) and rebounds (11) and was 7-12 from the floor.

### BENNETT BRINGS IT

Another player who has played a key role in ASU's success thus far in 2011-12 is senior Kali Bennett. Now in her third season as a Sun Devil (transferred to ASU from the University of Washington in 2008), Bennett has become one of ASU's go-to players on both ends of the floor as she currently leads the Sun Devils in blocks (2.8 bpg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg), is second in scoring (8.4 ppg) and assists (2.3 apg) and is third in steals (1.5 spg).

Bennett, who earlier this season was named to the All-Tournament Teams of both the San Juan Shootout and ASU Classic, had a five-game stretch in December in which she led ASU in scoring (9.2 ppg) and rebounding (8.2 rpg). She also averaged 2.0 blocks and 1.8 steals during that span while connecting on 50 percent of her field goal attempts (20-40).

Bennett has had three or more blocks 14 times this season, including a career-high and school record nine rejections in ASU's win vs. Washington (Feb. 16). In addition, she has had seven or more rebounds 12 times this season, including 10 or more on four occasions. Bennett, who has scored in double figures 11 times in ASU's last 18 games, has posted two double-doubles this season. In ASU's win against Utah (Jan. 21), Bennett came within one rebound and three blocks of a triple-double (12 points, 9 rebounds and 7 blocks). Against Washington (Feb. 16), Bennett again flirted with a triple double (10 points, 9 rebounds and 9 blocks).

Bennett now owns the school's single-season record for blocked shots (87 - old record was 55 by Kym Hampton set in 1980-81 season).

### MANN'S STEADY PLAY LEADS THE SUN DEVILS

A starter in ASU's last 46 games going back to last season, Deja Mann took over the duties as the team's primary point guard this season and her steady play and leadership (Mann is the team's captain) have played a central role in ASU's success this season.

Mann currently leads ASU in assists (3.5 apg), free throw percentage (.803) and free throws made (53). She has recorded five or more assists 10 times this season, including a career-best 7 on two occasions - vs. Eastern Washington (Dec. 2) and vs. Colorado (Jan. 19). Mann has tallied double figures in scoring eight times this season, with six of those instances coming in ASU's last 14 games. Against Utah (Jan. 21) Mann scored a game-high 17 points. The following week at Washington (Jan. 28), she scored seven of her 12 points in the final 4:30 to help the Sun Devils leave Seattle with a 57-53 win. Against No. 4 Stanford (Feb. 2), Mann led the Sun Devils with 11 points. Three weeks later at USC (Feb. 25), Mann scored a career-high 22 points (most by a Sun Devil this season) in ASU's loss to the Trojans.

Mann, who has played in every ASU game since 2009-10 (94 games) is shooting 81 percent from the line (85-105) going back to the start of the 2010-11 season.

### NEW FACES

The Sun Devils have four new additions to their roster in 2010-11 -- freshman guards Promise Amukamara and Eliza Normen, freshman post Jada Blackwell and junior guard Micaela Pickens.

A local product who attended Glendale Apollo High School, Amukamara was named the state of Arizona's Gatorade girls' basketball player of the year in 2011 following a season in which she helped lead Apollo to the 4A-1 state title. Amukamara averaged 21.7 points, 10.8 rebounds, 6.8 assists and 5.3 steals per game her senior year as she would go on to earn Arizona Basketball Coaches Association 4A-I Player of the Year and the Big School Player of the Year honors. Amukamara, whose brother Prince was a 2011 first round draft choice (cornerback out of Nebraska) by the Super Bowl XLVI champion New York Giants, competed for the Nigerian National Team this past summer at the 2011 FIBA U19 World Championship.

Amukamara, who currently leads the team in field goal percentage (.443), has consistently provided the Sun Devils with a big lift off the bench. Her speed and quickness have enabled her to make plays on both ends of the floor. Nearly half (24) of her 52 rebounds have been on the offensive end.

Normen earned McDonald's All-America honors following an outstanding career at Monarch High School in Louisville (pronounced Lewisville), Colo. As a junior, Normen averaged 13.9 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.8 assists, 1.8 steals and 1.2 blocks per game as she helped lead her squad to a 22-5 record and an appearance in the state semifinals. Normen would have her senior season cut short by a knee injury after 17 games. At the time of her injury, Normen was leading her fourth-ranked team with 14.9 points per game to go along with 3.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 2.0 steals.

Normen played in ASU's season opener vs. UCR (Nov. 11); however she suffered a quad injury in the game's final moments. After missing an extended period of time because of the injury, the decision was made to redshirt Normen for the 2011-12 season.

Blackwell helped lead her Etiwanda High School team to a 24-4 season as a senior as she scored 17.0 points per game while adding 5.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.2 steals. Blackwell was named team MVP following a 2010 season in which she led her team to the CIF State Tournament. She would also earn First-Team All-San Bernardino honors in 2010 as Etiwanda posted a 24-8 record, including a perfect 10-0 record in league games.

Blackwell currently leads the Sun Devil bench in rebounds (3.6 rpg) and is third in scoring (5.4 ppg). She averaged 10.0 points (8-13 FGs, 4-4 FTs) and 5.0 rebounds in the ASU Classic (Dec. 2-3). She tied for the team lead in scoring (12 points, 4-4 FGs, 4-4 FTs) to go along with six rebounds in ASU's win over Eastern Washington (Dec. 2). She scored a career-high 14 points in ASU's win over Army (Dec. 20). She helped spark the Sun Devil offense during ASU's first Pac-12 road trip as she averaged 11.5 points while shooting 64 percent (11-14 FGs) in ASU's contests at Oregon State (Jan. 12) and at Oregon (Jan. 14). In ASU's Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinal win against Arizona, Blackwell scored 11 points and pulled down six rebounds.

A 2011 Junior College State Farm Coaches' All-American, Pickens transferred to ASU from Cypress College (Cypress, Calif.), where she helped lead the Chargers to a third-place state finish last season. Pickens finished fourth in the state in scoring (22.9 ppg) in 2011 on her way to being named the California junior college South Player of the Year and a State Farm Junior College All-American. Pickens' campaign included a pair of contests in which she went over the 40-point mark. In addition, she went on to set the school record for most career blocks with 114. As a freshman in 2010, Pickens led the Chargers in scoring (15.9 ppg) as she would go on to earn All-Orange Empire Conference First-Team honors in addition to Second-Team All-State recognition.

Pickens currently leads the team in steals (1.9 spg), is second in blocks (0.8 bpg) and third in rebounding (3.7 rpg - most among ASU's guards). She earned ASU Classic All-Tournament recognition after scoring a season-best 13 points (6-9 FGs) vs. Illinois State (Dec. 3). Pickens was responsible for helping preserve ASU's 47-45 win over UTEP (Dec. 28) as she blocked a potential game-winning 3-pointer by UTEP with under nine seconds left in the game. Three days later against Arizona she tied her season-best in scoring (13 points) in ASU's 60-45 win over the Wildcats. Pickens again came up big in the rematch against Arizona on Mar. 3 in Tucson as she scored eight of her 10 points in the final 6:11, including the go-ahead 3-pointer with 3:06 left, in ASU's 70-63 come-from-behind win. Pickens averaged 10.0 points and connected on 71 percent of her shots (10-16) in ASU's two games against second-ranked Stanford.

### NEW FACES PART II

In addition to the four new players on the roster, the Sun Devils also welcomed two new assistant coaches -- Amy Wright and Chris Mennig -- in the offseason.

Wright, who joined the Sun Devil staff on May 16, 2011, came to ASU following a successful three-year stint at Cleveland State - the final year as associate coach - where she was part of a coaching staff that helped lead the program to 59 wins, a conference tournament title, a pair of postseason berths and its first-ever postseason win.

At CSU Wright served as the program's recruiting coordinator in addition to assisting with game preparation, scouting and player development, specifically working with the squad's point guards.

Mennig joined the Sun Devil program on August 16, 2011 after serving for six years as a National Evaluator and Event Coordinator for U.S. Junior Nationals (USJN) & Blue Star Basketball, both owned by grassroots pioneer Mike Flynn. USJN is one of longest running event operating companies in girls' basketball and Mennig directed more than 20 tournaments across the country last year. Blue Star Basketball is the longest running national scouting service organization that ranks & evaluates girls' basketball players across the country for colleges/media.

Mennig is no stranger to the world of major women's college basketball as he spent 11 years as an assistant (most recently at Illinois from 2003-05) and was a runner-up for St. Louis University's head coaching position in the spring of 2005 before joining USJN/Blue Star.

### BLOCK PARTY

The Sun Devils recorded nine blocks in their 56-52 overtime win at Colorado State on Nov. 13. The nine blocks were the most for ASU since it also had nine blocks vs. Furman in 2009. The Sun Devils would tie and eventually surpass that figure with a school record 12 blocks against Cal State Fullerton (Dec. 6). The 12 blocks broke the old single-game record of 11 set against Grand Canyon in 1992. ASU would again break the record, this time recording 16 rejections in its win vs. Washington (Feb. 16). The 16 blocks also tied the Pac-12's single-game record.

The Sun Devils are currently No. 11 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in blocks, averaging 5.8 per game.

Leading the way for the Sun Devils in the shot rejection department has been senior Kali Bennett, who is averaging 2.8 blocks per game (13th in the nation and second in the Pac-12). Bennett has given the Sun Devils a consistent shot-blocking presence in the middle since beginning her Sun Devil career in 2009-10 after transferring from the University of Washington.

In two-plus seasons, Bennett has already moved into second place on ASU's career blocks list with 160. Bennett broke the single-game school record for blocks with nine in ASU's win over Washington (Feb. 16). She also owns the school's single-season record for blocked shots (82 - old record was 55 by Kym Hampton set in 1980-81 season).

Currently with 181 blocked shots, the Sun Devils have already surpassed the school's single-season record of 134 blocks set by the 2008-09 team. They need 16 more blocks to break the single-season Pac-12 record of 196, set by Stanford in 2002.

### SUN DEVILS SIGN THREE

The Sun Devil women's basketball program announced in November that El-isha Davis, Arnecia Hawkins and Isidora Purkovic signed letters of intent to study and play basketball at Arizona State.

Davis, a 5-foot-5 point guard, comes to ASU from Berkeley High School in Berkeley, Calif., where she helped her team reach the California Interscholastic Federation Division I title game last season. In that game, Davis scored 16 points including four 3-pointers in a 59-47 loss to national No. 1-ranked Mater Dei. Davis was named to the All-East Bay girl's basketball third team following the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

Hawkins, a 5-foot-10 shooting guard, played as a freshman at Mesa Red Mountain, averaging 10.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in 2008-09, before transferring to Mountain View. Last season Hawkins averaged 15.8 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.3 steals and 1.7 assists in helping to lead Mountain View to a 25-3 record and a Class 5A Division I semifinal finish. MaxPreps.com ranked Hawkins the fourth best recruit out of Arizona while ESPN ranked her the 44th best guard in the nation. Blue Star Basketball had Hawkins listed as the No. 124 player overall and All Star Girls Report listed her at No. 51.

Purkovic currently plays for Western Canada High School in Alberta where she is looking to lead her team to a second consecutive 4A Alberta Provincial Championship. A 5-foot-11 shooting guard, Purkovic's credentials include playing in the 2009 FIBA Americas U16 Tournament, 2010 FIBA U17 Worlds Championship (youngest member of the team), 2011 FIBA U19 World Championships, 2011 Pan America Games and the Inaugural FIBA U18 3 on 3 Basketball World Championships. In addition, she has been selected to participate in the prestigious Nike Girls Skills Academy in Oregon each of the last two years.

ASU's class was ranked #34 in the country by Blue Star Basketball.

In addition to outstanding defensive play, one of the most important ingredients in ASU's success over the years has been the ability of its bench to consistently put forth significant contributions throughout the season. This season has been no different as the Sun Devil bench has outscored the opponent's bench in all but four games this season (vs. UTEP, Dec. 28, at Oregon, Jan. 14, vs. Washington, Feb. 16 and at USC, Feb. 25).

As stated by ASU head interim head coach Joseph Anders earlier this season: "As a team, the only focus we want our team to have when the game is being played is when you check in the game, what is the score? When you check out of the game, the score should be greater because you as a fresh player have been afforded the opportunity to see what the other team is doing and be able to step on the floor and take advantage of that."

The Sun Devils have certainly taken advantage of that as their bench has a +8.7 per-game advantage in scoring. Leading the way have been Janae Fulcher (5.9 ppg), Jada Blackwell (5.4 ppg) and Promise Amukamara (5.0 ppg) .
