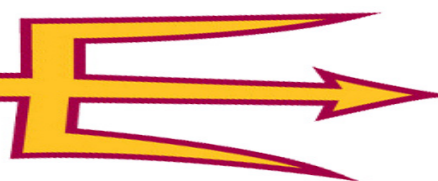

Head Coach Melissa Luellen --

Melissa Luellen, the 2009 SkyCaddie NGCA Coach of the Year returns for her eighth season as Arizona State's head women's golf coach. Last season, Luellen led the Sun Devils to their seventh NCAA Championship. She is a three-time Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a four-time Regional Coach of the Year. Under Luellen, the Sun Devils have garnered 20 tournament titles.

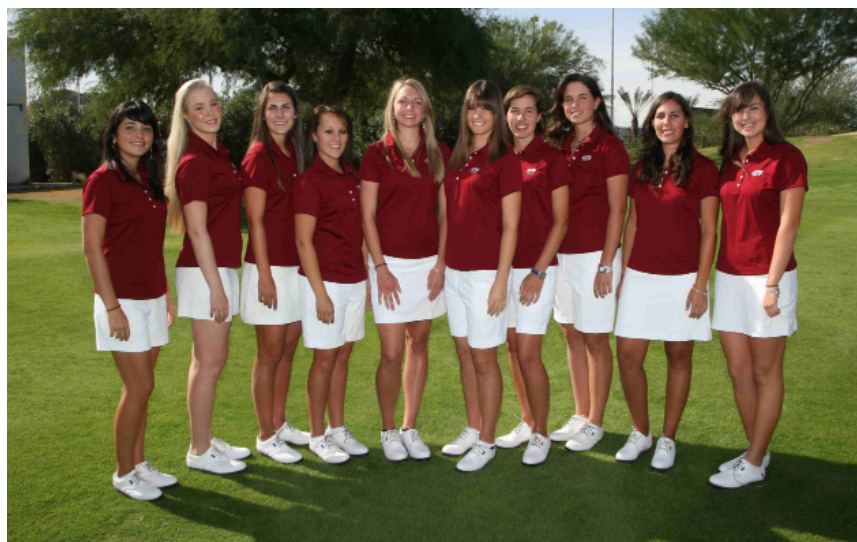

This Week --

The Arizona State women's golf team will look to defend the Pac-10 title this week as they head to Eugene, Ore., for the Pacific-10 Conference Championships. Held at the par-72, 6,203-yard Eugene Country Club, the tournament will run Monday, April 19 through Wednesday, April 21. The Sun Devils won their eighth Pac-10 title at the Stanford Golf Course by nine strokes over USC. Carlota Ciganda earned her first collegiate victory after winning a playoff against fellow Sun Devil Jennifer Osborn and USC's Jennifer Song.

About the Pac-10 Championships --

Known as one of the toughest conferences in collegiate golf, the Pac-10 has produced 13 NCAA Team Champions with seven of those coming from ASU. With eight conference titles, the Sun Devils have gathered more Pac-10 team titles than any other team in the Conference of Champions. The Sun Devils also have the most Pac-10 individual medalists with 10, which is more than twice as many as any other school. Head coach Melissa Luellen's squads have earned two conference titles.

Toughest Conference --

The Pac-10 Championship features six of the nation's top 25 teams. UCLA is currently first in the Golfstat rankings with the Sun Devils just behind in second. USC stands at fifth with Arizona ranking seventh. Stanford and California are also in the top 25, coming in at 14th and 24th respectively.

Last Year's Pac-10 Championships --

The Sun Devils won their eighth Pac-10 title after firing off an even 852 (293-281-278) to finish nine strokes ahead of USC. Then-freshman Ciganda shot par on the playoff hole to

become ASU's 10th conference medalist. Jennifer Osborn finished second after the playoff, Azahara Munoz tied for fifth and Juliana Murcia finished 20th.

ASU Pac-10 Championship History --

The Sun Devils have eight Pac-10 conference crowns, the most out of any Pac-10 school. The Sun Devils have won in 1987, 1988, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 2007 and 2009. Ten times, an ASU player has earned conference medalist honors including Danielle Ammacapane (1987), Pamela Wright (1988), Pearl Sinn (1989), Brandie Burton (1990), Wendy Ward (1993, 1995), Grace Park (1999), Jimin Kang (2002), Louise Stahle (2005) and Carlota Ciganda (2009).

Top Talent --

With three players in the top 20 in the Golfstat Cup standings and four in the top 25 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Ratings, the Sun Devils have one of the most talented squads in the country. Jennifer Johnson is a top 10 player in both polls. Juliana Murcia and Carlota Ciganda are in the top 20 in both and Jaclyn Sweeney sits at 22nd in the Golfweek ratings.

Curtis Cup Bound --

Freshman Johnson received an invitation to represent the United States in the 2010 Curtis Cup. Held June 11-13 at the Essex Country Club in Manchester-by-the-Sea, Mass., the Curtis Cup selects eight of the top American amateur women's golf to compete against eight amateurs from Great Britain and Ireland. This is the 21st time a Sun Devil has been selected as a member of the Curtis Cup and first since Kellee Booth in 1998.

Three Trophies So Far --

The top-ranked ASU women's team have already placed three new trophies in their case this season. The team went down to Tucson for the Wildcat Invitational and took their third Wildcat Invitational win. With four players finishing in the top 10, the Sun Devils won by a 12-stroke margin. In the fall season, the Sun Devils finished on top at the Stanford Intercollegiate. This was the third straight time ASU has won on the Stanford Golf Course, as they won the 2007 Stanford Intercollegiate and also won last season's Pac-10 title on Stanford's home course. Despite the stacked field, the Sun Devils came away with a four-stroke win as four of their players placed in the top 10. Previously, the Sun Devils took first at the TOPY Cup with a 26-stroke lead over second-place Wake Forest. Three ASU golfers went 1-2-3 as Jaclyn Sweeney claimed medalist honors with Juliana Murcia finishing runner-up and Carlota Ciganda tying for third.

Defending NCAA Champions --

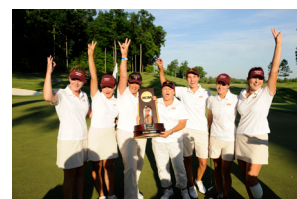
The Sun Devils claimed their first NCAA Championship since 1998, and seventh overall, last season at the Caves Valley Golf Course in Owings Mills, Md. The Sun Devils came back from an 11-stroke deficit after the second round to win by eight shots. ASU also won NCAA team titles in 1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997 and 1998. The Sun Devils are currently ranked No. 1 in the Golf World/NGCA Coaches Poll and the Golfweek/Sagarin Rankings and are No. 3 in the Golf Stat poll.

Krafty Freshman --

Freshman Jennifer Johnson recently competed at the Kraft Nabisco Championship as an amateur exemption. Johnson, who has placed in the top 10 in five out of six tournaments this season, was one of only two current collegiate players to make the two-day cut. Johnson has proven to be one of the top freshmen in the country this season. She has placed in the top 10 in five out of seven appearances and has finished out of the top 15 just once this season. She is currently the highest

Senior Star --

Senior Juliana Murcia has had a strong start to her final season as a Sun Devil. Murcia, a senior majoring in sculpture, carded her second runner-up finish of the season at the Wildcat Invitational, where she also recorded an eagle. The returning second-team All-American has finished in the top-20 in each tournament this season. After starting the 2009-10 campaign with a runner-up placing at the TOPY Cup, Murcia tied for 15th at the Mason Rudolph Championship. She followed that performance up with a third-place finish at the Stanford Intercollegiate and most recently tied for seventh at the Northrop Grumman. Over winter break, she tied for first at the Copa de las Americas in Argentina. A two-time NGCA All-American Scholar, Murcia is set to graduate in May.

Be Italia --

Giulia Molinaro has solidified herself on the Sun Devils' lineup this season. Highlighted by a final round of 69, Molinaro placed seventh at the Bruin/Wave Invitational for her second career top 10 finish. The Italian sophomore had a strong tournament in Palos Verdes, finishing tied for 17th. She has also recorded a top-10 placing at the TOPY Cup earlier this season.

Returning All-Americans --

The Sun Devils return three All-Americans to their 2009-10 squad. Carlota Ciganda's outstanding freshman season was recognized as she received First-Team All-American honors. Senior Juliana Murcia took home Second-Team honors at the end of last season. Jaclyn Sweeney had earned All-American honors in 2008 from Golfweek while playing for Oklahoma State.

What Sophomore Slump? --

Returning All-American Carlota Ciganda has picked up right where she left off. The sophomore has already notched four top 10 finishes this season. Ciganda turned in a runner-up performance at the Stanford Intercollegiate. Additionally, she finished tied for third at the TOPY Cup and was the Sun Devil's highest finisher at the Landfall Tradition/NCAA Fall Preview. Recently, she tied for seventh at the Wildcat Invitational and tied for fifth at the Bruin/Wave Invitational.

Jackie Medals in Japan --

Junior Sweeney took on the TOPY Cup field, shooting a 5-under 211 (70-72-69) to claim her first medalist honor as a Sun Devil. Winning by one-stroke over teammate Murcia, Sweeney now has two collegiate tournament victories on her resume as she won the Big 12 Championship as a freshman at Oklahoma State. She has also tied for sixth at the Stanford Intercollegiate and tied for 10th
