

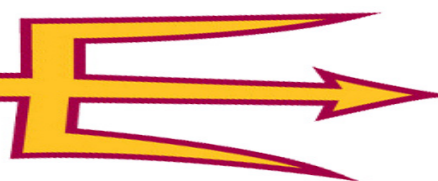

## Head Coach Melissa Luellen --

Melissa Luellen, the 2009 SkyCaddie NGCA Coach of the Year returns for her eighth season as Arizona State's head women's golf coach. Last season, Luellen led the Sun Devils to their seventh NCAA Championship. She is a three-time Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a four-time Regional Coach of the Year. Under Luellen, the Sun Devils have garnered 20 tournament titles.

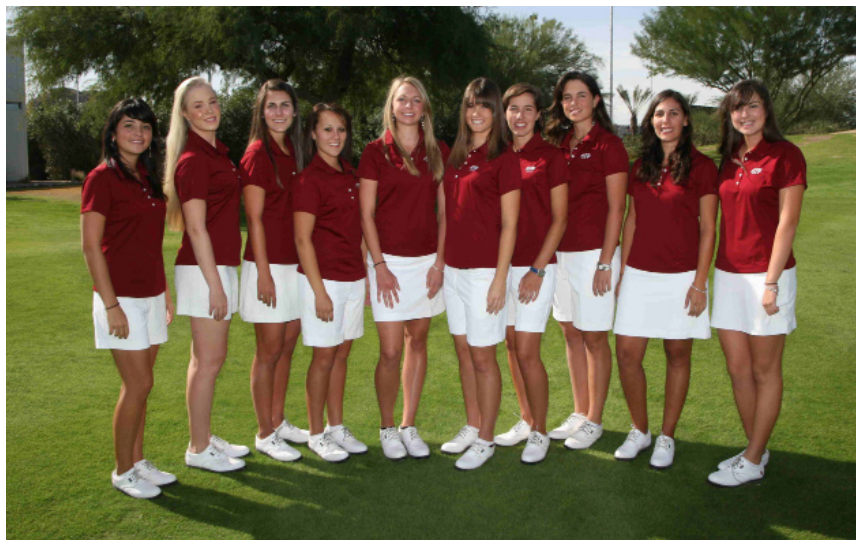

## ASU Women's Golf Looks to Defend NCAA Title

The Sun Devils have won a national leading seven NCAA Championships.



## This Week --

Making its 19th consecutive trip, the Arizona State women's golf team looks to defend their NCAA Championship as they head to North Carolina for the 2010 NCAA Women's Golf Championship. The ASU women's golf team will seek its eight NCAA team title at the par 72, 6,368-yard Country Club of Landfall in Wilmington, N.C. The tournament will begin Tuesday, May 18 and conclude on Friday, May 21. The Sun Devils will be paired with UCLA and Tennessee the first two rounds. Eight teams and two individuals from non-qualifying teams from each regional have qualified for the NCAA Championships. The Sun Devils will face No. 1/1 UCLA, No. 2/8 Duke, No. 3/5 Auburn, No. 4/3 USC, No. 6/4 Arizona, No. 7/6 Alabama, No. 8/7 Purdue, No. 11/13 Stanford, No. 12/12 Tennessee, No. 13/11 Virginia, No. 14/9 Pepperdine, No. 16/18 Vanderbilt, No. 17/20 New Mexico, No. 18/25 TCU, No. 23/22 Florida State, No. 24/23 Texas A&M, No. 25/28 Oklahoma State, No. 27/26 South Carolina, No. 28/32 Oregon, No. 29/30 Texas, No. 30/27 Tulane, No. 35/34 Kent State and No. 36/39 San Jose State. State has claimed three. The Sun Devils also have more Individual NCAA Championships than any school with five. Arizona, USC and Duke each trail ASU with three while three teams have two and eight teams have had one. The last Sun Devil to win an NCAA Individual title was Azahara Munoz in 2008.

## Streaking --

After qualifying for this year's NCAA Championship, the Sun Devils are currently tied with Stanford for the number of consecutive trips to NAAs. ASU finished second at the Central Regional to qualify for their 19th straight NCAA Championship. Stanford's reign of 19 ended two seasons ago when they failed to qualify.

## Congrats Graduate! --

Juliana Murcia has become the ASU women's golf team's latest graduate. A standout both in the classroom and on the course, Murcia will graduate with a 3.8 grade point average in Art with an emphasis in Sculpture. She is a two-time All-Academic Pac-10 First-Team member and three-time NGCA All-American Scholar. On the course, she was named a Second-Team All-American last year and has been an All-Pac-10 selection three times in her career. This season, Murcia has finished in the top three in four tournaments and has just finished out of the top 20 once this season.

## Back-to-Back --

Sophomore Carlota Ciganda made history at the Pac-10 Championships as she became the first back-to-back conference champion. Last season, Ciganda defeated senior Jennifer Osborn and USC's Jennifer Song in a playoff to earn her first collegiate victory. This year, the Spaniard birdied on a playoff hole against senior Juliana Murcia for her first medalist honor of the season. She is only the second player in the conference to win two Pac-10 titles. Former ASU standout Wendy Ward was the Pac-10 medalist in 1993 and 1995. Ciganda is the first Sun Devil to successfully defend a tournament title since Heather Bowie who won the Conquistadores/Chris Johnson Invitational in 1994 and 1995.

## All-Pac-10 --

Four Sun Devils were named to the All-Pac-10 team last week. Ciganda and Murcia were both named to the First Team for the second consecutive season. Johnson joined Ciganda and Murcia on the First-Team as the only freshman on the list. Sweeney earned Second-Team honors after being named Honorable Mention last season.

## Top Talent --

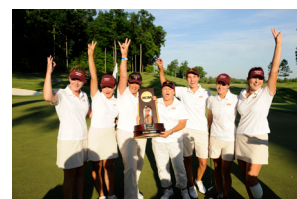
With three players in the top 15 in the Golfstat Cup standings and four in the top 25 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Ratings, the Sun Devils have one of the most talented squads in the country. Murcia leads the team with a ranking of sixth by Golfweek and 10th by Golfstat. Ciganda is ninth in both ranking systems. Johnson currently sits at eighth in the Golfweek rankings and is 11th by Golf Stat. Sweeney is 21st in the Golfweek poll.

## Curtis Cup Bound --

Freshman Johnson received an invitation to represent the United States in the 2010 Curtis Cup. Held June 11-13 at the Essex Country Club in Manchester-by-the-Sea, Mass., the Curtis Cup selects eight of the top American amateur women's golf to compete against eight amateurs from Great Britain and Ireland. This is the 21st time a Sun Devil has been selected as a member of the Curtis Cup and first since Kellee Booth in 1998.

## Sweeney Swings --

Jaclyn Sweeney has put together a solid junior season. The junior began the year with a win at the TOPY Cup and has earned three additional top 10 finishes. Recently, Sweeney had her second top three performance of the season by tying for third at the Pac-10 Championships. Additionally, she placed sixth at the Stanford Intercollegiate and finished 10th at the Wildcat Invitational.

## Three Trophies So Far --

The top-ranked ASU women's team have already placed three new trophies in their case this season. The team went down to Tucson for the Wildcat Invitational and took their third Wildcat Invitational win. With four players finishing in the top 10, the Sun Devils won by a 12-stroke margin. In the fall season, the Sun Devils finished on top at the Stanford Intercollegiate. This was the third straight time ASU has won on the Stanford Golf Course, as they won the 2007 Stanford Intercollegiate and also won last season's Pac-10 title on Stanford's home course. Despite the stacked field, the Sun Devils came away with a four-stroke win as four of their players placed in the top 10. Previously, the Sun Devils took first at the TOPY Cup with a 26-stroke lead over second-place Wake Forest. Three ASU golfers went 1-2-3 as Jaclyn Sweeney claimed medalist honors with Juliana Murcia finishing runner-up and Carlota Ciganda tying for third.

## Defending NCAA Champions --

The Sun Devils claimed their first NCAA Championship since 1998, and seventh overall, last season at the Caves Valley Golf Course in Owings Mills, Md. The Sun Devils came back from an 11-stroke deficit after the second round to win by eight shots. ASU also won NCAA team titles in 1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997 and 1998.

## Krafty Freshman --

Freshman Jennifer Johnson recently made competed at the Kraft Nabisco Championship as an amateur exemption. Johnson, who has placed in the top 10 in five out of eight tournaments this season, was one of only two current collegiate players to make the two-day cut. Johnson has proven to be one of the top freshmen in the country this season. She has placed in the top 10 in five out of seven appearances and has finished out of the top 15 just once this season.

## Be Italia --

Giulia Molinaro has solidified herself on the Sun Devils' lineup this season. Highlighted by a final round of 69, Molinaro placed seventh at the Bruin/Wave Invitational for her second career top 10 finish. The Italian sophomore had a strong tournament in Palos Verdes, finishing tied for 17th. She has also recorded a top-10 placing at the TOPY Cup earlier this season.

The Sun Devils return three All-Americans to their 2009-10 squad. Carlota Ciganda's outstanding freshman season was recognized as she received First-Team All-American honors. Senior Juliana Murcia took home Second-Team honors at the end of last season. Jaclyn Sweeney had earned All-American honors in 2008 from Golfweek while playing for Oklahoma State.

### What Sophomore Slump? --

Returning All-American Carlota Ciganda has picked up right where she left off. The sophomore has notched seven top 10 finishes this season, including defending her title at the Pac-10 Championship. Earlier in the season, Ciganda turned in a runner-up performance at the Stanford Intercollegiate. Additionally, she finished tied for third at the TOPY Cup and was the Sun Devil's highest finisher at the Landfall Tradition/NCAA Fall Preview. This spring, she tied for seventh at the Wildcat Invitational, for fifth at the Bruin/Wave Invitational and for eighth at the NCAA Central Regional.

### Super Coaches --

Head coach Melissa Luellen and associate head coach Missy Farr-Kaye garnered several awards after last season's success. Luellen was named Sky-Caddie NGCA Coach of the Year, Pac-10 Coach of the Year and West Region Coach of the Year. Farr-Kaye's determination and courage, shown last season through dealing with recovering from a recurrence of breast cancer while coaching, was awarded as she was named the recipient of the Kim Moore Spirit Award and was also a co-winner of the Golden Heart Award at the ASU Sparky Awards.
