

The Sun Devils will remain home next weekend as they set to open Pac-10 conference play hosting the Oregon schools. They face the Oregon Ducks on Friday, March 27 at 7 p.m. and the Oregon State Beavers on Saturday, March 28 at 7 p.m. and Sunday, March 29 at Noon in Tempe at Farrington Stadium.

Non-Stop Until they reach the top

In the polls for 2008, the Sun Devils enjoyed a new record in the rankings section as they attained their highest ranking ever with a #2 ranking coming in Week 2 and continuing until Week 5. The best ranking was saved for the middle of the season....and the end. Number One in all polls. The ranking also marked the first time the Sun Devils have ever surpassed the Arizona Wildcats in ranking and only the second time they have passed UCLA (Last was in 2002.) This season, the Sun Devils have also set a new ranking record as they were awarded a No. 2 preseason ranking by USA Softball, the highest preseason ranking the Devils have ever received.


THIRD AND FIFTH INNING STRETCH

Last year the Sun Devil offense has had an affinity for starting off ahead. This year's squad is no exception, though might be even better as they seem to surge late in the game as well since most of their 219 runs have been scored in the third and fifth inning with 53 scored in the third and 39 in the fifth.

BIG POWER, LITTLE PACKAGE

Sophomore transfer from Louisville, Kaylyn Castillo showed up on ASU's doorstep this season and has refused to produce nothing but power. The tiny catcher has a quick arm behind the plate and even quicker bat while at it. She's currently batting .341 with 12 RBIs and a home run for a .455 slugging percentage.
