LOOKING AHEAD — The Oregon State softball team (22-16, 1-2 Pac-10) gears up for four games in week nine as it heads to Eugene to face Oregon (25-13, 0-2 Pac-10) on Wednesday in the Dodge Civil War before hosting No. 8 Arizona (25-9, 2-1 Pac-10) on Friday at 3:00 p.m. and No. 1 Arizona State (39-2, 3-0 Pac-10) on Saturday and Sunday at 1:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m.

GAME 39: OREGON — Wednesday, Apr. 2 (4:00

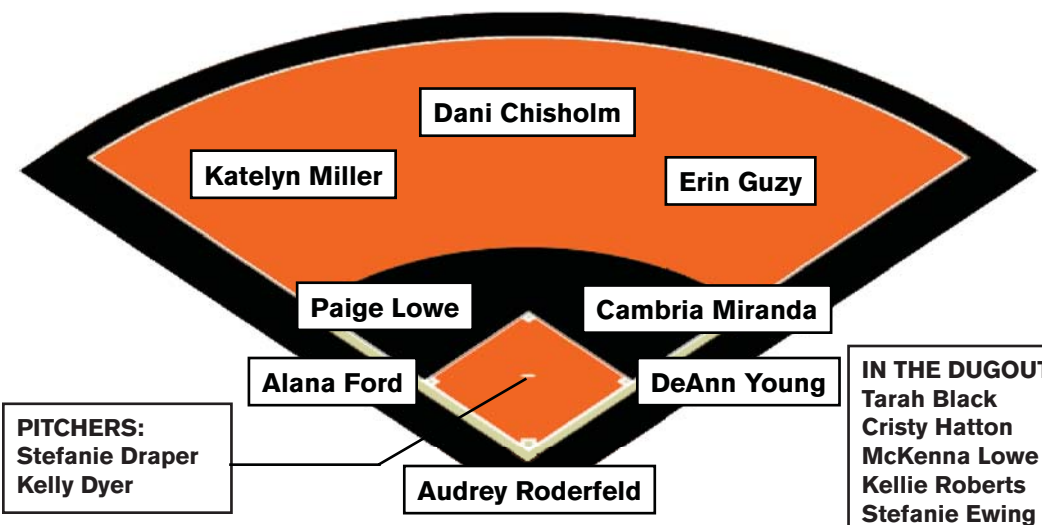
p.m.): Oregon State is 76-77-1 all-time against Oregon with Oregon holding a two-game winning streak.

After postponing its Pac-10 opener at Washington, Oregon dropped a pair at UCLA in the form of two shutouts, 2-0 and 12-0, snapping an 11 game winning streak. Sophomore center fielder Neena Bryant leads all Duck hitters with a .407 batting average, tallying eight doubles and home runs thus far on the season. The right-handed batter leads the team with 32 RBI and has 16 stolen bases, starting all 38 games. In the circle, senior Alicia Cook and junior Melissa Rice have shared most of the pitching duties, making 44 total appearances with seven complete game shutouts and six combined shutouts between them. Cook posts a 10-8 record with a 2.79 ERA, throwing a team-high 101 strikeouts on 116.0 innings of work, while Rice has a 2.08 ERA with an 11-5 record and 74 strikeouts on 99.2 innings pitched.

GAMES 40: NO. 8 ARIZONA — Friday, April 4 (3:00 p.m.): Oregon State is 10-75 all-time against the Wildcats with Arizona winning the last five straight.

nabbing a 4-1 win over Stanford in eight innings before rebounding against Cal in a 5-2 win on Sunday after dropping Saturday's game to the Bears, 3-1. Freshman Lauren Schutzler leads the team at the plate with a .390 batting average, while senior Callista Balko and sophomore Stacie Chambers lead the team in home runs with 11 each. Chambers also leads the team in RBI with 35. The team's pitching staff posts a 1.70 ERA, led by senior Taryne Mowatt and freshman Lindsey Sisk. Mowatt posts a 14-7 overall record with three shutouts and 212 strikeouts on 137.2 innings pitched, while Sisk has a 1.41 ERA with a 10-2 record, five shutouts and 64 strikeouts on 79.2 innings of work.

GAMES 41 & 42: NO. 1 ARIZONA STATE — Saturday, April 5 and Sunday, April 6 (1:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m.): Arizona State is 61-26 all-time against the Beavers, taking the last two meetings.

The Sun Devils extended their winning streak to eight games as they went 3-0 on Pac-10 opening weekend with a 4-2 win over Cal to kick things off, followed by 6-0 and 3-0 wins over Stanford. Arizona State boasts two players batting over .400, led by senior Jackie Vasquez with a .460 average and junior Kaitlin Cochran with a .443 average with 13 doubles, three triples and eight home runs. As a team, the Sun Devils have tallied 61 home runs, led by senior Kristen Miller with 10. Senior Katie Burkhart leads the team in the circle, posting a 0.55 ERA with a 20-2 record. The left-handed pitcher has tallied 11 shutouts with 256 strikeouts on 140.0 innings of work. Sophomore Megan Elliott has put up solid numbers with a 14-0 record, four shutouts and 77 strikeouts on 97.2 innings pitched.

LOOKING BACK AT LAST WEEK — Oregon State went 1-2 in the opening weekend of conference play, dropping a 3-0 decision to No. 1 UCLA and 1-0 to No. 23 Washington before rebounding on Sunday for a 5-3 win over the Huskies.

Freshman Erin Guzy hit her first career home run over right center in the top of the seventh inning to score three runs and lift the Beavers over Washington after the Huskies held a slim 3-2 lead through most of the game.

Sophomore pitcher Kelly Dyer earned the win after pitching 1.2 innings, including throwing a strikeout for the last out to preserve the win for the Beavers. Dyer also recorded a two-RBI double in the second inning, starting the game as the designated player.

PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK — After her .538 average performance, 1.154 slugging percentage, freshman Audrey Roderfeld was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week for the week of Mar. 11-17. The honor was Roderfeld's first, first Oregon State honoree of the season and 33rd all-time.

POINTS IN THE POLL — Oregon State received top 25 rankings in both the USA Today/NFCA Division I Preseason Top 25 Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Preseason Poll. The Beavers were ranked 18th in the USA Today/NFCA Poll, while sitting in the No. 19 spot in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll. After going 4-6 to start the season, the Beavers received votes in the USA Today/NFCA Poll, while dropping out of the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll.

CLUTCH RBI CHISHOLM — Sophomore Dani Chisholm has come up big on the season in RBI situations, collecting 20 so far on the season in the top three of the order. The left-handed batting slapper also leads the team with a .390 batting average with 46 hits, 24 runs and 54 total bases. Chisholm's RBI single against then-ranked No. 18 Ohio State helped boost the Beavers to their first win over a ranked opponent on the season.

NO STRIKEOUT STEFANIE EWING — With 65 at bats recorded thus far on the season, junior Stefanie Ewing has yet to chalk up a strikeout. Starting 23 games, the catcher is batting .262 with 17 hits, four doubles, one home run and 13 RBI. The right-handed batter has also drawn six walks. Ewing's zero strikeouts help the Beavers boast the least amount of strikeouts in the conference with 126 thus far on the season.

MARK ON MIRANDA — Senior Cambria Miranda was named to the 2008 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List, announced Jan. 30 by the Amateur Softball Association. Miranda is a two-time All-American, three-time All-Pacific Region First Team selection and three-time All-Pacific-10 Conference First Team honoree. The 2008 Pre-Season Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 34 schools and 14 different NCAA Division I Conferences.

DRAPER GETS ANOTHER YEAR — Pitcher Stefanie Draper was awarded her true freshman season back by the NCAA after battling injury during the 2007 season. She appeared in three games last season for four innings of pitching, facing 15 batters, and played in one game as the designated player. Draper is considered a redshirt freshman eligibility-wise for the 2008 season.

HOLLADAY HANGS OUT FOR A SEASON — Freshman pitcher Karmen Holladay will redshirt her true freshman season. Holladay is scheduled for surgery and will rehab for the rest of the 2008 season. She was the 2007 Oregon Pitcher of the Year at Corvallis High School.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME — The 2008 Oregon State softball team is undefeated at the OSU Softball Complex after winning its home opener against Portland State on Feb. 20. The Beavers are currently 8-0 at home after winning a pair at home at the Spring Fling

CHASING RECORDS — Senior Cambria Miranda set a new school record for runs scored on Saturday, Mar. 22, tallying a new best of 143 just halfway through the 2008 season and is knocking on the door of breaking more career offensive records. Miranda is 33 RBI, 36 hits, 14 doubles, 10 triples and 15 home runs away from breaking school records in all five categories. She already holds the school records for most runs scored (52) and most home runs (16) scored in a single season.

PAC-10 PREVIEW — Two-time defending NCAA National Champion, Arizona, barely edged out Arizona State in the Pac-10 Preseason Coaches Poll. The Wildcats and Sun Devils both received four first-place votes with Arizona receiving 45 total votes to Arizona State's 44. Oregon State was picked to finish seventh with a five-vote edge over in-state rival, Oregon. Seven Pac-10 teams were voted into the two top 25 preseason polls with Cal being the only team not receiving top status.

TICKET INFORMATION — Tickets are available for home softball games by walk-up purchase only at the OSU Softball Complex. Ticket prices are \$6 for adults and \$4 for seniors and children. Admission is free for Oregon State students with valid ID card.

2007 RECAP — In Oregon State head coach Kirk Walker's 13th season with the Beavers, the program continued to flourish. The Beavers made their ninth straight postseason appearance in 2007 advancing to the NCAA Regional Tournament, ending the season 41-23 overall, 10-11 in Pac-10 play. They finished the season ranked 15th in the nation, having been ranked as high as 13th during the season. Seniors Natalie Johnson, Mia Longfellow, Sherina Galvan, Ta'Tyana McElroy and Brianne McGowan helped Oregon State to the first Women's College World Series appearance in school history, one NCAA Super Regional appearance, four trips to the NCAA Regional Tournament and a Pac-10 title. Shortstop Longfellow and pitcher McGowan helped further establish the senior class' accomplishments by breaking a combined nine records in 2007. Longfellow now holds the career records for at bats (775), runs scored (141), hits (242), singles (192) and stolen bases (57). McGowan finished her career at Oregon State breaking records for

softball program, a program that has made a monumental turnaround under his direction. Walker reigns as Oregon State's all-time winningest softball coach with a 462-347-3 career record. He earned his 400th career coaching victory on March 25, 2006 when Oregon State rallied for a 2-1 eight-inning win against BYU in the Beavers' home opener. The Beavers have routinely beaten nationally-ranked teams and have shown improvement every season since Walker's arrival. His teams have won 40-plus games eight times.

Turning Oregon State into a perennial national contender, Walker led the Beavers to their first ever appearance in the NCAA Women's College World Series during the 2006 campaign. One of the best teams in Oregon State history, Walker's 2006 squad reeled off a school record 28-game winning streak (the longest for any team in the nation on the season), catapulted to a program-best No. 5 national ranking, and won both the NCAA Regional and Super Regional to earn a WCWS berth. Oregon State finished the year with a 43-16 record.

OSU SOFTBALL COMPLEX — The Oregon State softball complex opened in April of 2001. The \$1.5 million dollar complex features 750 bleacher backed seats, a concession and restroom facility, as well as one of the top playing surfaces in the nation. The sunken dugouts each contain a restroom for players as well as large storage areas. The press box facility, one of the best in the Pac-10, allows ample seating for six scorers in the main booth with two smaller television/radio booths located on both sides. A state-of-the-art sound and public address system are housed in the press box. Oregon State has hosted six fall tournaments since the OSU Softball Complex opened in 2001. The facility was home of the 2006 NCAA Regional and Super Regional Tournaments - with Oregon State winning both, and earning its first ever trip to the NCAA Women's College World Series. Additional bleacher seating was added for the NCAA post-season games and a plan is in the works to add lights to the facility for the 2008 season.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR BEAVER SOFTBALL — Oregon State heads to the Bay Area to play a single non-conference game against St. Mary's on Thursday, Apr. 10 at 2:00 p.m. before getting back into Pac-10 action against No. 7 Stanford on Friday at 7:00 p.m. The team then wraps up the weekend at No. 21 California on Saturday and Sunday with first pitch set for 1:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m.
