Coach Mac's Outlook on the 2007 Season

"As always, we are looking forward to the season, and the fantastic opportunities that are in front of us. We've worked extremely hard this fall and with the majority of our team being upperclassmen, we know what to expect going through the rigorous Pac-10 season and beyond. Our five seniors are determined to cap their careers with a memorable season. The group has improved tremendously over the past couple of years and have gained a confidence and belief in themselves. Each player knows what she needs to do individually to collectively have a great season as a team."

Schedule

"Traditionally, Arizona State plays one of the toughest schedules in the country. I do think that of my 23 years here at ASU this is the toughest schedule that we have ever faced. What better time than now with five seniors!! Pac-10 foes, Stanford, Cal, USC and UCLA could all very easily be ranked in the top 10 in the country, and we square off twice against them. The rest of the Pac-10 is always challenging and just to make it interesting this year we've added North Carolina and Duke to the mix, both finishing in last season's top 10. Texas, the national team indoor finalist in 2006 and Fresno State, an NCAA Sweet 16 team also will provide tough tests. We know we have our work cut out for us, and we don't shy away from it. To be one of the best programs in the nation you have to play the best. We certainly plan on that this year with the design of our schedule. Our feeling is if you don't get better, you get worse. With our schedule, we'll improve as the season progresses, and we embrace the challenge to compete against the nation's elite."

Returners

"In a sport like tennis, it's especially important that the upperclassmen be eager, which this team most definitely is. They started as freshman, but they aren't looking at this season as their last or going into it flat, they are looking at it from the opposite view. They can't wait to get on the court and see what the season will hold for them.

"Sabrina Capannolo has done a tremendous job for us the past two years playing number one singles. She has improved a great deal throughout her collegiate career in both singles and doubles and we are counting on Sabrina to be a force again this season."

"Kady Pooler has certainly improved her game every year she's been with us. We always knew Kady's doubles skills were some of the best in the country but she has also been a mainstay in the singles line-up the past two seasons. Kady has pulled out some big singles wins for us. Doubles-wise there is no one better than Kady as was evidenced when she teamed up with Roxanne Clarke to win the All-American Championship this fall, the first in the program's history. Kady will be called on in both singles and doubles this dual meet season."

"Rebecca Rankin had a great season last year, going undefeated at the three and five spots and played a solid four spot throughout the season. She is one of our most versatile players, which poses problems for her opponents because she has such a different style of game: she can slice, she can drop shot, and she volleys well. These traits also make her a very valuable doubles player."

"Senior Wendy Pilecka will be redshirted this spring after undergoing wrist surgery this past fall. Wendy has suffered some bad luck the past two seasons but we expect her to fully recover and be a force for us next season. We will count on Wendy's enthusiasm and support this spring."


"Jessica Leitch is much better than she was a year ago and has worked hard to get herself into very good shape. As a lefty, she presents a lot of problems for opponents. Her slice has improved and she has become a more aggressive player. Jessica has worked extremely hard over her career

on all aspects of her game and we expect her to come out and be extremely successful again this spring."

"Roxanne Clarke turned out to be a huge asset to the team both last season and this fall after coming in to play a solid two

spot and going 25-13 in singles for us as well as winning an All-American Championship in doubles with Kady Pooler. We expect Roxanne to play an even bigger role in this year's success."

"Laila Abdala had a very solid freshman year going 5-3 in Pac-10 play. Laila has great ability and a great attitude and has improved tremendously in her year and a half at ASU. I have tremendous confidence that Laila will have a major impact on our program. Her determination to improve her game everyday is going to benefit us."



Newcomers

"Nadia Abdala is a big time player and we believe she is going to make an immediate impact on our program, I'm confident that Nadia can play anywhere in the line-up successfully, she's that good. Nadia has great aspirations for herself and trains and plays with the desire and expectations of a professional career. Nadia is a tremendous team player and has embraced our program."

"Amanda Martin is a rarity as a Tempe native and is one of the hardest workers on the team. Amanda has improved a great deal this fall and will continue to get better and play an important role for us."



Head Coach Sheila McInerney



Sheila McInerney enters her 23rd season at the helm of the Sun Devil program after leading her team to its nineteenth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in 2006. McInerney has led the Sun Devils to 18 NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances, and eight quarterfinal appearances in her tenure. She has made the NCAA tournament in 21 of her 22 seasons.

The 2006 Sun Devils were without any seniors on the squad, yet still finished the year 13-9 and qualified once again for the NCAA Tournament. A highlight of

the 2006 season was ASU's win against the third-ranked Texas.

In 2004 with five freshmen, McInerney's team posted two upset wins in reaching the NCAA Sweet 16, defeating No. 19 LSU (4-1) in first round play and pulled off one of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament by shutting out Texas (4-0), the region's top-seed and 12th-ranked team in the country.

The 2003 season saw McInerney accomplish another milestone in her illustrious career, earning her 300th career win. She also coached another player to All-American acclaim and helped place four players on the Pac-10 All-Academic teams, tying a school record for most student-athletes selected. McInerney's knowledge of the game was evident in helping Adria Engel end her four-year career as the school's all-time wins leader (130) and a No. 6 final national ranking.

In 2002, McInerney tutored junior Adria Engel to her third straight All-American honor in singles and second straight NCAA quarterfinal singles finish. Engel and junior Dora Krstulovic then paired up to take All-American honors in doubles, finished the year ninth in the country.

Highlights from 2001 include a 20-6 overall record (McInerney's third 20-plus win season and her highest winning percentage as a head coach (.769), an All-American selection, an All-Conference selection, the school's first Pacific-10 Conference singles champion, four players earning national rankings, and three academic All-Conference honorees. Arizona State ended the year as the seventh best team in the country. Additionally, McInerney was selected as the head coach of the 2001-2002 USA Tennis Collegiate team.

In 1997, McInerney was honored as the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year. She guided the Sun Devils to a 15-7 record and finished the season with a No. 7 national ranking. She also garnered 1997 Pacific-10 Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Three times in 1988, 1990 and 2001, McInerney was selected as the West Region Wilson/ITA Coach of the Year and was a finalist for national coach of the year honors. In addition to producing some of the top student-athletes in the Pac-10, McInerney continues to lead her Sun Devil teams into the NCAA Tournament year-after-year.

Evidence of the program's academic status can be found in the Pac-10 All-Academic teams the past 12 seasons. ASU has had at least one member honored in each of those past years and averages nearly three honorees per season, including tying the school record with four selections in 2003 and 2006.

McInerney, who owns a career record of 333-211, posted three 20-win seasons (1986, '90, '01) to her credit and has guided the Sun Devils to the NCAA tournament in every year she has been at ASU with the exception of one. Her teams have finished in the top-10 five of the past eight seasons, and an astounding 13 times in her 20 seasons. McInerney has tutored 23 Sun Devil All-Americans and 13 different all-conference players.

McInerney's presence is felt off the court as well, earning the 2004 USTA/ITA Community Service Award for the Southwest section. The award honors McInerney for her significant contributions in developing community-based tennis programs through community centers, schools, parks, community tennis associations, the inner city, suburban and rural programs. Additionally, she also boasts a six-year tenure (1987-92) on the NCAA tournament selection committee.

Prior to coming to Arizona State, McInerney served as assistant women's tennis coach at the University of Southern California during the 1983-84 season. McInerney also has international coaching experience. At the 1986 Goodwill Games, McInerney coached former All-Americans Caroline Kuhlman and Beverly Bowes to gold and silver medals, respectively. In 1987, she led the U.S. Pan American Games doubles squad to a gold medal.

McInerney attended USC, where she captained the Trojans during her senior season. The four-time All-American also was a four-time Trojan Spirit Award winner, as voted by her teammates.

The Trojans won three national championships during McInerney's collegiate career, and she was the national collegiate doubles runner-up three times and a singles semifinalist in 1977. McInerney collected a half-dozen USTA national titles and was a member of the 1977-80 USTA Junior Federation Cup team.

As a professional, she played on the major international tour, earning a world ranking in the top 75. McInerney competed at three grand slam venues — Wimbledon, French Open and the U.S. Open where she reached the round of 32. She also served a short term as assistant pro at the highly acclaimed L.A. Tennis Club.

McInerney earned a bachelor's degree in public relations from the University of Southern California in 1980. A member of the Dean's List at USC, she won the USC Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the USC Junior Student-Athlete and Senior Student-Athlete awards.

Coaching Staff





Assistant Coach Josh Goffi

Josh Goffi enters his first year as Assistant Coach after an amazing collegiate and pro career. Goffi was a four-year letter winner on the men's tennis team at Clemson University in South Carolina from 1998-2001. While at Clemson, Goffi earned All-ACC First Team honors as a sophomore, junior and senior. During his career at Clemson, he was ranked among the top 10 NCAA players in singles (#9) and doubles (#2) while captaining the team in both 2000 and 2001.

As a professional, Goffi won the Masters singles events in the Sardinia, Italy Satellite and the USTA Sprint Futures in Elkin, NC. He won 18 doubles titles, including three Challengers during his career. As a participant on the ATPTour, Goffi had singles wins over six players in the top 100 and doubles wins over three players in the top 10 in the world.

Born January 24, 1979, Goffi comes from a coaching family. His father (Carlos) was the World Coach of the Year in 1991 while coaching several ATP touring professionals. Josh recently was the co-director of American Tournament Tennis, a full time, live-in tennis academy. He received his bachelor's degree in finance from Clemson University in 2001.

Josh and his wife, Nancy, current ASU Women's Soccer Assistant Coach, reside in Tempe.



Volunteer Assistant Coach Ford Oliver

Ford Oliver is in his 12th season working with the Arizona State women's tennis team as a volunteer assistant coach.

Throughout his Sun Devil coaching career he has aided numerous players with his proficient knowledge of tennis mechanics. His off-season conditioning programs have helped players improve their balance and movement on the court.

Oliver played on the international satellite circuit for three years following his collegiate career at Florida International University. He is a native of Yorktown Heights, New York, and is one of the most prominent and respected coaches in the state of Arizona.
