Season End Records

Allison Palmer reset ASU's single-season assists mark with 1482 assists on the year, which is also now the freshman record.

Macey Gardner set the freshman records for kills (577), kills per set (4.40) and kills in a match (28). She finished the season ranked second in single-season kills.

Alexis Pinson finishes the year with 121 block assists, fourth in single-season marks.

Erica Wilson ends her career with 522 kills her senior season, fifth in SS marks, 12th in total kills (1125), fourth in block assists (297) and eighth in total blocks (325).

Stephanie Preach finished just above her 2011 dig mark, ranking fourth with 619. She is fourth all-time in digs with 1460.

Palmer finished the season with 10 double-doubles, her final coming against Oklahoma with 52 assists and 12 digs. Gardner also had 10 double-doubles on the year while Nora Tuioiti-Mariner tallied four.

The 2012 team was just 57 assists shy of tying the program's season assist record of 1765 (had 1708).

NCAA Tournament First Round vs. OU

ASU had its first meeting against Oklahoma in program history. OU, in its ninth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and sixth under head coach Santiago Restrepo, took a 3-2 win to advance to the second round. ASU fell in set scores of 25-20, 19-25, 17-25, 25-19, 13-15.

ASU In the NCAA Tournament

After a six year absence in the NCAA Tournament, 2006 under then coach Brad Saindon, ASU made its 16th program appearance and Watson became the fifth coach to take the Sun Devils to the tournament. ASU now is 8-16 all-time in the postseason.

Jason Watson has been to the NCAA tournament three prior times with BYU. He is 4-4 in his five trips to the tourney.

ASU's last win in the NCAA Tournament was a 3-1 victory over College of Charleston on Nov. 30, 2006.

Regular Season Recap

ASU's 20 wins in 2012 is the most under Jason Watson.

This is the most victories for the program since it went 20-8 in 1993 under Patti Snyder-Park. That team went to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This is the most conference wins for ASU since 2000, that team finished 9-9 in the Pac-10 with Patti Snyder-Park.

ASU finishes the regular season with two wins against ranked teams: No. 6 USC, W 3-0 Nov. 2; No. 5 Washington, W 3-1 Nov. 21.

Jason Watson has grabbed seven wins against ranked opponents in his five years at ASU. The most wins vs. ranked teams in a single season under Watson was 2010, with three.

ASU won three tournaments in the non-conference portion of the season - UTEP's, UCI/LMU and the ASU Sheraton Invitational. Along with compiling an 11-2 record during non-conference play, a best start for the program since 2009, ASU had 10 earn tournament awards along the way.

Jason Watson earned his 50th win as a Sun Devil, on Aug. 25 in a 3-0 sweep of Fresno State. Watson joined ASU in 2008.

At the end of the regular season Macey Gardner ranks second in single-season kills (562) with each kill rewriting the ASU freshman kill record. Her 4.46 k/s is also the frosh record.

- Named the head coach in 2008, the sixth in program history
- In 2012, the Sun Devil squad opened with an 11-2 record, the best start in program history since 1992 when the Sun Devils advanced to a program-best Sweet Sixteen appearance.
- Since 2012, Watson has grabbed seven wins against ranked opponents in his five years at ASU.
- ASU's 2012 squad made the programs 16th appearance in the NCAA tournament and Watson is the fifth coach from ASU to guide the Sun Devils to a NCAA postseason berth.
- Watson's 20 wins in 2012 is the most in a single season at ASU, most for the program since 1993. The nine conference wins is the most under Watson and most since 2000 for the program.
- Watson's 2012 and 2010 recruiting class were ranked in the top-25.
- At BYU, he compiled a 74-18 (.804) overall record while leading them to three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.
- In only his first season as head coach, he was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading his team to a 25-4 record, the program's best record since 1998.
- In addition to leading BYU to the MWC regular-season title, Watson also helped lead them back to the NCAA Tournament
- In 2007, he led the Cougars to a 24-8 overall record and finish in NCAA Regional Final (Elite 8) as well as a final national ranking of 12th and at one point in the season as high a rank as ninth.
- Watson's teams have been ranked as high as eighth on RPI.
- Prior to his head-coaching debut at BYU in 2005, Watson had amassed 11 years as an assistant coach at four universities.
- Had an All-American playing career at BYU from 1990-1994, where he was a four-year starter and two-time captain.
- Watson coached for two years under his former coach, Carl McGown before beginning his career in women's volleyball with extremely successful stints at Kansas State, Arkansas State and Montana State.
- Graduated from BYU in 1995 with a degree in physical education and sports business management after leaving his native home of Homebush, Australia.
- He and his wife, Larissa, have three children; two sons and a daughter.

2012 (Senior):

Named the MVP of UTEP's El Paso Sports Commission Invitational after posting 55 kills over the weekend and 11 service aces. While leading the Pac-12 in aces and points, Wilson was named to her second All-Tournament Team, this time at the Jayhawk Invitational. The senior swung for 19 kills against tournament-host Kansas and finished the weekend with 15 kills against College of Charleston. Surpassed the 1,000 kill mark for her career and ended her career 12th all time at ASU with 1125 total kills. Also finished her career ranked fourth in block assists (297) and eighth in total blocks (325). Is one of just 15 Sun Devils to post 1,000 career kills and is just the third ever to post 1,000 kills and at least 300 total blocks (Tammy Webb, Sue Nord). Her 522 kills during her senior season ranks fifth in single season marks. Capped her senior season with her first appearance in the NCAA Tournament and recording 15 kills and six digs against Oklahoma in the outing. Put up career highs in kills (24) and points (26) against UTEP. Had five service aces against Fresno State, the second time she's tallied as much in a match, the first time against Idaho State in the season opener. Played in all 34 matches of the season and helped lead ASU to wins over two ranked opponents. Had 15 and 12 kills against Pac-12's leader Stanford in both matchups. Was clutch on senior night with 17 kills against Arizona. Not only led the team in service aces, but was fifth in the Pac-12 (0.28/s). At the end of the season was ranked 60th nationally in kills per set (3.98), and was the second Pac-12 athlete in 2012 to tally more than 500 kills (the first being ASU's Macey Gardner). Earned her first conference award by being named Pac-12 All-Conference Honorable Mention.

2011 (Junior):

Continued to be an important component on the team, starting all 31 sets. Led the team in blocks for the second consecutive year with 85 total on five solo and 80 assists. Had a .325 hitting percentage on the season, which was tenth in the Pac-12 conference and 107th nationally. Season high of 15 kills on Oct. 15 at Colorado. Had six block assists in two games on the year, first on Aug. 27 against San Jose State then on Sept. 16 in the Pac-12 opener at Oregon State.
