No. 4 Arizona State (23-10, 11-4) at Washington (20-14, 6-9)

ASU leads the all-time series with Washington, 33-18. ASU is also 10-5 in series' against Washington with 5 sweeps since 2000, but have lost the past two series' against the Huskies, including one at home and one in Seattle. Prior to the past two seasons the Devils had won the previous seven series' dating back to 2006. The Devils last won a series at Washington in 2011 (W, 6-0; W, 12-0; L, 0-3; May 20-22).

Comeback Devils

ASU has six wins this season when trailing after six innings, including a pair of wins over Oregon State, one over Oklahoma State, one over Oklahoma, one over Stanford and one over Utah. ASU has also overcome early deficits of at least three runs (within first three innings) five times (vs Oklahoma, vs TCU, vs Purdue, vs Oregon State, at Oregon.) Conversely, ASU is 16-2 when leading after six innings, including 16-1 when leading through eight

Two-Out Rally Towels

In six games this season the Devils have used a two-out rally in an inning to either break a tie or overcome a deficit. In addition, they have driven the game-winning run with two outs six times.

Vs Oklahoma, 2/18 - Scored four runs with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a 4-2 deficit

Vs Purdue, 2/28 - Scored five runs with two outs in the fifth inning to break open a 5-5 tie

Vs UNLV, 3/11 - Scored four runs with two outs in the fifth inning to overcome a 3-1 deficit At Oregon, 3/20 - Scored three runs with two outs in the fifth inning to overcome a 4-1 deficit

Vs Stanford, 3/27 - Scored two runs with two outs in the ninth inning to overcome a 6-5 deficit

At Utah, 4/4 - Scored two runs with two outs in the ninth inning to erase a 5-3 deficit, won in 10 innings

Free (And Close) Baseball

The Sun Devils have four extra-innings wins and five walk-off wins this season, and have gone 11-5 in 16 one-run games this season. In addition, they have driven in the game-winning run in the 8th inning or later 11 times, and all but seven of ASU's games have been decided by three runs or less. ASU went 4-3 in seven extra-innings games and 7-9 in 16 one-run games in 2014.

Head Coach Tracy Smith

Tracy Smith was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014.
Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosters to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

He tallied more than 40 wins in each of the past two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 40 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school

out of high school.

In 18 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 54 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 22 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 24 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past six seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In nine years at the helm of Miami (Ohio) baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization.

The Long Ball Is Back

The Sun Devils have hit 17 home runs through their 33 games, including four by designated hitter **RJ Ybarra** and catcher **Brian Serven**. It took the Devils 44 games in 2014 to hit their 17th home run (May 4 at Oklahoma State). Last season's home run leader, **Trever Allen**, did not notch his fourth and final home of the year until the Devils' 44th game of the season, May 4 at Oklahoma State.

Hitting Trends

Through the first 10 games of the season, the Devils hit over .300 just twice. In their second 10-game set of the season, they hit over .300 in all 10 games. In their third 10-game set, they hit over .300 just twice. Through their past three games they have hit .300 twice.

ASU ranks 10th in total attendance and is one of only 10 schools in the nation, including the only school west of Texas, to draw more than 82,000 fans this season. The Devils rank 16th in average attendance with 3,282 fans per game. ASU's 82,043 fans through 25 home games are the most in the past six seasons, and its 6,347 fans

Ranked Wins

The Sun Devils have nine wins over ranked opponents this season. They went 2-1 against then-No. 5 Oklahoma State on opening weekend and followed that up with a 1-2 record against then-No. 1 TCU, a 2-1 record against then-No. 24 Oregon State, a 2-1 at then-No. 15 Oregon and 2-0 against then-No. 24 Arizona.

Streaking

Right fielder **Trever Allen**'s 18-game hitting streak was broken on March 29. It marked the longest streak at ASU since **Riccio Torrez** put together a 26-game streak in 2010. Allen leads the team in extra-base hits with 12 (9 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run). Second baseman **Andrew Snow** (13-game) third baseman **David Greer** (12-game) and catcher **Brian Serven** (10-game) all have double-digit hitting streaks, while center fielder **Johnny Sewald** has reached base in 16 consecutive games.

Greer Comes Into His Own

Sophomore **David Greer**, who became a regular fixture in the lineup when then-starting third baseman **Dalton DiNatale** was injured March 3, has started the past 22 games, including 21 at third base. He has a hit in 21 of them. He has gone 30-for-79 (.380), including five doubles and a triple, with 18 RBI and 10 runs scored. He has two game-winning RBI in that span (3/8 vs Long Beach State and 3/15 vs Oregon State), set a career high with three RBI vs LBSU March 8 and vs Arizona April 12, and has set his career high with three hits in a pair of games.

#Woody

Sophomore shortstop **Colby Woodmansee** leads the team with 14 multi-hit games and eight multi-RBI games. He has a hit in 26 of ASU's 33 games this season and has reached base in 30 games, and has reached base in 40 of his past 47 games dating back to March 28, 2014, at UCLA. Woodmansee hit a walk-off home run in the 10th inning of the season opener for ASU's first walk-off home run since Joey DeMichele on June 3, 2011 vs. New Mexico (3-run homer in Tempe Regional) and became the first Devil in the past three seasons to hit multiple home runs on opening weekend (Abe Ruiz vs Western Michigan in 2012).

Rotational Changes

The team's weekend pitching rotation was altered prior to Long Beach State series March 6-8. Junior LHP Brett Lilek, the team's Friday night starter for 12 games in 2014 and through the first three weekends of 2015, was moved to the back of the rotation as the team's Sunday starter, a role he held for three weeks in 2014 before replacing RHP Ryan Burr as the team's Friday night starter prior to Tennessee series March 7-9, 2014. Sophomore RHP Seth Martinez, who made seven midweek starts in 2014 and two in 2015, was moved to the Friday night starter role. ASU used four pitchers in the Friday night role in six seasons between 2008 and 2013 with Mike Leake ('08, '09), Seth Blair ('10), Brady Rodgers ('11, '12) and Trevor Williams ('13). In the past two seasons the Devils have used three different pitchers (Burr, Lilek and Martinez) and have switched midseason in both '14 and '15.

A Record Breaking Career

Junior RHP Ryan Burr recorded his 26th career save Feb. 18 in a win over Oklahoma to set the school's career saves record and currently has 34 in his career. Burr also currently ranks sixth in school history with 81 career appearances and is one away from the fifth spot, held by Kevin Dukes (1978-81). Burr, who collected 12 saves in each of his past two seasons and already has 10 in 25 games in 2015, broke Doug Nurnberg's record which was set in 1965-67 and was the longest-standing individual career record in school history. Burr also set the freshmen record for single-season saves with 12 in 2013.

Friday Night Tradition

Sophomore RHP Seth Martinez joins a long and illustrious line of Friday Night Starters at ASU that includes eight Major Leaguers and numerous ASU Hall of Famers. Notable Mr. Friday Night's include Eddie Bane, Floyd Bannister, Kendall Carter, Mike Esposito, Larry Gura, Gary Gentry, Mike Leake and Brady Rodgers.

#KelloggShow

Junior LHP Ryan Kellogg is the first Sun Devil to lead the team in wins in consecutive seasons since Ken Jones in 1978-79. Sterling Slaughter (1962-63), Craig Swan (1970-72) and Floyd Bannister (1975-76) also accomplished the feat and Kellogg could join Swan as the only Devils to lead the team in wins in three consecutive seasons. In addition, Kellogg has 11 wins over ranked opponents, including four in 2015, three in 2013 and four in 2014. He has a career record of 25-5, including 17-2 in 25 career Pac-12 starts, and 23 of his 39 career starts have been quality starts. Kellogg is one of five Sun Devils in the past five seasons to earn repeat First Team All-Conference honors, joining Joey DeMichele (2011-12), Deven Marrero (2011-12), Riccio Torrez (2010-11) and Mitchell Lambson (2009-10). He has not issued a walk in three of his starts this season and 16 career starts. Among Div. I Canadian pitchers, Kellogg is tied for fourth all-time with 25 wins, and is just four wins from the top three, and all seven pitchers ahead of him played four season for their respective schools. Kellogg tossed his third career complete game in a win over Oregon on March 21, tied for the fourth most among ASU pitches since 2008.

K's & ERA & Opposing Batting Average

Junior LHP Brett Lilek is the first Sun Devil to lead the team in both ERA and strikeouts since Mike Leake in 2008 and 2009, and is the 11th player in school history to accomplish the feat. In addition, Lilek was one of just three pitchers in the Pac-12 in 2014, and one of just two returning pitchers in 2015, to finish in the top eight in the conference in the regular season in ERA, opposing batting average and strikeouts.

I'll Take That

Junior center fielder Johnny Sewald has stolen a team-high 16 bases through 33 games this season. He has 33 career stolen bases and his 16 stolen bases in 2014 were the most by any Sun Devil in the past three seasons.

A Two-Way Tradition

Junior INF/RHP Jordan Aboites is latest installment in a long tradition of two-way players at ASU. He has started 16 games at second base and has pitched 18 innings in 14 appearances. He won his first game of the season against Oregon State (3/15) in a career-long four innings. Freshman OF/LHP Andrew Shaps is also contributing both ways as he's come in as the team's late-inning left fielder for his defense and has appeared in one game on the mound, as is junior OF/RHP David Graybill. They are 63rd, 64th and 65th Sun Devils in school history to comtribute both ways, a list that includes ASU Hall of Famers Jamie Allen, Doug Henry, Jerry Hochever and Lerrin LaGrow, and current Major Leaguers Kole Calhoun, Ike Davis and Mike Leake.

Young, Seasoned Catcher

Sophomore catcher Brian Serven, who was named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List, has caught 15 runners stealing base in 2015 and his career total of 30 is more than any Sun Devil since 2009. He became just the third true freshmen catcher in the past 20 years at ASU to start the majority of the season, joining Petey Paramore in 2006 and Trent Pratt in 1999. He also caught 15 runners stealing base in 2014, which was the most since Carlos Ramirez caught 15 in 2009 and is tied for the most by a Sun Devil since 2006.

A Trio Of Junior Preseason All-American Pitchers

ASU is the only school in Div. I with three pitchers on a preseason All-America team as junior left-handed starters Ryan Kellogg and Brett Lilek, and right-handed closer Ryan Burr were all named Louisville Slugger 2015 Preseason All-Americans (third team).

Golden Spikes Tradition

Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Burr was named to the Golden Spikes Midseason Watch List and is the first Devil since right-handed pitcher Trevor Williams in 2013 to earn a spot on the midseason list. The Sun Devils are the only team in the nation to boast three current pitchers who have been named to the preseason watch list for the Golden

Spikes Award, given to the top amateur baseball student-athlete in the country. Junior left-handed pitcher Brett Lilek was named to the preseason watch list in 2015 and is the 11th Sun Devil to earn the recognition since 2010. He joins fellow juniors Burr and Ryan Kellogg, who earned the preseason nod in 2014, as current Sun Devil student-athletes to earn a spot on preseason watch list.

Legacy Devils

There are five Legacy Devils on the 2015 team: Trever Allen (father, Jaime), Joey Bielek (uncle, Brett Wallerstedt (football)), Coltin Gerhart (brother, Garth (football)), David Graybill (father, Dave Graybill), and Andrew Snow (uncle, Dustin Pedoria; father, Phil Snow (football assistant coach)).

Academic Success

Fourteen Arizona State University baseball student-athletes have been recognized during the Fall 2014 semester as Scholar Ballers®, which honors those who achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher. A total of 20 current baseball student-athletes have earned Scholar Baller® recognition in at least one of the past five semesters. Junior preseason All-America pitchers Ryan Burr and Ryan Kellogg each earned a 4.0 GPA this past semester, while freshmen Ryan Hingst and Eli Lingos each began their respective college careers with a 3.9 GPA in their first semesters.

Packing Them In

For the 10th consecutive year and the 11th time in the past 12 years, Arizona State led the West Coast and Pac-12 in total attendance, as well as regular season average attendance. 85,325 fans came to Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark during the 2014 season for an average of 2,844 in 30 home games, the 22nd highest average in the nation.

Feeling The Draft

There are eight members of the 2015 Sun Devils who have had their name called during the annual Major League Baseball draft, including junior David Graybill, who has been drafted twice as a pitcher.

The Sun Devils finished the regular season ranked first in the Pac-12 in batting average (.286), slugging percentage (.389), hits (546) and total bases (741), and were second in on-base percentage (.374) and runs scored (325). ASU has led the conference in slugging percentage, hits and total bases the past two seasons.

...And In All-Conference Selections

ASU leads the Pac-12 with 24 First Team All-Conference selections since 2010, three more than UCLA, four more than Arizona, and five more than Oregon State.

A Tradition Of USA Collegiate Baseball

Junior RHP Ryan Burr earned a spot on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team for the second consecutive summer in 2014 and joined former Sun Devil Dustin Pedroia as the only two student-athletes in school history to be selected to the team in consecutive seasons. At least one Sun Devil has played on the Collegiate National Team in seven consecutive seasons, which is the longest streak in the NCAA. ASU has had a representative on the team each year since 2007 and a Sun Devil has been represented on the Collegiate National Team in 15 different seasons, which is fourth most behind Stanford (21), Cal State Fullerton (19) and Miami (17). ASU's 20 players are tied for the fourth most with Georgia Tech and trail Stanford (29), Cal State Fullerton (22) and Miami (21). In two summers with the USA Baseball CNT, Burr has pitched 20 2/3 innings and allowed only one total run. Opponents are hitting a miniscule .048 off of Burr as a member of the CNT and he has recorded nine saves, which is the most of any CNT pitcher in the past two years. Burr has struck out a remarkable 38 batters in his time in the Red, White and Blue, which puts him over 16 strikeouts per nine innings.

Restarting A Baseball America Tradition:

The Sun Devils were ranked in the top 25 in six major preseason polls, including No. 18 by Baseball America. The Devils had a two-year hiatus from Baseball America's preaseason top 25 after they had been in the poll for 26 straight seasons, the longest streak in the nation.

Joe Arnold and Mike Kelly will be inducted into the National College Baseball Hall of Fame as part of the 2015 class. The two inductees give ASU a total of 10 Hall of Famers, the most from any single school in college baseball.



Back To The Old New:

ASU moved back to Phoenix Municipal Stadium after playing 40 seasons at Packard Stadium from 1974-2014 The Devils played 137 games at Muni from 1964-74, and went 111-26 at the stadium, including 17-6 against Arizona. ASU's first game at Muni was April 10, 1964, and was a 5-3 win over Arizona. ASU's last game at Muni was March 18, 1974, and was 9-6 win over Colorado. ASU won District 7 titles in 1965 and 1967 at Muni before going on to win National Championships in Omaha. Former Sun Devil and eventual Major League Baseball Hall of Famer Reggie Jackson was the first college player to hit a home run at Muni.


