Washington State (27-23, 9-15) at No. 12 Arizona State (30-18, 15-9)

ASU leads the all-time series against the Cougars, 49-15. ASU bookended a series with wins in 2014 at Pullman, but dropped the series in Tempe in 2013, 2-.1. The Devils last beat WSU in a three-game series was a sweep in 2000. They are 13-2 in series' against Washington State since 2000 with five sweeps, and the two losses have come in recent years in 2010 and 2013.

Comeback Devils

ASU has six wins this season when trailing after six innings, including a pair of wins over Oregon State, one over Oklahoma State, one over Oklahoma, one over Stanford and one over Utah. ASU has also overcome early deficits of at least three runs (within first three innings) six times (vs Oklahoma, vs TCU, vs Purdue, vs Oregon State, at Oregon, at Arizona.) Conversely, ASU is 22-6 when leading after six innings, including 22-2 when leading through eight innings.

Rotational Changes

The team's weekend pitching rotation has been altered for the second time this season:

It was first changed prior to Long Beach State series March 6-8 - junior LHP Brett Lilek, the team's Friday night starter for 12 games in 2014 and through the first three weekends of 2015, was moved to the back of the rotation as the team's Sunday starter, a role he held for three weeks in 2014 before replacing RHP Ryan Burr as the team's Friday night starter prior to Tennessee series March 7-9, 2014. Sophomore RHP Seth Martinez, who made seven midweek starts in 2014 and two in 2015, was moved to the Friday night starter role.

It was changed for the second time prior to Washington State series May 14-16 - junior LHP Ryan Kellogg, the team's Saturday starter for the past three seasons (44 starts), is making his first start at the front-end of the rotation. Lilek will move to the Saturday role for the first time in his career, and Martinez will move back to Sunday. ASU used four pitchers in the Friday night role in six seasons between 2008 and 2013 with Mike Leake ('08, '09), Seth Blair ('10), Brady Rodgers ('11, '12) and Trevor Williams ('13). In the past two seasons the Devils have used four different pitchers (Burr, Lilek, Martinez and Kellogg) and have switched midseason in both '14 and '15.

Head Coach Tracy <u>Smith</u>

Tracy Smith was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014. Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and

was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball

He tallied more than 40 wins in each of the past two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 40 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted

out of high school.

In 18 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 54 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 22 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 24 Major League in the MLB Draft in the most of the seasons, including the most of the seasons. Baseball draft picks over the past six seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In nine years at the helm of Miami (Ohio) baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization.

Free (And Close) Baseball

The Sun Devils have won five-of-six extra-innings games and have five walk-off wins this season, and have gone 15-6 in 21 one-run games this season, including 9-3 in Pac-12 play. In addition, they have driven in the game-winning run in the 8th inning or later 13 times, and all but 12 of ASU's games have been decided by three runs or less. ASU went 4-3 in seven extra-innings games and 7-9 in 16 one-run games in 2014.

Two-Out Rally Towels

In seven games this season the Devils have used a two-out rally in an inning to either break a tie or overcome a deficit. In addition, they have driven the game-winning run with two outs seven times. Vs Oklahoma, 2/18 - Scored four runs with two outs in the seventh inning to overcome a 4-2 deficit Vs Purdue, 2/28 - Scored five runs with two outs in the fifth inning to break open a 5-5 tie Vs UNLV, 3/11 - Scored four runs with two outs in the fifth inning to overcome a 3-1 deficit At Oregon, 3/20 - Scored three runs with two outs in the fifth inning to overcome a 4-1 deficit Vs Stanford, 3/27 - Scored two runs with two outs in the ninth inning to overcome a 6-5 deficit At Utah, 4/4 - Scored two runs with two outs in the ninth inning to erase a 5-3 deficit, won in 10 innings At Washington, 4/18 - Scored one run with two outs in the seventh inning to break a 3-3 tie

Sewald Surging

As the rest of the offense has slumped dating back to the loss at Arizona (4/28), center fielder **Johnny** Sewald has found his groove. He is hitting .471 (16-for-34) with a .526 on-base percentage and a .647 slugging percentage, and has seven RBI, five extra-base hits and 10 runs scored. Sewald is one of only three regular starters with a batting average of .300 is the only one above .350.

Hitting Trends

Through the first 10 games of the season, the Devils hit over .300 just twice. In their second 10-game set of the season, they hit over .300 in all 10 games. In their third 10-game set, they hit over .300 just twice. In their fourth 10-game set, they hit .300 nine times. They hit .300 in the next six games, but are under .300 the past two.

#OccupyPHXMuni

ASU ranks 15th in total attendance and is the only school west of Texas to draw more than 90,000 fans this season. The Devils rank 18th in average attendance with 3,176 fans per game. ASU's 98,482 fans through 31 home games are the most in the past six seasons.

Ranked Wins

The Sun Devils have 11 wins over ranked opponents this season. They went 2-1 against then-No. 5 Oklahoma State on opening weekend and followed that up with a 1-2 record against then-No. 1 TCU, a 2-1 record against then-No. 24 Oregon State, a 2-1 at then-No. 15 Oregon, two wins against then-No. 24 Arizona, and 1-2 at No. 13 Cal, and one win over No. 2 UCLA.

Center fielder Johnny Sewald's 26-game streak of reaching base safely, the Devils' longest streak this season, was broken on May 8. Second baseman Andrew Snow (20) and right fielder Trever Allen (21) each have also reached in 20 consecutive games at one point this season. Allen's 18-game hitting streak was broken on March 29. It marked the longest streak at ASU since Riccio Torrez put together a 26-game streak in 2010. Snow (13-game), third baseman David Greer (13-game) and catcher Brian Serven (10game) have each put together double-digit hitting streaks this season.

Serven Finds His Power

Sophomore catcher Brian Serven has found his power stroke over the second half of the season: Through his first 69 at-bats, he had a .391 slugging percentage, a .304 batting average, 21 hits, three doubles, a home run, eight RBI and nine runs scored.

Through his second 69 at-bats, he had a .623 slugging percentage, a .377 batting average, 26 hits, five doubles, four home runs, 19 RBI and 14 runs scored.

However, in the past 29 at-bats, he's hit .103 with three hits, including one double, and three RBI.

Greer Comes Into His Own...

Sophomore David Greer, who became a regular fixture in the lineup when then-starting third baseman Dalton DiNatale was injured March 3, has started the past 37 games, including 34 at third base. He has a hit in 32 of them, and has gone 50-for-140 (.357), including nine doubles, two triples and a home run, with 24 RBI and 18 runs scored to go along with a .413 on-base percentage and a .481 slugging percentage. He has two game-winning RBI in that span (3/8 vs Long Beach State and 3/15 vs Oregon State), set a career high with three RBI vs LBSU March 8 and vs Arizona April 12, and has set his career high with three hits in five games.

...And So Does Snow

Freshman second baseman Andrew Snow has hit .333 (26-for-78) with five extra-base hits, 12 RBI, and 15 runs scored, and has tallied a .391 on-base percenge and a .436 slugging percentage in the past 21 starts. In his previous nine starts he hit .286 (8-for-28) with two extra-base hits, seven RBI and one run scored, and a .364 on-base percentage and a .357 slugging percentage.

#Woody

Sophomore shortstop Colby Woodmansee leads the team with 20 multi-hit games and 21 multi-RBI games, as well as hits, extra-base hits, RBI and total bases. He has a hit in 39 of ASU's 48 games this season and has reached base in 43 games, and has reached base in 53 of his past 62 games dating back to March 28, 2014, at UCLA. Woodmansee hit a walk-off home run in the 10th inning of the season opener for ASU's first walk-off home run since Joey DeMichele on June 3, 2011 vs. New Mexico (3-run homer in Tempe Regional) and became the first Devil in the past three seasons to hit multiple home runs on opening weekend (Abe Ruiz vs Western Michigan in 2012).

Burr's Box Score Presence

Right-hander Ryan Burr is the only player in the nation with double-digit saves and seven wins, and he ranks first in the Pac-12 in saves with 13 and is tied for second in the conference with seven victories. He has already matched his career win total this season as he went 3-3 in 2014 and 4-2 in 2013. He is eighth in the conference with 61 strikeouts, and is the only full-time reliever to rank among the top eight in the Pac-12 in strikeouts.

More Burr - A Record Breaking Career

Junior RHP Rvan Burr recorded his 26th career save Feb. 18 in a win over Oklahoma to set the school's career saves record and currently has 37 in his career. Burr also currently ranks fifth in school history with 89 career appearances and is 10 away from the fourth spot, held by Ryan Bradley (1995-97). Burr, who collected 12 saves in each of his past two seasons, has 13 in 2015 and is one away from tying the single-season record. He broke Doug Nurnberg's record, which was set in 1965-67 and was the longest-standing individual career record in school history. Burr also set the freshmen record for single-season saves with 12 in 2013.

#KelloggShow

Junior LHP Ryan Kellogg is the first Sun Devil to lead the team in wins in consecutive seasons since Ken Jones in 1978-79. Sterling Slaughter (1962-63), Craig Swan (1970-72) and Floyd Bannister (1975-76) also accomplished the feat and Kellogg could join Swan as the only Devils to lead the team in wins in three consecutive seasons. In addition, Kellogg has 11 wins over ranked opponents, including four in 2015, three in 2013 and four in 2014. He has a career record of 26-5, including 18-2 in 26 career Pac-12 starts, and 25 of his 44 career starts have been quality starts. Kellogg is one of five Sun Devils in the past five seasons to earn repeat First Team All-Conference honors, joining Joey DeMichele (2011-12), Deven Marrero (2011-12), Riccio Torrez (2010-11) and Mitchell Lambson (2009-10). He has not issued a walk in three of his starts this season and 16 career starts. Among Div. I Canadian pitchers, Kellogg is tied for fourth all-time with 26 wins, and is just three wins from the top three, and all seven pitchers ahead of him played four season for their respective schools. Kellogg tossed his third career complete game in a win over Oregon on March 21, tied for the fourth most among ASU pitches since 2008. His 298.2 career innings pitched are the most since 2008, and his 44 career starts are the most since 2008.

Allen's ASU Career

Redshirt senior outfielder Trever Allen, who had nine home runs in 2013 and five in 2014, was the first Sun Devil to lead the team in home runs in consecutive seasons since Brett Wallace in 2007-08, and just the seventh in program history to do so. His 181 career starts are tied for the second most since 2008 (behind 199 by Matt Newman, 2008-11), his 709 at-bats are the second most behind Newman's 713, and his 195 games played trail only Newman's 223. He recorded his 200th career hit against Arizona on April 22.

K's & ERA & Opposing Batting Average

Junior LHP Brett Lilek is the first Sun Devil to lead the team in both ERA and strikeouts since Mike Leake in 2008 and 2009, and is the 11th player in school history to accomplish the feat. In addition, Lilek was one of just three pitchers in the Pac-12 in 2014, and one of just two returning pitchers in 2015, to finish in the top eight in the conference in the regular season in ERA, opposing batting average and strikeouts.

Junior center fielder Johnny Sewald has stolen a team-high 20 bases this season and 37 in his career - both marks rank as the most by any Sun Devil in the past three seasons.

Young, Seasoned Catcher

Sophomore catcher Brian Serven, who was named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List, has caught 16 runners stealing base in 2015 and his career total of 31 is more than any Sun Devil since 2009. He became just the third true freshmen catcher in the past 20 years at ASU to start the majority of the season, joining Petey Paramore in 2006 and

Trent Pratt in 1999. He also caught 15 runners stealing base in 2014, which was the most since Carlos Ramirez caught 15 in 2009 and is tied for the most by a Sun Devil since 2006.

A Trio Of Junior Preseason All-American Pitchers

ASU is the only school in Div. I with three pitchers on a preseason All-America team as junior left-handed starters Ryan Kellogg and Brett Lilek, and right-handed closer Ryan Burr were all named Louisville Slugger 2015 Preseason All-Americans (third team).

Golden Spikes Tradition

Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Burr was named to the Golden Spikes Midseason Watch List and is the first Devil since righthanded pitcher Trevor Williams in 2013 to earn a spot on the midseason list. The Sun Devils are the only team in the nation to boast three current pitchers who have been named to the preseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the top amateur baseball student-athlete in the country. Junior left-handed pitcher Brett Lilek was named to the preseason watch list in 2015 and is the 11th Sun Devil to earn the recognition since 2010. He joins fellow juniors **Burr** and **Ryan Kellogg**, who earned the preseason nod in 2014, as current Sun Devil student-athletes to earn a spot on preseason watch list.

There are five Legacy Devils on the 2015 team: Trever Allen (father, Jaime), Joey Bielek (uncle, Brett Wallerstedt (football)), Coltin Gerhart (brother, Garth (football)), David Graybill (father, Dave Graybill), and Andrew Snow (cousin, Dustin Pedoria; uncle, Phil Snow (football assistant coach)).

Academic Success

Fourteen Arizona State University baseball student-athletes have been recognized during the Fall 2014 semester as Scholar Ballers®, which honors those who achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher. A total of 20 current baseball student-athletes have earned Scholar Baller® recognition in at least one of the past five semesters. Junior preseason All-America pitchers Ryan Burr and Ryan Kellogg each earned a 4.0 GPA this past semester, while freshmen Ryan Hingst and Eli Lingos each began their respective college careers with a 3.9 GPA in their first semesters.

Feeling The Draft

There are eight members of the 2015 Sun Devils who have had their name called during the annual Major League Baseball draft, including junior David Graybill, who has been drafted twice as a pitcher.

...And In All-Conference Selections

ASU leads the Pac-12 with 24 First Team All-Conference selections since 2010, three more than UCLA, four more than Arizona, and five more than Oregon State.

A Tradition Of USA Collegiate Baseball

Junior RHP Ryan Burr earned a spot on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team for the second consecutive summer in 2014 and joined former Sun Devil Dustin Pedroia as the only two student-athletes in school history to be selected to the team in consecutive seasons. At least one Sun Devil has played on the Collegiate National Team in seven consecutive seasons, which is the longest streak in the NCAA. ASU has had a representative on the team each year since 2007 and a Sun Devil has been represented on the Collegiate National Team in 15 different seasons, which is fourth most behind Stanford (21), Cal State Fullerton (19) and Miami (17). ASU's 20 players are tied for the fourth most with Georgia Tech and trail Stanford (29), Cal State Fullerton (22) and Miami (21). In two summers with the USA Baseball CNT, Burr has pitched 20 2/3 innings and allowed only one total run. Opponents are hitting a miniscule .048 off of Burr as a member of the CNT and he has recorded nine saves, which is the most of any CNT pitcher in the past two years. Burr has struck out a remarkable 38 batters in his time in the Red, White and Blue, which puts him over 16 strikeouts per nine innings

Restarting A Baseball America Tradition:

The Sun Devils were ranked in the top 25 in six major preseason polls, including No. 18 by Baseball America. The Devils had a two-year hiatus from Baseball America's preaseason top 25 after they had been in the poll for 26 straight seasons, the longest streak in the nation.

Alone At The Top

Joe Arnold and Mike Kelly will be inducted into the National College Baseball Hall of Fame as part of the 2015 class. The two inductees give ASU a total of 10 Hall of Famers, the most from any single school in college baseball.

Back To The Old New:

ASU moved back to Phoenix Municipal Stadium after playing 40 seasons at Packard Stadium from 1974-2014 The Devils played 137 games at Muni from 1964-74, and went 111-26 at the stadium, including 17-6 against Arizona. ASU's first game at Muni was April 10, 1964, and was a 5-3 win over Arizona. ASU's last game at Muni was March 18, 1974, and was 9-6 win over Colorado. ASU won District 7 titles in 1965 and 1967 at Muni before going on to win National Championships in Omaha. Former Sun Devil and eventual Major League Baseball Hall of Famer Reggie Jackson was the first college player to hit a home run at Muni.

Packing Them In

For the 10th consecutive year and the 11th time in the past 12 years, Arizona State led the West Coast and Pac-12 in total attendance, as well as regular season average attendance. 85,325 fans came to Winkles Field-Packard Stadium at Brock Ballpark during the 2014 season for an average of 2,844 in 30 home games, the 22nd highest average in the nation.


